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I Street Bridge final design revealed

The new I Street Bridge across the Sacramento River will feature benches for pedestrians to relax, a glass floor so they can see the water below and a graceful arch that will lift to allow boats to pass underneath.

Designed by T.Y. Lin International Group, the \$200-million bridge be the first span erected across the Sacramento River since 1966 when the Pioneer Bridge began carrying cars across the river to Interstate 80. The primary architect is Noel Shamble of T.Y. Lin. The final design was unveiled Friday, Feb. 21.

By the time the bridge is finished in 2023, the surrounding landscape will be strikingly different, with a new Major League Soccer stadium in The Railyards, new entertainment venues and green spaces along the Old Sacramento Waterfront. The Powerhouse Science Center will be operating just up the river in Sacramento. Kaiser is also planning to build a new hospital in The Railyards.



Built 108 years ago, the existing I Street Bridge is too narrow to serve buses, has no bicycle lanes, and has sidewalks that don't meet accessibility standards. It will continue to operate for trains, which cross on the lower level of the span. The cities of West Sacramento and Sacramento are exploring whether to turn the upper deck into a pedestrian park.

The design was the result of an extensive public process that included input from more than 3,800 people. It includes car lanes, bike lanes, and a broad pedestrian walkway with built-in benches to take in the view. "The public delivered, and I want to thank the public for being part of the process," said U.S. Rep. Doris Matsui, who secured federal funding for the bridge.

Local nonprofit wins grant to improve residents' health

West Sacramento looks to become a bit healthier as part of a nearly \$1.5 million grant.

The Health Education Council, a local nonprofit that seeks to cultivate health and well-being in underserved communities in West Sacramento and beyond, is being awarded by the Public Health National Center for Innovations and the Center for Sharing Public Health Services. The grant will provide as much as \$150,000 over the course of the next two years. It's money the nonprofit's representatives say is critical to their mission of improving the cardiovascular health of the city's residents.

"West Sacramento is a really interesting place and it has not always received the dedicated funding for prevention efforts that probably it deserves," comments council director of programs and impact Amanda Bloom. "And so this is a real opportunity for West Sacramento – for the organizations that it services the people who live here – to get together and plan, really, for the first time about how to deal with heart disease in the community."

Health Education Council states that heart disease contributes to nearly one in five deaths in West Sacramento. Furthermore, they point out that more than four out of ten children in the city are obese, which is more than the average for not just Yolo County, but the state of California as a whole.

Over the past year, the council hosted planning workshops with community members and leaders to highlight some areas in need of improvement. The workshops, along with feedback from residents, found that through improving access to fresher and healthier foods, making the city more appealing for walking, decreasing tobacco use, and developing a better sense of community can be key in reducing cardiovascular-related health issues among residents.

"There are a lot of studies that correlate cardiovascular disease with loneliness and other factors of mental health that could lead to other conditions," council program director Roxana Garcia-Ochoa says.

"We want to do some sort of multicultural event where it's inviting to the community...showcasing different food and appreciation for the different cultures," she adds. "It's something that we think is really important."

The nonprofit's commitment to improving the lives of the more in need communities of West Sacramento, along with the plans they have in place, helped catch the eye of the grant providers as they beat out roughly 160 others who submitted for grant funding.

Health Education Council won't be working toward a healthier West Sacramento alone as they're partnered with a number of public and private entities including the city of West Sacramento, Yolo County, and Kaiser Permanente Hospital. The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation funds the grant that the council will be receiving. The foundation sees these sort of partnerships as essential as the council works toward a healthier and happier community.

RCHS soccer wins in penalty kicks

The cheers of Lady Raider Girls Soccer Fans echoed through the Raider's stadium on Wednesday, Feb. 19, as the girls took on Lincoln from Stockton in the first round of Division 1 Sac Joaquin Section playoffs. After winning against Grant in their final league game the week prior in a 6-0 match, the Lady Raiders were crowned back-to-back Metro League champions as well as achieving an 8th seed in the D1 playoffs bracket, only the second year for this to happen. This allowed the Lady Raiders to host the first round of playoffs on their home turf as they faced off against the 9th seeded Lincoln Trojans.

After a hard fought first half, the game was still scoreless. At the beginning of the second half, the Trojans scored first and it seemed to light a fire under the Lady Raiders as well as the fans. 4 minutes after the Trojans goal, senior forward Marwah Abdali took a shot that rocketed past the opposing teams keeper. With the stands thundering, the game continued at a tie.



At the end of regulation, the score was at a 1-1 standstill leading to two 15 minute extra time periods. Despite both teams' best efforts, the score remained tied. After the final whistle, both teams set up for penalty kicks. As shot after shot and save after save were made, the result ended in a 2-2 tie. Due to the tie, the teams went into sudden death penalty kicks.

As the opposing teams' player lined up to take their shot, junior goalkeeper Hannah Wheeler got ready in the goal box to stop yet another shot. An uproar of cheering for Wheeler's save was soon silenced as junior Lillyana Jordan stepped up to take her shot against the Trojans keeper. With bated breath, fans watched as the ball sailed past the keeper into the back of the net.



As the team sprinted onto the field to dogpile in celebration, the stands roared with applause. The Lady Raiders advance in the playoffs and will take on a tough 1 seeded Davis High School. The two teams played to a 1-1 draw earlier this season.

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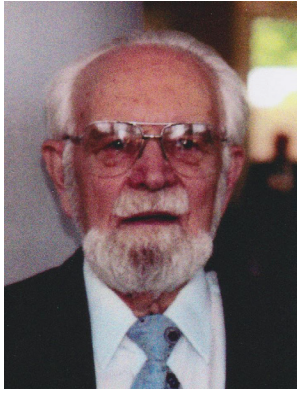
OBITUARIES

Joseph John Sokolich

Joe Sokolich, a long-time resident of West Sacramento, and member of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters for almost 80 years, drove his final nail home when he passed away peacefully on January 15, 2020, at the age of 98 years.

Born in Portland, Oregon, in April 1921, Joe grew up in San Pedro, California among the town's Croatian community. Joe attended San Pedro Senior High School, excelling as a runner on the track and field team. When not in school, he assisted the family by working odd jobs and helping with maintenance on his father's fishing boat. Following high school graduation, Joe enrolled carpentry trade school.

Joe joined the carpenters' Long Beach local. He was sworn into U.S. Navy as a Carpenter's Mate less than a week after the attack on Pearl Harbor and the United States entry into World War II. Joe spent the War on numerous Pacific Islands and Atolls repairing ships, boats, and landing craft.



After the War, Joe returned to Southern California to work as a carpenter. He spent more than 30 years working on homes, mostly in the South Bay of the Los Angeles area. During this time, Joe married his first wife, Hazel, built their house, and together they adopted their daughter Melinda.

In 1978, Joe retired and moved to Sacramento where he married Betty Fairbairn Finlayson Turner Vogel. He became Grandpa Joe to Betty's grandchildren, step-dad to her kids, and Grandpa to extended family and friends. He also became part of the art world in which Betty lived. He used his skills to hang art shows, build display stands, assist in making stained glass

windows, and in his own art form of woodturning. Additionally, Joe and Betty traveled all over the world visiting family and friends, as well as making new ones.

Through all of their activities and travels, West Sacramento was home. Joe spent many years serving Trinity Presbyterian Church using his knowledge and skill to help maintain the facilities. He served as the long-time host of their Men's Prayer Breakfast on Saturday mornings. He truly showed his faith through the caring and help he provided to anyone in need; he lived his life the same way he practiced his trade: plumb, level, and square.

In 2013, Joe and Betty moved into assisted living after Betty suffered a stroke. Following Betty's passing in 2014, Joe continued activities with friends and family until his passing last month. Joe is survived by his daughter Melinda, stepchildren Judy, Janet, and Pitt, as well as their spouses, 10 grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren, along with numerous great-great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and adopted grand relatives all around the world.

angle, if a breeze ruffles a few hairs out of place and his white roots need a touch up; you can see through his front-to-back auburn comb-over. And there it is. His pink no-hair scalp.
