The Sail Inn is Back in Port

The Sail Inn on Jefferson Boulevard is being reopened and rechristened as the Sail Inn Grotto & Bar. Launch date is late February. All aboard.

The old Sail Inn, its full name The Sail Inn Food and Spirits, has been closed since August, 2013. That's when Joan Washburn lost her lease to run the place, which she had been doing since 1986.

The Sail Inn was a family owned property of the Kristoffs, best known for Bill Kristoff, the longest-serving member of the West Sacramento City Council. The new restaurant and bar retains a Kristoff family member, Ellie Marie, but now includes Archie Morse as the chief owner. The new management team also has equity in the business.

A West Sacramento landmark, The Sail, as it was simply known to most folks, was a working-class bar that served good food and made people feel welcome. A port of call for many on a long Friday night, the bar appealed beyond its State Streets location to the greater Sacramento area. Although the exterior may have been rough, the bathrooms small and scary, the Harleys parked outside intimidating, few places exuded a greater charm for after work, after a River Cats' game, or after the kids were left with the sitter. The new managers understand this.

The Sail's operating team are Garrett Van Vleck, Jason Boggs and Alex Origoni. They are behind the wildly successful and nationally recognized Shady Lady Saloon across the river. Van Vleck used to go to the Sail Inn. "I went there several times. In renovating the place, I think we kept a lot of the old roadhouse feel and the basic nautical theme, but we cleaned it up considerably and brought everything up to code. I hope the people in West Sac will appreciate the transformation and enjoy the nod to what it used to be." He says there will be a varied cocktail menu and surf food to complement the sea-faring theme.

So when does the party start? "I think we should be open near the end of February. We are still debating the exact night time hours. We'll probably stay open until midnight on the weekdays and 2 a.m. on Friday and Saturday. Possibly open at 11 a.m. for lunch and keep serving food until about 10 p.m. at night. We may have some live music and DJs occasionally but no juke box or karaoke. There also won't be a pool table but we are still discussing the possibility of some bar games."

The Sail Inn's transformation may change its looks but not its destination to good times. Instead of a tramp steamer, perhaps West Sacramento will have a boutique cruise ship with a good living attitude. And a Mai Tai. All aboard.

Hollywood comes to West Sacramento as the annual Father **Daughter Dinner Dance turns 21**



Adult Wellness Center Re-**Opens in West** Sacramento

As part of the mission of the Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency to provide comprehensive mental health services to adults and transition-age youth (16-24), the Adult Wellness Centers were established in Woodland and West Sacramento. Unfortunately, the Recession resulted in a reduction in funding and staff; and consequently, the closure of the West Sacramento location in 2010. In order to access services, clients living in or near West Sacramento had to travel to the Woodland location using transportation vouchers or bus passes.

On Tuesday, Jan. 19, The West Sacramento location re-opened its doors in a new larger expanded location on Jefferson Avenue. The space, which previously housed the county's WIC program office, is now re-purposed and better equipped to serve the mental health needs of West Sacramento residents. It offers a wide range of rehabilitative services including; group support activities, socialization skill-building, arts and crafts classes and workshops, job readiness, and access to computer labs.

"We are grateful to have the Adult Wellness Center re-open in West Sacramento," said Yolo County Supervisor Oscar Villegas. "This center will allow West Sacramento residents struggling with mental illness an opportunity to receive social support, life skills and the opportunity to feel more connected to their community."

The Woodland and West Sacramento MHSA Adult Wellness Centers are funded by the Mental Health Services Act, through the MHSA Community Services and Supports "Adult Wellness Alternatives Program." According to Joan A. Beesley,



Mental Health Services Act Manager, the recent availability of space formerly occupied by the WIC program, as well as the post-recession expansion of the county's mental health staff, enabled the county to re-open a MHSA Wellness Center.

Tracey Dickinson, Homeless Program Coordinator, reported the partners and service providers in the new complex were excited to see the center re-open and the variety of programs and services available for participants.

The Wellness Centers are a drug-and alcohol-free environment and participation is limited to behavioral health consumers receiving services. Eligibility is determined by the clinical supervisors or managers, based on clinical need.

The current hours of operation for the West Sacramento Adult Wellness Center are Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Yolo County hopes to increase hours in the future. A schedule of weekly activities is posted online. For more information, contact Kristen Cline, Director and supervising clinician at (916) 375-6340.



Walt Disney Studios Motion Pictures their visualization of a real historical event with "The Finest Hours," the story of a dramatic rescue at sea in the most difficult of conditions. Thrilling and realistic, it's based on Michael J. Tougiis and Casey Sherman's book of the same name. It has nothing to do with the Columbia Pictures release of 1964 about Winston Churchill with exactly the same title.

This is the harrowing true story of an oil tanker that split in half during one of the worst recorded East Coast storms which battered New England in February of 1952, and the brave Coast Guard men that risked their lives in a very small craft through and over seventy foot-high waves to rescue the surviving tanker crew of 30 sailors. Intercutting between the story on the remaining floating portion of the tanker's stern and the men at the Coast Guard station, this movie shows the remarkable possibility of human spirit.

On board of the T-2 tanker SS Pendleton the men without a captain had been lost on the forward part of the ship. They are torn about what to do: Escape by lifeboat or stay on board?

The tanker's chief engineer, Ray Sybert, played by Casey Affleck, tries to bring reason to a moment of terror by organizing the men at the stern of the ship and suggests manually controlling the rudder in order to run the ship aground onto a sand bar. While these sailors fear their last moments are at hand, the Coast Guard is on the way. But not in force.



Remarkably, not far whilst a work in the galaway up the coast a second oil tanker also has been split by the weather in the rough seas. Many Coast Guard men and the largest craft in the region had been sent out on that distress call before the closer disaster of the SS Pendleton had been discovered. RT Announces New RT Policy requiring Swiping (Sliding) of Magnetic Fare Cards on Buses

RT bus passengers are now required to swipe (slide) all passes and tickets with a magnetic stripe through the farebox upon boarding buses to confirm validity. Fare media with a magnetic stripe include monthly passes, semi-monthly passes, daily passes (pre-paid, farebox-issued and fare vending machine-issued), and pre-paid single ride tickets.

Passengers using RT photo ID cards with valid fare stickers (Disabled pass, Senior Pass, etc.) or Sac State Commuter sleeves and Los Rios Community College Student Access Cards as a form of fare media, do not need to swipe upon boarding.

Confirming validity via the magnetic stripe will help prevent counterfeiting and fraudulent use.

On buses, customers are asked to have passes and tickets ready to swipe to expedite boarding. On light rail trains, passes and tickets must be available for visual inspection.

For Yolobus passengers purchasing Daily Passes issued out of Yolobus fareboxes, which are valid on RT, RT has the following guidance:

If a pass is swiped (slid) through an RT bus farebox and gets a negative sound, RT drivers have been informed to visually inspect the pass. Customers will not be turned away unless the pass is not valid, "expired" or appears to be fraudulent when the RT driver does a visual inspection.



Mustard Seed School was established in 1989 to help meet the needs of homeless children. Many school

Mustard Seed is a free, private school for homeless children 3-15 years old which provides a safe, nurturing

age children do not attend school because of their homelessness; some lack immunizations, birth certificates, or other documents, some are in transit, and almost all lack a support system. In spite of their situations these children are eager to learn and to be accepted.

Many homeless children are not enrolled in school because the places their families find to sleep are often not near a child's school and the family only plans to be there a short time. Sometimes the school needs an address or updated immunizations which homeless families cannot provide.

From fifteen to thirty-five children may not attend our school each day, and an average stay is just three to four weeks. Some children have been out of school for a long time and need help to go back. A major goal of the Program is to prepare and enroll homeless children into public schools, and preschool for younger children, when families have found housing stability. Since the school began, over 4500 individual children have participated in Mustard Seed.
