GALT, CA (MPG) - Dry Creek Oaks, a new residential development for adults 55 and older, is holding a winter clothing drive, aiming to gather warm coats, hats and gloves for low-income residents of the Sacramento area.

"We have decided to

host a coat drive this winter season because we've seen the need in the community and all of the unhoused and less fortunate folks we've got around," said Danielle Sanders, Dry Creek Oaks' lifestyle coordinator. She continued that, in places throughout the Sacramento region, "there's quite the need for reducedcost items, and so we just thought we could help provide a necessary item to those in need."

The donations will go to Elica Health, a health care provider with various locations in Sacramento that services low-income clients.

New and gently used coats, jackets, hats, gloves and scarves can be dropped off at 959 Dry Creek Drive, Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. For weekend drop-off, call 209-663-2845. The donation deadline is Jan. 20.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted last month to appoint David Villanueva as the county executive.

The county executive manages the operations of the county and enacts the decisions of the board. The board approved Villanueva's appointment at its Dec. 5 meeting, and he will replace retiring County Executive Ann Edwards on Jan. 28. Addressing Villanueva at the board meeting, Supervisor Pat Hume acknowledged that his initial preference had been for Edwards to remain in her position, but with her retirement, Hume felt that promoting within the county was a good choice. "I think that there's value in looking inside the organization, and I hope that that does something for the morale of those that you'll be leading, to say, 'You, too, can ascend to these heights if you stay dedicated to the job." Hume said he looked forward to Villanueva's leadership direction. "I truly am honored and grateful for the confidence that you've placed in me in this appointment," Villanueva told the supervisors. He acknowledged the board's wish to continue an initiative to change the county government's culture, noting that he helped draft the county's statements of purpose, vision and values. "Rest assured that these principles will continue to serve as the guiding force for me and our county staff," Villanueva said, thanking his colleagues and family for their support.

National Weather Service, City of Galt Tell How to Handle Rain on the Road, at Home

GALT, CA (MPG) - The rainy season has arrived in California. Over 24

hours starting on Jan. 2, the National Weather Service measured half an inch of rain at a station in Herald, and it reported slick roads across parts of Northern California. On Dec. 30, the same station measured 1 inch. Posting on the social network X, formerly known as

Twitter, the weather service said it anticipates more rain in the Central Valley over the weekend, on Jan. 6 and 7. *Continued on Page 2*

far hasn't matched the deluge the region experienced last winter, there are still measures residents can take to stay safe.

The weather service's advice: "Give yourself extra time to reach your destination, and slow down & use wipers/headlights when driving in the rain!"

The city of Galt also posted on social media, where it gave the following pointers for weather-proofing homes:

"— Clear the Path: Help us maintain clear sidewalks and City storm drains. Rake and dispose of leaves, branches, and


debris in your yard waste cart/container. Remember, no piles in the street or gutter!

Gutter Check: Ensure smooth water flow by cleaning rain gutters of any debris. Don't forget to flush downspouts to prevent clogs.

- Stay Connected: Your safety matters! For after-hours assistance, contact Public Works through the Galt Police Dept. non-emergency line at 209-366-7000."

The city concluded with a call to action for community members.

"Let's keep our community resilient and ready for whatever weather comes our way."

Continued from Page 1 career path began by answering a bulletin board ad for a student assistant with the state of California. After rising to executive roles in the California Department of General Services, he began his work with the county as deputy county executive for administrative services in 2011. He was promoted to assistant county executive in May 2023.

Villanueva thanked Edwards for her service and said pledged to continue and build on the projects she as been working on.

Board Chair Rich Desmond said the county has made important steps

in making sure employees feel valued.

"I am very confident that with your experience with Sacramento County, David, your commitment to Sacramento, that you will carry on this progress that we have made in the county. I think that ... we have an outstanding executive team, and I'm very happy that you've been selected to lead this team and ... carry on the progress we've made, but take us in the county to higher heights."

Supervisor Sue Frost commended Edwards' work in improving the county's culture, and Frost said she was encouraged by staff's support of Villanueva.

Edwards, retiring from position she has held since 2021, voiced her confidence in Villanueva's ability to manage the county.

"A lot of people don't know him well because he's just this guy that works quietly behind the scenes and gets stuff done, all the time. He's been my right-hand man since I took this job three years ago. And David is smart, he's creative and innovative, but equally important, he's kind and compassionate."

Edwards said Villanueva "deeply cares" about the county, and its residents and employees. \star



According to National Today, National Whipped Cream Day is always celebrated on Jan. 5. Whipped cream is a sweet treat that we've been creating for centuries.

As air is beaten into milk with a high enough fat content, the fats trap the air in tiny bubbles. With enough bubbles, the cream loses it liquid qualities and starts to hold shape. The earliest recipes for whipped cream date back to Italy in the mid 1500s. It wasn't actually called "whipped cream" until the late 1600s in England; early recipes dubbed the confection "snow milk" and recommended beating heavy

cream with a willow branch until foamy.

Now that we have sanitized whisks and modern food processing machinery, whipped cream is widely available in a range of flavors and textures. You can find chocolate whipped cream, mint whipped cream, and tubs of whipped-cream substitute that never goes flat. Then there's heavy whipping cream, which has a higher fat content for a richer taste and sturdier peaks.

Whether you like the convenience of whipped topping from a can or the sweet satisfaction of whisking up a homemade batch, be sure to celebrate the joys

that whipped cream can bring.

A whipped cream timeline: In the 1500s, an English recipe title "A Dyschefull of Snowe" (not quite sure who or what "dyschefull" is, but that is the title of the recipe) utilizes a whipped cream texture know as "snow cream." In 1661, French Chef Vatel prepared whipped cream with sugar and served it at a feast in honor of King Louis XIV. This became known as royal whipped cream. In the 1930s, British scientists invented aeration systems using nitrous oxide, for use in the food industry. And in 1948, Aaron "Bunny" Lapin created Reddi-wip using real cream.

Today, you can find many variations of whipped cream including vegan versions which use plant-based milks such as cashew or coconut instead of traditional dairy ingredients. My favorite use of whipped cream is in cream puffs with sliced strawberries. Yum! Too bad strawberries are not in season right now, because that could be tonight's dessert. Oh, what the heck! I'll just have to eat the cream puffs without strawberries.


