The Sail Inn is Back in Port

The Sail Inn on Jefferson Boulevard is being reopened and rechristened as the Sail Inn Grotto & Bar. Launch date is late February. All aboard.

The old Sail Inn, its full name The Sail Inn Food and Spirits, has been closed since August, 2013. That's when Joan Washburn lost her lease to run the place, which she had been doing since 1986.

The Sail Inn was a family owned property of the Kristoffs, best known for Bill Kristoff, the longest-serving member of the West Sacramento City Council. The new restaurant and bar retains a Kristoff family member, Ellie Marie, but now includes Archie Morse as the chief owner. The new management team also has equity in the business.

A West Sacramento landmark, The Sail, as it was simply known to most folks, was a working-class bar that served good food and made people feel welcome. A port of call for many on a long Friday night, the bar appealed beyond its State Streets location to the greater Sacramento area. Although the exterior may have been rough, the bathrooms small and scary, the Harleys parked outside intimidating, few places exuded a greater charm for after work, after a River Cats' game, or after the kids were left with the sitter. The new managers understand this.

The Sail's operating team are Garrett Van Vleck, Jason Boggs and Alex Origoni. They are behind the wildly successful and nationally recognized Shady Lady Saloon across the river. Van Vleck used to go to the Sail Inn. "I went there several times. In renovating the place, I think we kept a lot of the old roadhouse feel and the basic nautical theme, but we cleaned it up considerably and brought everything up to code. I hope the people in West Sac will appreciate the transformation and enjoy the nod to what it used to be." He says there will be a varied cocktail menu and surf food to complement the sea-faring theme.

So when does the party start? "I think we should be open near the end of February. We are still debating the exact night time hours. We'll probably stay open until midnight on the weekdays and 2 a.m. on Friday and Saturday. Possibly open at 11 a.m. for lunch and keep serving food until about 10 p.m. at night. We may have some live music and DJs occasionally but no juke box or karaoke. There also won't be a pool table but we are still discussing the possibility of some bar games."

The Sail Inn's transformation may change its looks but not its destination to good times. Instead of a tramp steamer, perhaps West Sacramento will have a boutique cruise ship with a good living attitude. And a Mai Tai. All aboard.

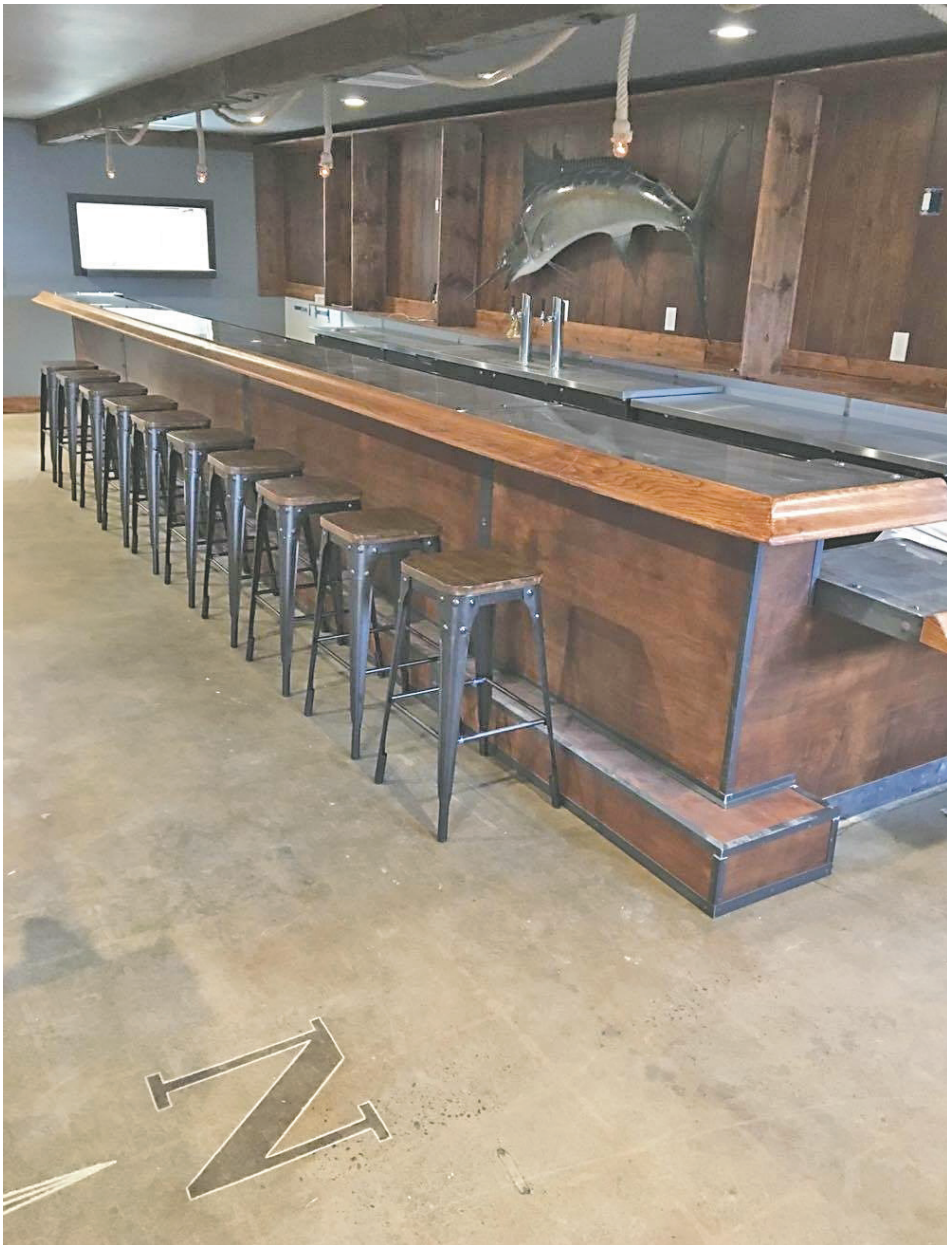

Artwork for Joey Lopes Park

The art installation for Joey Lopes Park will be a knock-out. The City Council voted on Wednesday, Jan. 13 to accept a design from nationally known artist Michael Clapper of Denver, Colorado. He beat out over 75 submissions. There were no artist submissions from West Sacramento. Commissioners from the City of West Sacramento's Arts, Culture & Historic Preservation Commission weighed in on the decision as well as the Yolo Arts Council, City staff, an outside artist, and a landscape architect. The artwork will cost \$70,000, less than two percent of the budget to build the new park off of West Capitol.

Joey Lopes was a hometown boxer who fought in the late 1940s and throughout the 1950s. At many times he competed at the Memorial Auditorium across the river. In his early career he was selected for the 1948 U.S. Olympics

boxing team. He went on to fight three times for the World Lightweight crown. A community leader in retirement, Lopes did work for the West Sacramento Sanitary District, the West Sacramento Optimist Club and the West Sacramento Babe Ruth Baseball League. It was only natural that a park be named after him, and just as naturally a fitting tribute to him in art would be constructed.

As solid as the boxer and community steward himself, the stone and steel artwork will show Lopes at the height of his powers, in profile, reaching out to deliver a punch. The metal's rusty finish connects with his blue-collar roots, the son of a grocer, fighting his way toward the top of his sport. Where did the ideas and inspiration come from to produce such a design?

Michael Clapper says he drew on materials supplied to him by the Yolo Arts Council and the West Sacramento Historical Society. But as with all



of his projects, he did his own independent research as well, even taking to watching old Joey Lopes fights now on YouTube. Along the way, Clapper said he could identify with Lopes rise from a working-class neighborhood, as he did from north-east industrial Ohio, the first in his family to graduate from college.

A collaborative effort, Clapper's team includes an engineer, a graphics company, a water-jet shop that cuts steel, and even an electrician to

provide the installation's night-lighting. As this article goes to print, the artwork's stone is being brought from Kansas to Clapper's studio. Preparations are underway to meet a tight deadline, with late May the hoped for completion date. Clapper wants West Sacramento to know that he is proud and pleased to be selected as the champion for Lopes' tribute and hopes that it will embody the boxer and civic leader's spirit: fighting for community.

Adult Wellness Center Re-Opens in West Sacramento

As part of the mission of the Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency to provide comprehensive mental health services to adults and transition-age youth (16-24), the Adult Wellness Centers were established in Woodland and West Sacramento. Unfortunately, the Recession resulted in a reduction in funding and staff; and consequently, the closure of the West Sacramento location in 2010. In order to access services, clients living in or near West Sacramento had to travel to the Woodland location using transportation vouchers or bus passes. On Tuesday, Jan. 19, The West Sacramento location re-opened its doors in a new larger expanded location on Jefferson Avenue. The space, which previously housed the county's WIC program office, is now re-purposed and better equipped to serve the mental health needs of West Sacramento residents. It offers a wide range of rehabilitative services including: group support activities, socialization skill-building, arts and crafts classes and workshops, job readiness, and access to computer labs. "We are grateful to have the Adult Wellness Center re-open in West Sacramento," said Yolo County Supervisor Oscar Villegas. "This center will allow West Sacramento residents struggling with mental illness an opportunity to receive social support, life skills and the opportunity to feel more connected to their community." The Woodland and West Sacramento MHSA Adult Wellness Centers are funded by the Mental Health Services Act, through the MHSA Community Services and Supports "Adult Wellness Alternatives Program." According to Joan A. Beesley,



Mental Health Services Act Manager, the recent availability of space formerly occupied by the WIC program, as well as the post-recession expansion of the county's mental health staff, enabled the county to re-open a MHSA Wellness Center. Tracey Dickinson, Homeless Program Coordinator, reported the partners and service providers in the new complex were excited to see the center re-open and the variety of programs and services available for participants. The Wellness Centers are a drug-and alcohol-free environment and participation is limited to behavioral health consumers receiving services. Eligibility is determined by the clinical supervisors or managers, based on clinical need. The current hours of operation for the West Sacramento Adult Wellness Center are Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Yolo County hopes to increase hours in the future. A schedule of weekly activities is posted online. For more information, contact Kristen Cline, Director and supervising clinician at (916) 375-6340. The West Sacramento Adult Wellness Center is located at 500-B Jefferson Blvd. The Mental Health Crisis & Access Line is toll free - 24 hours a day, seven days a week at (888) 965-6647. 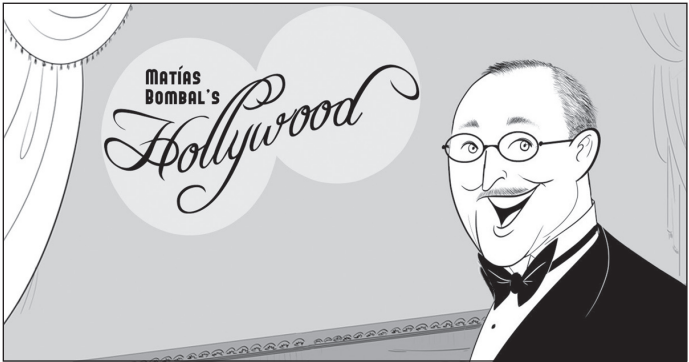
The Finest Hours
The MPAA has rated this PG-13

Walt Disney Studios Motion Pictures offers their visualization of a real historical event with “The Finest Hours,” the story of a dramatic rescue at sea in the most difficult of conditions. Thrilling and realistic, it’s based on Michael J. Tougias and Casey Sherman’s book of the same name. It has nothing to do with the Columbia Pictures release of 1964 about Winston Churchill with exactly the same title.

This is the harrowing true story of an oil tanker that split in half during one of the worst recorded East Coast storms which battered New England in February of 1952, and the brave Coast Guard men that risked their lives in a very small craft through and over seventy foot-high waves to rescue the surviving tanker crew of 30 sailors. Intercutting between the story on the remaining floating portion of the tanker’s stern and the men at the Coast Guard station, this movie shows the remarkable possibility of human spirit.

On board of the T-2 tanker SS Pendleton the men without a captain had been lost on the forward part of the ship. They are torn about what to do: Escape by lifeboat or stay on board?

The tanker’s chief engineer, Ray Sybert, played by Casey Affleck, tries to bring reason to a moment of terror by organizing the men at the stern of the ship and suggests manually controlling the rudder in order to run the ship aground onto a sandbar. While these sailors fear their last moments are at hand, the Coast Guard is on the way. But not in force.



Remarkably, not far away up the coast a second oil tanker also has been split by the weather in the rough seas. Many Coast Guard men and the largest craft in the region had been sent out on that distress call before the closer disaster of the SS Pendleton had been discovered. With less than a handful of men and a small motor lifeboat, the timid yet resolute Bernie Webber, played by Chris Pine, risks all to find the SS Pendleton, while pelted by the worst conditions in their careers.

They remain determined to reach the men in distress, without compass, having barely survived the giant waves crashing on a giant underwater sandbar from multiple directions.

Director Craig Gillespie has crafted an excellent and thoroughly entertaining movie that I feel is one of the strongest January releases in recent memory. In a month that is famous for being the month of the year when most major studios dump the worst movies in their release slate, here is something you will find excellent entertainment.

Nice touches, too. We are reminded of the era of this event when the cook on board the SS Pendleton, Tiny Meyers (Abraham Benrubi), sings “Sit Down, You’re Rockin’ the Boat” from the Broadway production of “Guys and Dolls”

whilst a work in the gallery. The movie version of “Guys and Dolls” did not come out until 1955. Chris Pine is excellent as Webber, but this movie really belongs to Casey Affleck. I first was really impressed by Affleck as an actor in a dismal movie of 2013 called “Out of the Furnace” in which his performance was riveting. As the silent but strong chief engineer of the SS Pendleton, Affleck remains one of my favorite actors to watch. I think he will only continue to impress us with outstanding work.

Also propelling movie is the concurrent story of Chris Pine’s love interest, played by lovely Holliday Grainger. She turns in a winsome performance as the girl that will get her man to marry her in April, come hell or high water. Above the bar for January release,

this is a perfect movie to see on the big screen. Carter Burwell, nominated this year for an Oscar for his work on the movie Carol, has written an appropriate musical score. I was thoroughly entertained by “The Finest Hours”. You’ll want to stay through the credits on this one, as you are shown comparative photos of the actors and the real life men that they played in the film as well as real images of the actual event.

Kung Fu Panda 3

Twentieth Century Fox continues the adventures of Po, voiced by Jack Black, the slightly slow but adorable animated Panda bear now in his third adventure with “Kung Fu Panda 3” This has a terrific line-up of popular stars of today lending their voices to the animated characters, some back from the previous movies, some for new ones introduced for the first time in this story.

Po’s long lost father Li re-appears into his life, from out of nowhere. Actor Bryan Cranston, nominated for his titular role as “Trumbo” this year, voices the father. This places a schism of attentions between the

rediscovered father and Mr. Ping (James Hong), the goose that adopted Po, and has him help out at his noodle house. Lovely Kate Hudson voices the tempestuous Mei Mei who has a panda pash for Po. Good turns come from Jackie Chan as Monkey, Dustin Hoffman as Shifu, Angelina Jolie as Tigress, and J.K. Simmons as the evil Yak, Kai, the antagonist of the animated photoplay.

The rather light story line of Kai’s push to conquer and steal the Chi of all of the kung Fu masters, defeating them and turning them into jade allows for silly asides and light froth well suited for kids but rather dull for adults. However, the movie, in 3-D, is lovely to look at with beautiful backgrounds that are truly stunning and seem incongruous with the jocular Jack Black’s dialog. Po travels with his father and the jealous Mr. Ping, dawdling not far behind, to the enchanted land of the pandas, to muster an army to fight the supernatural Yak menace.

Not much story, but for kids, fun comedy with talented voices. What made this movie wonderful for me was the singular talent of the voice of Mr. Ping, performed by 86-year-old actor James Hong. Mr. Hong’s career

is the history of the modern cinema. The Minneapolis born Asian actor was once a guest on Groucho Marx’s “You Bet Your Life” in the golden age of television. He began his movie career in un-credited bits in such classic films as “Love Is a Many Splendored Thing” (1954) and “Blood Alley” (1955).

Over the years, such movies as “The Sand Pebbles”, “The Hawaiians”, “Chinatown”, “Bound for Glory”, Ted Post’s “Go Tell The Spartans”, “The World’s Greatest Lover”, and “Airplane!” were all enriched by his presence. You may remember him in “The In-Laws”, “Big Trouble in Little China”, and “Tango and Cash” but he is likely most remembered by today’s audiences as Hannibal Chew in Ridley Scott’s “Blade Runner” of 1982. At 86 and still working is a great testament to a great actor that makes any movie better by just being in it.

“Kung Fu Panda 3” is fun for kids, but mostly forgettable. Bryan Cranston’s rich voice is a joy to listen to. Do savor the lavish and beautiful backgrounds. With every word that you hear Mr. Ping say, know that voice is one that has been a golden goose for Hollywood.

RT Announces New RT Policy requiring Swiping (Sliding) of Magnetic Fare Cards on Buses

RT bus passengers are now required to swipe (slide) all passes and tickets with a magnetic stripe through the farebox upon boarding buses to confirm validity. Fare media with a magnetic stripe include monthly passes, semi-monthly passes, daily passes (pre-paid, farebox-issued and fare vending machine-issued), and pre-paid single ride tickets.

Passengers using RT photo ID cards with valid fare stickers (Disabled

pass, Senior Pass, etc.) or Sac State Commuter sleeves and Los Rios Community College Student Access Cards as a form of fare media, do not need to swipe upon boarding.

Confirming validity via the magnetic stripe will help prevent counterfeiting and fraudulent use.

On buses, customers are asked to have passes and tickets ready to swipe to expedite boarding. On light rail trains, passes and tickets must be available for visual inspection.

For Yolobus passengers purchasing Daily Passes issued out of Yolobus fareboxes, which are valid on RT, RT has the following guidance:

If a pass is swiped (slid) through an RT bus farebox and gets a negative sound, RT drivers have been informed to visually inspect the pass. Customers will not be turned away unless the pass is not valid, “expired” or appears to be fraudulent when the RT driver does a visual inspection.

Mustard Seed is a free, private school for homeless children 3-15 years old which provides a safe, nurturing and structured environment, a positive learning experience, happy memories, survival resources of food, clothing and shelter referrals, medical and dental screenings, immunization updates, counseling for children and their parents, and assistance entering or reentering public schools.

Mustard Seed School was established in 1989 to help meet the needs of homeless children. Many school age children do not attend school because of their homelessness; some lack immunizations, birth certificates, or other documents, some are in transit, and almost all lack a support system. In spite of their situations these children are eager to learn and to be accepted.

Many homeless children are not enrolled in school because the places their families find to sleep are often not near a child's school and the family only plans to be there a short time. Sometimes the school needs an address or updated immunizations which homeless families cannot provide.

From fifteen to thirty-five children may not attend our school each day, and an average stay is just three to four weeks. Some children have been out of school for a long time and need help to go back. A major goal of the Program is to prepare and enroll homeless children into public schools, and preschool for younger children, when families have found housing stability. Since the school began, over 4500 individual children have participated in Mustard Seed.
