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It's Getting Out of Hand

California's poverty rate climbed in the first quarter of 2023, the latest quarter measured by the Public Policy Institute of California. Poverty increased from 11.7% in 2021 to 13.2%, the institute said, with 5 million people living in poverty.

Safety net programs played a major role in recent shifts in the state's poverty rate.

During the pandemic, the federal government expanded such social safety net programs as tax credits for families with children and emergency food assistance, which lowered poverty rates nationwide. Poverty rates jumped when those expansions expired late last year and earlier this year, said Caroline Danielson, a researcher at the institute.

"We're seeing an uptick in poverty. That's not because the economy is worse- it's actually improving— but it's because we temporarily, using federal funds mainly, had expansions of safety net programs," she said.

About 3.2 million more Californians would be in poverty without any safety net programs, Danielson said. Expanded CalFresh food assistance alone kept 1.1 million people out of poverty in the first quarter of 2023, when that expansion expired, the report said.

Latinos make up about half of Californians living in poverty, despite being 39.7% of the population. By comparison, about 10% of white Californians live in poverty.

Child poverty leaped from 9% in 2021 to about 14% in early 2023, largely due to the expiration of social safety net expansions. In 2019, the child poverty rate was about 18%.

Senior Californians also experienced a higher poverty rate at

15%, compared to about 13% for adults ages 18 to 64.

Poverty rates also varied significantly by region, with San Diego and Los Angeles counties experiencing the highest poverty rates, about 15%, while the Central Valley and Sierra counties experienced the lowest, about 11%.

A big reason for that, Danielson said, is the high cost of living in Southern California counties and demographic differences among the regions. Los Angeles and San Diego counties have high populations of Latino and immigrant communities that experience higher rates of poverty.

The Public Policy Institute's California Poverty Measure includes such things as the value of government assistance and a region's cost of living, which the federal poverty rate does not consider.

Social safety net programs make less of a dent on poverty in counties with higher costs of living. That's because poor Californians in these counties may earn incomes too high for federal poverty thresholds and so don't qualify for as much aid.

For example, researchers found that social safety net programs reduced poverty the most in inland areas, where poverty rates are lower. Without the programs, poverty would be 14.4 points higher in the Central Valley and Sierra region, but only 4.3 points higher in the Bay

Area, the report shows.

The Public Policy Institute looked closer at working Californians and found that most Californians in poverty are working and even full-time employment didn't keep some residents from poverty.

More than 8 in 10 of California's 1.3 million working poor were employed year-round; nearly half worked full time and 37% part time. Part-time workers had higher poverty rates than full-time workers.

Workers in service industries — janitors, landscapers, cosmetologists, housekeepers and other service jobs — and workers in agriculture tended to experience poverty at higher rates than other labor sectors.

People in building and grounds maintenance, for example, have a 20% poverty rate, followed by workers in food preparation and service who endure a 16% poverty rate.

The report also highlights how the working poor spend their money. They cohabit with family members to make ends meet; 82% of Californians in poverty live with other adult family members.

People use most of their earnings for everyday expenses and bills. On average, working poor adults make \$28,000 annually.

Danielson said this underscores the need for policies that increase wages and improve training and educational opportunities for the working poor. \star

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - If vaping is touted as less harmful than smoking, the habit is not healthy for waterways.

With the popularity of e-cigarettes, e-debris is new age trash in the American River. In the short distance between Sunrise Bridge (Fair Oaks) to Ancil Hoffman Park (Carmichael) riverbeds and banks have lately yielded thousands of plastic vape cartridges.

These contain lithium batteries and cocktails of nicotine, oils and flavorings inhaled by vapers.

The river not only supplies drinking water for millions of humans. Its pollution also impacts fish and a multitude of wildlife species. Pollution also impacts fish and thousands of wildlife species. "Batteries contain highly toxic chemicals and acids," explains California Department of Fish and Wildlife Fisheries Supervisor Nick Bauer. "In stagnant water, these and vaping residues can accumulate and become more concentrated. They can leech into sediment and be consumed by organisms living in the water.

"All river wildlife is potentially affected because harmful chemicals tend to bio-accumulate as they move up the food chain. The containers eventually wash downriver to add to the huge amount of plastic in the Pacific Ocean."

California Wildlife Encounters rescuer Ken Nuckolls considers e-debris "the new environmental hazard plaguing our waterways."

"Arsenic, lead, chromium and nickel in lithium batteries are known carcinogens," he says. "Ingestion of lead kills our native eagles. It only takes a particle the size of a rice grain to be fatal for them."

Notes diver Matt Spruitenburg: "Five years ago, we seldom found vaping apparatus... Now we see it everywhere. These items are disposable, so when they're finished, some rafters just toss them. Dumping trash in the American River is illegal. There are garbage cans in landing areas. Rafters can surely hold their trash till then."

Karl Bly has volunteered for river cleanup since childhood and runs a group called American River Lost and Found. "I've collected boxes and boxes of vaping cartridges," he says. "In any waterway, garbage is a problem. But garbage that contains chemicals is even worse for river quality.

"I encourage people to enjoy our river. But make an effort to pick up garbage."

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Cordova Holds off Johnson in Last Second!

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - It's always nice to finish the regular season with a victory, and that's exactly what the Cordova Lancers did on Friday, October 27th. All the coaches had great things to say about this bunch of young men and wish them all the best as they move on to their next endeavor.

As games go, it was probably one of the most exciting games I've ever watched. The Warriors struck pay dirt first late in the 1st quarter making it 7 to nothing as we headed into the 2nd quarter. Things weren't going the Lancers' way, as Johnson seemed to have the momentum on their side. As Johnson was moving the ball deep into Lancer territory, a Warrior pass fell into the arms of Kravchuck who returned the interception 46 yards back the other way. From that point the Lancer's rushing game took over, moving the ball successfully down to the 5-yard line where Ryce took the ball up the middle for the score. The point after touchdown (PAT) kick by Gonzalez was good, tying the score at 7.

The ball was turned over several times by both teams until the 1:13 mark of the 2nd quarter when Johnson kicked a field goal, making the score 7-10. Elijah Wallace returned the ensuing kickoff back to the 30-yard line. Once again, some big runs by Ryce, Davis and Wallace brought the ball back to the 12-yard line. With time running out on 4th down, Cordova attempted a field goal of their own. Unfortunately the kick was

blocked, and the Lancers headed into the locker room trailing 7-10.

After a great halftime performance by the Big Red Marching Band and cheer squad, both teams were back on the field ready to start the second half. Johnson kicked off to the Lancers and seemed to have an answer to every one of their plays, forcing the Lancers back deep in their own territory. On 4th and long, Gonzales punted from two yards deep in the end zone. The punt, nearly blocked, landed about 40 yards away and was misplayed by Johnson, resulting in a fumble recovery by Damajae Moses. Several nice runs by Ryce and a nice pass reception from Ryce to Moses, and the Lancers found themselves at 1st and goal from around the 8-yard line. From there the handoff went to Davis up the middle on a bone-crushing run that ended in the end zone with a little help from the offensive line, pushing Davis from behind. PAT was good by Gonzales, and the Lancers took the lead 14-10 at the 9:12 mark of the 3rd quarter.

Cordova's defense couldn't put the reins on the Warriors, as a pass interference call hurt the Lancers and gave the Warriors a first down deep in Lancer territory. A few running plays later the Warriors went in for the score, but a bad snap on the PAT attempt caused the holder to run the ball, but he was forced out of bounds. The score late in the 3rd quarter was then 14-16 in favor of the Warriors. The ensuing kickoff was returned 30 yards by Kravchuck to around the 40-yard line. Cordova moved the ball successfully to midfield. From the 50-yard line Ryce hit Moses on a long pass that resulted in a touchdown. Davis then ran up the middle for the 2-point conversion, making the score 22-16 in favor of the Lancers with 5 seconds left in the 3rd quarter.

The 4th quarter went back and

forth with big defensive stops for both teams until Johnson got good field position on another pass interference call and ran the ball in, tying the score at 22-22 with1:32 left in the 4th quarter. Big runs by Davis, Ryce and Wallace took the ball to the Warriors 13-yard line. On 1st and 10, Davis took the handoff from Ryce and plowed his way through defenders and into the end zone for the score. PAT was good by Gonzales, and the Lancers were ahead 29-22 with 47 seconds left to play.

There was no time to celebrate because Johnson was not ready to throw in the towel. Another pass interference call and the Warriors were knocking on our door once again with 7 seconds left in the game at around the 10-yard line. The next play, Johnson's quarterback missed his target deep in the end zone leaving one second on the clock. With one second left, Johnson's QB tried to hit a receiver in the corner of the end zone, but the pass was out of bounds. Cordova Wins!

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AREA 49000, AEROJET SUPERFUND SITE Rancho Cordova, California Delaware Street, Rancho Cordova, California 95742

The Department of Toxics Substances Control (DTSC) has approved the Final Remedial Action Plan (RAP) for Aerojet Area 49000, located immediately west of Nimbus Road and south of Folsom Boulevard, in Rancho Cordova, California (Site). The Site is a 71-acre portion of the Aerojet Superfund Site. The Site was purchased by NorthPoint Development, LLC (NorthPoint) in 2021 along with surrounding land for a total of 101 acres. NorthPoint plans to construct a total of five (5) warehouses and four (4) stormwater detention basins on their property for the proposed Rancho Cordova Logistics Center development.

The Site was previously investigated, and the soil remediated as part of the Perimeter Groundwater Operable Unit (PGOU, or OU-5) of the Aerojet Superfund Site under the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). Groundwater remediation of the PGOU, including beneath the Site, is still ongoing under USEPA as the lead agency for the Aerojet Superfund Site. Land use restrictions were placed on the Site following soil remediation, including restrictions on groundwater use and requirements for vapor mitigation for any future new buildings intended for human occupancy due to the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in soil vapor beneath the Site. DTSC is the lead agency administering, executing, and enforcing the land use covenants (LUCs) that specify these restrictions. Following the State's process, a RAP was required for the selection of the type of vapor mitigation measure to be implemented for Buildings 1 and 2, the only buildings being constructed at this time. Buildings 3, 4, and 5 are planned for possible construction later and not included in this RAP. The Final RAP describes the history, investigation, and previous cleanup of the Site, assesses different vapor mitigation methods, and presents the approved course of action for the LUC-required vapor mitigation remedy for Buildings 1 and 2. The approved vapor mitigation remedy involves incorporating passive vapor mitigation systems (VMS) with active contingency into the engineering designs for the buildings to address the potential intrusion into indoor air of VOC vapors from beneath the building slabs. The VMS would dilute and collect VOC vapors from beneath the building slab and vent them to ambient air above the building roof. This remedy is consistent with the LUC requirements for the Site. The VMS is fundamentally incorporated into the physical design of the warehouse buildings and installed as part of the construction process for Buildings 1 and 2. Institutional Controls in the form of the existing LUC and an Operation & Maintenance (O&M) agreement will oversee the proper implementation and long-term O&M and monitoring of this remedy.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): DTSC utilized the approved Easton Research Park West Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) to comply with the CEQA requirements for the approved RAP. The City of Rancho Cordova approved the IS/MND on November 15, 2021 (State Clearinghouse Number 2021090544). The IS/MND concluded mitigation measures were required for Biological Resources, Cultural Resources, Geology and Soils, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, Noise, Tribal Cultural Resources and Utilities and Service Systems. DTSC prepared a Statement of Findings concluding the Lead Agency Final Environmental Document adequately analyzed impacts associated with the remediation.

Another Wet Winter Looms. California Needs To Get Serious About Water Management

Oct. 1 is the beginning of what hydrologists call the "water year."

Historically, California's reservoirs are near their lowest levels by this point after months of being drawn down, mostly to irrigate fields and orchards, during the state's precipitation-free summer.

This October is quite different.

Last winter's heavy rain and snow storms, generated by a series of atmospheric rivers, filled reservoirs even as dam managers fully opened their gates to send as much water downstream as possible.

So much rain and snow fell in the southern San Joaquin Valley that Tulare Lake, once one of the nation's largest natural lakes, was recreated, and threatened the town of Corcoran.

Virtually every reservoir in the state contains more than 100% of their historic storage levels at the beginning of the water year. The biggest ones, such as Shasta and Oroville, are close to three-quarters full even after giving farmers their full quotas of irrigation water during the growing season.

Hydrologists and meteorologists, moreover, are telling Californians that they may see a repeat in the months ahead, thanks to a phenomenon known as El Niño, and it potentially could surpass last winter's storms.

El Niño is a warm current that often results in huge amounts of Pacific Ocean water being sucked into the atmosphere and delivered to land as rain and snow.

"The anticipated strong El Niño is the predominant climate factor driving the U.S. winter outlook this year," Jon Gottschalck, chief of the operational prediction branch at NOAA's Climate Prediction Center, told the Los Angeles Times. He and other weather scientists predict that California and other Western states will see above-average precipitation and some believe it could surpass the 1997-98 winter when floods and mudslides killed 17 Californians and caused \$1 billion in property damage.

"It's only been seen three times previously in the historical record," Stephen Yeager, project scientist with the National Center for Atmospheric Research, told public radio station KQED. "We are looking at the potential of a major season-long event that could impact people and their livelihoods."

The prospect of another heavy precipitation winter is both uplifting to a state that had experienced several years of drought prior to last winter and a little frightening.

Mostly, it's another warning to Californians – and particularly their politicians – that it's beyond time to take the state's water situation seriously and become more proactive on both flood protection and water storage. The good news is that after years of dithering, some significant progress is being made on rationalizing water management in California. A few days ago, federal and local water officials announced the approval of a project that would expand storage in the San Luis Reservoir, a major off-stream facility in the Pacheco Pass.

San Luis absorbs water from the California Aqueduct that's not currently needed and releases it on demand. It has the capacity to store 2 million acre-feet now and the new project will add another 130,000 acre-feet of capacity.

It's one out of a flurry of storage projects now in the works, including another off-stream reservoir on the west side of the Sacramento Valley called Sites. That project has been kicking around for decades and is finally gaining political approval and serious commitments of money.

Off-stream storage avoids the environmental issues of dams that plug rivers, such as Shasta and Oroville, and adversely affect fish and other wildlife.

State water authorities believe that, with climate change, California will receive more of its precipitation as rain, rather than snow. It's critical, therefore, that we have storage, both above-ground and in aquifers, to replace the natural reservoir of the Sierra snowpack as it recedes.

The message is finally hitting home.



Dave Ramsey Says

Eventually, You Become Self-Insured

Dear Dave,

My wife and I are both 36 years old, and we have two children. Our son is six, and our daughter will be four next month. We've been walking through the Baby Steps, and we should have our home paid off sometime next summer. We realized the other day the one thing missing from our financial picture is life insurance. We both work outside the home. She makes \$60,000 a year, while I make \$80,000 a year. At our age, and in our current situation, do you think we should we get 20-year or 30-year level term life insurance policies?

Dear Clay,

You guys are doing a great job of getting control of your

finances and planning for the future. Speaking of the future, do you plan on having more kids? If you do, you might want to go with 30-year policies. If you've decided two are enough, then based on your present situation I think 20-year policies would work out fine.

I recommend folks have 10 to 12 times their annual income in life insurance coverage. That means you'd need between \$800,000 and \$960,000 in coverage, while your wife needs a policy in the \$600,000 to \$720,000 range. But let's take a deeper dive into all this.

Your kids will be in their mid-twenties in 20 years. Ideally, they both should have finished college by that time, or at the very least, be working and living on their own. If you continue to follow my plan, you and your wife will have paid off your home in a few months and be completely debt-free. And, you'll have been saving 15% of your income for retirement over those 20 years. On average, that alone should give you more than

a half-million dollars for retirement.

Do you see where I'm going with this, Clay? Eventually, you two will become self-insured by getting out of debt, staying out of debt and piling up cash. So, if you've got \$500,000 or more in a retirement fund, no debt and your children are grown and out of the house, even if you or your wife were to die unexpectedly at that point, the other would still be taken care of and in great shape financially.



In the event that no response or request for additional time is received by any Responsible Agency by the end of the review period, the Lead Agency may presume that the responsible agency has no response [CEQA Guidelines Section 15082(b(2)].

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


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
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
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Flood Preparedness in Sacramento County

Sacramento County News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - This is a good time to make sure residents know what to do in case we have a repeat of last January's storms.

It is important for you to know the flood risk to your home or business. After years of drought, the floods of 2023 were a stark reminder about the County's location in a floodplain. The County's Department of Water Resources has information to help residents understand the threat flooding may pose to property. Go to www. stormready.org and click Flood Zone Information to learn more about your flood risk.

If you live in a flood zone, you can reduce the potential for damage to your property by being proactive.

- 1.Before the rain falls, remember to clear storm drains of leaves and debris to ensure the water freely flows away from your home. Clogs can cause localized flooding to streets that could eventually back up to your doorway.
- 2.If you come across street flooding, call 3-1-1 to have County crews come out and clear the clogs.
- 3.Don't drive through flooded streets. Turn around, don't drown!
- 4.If you see items dumped into nearby creaks, call 3-1-1 and report it. It's important to clear those areas before the rain to avoid problems.

Even in non-disaster years, nearly 20 percent of flood insurance claims in Sacramento County come from moderate to low-risk areas. Residents can obtain flood insurance if their homes or businesses are not in the mapped floodplain. If unchecked, localized flooding can cause a lot of damage. If you live in an area prone to flooding, consider talking to a qualified insurance agent about flood insurance. It takes 30 days for flood insurance to take effect, so don't wait.

Did you know that Sacramento County takes part in a special Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) program that helps reduce the cost of flood insurance? Through FEMA, residents living in a designated Special Flood Hazard Area can save about \$446.00 per year on the full cost of a standard flood insurance policy.

Take the time to develop an evacuation plan for you and your family. This plan will be useful for any potential disasters, including fires. It's not too early to decide where you will go and what you should take.

What do you take if you need to leave? Remember the "five Ps" you should have ready to go if you need to evacuate:

- 1. People and pets
 - 2. Papers (important documents)
 - 3. Prescriptions (medication, eyeglasses, hearing aids)
 - 4. Pictures (Irreplaceable memories)5. Personal computer

Also, have a designated meeting place in case your family is separated. Visit Stormready.org to view evacuation maps as well as the region's flooding history.

Need sandbags? On November 1, Sacramento County will open two sandbag locations for residents in the unincorporated area. For those who live in a flood prone area, this will offer up the chance to grab sandbags prior to the rainy season. The County supplies the sand and bags, but bring a shovel. There is a 20-bag limit per visit.

Do you live near a creek or stream? Follow the rise of nearby streams with the Water Resources Rainfall and Stream Level Information System at www.sacflood.org. This system monitors 47 different waterways in the County. If you live by one, it's one way to keep an eye on how high the water is rising.

You can also receive evacuation notices during flood threats by signing up to Sacramento Alert. This Countywide system, run by the Office of Emergency Services, will keep you informed about potential flooding or other emergencies threatening your neighborhood. Be Aware. Be Prepared. Make yourself Storm Ready.

Medicare's Annual Election Period Fast Approaching

Medicare's Annual Election Period, ("AEP") for Part D Prescription Drug Plans and Medicare Advantage plans runs from October 15 th until December 7 th . During AEP eligible Medicare enrollees can join or change a Medicare Advantage (Part C) or Part D drug plan. Enrollees can also "disenroll" from a Medicare Advantage plan and return to Original Medicare (Parts A/B) and join a drug plan.

Here is a timeline to assist you in navigating this important Enrollment Period and to help you avoid coverage surprises:

September

Your current Medicare Part D drug plan or Medicare Advantage plan is required to send you an Annual Notice of Change ("ANOC") notice. It's important that you read this notice as it contains important information about changes to your plan for the 2024 Plan Year. The "ANOC" notice will advise you if the plan premium is changing or if there are changes to the drug formulary, provider network and/or plan benefits. It can be a mistake to assume the plan you have this year will remain the same next year. Take the time to review your "ANOC" notice!

October 1 st

Sometimes referred to as the "marketing" period or "shopping" period, October 1 st is when the 2024 Plan Year information is released and companies can begin marketing Medicare's Annual Election Period Fast Approaching plans. This is a good time to review options for your prescription drug or Medicare Advantage coverage for 2024. Since plans can and do change, it's a good idea to confirm that your current plan continues to cover your prescriptions well and to meet your needs for the upcoming year.

October 15th Until December 7 th

This is when you can actually submit an enrollment if you want to enroll in a plan or to change plans for 2024. December 7 th is a hard deadline. Your ability to change Part D Prescription Drug Plans after December 7 th may be non-existent or extremely limited.

Every year we have people call us that miss the December 7 th deadline and end up stuck on a Part D plan that has increased their premium or that doesn't cover their prescriptions well.

Last Valid Enrollment

During AEP it is possible to submit multiple enrollments with the final enroll-





ment being the plan that will go into effect on January 1 st . This allows for you to change your mind during the Enrollment Period.

Disenrollment / Medicare Supplements

AEP is also a time when you can "disenroll" from a Medicare Advantage plan and return to Original Medicare (Parts A/B) and join a Part D drug plan.

If you're also intending to enroll in a Medicare Supplement (aka Medigap) plan when returning to Original Medicare during AEP, keep in mind that enrollment in a Medicare Supplement may not be guaranteed. You may have to answer health questions to enroll in a Medicare Supplement outside of limited guaranteed issue periods. An experienced insurance agent can be valuable if you're wanting to leave your Medicare Advantage plan and get a Medicare Supplement. Failing to do things properly and in the right sequence can end up creating a deficit in your medical coverage. The services of an independent agent are free to consumers.

A Word on Medicare Commercials

During AEP the airways are flooded with commercials pitching Medicare Advantage plans and all the free benefits you're missing out on. These commercials often tout benefits that are only offered in specific areas or to select segments of Medicare enrollees. They entice you to call and once you call they'll try to enroll you in a plan quickly over the phone. Exercise caution if you call one these large call centers.

Being proactive about your Medicare coverage during the Annual Election Period can go a long way to helping you avoid coverage issues and to feel confident in your coverage selections for 2024.

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
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Turkey Trots and Other Fun for Thanksgiving Week

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -The holiday season is upon us, and that means fun events in the Sacramento region are abundant. If you're looking for activities Thanksgiving week, you'll have plenty of options (in addition, of course, to all of the eating and shopping).

Thanksgiving morning the annual Run to Feed the Hungry will be celebrating its 30th anniversary and once again kicking off the largest Thanksgiving Day fun run in the country. The run starts at 8:15 on J Street right outside the Sacramento State campus, with start times varying for times or untimed running, and those choosing the 10k or 5k option. Participants - whether walking or running, going as an individual or as part of a team – can enjoy the camaraderie and beautiful fall foliage as they follow the loop route through East Sacramento. For the competitive runners, the top three finishers in each age group will receive prize money ranging from \$50-\$300. Run to Feed the Hungry benefits the Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services, which has seen an 87% increase in demand for services since the 2020 pandemic. Virtual and in-person race options are available, and adult registration begins at \$35. Strollers are allowed in the untimed races, but dogs in strollers are not; all pets are asked to stay at home.

If you're willing to drive a bit farther, there is the Elk Grove Gobble Wobble. This fun event features a 5K race, a Fun Run (1/4 mile) for kids, food, music, raffles, vendor booths, and a fun zone. Virtual and in-person race options are available for the 5K. Registration is \$10 for the kids fun run, \$20 for the virtual 5k, and \$30-\$50 for the in-person 5K (depending on registration date). Registration for the in-person 5k includes a medal and shirt.

Race-day registration is available if the event has not sold out. Check-in begins at 8:00 and the fun run begins at 9:00, with the 5k starting at 9:15. Strollers and well-behaved dogs are welcome. The Gobble Wobble event benefits Chicks in Crisis located in

Elk Grove, which supports parents and children by providing resources and support to help families become self-sufficient, helping all families "cross the finish line."

Folsom will also be holding its Turkey Trot on Thanksgiving Day. The race has 5K and 10K options, and participants can choose to walk or run at Rodeo Park/Lions Park at 200 Stafford Street. The 10k participants will line up at 8:50, and the 5K participants will be shortly behind at 9:00. Registration cost is \$35-\$40 and includes a race day shirt, bib, and timing chips. Dogs, along with children in strollers, can participate in the 5k assuming both are well-contained. The Folsom Turkey Trot usually sees around 4,000 participants each year. The proceeds from this year's event will benefit the Twin Lakes Food Bank, Folsom Athletic Association, and Johnny Cash Trail (which is also the trail that the run will traverse).

For those looking for something other than the typical turkey run, on November 18, the North Highlands Recreation and Park District will be hosting Turkey Day Flag Football. This inaugural event will start at 10:00 a.m. at Brock Park Sports Complex in North Highlands and last until noon. Participants must be at least 18 years old, and the cost is \$19.00 to register. Refreshments and t-shirt are included.

Lastly, if you didn't sign up for a Thanksgiving Day run but subsequently feel guilty about your overindulgence, there is the Sacramento Turkey Trot Run on Saturday November 25 with 5K, 10K, and half-marathon options. Registration is \$35-\$42, depending on race selected, and includes a swag bag that's mailed directly to you. There are three waves starting at 8:00, 8:30, and 9:00, filled on a firstcome first-filled basis. All ages and paces are welcome, but this is a very limited capacity event. The run will start at Sutters Landing Park in Sacramento. ★





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
