

West Sac icon closing, or are they?

In 1981, Paul Holtzen opened Wild West Feed Store here in West Sacramento. “Back then,” Paul said, “it only took about a half an hour to commute from my ranch in Rescue. Now it takes about an hour and 20 minutes.” Originally the store was located in the Country West Shopping Center on West Capitol Avenue and Harbor Boulevard.

Like all feed stores, you could find food for your large animals and small animals. But in addition to food for your average pets, such as dogs, cats, rabbits, hamsters and chickens you could also find food for pets such as monkeys. This isn’t a common item to stock in the Sacramento area. In addition to animal food and toys there were cages, vitamins and a wide variety of items that is needed to keep your pets happy and healthy. Every year there was always a

variety of animals that could be purchased and adopted there. You could often find fish, birds (both exotic and domestic), and snakes and rats, just to name a few. Paul has been a huge asset to West Sac for other reasons besides the feeding of our pets. Wild West Feed has been a great place to find resources for your animal needs. Wild West Feed has also been the host of countless affordable vaccine clinics for our pets.

In addition to the care of our animals, Paul has been a great asset to our children. He has sponsored youth sports teams, and during those times that business was not in a position to donate money, he was always willing to donate something like a bail of hay for an opening day float. In addition to the charity he has given the community, Paul has had hundreds of employees. Most of them were high school students.

But perhaps the thing that Wild West Feed has been best known for is Gus. Gus is a Red Macaw Parrot that has lived at Wild West Feed for 32 years. Originally he was purchased as a very young bird to be one of the animals to be sold. However, Gus hadn’t been there long when he got sick. Paul took him to the vet and took up the care that Gus needed in order to be well enough to be sold. “By the time he was well, we had gotten attached,” Paul said. “And then, I just couldn’t get rid of him.” Paul continued to raise Gus and he has been the official greeter ever since.

Wild West Feed got lunged into the national spotlight in 2005 when someone smashed the window of the store and kidnapped Gus. Some Wild West customers were on vacation in New York when they saw the FBI come on the news with the story of Gus being stolen. Customers



came to Paul and offered donations to help in offering a reward for the return of Gus. Then, Paul got a call from the kidnapper, demanding a \$10,000 ransom for Gus. Paul agreed, but when the meeting time came, the kidnapper did not show

up. Paul was devastated. Day after day community members stopped in to check on the return of Gus. Then one day, one month after Gus had been kidnapped, the kidnapper was driving down

Yolo County exceeds COVID-19 case threshold; home gatherings at center of spike

A message from Mayor Christopher Cabaldon:

Some bad news, and some less bad news. First the bad news.

Yolo County no longer meets the “epidemiological stability” test that was needed to move further through the State reopening stages. Our county didn’t just inch past the limit of 55 new cases over 14 days, it blew past it to 77 new cases. The county reported 60 cases in just the last seven days--the biggest outbreak yet and more than at what was supposed to be the peak back in April.

This isn’t due mainly to more testing. Many of these cases have been linked via contact tracing to social events in private homes, like family birthday parties or other get-togethers. Our asymptomatic testing isn’t close to universal, so this type of spread is only a hint of what’s really happening.

Next, the less bad news. West Sacramento’s spike is not as severe, and we no longer account for a majority of Yolo’s county-wide cases. And positive rates from the initial asymptomatic testing here are within expected ranges. But we’ve seen 9 cases over the past five days--the highest number since the April peak. And our COVID hospitalization rate is still the highest in the county.

Only we can save ourselves. The county and the city don’t issue permits for birthday parties or licenses for family gatherings. Courts aren’t going to issue warrants to break into homes to see if you’re having a dinner party with friends. Sure, the state or

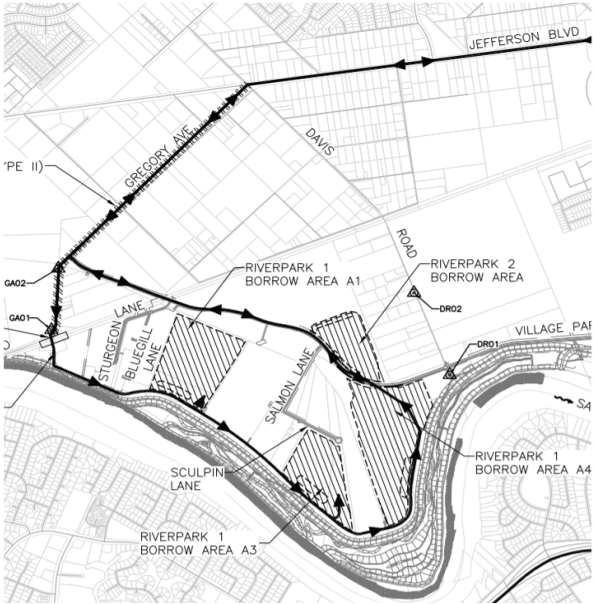
What’s up with all those trucks on Jefferson Blvd?

Personal care services to resume In Yolo County

Yolo County began allowing personal care services, as outlined in the State of California’s guidance and June 12th announcement, to resume operations while also following strict social distancing requirements and the mandatory use of face coverings in accordance with local health orders.

Most of the recently confirmed cases in Yolo County have been due to social/family gatherings, some workplace exposures, and travel to other counties, states, or countries. There has not yet been evidence of transmission in Yolo County

related to recently reopened activities and given this current information, the County will allow personal services to resume as stated by the State.

The following activities are allowed to resume effective under ‘Personal Services’ as long as they 1) follow State and/or County guidance, 2) adhere to the County’s face covering order; 3) comply with strict social distancing protocols:

- Skin care and cosmetology services
- Electrolysis
- Nail salons

Five more Individuals Charged with New Felonies After Being Released as a Result of California Judicial Council’s Statewide Emergency “0” Bail Schedule

Over the last week, five more individuals previously released from custody as a result of California Judicial Council’s Statewide Emergency “0” Bail Schedule were charged with new felony crimes. The “0” Bail Schedule became effective April 13, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Woodland man, Brandon Gray, age 49, was charged with felony criminal threats and misdemeanor vandalism by the Yolo County District Attorney’s Office after being arrested by Woodland Police on June 6, 2020. Gray was pending admission to a state hospital when he was released from custody despite prosecutor objections about risks to public safety, and to Gray. Because the California Judicial Council’s Statewide Emergency “0” Bail Schedule applied retroactively to pending cases and because his

cases did not meet one of the thirteen exceptions to “0” bail, he was released from custody on April 20, 2020. On June 11, 2020, Gray was arraigned on the felony threats and misdemeanor vandalism charge. He pleaded not guilty and the court set bail at \$50,000. He will next appear in Department 7 of the Yolo County Superior Court on June 19, 2020, for a preliminary hearing. Woodland man, Frank Creamer, age 39, was charged with multiple felonies after being arrested on June 9, 2020. Creamer was pending prosecution for auto theft and reckless evading as well as violations of Mandatory Supervision in five separate cases when he was released from custody on April 13, 2020. He was released as a result of the California Judicial Council’s Statewide Emergency “0” bail Schedule due to his cases

not meeting any of the exceptions listed. On June 11, 2020, Creamer was arraigned on charges of felony domestic violence, felony false imprisonment, vandalism, and commission of a new felony while out on his own recognizance. He pleaded not guilty and his cases are next set for preliminary hearing and prehearing conference in Department 7 of the Yolo County Superior Court on June 17, 2020. Bail is presently set at \$25,000 on the domestic violence case. Woodland man, Diamond Sanchez, age 37, was also arraigned on June 11, 2020 on charges of assault with a deadly weapon, vandalism, and battery after being arrested by Woodland Police Department on June 8, 2020. He was also arraigned on charges of possession of a short barreled rifle, possession of a weapon with an obscured serial number, resisting arrest and possession of a controlled substance. Sanchez had been arrested by Woodland Police Department on May 9, 2020 for those charges and was released from custody the next day as a result of the California Judicial Council’s Statewide Emergency “0” bail schedule. At his arraignment, he pleaded not guilty and the court set bail at \$10,000 for the felony assault case. Sanchez will next appear in Department 11 of the Yolo County Superior Court on July 1, 2020 at 1:30 p.m. for a preliminary hearing.

Woodland man, James Saragoza, age 34, was also arraigned on multiple cases. On April 8, 2020, Saragoza was arrested by the Woodland Police Department for felony vandalism and resisting arrest. He was released on \$0 bail. On April 11, 2020, he was cited and released by the Woodland Police Department for petty theft. On April 19, 2020, Saragoza was arrested by the Woodland Police Department for burglary and was again released on \$0 bail again. Finally, on June 10, 2020, he was arrested by the Woodland Police Department for burglary, looting, and possession of controlled substance paraphernalia. Because looting is one of the 13 exceptions to the “\$0” bail, bail was set and Saragoza was not released from custody. On June 15, 2020, Saragoza was arraigned on the multiple complaints filed by the Yolo County District Attorney filed multiple complaints. The first alleged the felony vandalism and resisting arrest from April 8, 2020; the second alleged a misdemeanor petty theft from April 11, 2020; the third alleged burglary and felony vandalism from April 19, 2020; the fourth complaint alleging the burglary, looting and possession of controlled substance paraphernalia. As to his felony cases, it was alleged that Saragoza had been previously convicted of a prior strike offense. He is also pending violations of

probation in three separate misdemeanor cases. At his arraignment, he pleaded not guilty and the court set bail at \$10,000 on the looting case. He will next appear in Department July 21, 2020, in Department 12 of the Yolo County Superior Court for a preliminary hearing. Davis man, Benjamin Howe, age 34, was arraigned on multiple cases. On May 19, 2020, Howe was arrested by the Davis Police Department for commercial burglary allegedly committed on May 17, 2020, and a misdemeanor warrant for failing to appear in court. He was released on \$0 bail. Howe was again arrested on June 10, 2020 for residential burglary. Because residential burglary is one of the 13 exceptions to the “\$0” bail, bail was set and Howe remained in custody. On June 16, 2020, Howe was arraigned on three criminal complaints. The first alleging the residential burglary from June 10, 2020; the second the commercial burglary and possession of stolen property from May 17, 2020; and a misdemeanor case involving possession of burglary tools, petty theft, and vandalism from April 15, 2020. At his arraignment, the court set bail at \$50,000. His next court date is June 25, 2020, in Department 14 of the Yolo County Superior Court for a preliminary hearing. West Sacramento man, Oscar Bucio, age 28, was arraigned on

June 16, 2020 on a felony complaint alleging a violation of assault with a deadly weapon and an allegation that he has a prior strike conviction. He was arrested by the West Sacramento Police Department on June 11, 2020. Bucio, who was on Post Release Community Supervision for a February 7, 2018 conviction for a concealed dirk or dagger, was arrested for an alleged violation of supervision on June 4, 2020. Due to the \$0 bail, Bucio was released from custody. Bucio was also arraigned on the violation of post release community supervision at his June 16, 2020, court appearance. At his arraignment, Bucio pleaded not guilty and the court set bail at \$10,000 on the felony assault case. Bucio’s next court date is July 10, 2020 in Department 14 of the Yolo County Superior Court for a preliminary hearing. On June 10, 2020, the Judicial Council rescinded its April 6, 2020 order imposing the statewide Emergency Bail Schedule effective June 20, 2020. Counties are still encouraged to use either the statewide emergency bail schedule or their own emergency bail schedule as part of ongoing efforts to keep those within the criminal justice system safe. Yolo County Presiding Judge Samuel McAdam has yet to announce which bail schedule will be used going forward but has sought feedback from the criminal justice partners.

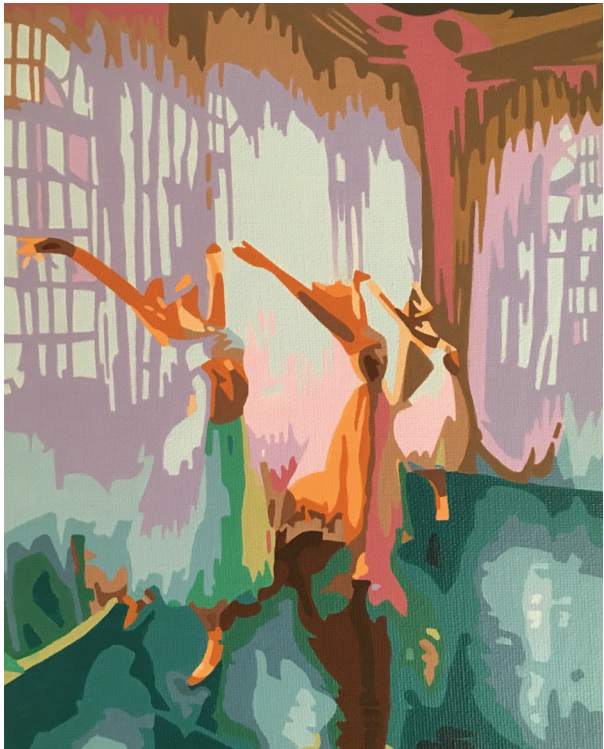
"I am inspired to create art that captures people in an intimate moment or setting. Whether a musician, a balleri-

ery' that some predict, our governor says deep cuts are needed. Others in state government want ZERO cuts. "Borrow the money!" is what they say. Right now, the Prime (interest) Rate is close to zero, which makes borrowing - say for a car loan - more attractive.

The stock market fluctuates with the virus news. As yet, no one can say with certainty, what we'll learn next.

Those scrambling to perfect a vaccine know only that it's a novel corona virus. With similarities to SARS: "Sudden Acute Respiratory Syndrome" is its cousin. Watched a CNN special with Anderson Cooper about Covid 19. (Who knew there are so MANY kinds of BATS??? For a minute, I was confused and thought I was watching Animal Planet, not CNN.)

Bottom line conclusion of the documentary's virus experts: China wasn't working on a biological weapon that escaped. In fact, Covid-19 didn't escape from a lab at all. One does grow restless. I want to see my son! I want to hug my friends! I want a sit down meal at Vientiane or Raku Sushi! I DON'T want to pick up my favorites, then eat a meal that's cold or soggy!

I want my church to open. INDOORS open. Not outdoors-bring your own chair-sit six

feet apart. Older people/those with chronic health conditions are not welcome. I want choir practice to resume this fall.

Most of my working age friends haven't 'gone' to work in months. One, who works at STRS in West Sac, now does all her work at home. Once this all settles down, we'll do lunch again she says.

I've seen scientific experiments that prove how far respiratory droplets spray when someone, unmasked, is speaking. If a mask isn't tight to someone's face - nose, mouth, cheeks and chin - there's bottom/side spray anyway. Clinics are reporting they don't have much business. I get it. Worried that where sick

people go is where I stand the best chance of contracting Covid, this month I canceled an MRI, put off periodic labs, and rescheduled two medical appointments

Don't much like the continued spike in cases across the river that's blamed on 'family gatherings.' My only family, Mike, doesn't live with me. I'd love to see him. I have stuff for him. But here's a fact: Young people his age (34) and younger are having Covid-related strokes. A young woman in her 20s just had a double lung transplant. Her virus-infected lungs, removed, looked like dried up swiss cheese. I saw a photo. A treatment, de-

Importance of social distancing and limiting gatherings

With increasing numbers of locally confirmed Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) cases, Yolo County is reinforcing the importance of social distancing and limiting social gatherings.
With the temptation of warming weather, upcoming Father's Day, and the start of summer, communities and residents are being asked to continue to social distance and reduce close contact, such as hugging or shaking hands, with people from other households, including family members and friends.
From June 10-16 confirmed cases in Yolo County increased due to a variety of reasons, including social gatherings with a lack of social distancing, where friends or family met, gathered, and contracted COVID-19 and individuals who traveled to other counties, states, or even out of the country and contracted the virus and then brought it back to their residence in Yolo County. This in-

crease in confirmed cases due to social gatherings, travel, or the lack of social distancing is happening throughout the region and in surrounding counties as well.
COVID-19 is mainly spread among people who are in close contact with each other for a prolonged amount of time. Social distancing, also called “physical distancing,” is one of the best ways to reduce the spread of COVID-19 by helping to limit the opportunities for the virus to infect others by staying at least six feet away from other people. Social distancing is important for everyone to follow, especially for people who are considered high risk or have compromised immune systems.
In addition to social distancing, the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the

Op-ed: Quarantine quarrels and 10 helpful hints

My wife and I are both professionals who teach and counsel individuals and couples about how to handle their conflicts better. This is especially true during this pandemic staycation. Many of us have woken to the truism that everyone annoys everyone.

In our home, we also try to handle our conflicts better. We have been together for 27 years, so we have had a lot of practice. And we are getting better—though we are far from perfect. We would like to maintain a calm, meditative, Zen state of mind, watching the flow

of life, and the news, with no perceptible anxiety. In reality, we're as troubled by as the rest of the world, shaken by this horrendous COVID-19, stuck in an impromptu Groundhog's Day—Contagion Edition, greatly amplified by the horrific filmed deaths of African Americans by police.

Like most of us, my wife and I bicker with each other about washing dishes, preparing meals, and house-cleaning. Because of our professions helping others with their conflicts, we know (on some level) that we are handling our own conflict sub-optimally.

Luckily, we also know that conflict resolution is a somewhat imprecise science, as it depends on many variables, including what one ate this morning, and how much sleep one got. We also, know that, even with the precise science of the computer technology, our Wi-Fi refuses to get along with our printer.

So, we suggest that those of us who are stir-crazy at home try to be mindful of the following rules:

1. Accept that, on some level, everyone eventually irritates everyone else. Therefore, people are sometimes snappish with each other, even in less stressful circumstances. It's part of the drama of life.
2. Generally speaking, there are two ways to look at any given

conflict: the right way and the other right way.

3. Nonviolence is always best, unless your partner has a sharp object in their hand, and even then, try soothing, de-escalation techniques first.
4. Don't yell! And no, you are not just talking loudly. (Any anxiety in the air will fuel the fire.)
5. If the two of you cannot calmly discuss your differences, consider taking a 30-minute break and retreat behind a closed (not slammed) door. Rinse and repeat, as needed.
6. Try to paraphrase what the other person is saying. Be assured that your paraphrasing will always be wrong, so try it again. At the very least, the other person will know that you are genuinely trying to listen—even when you miss the mark.
7. Don't forget about the 30-minute break; you may need another one, or at least a little refresh-

8. Try to find some common ground or a compromise that will last until the next dust-up. No conflict is perfectly resolved—peace and conflict come in episodes—stay tuned for the next one. We reboot our partnerships, as we reboot our technology—hopefully learning, as we move along.
9. Try to regularly say how much you both love and appreciate each other. (Keep your inevitable regrets to yourself.) Yeah, we are both idiots.
10. And finally, escalate the politeness and civility. Contrary to the film “Love Story,” love is saying you are “sorry,” and a “please” and “thank-you” help rebuild the bonds that get frayed.

We can do this! May your household host a pandemic of peace.
