

# Glen and Margaret Brinkhuis to celebrate 75 years of marriage

Glen, 97, and Margaret, 95, Brinkhuis will be celebrating their 75<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary with a car parade in front of their West Sacramento home on Saturday, July 18.

“We met at a roller skating rink when I was 21 and she was 20. We are really blessed ... God picked good doctors and kept us from a lot of dangers,” said Glen.

Residents of West Sacramento since 1961, the couple married on July 20, 1945 toward the end of World War II at the home of Margaret’s family in Northwest Iowa.

Included in attendance were both of their parents, two of Glen’s siblings and four of Margaret’s because six of their siblings were out of the country at war. The preacher didn’t stay too long; he had another wedding that day, recalled Glen.

The two moved out to California for Glen’s work, installing and repairing air conditioners where he was making \$1.50 an hour, or 50 cents more an hour than he did in Iowa. In his later working years, Glen drove for Teichert.

Recalling when he courted Margaret, Glen said, he wanted a Christian partner, someone who would be a good example if they were to have children. “Margaret met those conditions and we went roller skating once a week. She has four brothers older than her and her father needed a helper at his work.

He talked me into working with him until his boys got out

of the service. All four brothers returned from WWII. I had one brother there and one brother later in the reserves,” Glen said.

They are parents to four daughters who all graduated from high school in West Sacramento and

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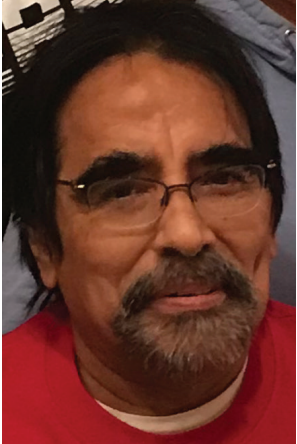
### Guadalupe Garfio Cuadras

# LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor,  
I’m a public-school teacher in the Sacramento area and a resident of my adopted hometown of West Sacramento. I am concerned that this lockdown and slow reopening is going to have serious negative effects on our students and our economy.  
Allow me to explain the effect on students. All students have different needs. Some students do well at home, they are capable of being home schooled and do well there, (already available). There are other students who do well with an independent study program, (already available). However, there are many students who don’t do well with home schooling or independent study. We need to serve these students now.  
We can serve these students in two different manners, a partial reopening or a complete reopening. A partial reopening allows students and teachers to meet between two and five days a week with the remainder of instruction time online. This partial reopening gives students much of what they need with contact, socialization and support. This partial reopening also helps teachers to monitor their students, and to keep an eye on their students and how they are responding to this shut down. However, a full reopening is much better for the students.  
The second reason for reopening school is we need to get the economy completely reopened. Most business-

es can survive a short lock down, they can’t survive a long lock down. If we don’t open school, many businesses can’t open either. Both of these courses of action will lead to a severe depression and it will take many years to dig out of this self-inflicted damage. We can intelligently open almost every single business. In West Sacramento we can completely open every store without concern. We can open many restaurants with take-out and social spacing. Many of our bars have open air seating which will allow them to also open. In short, we should be able to open 99% of our economy now.  
The last reason is the mental and financial health of people. It is well established that a few more students commit suicide when they are on summer vacation, isolated from their peers. People also commit more suicide during economic recessions and depressions. Therefore, this shut down has a double negative effect, isolation for students and economic stresses for their parents. Both lead to increased health stresses and increased suicide rates.  
In short, please push to open the schools and businesses in order to reduce deaths from preventable causes such as stress and suicide. And we can do this safely!

# California cannot reopen schools unless they are safe.

The following letter was sent to Governor Gavin Newsom, Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon, Senate Pro Tem Toni Atkins and Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond:

We write on behalf of the 310,000 members of the California Teachers Association and the more than nine million

students we serve regarding the pending reopening of schools and colleges throughout the state. We appreciate your leadership and efforts in meeting this extraordinary challenge. We understand the dramatic impact of the pandemic on the state budget and appreciate all efforts to protect public education, while recognizing that the budget relies on \$13 billion in deferrals and

additional federal funding. It is why, looking forward, we believe the state must have additional revenues to address the growing needs.  
Since schools closed in March, CTA has said that the health and safety of our students and educators must always be our top priority and our guiding principle during this crisis. Much is still

being learned about the COVID-19 virus. The recent surge in the infection rate and the closure of indoor activities in 26 counties gives us pause around the state's preparedness for safe in-person school instruction in a short six- to eight-week time frame. In this current situation, we believe that the "Precautionary Principle" should guide us. This means taking the most preventative action in the face of uncertainty to protect students, educators, and our communities. Simply said, California cannot reopen schools unless they are safe.

Unfortunately, many local districts and communities don't have the necessary resources or capacity to maintain even the most basic prevention measures of six feet physical distancing and limiting contacts, much less the other important preventative actions such as personal protective equipment (PPE), testing and tracing, or adequate ventilation and cleaning supplies.

While no one method of prevention by itself is 100 percent effective, layered strategies boost prevention with each measure knocking off some percentage of exposure and potential infection. This includes a clear

and manageable plan to implement measures like physical distancing of six feet, reducing the number of contacts, face coverings, handwashing, daily health screening, support for sick and at-risk people to stay at home, robust testing, good ventilation (with absolutely no recirculated air), and cleaning and disinfecting.

We should be clear-eyed about this reality. How can we physically reopen schools with lower thresholds of safety than we currently have for restaurants or hair salons?

Safe school reopening will require the state to coordinate consistent public health department operations that offer a uniform symptoms checklist and safety protocols;

data transparency and accessibility; increased testing dedicated to schools for students and staff; rapid case notification and contact tracing; isolation support and medical care for our most vulnerable students and families; and health monitoring of students to serve as early understandings of transmissions in schools and warnings of any school-based outbreaks. We also ask the state to direct the California Department of Public Health to coordinate with CalOSHA to develop and implement training for all school districts on safety protocols and to direct that Illness and Injury Prevention plans be updated and adopted prior to the first day of in-person instruction.

As educators, we too want to be back with our students doing the work that we love, but we cannot ignore science, facts, and safety. Absent a specific plan for each school that includes a clear line of responsibility and accountability we have two options:

1. A high-risk in-person opening, even under a hybrid model.
2. Start the new school year under robust distance learning protocols until the virus is contained in local communities and proper safety measures can be put into place.

It is clear that communities and school districts have not come close to meeting the threshold for a safe return to

cy fenced back yard was bigger for a growing boy, and our growing herd of animals. No big shady trees, though, so, I planted some. Four of them. In the city’s tree lawn. Trees the landscaper said could withstand fumes from the city’s bus stop. One was a buckeye. Like my grampa had.

From tree-related posts I’ve seen on Nextdoor, I know I’m not the only person in West Sac who gets attached to a tree, or trees. In the state streets recently, some residents were having tree issues. One tree likely predated the building of the house and the homeowner was loath to lose it. A Chinese elm, I think. Sadly, part of it had already fallen on or close to a neighbor’s house. My folks farm had one, too. “Trash tree,” my dad said. Big and beautiful, though. Birds loved it. My parents loved to bird watch. They attached suet to it and watched it while they had supper. But, eventually, they lost it.

From a forester who’d once worked for the U.S. Forest Service, I learned

a lot about what does, and does not, make a good city tree. Of course, what he recommended for Ohio was different than for California. The main thing I remember: He said to avoid trees with invasive roots that can damage a foundation, interfere with buried lines, and buckle sidewalks. Like willows, I think he told me.

My favorite tree on my farm was a ginormous Sycamore. Leaning out over my creek, it exposed its massive flat smooth roots. I spent more than a little time there, legs dangling, studying animal tracks in the mud below me. I asked the forester why I never saw the animals that left the tracks. He said, “Sit quietly for 10 minutes. They’ll come out.”

Now, you may already know this, but Sycamores also grow well in California! Imagine my joy to find an apartment that is shaded by a now-huge Sycamore! I’ve been told I have former West Sac City Manager Toby Ross to thank for the Sycamores that now line

Lighthouse. (Toby, my source said, was especially fond of Sycamores.)

As a suburban kid, before my parents bought their farm, I liked our front yard Sugar Maple with its dark red leaves in autumn. Dried several of those between pages of my school dictionary. In back, my favorite was the smooth-barked Granny Smith (a rough barked tree is hard on gravel-scarred small knees that nonetheless intend to climb it). Squirreled away in the topmost leaves of the Granny Smith, I ate its crisp green apples.

If attracting birds and wildlife quickly is a goal, take a look at small, ornamental fruit/seed-bearing trees. If, on the other hand, you want beauty but absolutely DO NOT WANT A MESS, best to go with a flowered variety that is ‘unfruited’. Here’s what else the forester told me as we walked the woods at my farm: Dead trees are good if you’re a wild-life lover. Birds and an-

imals live in the dead tree’s holes and hollows. I even had a Wood duck take up residence in one of mine!

The former forester assessed my woods for harvest purposes (\$3,600 in 1996). The tree trunks, he told me, would be pulled out on skeds, their roots and canopies left behind.

I didn’t like that. Instead of waves of trilliums, Spring Beauties, yellow violets and so much more – my woods would be scarred with ugly ruts. And the mess would clutter up the deer paths.

So, no, I wouldn’t be harvesting the veneer quality Black Walnuts or soaring oaks. “How,” I asked, “can I improve my woods for wildlife?” He pointed to grape vines bigger than my wrist. “Leave a few for wildlife cover,” he said, “but remove the rest. Grapevines will choke out the trees you want.”

Heading back, we walked the deer path along the creek, and he explained the trees to me from, I guess you’d say, a John Muir point of view. How to identify a tree by the way its limbs branch. Why water loving trees, like Cottonwood, prefer a swamp. And why

forest-grown trees grow straight and tall, while a single tree in a meadow has a spreading canopy. In the forest, he said, close-together saplings compete for sun. As their trunks grow, the lower limbs shear off until, eventually, only the top-most limbs are left.

Now, really. Aren’t trees interesting? And here’s why cities want to be known as a “Tree City,” besides the aesthetics of it. Adding trees helped reduce the ‘heat signa-

ture’ the EPA was picking up in its flyovers of West Sacramento 10+ years ago.

Speaking of heat: These 100-degree days are killer, aren’t they?! But thanks to mature shady Sycamores now lining Lighthouse, walking my Nikky won’t risk a heatstroke.

in-person learning, even under a hybrid model. In fact, with recent health orders issued in 26 counties impacting nearly 85 percent of Californians, we are going backwards. How can we reasonably expect hundreds of students, and in some cases more than 1,000 students, to come together on one campus for an entire day without

putting their health and the lives of every adult on that campus at risk? Federal and state guidance regarding a phased reopening have focused on a sustained downward trajectory of COVID-19 cases for 14 days or no more than 1 COVID-19 case per 10,000 in the past 14 days. From a public health perspective, the best course of action would be to focus on improving our ability to provide robust, quality distance learning until the virus is marginalized and safety measures are addressed.

Just yesterday, on July 7, President Donald Trump implored the nation’s schools to physically open amid a new wave of COVID-19 diagnoses. In doing so, he pointed to other countries’ abilities to reopen their schools as evidence that America’s schools needed to do the

same. President Trump ignores the fact that these other countries invested heavily in PPE, health and safety protocols for education and testing – the very resources that he is threatening to withdraw. We have joined you in lobbying the federal government for more money for California to aid in the COVID-related budget impacts. We are deeply concerned that politics are being played with the lives of children and the educators who serve them.

Safe school reopening and equity for our communities requires funding. While the recent budget agreement certainly buys a bit of time, it is not the investment needed to meet this critical crisis. California remains in the lower tier of school funding in this nation. At best,

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# What about armed protests?

Change. Now.

I get that, and understand the symbolism of packed heat. A gun says: We mean business. But that symbolism stops as soon as the trigger is pulled. What the armed protesters could wind up with is a bitter present-day civil war and the blood-stained illusion of change.

The country — and the world — have been in the midst of a social uprising for the past month and a half, ignited by the brutal police killing of George Floyd. The global protests against structural racism have been racially diverse and, for the most part (and except for the police) unarmed. But that's shifting. Armed black protesters have begun making their presence known. So have armed white counterprotesters.

"We want change that's really going to permanently help us. We don't want [any] little change, we want some real change." So said one of the organizers of the Not F\*\*king Around Coalition, pointing out in an interview with Newsweek the ineffectiveness of civil rights marches since the 1960s. NFAC led a protest this past Fourth of July at

Stone Mountain Park in Georgia. Several hundred mostly black, mostly armed men and women marched through the iconic Confederate "theme park" that features an enormous carving of Robert E. Lee, Stonewall Jackson and Jefferson Davis on the face of the mountain and was the site, back in 1915, of the rebirth of the Ku Klux Klan. The march was peaceful and there was no confrontation with white supremacists.

However, there was a confrontation — armed but, fortunately, nonviolent — at the base of another iconic Confederate landmark on July 4. This was in Richmond, the capital of Virginia, where a statue of Robert E. Lee has been under siege for a while now and protesters, demanding its removal, spent the week-end camping out at the statue's graffiti-covered base.

As Hannah Allam pointed out at NPR, opponents to this cause were also present: "a gathering of heavily armed white men — some prepping for a second Civil War, some calling for a white ethnostate. Their speeches were essentially the overtly racist version of President Trump's di-

visive lament at Mount Rushmore National Memorial Friday about lost heritage and fallen statues."

However, she goes on to note that black gun clubs in the Richmond area "have come together to safeguard the protest site. They call themselves a deterrent — a defensive, not offensive, presence." Their presence, she says, is controversial among the protesters, but grudgingly accepted.

And then, on the morning of July 4, the Bugaloo Boys — armed white males in Hawaiian shirts — showed up and stood in front of the capitol building. Other, more traditional-type white supremacists joined them, and just as the speeches were about to begin, another group joined them as well.

"Then, from around a corner," Allam writes, "a group of armed Black protesters showed up, many of the same who patrol the Lee site. The gun-toting Black group stood across the street from the gun-toting white group."

But instead of a simplistic, armed standoff — hatred spewing back and forth across the street — the leader of the Bugaloo Boys, a 19-year-old young man, crossed the

street and introduced himself, evoking solidarity with them in support of the Second Amendment. The blacks crossed the street with him and the groups mingled together. And then, according to Allam, something truly surreal happened:

"At one point, a guy in a Hawaiian shirt and tactical gear wished everyone a happy Fourth of July and led the crowd — the white nationalists, the Boogaloo boys, the Black gun group — in a surreal rendition of 'America The Beautiful.' But the harmony was fleeting." As soon as the white nationalists took the mic and began talking about "white genocide" . . . well, the unity, not surprisingly, fell apart.

Fascinatingly, the Bugaloo Boys sided with their armed black brothers and started shouting things like "White supremacy sucks!"

All of which seems to indicate . . . I actually have no idea what, except that the stew of change the nation is in may be more complex than anyone realizes. Maybe there's a force larger than hatred that is permeating multiple sides of this movement for change.

However, Allam brings up a cautionary moment, when an armed

black protester asked the Bugaloo leader, Mike Dunn: "Who's going to regulate if anything jumps off?"

"We just hope it doesn't," Dunn said.

In other words, things are volatile.

To which I add a bit of data from, of all places, Fox Business News: "More than 2.3 million guns were sold in June, a 145 percent increase from the prior year." According to the news site, an estimated 2,387,524 guns were sold this past June, the fourth straight month in which gun sales have been up compared to last year. "Experts" attribute the sales spike to the unrest going on out there, the site unsurprisingly informs us.

Gun aficionados talk about their right to defend themselves, but mostly the purpose of openly carrying a gun is

to give a public display of seriousness. The carrier, after all, holds the power of life and death in his or her hands. I get the symbolism and I get the absolute urgency of the current protests: We must acknowledge and atone for our racist history, defund the police and rethink the keeping of social order. We must do so now. This is a life-or-death situation.

But there's a difference between carrying a gun and using it — indeed, all the difference in the world. As soon as we pull the trigger, we've dehumanized the enemy and gone to war. When we go to war, nobody wins.
