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West Sacramentans come together for car crash victims

After the tragic accident that took the lives of two Bridgeway Elementary School parents Lloyd Tinsley, 37, and Stefanie Finnegan, 37, on Monday, April 11 on Southport Parkway at Lake Washington Boulevard, community members immediately came together to pay their respects and provide love and support to their families.

Stefanie leaves two young children, Andrew and Aubrey, son Nick and husband, Robert Fin-

negan. Lloyd leaves 10-year-old daughter Abigail.

According to a report by News10, Abigail's mother passed away when the little girl was only 5 years old. To further the hardship for Lloyd, he developed cerebral palsy when Abigail learned how to walk. But despite those challenges, he was a loving father and enjoyed baseball with his daughter.

"Lloyd was a single father, raising his daughter after her mother passed away five years ago. Lloyd's daughter was everything to him. He always put her first and she was his pride and joy," reads a

message on the GoFundMe Page that was created for him.

Meals for families have been planned, GoFundMe pages created, an ongoing food drive has been created at Stefanie's church, fundraisers have been planned and a vigil was held at Bridgeway on April 12, just over 24 hours after the tragedy. Filling the adjacent park, children and their parents shared their love of Stefanie and Lloyd.

A poster each for Stefanie and Lloyd were decorated and designed by the attendees showing their love and support. Tea lights

and candles were lit as more and more people filled the park.

"(Stefanie Finnegan) was completely beautiful inside and out. She was one of a kind, completely active in the community," said vigil attendee Stephanie Littlefield. "I've only known her for about six months, but that's just how she was. You felt like you knew her forever."

"She was such an amazing mom," said another attendee who declined to give her name. "Everything was about her kids and her husband. They've been married 11

Potential Yolo Rail Realignment Offers Positive Economic Benefits

Yolo County, the cities of Davis, West Sacramento and Woodland, and the Sacramento Area Flood Control Agency are excited to announce completion of the Yolo Rail Realignment Economic Benefits Study.

Prepared with support from a 2014 U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant, the study analyzes the economic potential of relocating the rail line that runs through the centers of Davis and Woodland, and extending rail service to industrial areas in Woodland, the west side of West Sacramento and the Port of West Sacramento. Study findings show rail relocation could generate substantial economic benefit in Yolo County and align well with regional flood protection options currently being studied.

With last week's U.S. EDA conference and the Sacramento Metro Chamber's annual Capital-to-Capital trip this week, the timing and tangible outcomes of this collaborative effort are particularly meaningful for Congressman John Garamendi (D-CA-03) and Congresswoman Doris Matsui (D-CA-06).

"I strongly encouraged this collaborative partnership to apply for the EDA grant to study this project during the Cap-to-Cap trip in 2013, because I saw the potential value it could bring our

Woodland child molester will not be paroled

Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reisig announced Wednesday, April 13, that convicted child molester Michael Ward will remain in state prison for at least another three years. Ward's parole hearing was scheduled to be heard before the Board of Parole Hearings at the California Health Care Facility in Stockton on April 12. Prior to the start of the hearing, Ward signed a hearing waiver, agreeing to remain in prison and delay his next hearing for three years. This is the fourth time Ward has not been granted a parole date.

A Yolo County Jury convicted Ward of child molestation involving two young girls in Woodland in 1996. Ward had sent pornographic Polaroid photographs through the

mail to an undercover Utah Special Agent. A search warrant was obtained and other evidence was found linking Ward to two young girls whom he had photographed and molested, according to a press release from Reisig's office. Ward has admitted molesting numerous other young children in Woodland. On October 17, 1997 a Yolo County judge sentenced Ward to 15 years-to-life for Lewd or Lascivious Act upon Child Under Fourteen With More Than One Victim.

Supervising Deputy District Attorney Christopher Bulkeley, who prosecuted the case in 1996, appeared at the hearing. Bulkeley was prepared to argue against Ward's release based upon his prior record, his lack

of any insight into his criminal behavior, his complete lack of parole plans and most importantly his continuing danger to the public. Ward excelled at grooming young neighborhood children and building trust with them in order to manipulate them for his sexual purposes. He was known as "Magic Mike" because he could pull a quarter out of a child's ear, he posed as Santa Claus for the children in his apartment complex and provided them with candy, ice cream and other treats. Ward has admitted to molesting 100 children in his lifetime.

The mother of one of the victims attended the hearing accompanied by Yolo County District Attorney Victim Advocate Estela Morales.

Morales read a written statement to the board. In the letter the mother stated, "The defendant preyed on my daughter among many others in the community, and I urge you to keep the defendant in prison to prevent future crimes against children and to prevent others from experiencing the abject emotional trauma my daughter and our family continue to live with." The Board was appreciative of this letter and an additional letter from the victim.

According to District Attorney Jeff Reisig, "The result of a three year waiver means that the victim and her family's wish, that Mr. Ward remain imprisoned for the safety of the children in our community, was met."

On Saturday, April 30th, the Sailing Club of West Sacramento is having an open house featuring free sailboat rides. Hours are from 10:30 am to 3:30 pm. Warm clothing is advised. Life jackets will be provided, however, very small children cannot be accommodated. Some refreshments are available for purchase. The open house has been held for well over seven years. They are particularly interested in having local families attend. "Sailing is not expensive", says Tom Heavey, Vice Commodore of the Club, "the wind is free and it is phenomenal along the Delta."

Although the "Lake Washington Sailing Club was founded in 1932, "it is still a big secret" in West Sacramento. The clubhouse and harbor have been located at the Port of West Sacramento since 1964. Recent launching improvements have been made. The location is also home to four other boating clubs. The Lake Washington Outboard Motor Club is

primarily for fishermen. The Sailing Club has a special youth program and partners with several high schools for a sailing program, although not River City High School, as yet. The club has over two hundred members. They charge a reasonable membership fee and have special team rates for youth. Sailboats are also available for rental. New members must pass a weekend sailing course.

Unlike Sacramento Yacht club, the Lake Washington club is "strictly sail." In June, there are special nighttime races which are open for public viewing. Every year there is a race which begins with the tide at Rio Vista. The small sailboats which are housed there are Lido 14's, Sunfish, Laser, Thistles and 14' Day Sailors.



They even have sail boarders. The club hosts an annual dinner at the Pheasant Club. They are members of the Pacific Yacht Association and as such have reciprocal privileges in Bay area clubs.

Tom Heavey tells me that sailing puts one in touch with nature. "There have been whales, sea lions, spectacular birds, fish, muskrats, beavers and blue herons at the port." "We're

here to create a love of sailing in the general public. Tom has been sailing since he was fourteen years old. "It is a fascinating sport," he tells me.

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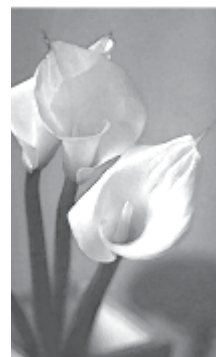
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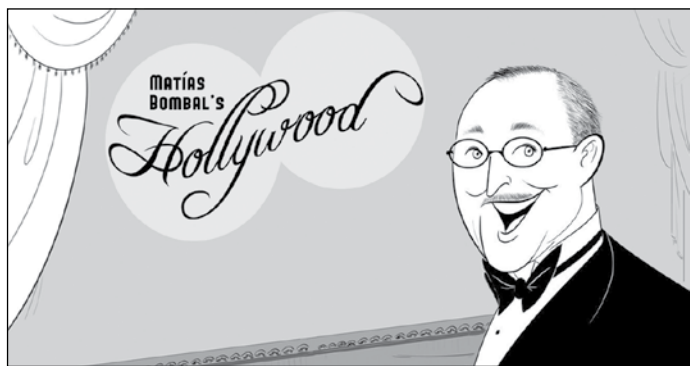
# Matías Bombal's Hollywood

**THE JUNGLE BOOK (2016)**

*The MPAA has rated this PG*

Walt Disney brings us another telling of Rudyard Kipling's "The Jungle Book", this time in IMAX and regular theatres, which they adapted from the classic collection of stories by the famous author, first written in 1894. In 1967, Disney's animated version with wonderful music became immensely popular, though varying from the original stories. They again returned to the story for their 1994 release, "Rudyard Kipling's The Jungle Book" with Jason Scott Lee, and "Jungle Book 2" in 2003. There have been numerous other film and television adaptations, the most beautiful, also live action and in Technicolor, may likely be Zoltan Korda's version from 1942 which starred Sabu.

This time Disney's opus is directed by long-time independent actor, Jon Favreau. It appears to be live action, yet you may be sure computer wizardry is afoot. This is indeed a very engaging telling of the classic tales where the law of the jungle holds forth. I came to this from a perspective of reading the stories in childhood and then seeing the 1967 animated feature, which



made a profound impact on me. The voices of great personalities like George Sanders as Shere Kahn and Baloo the bear, so perfectly fitting the real Phil Harris who voiced him, are indelible parts of my memory.

Shortly after seeing the 1967 version, I was taken to visit a family friend, Vicente Urbistondo, who had been a film critic and later professor at UC Berkeley. That day, he had a house guest, a gentle looking slender old man with a shock of white hair, who I had been told had been an actor in movies. I was not yet 5 years old when this man leaned down to look at me and gently extended his hand to greet me. I was on my very best behavior in the era when children were seen and not heard. Suddenly, he spoke very softly. I was stricken by great fear and ran screaming from the room! It was Sterling Holloway and I thought the snake from "The Jun-

gle Book" was alive in the room and talking to me.

This is really a wonderful movie and very well made. Sir Ben Kingsley narrates and also is the voice of the sleek black panther Bagheera. Early in the picture young Mowgli must leave the pack of wolves to which he had been entrusted. The parental wolves are voiced by Giancarlo Esposito as the father wolf Akela and Lupita Nyong'o as Raksha, the mother wolf. He'll go on to stumble into adventures with Baloo the Bear, get into Kaa's terrifying grip, and run from Shere Kahn's terror.

This new picture is by far the most delightful time I have had at a Disney movie in the last five or more years. It is outstanding from start to finish, and I felt the kind of fun I've not had at the movies since I was a child! It was full of adventure, wonder and highly entertaining throughout. I find that most Disney movies

are preachy about political correctness, however, director Jon Favreau does not use that typical Disney approach, instead relying on excellent storytelling ability and stunning visuals, made even more impressive should you see this bigger than life in an IMAX presentation.

Top Hollywood talent has been brought on board for this production, including the voices of Bill Murray as Baloo the Bear, Idris Elba as Shere Kahn, and in his last work for the screen, the late Gary Shandling gives voice to the porcupine Ikki. Director Favreau has a dedication to him at the end of the credit crawl, in memoriam.

The most interesting choice in casting was King Louie, played by the always entertaining and

unexpected Christopher Walken. If you are used to the king from the animated version, so perfectly tailored to the personality of jazz hound Louie Prima who voiced him, at first you won't know what to think of Walken's performance. However, it is only a matter of seconds before he has completely won you over. How his first sequence is introduced may be my favorite moment in the picture, but I won't tell you, you'll just have to see it.

My deep seated fear of snakes, so vibrant since my childhood encounter with Sterling Holloway, was rekindled with fear and allure by Scarlett Johansson as the famous serpent Kaa, made so much more effective by the remarkable stereo-

phonic 5.1 sound reproduction used in the IMAX presentations. This picture is also in 3-D so when Kaa looms in, that snake is in your lap!

Magnificent IMAX, and also showing in other theatres in 3-D, this is the most I have been entertained by new movie in recent memory, as a joyful smile was fixed on my face thorough the whole experience. Once again, I was a child at a Saturday afternoon adventure matinee, thrilled by what I saw up there on the screen. One not to miss no matter what your age.

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# RCHS Engineering Program Sweeps Awards

Six students from River City High School Engineering and Science academy competed in the SkillsUSA competition, which was held in San Diego on March 31st to April 2nd.

SkillsUSA is a partnership of students, teachers and industry professionals working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce for the 21st century. The competition is divided into 6 sections: A Professional Development Proficiency test (PDP), customer service exam, written examination in electronics, soldering, breadboarding (a construction base for electronics) and troubleshooting.

The students were asked to build a circuit and then solder it, as well as measure a circuit using an oscilloscope (a tool used to measure voltage) and solving problems based on that information. They also had to troubleshoot multiple devices and solve multiple computer programs such as wire testing, and troubleshooting boards.

Sedikeh Yusufi, the lead teacher for the Engineering and Science Academy at RCHS, has worked

hard for 6 years to develop a program for students interested in careers in that field. Before the competition, Yusufi and the six students that travelled to San Diego put in extra work to get them prepared.

"I made sure that I got them ready for the competition by working with them hours after school, weekends and never letting them feel that it was too hard and that they could not reach their goals," said Yusufi.

RCHS junior Jagjit Singh, one of the students who competed said, "I practiced every Wednesday and Friday and some Saturdays before the competition with Mrs. Yusufi and she was very helpful

and she had us well prepared before we left."

Singh said, "The competition was tough, but Mrs. Yusufi had us well prepared for it and it was an amazing experience, I cannot wait till I go back next year to compete again."

At the end of the competition, RCHS students swept the medals in the electronics competition. Roman Yamaletidnov won Gold Medalist, Jade Pascual won Silver Medalist, and Calvin Jang won Bronze Medalist.

"I feel really accomplished to have won the silver medal because the test itself took me more than 10 hours. I've spent months practicing and studying beforehand, and I was competing with other people from all over California," said senior Jade Pascual.

As part of the competition, advisors from the 6 regions are recognized by the SkillsUSA organization. Yusufi was recognized as the Region 4 Advisor of the Year.

"I am honored and privileged that many of my students recognized my dedication and passion for teaching and nominated me," said Yusufi.

"Mrs. Yusufi is the best! She has helped me so much, even with other things besides SkillsUSA. Without her, I wouldn't have achieved as much as I have throughout my years of high school," said Pascual.

region," said Congressman Garamendi. "This project demonstrates how federal support, regional collaboration and broader, more comprehensive analysis results in new opportunities to align major infrastructure projects that can reduce costs and increase regional flood protection, public safety and economic growth."

"The more efficiently we are moving goods, the more our economy will grow, which is why I've worked with the EDA to fund the Yolo Rail Relocation project," said Congresswoman Matsui. "The findings of this study reinforce the value of crafting multi-benefit, regional infrastructure projects that generate new economic opportunities that advance the entire region. Rail realignment could spur rede-

velopment and increase public safety, creating opportunities for new homes, businesses and jobs in our community."

Economic growth opportunities, including redevelopment in urban corridors presently impacted by rail lines, increased rail access for agribusiness and industry and creation of sustainable employment were examined. Using a 20-40 year full-build-out timeframe, the study found net new commercial and residential development enabled by the phased rail relocation could generate between 38,700 to 53,200 ongoing jobs countywide and beneficial economic impacts projected at between \$5.9 and \$8.1 billion of annual output (market value of goods and services, including \$2 to \$2.7 billion of labor income).

Opportunities to significantly reduce the estimated \$156-335 million project costs by

integrating the rail relocation project with other flood control projects under consideration in Yolo and Sacramento counties were also identified. By eliminating 22 at-grade crossings, the project will improve access and increase safety. The relocated line will also allow for the proposed widening of the Sacramento Weir and Yolo Bypass, and will remove of the short-line rail trestle over the Yolo Bypass providing increased flood protection for the entire Central Valley.

The Yolo Rail Realignment Partnership will continue to seek state and federal funding to move this project forward.
