West Sacramento Prepares for Storms, Possible Flooding

A flood watch has been issued for Yolo County and surrounding communities in anticipation of heavy rains over the next several days. The National Weather Service says excessive rainfall on already saturated soils and swollen rivers will likely result in some minor flooding through Sunday.

The City of West Sacramento and the Yolo County Office of Emergency Services are working together to monitor the situation and provide helpful information to the public.

Residents are urged to take caution around rising rivers and streams. Motorists are advised to avoid flooded streets and to be on the lookout for debris on the roads resulting from strong winds and runoff.

The West Sacramento Fire Department's Office of Emergency Services will be providing continuous monitoring of the weather and river levels; and general situation status.

Public Works has increased staff levels to handle any storm related issues, including downed trees and detours around flooded streets.

Sandbags are being made available for residents and businesses. See sandbag location

The West Sacramento Police Department has conducted patrols along the river to inform the public of potential river levels rising.

The Reclamation Districts are monitoring levee conditions, and during periods of heavy rain checking the function of the internal drainage system 24 hours a day.

What can you do?

Register with Yolo Alert to receive messages about important public safety information.

Keep your cell phones charged.

Have a flashlight and batteries in case the power goes out.

Have an emergency kit at home and in your car.

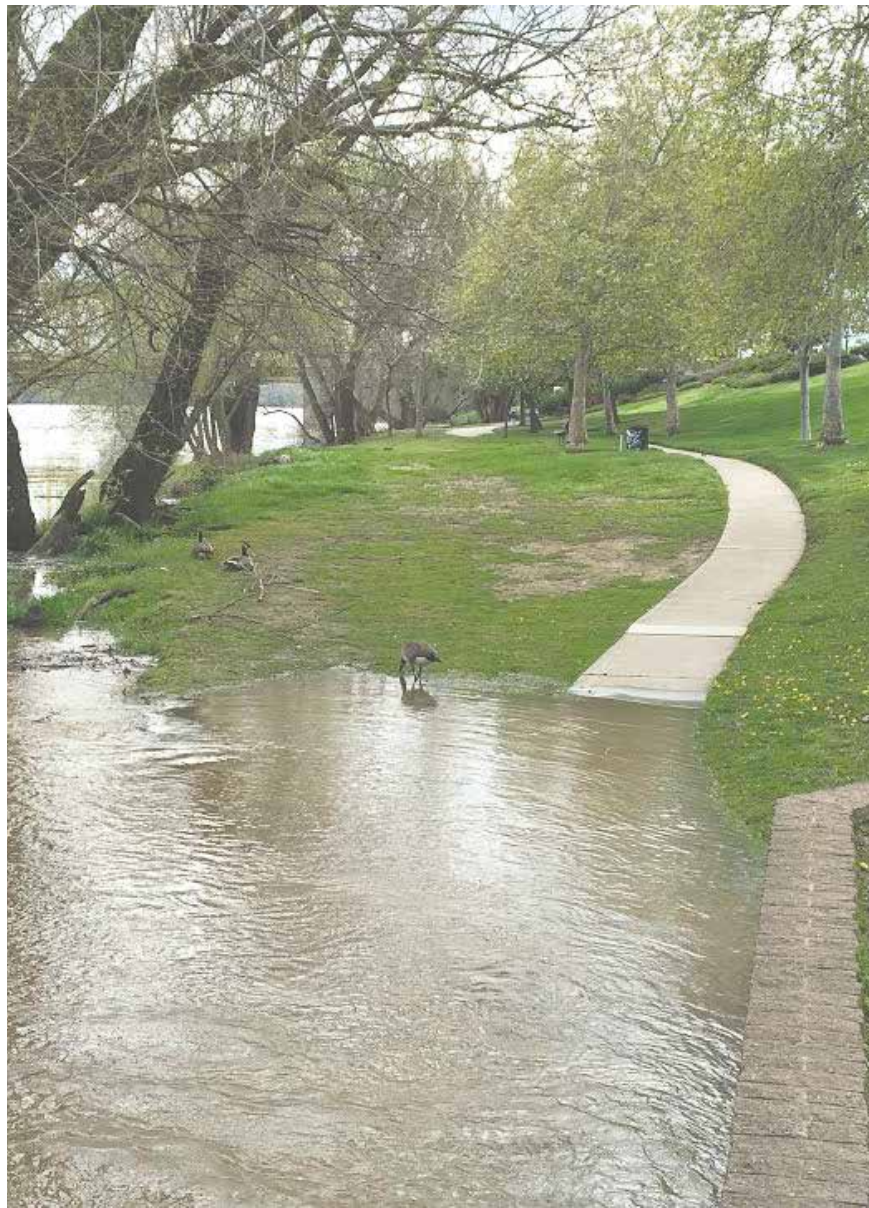

Little Leagues Merge in West Sacramento

Little League came to West Sacramento in 1953. It was a much simpler time then, and it seemed the entire town was excited about bringing baseball to the children of our community. It was a common sight to see a team photo hanging on the wall of local businesses.

Its popularity took off like wildfire. West Sacramento's Little League became official when it was chartered in 1954 by Williamsport, allowing for the children in our league to be eligible for advancement in competition beyond our town limits.

It wasn't just West Sacramento that was organizing a local little league. Little leagues were popping up all over the Sacramento area. By 1954, California was being divided into 33 original districts.

West Sacramento fell within the boundaries of D6. Once the district offices were established, it became the responsibility of those offices to han-

Long Time Coach, Permanent Legend

Chris Baker, a West Sacramento native and long-time Raider, was named the head coach of River City High School's varsity football team last week.

Coach Baker started coaching football in 1974 and started coaching for the Washington Unified School District in 1976, making this his 40th season in West Sacramento.

This will be Baker's third tenure as head football coach, although he retired as a teacher at River City three years ago, he has been an assistant coach and on the sidelines throughout his entire career.

"I've always been involved in one level or the other of either Junior or Varsity, so it's not like I've gone anywhere, it's just that I've just changed the official title. So I never left," said Baker.

He is taking over a team that went 2-8 the previous season with many of those losses being lopsided blow outs. Since he has been involved in the program and knows many of the players already, he has a solid understanding of what needs to be done to make the team successful.

"I think I'm up to speed on our strengths and weaknesses and what we need to do to get better and where we are in the pecking order and the teams we compete with," said Baker.

Part of his plan to restore Raider Pride in the football program includes bringing back alumni and influential community members to connect the present and the proud past.

"...we want to select noteworthy people who

have contributed [to West] Sacramento and specifically this school and honor them," said Baker.

Not only is this a big year for Coach Baker as he prepares for the challenge of being head coach, but this is also a big year for his son, RCHS Senior Gabriel Baker. Gabriel had the opportunity of playing football here while his father was the assistant coach and has been immersed in RCHS football since he was a child, so he's familiar with his father's coaching style and what he believes his father will bring to the program.

"His enthusiasm is not only explosive but contagious to his staff as well as his players," said Gabriel, "He pours his heart and soul into this program to give the kids the greatest chance possible to succeed."

Gabriel said he was beyond excited for his father's returning role as head coach and that he won't be coaching alone. "This time he is supposed [to coach] with another local legend Coach DePrato as offensive coordinator to lessen the stress load."

The Raiders will have their work cut out for them in their first game next season against Liberty Ranch High School, a strong team from Galt that is returning several skilled athletes from last year's team. Regardless of the competition River City has already started their off-season conditioning program and is getting ready to represent the community of West Sacramento.

"I grew up here, it's my home," said Coach Baker, "I have a ton of energy, I'm a competitor, I love to win and I hate to lose. River City High School is the best place for me to be and I think that makes it good for our kids and our players.

West Sacramento wins nationwide contest to become next LRNG city: FutureReady to receive \$30,000 grant to launch programming this summer

West Sacramento has been named one of eight winners in the national LRNG City Challenge, which will award a \$30,000 grant to West Sacramento's FutureReady Program. The winners were announced Thursday at SXSWedu in Austin by LRNG CEO Connie Yowell who announced a major expansion of the LRNG Cities movement.

LRNG is a new, youth-centric movement focused on turning learning into a lifestyle.

With LRNG, young people can pursue their passions, connect with peers and mentors, and access new paths to college and career.

As an LRNG City, West Sacramento will build partnerships between existing community resources on and offline to help the city's youth learn anywhere and anytime. FutureReady will coordinate local efforts with the national LRNG movement.

"The induction of West Sacramento into the network of LRNG cities is representative of how committed we are as a city to prepare our youth for success in college and career," said

FutureReady executive director Ian Winbrock. "FutureReady will be leveraging these resources to enhance existing efforts with the school district, employers and the city."

West Sacramento joins a national movement that includes Chicago, Dallas, Pittsburgh and Washington, D.C., which have already worked as established LRNG Cities. Other LRNG City Challenge winners include San Diego and San Jose CA; metro Columbus and Springfield, OH; Kansas City, MO; Rochester, NY; and Philadelphia, PA.

In May of 2013, West Sacramento Mayor Christopher Cabaldon launched FutureReady, a program of the West Sacramento Foundation designed to build college and career readiness for local high school students. The mission of FutureReady is to train the next generation of West Sacramento's workforce by connecting in-class curriculum to project based learning with relevant businesses in order to produce real benefits for both employers and students.

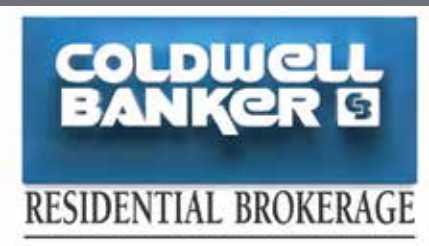
