

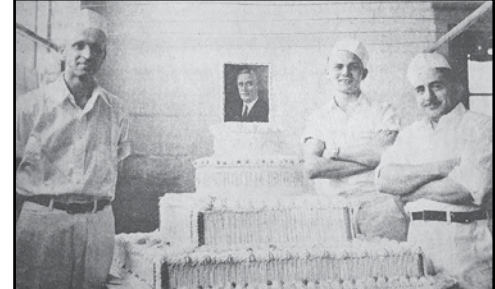

GALT, CA (MPG) - The Galt District Chamber of Commerce formally opened its new office downtown on

Jan. 24, gathering members together for a ribbon-cutting.

The new location, at 400 Fourth St., Suite 130, is the chamber's third in recent months, and leadership looked

forward to making the most of a dedicated, permanent space.

Though the weather was wet, the rain stopped just long enough for the attendees to take some pictures outside the

office and cut the ribbon. A representative of state Sen. Roger Niello presented the chamber with a certificate of recognition.

HS Board Reviews Finances, Hall of Fame

GALT, CA (MPG) - The board of education for Galt Joint Union High School District reviewed the district's annual financial report for fiscal year 2022-23 at its Jan. 18 regular meeting. It also received an update on the proposed state budget and discussed the possibility of reinstating Galt High School's sports hall of fame.

A representative of the district's auditor, Crowe LLP, said the firm had issued an unmodified opinion on two of three reporting categories: financial statements and federal awards. This means that the data are presented fairly and Crowe identified no corrections.

The auditor gave a qualified opinion for the reporting on state awards. The representative said that, in a sample of students, Crowe found one student who was improperly classified in the free and reduced-price lunch program, an error that, once extrapolated to the full district, lowered true state funding by \$43,000. The final report used the corrected number, and the district said it would add checks to verify lunch program membership.

The Crowe representative commended the cooperation of district administrators and schools.

Chief Business Official Douglas Crancer gave a summary of the Gov. Gavin Newsom's budget proposals related to education, which will inform the district's budgeting process. Crancer said the governor's plan was intended to protect education funds despite an anticipated \$37.9 billion shortfall due to low tax revenue. The proposal includes pulling \$13.1 billion from reserves and \$5.7 billion from the Public School System Stabilization Account. The government is not

Police: Theft Suspect Had 100 Pieces of Mail

GALT, CA (MPG) - Galt Police Department on Jan. 28 announced the arrest of a suspect in recent mail thefts, saying they had found roughly 100 pieces of mail during a search of the man's vehicle.

In a post on social media, police said they arrested

Randyll Wilson, 40, of Sacramento in a traffic stop; during the stop, police learned he was on probation. According to activity records, the traffic stop occurred on the 28th at 12:10 a.m., at the intersection of Carol Drive and Ayers Lane.

"During a probation search, about 100 pieces of mail addressed to multiple addresses in Galt were

located," the social media post read.

Jail and court records showed Wilson was arrested on felony charges of identity theft and receiving stolen property, as well as charges of driving with a suspended license and an unregistered vehicle. He had a warrant for his arrest stemming from a 2021 DUI case in which he failed to appear at hearings.

As of Jan. 29, Wilson was being held at Sacramento County Main Jail and was listed as ineligible for bail. His arraignment was set for Jan. 30.

"This arrest is a reminder to check your mail daily, avoid sending checks or cash, and promptly report any mail theft to us," the department concluded. ★

ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) - The Elk Grove American Legion, Marine Corp League and Veterans of Foreign Wars are set to host their second annual commemoration of four chaplains who died working to save the lives of others during World War II. George Fox, Alexander Goode, Clark Poling and John Washington were stationed on the transport ship SS Dorchester off the coast of Greenland on Feb. 3, 1943, when it was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine. They attempted

to calm those on the ship and offered prayers, encouragement and eventually their own life jackets to others on the ship. "In doing so, they became an enduring example of extraordinary faith, courage, and selflessness," the Four Chaplains Memorial Foundation wrote in a description of the event. The Four Chaplains Service will take place Feb. 4, 10 a.m., at District 56, 8230 Civic Center Drive, Elk Grove. An onsite reception will follow. The dress code is smart casual. Kari Markel said she was pleased to have the move-in process completed.

"We're hoping to grow with getting an events coordinator, just growing the chamber in general," she added, noting the office would be a good base of operations for Community Relations Director Kat Seabolt.

"It's definitely been nice" to have a dedicated location, Seabolt told the Herald. "It's nice because we actually have a location where our members can come in. We can do our own meetings instead of having to meet at restaurants and coffee shops."

And the fact that many chamber events take place in Old Town Galt makes the office especially convenient, Seabolt said.

The chamber was previously headquartered in the same building as the Herald on North Lincoln Way. When that building was sold last year, the chamber temporarily moved to the Parker Realty offices off of Industrial Drive. It secured the Fourth Street location in August 2023.



The location includes a receptionist area, two offices and a multipurpose space. Seabolt anticipated holding member meetings, and having somewhere for individual members to go and share their ideas and concerns. She said one of the offices might be made available for members who need a temporary workspace.

"Hopefully, we expand and we can bring on more staff," Seabolt said. ★

Proposed Initiative Establishes University of California Online

Office of California Secretary of State Shirley N. Weber, Ph.D.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Secretary of State Dr. Shirley N. Weber announced that the proponent of a new initiative was cleared to begin collecting petition signatures on January 10, 2024.

The Attorney General prepares the legal title and summary that is required to appear on initiative petitions. When the official language is complete, the Attorney General forwards it to the proponent and to the Secretary of State, and the initiative may be circulated for signatures. The Secretary of State then provides a calendar of deadlines to the proponent and to county elections officials. The Attorney General's official title and summary for the measure is as follows:

Establishes New "University Of California Online." Initiative Constitutional Amendment.

California's public higher education systems — University of California, California State University, and California Community Colleges — currently offer courses in person and online. This measure would amend the California Constitution to require creation of an online public university named "University of California Online" with two divisions:



one providing online courses for credit towards an academic degree, open to anyone who pays tuition; and one providing free public access to all online courses not for credit. Requires tuition for for-credit courses to be based on their cost, and additional fees for most out-of-state students. Requires state treasurer to issue bonds to fund University of California Online, repaid from tuition. Summary of estimate by legislative analyst and director of finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: Operating a new public online university could cost in the hundreds of millions of dollars to low billions of dollars annually. All of the cost is to be covered through student tuition revenue generated by the new university. The measure is not intended to have any direct fiscal

impact on state or local governments. (23-0034) The Secretary of State's tracking number for this measure is 1975 and the Attorney General's tracking number is 23-0034. The proponent of the measure, Boyd Roberts, must collect signatures of 874,641 registered voters (eight percent of the total votes cast for governor in the November 2022 general election) in order for the measure to become eligible for the ballot. The proponent has 180 days to circulate petitions for the measure, meaning the signatures must be submitted to county elections officials no later than July 8, 2024. When Spaans Once Baked for Roosevelt

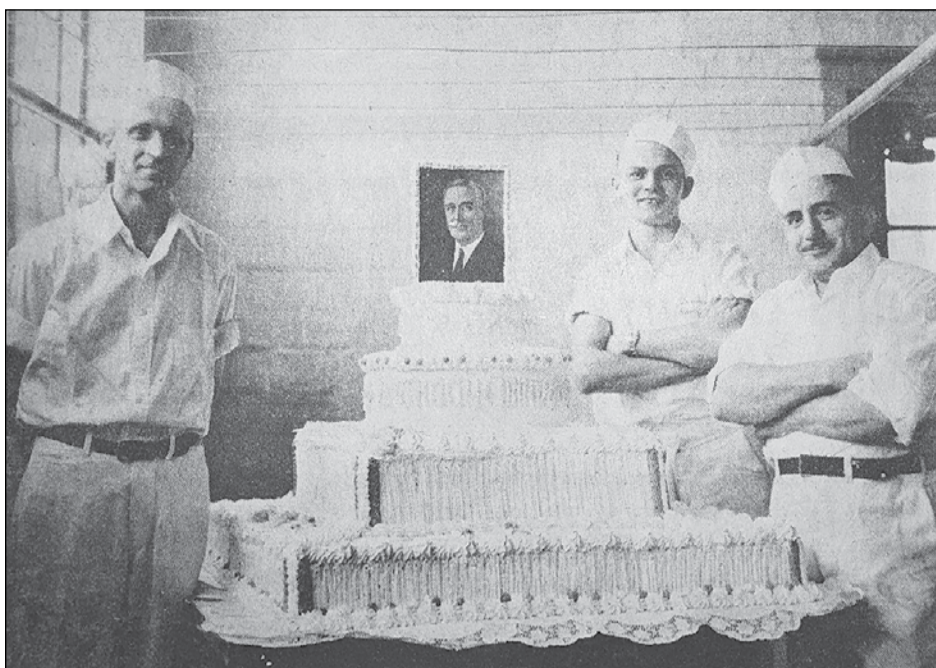

GALT, CA (MPG) - From 90 years ago, a photograph taken circa 1934. It was published in the Feb. 4, 1982, edition of the Herald: "The very young baker in the picture above is still a baker but he limits himself to cookies now. When local baker William Spaans was a junior baker in Michigan, he and the other bakers in the picture donated their time to build this cake for 1,800 people. People paid a dime for each slice they ate, and the money was donated to the March of Dimes for polio research. The cake

celebrated the 52nd birthday of then President Franklin Roosevelt, one of the most famous polio victims, though at the time, his disease was hidden from the public. As far as Spaans can remember, the cake was four-foot square on the bottom, about 40 inches high and weighed about 500 pounds. It was a yellow cake with butter creme icing and took 40 dozen eggs. To make the cake, the bakers took 12 hours—after work hours. A staunch Republican, Spaans remembers, 'Everybody was a Roosevelt fan.' Asked if Roosevelt was the only Democratic president he ever supported, Spaans mused, 'Well, yes, I think he was.' ★

proposing any cuts or deferrals for education programs.

Crancer cautioned that there is a lot of risk and volatility in state tax revenue and said he had a "bad feeling" about the fact that the state is dipping into its rainy-day fund.

In response to a request from Trustee Patrick Maple to consider reviving the Galt High School athletic hall of fame, Superintendent Lisa Pettis asked the board members discussed how the district

works with connected organizations. Pettis said that Placer and San Joaquin county educational institutions that administrators looked at usually require these entities to be nonprofits — or part of a larger nonprofit like the local booster club — and separate from the district.

Maple said it is important to recognize students' athletic accomplishments.

"I think we really need to look at resurrecting it and start honoring the kids and the people that have done a lot in this community in sports," he said.

From the league tournament 4 individuals qualify for the Divisional tournament on Feb 9 and 10 that will be held at Rosemont High School.

“Dual season is tough as a team for schools with low participation, because there are 14 weight classes and if we don’t send someone out for that weight then it is a forfeit,” said Hawk head coach Brian Robinson. “All year we had to forfeit at least 4 weight classes and that is a big hole to dig out of every dual meet. Even though the wrestlers we have wrestling every night do well, the 24 giveaway points makes it almost impossible to win against a full lineup.”

Unfortunately, Girls do not get a league tournament since most schools don’t have a full lineup of girls yet, however that day is getting closer and closer. Girls will compete in Northern Regionals on Feb 9 and 10 and from there 7 qualifiers move on to Masters.

The team season ends and the individual season begins where wrestlers will get to move on in competition as individuals.

Leading the Liberty Ranch girls this year is sophomore Veronika Shayhen with a record of 32-8, she has won 3 tournaments this year and placed top 3 on 3 other occasions. Anastasia Richardson, Kaydince Silva and Zuly Sanchez-Gomez should fair well in Regionals as they all have won a few tournaments and placed high in others according to Robinson.
