## **ARTners host 3rd Día de los Muertos**

ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) - An area art nonprofit invited Elk Grove residents to remember their deceased loved ones on Oct. 29, for its third annual celebration of Día de los Muertos.

ARTners held the event at the District56 civic center, with performances by a mariachi band, a Mexicandance group and a Latin

tribute band. Members of ARTners contributed murals representing their take on Día de los Muertos.

Also called Day of the Dead, Día de los Muertos originated in Mexico as a time when people commemorate loved ones who have died. Participants build an altar called an ofrenda, often at a loved one's grave.

### Council Approves Design for New Library, **Reviews New Zoo Plan**

**ELK GROVE, CA (MPG)** - At its Oct. 25 meeting, the Elk Grove City Council considered the design review for the project to move the current Elk Grove library branch from 8900 Elk Grove Blvd. to the vacant Rite Aid building at 9260 Elk Grove Blvd.

Rite Aid ceased operations at that location in 2019, and the city of Elk Grove purchased the property in 2021 for a new library site. Proposed renovations include adding various doors and windows to the exterior, repainting the building, and making improvements such as patio spaces, outdoor art, electric-vehicle charging stations and updated landscaping throughout the site.

Much of the renovation will be interior work to update the space for library use. Library services in Elk Grove are provided by the Sacramento Public Library Authority, which will be the tenant of the renovated

Construction documents are currently in the final stages, so the project will go to bid in early summer 2024, with construction expected to begin

in August 2024. The new

library branch is expected

to open sometime in late 2025.

During public comment, Paul Lindsey, a long-time Elk Grove resident and member of Friends of the Elk Grove Library, spoke in support of the project. He said the expanded library site will "provide a vital and necessary service to the community. The new site will offer a host of exciting and new assets to the community." Lindsey said that the Friends "wholeheartedly endorse

this effort." Sacramento Public Library Director and CEO Peter Coyl said the library is happy to be working with the city on this project and believes the new

library will be a "great

addition to Elk Grove."

The councilmembers

were all happy to see this project moving forward, and Council Member Darren Suen said, "It's been a long time coming. ... I think this facility can be a jewel in that corner."

Mayor Bobbie Singh-Allen said, "It's an excellent civic amenity, not only for our city, but for the region, that will draw many, many people to enjoy this."

The council voted unanimously to approve the design for the relocation of the Elk Grove branch library.

The council also heard an update about the plans for relocating the

Sacramento Zoo to a property in Elk Grove. The zoo has outgrown its

where it first opened in 1927 on 4.2 acres. Over the years it has expanded to 14.7 acres, housing more than 400 animals across more than 100 species — with the latest addition being a white rhino. But the collection is limited by the lack of space, and expansion at that site is not possible, due to adjoining residential areas and limited parking. The city of Sacramento does not have an alternative site available. In the summer of 2021,

the Sacramento Zoological Society began discussions with the city of Elk Grove to explore possible locations for a new zoo site. In February 2022, the city acquired a potential location — 98 acres Continued on Page 3



### **Fine Arts Center Plans** Return to Elk **Grove Blvd.**

ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) - The Elk Grove Fine Arts Center is moving back to Elk Grove Boulevard after five years at its current location on Elk Grove-Florin Road. It will hold a grand opening at the new location on Dec. 2.

In a release on Nov. 1, the center said it is making the move "to expand its offerings and services." The center's new home will be 9020 Elk Grove Blvd., Suite 101, the former location of Paula Maita & Co. Promotional Products.


"We have chosen a new, larger location on Elk Grove Boulevard that will give local and arts tourism patrons access to the diverse fine arts our community has to offer," the release read.

The move represents a "return to our roots" for the center, which was based at a different Elk Grove Boulevard storefront from 2009 to 2018. It then moved to a larger space in Emerald Park Plaza on Elk Grove-Florin, where it will remain through Nov. 18, 2023.

A grand opening at the new space is planned to coincide with the center's monthly First Saturday reception on Dec. 2. The celebration will run from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The current exhibition, an annual showcase of "Small Treasures," will continue through Nov. 18 and resume after the grand opening through Dec. 30.

### ARTners host 3rd Día de los Muertos

Ofrendas are commonly decorated with marigolds, photos and religious items, as well as objects and foods that the person enjoyed in life. Especially popular are stylized skull images known as "calaveras," as well as shaped loaves called "pan de muerto" (bread of the dead).

Individuals and families set up ofrendas in an outdoor area, and several more altars were on display at a car show on Civic Center Drive.

Aztec dance group Kalpulli Xihuacoatl constructed a large community altar on an outdoor stage, where guests could place photos of loved ones; the group honored its own deceased members there, too. That evening, they performed a procession honoring those being remembered.

The group's captain, Adan Gutierrez, explained the symbolism of the ofrenda.

"The Day of the Dead is a remembrance of our loved ones who passed away. The altar just signifies the levels of the world, from the heavens down to the underground. There's many layers, and each layer has a meaning," Gutierrez said.

"(There are) pictures of our loved ones up there so we remember what they look like, and also so they remember what they look like because they lose their corporeal body, they're only spirits," he continued. "And the smell of the flowers is what guides them here, and the bright colors are like a light."

ARTners Vice President Markos Egure said the Sacramento-based group is trying to spread the word about the yearly event, which he said is elevated by the contributions of Gutierrez and Kalpulli Xihuacoatl. Egure wanted to commemorate his parents, whose deaths were the reason he moved to Elk Grove. At that point, he decided to become more involved in the local community.

Sabrina Garcia constructed an ofrenda with references to generations of her ancestors, going all the way back to Kumeyay Native Americans who became part of the California mission system in the 18th century. She reflected on the intermarriage between Spanish soldiers and Native women in her family's roots.

"It's very much a conflicted history, a conflicted story, and somehow I learn to navigate it," she said.

Garcia said she joined the ARTners Day of the Dead to showcase Mexican culture in Elk Grove, and to see other cultures from around the world gain more visibility in the city.

Gutierrez of Kalpulli Xihuacoatl said he celebrates Day of the Dead because of his heritage, having been born in Mexico. He also felt the importance of continuing the legacy of the group's first captain, Irene Adame, who died six years ago.

"So to me, it's very special to have the opportunity to come to events like this and teach and educate people," he said. Gutierrez and Egure encouraged members of the public to bring photos of deceased loved ones to place at the community altar in future years.

## **Reviews New Zoo Plan**

Continued from Page 1 of undeveloped land along Kammerer Road, near Highway 99 — for just over \$9 million.

A feasibility study was conducted in March 2022, and the city of Elk Grove and the Sacramento Zoological Society entered into a contract in May 2022 to conduct conceptual design work, master plans and environmental reviews. According to the staff report on the item, the city's portion of the work is financed through the city's general fund at an estimated cost of \$1.3 million.

The conceptual design work has now been completed, and the new zoo campus is planned to take up approximately 65 acres. It will be built in phases, with 28 acres completed in Phase 1. which will include the African savanna exhibit. Phase 1 will be double the size of the current zoo.

The animal habitats will be expansive, with long-range views through the savanna. The new zoo will also include various opportunities to interact with animals (such as giraffe and hippo feedings), a carousel and playground space, event spaces, extensive parking, and a cafe. It will also feature an upscale restaurant with exterior access, so people can eat in the restaurant without entering the zoo itself, but still catch glimpses of giraffes walking through the savanna.

The new location is

also billed as a model of sustainability in the community, with solar power and recycled water for irrigation.

In spring 2024, the finalized designs and financial plans will go to the Planning Commission for review, and then to the city council for approval. This was an informational item, so no action was required of Council.

Sacramento Zoological Society Board President Elizabeth Stallard said that excitement in the community is building, and fundraising for the project broke donation records at the society's recent gala.

During public comment, Elk Grove resident Lynn Wheat said that while she appreciates "the big dreams," she wants to know how much this project will cost: "We can get excited about it, until it comes down to money. ... And we're not really discussing that."

Wheat also wondered, "How will this serve every resident?"

Councilmember Sergio Robles said he appreciated the in-depth report and looks forward to seeing the detailed financial plan in the future.

Councilmember Rod Brewer said there is a lot of excitement about this project, both in Elk Grove and throughout the region: "When you have something that provides a public benefit regionwide, people want to see that. And when they want to see something happen, we all find a way to have that shared responsibility."

Suen said the cost is a concern, but that's why the city is spending the money for further analvsis. He said the city can sell the property and pull the plug on the project if it isn't financially feasible. But he said he is encouraged by the potential.

Vice Mayor Kevin Spease said he is also anxious to see the cost estimates and finance plan. He said he understood that people throughout the region are excited about the project, but "it is the residents of Elk Grove, the taxpayers of Elk Grove, who will be the ones paying for this."

While he acknowledged there will be some private financing, "in the end, it sits on the backs of Elk Grove taxpayers, and that's what I'm most concerned about."

Singh-Allen said the financing will be "critical," but the project provides a tremendous opportunity for "generating revenue, and our economic development prospects and jobs." She said that she gets asked about the project on a daily basis, and "people are excited. ... There is a lot of buzz out there in our city."

The new zoo would create opportunities for residents, businesses and visitors, Singh-Allen said, adding, "This is one of those once-in-alifetime opportunities, so I'm excited about the prospect of doing this project here in our city." ★



Paul N. Peters, age 90, passed away October 13, 2023 after ferociously combating colon cancer for


3.5 years.



### Elk Grove Startup Wins Challenge, Aims to Change Online Dating

#### SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- An Elk Grove matchmaking startup recently won first place in a competition at California State University, Sacramento, and the founder hopes her company can "make a dent in loneliness" in the Sacramento region.

ValleyMatch took part in the Startup Challenge, a two-day competition organized by Sacramento State's Carlsen Center For Innovation & Entrepreneurship. About 18 teams competed from Oct. 13 to Oct. 15 to see who could best develop and pitch a startup business model to local venture capital investors

The competition was "tiring," ValleyMatch CEO and founder Rebecca Nguyen said in a recent interview, noting that she is eight months pregnant. "But it was a really cool experience.'

And ValleyMatch took home a \$1,000 check.

Nguyen said she started ValleyMatch this year to "make online dating less

"We're trying to make it offline so that you aren't judging people by little boxes on your phone, that you get to meet the person and try to form a human connection in person," Nguyen told the Herald.

Before meeting her hus-

band, Nguyen tried multiple dating websites and matchmaking services but found it to be a "tiresome and lonely process." She said she wanted to help others form long-term connections, so she quit her job with a



technology company to start ValleyMatch.

She identified several problems with dating apps and matchmaking services that she wanted to remedy. Nguyen felt that dating apps have a "marketplace mentality" that encourages a user to reject someone based on little information, a heavy gender imbalance among heterosexual users, and an emphasis on online messaging that doesn't translate to in-person chemistry.

Matchmaking, Nguyen said, is very expensive and incentivizes matchmakers to set up dates even when they aren't likely to pan out.

ValleyMatch works only with people who are looking for a long-term relationship, Nguyen said, and it currently serves the region from Sacramento to Modesto, and the Bay Area. It uses an algorithm to match members up based on their preferences. The matches are reviewed by human employees, who also consult with members to verify their information and assess their experiences on dates. Nguyen said there are currently "hundred of people" in ValleyMatch's database.

Its main subscription package costs \$250 per quarter, with the payment period starting when the

service finds the first match. A free tier allows a user to be matched with ValleyMatch's paying members.

"We're not a dating app. ... We're trying to be a more affordable alternative to dating apps, so there is no constantly logging into my platform and checking

things," Nguyen said. "I'm not trying to monetize your attention, basically. So because of that, my incentives, I hope, are lined up with their (users') goals, unlike dating apps."

### In my new book, "Tell it To the

Chaplain," I describe the yearlong postgraduate residency I took in 1991 to become a chaplain. The program was called Clinical Pastoral Education and was the hospital-based internship required to begin a career in healthcare chaplaincy.

Each morning, the interns went onto the wards to support patients in need of spiritual care. In the afternoon, we'd critique our patient visits with our supervisor and fellow students.

Dr. Timothy Little was our supervisor. He was an old hand at teaching his charges how to walk with patients through sickness and pain. He was blind, yet quite Yoda-like with his limitless wisdom. He often used a critique tool called a "verbatim," which was our written verbatim of a visit in a word-for-word description.

## **Pregnant With Truth**

One afternoon I went onto the hospital wards determined to find a patient who would portray me in a favorable light to my supervisor.

As I walked past the nurses' station, a nurse called me aside to tell me of a patient requesting a chaplain visit. The man he described was in his fifties and had just received a terminal diagnosis of stomach cancer. However, before the nurse could explain more, an urgent phone call pulled him back to the desk.

Never mind, I thought, waiving a dismissive hand. I pushed out of the station like I was Chaplain America looking for a patient to save.

I found the room and opened the door. As I neared his bed, my game face shattered. The male patient appeared every bit pregnant.

Fortunately, I think his bulging gut blocked him from seeing the shock on my face as I composed my introduction. The man responded well. He took an immediate liking to me and freely shared the doctor's prognosis.

"Would you pray with me?" he asked. "I feel God in me and know He wants to heal me."

"Certainly," I said, smiling inwardly. This was someone I just might "save."

I prayed a strong prayer from my Baptist tradition, full of words like, "If it be your will, God," and "In Jesus's name we ask." In retrospect, it was more like I was casting a theological incantation rather than trying to understand the man's soul.

Still, he offered a satisfied smile. was sure my patient would be the stunning star of my upcoming verbatim.

Just as I was about to dismiss myself, the man placed his hand on

"Sometimes I can feel him move," he said.

"Pardon me. Who do you feel

"Jesus!" he proclaimed. "Jesus is returning through me. I'm carrying God's son."

Along about then, the nurse appeared at the door and motioned

"Chaplain, I was trying to tell you that our patient is also psychotic."

I shot the nurse my best "no-duh" look. "I was trying to tell you that when

my phone rang," he added.

A few days later I humbly presented the verbatim as a "hownot-to." I admitted that I'd not waited

for the nurse's guidance or tried to hear the patient's pain.

Dr. Little tapped his white cane on the floor. "Well, well," he said, "I think we might have the beginnings of a chaplain."

Years later, I reprised that verbatim, this time before a peer committee as I sought professional certification as a chaplain.

"What did you learn?" asked one committee member.

"I learned that I can't be the hero of someone else's story. When someone invites me into their story, I can't morph into the Great Explainer or shine as the Truth Holder. I must honor the way God intersects their story without injecting myself into

They all voted to endorse me as a new chaplain - and gratefully, I acknowledged that their commendation demonstrated yet another way in which God intersects my story.

### Sheldon Wins Two Games in One Day to Make Playoffs

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sheldon did the very unusual Friday night. They won two games. Earlier in the day, the Huskies received word that Tracy had to forfeit four of its early season games for having an ineligible player. One of those games was a Sept 1 win over Sheldon. That forfeit gave the Huskies their fourth victory of the year literally a couple hours before their kicked off their regular season finale against rival Pleasant Grove.

Then behind a secret weapon named Zayden Learson, Sheldon won another game that day by defeating the Eagles, 26-17, to conclude the regular season at 5-5. That record along with its CalPreps. com rating has assured the Huskies have another game to play. They'll open the playoffs on Nov. 3, seeded No. 11 in Division I, and will have to travel to No. 6

But, on the field Friday it was a coming out of sort for Learson, the 6-2, 210-pound running back/ linebacker.

He started the season on the bench on suspension for an incident in the pre-season scrimmage at Oak Ridge. Then he had to work on some grades in the classroom, but Learson has that all behind him and he's ready to lead his team into the Division I playoffs.

"I came back at a perfect time when they needed me," Learson said. "I was always fighting for my grades, really trying in the classroom. I've been playing football 12 years. I've been a Huskie four years. I've always wanted to dominate. I got that dog in me."

That dog ran for 233 yards on 21 carries and two touchdowns. He stunned Pleasant Grove on a 38-yard TD reception from Malakai Savage in the third quarter that seemed to spur the Huskies fourth quarter comeback.

Defensively Learson was a force making eight tackles to lead his team in that category, too.

Coach Chris Nixon was relieved that Friday's game wasn't going to have to be a must-win contest after being told about the forfeiture by Tracy. "Word of it leaked out a little bit but I really didn't

want the guys to know," he said. "I knew we need to win and we had to perform (against Pleasant Grove). This is the first round of the playoffs right now and that's how we treated it."

Pleasant Grove will be on the road Friday when the Section playoffs get underway. They earned the 12-seed and will travel to No. 5 Inderkum. Meanwhile Monterey Trail got a first-round bye after their 56-35 win over River City Friday to win the Metro Conference championship. They are the four-seed in Division I. Cosumnes Oaks has the nineseed in Division I and will travel to No. 8 Lincoln of Stockton. The Wolfpack had a bye in Week Ten.

#### Sacramento State 51, **Idaho State 16** SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- Sacramento State scored the final 37 points, compiled 587 yards of offense and intercepted four passes in a 51-16 win over Idaho State on Saturday night on Homecoming at Hornet Stadium.

True freshman Carson Conklin made his collegiate debut midway through the second quarter and completed 14-of-21 passes for 235 yards and three touchdowns without an interception. Conklin came into the game with the Hornets trailing 16-14 and immediately led the team on a 7-play, 61-yard touchdown drive which was capped by 13-yard pass to Devin Gandy to put Sacramento State on top for the remainder of the game.

Zach Schreiner gave Sacramento State a 24-16 halftime advantage with a 30-yard field goal as time expired and the team continued that momentum into the second half where the Hornets scored a season-best 20 points in the third quarter.





# Few Volunteers Were as Dedicated as Jay Benson



Over the years a fixture at Elk Grove High School's girls basketball games was Jay Benson. He was the official scorekeeper, first for his son Brian when he coached the Thundering Herd but stuck around the program through coaches Amanda Buck, Greg LeCount, Larry Price and Dave Crawford.

Jay was always a welcome smile, made certain I had the starting lineup and after the game the final scoring. After I got to know him a little bit I went to the scoring table one night prior to a Lady Herd game, greeted Jay who almost all the time was wearing a referee's jersey. Years ago the basketball scorekeeper always wore the black and white stripes. Jay was keeping that tradition alive.

Being the smart aleck that I sometimes am, I asked Jay if he was trying out for a job at Footlocker. Jay had a good laugh. (To appreciate that joke you have to know that the employees at the sports memorabilia shop always wore referee jerseys)

Jay passed away Tuesday at the age of 88 from kidney failure after years of struggling with stage four colon cancer.

"I would tell you that in my over 40 years of coaching at five different high schools I have never seen a more dedicated individual to high school sports," current Thundering Herd girls coach Dave Crawford said. "His web page far exceeded any other program in the information that was contained in it. He had over 20 years of history about Elk Grove girls' basketball. He not only gave his time to us but also to the softball and track programs."

"He began keeping score for basketball games when I played at River City High school in West Sacramento in the late 80s," Brian wrote to me in an email. "When I started coaching girls basketball at Del Campo in 1994 he joined me and kept the books for the teams there. In 1997 I came to EGHS and he followed along to be our scorekeeper. After the 2007-08 season I retired from coaching and he remained to continue on with the program. Each new coach of the Lady Herd inherited my dad as their scorekeeper."

Brian coached the Lady Herd for 12 seasons with a record of 159-95. (I got that info from the old girls' basketball webpage, LadyHerdHoops.info) Jay kept the records and stats intact on that website, going as far back as the 1981 season archiving the girls basketball program at Elk Grove.

"The program website he developed served as an important tool for communication and promotion of the teams before the era of smart phones." Brian said.

Jay even created a Lady Herd Hoops Hall of Fame, had criteria for qualifying for that honor and it now has eleven "enshrined" in the Hall.


One of them, Elk Grove's all-time leading scorer, Mira Schulman is now working in finance and living in San Francisco. She recalled Benson fondly.

"We used to call him our 'mascot.' We loved him," she chuckled. "He was so dedicated. He came to all of our games, home or away, rain or shine. He was as constant as our coach. He would even come to practices and was always so happy to be there."

The elder Benson finally retired from his scorekeeping after the 2021-2022 season.

"The was often first in line for Friday football games and ran the scoreboard for home softball games as well," Brian wrote in his email. "He dedicated countless hours to the program, giving gifts and treats to the players. Many players have commented this week how much of a part of the program he was and how much he was appreciated for his kindness and smiles, support and jokes."

Jay is survived by his brother, Kay Benson, children Candace Okada, Marlys Emory, Martin Benson and Brian Benson. He is also survived by six grandchildren and four great grandchildren.
