### West Sac PD released police review guiding principles

#### BY WEST SACRAMENTO **POLICE DEPARTMENT**

The West Sacramento Police Department shares in the outrage and sorrow regarding the criminal actions of police officers that led to the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis. We understand that events like this undermine public confidence in law enforcement, and we are committed to continually building the community's trust in our department through our ongoing community engagement and adherence to the highest professional standards, and through our commitment to transparency.

Recently, we have received many inquiries from the community about our police department and whether our policies are consistent with recommendations and advocacy being put forth by police reform We have re-examined and will continue to evaluate our policies and approaches

to policing in consideration of those initiatives. While we believe that we are heading in a good direction as a department, in this moment we must pause to listen and understand the diverse perspectives of our community. We acknowledge that we are at an inflection point in which we must leverage the immense community interest in policing to better inform our mission, direction, and the tactics we employ as we strive to maintain a safe environment for everyone in West Sacramento.

We have created this web page to provide information related to these topics with openness and transparency, and to facilitate dialogue with the West Sacramento community we so proudly serve. On this site you will find information about our department relative to police reform initiatives, use of force statistics, demographics, and training. Links to relevant reference documents are provided throughout this

#### 21st Century Policing:

The West Sacramento Police Department has embraced the principles of the Obama-era "President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing" since it was published in 2015. The initiative is based on six pillars for policing practices to promote effective crime reduction while building public trust, including:

- Building Trust and Legitimacy
- Policy and Oversight Technology and Social
- Media Community Policing
- and Crime Reduction Training and Education
- Officer Wellness and Safety

At the end of each quarter, the department presents the West Sacramento City Council with a report on progress towards each of the 21st Century Policing pillars, in addition to other statistical data related to California's Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015.

#### My Brother's Keeper Alliance:

On June 3, 2020, former President Obama called on Mayors to pledge to address police use of force policies in their cities as part of an initiative known as the "My Brother's Keeper Alliance." Mayor Cabaldon recently signed onto this commitment on behalf of the City of West Sacramento. Participation in the initiative includes making a commitment to take the following actions at the local level:

- Review police use of force policies.
- Engage the community by including a diverse range of input, experiences, and stories in the review.
- Report the findings of the review to the community and seek feedback.
- Reform the community's police use of force policies.

Review of Department Policies—8cantwait Initiative:

Campaign Zero has created an initiative called "8cantwait" that promotes eight recommendations to address issues related to use of force. The following summarizes how our existing policies compare to the 8cantwait recommendations (relevant sections from our Policy Manual are also cited and linked as excerpts).

Ban chokeholds and strangleholds - These techniques are not permitted in our policies. Previously, carotid holds were only allowed by trained officer in situations involving violence or physically combative individuals. California law (SB 230) requires that "an officer may only use a level of force that they reasonably believe is proportional to the seriousness of the suspected offense." Any excessive force beyond this

#### Testing Site in West Sacramento Extended to June 27th

Initially slated to end June 20, the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) testing site in West Sacramento, run by Optum-Serve in conjunction with the State of California, will be extended an additional week to June 27 to allow for additional residents to be tested in Yolo County.

The site recently moved to West Sacramento on June 2 after concluding four weeks of testing in Woodland from May 5 – 30. Yolo County was selected as one of 80 community testing sites for COVID-19 across the state focused on underserved communities. To date, more than 2,400 tests have been taken in Yolo County through OptumServe.

Testing is by appointment only and can be made by calling (888) 634-1123 or completing an online application at: https://lhi.care/ covidtesting. Testing is open to anyone in the community regardless of documentation status. If residents do not have health insurance, the cost of the test will be covered by the state. If residents have health insurance, their provider will be billed with no out of pocket cost.

This is not antibody testing: this is to test if individuals currently have COVID-19. Children under the age of 12 will not be tested at this location due to health and safety reasons. Residents must wear a face covering to their appointment and practice social distancing. This location is not a drive-thru so residents will need to park their car and walk a short distance to the build-

### Graduating West Sac seniors get automatic admission into SCC

West Sacramento-For the first time, every graduating senior in West Sacramento is getting a college acceptance letter. Thanks to a new initiative launched by the City of West Sacramento, in cooperation with Washington Unified School District (WUSD) and Sacramento City College (SCC), all high school seniors graduating from WUSD are being guaranteed their admission to SCC.

"Imagine no one in your family has ever gone to college and you open up an envelope with a letter of admission and a scholarship award," said Mayor Christopher Cabaldon, who added, "this groundbreaking effort will make it just as simple to go from high school to college as it is to go from kindergarten to first grade."

This first-of-its-kind program is part of the city's broader West Sacramento Home Run, which is comprised of: (1) preschool and a college savings account; (2) paid career-related summer internships and digital badges; and, (3) the West Sacramento College Promise and college scholarships.

The third component of this program already provides high school graduates from West Sacramento with feefree college for two years at SCC. For the first time this year, along with their automatic acceptance letter, students will receive a one-time \$200 Home Run Scholarship offer for Fall 2020 to cover other expenses associated with attending college, including books and transportation.

"We know one of the most effective ways of getting our young people on track to attain

#### **Executive Order Expands** Early Voting for the **November General Election**

On Wednesday, June 3, 2020, Governor Newsom signed an executive order (found here) modifying rules for in-person voting in the upcoming election to ensure that Californians can continue to exercise their right to vote in a secure and accessible manner.

Last month, with ongoing COVID-19 concerns, the Governor signed an executive order (found here) to send every active registered California voter a Vote by Mail ballot, while ensuring in-person voting options for those that may need access to it. "The most convenient way to cast your vote is from home. It is also the preferred method of voting within Yolo County during this pandemic." says Jesse Salinas, Yolo County Assessor/Clerk-Recorder/Registrar of Voters.

Vote by Mail voting has been on an upward trend in Yolo County. In June 2012, 47.3% of Yolo County registered voters cast their ballot by mail. Now, 72.2% of Yolo County voters prefer to Vote by Mail (as of March 2020).

The executive order signed this week ensures in-person voting opportunities are available in sufficient numbers to maintain physical distancing. It

ple ahead of him, it took about 15 minutes.

The state's requiring widespread testing if counties want a 'variance' (exemption) to the California Stay Home order. The testing's goal: what percentage of the total tests are positive. Is the virus in Yolo waning, holding steady – or is it spiking, as it is across the river. There, health officials blame family gatherings.

The only thing you have to do to qualify for

West Sac's free test is make an appointment (assuming it's still being offered by the time this publishes. Check the city's website: www.city-ofwestsacramento.org).

Frankly, I'm not too excited about waiting in line with someone who may not yet have symptoms but can give me the virus just by talking. Even WITH a face covering and standing six feet away, Covid-infected droplets still escape. (The World Health Organization says 10 feet apart is safer.)

I'll tell you what, though: You're seeing

mostly covered faces at West Sac's Walmart these days. Want to enter? Face coverings are required, even on kids 2 years old and older.

Walmart is one of my three weekly 'outings': The other two: Petco and Raley's. Wild West, I'm very sad to report, has gone out of business. Gus the Macaw has been adopted. (If the employee who wants buy the store can get a loan, Gus will again be Wild West's mascot.)

In any case, when I do go out, I'm super careful, plus constantly wash my hands thoroughly with soap and water. A friend, older and equally conscientious, bemoaned: "My hands are so dry!" I said, "I know! I'm just glad I don't pay for water!" (It's included in my rent, so, I suppose I do, but I don't notice.)

She said she misses hugging people. I do, too. And I miss delivering for Meals On Wheels. How are those elderly/disabled people doing? I miss church and choir practice.

But, the pets are happy to have me home so much, and I have more time to peruse social media. I loved a June 8 post on Nextdoor. The "Old West Sac" poster did a slide show of wild turkey babies — about a dozen of them — with their

mother. After stopping in a couple yards, they were walking down the sidewalk near 16<sup>th</sup> and Alabama. She'd posted to caution drivers in the area to watch out for them. In a mostly nice straight line, they'd decided to cross the street.

From my own experience, I have to say that turkeys aren't the smartest. I had four as pets when I had my farm: Two domestic white ones I bid on at a farm auction, and two wild. I bought those two as chicks at the grain elevator.

I named the white turkeys Gobble 1 and Gobble 2; the wild ones, Dinner 1 and Dinner 2 (a joke). I'd tell them: "Don't worry, I don't mean it." Turkeys tend to worry.

One fall, after harvest, 32 wild turkeys showed up in the corn field near the barn. A lot of gobbling ensued. They gobbled at the Dinners. the Dinners gobbled back. Silly things, the turkeys.

Sweet, though. I'm serious. They really are. They liked it when I stroked their wattles. By the time I sold the farm to move to California, I had just one turkey left. I rehomed Dinner 1 and the 'girls' (my eight chickens) to a farm family who planned to watch them pecking around the barnyard. I gave all in-

volved a chance to settle in, then called to check on them.

All was well, they said, adding, "The turkey moped for three days, but he's OK now." As you might imagine, seeing photos of those West Sac wild turkeys reminded me of the Dinners. A couple factoids: Did you know the wild turkey almost was our national symbol, not the Bald Eagle? And that a gang of turkeys is called a 'rafter' (kind of like a gang of geese is called a gaggle). The things you learn, doing research for a column.

Also exciting: The HUGE police presence -Yolo County Sheriff and West Sac PD - Sunday June 7 not a block from my apartment complex. WSPD's chopper was up; the K9 unit was represented; a neighborhood man told me two officers on the ground were searching bushes behind his house. Driving Kegle toward Lighthouse, I saw streets blocked off by police vehicles. LOTS of police vehicles.

CBS 13 news reported that maybe an hour? earlier, as demonstrators were, I think, marching peacefully along Sac Ave. near Jefferson (Jefferson turns into Kegle); shots were being fired into a house near Kegle and Anna. Three shooters. Police got

two of them. One took off running. With two in custody, police were confident they'd track down the third who escaped on foot, the 13's reporter said. Reportedly, no one in the house was injured. As of now, I've not heard what that was all about or whether there was any connection to initial protests. Before the curfews, there was vandalism here. River Walk was damaged. Tower Bridge, graffitied. Target closed early, fearing violence. Some downtown damage, as I recall.

So, I'll tell you this. I am grateful for all police officers who put their lives at risk to protect the rest of us. I *hope* they know how much they're valued by the law abiding. As I was unloading groceries, that chopper was overhead its sweeps getting wider, and growing closer. I didn't know then who they were looking for or what had happened, but with that level of police activity, I knew whatever it was was serious. I went inside, locked my door and stayed there.

"Unfund police departments" – really? I don't think so. And if you know anything about that shooting, our police department would like to hear from you.

requirement is unreasonable. As of June 10, 2020, the department has suspended the use of carotid holds to allow for further evaluation of this policy and in consideration of pending State legislation to disallow their use.

#### View Policy 300.3.5: Carotid Control Hold

Require de-escalation – De-escalation is interwoven into the department's operations and is included in the department's Use of Force De-escalation techniques are also included in various continued professional training topics. California law (SB 230) requires that "officers utilize de-escalation techniques, crisis intervention tactics, and other alternatives to force when feasible." SB 230 also mandates each policy require officers to conduct all duties in a manner that is fair and unbiased. Additionally, SB 230 requires all officers be trained in alternatives to deadly force and de-escalation techniques. The West Sacramento Police Department adheres to these

#### View Policy 300.1: Use of Force and Policy 300.3.3: De-Escalation

requirements.

Require warning before shooting – California law (AB 392) states: "where feasible, a peace officer shall, prior to the use of force, make reasonable efforts to identify themselves as a peace officer and to warn that deadly force may be used, unless the officer has objectively reasonable grounds to believe the person is aware of those facts." This requirement is also consistent with federal case law. The West Sacramento Police

Department adheres to these requirements.

Exhaust all other means before shooting - Our policy requires officers to evaluate the use of other reasonably available resources and techniques when determining whether to use deadly force, and deadly force is only used when there is an imminent threat of death or serious injury to the officer or another person.

Duty to intervene and stop excessive force by other officers – Our policy mandates a duty to intercede if any officer observes another officer using force that is unreasonable. California law (SB 230) also sets forth a "requirement that an officer intercede when present and observing another officer using force that is clearly beyond that which is necessary, as determined by an objectively reasonable officer under the circumstances." This provision is consistent with federal law as well.

Ban shooting at moving vehicles - While our policy does not ban shooting at moving vehicles, it is only allowed when the driver poses a deadly threat. Outright prohibitions in all circumstances does not account

for situations where the driver of a vehicle may be threatening death or great bodily injury to others. California law (SB 230) requires "Comprehensive and specific guidelines for the application of deadly force," which should include guidance on the limited situations that would warrant shooting at moving vehicles. Our policy includes this guidance.

Require use-of-force continuum - Law enforcement agencies vary whether they incorporate a use-of-force continuum. The West Sacramento Police Department has not formally adopted a use-of-force continuum, but our policies require officers to use only the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and totality of the circumstances. AB 392 and SB 230, signed into law in 2019, substantially changed California law to require that police officers may use deadly force "only when necessary in defense of human

Require comprehensive reporting each time an officer uses forces or threatens to do so - All uses of force are documented and reviewed. The department provides

life."

data regarding all officer-involved shootings and incidents involving use of force resulting in serious bodily injury to the California Department of Justice. The department recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting officers with the authority to use reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation, and a careful balancing of all interests.

#### **Use of Force Statistics:**

In 2019, the West Sacramento Police Department responded to a total of 64,920 calls for service. Only 31 of those calls (0.05% of total calls) resulted in a use of force by responding officers. No use of force instances resulted in major injuries or fatalities.

#### Demographics:

Our aim is to have a department that is diverse and reflective of those who call West Sacramento home. While we work to achieve that goal in our ongoing recruiting efforts, we are also working to develop interest in law enforcement as a career among the youth in our community.

According to the most recent data, the following is a breakdown of ethnicity for West Sacramento's population and for the West Sacramento Police Department.

### Two More Woodland Men Previously Released as a Result of California Judicial Council's Statewide Emergency "0" Bail Schedule are charged with new crimes

Two more individuals previously released from custody as a result of California Judicial Council's Statewide Emergency "0" Bail Schedule were charged with new crimes. The "0" Bail Schedule became effective April 13, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A complaint has been filed alleging a misdemeanor violation of obstructing a business and trespass. At the time Nelson was arrested for these crimes, he was on Mandatory Supervision following a vandalism conviction which resulted in him being sentenced to County Prison on December 9, 2019. As a result of these recent arrests, the Yolo County Probation Department filed a petition to revoke his Mandatory Supervision on May 28, 2020.

Thirty-year-old Woodland man, Clifford Garrison, was arrested on May 22, 2020, for negligent discharge of a firearm and was released on \$0 bail. He was subsequently arrested by the Woodland Police Department on May 31, 2020, for felony evading a peace officer with reckless disregard and driving under the influence. He was released again on \$0 bail. The Yolo County District Attorney's Office filed two complaints. The first alleging the negligent discharge of a firearm; the second alleges felony evading with reckless disregard and driving under the influence. Due to the court setting dates out 4-5 months out, Garrison's arraignment is set on November 3, 2020.

allows for counties to consolidate voting locations, requiring one voting location per 10,000 registered voters. Currently, Yolo County has 119,289 registered voters, which equates to approximately 12 locations. Additionally, counties are required to provide three days of in-person early voting starting the Saturday before Election Day and ballot drop-box locations must be available between October 6 and November 3.

"My office continues to work with leadership groups within the county and local jurisdictions to prepare for the upcoming election. We plan to secure optimal in-person voting locations and ample ballot drop-off locations to make returning Vote by Mail ballots as effortless as possible. Similar to the March 2020 Primary Election, return postage will be paid, so no stamp will be required to mail back your Vote by Mail ballot," says Salinas.
