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Raising the big top: Cirque du Soleil raised new big top at Sutter Health Park

For the first time after 18 years, Cirque du Soleil raised the new big top at Sutter Health Park on Thursday, Jan. 16 readying the location for tonight's (Jan. 22) opening night. Battling inclement weather, more than 60 men and women worked for several hours pounding pegs, unfurling the canvas and pushing more than 100 supporting poles to make the intimate tent its shape.

Here are some facts about the Amaluna big top and the Cirque du Soleil village:

- The Big Top seats more than 2,600 people
- The entire site set-up takes 8 days—this includes installation of not only the Big Top, but also the concession tents, artistic tent, box office, administrative offices, and kitchen
- The Big Top stands at 62 feet (19 meters) high and is 167 feet (51 meters) in diameter
- The 4 masts each stand at 82 feet (25 meters) tall each
- The Big Top, the VIP, concessions, and artistic tents are all climate controlled
- Amaluna travels in 78 trailers, carrying close to 2,000 tons of equipment

About the production

Cirque's Amaluna invites the audience to a mysterious island governed by goddesses and guided by the cycles of the moon. Their queen, Prospera, directs her



daughter's coming-of-age ceremony in a rite that honors femininity, renewal, rebirth and balance which marks the passing of these insights and values from one generation to the next.

In the wake of a storm caused by Prospera, a group of young men lands on the island, triggering an epic, emotional story of love between Prospera's daughter and a brave young suitor. But theirs is a love that will be put to the test. The couple must face numerous demanding trials and overcome daunting setbacks before they can achieve mutual trust, faith and harmony.

The name Amaluna is a fusion of the words ama, which refers to "mother" in many languages, and luna, which means "moon," a symbol of femininity that evokes both the mother-daughter relationship and the idea of goddess and protector of the planet. Amaluna is also the name of the mysterious island where the story unfolds.

Amaluna's Tony Award-winning Show Director, Diane Paulus, drew from a series of classical influences when creating the

Formed in 1920, the League of Women Voters (LWV) celebrates its 100th anniversary on February 14, 2020. The LWV of Woodland is joining with more than 700 other local and state chapters to celebrate this historic milestone.

On February 14 the LWV of Woodland will be hosting a Centennial Gala Celebration at Historic Hotel Woodland, 436 Main Street in Woodland, 6-8:30 p.m. The evening will feature a talk by nationally recognized author, lecturer, and activist, Dr. Sally Roesch Wagner, who will speak on women's suffrage and the movement that made it happen. Dr. Roesch Wagner was awarded one of the first doctorates in the country for work in women's studies and is a founder of the CSU Sacramento women's studies pro-

gram, one of the first women's studies programs in the United States. She has taught women's studies courses for 50 years and currently serves as an adjunct faculty member in The Renée Crown University Honors Program, Syracuse University and the St. John Fisher Executive Leadership Program.

The League of Women Voters of Woodland has been educating voters and working to create a more perfect democracy since 1975. The grassroots organization encourages the informed and active participation in government, working to increase understanding of major public policy issues, and influence public policy through education and advocacy.

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THIS 'n' THAT

How Old is Old Enough to Get a Pet?

For the sake of argument (or in this case, LOTS of arguments), let's say getting a pet is tied to a child's promise to 'take care of' said pet. Feed it. Clean up after it. Etcetera and so forth.

When my parents bought a farm, I wanted a dog. They got me a dog. At age 10, my sole responsibility for said dog was: Keep it out of my dad's garden.

Not too much later, I started pestering for a horse. Dad said, "If you want a horse, you'll have to earn it." By earn it, he meant earn 10,000

'points.' Example: Do the dishes by hand without complaint (we had no dishwasher. I HATED doing dishes.) But, when I did them, I got 10 points. I did a lot of dishes. Some chores, such as stacking firewood, I enjoyed. 20 points for that! Little by little, month by month, I edged closer to my goal.

Complicating this project, however, were the demerits. With ADHD, I 'earned' a few. By 16, I still needed 1,820 points to get a horse. Mom took dad aside. "Lloyd," she said, "if we don't get Carol a horse now, she'll be off to college before she has one."

Now, you may not agree with the folks not sticking to the points plan, but I will tell you this: I not only swore I'd be 100 percent responsible for Ringo, I stuck to it.

Mucked his stall. Cleaned his feet. Bathed

him. Brushed him. Fed and watered him. Walked him down each time I rode him. Joined 4-H to learn about proper horse care – and compete in horse shows. (We took first place in bareback riding!)

So, short version: With me, 16 was 'old enough' to care properly for a pet.

Conversely, age 3 was definitely too young to get a dime store turtle. I wanted to watch it swim. So dragged a stepstool over to the bathroom sink. Turned the hot water on. Tragedy. I screamed. I sobbed. Even now, I wish I could undo it.

As my son was growing up, we learned that certain pets require a lot of upkeep. For one, you cannot housebreak them. Ferrets. Guinea pigs. Hamsters. Rabbits. With each addition, Mike promised he'd take care of it. I finally put my foot

down. No more animals in cages.

Stuck to it, too. The only 'caged' pets on the farm I bought when Mike was 10 were 'caged up' in pastures.

When he was 17, we moved to California, car-avanning in two cars. Our farm dog, Dodger, rode with Mike. Pumpkin, the cat, rode with me.

Years later, when Mike made up his mind to give college another shot, he moved back in with me and helped me with assorted stuff that made my neck and back hurt. One day, he came home from Petco with a Bearded

Dragon. Sensing I wasn't sold on this small lizard, he cajoled me. 'Bearded Dragons are really cool, mom,' he said, and besides, 'Darwin' would be the first 'pet' that was really 'his.' All the others, he said, were mine.

(mm hm. Because I fed them.)

Darwin, he assured me, would live in his bedroom, and, he said, I was not to play with it. Fine, I countered. Then he would do everything for his lizard. Clean the tank. Change out its water. Chop 'greens' into tiny pieces. All of it.

He rose to the challenge. Fully and whole-

heartedly, he took perfect care of 'Darwin' – and also conquered college.

Bottom line: For most kids, becoming 'responsible' is a work in progress. So, how old is old enough for a child to get a pet and assume its care? Only you can make that call. Decide ahead of time whether you'll step in if the pet's 'owner' forgets to feed it. 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Xin Jiang Agrees to Settlement Prohibiting Unlicensed and Unsafe Food Delivery Through His Business "Anna's Kitchen"

The Yolo County District Attorney's Office reached a settlement with Xin Jiang, the owner of "Anna's Kitchen," a popular Chinese food delivery business that operated through WeChat and primarily marketed itself to Chinese foreign exchange students at UC Davis in a civil enforcement action. The Yolo County Environmental Health Division began investigating Mr. Jiang after receiving multiple complaints from UC Davis students who reported becoming

ill after ordering and consuming food prepared and delivered by Anna's Kitchen. The investigation revealed that Mr. Jiang did not have a permit to operate a food facility in Yolo County, and had repeatedly delivered hundreds of meals that had not been kept properly hot or cold for extended periods of time, increasing the likelihood of food-borne illness. The settlement was approved by Yolo County Superior Court Judge Peter M. Williams on Dec. 18, 2019.

Mr. Jiang admitted wrongdoing and is no longer operating Anna's Kitchen. Mr. Jiang will pay \$106,997 in costs and penalties, and will forfeit an additional \$90,000 in penalties if he is discovered operating Anna's Kitchen or offering any type of food for retail purchase without a valid permit going forward. Anyone with an outstanding "VIP Card" balance may obtain a cash refund or restaurant credit at Hunan Bar & Restaurant, located at 207 D St. in Davis.
