### Dog license reminder: Unlicensed pets can lead to misdemeanors

The city of West Sacramento is promoting responsible pet ownership and has issued a reminder to get your dog licensed. Having your dog licensed is the law under Yolo County Ordinance 6-1.406. They state that there are two reasons for this. First, having a license increases the likelihood of the animal being reunited with its owner should the pet be lost. Second, it helps prevent rabies outbreaks due to the fact that a current rabies shot is required in order to obtain a license. Many people know that you are required to have your dog licensed (your horses too), but do not realize that it is a misdemeanor if they're not.

I personally got a ticket for not having my dog licensed, several years ago. I figured that it was no big deal and assumed it would be a "fix-it ticket". So I licensed my dog and took proof to Yolo County Animal Control, thinking it would get signed off. They told me that I would need to appear in traffic court. (I told them I didn't think that my dog could run fast enough to end up in traffic court.) I went to court, again thinking it would be signed off or dismissed. Again I was wrong. When they called my name, as I walked up to the podium the judge was telling his clerk that he didn't need to hear my case because he was just going to hold it over for trial. I ran up to the podium and said "Did you say trial your honor?" He said yes. I said "For my



# **Abortion Stories**

So, here we are again. Debating whether abortion should be legal. There are, of course, as many pre-legalized abortion stories as there were abortions.

The trump (no comparison pun intended) card for those who supported, and won, a 'woman's right to choose' was a Supreme Court that agreed with them.

Recently I read a quote who-knows-who positing that, "Women who've had abortions don't regret them."

In the interests of which, if a girl was havinterject here that I grew up in a conservative Christian household. Where my father, an elder in our church, had grown up forbidden to dance or play cards. "Sins," his mother told him. On my grandparents' working farm, only sons would go to college, and only if they paid for it themselves. Dad was an 'up by your bootstraps' kind of guy, who believed, and often said, "All welfare mothers should be sterilized." He did not, however, believe in killing of unborn welfare babies.

Prevailing 'wisdom' included: There's no such thing as rape because a girl can run faster with her skirt up than a boy can with his pants down. Virginity, at least in concept, was highly prized. Mothers cautioned daughters: No one will buy the cow if the milk is free. All girls knew you were more likely to 'land' a 'good' husband if you met this 'marriage material' in college.

> I went to a public high school. We were required to wear skirts to school. They could NOT be 'miniskirts' - which were all the rage.

In my high school, as far as I know, there were NO then-illegal abortions. A pregnant girl could not come to school. "Bad example." "A distraction." The few that got knocked up went to the Florence Crittenden Home for Unwed Mothers (and gave up the baby for adoption). I especially remember one senior girl: a cheerleader; "going steady" with the football team's quarterback/captain; always nice to everyone, including gawky sophomores (i.e. me).

A pretty blonde, one spring, she disappeared. A few months later, she came back. Her hair was brown. Her eyes were haunted.

By the time I went to college, 'back alley' abortions were not unheard of, following an era in which some desperate girls tried to end 'problem' pregnancies with a knitting needle or a coat hanger.

Here's the true story of one girl I knew in college. Very smart girl. "Pretty face." Self-conscious about her weight but couldn't shed it. One Friday, jocks invited her to a party at the frat house. There was a lot of drinking. The girl passed out – and the jocks took turns. She got pregnant.

A shady procedure in New York City 'took care of it.' Did she regret the abortion? I don't think so.

Several years post-college I got a call from a graduated college friend living in D.C. She'd just learned she was pregnant and was aghast. Didn't know if the baby was Long-time Boyfriend 1's, or New Boyfriend 2's. Months of indecision

followed. Five-months along, she finally decided on abortion. Snag. Her gynecologist wouldn't do it. She threatened to sue him because her contraception failed.

She ended things with Boyfriend 1. A year later or so, married Boyfriend 2. Soon, they had one son. Followed by two failed pregnancies. She got to thinking about the abortion. Secured the records. The aborted baby was a healthy boy. At 5 months, a fetus can survive outside the womb.

Regret that abortion? Yes. She did.

Today, abortion is, for the most part, legal. Here are recent stories: Two married women who, with their spouses, opted to abort a second preg-

Case #1: After years of trying, the couple was expecting. Both were, by then, successful in their careers. They adored their toddler, but now knew that a child is a lot of work. One was enough, the two decided, and aborted the toddler's sibling.

Case #2: The wife refused carry a second pregnancy to term after her husband, an off-andon provider, refused to give up pot. Their only child, a girl, is now a teenager.

And here's a third story: A Catholic friend whose husband is an OB/ Gyn. She married him, in part, she says, because he wouldn't do abortions. Her faith, melded with his conscience. They have two boys.

Even if today's Supreme Court reverses the pro-choice ruling, making abortion, again, illegal - it's likely that a California teenager who passes out at a frat party and winds up pregnant could still end the pregnancy. The same as any other rape victim.

But what about the possibility, maybe likelihood, of more babies being born to girls and women of insufficient means? Who perhaps lost their free birth control at Planned Parenthood when it lost its federal funding?

Back in the day, when some families had more babies than they had money, an excess baby might be abandoned in a back bedroom. Where, starving, it cried until it

dog?' He then explained that you cannot sign off a misdemeanor ticket without a trial. I was possibly looking at a fine and there was even a possibility of jail time.

I explained that I had fixed the situation, and that all of my dogs were now licensed. Eventually it got signed off. All I paid was the administrative fees. I'm sharing this with you because when it rains, it pours, and chances are if you are in a situation where you are being asked for your dog's license, there is already an issue. Dog licenses are cheap, and you can get them for 1 or 3 years. You will need proof of current rabies vaccine. Once you have that, you can license your dog at the Yolo County Animal Services, in Woodland. You can also license or renew your license on line at http:// www.licensepet.com/yolocounty. You will need the information as shown above. In addition, there are specific instructions on how to complete the process on line at https://www. yolocountysheriff.com/services/animal-services/online-license-renewals/. For questions regarding pet licensing or to obtain your pet's license renewal number please email petli-

censing@yolocounty.org.

A couple of other dog laws worth mentioning are, West Sacramento's leash law (Municipal Code Section 6.16.020, Dogs on leashes) states, "No owner shall permit his or her dog to be in any residential, commercial or industrial area, other than on private property where the dog is maintained by or on behalf of its owner, unless the dog is restrained by a leash not exceeding eight feet in length. The only exceptions are Police K-9s, dogs assisting those engaged in hunting with a license, and dog training or exhibitions conducted with the permission of the property owner." Also, dog owners are required by law to clean up after their pets according to Municipal Code Section 6.16.220.

Wildlife Corridors for Flood Escape on the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area

Within the Yolo Bypass, floodwaters rise from east to west. Wildlife including deer, furbearers, and ground nesting birds lack adequate cover to move out of lower areas or to escape aerial predation. Wildlife in the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area (YBWA) are regularly stranded in winter flood events. Since 2016, the Yolo County Resource District Conservation (RCD) has been leading a project to improve flood escape for wildlife, implement agriculture-compatible restoration, and engage the public. This effort will create five miles of cover for wildlife escaping flood events, enhance year-round habitat for migratory birds, pollinators and other wildlife, provide a public-access demonstration planting, and increase awareness and appreciation of the YBWA and its values and functions by holding high school field days and community volunteer stewardship events.

At this month's Flyway Nights speaker series event, Heather Nichols will be talking about the 'Wildlife Corridors for Flood Escape in the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area' project. Heather has been the Executive Director for the Yolo County RCD since 2014. She oversees the project management of the Wildlife Corridors project and has been working with California Department of Fish and Wildlife and the agricultural lessees in the Yolo Bypass for the past five years. She has been planning and managing conservation projects on Yolo County farms and ranches

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# Free tax help available in West Sacramento through United Way, now taking appointments

Sacramento residents are eligible for free help preparing taxes and claiming credits this year, saving an average of \$200 in preparer fees and earning up to \$6,500 in credits. Participating households must have earned \$60,000 or less in 2019. United Way California Capital Region's Free Tax Prep program will provide help at Las Casitas Public Housing, Yolo County Children's Alliance and Arthur F. Turner Library. The program will begin taking appointments on Jan. 21. For more information, visit YourFreeTaxPrep.org or call toll-free to (800) 500-4931.

"More than a third of households in the Sacramento region are a paycheck away from homelessness," said Stephanie Bray, president and CEO, United Way California Capital Region. "United Way's Free Tax Prep program not only saves them preparer fees, it puts money back in their pockets through tax credits that many people don't even know they are eligible for. For some families, receiving \$6,500 in tax credits can mean the difference between paying rent and living on the streets. For others, it seeds a child's college savings account, buys a car to take children to school or provides for a future emergency."

United Way's Free Tax Prep program kicks off on Feb. 1 with IRS-certified volunteers providing free tax return preparation with electronic filing and helping guests claim the maximum tax credits for which they are eligible, including the federal and state Earned Income Tax Credits (EITC and Cal EITC), Child Tax Credit, American Opportunity Education Credit, and the new Young Child Tax Credit. Free Tax Prep community events will occur throughout the greater Sacramento region during tax season, and help also will be available at dozens of sites during the week in multiple languages in Amador, Placer, Sacramento and Yolo counties.

Age qualification for Cal EITC expanded last year to include ages 18-24 and working adults ages 65 and up, giving more taxpayers the opportunity to earn credits, including those who are self-employed. Many Cal EITC-eligible households are not legally required to file taxes due to low income; however if they file, they can claim state and federal credits. Regardless of who prepares their taxes, those who claim EITC, Cal EITC or Child Tax Credit should plan for their refund to be delayed until end of February, due to federal law.

More than \$11 million in refunds were claimed across the Sacramento region in 2019 through United Way's program, up more than \$1 million from the previous year. More than 9,000 local households received free help from nearly 500 volunteers in 2019, saving a total of \$1.8 million in tax preparation fees.

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# Yolo Community Foundation Awards More Than \$50,000 via Buck Grant

The Yolo Community Foundation (YCF) has awarded a total of \$52,320 to eight Yolo County nonprofits through its third annual Buck Education Grant. promising ideas and programs to the next level. Yolo County nonprofits have truly taken advantage of this funding and have implemented creative and impactful programs that continue to enrich education locally."

#### Grantees include:

Yolo Farm to Fork (\$9,920): From Seed to Food is a pilot program from Yolo Farm to Fork for teachers serving low income and English language learner populations. The program will provide teachers with eight garden-based learning modules, for grades K-5, focused on growing and consuming healthy food seasonally.

United Way California Capital Region (\$5,000): "Woodland Kids Read and Dream" has partnered with Woodland Rotary Clubs to invite all first graders on a field trip to Woodland Community College for a celebration of reading. The event supports early childhood literacy by making reading fun for young kids with interactive storytelling, activities, a personalized book and the opportunity to meet with local community professionals.

Yolo Crisis Nursery (\$5,400): The Yolo Crisis Nursery (a liscensed child abuse prevention program) will partner with the Davis Arts Center to provide an arts program as an enhancement to their licensed preschool program.

Sci-Tech KL (\$2,000): The STEAM Ball Run Wall will provide a space to create ball runs. Students of all ages will use this during recess and other outdoor times to work individually or collaboratively to create, engineer, and design ball runs.

Mondavi Center for Performing Arts (\$10,000): The Mondavi Center will bring its performing arts resources to Marguerite Montgomery Elementary School in Davis.

Putah Creek Council (\$10,000): Through this grant, the Putah Creek Council will expand the Putah Creek Club, an after-school environmental education program for Winters Middle School students, to reach more low-income youth. The club builds understanding, appreciation, and stewardship of Putah Creek through educa-

tion, exploration, and hands-on habitat stewardship projects.

Inspire Tech (\$5,000): Through Inspire Every-Girl, Inspire Tech will develop a new program to provide STEM workshops to one hundred girls in Yolo County.

Winters Robotics Inc. (\$5,000): Winters Robotics will use the grant to fund the Winters Robotics team entry into competitions and grow its program.

President of Yolo Farm to Fork, Suzanne Falzone, said, "The Buck funds will allow us to work directly with several teachers as they use their edible gardens as labs to address multiple content standards with hands-on lessons designed to excite students' curiosity and discovery."


