Tummy's a Rio Linda Mainstay

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - If there has ever been a Rio Linda dining institution, it's Tummy's Sub Shop on 741 M St. In business for 47 years, the eatery was taken over in December 2022 by Jessica Thornhill.

But Thornhill is no newcomer to the place. Now in her 30s, she started working behind the counter at age 16. Thornhill literally grew up at

Tummy's. While her mother. Julie Ellis, worked there in the 1990s (she's still full-time at Tummy's, along with her sister, Jolene), Thornhill was running in and out of the shop, absorbing the sandwich environment.

Indeed, running Tummy's has always been her dream.

"This is my heart and soul," Thornhill said.

After being away for numerous years with a successful sales career, Thornhill heard once again the siren lure of sandwiches.

When longtime owners and family friends David and Sandy Shinn were getting ready to hang up their roast beef and cheese days, Thornhill decided to buy the restaurant. Thornhill said that she asked her mother and sister to support her endeavor "and they enthusiastically came aboard." Thornhill's father, Chuck Ellis, also joined the family act, assisting with closeout activities at the end of the business day.

While she had some concerns about buying a business during the COVID-19 pandemic and a history-making wave of inflation, Thornhill reminisced, she took the

"I knew what I needed to do to be successful and that's what I did,"

Thornhill said.

After giving herself a couple of weeks to get her ducks and loaves of bread in a row, Thornhill reopened on Dec. 10, 2022. Her menu, which features traditional sub sandwiches, also includes a turkey cranberry wrap and chicken Caesar salad. On Sundays, customers can enjoy a leisurely brunch at Tummy's, including biscuits and gravy, and mimosas.

Adding such items as well as maintaining what has been tried and true for almost a half century, Thornhill said, keeps her "on top of the sandwich game." She kept what was working at Tummy's, which includes a specially-designed ice machine that produces a fluffy, snowlike method to chill beverages.

Meanwhile, a third generation is growing up at Tummy's. Thornhill's daughter, Joslin, 13, and sons,

County Nurses Prepare for Disasters

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Department of Health Services (DHS) is taking a proactive approach by providing four Nurse Disaster Worker Trainings to ensure County nurses are prepared and well-educated ahead of a disaster.

According to Director of Public Health Nursing, Lynnan Svensson, this training is important because, in an emergency, County public health nurses would move into a situation that's different than their normal workday and comfort level. By collaborating with local nursing professionals, our nurses will be equipped to provide safe and effective care to our community.

The four-part nurse training series covers a range of topics, including disaster readiness, a clinical refresher and training for shelter leaders.



In March, DHS held its third training event, partnering with California State University Sacramento's School of Nursing faculty, local hospital nurses, nursing honor society members, and student nurses to provide three sessions of the Nurse Disaster Worker Clinical Skills Refresher which began with a classroom lecture followed by lab work.

"We went through a little bit of dyadic information, as far as taking care of nonobvious emergencies, in shelter situations. They will also be practicing some hands-on skills, basic patient assessments, mobility, how to use some

of the equipment, and how

to use some of the first aid equipment that's going to be available to some of these nurses," said Laura

Cravens-Ray, assistant professor, California State University, Sacramento. "Something I really wanted to learn, even before this, was wound

Through the generosity of the The Rio Linda News, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Rio Linda.

Last month, the Board of Supervisors heard a presentation about broken families and the struggles of our region's most vulnerable children. The numbers were startling, and the stories were heartbreaking.

We heard about the impact of families suffering from economic stress and children pushed into courts that could result in removal from their families. We also heard about a grant for a pilot program that purports to help - one that other jurisdictions claimed was reducing incidents of children being pushed into the family court system.

I joined my colleagues in supporting this pilot project. But upon reflection, I shouldn't have.

I so was focused on the numbers, the needs of these families, and the struggles of the children - as well as the grant dollars from the state for a pilot project that wouldn't cost county taxpayers or reduce other services we provide - that I didn't take the time to consider the broader issues.

Families are the building blocks of our society

I was trying to help, but I made a mistake

- and I will always step up to strengthen families and support parents. However, I should have looked deeper and realized that this pilot program isn't really the best way to help families and the data presented didn't tell the whole story. Even though my vote wouldn't have changed the outcome, I should have voted "no."

I made a mistake - and I have to own that.

After looking more closely at the pilot program, I'm concerned that it sets a precedent that could be used to justify a wider use allocation of public resources based on racial preferences. In fact, the pilot project itself violates the California Constitution which prohibits the state from granting privileges or immunities to a citizen or class of citizens that are not granted to the same terms to all citizens. (See California Constitution, Declaration of Rights, Article 1, Section 7B).

I'm also concerned that throwing money at a problem - even though it isn't county tax dollars - without addressing the deeper issues plaguing so many families isn't going to make things better.

Instead of throwing money at the problem, we should be focused on supporting parents. And instead of dividing people by race, we should be celebrating our shared commitment to our families. The pilot project isn't a panacea - it has insufficient restrictions and not enough accountability and doesn't address the underlying causes of family crises.

The challenges families face in these often conflicting times, the incidents of abuse, and the growing number of children struggling with school or getting into trouble won't disappear with a \$750 check. And doling out those dollars based on race, rather than need, perpetuates divisions in our society.

I know it's not politically expedient to admit you made a mistake, and there was little media attention, so I could have just remained quiet and few people would have noticed. But I think you deserve to know the truth - not just when it's convenient, but also when I mess up.

Rio Linda Community Update Housing and Infill Workshop

Recap and Next Steps

SACRAMENTO COUNTY. CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors conducted a workshop at its April 10 meeting to discuss a range of policy considerations related to process improvements, hearing body authority and regulatory and financial incentives to streamline development of housing in infill areas.

The Board o f Supervisors directed Community Development Department staff to return with a Resolution of Intention to amend the County's Zoning Code and County Code in ways that would facilitate streamlined housing production and accelerate infill development.

"We're taking this feedback from the board and will put together a Resolution of Intention to present back to the board in the coming months," said Todd Smith, planning director. "Our overall goal is to increase the amount of infill development in the unincorporated county and this guidance will become our north star as we move forward with this process."

High quality infill development benefits the region through investments in aging communities, reducing vehicle miles traveled and associated emissions, and generally improving the quality of life for residents.

In February 2023, the Board of Supervisors adopted a Resolution regarding the County's Development Review Process Improvements that provided general direction to staff to address process-related constraints to improving the built environment in Sacramento County.

The Board subsequently discussed infill and housing at the September 19, 2023, Board retreat. As it relates to housing and infill, the Resolution acknowledges the unprecedented housing supply and affordability crisis, identifies the need to facilitate equitable investment in and economic development of existing communities, particularly within aging commercial corridors and Environmental Justice communities, and public improvements to help catalyze such investments.

The Resolution further expresses the Board's general support for amendments to County codes and regulations that allow for more ministerial/by-right development and more approvals at the staff level or lower hearing bodies. Infill development is highlighted as a priority in the goals, policies, and implementation measures of the Sacramento County General Plan.

The recommendations made and potential process improvements suggested at the housing and infill workshop are very much in line with the February 2023 Resolution. A Resolution of Intention related to this workshop will come before the board in the coming months. Maldonado has more than 25 years of executive level and administrative management experience. Her experience includes leading nonprofit and public social services agencies that champion policies,

programs and efforts to heighten awareness regarding issues that impact vouth and underserved communities.

Since 2020, Maldonado served as the Chief Executive Officer of Social Advocates for Youth, where she was responsible for the oversight of Youth Crisis, Career and Educational, Counseling, and Housing service programs. Development. Maldonado also worked for IMPACT Community Action as the Chief Operating Officer.

Maldonado also possesses a Ph.D. in higher education from Kent State University and a master's degree in public administration and Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from the University of Akron.

"I make sure Mom's happy. I make sure sister's happy. I couldn't do it without them," Thornhill added.


Thornhill said that she thinks about the restaurant when she is home at night.



Rep. Ami Bera Votes for Series of Bipartisan Bills to Support Ukraine and Israel

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG)

- On April 20, U.S. Representative Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-06) released the following statement after voting for a series of bipartisan security supplemental bills which provide critical security assistance to Ukraine and Israel, bolster security and stability in the Indo-Pacific, and deliver essential humanitarian aid to civilians in Gaza:

"I am proud to vote to advance these critical pieces of bipartisan legislation to ensure that America rises to meet this important moment in history.

"As a senior Democrat serving on the House Foreign Affairs Committee and the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, I am keenly aware of the numerous national security challenges facing our nation and our allies and partners.

"The Ukrainian people continue to wage a valiant fight against Vladimir Putin's unprovoked and illegal invasion. Now in its third year, Ukraine is in dire need of assistance to replenish defense stockpiles and give brave Ukrainian soldiers the support they need to win their

battle for freedom and democracy. While long overdue, this bill provides urgently needed support to aid Ukraine in defending its homeland and countering Russian aggression.

"Last weekend's unprecedented drone and missile attack by Iran on Israel underscored the strength of Israel's defense capabilities. This legislation replenishes Israel's Iron Dome and David's Sling missile defense systems and provides other critical security assistance to further strengthen the security of Israel and its people. I remain supportive of the Biden administration's efforts to restore stability and avoid further escalation in the region.

"In December, I introduced H. Res. 935 alongside Rep. Andy Kim (NJ-03), urging the Biden administration to help facilitate the scaling up of safe, timely, and sufficient delivery of humanitarian aid to civilians in the Gaza Strip. As the humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip continues to unfold amid ongoing conflict and instability, it is critical that we provide essential supplies including food, clean water, and medication. This bill provides additional funding to ensure humanitarian aid reaches civilians in Gaza, Haiti, and Sudan.

"As Ranking Member of the House Foreign Affairs Indo-Pacific Subcommittee, I am committed to maintaining peace, stability, and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific. This bill provides funding to strengthen the security of our partners in this vital region.

"As a small minority of extreme Members try to stifle progress, I am proud to stand with a strong bipartisan majority that believes that America must continue to lead the free world in efforts to end the war in Europe, contain the conflict in the Middle East, and prevent a war in Asia. I call on my Senate colleagues to promptly pass these critical pieces of legislation and send them to President Biden's desk for signature."

The Sacramento Kings are officially out of the playoffs, and the 2023/2024 season is over.

The question that everyone should be asking is, is there reason for optimism? I say unequivocally, yes!

Kings center, and indefatigable big man Domantas Sabonis, has now completed two consecutive seasons as the NBA's number one rebounder, outproducing every other player in the entire league. Add to that herculean feat the fact that he led the league for the first time in his career in triple doubles with 26, and you have the picture of an indispensable player.

If there was an iron man award given in the NBA, no doubt Domantas would receive this award as well. Playing in all 82 games, the Kings center led by example all season, undoubtedly playing through numerous nagging injuries, just as he did last year when he played the bulk of the season with a broken thumb.

Make no doubt about it, Malik Monk is magic to this team, and if Monte McNair does nothing else, he must sign Malik to a long-term deal.

Domantas needs someone with girth next to him, and if either coach Brown can figure out how to effectively use Alex Len, or it becomes necessary to draft or acquire a free agent, by next season Domantas can't be the only player capable of averaging a double-double.

By all rights this team should be meeting the Oklahoma City Thunder, and were it not for our own implosion caused by missing free throws, or games taken away by way of atrocious officiating, the Kings would

undoubtedly be in the first round for the second straight year.

That is not the case, and we all must shake away the cobwebs and buckle down to reason with a remedy that is realistic.

First acknowledge there is no first-round pick, so focus on the second round and scour the NCAA, Europe, and beyond to find the Kings a legitimate player capable of not just making the team, but able to make a significant contribution.

I like overall what I see in the growth of Keon Ellis, but there will need to be an expansion of his playing skills if he is to be a starter on this team.

Trey Lyles' time has come, and he needs to replace Harrison Barnes in the starting lineup.

If that is a knock on Harrison, it should not be taken as such. Trey is 28 and provides more girth and rebounding potential than Barnes. Lyles has a three-point shot that is good, and with more playing time I'm convinced he can surpass the 40% mark on a consistent basis.

Coach Brown, after tinkering with his bench substitutions for the entire season, finally tightened down for the final two games, and played a total of four off the bench in the win over the Golden State Warriors. This needs to continue and should not be an aberration.

As I recede into the offseason, and turn my attention to baseball, it's the win over the Golden State Warriors that I will focus on. Yes, the win that sends a message to a team that says, "the torch has been passed," and we have not forgotten last season's humbling loss that took away our chances to advance to the second round.

As the sun sets on this roller coaster we call the NBA, let's be sure to applaud De'Aaron Fox who finished 8th in the NBA in scoring with a 26.6 ppg scoring average. De'Aaron, like his teammate Domantas Sabonis, is the epitome of bringing his lunch to work, and not a game goes by that De'Aaron doesn't leave it all on the hardwood.

Congratulations to this mighty team, to their effort, and to their commitment. We will all be back next year to root you on to even greater heights!

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

Since 1949, Mental Health America and its affiliates across the country have led the observance of May as Mental Health Awareness Month by reaching millions through the media, local events, and screenings. It raises awareness of trauma and the impact it can have on the physical, emotional, and mental well-being of children, families, and communities. Cities and businesses across the country hold various events to support mental health and open up the lines of communication. Many websites provide ideas for businesses to support their employees during May and beyond.

According to the CDC, suicide rates in our country increased by 36% between 2000-2021. Suicide was responsible for 48,183 deaths in 2021 alone, which is about one death every 11 minutes. We know that many mental health disorders-including depression, bipolar disorder, borderline personality disorder, and PTSD-come with heightened risk of suicidal thoughts or attempts. While seeking help for suicidal thoughts or behaviors is critical regardless of the cause, securing a specific diagnosis may help the individual receive treatment-especially ongoing treatment -that is best suited to their mental health needs.

Mental Health America says that up to 60% of people who die by suicide have major depression, and research suggests that the majority of suicides are related to a psychiatric condition. If you or someone



you know is depressed, there are effective treatments available. Talking to your doctor is a fantastic first step, and you can also visit the National Alliance on Mental Health Illness to learn more about support groups that you might find helpful.

The Jason Foundation is another valuable resource. JFI is dedicated to the prevention of the "Silent Epidemic" of suicide through educational and awareness programs. On its website, you will learn about warning signs and risk factors associated with people who may be struggling with mental health issues and suicidal ideation. JFI's website also has more information about finding a Jason Foundation location near you. We know that four out of five individuals considering suicide give some sign of their intentions, either verbally or behaviorally. In 80% of those considering suicide, we have an opportunity to recognize the warning signs and intervene. Take the time to educate yourselves on the warning signs and risk factors associated with suicide. This knowledge may help you save the life of a friend or loved one.



The Pantless Chaplain



Whenever I meet fellow veterans, we'll often engage in some good-natured ribbing. I set up the first joke by announcing that I'm an Air Force vet, which inevitably invokes the response, "Oh, you mean you're a 'Chair Force' vet."

I understand that nickname because Air Force members occupy a lot of chairs doing heavily technical work in places like the Space Force and Cyber Command.

I first met those seat-techies in 1994 while on my first active-duty assignment at Onizuka Air Force Station in Sunnyvale, Calif.

Declassified that same year, Onizuka was dubbed the "Blue Cube" because of its shape, color and lack of windows. Outside the cube, sat three parabolic dish antennas that the chair jockeys in blue jumpsuits used for "flying" military satellites.

A few miles away, I sat in a chair in our chapel offices on Moffett Field, a Navy base acquired by the Air Force that same year. My workday often included planning worship, counseling and meeting with our staff.

In these days before 9/11, chaplains, like most military officers, wore a simple uniform of sky-blue shirt anddark-blue Poly/ Wool pants that resemble blue Dockers. We called the ensemble our "Blues." Add the rank, name tag and a Protestant cross, and I became an instant chaplain.

It was the same uniform I'd worn for monthly weekend duty as a USAF Reservist, so I quickly mastered the routine for daily wear. We had no one inspecting us for proper haircuts, uniforms or shoe shining. We were all friends and "trusted professionals."

With a 7:30 a.m. daily start, I'd often suit up in my darkened bedroom on summer mornings, leaving the exhausted mother of our four children asleep.

Early one morning I decided to bypass office work to make a few visits around the cube. I walked through classified work areas introducing myself and giving an encouraging word. I returned to the office before lunch with a feeling that I had done some good chaplain-type work.

"Good," that is until I was greeted by Janet, our chapel manager and Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC).

Janet was a law-and-order manager, good with regulations and policies. She had a sharp eye for detail that helped her chaplains stay sharp too.

I knew something was up when she asked, "What are you wearing today, Chaplain?"

Her question sent me inspecting my shirt for uneaten breakfast.

"Look farther down," she said.

Forget the friendly "Chair Force." I was beginning to feel like a recruit standing before his drill instructor.

Finally, unable to hold her snicker, she said, "Those can't be your uniform pants." "Why?" I asked, still staring at my well-

creased blue pants. "They look more like Levi Dockers®

than official Air Force Blues." Suddenly I was the picture of patriotism - a red face on a white man wearing blue pants.

She was right. In my haste to dress in my darkened room, I'd donned my Levi's Ultimate Chino Straight Fitinstead of my Air Force Poly/Wool pants.

There's no telling how many airmen on my morning rounds noticed Dockers on their new chaplain. But just like the people in Hans Christian Andersen's fable, "The Emperor's New Clothes," they'd said nothing.


But the sergeant, like the little boy of the story, was the only one brave enough to call out her proud chaplain for his "nakedness." I tried minimizing my mistake with the

adage, "No one's perfect. We all put our pants on one leg at a time." "Still," she said, "Perhaps chaplains ought to heed the Jesus protocol and 'Be

perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). But, but..." I stammered as she reloaded. "And I think even Jesus might tell you

the right pants." And with that, I returned home to change pants. Obviously, my argument no longer had a leg to stand on.

You guys are like two hamsters in a wheel right now. Neither one of you is afraid of work. That much is obvious. And you're working four jobs between the two of you, so there's no lack of effort. But you're not gaining any traction. You're not making a lot of money, and the debt hanging over your heads isn't helping either.

Your parents are obgood-hearted viously people, Melissa. If you do this, I want you, your husband and your folks

to go into it with this mindset-your stay with them is a brief stopover on your way to prosperity. Don't go into this-any of you-with an attitude of the world is mean, rent went up, and we can't make it out there. This is a safety net, not a hammock. Use this time to begin addressing your financial issues, and take a long, hard look at your career and income situation. If you use this opportunity wisely, you can emerge in a better place with your money and with getting ahead in your careers.

CDFW Warns Dog Owners to Be Mindful of Salmon Poisoning Disease

- Salmon Poisoning Disease is a potentially fatal condition seen only in dogs after they eat certain types of raw or cold smoked fish like trout and salmon that are infected with a bacteria-like organism, Neorickettsia helminthoeca, which is transmitted by the parasitic flatworm (or "fluke") Nanophyetes salmincola.

Nanophyetes salmincola occurs naturally in waters of northern California and most of the north state can be considered the native range for the fluke. But dogs throughout the state are susceptible. Dog owners are advised to be cautious and to keep their dogs away from salmon, steelhead, trout and other freshwater fish carcasses. The parasite cannot survive in cooked fish, is not harmful to humans and does not affect pets other than dogs. If your dog has eaten or

is suspected of eating raw fish, watch for signs of the disease. Symptoms are similar to distemper and may include some or all of the following: a rise in body temperature, loss of appetite, vomiting, diarrhea, listlessness and/or rapid weight loss. If signs of the disease appear, promptly take your dog to a veterinarian. Salmon Poisoning Disease is

treatable if caught in time. If untreated, death usually occurs within two weeks of eating the infected fish. Without treatment, 90 percent of dogs showing symptoms die.

While all fish caught or originating from streams in California could potentially be infected, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) cautions that trout stocked in some waters in CDFW's North Central Region are more likely to be infected with the flukes that cause Salmon Poisoning Disease.

When doing whatever they want to do, Democratic officeholders don't have to worry about competition from the state's shriveled-up Republican Party nor, for the most part, criticism from equally shrunken political media.

Thus, the Capitol has become an echo chamber rather than a forum for forthright debate about issues

The syndrome explains why its leaders, including Gov. Gavin Newsom, ignored indications that as California emerged from the COVID-19 pandemic, its law-abiding residents were becoming increasingly worried about crime. The concerns arose, even though voters had approved two ballot measures in the previous decade to lower penalties and in 2020 rejected a measure to get tougher on some crimes.

Democrats were committed to "criminal justice reform," which meant decreasing penalties for crime, reducing the numbers of offenders behind bars and implicitly viewing them more as victims of an unjust society rather than victimizers.

Post-pandemic worries about crime were fueled by videos depicting brazen carjackings, home robberies and smash

and grab assaults on stores. Just before the 2022 elections, the Public Policy Institute of California released a poll that confirmed the shift.

"Californians' perception of crime spiked during the pandemic – as did certain types of crime," PPIC found, adding, "nearly 2 in 3 Californians call violence and street crime in their local community a problem. This includes 31% who call them a big problem, a noticeable increase from February 2020 (24%)."

Changing attitudes are particularly evident in the traditionally liberal San Francisco Bay Area, where stores and restaurants have closed their doors after experiencing multiple crimes. San Francisco voters recalled their reformminded district attorney. Across the bay, Alameda County's DA also faces a recall effort.

Facts bolster the sentiment. Last July, Attorney General Rob Bonta, a strong criminal justice reform advocate, released annual crime data, revealing that the state's violent crime rate increased by 6.1% in 2022, and property crime was up 6.2%. Homicides dipped, but robberies jumped by 10.2%.

The dissonance between the public's changing attitudes and the Capitol's unchanging commitment to softening criminal penalties reached a climax last year when the Assembly Public Safety Committee rejected legislation that would have reclassified human trafficking of a minor as a "serious felony," thereby increasing punishment for committing it.

Similar legislation had repeatedly died in the Legislature but the 2023 rejection touched a nerve and became a media sensation. Newsom and legislative leaders sensed the backlash and quickly revived and enacted the bill.

Having finally gotten the message, Newsom and other Democratic figures began to recast themselves as crime fighters. The governor pledged to crack down on street crime and dispatched dozens of California Highway Patrol officers to bolster Bay Area policing. Legislative leaders now want to fine-tune criminal statutes to crack down on retail theft without materially changing the criminal justice reform measures that the Legislature and voters had enacted.

They also hope to head off a November ballot measure that would go further in undoing some of the previous softer-oncrime decrees. On Thursday, law enforcement groups, big city mayors and major retailers submitted 900,000 signatures for the measure, virtually guaranteeing it a place on the November ballot.

Its heavyweight proponents can easily spend the millions of dollars a full-fledged statewide campaign requires. In a statement, the coalition said "half-measures" are not good enough, an apparent reference to the legislative package.

A head-on collision over crime appears to loom, but it's also possible that the measure's backers and Democratic leaders, including Newsom, could reach a compromise that the Legislature would enact and the ballot measure would be withdrawn. It's happened before. Dan Walters has been a

After 50 plus years on the air, an icon in radio signs off for his final journey. But I'm sure if there is a microphone in the clouds, Joey Mitchell will be at the helm with his joyous voice that always made his fans feel that he truly cared about each and every one.

What can I say about Joey that hasn't already been said... talented, dedicated, award-winning personality, a great sense of humor, total love of family and what meant so much to me was that he was genuinely a really nice guy and gentleman. He greeted everyone he met with a big smile and you felt he knew you forever.

Joey was the first on-air radio guy I worked with when I first came to Sacramento in 1977. It was at the hit country music station, KRAK Radio. I would pop in with the news updates, and truly, I never knew what to expect. There were times I would go into the studio and no Joey...until he popped up from under the board trying to scare me with that silly grin on his face. But it was always in fun. He would try to break me up on the air but little did he know I came from doing a television show in Indianapolis with a crew that did all they could to break me up with antics behind the guests so only I could see. But I loved the friendship Joey shared with everyone, including me, for all these many years.

I think I admired Joey most for his caring about the community, especially when we would host telethons to raise money for so many worthy charities from Easter Seals to the Children's Miracle Network and more. Back in the '80s, there were eight or nine telethons on the air and they were the 24-hour ones. But Joey's energy level never waned. Always professional yes, but with a fun competitive spirit as we would compete for on-camera time, with the ultimate goal of raising as much money as we could for charity. Joey was always game for fun too, like when we were asked to host an event for, I believe, the Opera Association. So we dressed in silly opera garb, and we laughed our way through the event, always ready for anything we could do to help the community.

Stories about Joey were so many I had to limit them, or I would need several pages to tell them all. But I had to share this one from Ken Knoll who did lots of film work in Sacramento. When Joey was named Country Music D.J. of the year and hosted names such as Freddy Fender, Loretta Lynn and Merle Haggard at the Lonesome Armadillo in Roseville, he would do TV funny skits to promote his show. Ken still laughs at this one. Wait until you hear what happened. Ken and Joey came up with the idea to do a skit at the Folsom Zoo in the tiger cage, and yes, with a real tiger. The idea was for Joey to first dress up in lady garb, moustache, and all, and pretend that the tiger was going to attack her/ him. Then Joey would change back into guy clothes, and with the magic of television editing, come to her rescue. Funny, right? The trainer assured Joey that the tiger was tame and not to worry. To be honest, Joey



was rather nervous and began sweating some. But being the trooper he was, Joey got into the enclosure. Ken was not sure but perhaps the tiger sensed Joey's fear and began to growl and started to get too close for comfort. It was too close for Joey and he began to shout "please get me out of here." But it was hard to hear him above the laughter of the crew. Suffice to say, Joey was not going into a

wild critter space alone for a long time.

Here's one that will give you a laugh but I'm not sure Joey laughed. Ken told me about the time President Clinton came to town on Air Force One, and we don't know how Joey did it but he planted a bumper sticker on the back of Air Force One promoting the Joey Mitchell Show. he actually got arrested. Don't know if he had to spend time in the pokey but leave it to Joey to come up with this stunt and look for more to do.

Another side of Joey was always wanting to help others in the business. Jennifer Steele, executive producer of the morning news at KFBK, had fond memories of him. She worked Service was not amused, and years and knew him more than Joey's family.

30 years. Despite his being a celebrity, she said, he was always a real human being, a mentor, teacher and nice to all.

And Big Jim Hall worked with Joey at KRAK Radio for many years. That's where I met them both. Jim and Joey both began working at KRAK Radio together. One did the morning, and one did the afternoon, and their friendship grew over the many years. Jim said he was always fearless and always wanted to support organizations to help the community. Fondly, Jim said, Joey was an incredible co-worker and friend for 40 years, along with having a caring heart and always being super funny. Jim said he was a joy to work with and to know.

There are many stories to tell and perhaps some of the pictures can tell the Joey Mitchell life and his work, but I asked his son, Joe Jr., who sent me so many wonderful pictures to choose of his dad, if he could tell me his fondest memories of "Dad" Joey. I could not end this piece any better. Here is Joe Jr and his heartfelt thoughts about his dad in his own words.

"My dad was just my dad to me, and I never really appreciated all he had accomplished until I grew older. Many people didn't know he had severe and painful scoliosis that would keep him up nights. Getting up at 3 a.m. was a chore for anyone, but for him, it was a daily struggle to get ready for his radio show. Even though he was in pain, he always had a smile on his face and wanted to make people laugh. It wasn't an act, it was who he was. He truly was an amazing man, husband, father, friend and radio legend who will leave a huge void in our hearts. I strive to be like him. He was my HERO!"

And so the memory of Joey Mitchell goes on and I'm sure he is wowing them up there behind the mic with his wit and big smile. We will miss you Joey, but our memories will always be with us. Rest in peace, good friend.
