Community Honors Heroes

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Gold Star families and community leaders gathered last Saturday to recall fallen heroes of nation and community. The Wall of Honor ceremony was observed at Patriots Park.

The reserve's stone monument is dedicated to 15 local men - from military, police, CHP and firefighting ranks - who died in service during Carmichael Park District's 60-year history. Their sacrifice unites surrounding neighborhoods each November. Plaques recall sacrifice from Vietnam War years

until recent times. "It seems this ceremony becomes more poignant and meaningful considering what we're seeing in the world today," noted

County Supervisor and former CHP officer Rich Desmond. "Throughout my career, I've come to see (first responders) as cut from the same cloth. They all come from the same place; they care about the community and want to keep it safe."

Patriots Park was developed during the supervisory term of Susan Peters. Now retired, Peters joined the annual ceremony. "This land used to be an empty lot, covered in trash," she recalled. "We sold part of it and used the cash to build this park and dedicate a Wall of Honor to patriots. It warms my heart to see everyone here today,"

Your Flood Preparedness in Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - This is a good time to make sure residents know what to do in case we have a repeat of last January's storms.

It is important for you to know the flood risk to your home or business. After years of drought, the floods of 2023 were a stark reminder about the County's location in a floodplain. The County's Department of Water Resources has information to help residents understand the threat flooding may pose to property. Go to www.stormready.org and click Flood Zone Information to learn more about your flood risk.

If you live in a flood zone, you can reduce the potential for damage to your property by being proactive.

1. Before the rain falls, remember to clear storm drains of leaves and debris to ensure the water freely flows away from your home. Clogs can cause localized flooding to streets that could eventually back up to your doorway.
2. If you come across street flooding, call 3-1-1 to have County crews come out and clear the clogs.
3. Don't drive through flooded streets. Turn around, don't drown!
4. If you see items dumped into nearby creeks, call 3-1-1 and report it. It's important to clear those areas before the rain to avoid problems.

Even in non-disaster years, nearly 20 percent of flood insurance claims in Sacramento County come from moderate to low-risk areas. Residents can obtain flood insurance if their homes or businesses are not in the mapped floodplain. If unchecked, localized flooding can cause a lot of damage. If you live in an area prone to flooding, consider talking to a qualified insurance agent about flood insurance. It takes 30 days for flood insurance to take effect, so don't wait.

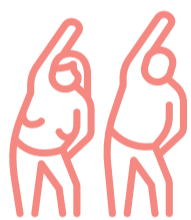

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) welcomed more than 100 of California's newest members of law enforcement during a graduation ceremony at the CHP Academy in West Sacramento. The November 3, 2023 ceremony is the culmination of more than six months of rigorous training, hard work, and commitment.

"These cadets are California's finest," said Governor Gavin Newsom. "They are truly the best among us — answering a call of duty to serve our communities with trust and care. On behalf of all Californians, I am proud to welcome them to the California Highway Patrol."

The graduating class of 112 officers, including 11 women, report for duty on Nov. 13, 2023, to one of the CHP's 103 Area offices throughout the state.

"The newly sworn officers exhibited remarkable dedication and determination throughout their training. They have proven themselves ready to take on the responsibilities and challenges of law enforcement, ensuring the safety and well-being of those who live and visit California," said CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee. "We are proud to welcome them as part of the CHP family."

At the CHP Academy, cadet training starts with nobility in policing, leadership, professionalism and ethics, and cultural diversity. Cadets also receive instruction on mental illness response and crisis intervention techniques. Training also includes vehicle patrol, crash investigation, first aid, and the apprehension of suspected violators, including those who drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Cadets also receive training in traffic control, report writing, recovery of stolen vehicles, assisting the motoring public, issuing citations, emergency scene management, and knowledge of various codes, including the California Vehicle Code, Penal Code and Health and Safety Code.

A new class of more than 100 cadets will begin their 26-weeks of training at the CHP Academy that same day, bringing the total number of cadets in training to nearly 350.

In June 2022, the CHP launched a multi-year recruitment campaign to recruit and hire 1,000 officers. If you are interested in an exciting career that offers diversity, challenges, and opportunities, the CHP invites you to apply to become a part of our professional organization. ★

carrying on an important tradition."

Assemblyman Josh Hoover noted that heroes commemorated by the wall were relatives, friends and neighbors of those gathered. "We honor them as people who ran toward danger," he said. "It's paramount that we keep their memory alive."

Congressman Ami Bera's representative Matthew Ceccato (a Purple Heart recipient for Operation Iraqi Freedom) brought first-hand perspective to remembrance.

"After patrolling the streets of Baghdad, we sat in our safe houses and told stories about heroes such as these," he remembered.

Quoting American novelist Willa Cather, Ceccato called Patriots Park honorees 'mortal, but unconquerable.'

"These bronze plaques will be here long after we have gone," said Ceccato. "And these heroes will remain unconquerable."

part in a special Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) program that helps reduce the cost of flood insurance? Through FEMA, residents living in a designated Special Flood Hazard Area can save about \$446.00 per year on the full cost of a standard flood insurance policy.

Take the time to develop an evacuation plan for you and your family. This plan will be useful for any potential disasters, including fires. It's not too early to decide where you will go and what you should take.

What do you take if you need to leave? Remember the "five Ps" you should have ready to go if you need to evacuate:

1. People and pets
2. Papers (important documents)
3. Prescriptions (medication, eyeglasses, hearing aids)
4. Pictures (Irreplaceable memories)
5. Personal computer


Also, have a designated meeting place in case your family is separated. Visit Stormready.org to view evacuation maps as

well as the region's flooding history.

Need sandbags? On November 1, Sacramento County will open two sandbag locations for residents in the unincorporated area. For those who live in a flood prone area, this will offer up the chance to grab sandbags prior to the rainy season. The County supplies the sand and bags, but bring a shovel. There is a 20-bag limit per visit.

Do you live near a creek or stream? Follow the rise of nearby streams with the Water Resources Rainfall and Stream Level Information System at www.sacflood.org. This system monitors 47 different waterways in the County. If you live by one, it's one way to keep an eye on how high the water is rising.

You can also receive evacuation notices during flood threats by signing up to Sacramento Alert. This Countywide system, run by the Office of Emergency Services, will keep you informed about potential flooding or other emergencies threatening your neighborhood. Be Aware. Be Prepared. Make yourself Storm Ready. ★

A 50-year-old California Mass Murder Case Forever Etched in my Consciousness

Occasionally I'm asked which event – which story – has been the most memorable of a journalistic career that's spanned more than 60 years, three-quarters of them writing about California politics.

No political story, however, occupies a bigger place in my consciousness than the execution-style murders of nine people, two entire families, in the bedroom of a rural home near Lodi 50 years ago today, which I covered for the Sacramento Union.

It was the home of Walter Parkin, owner of a small food store in Victor, his wife, Joanne, and their two children, 11-year-old Lisa and Robert, 9.

The two Parkin children were lying in the master bedroom's bed, both shot to death. Their parents and five other bodies were found in a walk-in closet, all bound and methodically murdered. They were the Parkins' neighbors, Richard and Wanda Earl, their daughter, Debbie, who had been the Parkins' babysitter, Debbie's 15-year-old brother, Ricky, and her boyfriend, Mark Lang.

Authorities had absolutely no clues as to who had killed them, although

they quickly discovered that the Parkins' store had reportedly been robbed of about \$3,000 in cash.

Nevertheless, the case was quickly solved because San Joaquin County Sheriff Mike Canlis had a hunch. He asked contacts at the FBI about fugitives roaming the countryside and was told that a warrant had just been issued for Willie Steelman, who had spent most of his life in the Lodi area, and Douglas Gretzler for killing two people in a mobile home in the Arizona desert.

Canlis released an old San Joaquin County mugshot of Steelman, who had a history of minor crimes, saying he thought it possible that Steelman was involved.

The mugshot was printed at the top of the Sacramento Union's front page the next morning, and a clerk at the Clunie Hotel in downtown Sacramento recognized Steelman as one of two young men who had checked in the day before.

Cops scooped up Gretzler when he returned to the hotel and he told them where they could find Steelman. He was visiting a masseuse that the two had met while spending some of the loot at a massage parlor. After a brief standoff at her apartment house, Steelman surrendered.

A few days later, I obtained summaries of the their interrogations, and wrote that they had killed 17 people in a 17-day spree of death that began in Arizona with

the mobile home killings, moved to California, then back to Arizona and finally back to California because Steelman knew that the Parkins' store kept a lot of money to cash checks of farmworkers.

After months of legal wrangling, it was agreed that Steelman and Gretzler would be declared guilty in California and shipped to Arizona which, unlike California, had the death penalty. They were convicted of murdering a young couple whose car they were driving when arrested in California, nine others and sentenced to death. Steelman died in 1986 of cirrhosis but Gretzler sat on death row for nearly 25 years before being executed in 1998.

I wasn't done with the story, however. Jack Earl, whose aunt, uncle and two cousins had been murdered, decided to satisfy his curiosity about the case by writing a book. I helped him with accounts of court battles and documents I had preserved. He had even visited Gretzler on death row and attended his execution. Earl's book, "Where Sadness Breathes," was published in 2013. I also helped a woman who produced a documentary video about the case and who had also interviewed Gretzler.

Fifty years is a long time, but the horrific events that began on Nov. 6, 1973, will forever be etched in my consciousness.

Social Security Matters

When Should I Retire and Claim My Social Security Benefits?

Dear Rusty: I am 64 years old and having difficulty working due to my arthritis, but I can continue part time as a podiatrist. I do not know the best way to determine when to retire. What is the formula or a way to determine which is a better choice? **Signed: Undecided**

Dear Undecided: There is a difference between deciding when to retire from working and deciding when to claim your Social Security benefits. For the former, you should consult with a certified financial advisor, but I'll provide you with how Social Security fits into your personal circumstances. In deciding when to claim Social Security, you should look at your financial needs, your life expectancy, your work status, and your marital status. There is no one formula right for everyone because everyone's circumstances are different, but here are some things to help decide what is right for you:

- Social Security has an "earnings test" which applies to anyone who collects Social Security before reaching their full retirement age (FRA). Your FRA is 66 years and 8 months, and that is the point at which

you get 100% of the SS benefit earned from a lifetime of working. If you collect SS before your FRA and continue to work, there is a limit to how much you can earn without jeopardizing your benefits. For example, the earnings limit for 2023 is \$21,240 and, if that is exceeded, SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. They "take away" benefits by withholding future payments until they recover the penalty for exceeding the limit. If your earnings are substantially over the limit, you will be ineligible to collect Social Security until either your earnings are less, or you reach your FRA.

- If you claim SS before your FRA your benefit amount will be permanently reduced. If, for example, you claim SS to start at age 65 your monthly benefit will be about 89% of what it would be at your FRA. That reduced benefit would not change thereafter except for Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA) usually granted annually.

- If Social Security will be a major part of your retirement income, then waiting to get a higher monthly benefit may be a prudent strategy for you. The longer you wait to claim the more your benefit will be. Your SS benefit will continue to grow until you are 70 years old, and at 70 your monthly benefit will be about 27% more than it would be at your FRA. Your maximum SS benefit will be attained at age 70 but waiting until age 70 to claim is only prudent if you anticipate a long life expectancy.

- Life expectancy is a very important factor in deciding when to claim SS. If you claim at age 70 instead of at your FRA, you will need to live until you are about 83 to breakeven moneywise. If you live even longer than that, then waiting until 70 will yield the highest monthly amount and the most in cumulative lifetime benefits. But if your anticipated life expectancy is less, claiming earlier may be a better choice.

- If you are married and expect your wife to survive you, consider that the benefit your wife can get as your widow will be based on your SS benefit when you die, thus the longer you wait to claim the more your wife's benefit as your widow may be. If you predecease your wife, her benefit will be based on the amount you were receiving at your death if that is more than her personally earned SS benefit.

So, as you can see, deciding when to claim Social Security is a decision to be made after carefully evaluating your personal circumstances as described above. Officer-Involved Shooting on Interstate 80

Sacramento County Sheriff's Office News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The following information is based on a preliminary and ongoing investigation, which continues to evolve as investigators interview witnesses, review physical and electronic records, and analyze forensic evidence. Understanding of the facts and circumstances may change as additional evidence is collected, processed, and analyzed.

At approximately 12:20 p.m. on Sunday, November 5, 2023, a solo motorcycle officer from the California Highway Patrol was involved in a vehicle pursuit with a silver-colored Toyota Prius near Interstate 80 and Norwood Avenue. Moments later, a Sheriff's K9 deputy joined in the pursuit to assist, along with another CHP officer. The driver, later identified as 36-year-old Zachary Wolffscott, suddenly struck an adult male riding a motorcycle with his vehicle just east of Greenback Lane on Interstate 80, also rendering his vehicle seemingly inoperable.

Wolffscott then exited his vehicle and pulled out a knife. He continued to advance toward the officers, ignoring

repeated commands to stop. Two CHP officers and the Sheriff's K9 deputy fired their weapons at Wolffscott. Wolffscott was transported to a local area hospital by ambulance, where he was later pronounced deceased. The civilian motorcycle rider was also transported to a local area hospital by ambulance with serious injuries and is expected to survive.

Sheriff's Homicide Detectives, Crime Scene Investigators, and CHP Investigators responded to the scene and began their investigation. The investigation into this incident will be conducted by the Sheriff's Homicide Bureau and Professional Standards Division, which is standard practice for any officer-involved shooting that occurs in the Sheriff's Department's jurisdiction. An independent review of the incident will be conducted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office.

In accordance with the Sheriff's Department policies and procedures, the deputy involved in the shooting will be placed on administrative leave pending the investigation. The Sheriff's Office will publish a community briefing video that will include body camera video and other information in compliance with state law. ★

Shooting on Cornelia Way

Sacramento County Sheriff's Office News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Just after 1:30 a.m. on Wednesday, November 1, 2023, Sacramento County Sheriff's deputies responded to a fight at a large party at a residence on the 4100 block of Cornelia Way in North Highlands. Callers

reported gunshots being fired and people running into the streets. Simultaneously, the Sheriff's Communications Center received a 9-round ShotSpotter activation from the same location.

Deputies arrived on scene quickly and located an adult male victim in the street with a wound to the head. The injury appeared to have stemmed

from a physical fight. They also located a second adult male victim, with a gunshot wound to the leg. Both victims were transported to the hospital via ambulance and are expected to survive.

Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene and gathered evidence, as deputies interviewed witnesses and attempted to locate any video

near the incident. This investigation is still ongoing, and detectives are asking anyone with information about this incident to contact the Sheriff's Office at (916) 874-5115 or Sacramento Valley Crime Stoppers at (916) 443-HELP (4357). Tips leading to an arrest are eligible for a CASH reward of up to \$1000, and tipsters remain anonymous. Tips are

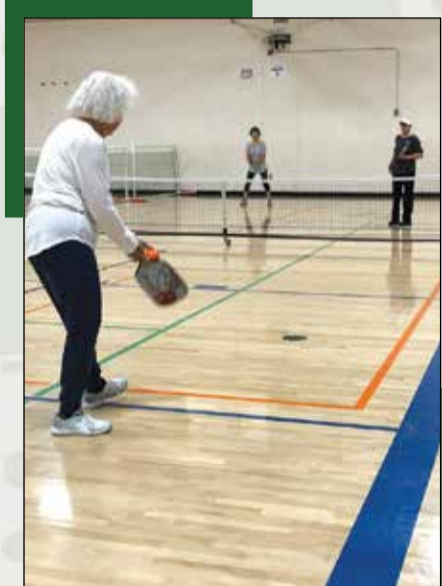
