HERALD, CA (MPG) - Galt District Chamber of Commerce held its first Chamber Gala on Dec. 9, turning its annual celebration of local businesses and introduction of board members into an elegant evening do. Mach One Towing was named the business of the year.

Galt Police Arrest Lodi **Homicide** Suspect

GALT, CA (MPG) - Galt police on Dec. 11 arrested a suspect in a deadly shooting that took place in Lodi days earlier.

In a post on social media, Galt Police Department said it received a report at 7:23 a.m. of someone trying to enter the back door of a residence, which records indicate was on Sugarwood Court.

Officers entered the backyard, found a door broken and located a man "sleeping under a pile of clothing in a guest bedroom." The man refused to identify himself, according to the statement, but during booking into Sacramento County Main Jail, he was identified as Frank Avila, 25, of Lodi. Avila had a warrant for his arrest in a shooting on

Lodi Police Department, which disclosed Avila's identity in a separate statement, said it received a call at 2:11 p.m. on the eighth, reporting an active shooter on the 1100 block of South Sacramento Street in Lodi.

Dec. 8.

"The crime scene was handled as though it was an active shooter, however, at this time we have only located and identified one decedent," the Lodi police reported.

The San Joaquin County Medical Examiner's Office identified the person killed as 33-year-old Coty Bruhn of Stockton.

"The shooting appears to be targeted, and there's no reason to believe there's an active threat to the public," the Lodi police statement read, concluding with thanks to California Highway Patrol, Stockton Police Department, California Department of Fish and Wildlife and the San Joaquin County Sheriff's Office for their assistance responding to the shooting.

Lodi police said Avila is facing a charge of homicide. Further, jail records show he is charged with burglary, vandalism, loitering and resisting a peace officer, stemming from his arrest in Galt.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Roman Catholic Diocese of Sacramento will seek Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection next year, Bishop Jaime Soto announced on Dec.

9, as it faces hundreds

of lawsuits alleging child sexual abuse by clergy. The diocese oversees Catholic parishes in much of Northern California, including Galt.

In a letter published online and distributed

to parishioners at local

churches, Soto said he

expects to file for bankruptcy protection in March 2024.

"It is now clear to me that the only respectful, transparent, and fair way to address the substantial number of claims by those who have been abused by clergy and other members of

Sac Diocese to Seek Bankruptcy Protection, Facing 250+ Sexual-Abuse Cases

Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection generally allows an organization to continue operating while negotiating with creditors to restructure its debts. The letter noted as much and said parishes and schools in the diocese "would continue their operations uninterrupted."

Soto said more than 250 lawsuits alleging abuse have been filed against the diocese. Without reorganization, "it is likely that not all the abuse victim-survivors would receive a fair consideration of their claim," he said, with available funds being "depleted" in the first cases brought forward.

"Bankruptcy is a costly and lengthy process, but it also provides supervision and transparency for all the parties involved so that a fair resolution is offered to the victim-survivors of abuse," Soto continued. He expressed hope that the diocese would "emerge from this necessary, penitential exercise with greater resolve to be a humble sanctuary of holiness and healing for all the sons and daughters of God in Northern California."

Law Group **Decries Plan**

A law firm that represents people alleging clerical abuse, including cases in the Sacramento diocese, criticized the decision.

"On behalf of the many survivors who were gravely hurt, we react with deep disappointment in the choice made by the Bishop of Sacramento to seek bankruptcy protection from accountability," Jeff Anderson and Associates said in a press release. "We know from all the work we have done with survivors across the country that bishops and dioceses have continuously utilized Chapter 11 to shamefully protect themselves."

The release said other dioceses have used bankruptcy filings to delay court cases and prevent "full disclosure."

"The Diocese might change, but their motivations for filing bankruptcy remain the same — the desire to protect their reputation and their assets, no matter the moral expense," attorney Jeff Anderson said in a statement.

The Sacramento diocese is the fourth in California to seek bankruptcy protection after a wave of sexual-abuse claims under state Assembly Bill 218. The legislation took effect in 2020 and extended the statute of limitations on childhood sexual abuse, allowing much more time for accusers to come forward after reaching adulthood.

The other dioceses filing for Chapter 11 protection are Santa Rosa, San Francisco and Oakland.

3 Accused Priests Served in Galt

According to a list of "credibly accused clergy" published by the Sacramento diocese, three priests who served

in Galt were accused of abuse at some point in their careers: Rodolfo Delgado, Francisco Javier Garcia and Robert Casper.

Delgado was accused of abuse from 1983 to 1985, during the time he served at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento. He went on to serve at seven other parishes in the diocese; they include St. Christopher Catholic Church in Galt, where he was assigned from 1992 to 1996. When his accuser came forward in 2006, he was removed from ministry and "later assigned to (a) life of prayer and penance."

Garcia served at St. Pius X Seminary in Galt from 1978 to 1980. The diocese logged 26 credible claims against him, beginning in 1973 and ending in 1995; all accusers were 18 years old or younger at the time of the alleged abuse. The list does not clarify whether any of the allegations relate to his time at St. Pius. According to the list, the diocese removed Garcia from ministry in 1995 after receiving a report, and he fled to Mexico that same year when a warrant was issued for his arrest. He was defrocked in 2007.

Casper, who died in 1998, served at St. Pius from 1961 to 1967 and is alleged to have sexually assaulted an 18-year-old in 1962. The list reports that his "faculties (were) withdrawn in 1986," the same year the accuser came forward.

Kubota Opens New Tractor Facility

ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) -Kubota Tractor Corp. held

a celebration on Dec. 12, marking the grand opening of its new distribution center at 10355 Waterman Road, in south Elk Grove. The company, which manufactures equipment for agriculture, construction and lawn care, said it has it has invested more than \$70 million completing the facility and expanded to more than 100 employees.

The 630,000-square-foot facility will house offices, training classrooms and repair parts for Kubota's dealers and customers in 11 Western states.

The grand opening featured a ribbon-cutting ceremony that included Kubota executives and Elk Grove city officials. Kubota's Western Division manager, Kyle Hagen, told attendees that the company is "excited" to come to Elk Grove after deciding three years ago to move to the city from its former location in Lodi.

Elk Grove Mayor Bobbie Singh-Allen gave an enthusiastic speech about Kubota's future in Elk Grove.

"The Kubota-Elk Grove story is one of partnership and perseverance, a story that dates back several years to when the city and Kubota first sat at a table at City Hall and discussed the possibility of bringing this project right here," she said. "The project is the result of a multicity and multistate search by Kubota for the right location and the right community, and that community is right here in the city of Elk Grove."

The Kubota facility is located in the city's Grant Line Southeast Industrial Area, and Singh-Allen said it is "the first of many new

projects that will fill this area with millions of square feet of industrial and manufacturing space, attracting hundreds of millions of dollars of capital investment to the city and the region, employing thousands of people."

Event attendees went on tours of the facility and watched a performance by taiko drummers, a nod to Kubota's Japanese parent company. There were remarks by Greater Sacramento Economic Council CEO Barry Broome and V.J. Chue, a representive of Congresswoman Doris Matsui, D-Sacramento.

Also on the speaker list was Shingo Hanada, former president of Kubota North America, who was recently promoted to an executive position with the parent company.

"This facility is not just a building. It represents a key chapter in Kubota's history," Hanada said in his speech. He said Kubota

is "committed to making strategic investments in infrastructure" and to expanding in the United States.

Finally, Hagen announced that Kubota would donate a utility vehicle, an RTV-X1140, to Cosumnes Fire Department. He said it can be configured to transport crew or haul cargo, with a payload capacity of more than 1,000 pounds.

Fire Chief Felipe Rodriguez and Cosumnes **Community Services District** (CSD) board Chair Gil Albiani accepted the donation. Rodriguez said the vehicle would see use at CSD's largest event of the year, the Elk Grove Giant Pumpkin Festival, much of which the department's fire engines and ambulances can't access.

"This will be used to save lives (and) once again, protect this community, and for that we are grateful, very grateful," Rodriguez said. ★



Dec. 17, 1943

Arno School entered the New Triple Threat Schools at War Jeep Campaign to sell enough bonds and stamps by Dec. 7 to buy a Flying Jeep (Grasshopper), which costs the government \$3,000. Though there are only 23 pupils in Arno School, they sold or bought themselves \$3,043.90 in bonds and stamps. Most outstanding in the school for salesmanship were Jimmy and Tommy McKenzie, who had \$1,836.50 to their credit.

Lt. George Lakey of the U.S. Navy arrived home Tuesday on leave to visit his mother, Mrs. A.F. Bettfreund. He has been stationed overseas for some time and has seen considerable action in the Pacific theatre.

Dec. 24, 1953

A decision to terminate the employment of Wendell J. Forney, principal and district superintendent at Galt High School when his four-year contract expires June 30, 1954, was made Monday night by the board of trustees. The vote was unanimous by all members of the five-man body.

Dec. 20, 1973

The Bank of Alex Brown officially opened its doors Monday when Reed Blevins' mule pulled open the doors at 10 a.m. for the customers of the day. Joe Lindberg, builder of the new bank, and his wife Thelma officially were the first customers to open a new checking account.

Robert Biederman was appointed as representative on the Mosquito Abatement District. His appointment was unanimously approved by the council.

Dec. 19, 1963

Mr. and Mrs. E.J. Olson announce the engagement of their daughter, Toni Marie, to Philip Edward Scully, son of Dr. and Mrs. T. Scully of San Francisco at their home on Thanksgiving Day. Miss Olson attended schools in Lodi, graduating from Galt High School, attending UC Davis and is now attending UCLA as a Spanish major.

Ronald Victor and Desiree Lee Jacobsen. twins, entered the lives of Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Victor Jacobsen of Galt Nov. 21. Ronald weighed 5 pounds, and Desiree weighed 4 pounds 12 ounces. They made their appearance at Lodi Memorial Hospital.

Dec. 15, 1983

California Assessment Program test scores for Galt High School seniors, reflecting a much improved state of affairs, were presented to the board of trustees by Principal Henry Mellon at a meeting Tuesday, Dec. 6. Just one year after Galt seniors scored near the bottom of the state percentile ranks, GHS students now rank in the middle of the pack at worst, according to the figures released by Mellon.

Pre-school through sixth grade students participated in the Fairsite Christmas program held at the Civic Center December 8. Also taking part was the band, directed by Rick Hawkins, and the choir, directed by Phil Brown. The program centered around Santa Claus (played by Joe Stamp), Mrs. Claus (Elvia Gonzales) and his elves. \star



Have you ever noticed how enterprising individuals can turn nearly anything into a marketable advent calendar by dividing the merchandise into 24 discrete pieces?

I prefer the traditional choice of chocolate, but now you can find beer, wine and even whiskey advent calendars. Sausage and cheese make for a December-long charcuterie board in 24 bitesize pieces.

For kids, there are small toys behind the little cardboard doors.

If you want to encourage your young charges toward engineering fields, you might buy the one with 24 science projects that, at the end of it all, yield an actual working radio.

Note: Be prepared to answer the question, "Mom. What's a radio?"

The point of these advent calendars is that they give us a countdown to Christmas as, each day, we find the next numbered window. Open it to discover a treat inside, and then enjoy that treat anticipating the big day.

The counting also brings us an element of certainty. We start at the beginning, and we know when it ends. Christmas is only 24 chocolates from now.

agenda. The story goes that the 19th-century German pastor and advocate for those living in poverty, Johann Hinrich Wichern, created the first wreath to help the children of his community manage their impatience as they waited for Christmas.

The original wreath featured four large white candles, one for each Sunday of Advent. He added smaller red candles for each day of the week that allowed for daily tracking.

But the wreath's shape a circle — is significant in its own right.

Had Wichern simply been looking for a way to mark the days, a straight line (or rows) of candles would have done the trick. But the wreath opens up an entirely different story. It's a story with an as-yet-undated end.

While the Advent season marks the days until Christmas, for many of us, it also marks a season of raised awareness of the promised return of Jesus Christ at the end of all time and of death's inevitability.

Here's the thing: nobody knows when that will be.

While each day brings us one day closer, we don't know how many little windows we'll need for that advent calendar.

The circle of Wichern's wreath evokes the cyclical nature of time, inviting us to remember that one day follows the next through a cycle of days, months and years. In a productivity culture, this cycle is one of wanting and achieving followed by the need to want and achieve all over again. The cycle seems never to

Yet we know that the days of achieving will end at some point, and if all we

have is achievement, we will have nothing but dust.

The Biblical texts read in many churches during Advent offer us a way through this endless cycle of days that will not be satisfied. In these readings, we hear Jesus teaching about the end of all things with images of destruction that seem bent on scaring us to death (Mark 13:24-37).

If it is true, as he says, that the most fundamental realities like mountains and the sun's shining are subject to destruction, what is left?

What remains is the eternal love of God coming - "adventing" - that is, coming in love for the you that is

Wichern's advent wreath forms an eternity of shape and it becomes your victory crown. It is the shape of love seeking you.

Hawk Wrestling Update Corriea and Shayhen **Off to Great Starts**



Chalo Enriquez has also been placing well in the first few tournaments.





Sophomore Madisyn Robbins is


second in points at 14.1 per game and averaging 9.5 rebounds. New coach Josh Williams stepped up
