WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Saturday, January 27th, Bryte and Broderick happily celebrated the grand opening of their much needed and long-awaited Community Center. On that day, he Bryte/Broderick Community Center finally opened their doors to the public. The City of West Sacramento has been promising a community center for the northern side of town for many years, some say decades. It has just never seemed to have made the priority list.

The Buena Vista Rancheria Tribe of Me-Wuk Indians once again stepped up to help out the north side of West Sacramento. When the Bryte VFW closed down, longtime resident and advocate of the Broderick/Bryte area, Rhonda Pope-Flores, saw the opportunity to change that priority level. Rhonda is a board member of the Buena Vista Rancheria Tribe and played a big part in the purchase of the building.

Rhonda and her team have worked tirelessly to restore and renew the historic building, while bringing new life to it. The biggest challenge has not been the lack of people willing to work for it, nor has it been the lack of ideas or programs that could be offered. The biggest challenge was not even the cost. The biggest challenge has been the complete lack of consistency with the city.

Again and again, the city would show up to do an inspection, give them menial changes that needed to be made, only for the next inspector to deny them, due to those changes. Time and time again, they were verbally approved and then the very next day be slapped with a stop-work order. Please understand that all of the changes were submitted in a plan that was approved by the city, prior to the work starting.

However, with each and every completion, there was a hold up. Permits were held, stop-work orders were issued, and more changes were required. The changes that the city was asking for were not major issues, like plumbing, or sewer, or electrical... they were items like the ADA striping needing to be moved three inches, and other similar items. After months and months of this



finally been given to open. The grand opening was held and Rhonda and Center Manager, Leah Murphy, were quickly reminded just why they have been fighting this ongoing battle. The street was closed off in front of the building for a small street fair that included a low rider club, Hoopers University, CalHope RedLine, Culture & Rafts Healing Center, California Indian Manpower Consortium, Inc. (CIMC), Joann Deny's Native Three Feathers, Three Sisters Crafts & Notions, Belve Designs, Empower Yolo, Yolo Cares, California Consortium for Urban Indian Health and the California Highway Patrol.

The streets were blocked off and monitored by the West Sacramento Police Department while people walked up and down the street gathering resources, looking at the cars and beautiful assortment of Indian jewelry and artifacts. Inside there was just as must activity as outside. There was good food and plenty of VIP's.

"I appreciate the Mayor coming and Norma Alcala to show their support. I was surprised to see Quirina (Orozco), but I'm glad that she was able to come! Ronald Ramos, son of the man who built that building, was the first speaker." He shared some history about his father and history of the building.






Divine Rivals

Iris Winnow has always dreamed of being a newspaper columnist, but she always seems to be neck and neck for featured spots with her rival Roman Kitt. Handsome and irritatingly annoying, Roman Kitt is always one step ahead or just on Iris's heels, and it would be even more irritating if he weren't so enigmatic. But Iris has other things on his mind; her brother Forest has just been deployed to war, and her mother is suffering from an addiction that takes all of Iris's money and time.

When months go by without any news from her brother, Iris begins to worry, and the only way she can find solace is by typing him letters and slipping them under her wardrobe door, where miraculously they vanish. Even more impressive, one day, a letter appears, not from Forest but from someone else. Now overwhelmed with the plight of war, Iris must make sense of her secret correspondent and the annoying Kitt, who alarmingly becomes less annoying. But Kitt is carrying his own set of secrets and feelings that are about to change everything that Iris thought she knew about her letters, war, love, and her magical typewriter.

Rebecca Ross throws the door wide open on this war-torn fantasy that will leave readers cheering, crying, and even searching for their own typewriter.

Divine Rivals will take its readers back to a time when newspapers were the only form of news and typewriters were revered as a way of life. Gods and monsters join a war-torn land, where mortal soldiers lay hidden in trenches, fearing the wrath of a war fought by angry Gods. Social Security Matters

Will my WEP Reduction Go Away if I Continue Working?

Dear Rusty: I'm 63 years old and have not yet started my Social Security. I now work for the State of Illinois and will draw a pension from that state's university system. I don't pay into Social Security from this position and, as a result, my Social Security payment will be reduced. But I have also worked elsewhere and contributed to Social Security for 26

If I retire from the state university and begin drawing my reduced Social Security payment, and then work in a different job which does contribute to SS, will the reduction to my Social Security payment ever be eliminated? Or will I be permanently stuck with the smaller Social Security payment? Signed: Curious Educator

Dear Curious: A rule called the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) will apply to your Social Security benefit because your IL state pension was earned without paying into the Social Security program. The basic rule is that anyone with a pension earned without contributing to Social Security, and who is also entitled to Social Security benefits, is subject to WEP, which reduces that person's Social Security retirement benefit. It's a law enacted many years ago to equalize how SS benefits are paid to all

Social Security beneficiaries. However, the WEP rules also provide relief for those who have only a small non-covered pension, and for those who have separately contributed to Social Security for a lot of years. For example:

• The WEP reduction to your SS benefit cannot be more than 50% of your non-covered (IL) pension

• The WEP reduction is smaller for each year over 20 years contributing to Social Security from substantial earnings

• WEP does not apply to those who have at least 30 years contributing to SS from substantial earnings

Although you could retire at 63 and collect your pension from the university and also collect your WEP-reduced Social Security, you have something else to consider if you take another job which pays into Social Security.

Social Security has an annual "earnings test" for those who collect benefits before their full retirement age (FRA). The earnings test limits how much you can earn while collecting early SS before they take away some of your benefits. The earnings limit for 2024 is \$22,320 and, if that is exceeded, you will lose \$1 in benefits for every \$2 you are over the limit. If your work earnings substantially exceed the earnings limit, you would likely be temporarily ineligible to receive Social Security benefits. FYI, the earnings test no longer applies once you reach your full retirement age, which for you is 67.

Without knowing your expected income from a new job, I can't say how much of your SS you would be able to receive, but you can use this as a guide: Social Security will take away benefits equal to half of what you exceed the annual earnings limit by, and they typically recover by withholding future benefits. If 12 months or more of benefits are withheld, you will be temporarily ineligible to receive benefits until your earnings are less, or you reach your full retirement age (the earnings test no longer applies once you reach your FRA). So, depending on your expected annual work earnings, you may wish to defer claiming your Social Security until you either earn less or reach 67 years of age. If you already have 26 years

contributing to Social Security from "substantial earnings," your WEP reduction will already be mitigated, and any additional years of substantial earnings from which SS payroll taxes are deducted will result in an even smaller WEP reduction. If you can achieve 30 years of SS contributions from substantial work earnings, WEP will no longer apply. So, you may not be "stuck with" the WEP reduction permanently, but you will need to contact Social Security to request that your WEP reduction amount be reviewed in light of any additional years of SS-covered earnings (this should be done after you submit your income taxes each year you have additional SS-covered earnings).

How Will California Overcome High Living Costs, High Poverty And High Debt?

As most Californians know from personal experience, their state has an especially high cost of living, particularly for housing.

Forbes magazine rates California as having the nation's third-highest living costs behind Hawaii and Massachusetts, with \$53,171 a year in average household spending for housing, health care, taxes, food and transportation.

California also has the nation's fourth-highest level of income disparity, which explains why it also has the nation's highest level of poverty in the Census Bureau's supplemental calculation, which factors in the cost of living.

The Public Policy Institute of California, using a similar methodology, found that nearly a third of Californians are living in poverty or near-poverty. PPIC also says that without state and federal safety net programs, many of which were enacted in recent years by Gov. Gavin Newsom and a Democratic Legislature, the state's poverty rate would climb by more

than eight percentage

These data are the grist for perpetual debate in California's political, media and academic circles over causes, effects and remedies, and the conversations will be heating up this year. The state faces multibillion-dollar budget deficits well into the future due to what appears to be a semi-permanent plateau in revenues that cannot cope with sharp increases in spending during Newsom's governorship.

Advocates for the poor and their legislative allies are pushing Newsom and legislators to protect the safety net programs from cuts as they confront the deficit, but they will be competing with other spending categories that enjoy heavyweight political support, such as K-12 and higher education and prisons.

There's another aspect to California's high living costs and high poverty rates - high levels of debt that have gotten scant media and political attention.

Americans have amassed \$17.3 trillion in home mortgages, auto loans, student loans, credit cards and other forms of personal debt, according to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Californians owe at least \$2.5 trillion of that and perhaps as much as \$3 trillion, thanks largely to its high housing costs and the large mortgages needed to

handle those costs. In fact, according to a newly released study by CreditDonkey, a personal finance website,

rying the most debt of any state, driven by an average mortgage of \$422,909 for homeowner families

Californians debts for student loans, auto loans and credit card balances are also fairly high, although not terribly so vis-à-vis other states. It's mortgage debt, at least \$2 trillion, that truly sets California apart from other states, although a third of the state's homeowners don't have mortgages.

That said, Californians seem to be handling their high debts fairly well. The state's personal bankruptcy rate is well below the national average and a fraction of those in states, mostly in the South, with skyhigh rates. However, the PPIC, using census data, found that a million of California's 9 million renters are behind on their rent.

California's unique combination of high living costs, high poverty and high debt makes the state something of a personal finance experiment. The test will be how people fare during the next recession.

During the Great Recession, California had one of the nation's highest levels of mortgage defaults and repossessions, and it took years for the housing industry to climb out of the cellar.



It's Worth the Sacrifice and Put The Money in Your Own Pocket

Dear Dave,

I switched to a debit card so that the money I spend comes directly from my checking account. But I still have a problem some months with overspending and buying things I shouldn't. Do you think I should stop using my debit card?

Dear Debbie,

When I made the decision to get intentional with my money, I just used cash. It's hard to spend it when you don't have any on you. It's a tough thing, I know, but you have to make a conscious decision to start living differently. You've got to get mad at the things that steal your money a dollar or two at a time enough to take action.

Try looking at your life as a whole, not a moment at time. All the moments

you're living right now will have either a positive or negative effect on your future. I decided I wanted the greater, long-term good, so I gave up on the short-term stuff.

Debit cards are great tools. You can't spend money you don't have with them like you can with a credit card. But you've still got to budget very carefully for each month, and give a name and a job to every single penny of your income. Otherwise, you can still overspend.

Dear Dave,

Are home warranties a waste of money if you already have a fully-funded emergency fund containing six months, or even more, of expenses set aside?

Jodie

Dear Jodie,

I don't do extended warranties, because they're not a good deal. In my mind, you're better off to self-insure against damage or things breaking down. That way, you can put what would have been profit and marketing

dollars for the extended warranty company in your own pocket. I mean, think about it. If you buy something, but can't afford to fix it if something goes wrong, it's not really a smart move to buy it in the first place, is it?

I always recommend an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses to cover the unexpected things that life will throw at you. In most cases, this amount of cash—sitting in a good money market account with check writing privileges—will allow you easy access in the event of unexpected expenses or a financial emergency.



Homeowners, carpet installers, landlords, and other contractors are invited to drop off carpets for recycling at the Yolo County Central Landfill (YCCL), located at 44090 County Road 28H in Woodland. Carpet dropoffs are accepted seven days a week at the standard entry rate. YCCL's operating hours are Monday through Saturday from 6:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Sunday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It is important to ensure that the drop-offs are dry, free from debris, and cut and rolled into manageable sections, separated from the carpet pad. Both the carpet and pad can be recycled if rolled

This recycling initiative is made possible through

an agreement with Carpet America Recovery Effort (CARE), which operates a carpet stewardship program in California. The program is intended to increase the amount of carpet diverted from landfills in the state. Instead of discarding carpets with other construction debris or placing them in regular trash bins, the CARE program offers the opportunity to transform carpets into useful new products for the automotive, transportation, and construction industries.

"We are very pleased to participate in the state's carpet stewardship program," said Yolo County Supervisor Vixie Sandy. "With little advertising in the first two years of this program, I am even more pleased to see Yolo County residents and contractors choosing to do the right thing by recycling instead of landfilling this waste

stream."

"I take pride in our community's commitment to sustainability as the Yolo County Central Landfill achieves a significant milestone, having recycled 250 tons of carpet," added Yolo County Supervisor Jim Provenza. Senator Dodd Introduces Utilities Infrastructure Savings Bill

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sen. Bill Dodd, D-Napa, introduced legislation today that would help ensure electrical utilities are pursuing the fastest and most cost-effective infrastructure improvements, safeguarding the public from future wildfires and saving money for ratepayers forced to cover the cost of more expensive repairs.

"As utilities make upgrades to their systems to keep us safe from wildfire, we must ensure they identify projects that have the biggest impact and can be completed in the shortest amount of time for the least amount of money," Sen. Dodd said. "In other words, utilities need to get the biggest bang for the buck when they do projects. That way, we protect our communities from wildfires sooner and avoid unwarranted rate increases as we're forced to absorb the cost of these improvements."

Recently, the

California Public Utilities Commission approved a \$13.5 billion rate increase requested by PG&E to pay for the undergrounding of 1,230 miles of electric utility lines over the next three years. This is a fraction of the more than 10,000 miles of undergrounding PG&E proposes for the next decade in hopes of reducing the risk of its utility infrastructure sparking wildfires. The cost per mile is estimated at \$3 million.

However, there are alternatives such as insulating existing utility cable. Insulating wires costs an estimated \$800,000 per mile, and in certain circumstances may be as effective in preventing wildfire ignitions as undergrounding, and achievable in far less time.

"Undergrounding lines in high-risk areas is important and needs to continue in a targeted manner, but we also need to advance faster, cheaper methods to maximize safety today," said Sen. Dodd. "It's all about maximizing benefit, while minimizing

ratepayer costs."

Sen. Dodd's Senate Bill 1003 would direct the Office of Electrical Infrastructure Safety to consider the timeliness of investor-owned utility electrical infrastructure upgrades when reviewing the utilities' wildfire mitigation plans to ensure that the maximum amount of risk from utility-sparked wildfires is reduced in the shortest amount of time.

"Safety today is not the

same as safety in three or 10 years," said Michael Wara, director of climate and energy policy at Stanford University. "This bill will force the utilities to account for the long implementation delays of some strategies as an additional cost to their customers. Delivery of adequate service today — including the 'service' of safety — is an important value that all Californians deserve from their electric utilities. This bill will compel utilities to evaluate not just how safe a system they can create in the long run, but will push them to do it as quickly as possible." ★

First Northern Reports Record Year End 2023 Net Income of \$21.6 Million

DIXON, CA (MPG) - First Northern Community Bancorp (the "Company", OTCQX: FNRN), holding company for First Northern Bank ("First Northern" or the "Bank"), today reported 2023 annual net income of \$21.6 million. or \$1.41 per diluted share, increases of 35.7% and 35.6%, respectively, when compared to net income of \$15.9 million, or \$1.04 per diluted share, for 2022. Net income for the year included the bargain purchase gain resulting from our branch acquisition completed in the first quarter of 2023. On an after-tax basis, the bargain purchase gain contributed \$1.0 million to net income for the year ended December 31. 2023.Net income for the quar-

ter ended December 31, 2023, totaled \$6.9 million, or \$0.45 per diluted share, compared to net income of \$4.7 million, or \$0.31 per diluted share, for the quarter ended December 31, 2022. The increase in net income on a quarter over quarter basis was largely driven by the reversal of provision for credit losses which totaled \$2.0 million for the quarter ended December 31, 2023, compared to no provision for credit losses for the quarter ended December 31, 2022. The reversal of provision for credit losses of \$2.0 million was primar-

ily due to the payoff of a

non-performing agricultural loan relationship that resulted in recoveries of previously charged-off principal totaling \$2.6 million, partially offset by provision for credit losses due to loan growth during the quarter.

Total assets as of December 31, 2023, were \$1.87 billion, an increase of \$0.5 million, or 0.03%, compared to December 31, 2022. Total deposits as of December 31, 2023, were \$1.69 billion, a decrease of \$34.4 million, or 2.0%, compared to December 31, 2022. Total net loans (including loans held-forsale) as of December 31, 2023 were \$1.1 billion, an increase of \$82.3 million, or 8.5%, compared to total net loans (including loans held-for-sale) of \$970.1 million as of December 31, 2022. The increase in net loans was primarily driven by growth in commercial real estate and residential mortgage loans partially offset by net reductions in agricultural loans.

The Company continued to be "well capitalized" under regulatory definitions, exceeding the 10% total risk-based capital ratio threshold as of December 31, 2023.

Commenting on

the Company's yearend 2023 financial results, First Northern Bank's President & Chief Executive Officer Jeremiah Smith stated, "We are pleased to report robust financial results for the year 2023. Our success was partially driven by the heightened interest rate environment and subsequent balance sheet repricing. This resulted in record net interest income of \$66.5 million for the year, an increase of \$11.8 million, or 21.7%, compared to the previous year's \$54.7 million. The Company ended the year with a record \$21.6 million of net income, an increase of 35.7% over the \$15.9 million earned in 2022. We believe the success we experienced in 2023 was driven by the significant demand for our approach to relationship banking across the Sacramento region and surrounding communities and reflects the trust our clients and communities have placed in First Northern Bank. Further, we're proud to announce that our trading upgrade from the OTCQB® Venture Market to the OTCQX® Best Market is complete. The OTCQX should provide improved visibility for our stock to investors, brokers, and market makers, with the aim of enhancing shareholder value for FNRN."

The Company also reported that at their regular meeting on January 25, 2024, the Board of Directors approved a 5% stock dividend payable March 25, 2024, to shareholders of record as of February 29, 2024. All income per share amounts in this press release have been adjusted to give retroactive effect to the stock

dividend.

Felony Charges Filed Against Woodland Man After Police Stand-Off
