WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - The Racial Justice Committee of the Yolo County Public Defender's Office is delighted to announce the commencement of its annual holiday toy drive, which benefits local families affected by the criminal legal system. This marks the second year that the Public Defender's Office is organizing a toy drive,

in partnership with Toys for Tots, and with contributions from Supervisor Vixie Sandy. The Yolo County Public Defender's Office aspires to make a difference by giving more toys to families in need this holiday season and is immensely appreciative of those able to donate.

The holiday season can be an especially challenging time. Some families may grapple with separation as a loved one serves a jail or prison term. Others face the secondary consequences of involvement in the criminal legal system, such as court fines, fees, and barriers to employment, or exacerbating financial stress during the holidays.

"Last year, this event helped provide toys to over 130 children," stated Eleni Bonilla, Chair of the Racial Justice Committee. "Now, in our second year and in partnership with Toys for Tots, our goal is to give even more!'

For this community event, the Public Defender's Office will transform its conference room into a magical Toy Shop. # Wrestling in Honor of a Child

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - George Frey is a man that has been through unspeakable pain.

As a young man, George, like many, fell in love and got married. He had two daughters and was now very excited about the upcoming birth of his first son. When the boy was born, George named him after his favorite cousin Michael Theodore Tate Frev. But something happened when George left the hospital to get a car seat from home and the time came for the baby and mother to be released from the hospital.

George's wife suffered from mental illness. Diagnosed with schizophrenia and bi-polar disorder, medical staff had the duty to make sure the baby would go home to a safe environment. While George was getting the car seat, Child Protective Services (CPS) came in for an assessment. They asked the mother if she were to become frustrated from the baby crying and there

what she would do. She said she would throw the knife. CPS immediately took custody of the baby and when George got back to the hospital, they would not let him see his son. "CPS is just legal kidnapping, if you ask me," he said.

George was active in the military. Immediately after all of this occurred George was deployed. He served two tours in

When George returned from military service, he began the fight to gain custody of his son. He was able to see his son and together they shared their love for professional wrestling. # West Sacramento City Council Highlights

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The second City Council meeting for the month of November 2023 was held on Wednesday November 15. The following are highlights of the discussions, suggestions, complaints, reports and desires that were shared during that meeting. Please understand that these are highlights. For more detail please refer to the meeting minutes or watch the video of the meeting. Both can be found at cityofwestsacramento.org.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance and the reading of the Land Acknowledgement. Before discussing agenda items, the meeting is open for Public Comment. These comments are allowed to be on any topic that is not on the agenda for that meeting. If you want to talk about a topic that is on the agenda for that night, there is a time for Public Comment when that item is being discussed.

#### **Presentations by** the Public

Guy Stephenson -Guy expressed that he was offended that the city prompted for a second article be written in the newspaper about Via Rideshare. He was offended that they requested a second reporter write a new article with the City's point of view. He said that the program has some problems that just need to be looked at. He said he felt that he's just trying to get them to address issues, instead of sugar coating the problem. Aleecia Guiterrez - She

was there to champion two efforts that she believes to align with what she believes will support prosperity to all community members and neighborhoods in an equitable way. The Bryte/Broderick Community Center is caught up in a permit nightmare. She is hoping that the City will actively work with the Rancheria Me-Wuk Indians to get the permits taken care of. West Sacramento will benefit greatly with the programs that are waiting to be started. She also reminded the Council that the building in which the Community Center is being constructed in is a historical building and Rhonda Pope Florez and her team have been working incredibly hard to improve the building and systems within, while still maintaining the historical integrity. She suggested that perhaps the City should hire an Ombudsman to assist the city and the Me-Wuk Indians work together. There will be free tutoring available and there are several people waiting for that service. She said that a public service was done when Rancheria purchased the historical building for community services... just as it was a public service when the city purchased Club Pheasant for the purpose of community services.

Manuel Castro - Runs a nonprofit that works with kids from Washington



Unified by teaching online math classes. They help students from k - 12th grade, but says that they need to be able to do this in person. The place that they want to provide this tutoring is the Bryte/Broderick Community Center. He explained how he grew up in an area where there was a community center. It was a safe place to go. He explained how deeply the lady working at that center was such an important role model. He explained what a great benefit having a role model is. He asked for the City to please work it out with the permits.

Angelina Hinojosa – 18 years old and is encouraging the City to make it as easy as possible to complete the Community Center. She said, from a youth perspective, sometimes all they need is a safe place that understands culture and diversity. Someplace that understands families and youth. She said that it give the kids someplace to be. Sometimes they are out there getting into trouble because they have nowhere to be and they get bored. She said the center will give them somewhere to be after school and something to do. Whether they go to tutoring, a community Pow-wow, or basket making, there will be something to do. She told the Council that their pen will make that change so to please create this

change. Leticia Agulara - Born and raised in Sacramento, she said the community center will be a step in the right direction in creating good relationships with the Native American community. She explained that many generations of families in this area have held baby showers, birthday parties, reunions, wedding receptions, funerals and other family events. This was the place to go for these kinds of events. It was a place for them to go and celebrate in a healthy way. Her brothers and other family members are veterans and are very proud of this place for families. She said that it is important that we move forward with this progress and to have a space for the kids to get off of zoom.

Rhonda Pope Florez -Rhonda thanked everyone who spoke about the Bryte/ Broderick Community Center. She said that they have people lined up to provide services at the Community Center. She then said that she doesn't know what happened. She went back and looked at her past notes so that she didn't misspeak. Back on December 7th, 2022 they were working with the City. They worked with engineering, they hired an architect and eventually a lawyer. She said that they were issued permits, she knows this because they paid for them and the city doesn't release that until they're approved. Then they received a stop work order in April. They were advised to start over, so they did. She stated the permitting system in this city is flawed. She explained that the worst part is that this an historical building and that by law the city does have to have an inventory to protect historical resources and the tribe had to provide that. However as of today (November 15th) they were given their permit. However, the other two permits that they got in December, they were locked out of and told that the tribe didn't respond and that they would have to take care of it. Rhonda described it as unbelievable and said it is crazy that the City locked them out of their permits in December then said they had to start over in June, was supposed to have all of the comments back from all departments by September for the paperwork that they submitted in August, and here we are in November and they don't have them. She said this is a very long 10-day process.

Maria Garcia - It is ridiculous that they were supposed to open the community Center on April 5th and they just got the permit issued. She asked that the city please stop holding the permits hostage and to let them open the Community Center. She said that the community wants and needs the center. She wants the return of all of the events that have been held there for so many years.

Alex Hirsch - Board Member of the West Sacramento Friends of the Library. He explained that the members of the friends of the library are all volunteers with the single mission of supporting the library and librarians and library staff. He notified the Council and invited them to the annual meeting of the Friends of the Library. It is to be held on Saturday, December 9th, 2023 at 12:30 PM with the guest Speaker being County Supervisor, Oscar Villegas. He will speaking about his love of and support of the library. All community members are invited and encouraged to come and see all of the wonderful things that the library does.

# Property Tax Delinquent If Not Paid by December 11

Property owners have the option to pay property taxes by credit or

debit card (with a 2.34 percent convenience fee) or by electronic check (no charge). These payments can be made online at www.YoloCounty.org/ PayTax or by phone at (877) 590-0714. Payments through either system must be completed by 5:00 p.m. on December 11, 2023, to avoid penalties.



One day George received a call from "a county worker" saying that they had his son with them. The county worker ended up being the Coroner. George was told that his son Michael, now 3 years old, had drowned. At least that's what was believed to have happened.

George later found out that his 3-year-old baby had been brutally tortured and beat to death. The official cause of death was dry drowning (this can occur after you've fallen into water and then taken out. After taking in water through the nose or mouth, the muscles in your windpipe can become constrained to protect your lungs, according to healthline.com). Additional information on the autopsy report said the small child had all of his ribs and both arms and legs broken. The child also had multiple skull fractures and additional injuries that are too graphic for newsprint. The baby had, at minimum, endured hours, if not days of torture. He had been drugged with a very large amount of Ketamine. George Frey was devastated and lost in his overwhelming, unbear-

able pain. After the loss of his on, George needed an outlet for his overwhelming feelings. He has been wrestling since he was 16 years old and so created a professional wrestling company, in honor of his son Michael. Founded in 2007, the wrestling organization started in El Dorado Hills as Golden State Championship Wrestling (GCW). It began as the shadow group Wrestlers Against Child Abuse.

"At first we did great

Park and El Dorado Hills," George said. They had also done a couple of shows at Denio's. After some administrative issues about the organization's name, George closed GCW and opened Ultimate Riot Wrestling. Like so many businesses, COVID had a devastating effect on the growth of the business and the availability of opportunities for shows.

Ultimate Riot Wrestling's slogan is "Let's Start a Riot." The riot that they are referring to is "starting a riot to better the world." They began doing charity shows at places including a children's receiving home and Shriners Children's Hospital.

Currently the wrestling organization is based out of West Sacramento, Calif. Equipped with the items needed to hold a match, such as the ring, the organization can travel to hold matches anywhere.

Ultimate Riot Wrestling (URW) does not wrestle for profit. This organization holds matches for charity and fundraising. One of their favorite events is to hold shows to collect children's toys for distribution during the holidays. "Even if we don't have a show, we try to always collect toys for kids," George

George explained that 6 matches is called a card in wrestling, and every show with URW contains at least 6 matches with every event ending in a title match. URW can work with your organization to hold a show where profits from the ticket sales and concessions go to your organization. "If I do a show and there are 500 people there, and there is a smile on every kid's face, I've been paid," George

"If I can put \$15,000 in someone's hand after a show, then maybe little Jimmy will get the surgery that his family has been struggling to pay for. It's about helping the kids."

In October 2023, the URW put on a show at Sunrise Mall, and another in Lodi next to a brewery, both for the Zombie Walks. The URW is all about kids and always provides a family-friendly show. Participating wrestlers are all background checked and are only allowed if they have a clean history. In addition, if someone attends one of their shows and does not have a good time, URW will refund their money. Standard ticket prices for a show are usually \$10-\$20.

George said that his dream is to be able to find a building in West Sacramento and open a teen center where professional wrestling can be taught, and where shows can be held. George began his wrestling training at Valley High School in South Sacramento. One of George's fellow wrestlers and good friend is former RCHS football coach turned professional wrestler, JD Bishop (the Big Ugly).

George is a 15-time Heavy Weight Champion, a 17-time Tag Champion and has connections to bring in "big name" wrestlers. If you or your organization are looking for a main event for your fundraiser, George Frey may be just the man you need

# Wrestling in Honor of a Child Oakland Man Convicted of Theft

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) -On November 7, 2023, Mebrahtu Tsehai, a 42-year-old resident of Oakland, was convicted by a Yolo County jury for Petty Theft, which was committed at Nugget Market in Davis, CA. Tsehai walked out of the store with a grocery cart full of mostly alcohol, valued at \$570.13. Tsehai had a prior misdemeanor and a prior felony conviction for

unlawful possession of a firearm, as well as a felony conviction for assault on a prison employee.

The theft was initially reported by a Nugget Loss Prevention Agent. The Loss Prevent Agent detained Tsehai until an officer with the Davis Police Department arrived.

The trial took place before the Honorable Judge Tom Dyer. The case was prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney Nicholas Spatola. Sentencing is scheduled for November

30, 2023, before Judge Dyer. Tsehai faces up to six months in jail and one year probation.

District Attorney Jeff Reisig commented. "Our office has always taken retail theft cases seriously. These offenses harm our local businesses and the quality of life for everyone, and consumers end up paying for these losses in the end. We will continue to fully prosecute these offenders and keep Yolo County a safe and thriving place for businesses and consumers."

#### Internship **Program Wins** League of California **Cities Award**

Sacramento was presented with the Helen Putnam Award for Excellence for City and Business Relations for the West Sacramento Home Run Paid Internship Program by the League of California Cities at its Annual Conference and Expo in Sacramento. A representative from the league also attended the November 1st City Council meeting and presented the Council and our partners, Washington Unified School District, with a plaque to commemorate the award.

The Paid Internship program was initiated by the City Council and designed by Home Run staff in partnership with the West Sacramento Chamber of Commerce and has grown from around 24 students in 2017 to 56 in summer of 2023. The program, which places students in meaningful internships with local businesses and organizations, is available to high school students from all Washington Unified High Schools aged 16 and older and have completed one Career Technical Education course or received a recommendation from a high school counselor or mentor teacher/ administrator. The Home Run team was delighted to receive this coveted award and is hopeful that it will help to bring recognition and further partnership with local businesses to the Home Run.

#### Micro-credentials for Early Learning **Professionals**

In Fall 2023, West

early learning professionals will have a new way to share their skills and experience with the public. Digital Badges have been part of the West Sacramento Home Run since the beginning, and initially focused on youth participating in training, courses, or experiences that can be badged and show they have gained career readiness skills. West Sacramento's early learning quality improvement has been providing teachers, administrators and caregivers of young children with professional development, coaching and certification in an array of skillsets known to be important for quality early learning. Because the Home Run early learning specialists are state-certified, we have now embarked on a new form of digital badging and micro-credentials specifically designed for early learning. The micro-credentials earned through this

new program: Signify that specific skills and/or competencies have been demonstrated by the credential holder; are endorsed by the West Sacramento Home Run; and are developed through established state and local

governance processes

As of November of 2023, there are multiple badges being issued to early learning teachers and administrators, and those digital badges can be included in online profiles like LinkedIn, on digital resumes, and are also being printed on stickers that will be displayed at the site to signify the levels of quality work done by early learning staff.

Filing fees, if required, must be paid at the time the nomination papers are obtained. This fee is non-refundable.

Candidates have until 5:00 p.m. on

December 8, 2023, to collect their nomination signatures and submit their declaration of candidacy and candidate statement (if applicable) with the County Elections Office located at 625 Court Street, Room B-05, Woodland, CA

Additionally, the time frame for the mandatory Declaration of Intention for judicial candidates is October 30, 2023, to November 8, 2023. The filing fee must be paid at this time and is non-refundable. Signatures In-Lieu of filing fee will not be accepted after the Declaration of Intention is filed. If an incumbent for Judge of the Superior Court does not file a Declaration of Intention by the November 8 deadline, the Declaration of Intention period is extended until November 13. ★

# Hit-and-Run Killer Denied Parole

**Yolo County District Attorney** News Release

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - On November 16, 2023, a two-commissioner panel of the Board of Parole Hearings denied the parole of 56-year-old Kevin King. King is serving a 19 yearto-life prison sentence. This was his first request to be paroled. The denial was for three years.

On May 13, 2006, King was speeding in a van westbound on West Capitol near Pecan Street in West Sacramento, CA. The victim was crossing the street in the crosswalk when King hit him going 50 mph. King never stopped. A port officer through a surveillance camera saw King get out of the van

and run. West Sacramento Police Officers caught him nearby. He was under the influence of cocaine, marijuana, and alcohol.

In 2009, a Yolo County jury convicted King of Second-Degree Murder, Hit and Run, and Felony Gross Vehicular Homicide with prior DUIs. Assistant Chief Deputy

District Attorney Garrett Hamilton represented the District Attorney's Office at the lifer hearing. The victim's daughter asked her statement to be read because she said being in the hearing would bring back too many painful memories.

Board of Parole Hearings Commissioners David Ndudim and Mary Dang determined that King still poses an unreasonable risk to public safety and is therefore unsuitable for parole. They were concerned about his rules violations in custody, his attitude towards prison work assignments, and his need for more programming. He was given specific instructions on how he could improve his chances of being paroled.

Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reisig was pleased that parole was denied. "It is clear from his lack of rehabilitation and prior crimes, due in part to his addictions, that he is not ready for release,"

King will be eligible for a new parole hearing in 2026, however, the law permits him to request an earlier hearing date if circumstances change that would increase his likelihood of release.





#### Floodwaters on Farms Help Boost Aquifers

The historically wet winter early this year motivated greater adoption of a water management strategy known as flood-managed aquifer recharge, or flood-MAR, in which excess flood flows are diverted onto farmland to boost depleted groundwater aquifers. "We knew from the previous year, even in intense drought years, we have opportunities with these big storm events and need to do everything we can," said California Department of Water Resources Director Karla Nemeth, addressing water managers, farmers, government officials and others, as part of the Flood-MAR Forum in Sacramento last week. "Our ability to respond to those kinds of intense rain events is becoming increasingly important." Hartwig Named President of Leading

#### "Sites Reservoir on Fast Track for Final Legal Green Light

After decades of discussions and delays, a major new reservoir in Northern California is close to becoming reality. Last week, Gov. Gavin Newsom certified the Sites Reservoir project to be fast-tracked for construction, exercising for the first time his power under a new state law to streamline the process to break ground on infrastructure projects. The reservoir, estimated to cost \$4.5 billion and hold 1.5 million acrefeet of water, would be the first major reservoir built in California in almost half a century. It would be located about 80 miles northwest of Sacramento on ranchlands in Colusa and Glenn counties.

#### Vineyard Boxes Help Lure Owls That Manage Rodents

Scattered across Napa Valley's winegrape acreage, posts holding wooden boxes rise above vineyards. The boxes provide cozy homes that attract barn owls to establish residency and raise families. The owls then become voracious predators that rid vineyards of gophers, mice and other rodents. "We know barn owls eat rodents," said Matt Johnson, a professor at California Polytechnic State University, Humboldt, who heads the Johnson Lab of Wildlife Habitat Ecology. A research project he conducted by monitoring video feeds from owl nest boxes in Napa Valley vineyards revealed that a single barn owl family could remove 3,466 rodents in a year. \*\*

# **Social Security Matters**

### Can I Voluntarily Suspend My Social Security Payments?

Dear Rusty: My wife retired in 2015 and is receiving Social Security. I am past my full retirement age, and I still work. I recently filed for Social Security benefits and received my first payment earlier this month, and my benefits are around three times my wife's. I now find that, due to other income, I am having some regrets about filing for Social Security, as the taxes will be complicated. So, my questions are:

- 1. If I do a "Voluntary Suspension", can my wife still apply to get up to 50% of my benefits, or do I have to be "actively" receiving Social Security benefits? In other words, does the "Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015" prevent this?
- 2. If I do a "Voluntary Suspension", how soon could I "restart" my benefits?

Signed: Having Second **Thoughts** 

**Dear Second Thoughts:** The Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015 closed a loophole which previously allowed someone to file for their Social Security retirement benefit in order for their marital partner to claim a spousal benefit, after which the primary beneficiary could suspend their own benefit and allow it to grow to maximum at age 70. That "file and suspend" option went away in April of 2016; thus, your wife cannot claim her spousal benefit while your Social Security retirement benefits are suspended (you must be "actively" receiving benefits for your wife to get benefits on your record).

Nevertheless, because you've already reached your full retirement age, you can voluntarily suspend your benefit payments at any time to allow it to continue growing by simply calling Social Security at your local office (or at the national number 1.800.772.1213) and asking them to do so. Your wife will not receive her spousal benefits for any months your benefits are suspended, but she would continue to get her own SS retirement amount (only the spousal portion of her monthly amount would be suspended).

You will be able to restart your benefits at any time by calling Social Security again and asking that your benefits be resumed. You can suspend and restart your benefits as needed (no restriction on how many times), but they will only start/

resume the suspension effective with the month following the month you call. And, as you likely already know, for each month your benefits are suspended you will earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) resulting in a higher payment amount later.

Just for clarity, voluntary suspension of benefits is only available to those who have reached full retirement age but is an excellent way to increase your monthly Social Security payment. Your benefit will grow by .667% for each month suspended and, if your benefit is still suspended when you turn 70 years old, Social Security will automatically resume payments at that time, at your higher maximum monthly amount.
