

Eaglet Rescue Took a Village

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - After a perilous rescue on May 27, a bald eaglet was last week transported by the California Fish and Wildlife Department to the Lake Tahoe Wildlife Care facility. It is being fostered there by a resident bald eagle.

While hopes were initially high that the baby could be returned to his family's nest on the American River, federal agencies deemed re-nesting would be too dangerous and bore no certainty of success.

"This transfer was the best solution under the circumstances," said Bird of Prey Health Group

veterinarian Dr. Vickie Joseph. "The eaglet has a chance to go back to the wild. I'm grateful so many people worked together to ensure his safety. At Tahoe, he'll be in the eyes of another bald eagle and

won't get imprinted on humans. He'll do fine."

Hatched in April, the eaglet was the 19th offspring of the eagle couple that has occupied an American River nest since 2016. It's uncertain how the 3.3-pound raptor tumbled to spend many hours snared below the eyrie. This reporter watched him being fed by a doting mother the night before. The nursery might have been damaged by a recent storm. With three rapidly growing babies competing for space, accidental fall-out is a risk.

On the recent early Saturday morning, nest-cam watchers noted the youngest baby - "Diecinueve" (Spanish for 19) to some eagle watchers

Local Blue Star Museums Offer Free Admission

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Seven Sacramento area museums are participating in Blue Star Museums to offer free admission to the nation's active-duty military personnel and their families, including National Guard and Reserve, from Armed Forces Day on May 18 through Labor Day on September 2, 2024. A partnership between the National Endowment for the Arts and Blue Star Families in collaboration with the Department of Defense and museums across America, the local museums participating in the 2024 Blue Star Museums program include the following: Aerospace Museum of California, California Automobile Museum, California Museum, Crocker Art Museum, Fairytale Town, Sacramento Children's Museum and Sacramento History Museum.

The free admission program is available for those currently serving in the United States Military-Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, including Reservists, National Guardsman (regardless of status), U.S. Public Health Commissioned Corps, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and up to five family members. Qualified members must show a Geneva Convention common access card (CAC), DD Form 1173 ID card (dependent ID), or a DD Form 1173-1 ID card for complimentary entrance into a participating Blue Star Museum.

Before planning a visit, guests are encouraged to contact the individual museums for hours of operation and note some are normally closed on Mondays and in observance of holidays such as Memorial Day and Labor Day. CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Three businesses recently received the Carmichael Improvement District's "Bright Star Award" for bettering the visual landscape of Carmichael.

More than 100 Carmichael Improvement District property owners, plus elected officials, cheered awardees and celebrated business zone improvements in Carmichael. The Carmichael Improvement District announced an upcoming beautification effort to wrap SMUD utility boxes with photographic images depicting local bird life. Stakeholders

voted on preferred photographs for the project.

"We want to highlight our area's natural landscape," explained Carmichael Improvement District board director Rosie Buck. "Everybody loves birds. We also hope this beautification will

discourage vandalism and graffiti."

Addressing attendees, Supervising District Attorney Ron Linthicum noted local problems for law enforcement.

"The public has a right to be free from criminal conduct," he said. "I've seen

too many businesses start off with the best of intentions and go into oblivion because of theft.

"Too many times, leaders make decisions that work to our detriment," Linthicum said. "It's false compassion to leave fellow

— had disappeared from view. At the site, eagle fan Terri Madden saw him mired in branches below the nest at 50 feet above ground.

“I didn’t know what to do,” said Madden. “My heart broke for him. His mother was above, watching him. I guess she didn’t know what to do, either.”

Seasoned animal rescuer Ben Nuckolls of California Wildlife Encounters soon reached the scene and sought clearance for an intervention to save a federally-protected bird on federal land.

“I knew a rescue would be difficult,” Nuckolls said. “The pine tree angled sharply over a bluff. There were huge safety concerns for anyone who climbed it. But this was our beloved national bird. I’d watched this family for years and I felt a responsibility to help them.”

Orangevale firefighters assessed a seemingly hopeless scene. Because the tree was on a steep slope, using ladders was out. They summoned high-angle rescue colleagues. Dubbed the “Navy Seals of firefighting,” this specialist team could not risk the safety of officers with an attempt.

By now, the baby had been dangling for at least 10 hours. Alternating between exhaustion and flapping, it could not survive much longer. Tree-climbing arborists were a last hope. Onlooker Terri Madden located Sierra Pacific Tree Care, a Placerville-based company. Two of its climbers agreed to tackle mission impossible.

Kiover Larnus and Gabriel Cuevas rushed to the nest site. They were warned that the job would be unpaid and undertaken at their own risk. Larnus had retrieved plenty of cats from trees. “Eagles, no,” he conceded.

In boots, helmets and formidable spikes, the duo scrambled downhill to the tree base. Above, the eagle parents circled their sanctuary, shouting outrage at human invasion.

“The lean on the tree worried us,” said Larnus. “But its roots looked strong. I was also worried the mother eagle might come at me. I said a prayer and figured it would be all right.”

With partner Cuevas manning ropes, up Larnus scrambled. Hearts thumped below.

“We were all scared,” said one of the gathered volunteers. “Not just that he might fall; the higher Kiover climbed, the closer Mama circled.”

The climber quickly reached Diecinueve and grabbed the bundle of protesting feathers. “He was bigger than I thought,” Larnus recalls. “He looked at me bravely. He didn’t want to go in the cage, but I told him you’ll be okay, baby. He felt soft and fluffy, like a stuffed toy.”

The nest above him contained Diecinueve’s two siblings. Before descent, the rescuer turned and called: “You only want this one, right?” For the first time in many hours, onlookers — many in tears — laughed.

Descent with precious cargo was slower. When the climbers and cage appeared over the canyon ridge, firefighters cheered. One inevitably uttered: “the eagle has landed.”

The creature I’d struggled for weeks to photograph was no longer a high pin-point of fuzz. Caged, his wings and talons huge, his talons massive. He was still flecked with baby fluff. After hours of misery, his eyes still shone. The little icon had steel in his blood. We did a quick whip-round and gave the tree-climbers as much cash as we could muster — nothing worthy of their heroism.

Ben Nuckolls and fellow rescuer Leslie Ackerman spirited Diecinueve to Gold Country Wildlife Rescue staff (Auburn) that operates in conjunction with Lincoln-based Bird of Prey Health Group. The baby was given fluids for dehydration and anti-inflammatory medication. He was otherwise undamaged.

Climber Larnus later told his wife and five children about the rescue.

“We all love eagles,” he said. “My kids were excited. We’re relieved the little guy is safe and we hope he’ll be released in the wild someday. My wife always worries about my work. But she was happy, too.”

Climbers Larnus and Cuevas will soon be honored by Sacramento County for their heroic effort.

For the safety of the eagles, the nest location is not included in this report.

citizens in a mud puddle, strung out on methamphetamine. It takes more than love. It takes tough love. That’s where our justice system plays its part. But law enforcement is run ragged.”

Sacramento County, said Supervisor Rich Desmond, acts to provide social services for people in need.

“But people have the responsibility to take advantage of those services,” Desmond said. “If they don’t, at some point, there must be consequences. Since Sheriff Jim Cooper got elected, he’s brought on improvements. But there’s much more to do. The county has to strike a better balance. I’ll continue to work on that.”

Desmond nevertheless called the Carmichael Improvement District “part of the tapestry that makes Carmichael a wonderful place to live.”

Carmichael Improvement District Bright Star awards recognize efforts that enhance the commercial district. Wellness Salt Cave improvements included a total remodel for an old Fair Oaks Boulevard store.

The vacant property, noted the

district’s director Nick Bloise, was a source of many calls for the Sacramento County Sheriff. Its renovation took four years to complete.

“The business owners worked with the property owner all through the COVID pandemic and beyond,” said Bloise. “They created an impressive facility that’s a true Bright Star in Carmichael.”

Started in 2016 by Carmichael Corridor property owners, the Carmichael Improvement District is among many similar agencies in the county that aim to improve merchant operations. The Carmichael group’s operation extends through three miles of Fair Oaks Boulevard and adjacent streets.

Funded by self-imposed assessments on property owners, the Carmichael Improvement District enables seven-day-per-week mobile security to counter trespassing, vandalism and homeless camping. The organization also removes trash from the business corridor and advocates for community interests.

Dogs Take the Lead and Support SPCA

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On April 20, Sacramento let the dogs out to participate in the 31st Annual SPCA Doggy Dash. Over 2,000 people and their canine companions went to William Land Park to enjoy the sunny Saturday. Dogs and their people registered for either a 5k or 2k run in the tree-filled park. Some pooches ran alongside their owners, while less athletic and senior dogs enjoyed the view from a wagon or stroller.

The pet festival was a vibrant hub of activity, with over 100 vendors offering a diverse range of services. From pet daycare and veterinary care to dog training, there was something for every pet owner. Posh services included pup boutiques, “barkcutterie boards” and pet portraits.

Professionals of the four-legged variety were also represented. Officers from Sacramento’s Police Canine Association brought their working dogs for photos, and provided information about the program. Several rescue organizations were also present, advocating for specific breeds such as corgis, basset hounds, German Shepherds,

malemutes and golden retrievers. Mixed breed rescues like Resilient Dog Rescue brought in adoptable dogs, adding an opportunity to find a forever home by the end of the day.

Many dogs arrived in tutus and outfits to win in the best-dressed arena. There were also contests for the most enthusiastic tail wag and best kisser. And other pups competed in a doggy peanut butter

eating contest. Obstacle courses and plastic pools were spread around the area so every dog could burn their energy and cool off. Humans had a chance to grab lunch at a food truck and enjoy some downtime at The Watering Bowl, a VIP beer, wine, and cocktail garden.

Dawn Foster, SPCA director for marketing and communications, expressed the significance of the Doggy Dash event, stating, “This is not just a fun event, it’s a community effort. All the money raised today stays right here in the Sacramento community, directly

benefiting over 40,000 animals every year.” The funds raised help to off-set costs for spay/neuter, vaccines, surrender intake and adoptions. There are also educational programs and affordable options for senior pet owners and low-income families. This includes a pet food pantry, a lifeline for owners and their pets during difficult financial times. While the event was focused on dogs, the organization also offers services for cats, such as funding a feral/community cat program that helps to maintain healthy feline colonies in specific areas.

As of this article, the Doggy Dash had earned over \$200,000 in registration fees. The money is still being tallied from the beer garden and food truck proceeds. To learn more about the SPCA, and to get involved, go to their website at www.sspca.org.

Through the Lens of Stefanie's Journey

"Tale of Through the Lens: The Life and Legacy of Horace Brazelton"

"I would like right here to make a special appeal to young men, who are honest workers, who are undecided what field of profession or business to enter, that the photographic field offers excellent opportunities. It is one field that the crust is hardly broken, a scientific and magnetic profession with quick returns on your money, and expansion as big as the man." – Horace Brazelton

The exhibit, "Through the Lens: The Life and Legacy of Horace Brazelton," is the work of historian and curator of the exhibit, Stefanie Haire. Haire is completing her doctoral work at Middle Tennessee State University in public history with an emphasis on historical preservation. She works as a historic preservation planner and is instrumental in restoring and preserving cemeteries in the Chattanooga region. Stefanie's research included writing more than 400 pages of notes and examining countless newspaper archives and tracking down anyone with information for her exhibit. Needless to say, Stefanie has brought to life a person who had

an important impact on the local people of Chattanooga, Tennessee. Who exactly is Horace Brazelton? Brazelton was an entrepreneur, a vice-president in the first Black-owned realty company in Chattanooga and a civic leader who became the first African American to open a photography studio in Chattanooga, Tennessee in 1904. I spoke with Christina Sacco, public relations director for the Chattanooga Public Library, and she said to me, "This exhibit not only showcases an important figure from Chattanooga's past but also lets visitors see Black families and community members as they really were instead of seeing them represented through stereotypes." And stereotypes flourished during the "Jim Crow" segregation era. This was an era of "legal racial segregation" and prompted the belief that Black Americans were incapable of being citizens equal to white people. Around 1890, Jim Crow segregation came to Chattanooga and did not end until the 1960s. Before this segregation, Chattanooga was flourishing as people were coming from all over the country. The railroad provided transportation and

Chattanooga was becoming the city it was before the Civil War as a vibrant community. Horace and his wife, Hettie, did not let segregation stop their work, nor did it stop them from being instrumental leaders in the Black community. They formed social clubs

and supported programs that helped those in need. Along with other Black leaders, they organized protests against discrimination and registered Black voters. In her own right, Hettie Brazelton was not a lady to sit back and watch events unfold. She served

as an elder in her church, judged Emancipation Day cooking contests, and volunteered at a local YWCA club. The Black middle class in Chattanooga in the early 1900s was instrumental in establishing schools, businesses and two hospitals. Horace Brazelton and his photography studio was at the forefront, showcasing Black citizens as successful men and women raising their families and showing the world that Blacks were successful business owners thriving despite laws aimed at undermining that success. Horace Brazelton passed away in 1956 and Hettie died the following year. Their children and grandchildren are now scattered across the U.S. and beyond, and it was only by chance that one of Horace Brazelton's great granddaughters, doing research on her family tree, found several period vintage photographs from the 1930s and 1940s. As she was seeking additional family documents and information about Horace Brazelton in Chattanooga, Tennessee, this led the family to Stefanie's exhibit and culminated in the family pilgrimage to see the exhibit's opening at the

Chattanooga Library. This historical exhibit allowed the family to witness and experience how wide and deep Horace and Hettie's impact has been on Chattanooga. I had the honor of meeting many members of the extended Brazelton family. Grandsons Will and Ronald Harris were clearly emotional. George Harris, Jr., Brazelton's great grandson, said he was "very pleased to see the exhibit and for his family to come together." When I asked Stefanie to name the most rewarding aspect of doing the Brazelton exhibit, she said, "One of the most rewarding aspects of researching the Brazelton family is getting to piece together history in a way that honors those who came before us and to share the incredible story with the public. This is Horace and Hettie Brazelton's story, and I'm humbled to be the vessel to bring it to light." I want to acknowledge all the people who helped me organize this story: historian Stefanie Haire and Will Harris, who is the Brazelton family spokesperson; appreciation goes to the Chattanooga Public Library for displaying the exhibit. ★

The Initial Annual Percentage Rate (APR) is currently 6.75% for a new Home Equity Line of Credit (HELOC), and is fixed for the first 5 years of the loan which is called the draw period. 

Dear Dave,

We're good friends, so I don't want to be cruel. How can I approach him about the situation?

friendships or business dealings, to be unclear is to be unkind. Believe me, I understand you don't want to be mean to a friend. But situations like this should always be addressed directly and quickly, before things get out of hand.

You said you were good friends, and not just roommates, right? My advice is to suggest a night where you both just hang out at the apartment. Offer to pay for dinner to be delivered, and just relax and watch a movie or a game together. Before the night's over, tell him there's something you've been wanting to talk to him about, and begin an understanding—but firm—conversation about the last few months and the situation with the bills. Let him know he's a good friend, and you enjoy his company, but the roommate agreement isn't working out because he's not living up to his agreement to pay half the bills. Give him every chance to give a reasonable explanation for things, but make sure he understands that you two aren't going to be able to be roommates much longer unless he starts paying on time. Being understanding is

key in a situation like this, Mikhail. You don't want to approach him with a bunch of accusations, but at the same time, you need to know what's going on. Maybe he needs help learning to budget money properly. You said both of you have good jobs, so that means his money has to be going somewhere. The problem is it sounds like it's not going to the right places.

When a friend is having a rough time, you should always do what you reasonably can do to help. But in this case, he's got obligations he needs—and agreed—to live up to. Do what you can, but in the end, he should understand it's time for him to get his act together.



Community Health Fair Provides Critical Resources

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - County partner and homeless service provider, First Step Communities held its 2nd Community Health Fair on Friday, April 26. The fair was a huge success with more than 250 attendees, 54 community vendors and hundreds of services provided. The River District and the Willow Clinic were also partners in presenting the Health Fair.

The fair included service providers connecting attendees to animal care, medical care, dental care, haircuts, fresh food, benefit assistance, mental health screenings, showers, vaccinations, substance abuse treatment, domestic violence resources and more.

Several Sacramento County departments participated in the fair, connecting directly with their clients and potential clients, providing much needed education and access to critical County services.

Public Health Division

Sexual Health Promotion Unit: The sexual health promotion unit provides testing for HIV and education and safety supplies to prevent the spread of sexually transmitted diseases like HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis C. Attendees could leave with educational materials and condoms.

Immunization Assistance Program: The Public Health COVID-19 strike team provides vaccinations to both adults and children for COVID-19 and influenza. Children as young as six months old can be vaccinated by the strike team.

Wellness Without Walls Mobile Medicine Van: provides easy, accessible care such as refilling prescriptions, rapid STD testing, minor wound care, basic physical exams, and vital statistic checks such as blood pressure and glucose levels.

Division of Behavioral Health

Homeless Engagement and Response Team (HEART): HEART staff was offering on the spot mental health assessments to create linkages to more in-depth behavioral health resources. HEART has both medical clinicians and peer specialists that have relatable lived experience to share with clients.

Substance Use Prevention and Treatment: The alcohol and drug team handed out free

Narcan to attendees to help prevent the dangers of an opioid overdose. Anyone can use or administer Narcan safely while they wait for first responders to arrive. The team also provided a resource list for Countywide treatment services.

Probation Department

Probation officers provided an easy and accessible access point for probation clients to check-in with their probation officer. The team also provided general education on the probation system and the work they do, and how clients can positively interface with the justice system.

Department of Human Assistance (DHA)

DHA provided information about benefit assistance and eligibility – such as cash assistance, food benefits and general assistance. Residents can check their eligibility for benefits online or by visiting a DHA field office. DHA is also hiring for several entry level positions and gave out job flyers to people looking for work.

Serving the complex needs of the County's unhoused residents requires multi-agency collaboration. The Community Health Fair is a great example of bringing critical resources together in one place that is easy to access for the people that need them the most. This opportunity also allowed service providers to meet each other and further the community collaboration needed to have a lasting impact on homelessness. ★

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

Since 1949, Mental Health America and its affiliates across the country have led the observance of May as Mental Health Awareness Month by reaching millions through the media, local events, and screenings. It raises awareness of trauma and the impact it can have on the physical, emotional, and mental well-being of children, families, and communities. Cities and businesses across the country hold various events to support mental health and open up the lines of communication. Many websites provide ideas for businesses to support their employees during May and beyond.

According to the CDC, suicide rates in our country increased by 36% between 2000-2021. Suicide was responsible for 48,183 deaths in 2021 alone, which is about one death every 11 minutes. We know that many mental health disorders-including depression, bipolar disorder, borderline personality disorder, and PTSD-come with heightened risk of suicidal thoughts or attempts. While seeking help for suicidal thoughts or behaviors is critical regardless of the cause, securing a specific diagnosis may help the individual receive treatment-especially ongoing treatment -that is best suited to their mental

health needs.

Mental Health America says that up to 60% of people who die by suicide have major depression, and research suggests that the majority of suicides are related to a psychiatric condition. If you or someone you know is depressed, there are effective treatments available. Talking to your doctor is a fantastic first step, and you can also visit the National Alliance on Mental Health Illness to learn more about support groups that you might find helpful.

The Jason Foundation is another valuable resource. JFI is dedicated to the prevention of the "Silent Epidemic" of suicide through educational and awareness programs. On its website, you will learn about warning signs and risk factors associated with people who may be struggling with mental health issues and suicidal ideation. JFI's website also has more information about finding a Jason Foundation location near you. We know that four out of five individuals considering suicide give some sign of their intentions, either verbally or behaviorally. In 80% of those considering suicide, we have an opportunity to recognize the warning signs and intervene. Take the time to educate yourselves on the warning signs and risk factors associated with suicide. This knowledge may help you save the life of a friend or loved one. ★


