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May is Motorcycle Safety **Awareness Month**

During Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month in May, the Citrus Heights Police Department would like to remind drivers to always look twice for motorcycles. By practicing safe driving habits and taking shared responsibility on our roads, we can help everyone arrive at their destination

"Motorcycles may be difficult to spot, so be extra careful before changing lanes," Sergeant Kane Kissam said. "A simple double take could mean the difference between a safe journey and a tragic crash. Motorcycle riders do not have the same protections drivers and passengers do. Let's all do our part to keep each other safe out there."

According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration data, there were 6,218 motorcyclists killed in traffic crashes in 2022. Motorcyclists were about 22 times more likely than passenger car occupants to die in a motor vehicle crash and four times more likely to be injured.

To help protect you and your family, keep the following tips in mind while driving or riding:

DRIVERS

Always check mirrors and blind spots before changing lanes.

Do not follow a motorcycle too closely. Always keep a safe distance.

If you see a motorcycle with a signal on, be careful. Be sure that the rider is turning before moving ahead.

MOTORCYCLISTS

Always wear a U.S. DOT-compliant helmet with eye protection.

Wear leather or other sturdy clothing such as a jacket, pants, boots with nonskid soles, and gloves. Add reflective strips or decals to your clothing and motorcycle to make it easier for other drivers to see you.

Ride defensively. Don't assume a driver can see you and avoid riding in a driver's blind spot.

Always keep your lights on, even during the day.

Lastly, both drivers and riders should never drive/ride distracted or under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. Funding for this program

of Marie Duncan, owner of Runs with Scissors, a decidedly fun quilting shop in Citrus Heights that offers modern and contemporary quilting fabrics and quilting supplies.

Open in Citrus Heights since 2006, Runs with Scissors outgrew its former location at Sylvan Corners at 7130 Auburn Blvd., not far from Sylvan Middle School.

Duncan's new store opened in January 2021 in two suites in a commercial building at Pratt Station at 7525 Auburn Blvd., Suite 1, just up the street. Hers is one of three women-owned businesses in the plaza, which is anchored by Single Mom Strong.

A second suite houses



classroom space with plenty of open space where quilters can gather, share tips and work on their own projects. "Sit and Sew" sessions are offered from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesdays and Wednesdays. "The name of the

business came from my car's own vanity license plate," Duncan said.

Once the individual pieces of a quilt are assembled, Runs with Scissors has a long-arm sewing machine that is used in the finish assembly of large-sized quilts. Quilters can also use an AccuCut machine, a helpful alternative to a rotary cutter, which can cut patterns such as 2.5-inch strips, 5-inch squares and tumbler blocks.

Hoover Makes Statement Following Oversight Hearing on Homelessness

Assemblyman Josh Hoover (R-Folsom) released the following statement regarding the May 6 oversight hearing on homelessness in Assembly Budget Subcommittee 7 on Accountability and Oversight:

"Today's oversight hearing shined a light on a very troubling reality. After spending \$24 billion taxpayer dollars on homelessness, our lead agencies in California have no idea where the money has gone or how many people it has helped. This is a complete failure of leadership by Governor Newsom and it's time for the Legislature to demand more accountability.

"When pressed, representatives from the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) and the Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH) admitted they have no data to share on existing homelessness programs and investments. In fact, ICH claimed they would need even more money to implement transparency measures recommended by the State Auditor. This is completely unacceptable."

Assemblyman Hoover has authored AB 2903 to require state-run homelessness programs to annually report cost and outcome data to ICH. It would also require ICH to develop uniform procedures for collecting the data and reporting it to the public. This implements the recommendation of the California State Auditor

following the results of a recent audit requested by Assemblyman Hoover, which found that the state has failed to systemically track homelessness spending and is not adequately positioned to collect data and assess outcomes.

According to the Auditor's report, California has spent nearly \$24 billion taxpayer dollars since 2018 to solve our homelessness crisis. During that same period the state's overall homeless population increased by 32 percent and half of the nation's unsheltered homeless now live in California.

Josh Hoover represents Assembly District 7, which includes the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, and Rancho Cordova and the unincorporated communities of Carmichael, Fair Oaks, Foothill Farms, Gold River, Mather, McClellan Park, North Highlands, Orangevale, and Rosemont.

Guests and the public were also invited to "walk, bike and run" along the trail to C-Bar-C Park which featured food trucks, activity booths and trail exploration opportunities.

A SacRT shuttle was provided at C-Bar-C Park for guests who attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony and left cars at Tempo Park.

The Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail, referred to as ACCT for short, is a 3.45-mile-long multi-use trail starting at Arcade Creek Park Preserve and ending at Wachtel Way. The trail connects several neighborhoods to eight parks, several schools and Sunrise MarketPlace.

The Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail travels through Mitchell Village Park where it features playgrounds and picnic areas before veering off to connect with the back of Tempo Park.

Two large historic valley oak trees, each more than 250 years in age, are along the route in Northwoods Park and in the Sundance Nature Area.

The trail travels through the Sundance Nature Area, some 14 acres of meandering wooded natural terrain, before reaching Streng Park.

The trail continues to Northwoods Park, C-Bar-C Park before reaching the Woodside K-8 School at 8248 Village Oak Drive and Woodside Oaks Park.

Successive Citrus Heights City Council members, Sunrise Recreation and Park District and the Orangevale Recreation and Park District board members, together with San Juan Unified School District, the Sacramento County Area Council of Governments (SACOG), and SMUD representatives, partnered throughout the project's lengthy development and execution.

The completion of the trail project is part of the City of Citrus Heights' effort to "increase walkability, safety and provide improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists throughout a system of Creekside trails, passive open space, and

The City of Citrus Heights first began exploring the feasibility of a multi-use trail in 2014 and then adopted a Bikeway Master Plan in 2015, making the Arcade-Cripple Creek trail a priority project.

The trail was also identified in the Sacramento County Bikeway Master Plan. Funding was acquired in 2017 and the project's design phase began in 2018. Construction officially began on the trail in 2022 at Arcade Creek Park Preserve.

The new Arcade-Cripple Creek trail is part of the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) Regional Trail Network and is anticipated to be a step in a regional plan to ultimately connect to the American River Parkway.

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Through the Lens of Stefanie's Journey

"Tale of Through the Lens: The Life and Legacy of Horace Brazelton"

"I would like right here to make a special appeal to young men, who are honest workers, who are undecided what field of profession or business to enter, that the photographic field offers excellent opportunities. It is one field that the crust is hardly broken, a scientific and magnetic profession with quick returns on your money, and expansion as big as the man." - Horace Brazelton

The exhibit, "Through the Lens: The Life and Legacy of Horace Brazelton," is the work of historian and curator of the exhibit, Stefanie Haire. Haire is completing her doctoral work at Middle Tennessee State University in public hstory with an emphasis on historical preservation. She works as a historic preservation planner and is instrumental in restoring and preserving cemeteries in the Chattanooga region. Stefanie's research included writing more than 400 pages of notes and examining countless newspaper archives and tracking down anyone with information for her exhibit. Needless to say, Stefanie has brought to life a person who had an important impact on the local people of Chattanooga, Tennessee.

Who exactly is Horace Brazelton? Brazelton was an entrepreneur, a vice-president in the first Black-owned realty company in Chattanooga and a civic leader who became the first African American to open a photography studio in Chattanooga, Tennessee in 1904.

I spoke with Christina Sacco, public relations director for the Chattanooga Public Library, and she said to me, "This exhibit not only showcases an important figure from Chattanooga's past but also lets visitors see Black families and community members as they really were instead of seeing them represented through stereotypes." And stereotypes flourished during the "Jim Crow" segregation era. This was an era of "legal racial segregation" and prompted the belief that Black Americans were incapable of being citizens equal to white people. Around 1890, Jim Crow segregation came to Chattanooga and did not end until the 1960s. Before this segregation, Chattanooga was flourishing as people were coming from all over the country. The railroad provided transportation and

Chattanooga was becoming the city it was before the Civil War as a vibrant community.

Horace and his wife, Hettie, did not let segregation stop their work, nor did it stop them from being instrumental leaders in the Black community. They formed social clubs and supported programs that helped those in need. Along with other Black leaders, they organized protests against discrimination and registered Black voters.

In her own right, Hettie Brazelton was not a lady to sit back and watch events unfold. She served as an elder in her church, judged Emancipation Day cooking contests, and volunteered at a local YWCA club. The Black middle class in Chattanooga in the early 1900s was instrumental in establishing schools, businesses and two hospitals.

Horace Brazelton and his photography studio was at the forefront, showcasing Black citizens as successful men and women raising their families and showing the world that Blacks were successful business owners thriving despite laws aimed at undermining that success.

Horace Brazelton passed away in 1956 and Hettie died the following year. Their children and grandchildren are now scattered across the U.S. and beyond, and it was only by chance that one of Horace Brazelton's great granddaughters, doing research on her family tree, found several period vintage photographs from the 1930s and 1940s. As she was seeking additional family documents and information about Horace Brazelton in Chattanooga, Tennessee, this led the family to Stefanie's exhibit and culminated in the family pilgrimage to see the exhibit's opening at the


Chattanooga Library.

This historical exhibit allowed the family to witness and experience how wide and deep Horace and Hettie's impact has been on Chattanooga. I had the honor of meeting many members of the extended Brazelton family. Grandsons Will and Ronald Harris were clearly emotional. George Harris, Jr., Brazelton's great grandson, said he was "very pleased to see the exhibit and for his family to come together."

When I asked Stefanie to name the most rewarding aspect of doing the Brazelton exhibit, she said, "One of the most rewarding aspects of researching the Brazelton family is getting to piece together history in a way that honors those who came before us and to share the incredible story with the public. This is Horace and Hettie Brazelton's story, and I'm humbled to be the vessel to bring it to light."

I want to acknowledge all the people who helped me organize this story: historian Stefanie Haire and Will Harris, who is the Brazelton family spokesperson; appreciation goes to the Chattanooga Public Library for displaying the exhibit

he starts paying on time. Being understanding is

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

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Social Security Matters

Widower's Retirement Stymied by Social Security's "WEP" and "GPO" Rules

Dear Rusty: My wife passed away 4 years ago. I want to retire so called SSA and was told I can collect my own SS at 62, reduced by WEP. My wife's SS was greater than mine, but they said I do not qualify for hers at age 60 because of the GPO. This seems odd that I get zero for her, however I can collect mine at the two thirds reduction at 62. Is this true? This zero dollar amount places my retirement on hold for now. I was counting on her SS. Signed: Discouraged Widower

Dear Discouraged: The Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO) are two of the most confusing (and unpopular) of Social Security's myriad rules. From the way you describe your conversation with the Social Security Administration, it doesn't appear to have concluded with you fully understanding how these provisions work, so allow me to elaborate.

WEP and GPO affect anyone who has a retirement pension from a federal, state, or local government agency which did not participate in Social Security, meaning neither the employee nor the employer paid into Social Security based on the employee's earnings. Obviously, you have such a pension, which means that WEP will reduce any Social Security retirement benefit you have earned from other employment where SS payroll taxes were withheld, and the GPO will affect any survivor benefit you are entitled to.

WEP affects only the SS retirement benefit you earned elsewhere; WEP does not affect any surviving spouse benefit you might be entitled to from your wife. Rather, it is the GPO which affects your survivor benefit, again because of your state retirement (called a "non-covered pension" - one earned without contributing to Social Security). The GPO will reduce any surviving spouse benefit you might be entitled to by 2/3rds of the amount of your "non-covered" state pension. Depending on the size of your state pension, that reduction may entirely eliminate your surviving spouse benefit from your wife. Under normal SS rules,

a surviving spouse does not

become eligible for survivor benefits until they reach age 60 (age 50 if disabled). Normally, a surviving spouse benefit claimed at age 60 is reduced by 28.5% and it is the GPO (not WEP) that will affect your survivor benefit whenever you claim it. However, even without GPO, your age 60 survivor benefit amount would be only 71.5% of the amount your wife was receiving (or entitled to receive) at her death. If you are already collecting your non-covered state pension when you claim your SS survivor benefit from your wife, then that reduced age 60 survivor bene-

fit would be offset by 2/3rds of

the amount of your state pension. And that (according to what Social Security told you) is what eliminated your age 60 eligibility for a surviving spouse benefit from your wife. If you don't claim it at 60 your survivor benefit will continue to grow until you reach your full retirement age (FRA) of 67, but if 2/3rds of your state pension is more than 100% of your SS survivor benefit, you still won't get any surviving spouse benefit from your wife's record.

A further consequence of your non-covered state pension is that the SS retirement benefit you earned elsewhere will be reduced by WEP. WEP will reduce, but cannot eliminate, your Social Security retirement benefit. The WEP formula is complex but, generally, your WEP-based Social Security retirement benefit will likely be roughly half of what you would get if you did not have a state "non-covered pension." You could claim your WEPreduced SS retirement benefit as early as age 62 or, if financially feasible, delay longer to get a somewhat higher (but still reduced) amount.

Just FYI, your state employer had an obligation to fully inform you of the consequences of not contributing to Social Security while earning your state pension. It appears as though they may not have fulfilled that obligation. .

California Agency Says It Will Take Millions to Find Out

Who is the flesh-and-blood landlord with a city-spanning portfolio of apartments concealed behind an obscurely-named limited liability company? Who is the proprietor of a local restaurant, hotel or regional car wash chain shrouded beneath a corporate veil?

Who actually owns what in California?

For three years a coalition of anti-eviction advocates, unions, legal aid organizations, affordable housing boosters, workers rights groups and pro-transparency activists have been demanding that the state make it easier to answer those questions.

And for three years, those efforts have failed in the Legislature.

Supporters of this year's version, Senate Bill 1201 authored by Sen. María Elena Durazo, a Los Angeles Democrat, now worry that their fourth effort will soon meet a similar fate.

Businesses operating in California must regularly submit documents with the Secretary of State that list the company's name and address, along with those of its top managers and anyone responsible for receiving legal filings on the company's behalf. That information is publicly available on the Secretary of State's website.

Durazo's bill would add an additional disclosure requirement: The names and home or business addresses of "beneficial owners" — defined as anyone who "exercises substantial control" or owns at least 25% of a company.

As Durazo explained at a recent Senate committee hearing, the bill is "simply adding one line on the forms that anybody fills out...It's not asking for any more."

Yet last week the Senate Appropriations Committee, tasked with putting a fiscal price tag on pending legislation, said implementing the bill would cost the state \$9.3 million in its first year and nearly \$3 million every year after that. The majority of those ongoing expenses would go toward paying the estimated 24 state employees that Secretary of State analysts say are needed to make the bill work. That would represent roughly 10% of the agency's workforce that now processes business filings.

Though \$9 million is couch cushion change by California budgetary standards, the bill's supporters say they are mystified by the number. For a 2020 bill requiring the Secretary of State to add a different question to the same form, the fiscal estimate was a mere \$561,000 in the first year and \$79,000 thereafter.

"This is an example of a good governance bill that will fail because of bad governance," said Jyotswaroop Bawa with the progressive nonprofit Rise Economy, which is sponsoring the bill. "By not collecting beneficial owner information, the

Secretary of State's office is allowing chaos to continue with impunity."

Bawa and other supporters of the bill say publishing ownership information will make it easier for tenants, workers and regulators to track down scofflaw landlords and other

business owners. Opponents of the bill, which include state and local landlord groups, California Association of Realtors and the California Chamber of Commerce, argue that it is already easy enough to contact a business and that disclosing the identities of individual owners would violate their privacy and enable harassment.

The Secretary of State's office refused to break down sky-

high estimate Once a bill receives a big cost estimate, it's put in a list known in California legislativese as the "suspense file." Then, in marathon sessions held twice a year, the Assembly and Senate appropriations committees rapidly tick through every bill on that list, passing some along and killing others without debate or a public vote. The first legislative culling of the year is set for mid-May.

With its seven-digit cost estimate, Bawa said she worries SB 1201 will be the latest victim of "death by price tag," especially when the state is facing a multibillion dollar deficit. And it wouldn't be the first time this idea has died a quiet procedural

In 2021, a bill that would have required companies to unveil their human owners when filing business records with the state didn't get a hearing. A revived

attempt the next year failed in

the Senate after a majority on a key committee declined to cast a vote "yes" or "no," but simply abstained. Last year, a third try succumbed to the suspense file after the bill was dinged with a \$9 million cost estimate from the Secretary of State's office.

In coming up with this year's figure, the Senate committee's fiscal analysis said it got the estimates from the Secretary of State. Itemized totals include \$3 million in "IT project costs" and

more than \$2 million in "mailing

The Secretary of State's office refused to answer specific questions from CalMatters about the bill's cost estimate, but instead responded by email with an unsigned statement.

"The Office of the Secretary of State continues to be involved in deliberations and ongoing discussions with legislative staff related to SB 1201. In furtherance of this process, we must respectfully decline to publicly comment on the substantive or fiscal issues associated with the bill at this early point in the legislative process," the statement said.

While the office "did not provide context" for its fiscal breakdown, the committee analysis says, the Secretary of State

expressed more detailed con-

cerns over last year's version

of the bill. Back then the office

warned that investigating and

verifying the ownership information through a modified form

would be costly. The bill, as currently written, does not require the Secretary of State to perform that due diligence, which led an earlier Senate committee to raise concerns about the bill's effectiveness.

'We could do it for \$200'

Corporations and limited liability companies exist in part to ensure that investors in a com-

pany aren't held directly legally responsible for the things that that company does or doesn't do. If a company maintains unsafe conditions at a rental property, a tenant can sue the company itself, seeking damages from the corporate treasury, but not from the business owner's personal checking

account. Publicizing an owner's name and address, then, doesn't serve an obvious legal purpose, said Debra Carlton, a spokesperson for the California Apartment

Association. Landlords can always be reached through the property management companies they employ. Lawsuits can always be served to a company's listed

representative.

he said.

"The point of the corporate veil is that you go after the corporation's assets" in a lawsuit, said Carlton, but it doesn't prevent landlords from getting sued. "You see lawsuits every day being brought against the

Matthew Silver, a lawyer who represents cities and counties in substandard housing cases, agreed that Durazo's bill isn't likely to make his work easier going after negligent landlords. It's often quicker to serve court papers to a corporation or LLC than "an individual slumlord" who doesn't have a paper trail or web presence, he said.

But there are times when it's

crucial to to track down a human business owner quickly, long before matters end up at court, said Larry Brooks, who runs the residential lead prevention pro-

gram for Alameda County. He remembers a case in 2022 when twin toddlers were found living in an old apartment with flaking paint. Lead levels in their blood were so high the children were immediately hospitalized. The twins' parents, undocumented immigrants, initially refused to put Brooks and his team in touch with the building's property management company, fearing

eviction or deportation, he said. So Brooks began hunting on his own. He turned first to the county assessor's office to find the prop erty owner's name, then plugged that name into the Secretary of State's database. The corporate documents there only listed a street address. Brooks struggled to connect that address with

Finally, a county nurse persuaded the twins' mother to share the phone number of a Sacramento-based property management company. That company put Brooks in touch with the owner, a corporation in Texas, he said. The entire process took

two weeks.

a phone number or email address.

"I wish that there were some state or federal law that required every corporate landlord to have a local contact," said Brooks, who has also advised Human Impact Partners, a public health nonprofit that supports Durazo's bill. "In a situation like with the twins, where the blood lead levels were so high they were life threatening and the kids had to be rushed to the hospital, you want to be able to call somebody immediately."


Brooks said he couldn't share additional information about the children or the landlord citing medical privacy laws and pending litigation. CalMatters was unable to independently verify the details of the story.

Making it easier to find the name and address of a business owner would provide a treasure trove of data for tenant rights organizations, housing researchers and investigative reporters.

But it would also be a boon for would-be harassers and activists, said Carlton. "I can't figure out what their true purpose is," she said of the bill's sponsors. "They want to shame people publicly,

But Carlton was also puzzled by the \$9 million cost estimate: "I almost felt like saying, 'We could do it," she said. "We could do it for \$200."

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
