## Matsui, Dingell, Castor Lead Effort

 to Protect Energy Efficiency StandardsOffice of Rep. Doris Matsui News Release

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - Congresswoman Doris Matsui (CA-07) and Reps. Debbie Dingell (MI-06) and Kathy Castor (FL14) led a group of 49 lawmakers in sending a letter to House and Senate Appropriations leadership, urging them to reject appropriations provisions that would gut new energy efficiency standards.
"As Congress works
to come to an agreement to come to an agreement on appropriations for fis-
cal year 2024, we write to oppose provisions in to oppose provisions in
H.R. 4394, the Energy H.R. 4394, the Energy
and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2024, that would diminish the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE's) authority to set energy conservation standards for a range of appliances," wrote the lawmakers.
DOE energy efficiency standards cover more than 60 different products ranging from laundry machines and dishwashers to lighting technologies. These stan-
dards are important tools dards are important tools sumers money while also
decarbonizing crucial sectors of the economy. DOE recently estimated that adopted during President Biden's first term will provide nearly $\$ 1$ trillion in additional consumer savings over the next 30 years. "By ensuring that standards are up-to-date, we can save money and energy while also ensuring that consumers have a wide range of top-perform-
ing choices that suit them," ing choices that suit them,
the lawmakers continued "As a result of standards in effect today, the average in effect today, the average approximately $\$ 500$ annuapproximately ally on utility bills."
The letter has the support of energy efficiency and climate stakeholders. "The Department of Energy is doing its job updating energy efficiency standards to save consumers and businesses money while protecting
the climate," said Andrew deLaski, Executive Director, Appliance Standards Awareness Project. "There's no good reason Congress should tatives on this letter are standing up for lower utility bills and less pollution",
"This attack by House Republicans on consumers would block the Department of Energy from reviewing, assessing, energy efficiency standards," said Margie Alt, Climate Action Campaign Director. "Since their inception in 1987, appliance efficiency standards have reduced family utility bills by about $\$ 500$ per month. New efficiency
standards will drive inno standards will drive inno-
vation and save families ven more money in the future. Plus, updated appliance efficiency standards ance efficiency standards
will reduce climate polluwill reduce climate pollu-
tion. Congress must reject this effort to keep profits high for big polluters at the expense of our families and our environment." Congresswoman Matsui has long spearheaded bold, forward-thinking climate policies and championed robust energy efficiency standards. She sits on the Energy Subcommittee of the Energy \& Commerce Committee, which verrsees DOE energy efficiency programs, and Sustainable Energy and Environment Coalition $\underset{(\mathrm{SEEC})}{ }$ (SEEC).

## National Average Price of Gas

Projected to See Yearly Decline in 2024

The outlook highlights key trends in gasoline and diesel prices, forecasting that, after two years of above average gas prices, 2024 will bring relief at the pump for consumers as several factors contribute to less of a pinch at the pump. Average yearly spending per household will fall to an estimated $\$ 2,407$, down $2 \%$ from 2023, and over $12 \%$ less compared to 2022.

The outlook forecasts the highest prices will be seen at the peak of the summer driving season in May, with the national average potentially rising as high as $\$ 3.89$ per gallon. More uncertainty is
expected with hurricane season in late expected with hurricane season in late summer. Diesel prices are also predicted
to fall incrementally from 2023 peaking to fall incrementally from 2023, peaking
at $\$ 4.13$ per gallon in March 2024.

## Sen. Dodd Introduces California Al Accountability Act

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In response to the unprecedented growth of artificial intelligence technology, Sen. Bill Dodd, D-Napa, introduced the California AI Accountability Act today to ensure state agencies advance safeguards and consumer protections. The bill incorporates and builds upon recent AI directives from President Joe Biden and Gov. Gavin ued innovation while encuring the rights ued innovation while ensuring the rights and opport
"By now we all recognize the tremendous capability of artificial the tremento improve our lives and the functioning of government," Sen. Dodd said. "But we of government," Sen. Dodd said. "But we
also see its potential downsides - specifically, the threat to consumer privacy, transparency and fairness. My proposal will help identify the risks of these emerging systems and develop appropriate guidelines to protect our state and the public."
The 2023 White House Blueprint for an AI Bill of Rights, in addition to recent executive guidance from Gov. Newsom, establish a framework for addressing
concerns including AI-driven algorithms that discriminate against people based on income levels or race, and the effects of automated machines on our workforce. Additionally, the president and governor have underscored threats posed by AI to data and consumer privacy, and the potential for misusing the technology to deceive and defraud.
Sen. Dodd's proposed California AI Accountability Act will guide the decision-making of state agencies, depart-
ments and subdivisions in the review, ments and subdivisions in the review,
adoption, management, governance and adoption, management, governance and
regulations of automated decision-makregulations of automated decision-mak-
ing technologies. One provision in the ing technologies. One provision in the
bill would require state agencies to notify users when they are interacting with AI. Further, it states the intent of the AI. Further, it states the intent of the
Legislature that the private sector adhere Legislature that the private sector adhere
to these rights and safeguards, in addition to any specific statutory or regulatory requirements, and evolving best practices. And the act encourages the state to invest in AI education and build AI competency in the state's workforce.
The bill is a follow-up to Sen. Dodd's Senate Concurrent Resolution 17, adopted ast year, which sets forth many of the
ideas and was the first AI-drafted state resideas and was the

## The Veteran Homeless Crisis

 CALMatters.orgCalifornia has poured billions of dollars into finding homes for unhoused veterans, but the number of former military service members living on the street has held steady for
almost a decade. Today, a third of almost a decade. Today, a third of the nation's unhoused veterans are
in California. in California.
Gavin Newsom proposes a significant change in the state's strategy for ending veteran homelessness. His plan, included in a $\$ 6.4$ billion menin the March primary election, would the March prion specifically, for vet set aside funding specifically for vet conditions.
That's a shift from California's last two major efforts to fund housing for veterans, both of which created units for a general population of former military service members
The first effort began in the late 1990s, when the state built seven new veterans' homes over a period of 17 years. Today those veterans' homes are underused. They were built to house about 2,400 people, but only 1,575 veterans live in them. The $300-$ unit veterans home in Barstow was so underutilized in 2020 that Newsom moved to close it as he braced for a pandemic recession, although lawmakThe second push shtred on a pair The second push centered on a pair 2014 and in 2018 that allocated $\$ 4.6$ billion to build housing specifically for bilion to build housing specifically for
former military service members. The former military service members. The and Homelessness Prevention Program, which has supported the construction about 3,250 housing units for veterans

In the last 12 years, veteran homelessness in California has decreased by more than $30 \%$. But the trend in California mostly accounts for gains made during the Obama administration, when veteran homelessness of Veterans Affairs moved aggressively to place former troops in housing. Since 2014, the number of homeless veterans in California has mostly plateaued around 10,000 to 12,000 people, according to annual counts released by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Alex Visotzky, senior
California policy fellow at the National Alliance to End Homelessness, said the high numbers of veteran homelessness result from the challenges veterans face on returning home in California's competitive housing market.

Studies have shown veterans are overpopulation. They may experience personal challenges, such as post-traumatic stress disorders or other mental health issues as well as disabilities related to their military service.
Transitioning from that very specific culture and society to civilian life is a lifelong process, said Amy Fairweather, director of policy at the veterans advocacy group Swords to Plowshares. "If you do have any physical or mental disabilities, dealing with those and trying to re-enter civilian life can be very difficult.
California's long history of providing housing to former military service memin Napa County as the state's first veterans home That site is still in operation, housing around 600 veterans on a picturesque property in wine country
Altogether, the state now has eight veterans homes. The two largest homes are in fairly remote communities - one is in Napa County's Yountville and the second is in Barstow in the Mojave Deserts. Moving to them can mean living at a long distance from a veteran's family. That geography somewhat limits interest in the homes
of CalVet's $\$ 650$ million annual budget. Some advocates have called on the state to put money into programs that would benefit people who don't necessarily want to live in a veterans home.
"The state should keep its promises to the current home residents, but as things change, the program needs to be less structured on just providing room and board for a very limited number of people and more structured on providing skilled nursing facility care for those who need it," said Ethan Rarick, executive director at Little Hoover Commission, which published Outside of the veterans homes, Calif Outside a series of bonds california military service members find housing military service . The Veters find housing passed that year provided $\$ 900$ million to veterans through the CalVet Home Loans Program. In 2014, California passed an initia-
 million toward building multi-family homes for veterans. A second ballot initiative in 2018 gave another $\$ 4$ billion to the program.

The federal Department of Veterans Affairs, meanwhile, has kept up steady funding for housing vouchers that can provide a place to live for former troops. The Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing program, commonly known as HUD-VASH, was a centerpiece of the Bush and Obama homelessness. It provides rental assistance to over 100,000 veterans nationally over 100,000 veterans nationally
The number of homeless veterans in the the VA in 2007 reported some 154,000 former troops were homeless.
At that time, Fairweather of Swords to Plowshares said many of those deployed in the Iraq and Afghanistan wars were starting to come back home "to a society that wasn't prepared for it."
On top of that, they and older vet
downturn, which led to more unemployment and homelessness.
"It all came together in a way that was really disadvantageous to the veterans," she said. Last year, the VA estimated about 33,000 veterans were homeless nationwide. According to the 2021 annual homelessness assessment report by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, more than half of them are over age 55. The data also shows that Black veterans are more likely to be homeless than veterans belonging to other races.
Advocates say veterans can be reluctant to ask for help.
When veterans ultimately fall down that along with that is that they're losing conalong with that is that they're losing con-
nection with friends and family, because nection with friends and family, because
they're ashamed that their life is falling hey're ashamed that their life is falling
apart and it's hard for them to ask for help," said Stephen Peck, president of the veterans support organization U.S. Vets

Putting the money into the mental health bond comes with a tradeoff.
In advancing Newsom's mental health plan, lawmakers amended an early version of Assemblymember Irwin's veterans' housing bill that would have issued more bonds for the existing veterans' housing program. Without new funding, the program that supports construction of
multi-unit veterans' housing is expected to multi-unit veterans' housing is expected to run out of money in 2024.
Still, representatives for Newsom's balbond would create more said the former troopse former troops.

Proposition 1 adds new money for California's most vulnerable veterans with-
out any redirection or reprioritization from the current program. Without Proposition 1, there would be zero funding for homeless veteran housing moving forward, which is why the measure is so critically needed," the statement read.
Altogether, the ballot measure going to voters includes $\$ 6.4$ billion to fund projects for behavioral health issues and those at the risk of homelessness. It also includes a proposal to adjust how the state spends money it collects for mental health services from a tax on personal income over $\$ 1$ million, aiming to direct more of the money to
housing. housing.

The $\$ 1$ billion for veterans housing will e distributed in the form of loans and Community Department of Housing and Ommunity Development.
Representatives from veterans' groups say the program's success could hinge
on getting the word out, and providing services that provide a path out of homelessness.
At U.S. Vets, Peck said the nonprofit strives to create a community where veterans help veterans.
"Building that community is really important," he said. "A federal veteran who's been through the process already is probably more effective than we are as social workers."

Continued from page 1 report, along with other feedback received from industry and the public, will be considered. He said a new draft of the rules will be released this spring. "With changing weather conditions threatening to reduce the state's water
supply $10 \%$ by 2040 , California is advancing an all-of-the-above strategy all-of-the-above strategy
to bolster water supplies throughout the state including conservation," Ortiz said.
Heather Cooley, director of research at the Pacific Institute, a global water think tank, said conservation and efficiency are the cheapest, fastest ways to meet California's water needs as climate change renders supplies more variable and uncertain. Mandated by a package of 2018 laws, the

individualized conservation targets for urban water agencies across the state based on goals for indoor leaks and other factors. leaks and other factors.
By 2035 , water ers will collectively need ers will collectively need $14 \%$. The savings would be enough to supply about 1.2 million homes every year, or about $1 \%$ of the state's total water use. The report called this amount "modest," noting that "the agricultural sector uses about four times as much water as the urban sector."
Water agencies and city officials warned state regulators last fall that complying would be costly, roughly $\$ 13.5$ billion from 2025 to 2040 for
rebates and other efforts rebates and other efforts
to cut residential use. The to cut residential use. The benefits are anticipated to
reach about $\$ 15.6$ billion in large part because suppliers and customers will pliers and custo buy less water.
Analyst's report noted that an assessment by a consulting firm commissioned by a water supplier raised questions about those calculations. They noted that customers, particularly low-income households, would likely bear the brunt of rates increased to cover the costs.
"Even if benefits outweigh costs in the long run, whether they merit
the amount of work and the amount of work and
costs to implement the costs to implement the requirements as currently proposed is uncertain," the
report said. report said.

than others under the prothan others under the proeastern California will be required to cut back the most, with the biggest cuts, up to $34 \%$, needed in desert areas, followed by the Tulare Lake region. Even in the North Coast area, which as a whole is not expected to need to cut back at all to meet the 2035 targets, two large suppliers serving more
than 1.6 million customers will nevertheless need to reduce their water use by a quarter.
But increasing conservation in the places that

need it most will seem a bargain when inevitable longer and drier droughts occur, said Felicia Marcus,
former chair of the water former chair of the water ing fellow at Stanford ing fellow at Stanford
University's Water in the West Program.
West Program.
"The goal is both to make each locality more make each locality more
resilient to the nightmare resilient to the nightmare
curveballs climate change curveballs climate change is throwing at us, and to
do it in a way that integrates efficiency first and foremost as the most cost and carbon effective measure in the long run," Marcus said.

Sonja Petek, the principal fiscal and policy analyst who authored the report, said the office isn't conservation abandon the it's just recommending changes to make them

"Water con

overall water management strategy," she said, citing more severe and prolonged droughts and the need to reduce reliance on overdrafted groundwater basins. "Our concern is that if these regulations
