

Maria Grijalva threw in her name for city council in this November's general election

Born in Houston Texas, Maria hails from the southern most part of Texas, where she "was raised straddled" to both sides of the border in Harlingen Texas and with the border town of Matamoros Mexico. She attended a catholic school during her elementary years, and later public schools. At 18, Maria attended Texas Southmost College and earned honor studies one semester. She also attended six months of a 1-year program in the general construction program in Texas State Technical Institute.

At 25, Maria moved to Sacramento with her children to continue her education at Sacramento City College. She became a regular part of her children's elementary schools and preschool as a volunteer. She served the Sacramento Unified School district for more than five years as a parent volunteer. She attended Sacramento State where she finished her BA in Psychology. While at CSUS she was involved in Mecha, where she "became involved in pressuring the psychology department to hire people of color."

While at Sac State she had volunteered to work in Joe Serna's campaign for mayor and continued to work in other campaigns, including for Deborah Ortiz when she ran for city council and later assembly, as volunteer coordinator. During the floods of 1997, Maria applied for state service.

West Sacramento Mayor Christopher Cabaldon released the following statement in response to the trag dy in Dallas:


The City of West Sacramento stands with the people, the city, and the police department of Dallas. We offer our support to the families of the officers slain last

As Dallas Mayor Rawlings said, "In the end three things remain: faith, hope and love. We need all three today." He has called on each of us to face the challenges of race, policing, community, and safety head-on, with both steely resolve and humility. He's right.

The officers and staff of our own West Sacramento Police Department put themselves on the line every minute of each day. The city they serve is no less committed to protecting their own safety.

I want citizens of every race, every sexual orientation, every religion, and every neighborhood in West Sacramento to know that the horrors they have seen in videos and pictures in other parts of the nation are not our reality. Independent agencies that track police-involved fatalities report that West Sacramento is one of the only cities in the region to have had none during this century. That isn't an accident, as the men and women of the department strive to meet ever-higher standards of ethics, performance, and transparency, and as they lead the way in implementing 21st Century community policing practices that build genuine trust. Our city doesn't use policing as a way to grow our fine revenues, and we don't hire white supremacists.

We are human beings and imperfect, and we will make mistakes. So your involvement, activism, scrutiny, and protest must make us continuously better as a department, as a city, and as a community. So, too, do your smiles, encouragement, and, on days like today, your sympathy.

legislative and budget analysis. She has worked on local and state policy issues that increased employment opportunities for the disadvantaged; protected vulnerable children, and the elderly, blind and disabled; enhanced access to health insurance; promoted self-sufficiency for those that have experienced long-term unemployment and homelessness; and improved the early education system. She has also worked with the Turning Point Community Program providing mental health services to children and families in the Sacramento region.

In addition, Martha serves currently Chair of the West Sacramento Planning Commission, a member of Yolo County's Citizen's Advisory Transporta-Committee, and the Yolo County Local Mental Health Board. Her prior commission and council appointments include: Universal Pre-School for West Sacramento (UP4WS) Advisory Council, Aging Commission, and the Economic Development Advisory Commission.

Martha Guerrero, a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, earned her Bachelor's Degree in Social Work from the California State University, Los Angeles, and a Master's Degree in Social Work from the University of Southern California.

She got picked up at office of emergency services in the Individual Assistance Program.

In 1999, she applied at DMV, ending up in the Legal Affairs Division writing regulations (administrative law) for 10 years.

Her nonprofit Latino Information and Resource Center created an audio book of the driver license manual in Spanish because of the high illiteracy rate. Her nonprofit was also the lead organization that responded to DMV proposed regulations that would require applicants to have a birth certificate that was no more than six months old from issue date.

After Maria retired she went back to working campaigns, including with Kevin McCarty for assembly, Norma Alcala for supervisor, Hundal for Mayor, and then Alcala for school board. The school board had a vacancy, which Maria applied for but didn't get.

When the mothers of "Broderick Boys" came to her asking for help, Maria became aware that she lived in "the safety zone" as opposed to the gang injunction zone. She started attending city council meetings and due to dissatisfaction with meeting procedures regarding public participation, she formed the nonprofit and has been teaching the mothers how to organize.

Maria sat on the board of directors of Festival De La Familia from 2007 to 2009, was on the board of directors Washington Neighborhood Center in 2009. Currently, she's the administrative coordinator for the Chicano Latino Caucus of the California Democratic Party, with the goal of putting Latinos in public office. Additionally, she founded Google Community, Spiritual Awakening with over 8,000 members.

Fridays are for Senior Citizens at the California State Fair

Anyone over the age of 62, is invited to celebrate their seniority on "Seniors Savings Fridays" at the California State Fair. A discounted admission of \$8 is offered on Fridays July 8. 15, and 22, 2016. The gates open at 10 a.m. and close at 10 p.m. All senior citizens ride free on the grand carousel and the giant wheel.

It is best to get to the fairgrounds, located on Cal Expo Boulevard, early to secure a parking place near the entrance gate. By arriving when the gates open, you can make your way around the State Fair when it is cooler, finish up your day early and get home before dark.

Before you leave home, make sure you have packed any medications that you might need during the day. Do you have your contact information with you in case there is an emergency? Once you are inside the fair, don't forget to pick up a map of the State Fair, and the daily schedule of events. Note any emergency help locations, just in case you may need them. Do you know where the restrooms are located?

By looking over the schedule you can plan your day, see where the activities are that you are interested in seeing, and note the times that they start. You should be wearing comfortable walking shoes and have a summer hat with you for shade. Cool clothing is great on those hot July days at the State Fair.

As far as amenities go, seniors and others are offered wheelchair and scooter rentals, which can be reserved ahead of time. If you need to stay out of the July heat, the Expo Buildings are air conditioned. California Buildings A, B, C and D offer great exhibits and entertainment. There are also animal shows and competitions, live music from bigname bands and tons of delicious fair food. The State Fair is also the only time of year when people can ride the monorail, one of only two working monorails in California.

There is a covered picnic area complete with misters at the Coca-Cola Promenade. This location has a great view of the SMUD Promenade Stage and is just steps away from a variety of food options. You

might want to start by enjoying the live horse racing at the Miller Lite Racetrack Grandstand and simulcast betting at the Satellite Wagering Facility.

Here are a few of the exhibits. demonstrations, and events that are taking placing on Friday, July 8. The Wildlife Exhibit is open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the Forest Center. You can walk the nature path to learn about the many animals that are native to our California forests. You will see rescued animals and learn their stories, and by doing so, increase your appreciation of wildlife and their forest habitats.

From 2:30 to 3:30 p.m., there will be "Homemade Fruit and Berry Jam Judging" at the Save Mart Supermarkets California's Kitchen - Cooking Theatre. From 10 a.m. to 10 p.m., the River City Quilters Guild will be presenting quilting demonstrations along with hands on quilt block designing for the public at the California Crafts Exhibit in the Expo Building No. 8.

At the Do It Yourself Center, Save Mart Supermarkets California's Kitchen vou can learn from "The

Best" at the Food Preservation Demonstrations by the Master Food Preservers of Sacramento, from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. They will also be sponsoring a Cheese Shoppe, which is open until 8 p.m. The Orland Farmstead Creamery was awarded five medals in The California State Fair's Commercial Cheese Competition. Find out what winning tastes like!

Watch Ballroom Dance Performances by Arthur Murray Carmichael from noon to 12:30 p.m. at the PG&E Center Stage B. And come back later in the evening from 8 to 8:30 p.m. to see the Acrobats of Hebei China.

The California State Fair, which is held at the Cal Expo in Sacramento each July, is a multi-week event that has been taking place for over 150 years. It's a non-stop exhibition of fun and entertainment for the whole family to enjoy, with activities ranging from thoroughbred racing to corn dog and pie eating contests and athletic events like soccer and motocross as well as engaging educational events for kids.

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
