Surviving spouses may also receive benefits.

We assist local veterans in applying for benefits offered through the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the State of California and local government entities.

Veterans Services is also responsible for administering the College Fee Waiver Program for Veterans' Dependents. This program is afforded to spouses, unmarried surviving spouses, and children of service-connected disabled or service related deceased veterans. Eligible dependents are not required to pay "mandatory system wide" tuition and fees while attending either a California community college, a campus of the California State University (Cal State) system, or a campus of the University of California (UC) system. This program not only provides eligible dependents with the incentive but also the opportunity to pursue their goals.

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA** (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Transit District

(SacRT) recognized a significant milestone on November 8, 2023, with the celebration of the Light Rail Modernization Project and groundbreaking ceremony for Folsom 15-minute light rail service. This groundbreaking marks the beginning of construction for the passing track near Glenn/Robert G. Holderness Station, a pivotal step in enhancing *Continued on page 2*

the transit experience for Folsom area riders.

Starting January 2024, construction will require a temporary light rail service disruption between Historic Folsom and Iron Point stations. To minimize inconvenience, SacRT will offer shuttle bus service during this period, ensuring riders can still access the impacted stations. For park-and-ride users, Iron Point Station will serve as the primary boarding point for downtown-bound trains. Construction is expected to last approximately six months.

Upon completion, the new passing track will allow for 15-minute light rail service frequency, compared to 30-minutes today, for Hazel, Iron Point, Glenn/Robert G. Holderness and Historic Folsom stations. Also, the new low-floor light rail trains will begin service along the Gold Line.

"As we embark on this transformative journey, we recognize the temporary disruptions and inconvenience this may cause our riders," said SacRT General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "We are working diligently to streamline the construction process and provide alternative transit options to mitigate any inconvenience for our valued passengers."

"This construction project represents a significant leap forward in our efforts to modernize Sacramento's transit system," said SacRT Board Chair and Sacramento County Supervisor Patrick Kennedy. "The 15-minute Folsom light rail service will not only reduce travel time but also enhance the overall commuter experience, aligning with our commitment to providing efficient and accessible public transportation." "Efficient public transportation is a keystone for economic development, educational opportunities and a healthier future," said Congresswoman Doris Matsui. "Earlier this year, SacRT was awarded a \$45 million federal grant to advance the purchase

of new low-floor light rail cars that will greatly improve accessibility and support more frequent service to the last seven miles of the Gold Line. We are excited to see the Light Rail Modernization Program come to fruition.'

"The Sacramento Regional Transit Light Rail Modernization Project extension to Folsom will provide residents with more options to travel through the Capital region, create jobs and boost the local economy, and increase safety by reducing traffic on local highways," said Congressman Kevin Kiley. "I am glad to support this project that will help residents of the Sacramento area, and I look forward to seeing the completed project in the coming years."

"We are now on the path to alleviating congestion and creating a more efficient, accessible and sustainable transportation network for our community, thanks in part to the Solutions for Congested Corridors grant from the state in 2018, which secured \$20 million for this transformative project," said Assemblymember Kevin McCarty. "I'm thrilled to see the positive impact it will have on the lives of our residents. Together we are shaping a brighter, more connected future for Sacramento."

The Light Rail Modernization Project, including the addition of new low-floor trains and station platform modifications, underscores SacRT's commitment to sustainable, state-ofthe-art public transportation solutions.

SacRT is currently in the testing process for 17 new low-floor trains, which were built at Siemens Mobility in south Sacramento. SacRT has an order of 36 trains with the option to purchase up to 76. SacRT has also been actively modifying station platforms along the Gold Line to meet the height requirements of the new low-floor trains. The trains are expected to be in service on the Gold Line by summer 2024.

# A History of the Orangevale Christmas Tree

It is the holiday season! We are looking forward to joining our friends and family at holiday events this year. Do you know we have an Orangevale community Christmas tree?

The tree is a live tree which grows in the circle in front of the Orangevale Community Center all year. The Park was established, and the Community Center was built in 1996 at 6825 Hazel Avenue. The tree was planted in 1997 by Park Superintendent, Chuck West, and his maintenance crew. Landscaping was part of the development of the

park after many remember it as a cow pasture.

The community tree was donated by Lumberjack Store, and it came to the park in a box rather than a bucket which they thought was fitting for Orangevale. They determined the tree was appropriate for Christas and therefore, it was planted in the circle in front of the Community Center in hopes of it being decorated every year for Christmas.

Not long after this tree was planted, a truck entering the roundabout lost control and drove over the newly planted tree. The tree was not always everyone's favorite. The staff called it "A Charlie Brown tree" as it had very few nice branches, most were gangly and droopy and was only about four feet tall. Several people tried to dissuade the park district from planting the tree in the center roundabout in hopes of finding one that was "prettier" that would be more suitable to be called a community Christmas tree!

Miraculously the tree survived thanks to the loving care it received. It is currently an exceptionally large and beautiful monument that is decorated with various ornaments and lit every year at Christmas time. A very heartwarming ceremony with the topper placed on the tree by Santa along with other community dignitaries who are lifted by a cherry picker/crane piece of equipment while the crowd enjoys the event.

# Hands on for Crafty Christmas

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - St John the Evangelist School's blowout – "A Holiday Show of Hands" – will ensure a crafty Christmas for thousands of shoppers on December 1, 2 and 3.

Now in its 45th year and boasting more than 150 vendors, the market annually fills the entire Locust Avenue campus with up to 10,000 guests. Proceeds benefit the Catholic school.

Entrepreneurism annually soars during the fundraiser. Wares range from funky sweaters to metal sculptures and glittering ornaments. A preview (4-9 pm on December 1) requires an admission fee, but Saturday and Sunday browsing is free. Doors open at 9 am on both weekend days.

While we are still multiple approvals and years away from the construction process, I am pleased to hear that the Sites Reservoir project is finally getting the chance to move forward in an expeditious manner."

Currently, much of the rainfall California receives is not captured. As proposed, Sites Reservoir will be a 1.5 million acre-foot reservoir located in the Sacramento Valley west of Maxwell and will capture storm-related runoff and a portion of storm-related flood water to increase water supply in drier years.

Elected in 2022, Senator Niello represents California Senate District 6, which covers portions of Placer and Sacramento Counties and all of Sutter and Yuba Counties.





# **How Military Spouses Can Find Connection and Support**

## From StatePoint

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Military spouses sacrifice stable careers and time with loved ones due to constant moves to new duty stations, and hold down the fort at home during their spouses' deployments. That's why the USO prioritizes providing community and support to military spouses. Here are some of the ways their programs are making an impact:

Friendship: USO Coffee Connections are monthly gatherings where military spouses can relax, craft, do yoga, swap advice and go on outings. The goal is building friendships among military spouses. When Jenna King's husband Tech Sgt. Howard King was forward deployed to Poland with less than 24 hours' notice, she says she found a home away from home at USO Lakenheath in the U.K., which has been hosting Coffee Connections since the war in Ukraine began. Because of the warm welcome and sense of community she found there, she and her children visit the center often. "There's something for each of us here," she said. "Being overseas, friends who are like family are the biggest blessing. And you can't turn down free coffee and snacks!"

Support for New Parents: Military parents are often away from family

and friends during their pregnancies and first months as new parents. USO Special Delivery presented by Johnson's are baby showers that provide a touch of home. They allow expectant parents and military spouses to connect and bond, and 72% of participants this year have stated in feedback surveys that this is the only baby shower they will receive. More than 20,000 parents have been served through this program since its 2013 launch, including 1st Lt. Erika Pearson, an active-duty service member in the Air Force. She knew

her spouse, 1st Lt. Drew Pearson, could potentially be deployed around her due date. "The USO helped me make friends that I could rely on if my husband were to miss the birth, and offered me resources I could reach out to, if needed," says 1st Lt. Pearson.

#### Professional

**Development:** Because of frequent relocations, military spouses often have trouble finding their professional footing. That's where the USO can step in. Connecting service members and military spouses to resources that focus on

employment, education, financial readiness, mentorship and veterans benefits, the USO Transition Program helps military families build a roadmap to achieve their goals and positions them for success throughout the duration of their service, as well as in their post-military life.

Support While Solo-Parenting: The burden of solo-parenting can become especially apparent during deployments, when military family members must struggle to find a new normal. For Tessa Michaelson Schmidt, connection with her husband Brett, a lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve, became complicated when he was deployed to Kuwait where there is an eight-hour time difference, unreliable Wi-Fi on base, and the added pressure of being deployed near the frontlines. Because they and their two children have an incredible passion for reading, the USO Reading Program has been a blessing. Deployed service members can record themselves reading a book to their child. Then, the recording and a copy of the book are sent to that service

member's family.

"They have a real response when they hear his voice, and then we get the books in the mail, and they know they're books from daddy," says Schmidt, who explained that her children will often watch the videos of their father just before bed, so that in a way, he is present for story time.

The life of a military spouse is undeniably challenging. By the USO fostering community and providing sources of connection, military spouses can feel supported and empowered.

# All Aboard the Sacramento Valley Live Steamers Santa Train!

#### RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - All aboard the Santa Train!

Members of the Sacramento Valley Live Steamers Railroad Museum (SVLSRM) welcome the public to ride their annual Santa train, weather permitting, during the first and second weekends of December at Hagan Community Park in Rancho Cordova.

Club members also help kick off the holiday season with their participation in the 23rd Annual Rancho Cordova Community Tree Lighting at Village Green Park at 3141 Bridgeway Drive from 4 to 7 p.m. on Sunday, November 26 when a special train for young riders will loop around the brightly lit community tree.

Upcoming run times for the Santa Train at Hagan Community Park are 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, December 2, and Sunday, December 3, and the following weekend, Saturday, December 9 and Sunday, December 10th. The SVLSRM museum is located at 2197 Chase Drive, just past the petting barn in the rear of Hagan Park.

The Santa Experience train ride is \$8 per person. Children, ages two and under, ride free with a paid adult ticket. Advance tickets can be purchased on the SVLSRM web site at: www.svlsrm.org/

Personal keepsake photographs taken with Santa Claus are free. Guests will receive a login and password to an online gallery where they can later view and download their digital photos.

"This is the largest fundraiser for the SVLSRM each year," said club president Andy Berchielli.

Over the two weekends, well over 2,400 riders and visitors, both young and old, are expected to visit Santa, he said. "It's also a lot of hard work and a lot of fun."

"Our Santa Train is a yearly event that many have made their tradition," Berchielli said. "We continue to make small changes to improve the flow and wait time of our guests," he said.

This year, tickets are being sold for three individual trains which will pull five cars each around the 6,300-foot main line loop which is festively decorated by club members to enhance the holiday train ride experience. 'We will also be handing out candy canes this year to everyone, and each group will receive a keepsake Santa train ornament," he said.

SVLSRM began in 1965 and trackwork was completed with a ceremonial Golden Spike ceremony in 1973. Track and guest improvements have continued ever since with new features added each year, Berchielli said. Live steam engines carry passengers through wooded areas and the nearby American River. The railroad also features wooden trestles, a 40-foot truss bridge as well as a girder deck bridge.
