RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - The 29th annual Farm and Tractor Days took about four-and-a-half months to prepare but Rio Linda/Elverta Historical Society members are happy planning the event, which will be on May 17 and May 18.

"The event is very educational and you'll see all the old antique tractors and the hit-and-miss engines," said Joyce Buckland, Rio Linda/Elverta

Historical Society treasurer and event coordinator. "It is our only fundraiser for the year and we rely on it to raise funds to preserve local history."

The free family-friendly event will be on May 17 and May 18 at the Dry Creek Ranch, 6852 Dry Creek Road in Rio Linda.

Dry Creek Ranch is both historical and a working ranch, according to Buckland. The ranch, which is leased from Sacramento Regional Parks, is home to the Rio Linda/Elverta

Historical Society and its museum.

"Come and learn more about agriculture and how farming was done and is still being done today," Buckland said. "We're in the process of harvesting the hay crop and just cutting the hay now."

Farm and Tractor Days is presented in conjunction with Early Day Gas Engine and Tractor Association, Branch 13.

Sacramento Autorama Announces Award Winners

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The O'Reilly Auto Parts Sacramento Autorama, one of the world's longest-running indoor car shows, closed out its 73rd annual event on Sunday, May 5, at Cal Expo by recognizing some of the country's finest custom cars with trophies and prizes. Overall, the show hosted over 500 world-class custom vehicles and handed out more than 400 individual awards during its closing ceremony.

The show's prestigious Custom d'Elegance award was presented to Cliff Mattis for his 1957 Chevrolet Convertible. Built by Lucky 7 Customs, this spectacular custom has been channeled by 2" and the frame was moved up to allow the car to sit as low as possible. Each piece of handcrafted copper trim has been fit, filed and chromed. The Roadster Shop chassis houses a vintage-look LS motor and the elegant leather interior was completed by Gabe Lopez. Mattis received \$5,000 in prize money courtesy of ARP Fasteners.

New for 2024, the show crowned the World's Most Beautiful Lowrider. The inaugural award went to Carlos Martinez's jaw-dropping 1964 Chevrolet Impala convertible. The lilac-painted "Indigenous Angel" features fabrication and assembly by American Muscle Cars, wheels and intricate engraving by Chavez Engraving, hydraulics by "Big Rob" Barajas and spectacular murals by Tim Lowery. Martinez bested five other lowriders for the first-ever award.

For the second consecutive year, the West Coast Challenge Car Show Series presented by ARP Fasteners crowned its Grand Champion during the Sacramento Autorama. Brent Schieder was presented with the Best of the West award for his 1937 Ford Cabriolet, beating out eight other vehicles that competed in at least three of four select car shows in California, Oregon and Washington. Schieder received a \$12,500 prize, while second- and third-place finishers Scott Cooper (1970 Chevy El Camino) and Gary Holyoak (1932 Ford Roadster pickup) received \$6,500 and \$3,500, respectively.

Global Transportation and Freight Company to Pay \$7.9 Million for Environmental Violations

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - District Attorney Thien Ho announced the resolution of a civil suit against XPO, Inc. and XPO Logistics, a global transportation and logistics company that provides supply chain solutions to businesses in various industries. XPO leased, owned or operated facilities in Sacramento and other counties in California where violations were found.

This case began with a referral to the San Bernardino District Attorney from San Bernardino County Fire, Hazardous Materials Section regarding underground fuel tank violations. The settlement was entered in conjunction with 20 District Attorney's offices and one City Attorney office from around the state. The settlement requirements include that XPO maintain a California environmental compliance manager to ensure that California XPO locations comply with state law relating to underground storage tanks, hazardous waste, hazardous materials and

above ground storage tanks.

XPO's corporate office and environmental compliance group were extremely cooperative with the District Attorneys throughout the investigation and settlement process. This Stipulated Final Judgment shall be in place for a minimum of five years.

As part of the settlement, XPO is ordered to pay civil penalties for their underground storage tank, above ground storage tank, hazardous waste and hazardous materials violations. Pursuant to the judgment, the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office will receive a total of \$745,000 in cost recovery and civil penalties. The Sacramento County Environmental Management Department will receive \$394,000 in penalties.

"Hazardous material, storage and waste are a routine component of many business operations," said District Attorney Thien Ho. "By joining other District Attorney offices in the state, we can ensure large businesses take the necessary precautions to protect the environment and the safety of our communities." ★

Defendant Convicted of Murdering Wife

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On April 26, Asghar Ehsan was convicted by a jury of first-degree murder. The jury also found true the allegation that Ehsan personally used a knife in the commission of the murder.

On January 14, 2020, Asghar Ehsan stabbed and strangled his wife, Assmaa Ehsan Ashooqullah, to death while she was sleeping next to their 7-month-old son. Ehsan then left the home with his son and met with a friend. Ehsan told his friend he killed his wife because Allah instructed him to do so. His friend tried to convince Ehsan to turn himself in, but Ehsan refused. He left his son with his friend and was later located by law enforcement in Placer County.

After a standoff with the Roseville Police Department, their SWAT team and the Sacramento Police Department, he engaged in a high-speed pursuit. Ehsan was

eventually taken into custody.

During the investigation, it was discovered Ehsan had attempted to kill his roommate in Santa Rosa in 2000. In that case, Ehsan reported he had been commanded by Allah to start a holy war and needed to kill someone close to him. Ehsan was found legally insane by the Sonoma Superior Court. In 2002, he was released from the state hospital with a diagnosis of bipolar disorder. Ehsan went on to get an associate degree in psychology and worked for Sonoma County as a mental health worker for over a decade. He was also a member of the Sonoma County Mental Health Panel and presented at critical incident training for law enforcement on how to handle mentally ill suspects.

In this case, Ehsan entered a plea of not guilty by reason of insanity. On May 2, the jury found Ehsan was legally sane when he committed the murder.

Ehsan faces a maximum sentence of 27 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 12 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 41. ★

Inmate Death at Main Jail

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Sunday, May 5, at approximately 10:30 p.m., a 45-year-old male inmate died while in custody at the Sacramento County Main Jail. The man had been in custody since May 2, 2024, when he was brought into custody by Sheriff's Patrol Deputies for a felony burglary warrant.

Main Jail Deputies were

conducting a cell check in the 6-East 100 Pod, which housed inmates detoxing from drugs and other substances. Deputies looked inside a cell and noticed an unresponsive inmate who was housed by himself. Deputies immediately entered the cell and administered first-aid as Main Jail medical staff and the Sacramento Fire Department responded. Fire personnel arrived and continued life-saving efforts, but the inmate

was ultimately pronounced deceased at the jail.

The Sheriff's Department will complete a thorough inmate death investigation in accordance with department procedures and state laws. The Sacramento County Coroner's Office will determine the cause of death and forward its findings as prescribed by law. The Coroner's Office will release the name of the deceased after notification has been made to his next of kin. ★

Celebrity Kustoms returned in 2024, honoring the best custom-styled car or truck manufactured from 1936 to today. Mike McAuliffe's winning 1953 Ford Victoria showcased the crucial elements of this award, including overall design, flow, quality and workmanship of bodywork, paint and interior. McAuliffe will receive a bespoke Jostens ring engraved with his name and car.

"We brought together all the best parts of the Sacramento Autorama with a few new elements for 2024, and we are delighted with how Northern California's incredible car community responded," said John Buck, owner of Rod Shows and producer of the Sacramento Autorama. "This year, we celebrated hundreds of custom hot rods and muscle cars alongside lowriders, trucks, bicycles and

more, and it wouldn't be possible without the car owners and builders who bring their incredible entries to the show."

Other significant awards included the four historic "Big B Awards." Dave Zocchi won the H.A. Bagdasarian World's Most Beautiful Custom Award for his immaculate 1936 Ford.

The Sam Barris Memorial Award, named in honor of legendary custom car builder Sam Barris, is selected by members of the Barris family. They chose "Lucille," a beautiful 1951 Mercury built by Cambra Speed Shop for Gary Stell Jr., as the car featuring the best metalwork, alignment of body panels and paint.

The Joe "Candy Apple Red" Bailon Memorial Award was designed and created by Bailon, one of the nation's premier custom car designers and builders. This year, the award was

presented to John D'Agostino's 1941 Cadillac designed by Oz Welch.

The last of the "Big B Awards," the Dick Bertolucci Automotive Excellence Award, was given to a vehicle manufactured before 1973 that the family of the late hot rod and custom builder Dick Bertolucci felt exhibited the best craftsmanship in assembly, fit, finish and detail. This year, the Bertolucci family selected Schieder's Dominator Street Rods-built 1937 Ford Cabriolet for the trophy.

Sunday's popular Pinstriper Charity Auction raised \$10,000 for UC Davis Children's Hospital, which is dedicated to improving lives and transforming health care.

Testing Mandate for Dairy Cows Aims to Curtail Bird Flu Spread

To limit the spread of highly pathogenic H5N1 avian influenza in livestock, all lactating dairy cows must test negative for the virus before they can cross state lines under new requirements by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The federal order, which took effect Monday, excludes heifers, dry cows and bull calves. Culled cows going to slaughter that do not show signs of illness also are not required to be tested. But they will still need a certificate of veterinary inspection or approval by animal health officials from the state sending the cattle and the state receiving them.

Local Agencies Race to Fix Groundwater Sustainability Plans

Seeking to prevent the California State Water Resources Control Board from stepping in to regulate groundwater in critically overdrafted subbasins, local agencies are working to correct deficiencies in their plans to protect groundwater. Last month, the Tulare Lake Subbasin became the first subbasin in the state to be placed under probation. Other critically overdrafted subbasins with inadequate plans include the Tule, Kaweah, Kern County, Delta-Mendota and Chowchilla subbasins. The state water board is set to consider probation for the Tule Subbasin on Sept. 17.

Federal, State Agencies Pledge a Modest Increase in Water Deliveries

State and federal water agencies last week announced additional allocations for farmers and other users, citing improving reservoir levels amid spring snowmelt. The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation said it is increasing promised water deliveries from the Central Valley Project for agricultural contractors south of the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta to 40% of requested supplies, up from 35% pledged last month. The California Department of Water Resources said it will increase water deliveries to 40% of requested supplies from the State Water Project, up from a pledge of 30%.

Seed Companies Report Steady Demand after Pandemic Boom in Home Gardening

With plant nurseries germinating seeds for springtime garden transplants, producers and seed companies report steady supply and demand after recovering from a pandemic-time gardening boom that depleted seed inventory for some varieties. Steve Wiley, general manager and chief operating officer at American Takii seed company in Monterey County, said the popularity of gardening during the pandemic helped the company compensate for a dip in sales to commercial growers. As commercial business returns, he said, "the home garden market does remain quite strong." ★

and Associate of Arts degree in 2022-2023; three more students are slated to achieve the same in 2024, \$79 million investment in 74 major projects during the 2022-2023 school year, including Sports Complexes at Grant Union and Highlands High schools, \$30 million investment in 24 projects during the 2023-2024 school year, including Universal Transitional Kindergarten (UTK) facilities at Castori and Woodridge, and a \$287 million investment in 128 projects in progress or the planning stages.

"The Legacy Award is an incredible honor, and I am truly humbled," said Martinez. "None of us accomplishes this work alone, and the Legacy Award reflects the dedication and effort of the Board of Trustees and all staff in Twin Rivers Unified. It's our collective work and the positive impact on the entire Twin

Rivers school community that matters most."

With an operating budget of \$528,249,814 for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, Twin Rivers Unified serves 24,470 transitional kindergarten to 12th-grade students. Nearly 88% are socioeconomically disadvantaged and 30% are English language learners. Nurturing the potential of every student is a collective effort.

"Dr. Martinez has made Twin Rivers a district where people can identify progress," said Derrell Roberts, CEO of the Roberts Family Development Center. "New construction, planned upgrades, a significant increase in high school graduation rates, outward student successes in and out of class, and some of the highest teacher salaries in our region. We are looking forward to working with him on ways to involve our broader community in making sure that this progress continues." ★

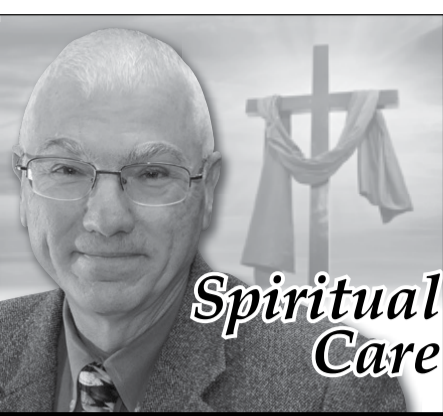

"Why not?" you ask.

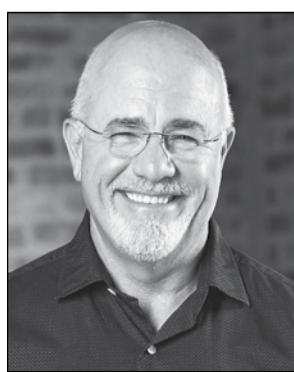
Well, it's not because he was intrinsically happy with who he was. He knew he was not completely accessorized, so he was willing to undertake a fearless inventory of his soul closet.

friendships or business dealings, to be unkind. Believe me, I understand you don't want to be mean to a friend. But situations like this should always be addressed directly and quickly, before things get out of hand.

You said you were good friends, and not just roommates, right? My advice is to suggest a night where you both just hang out at the apartment. Offer to pay for dinner to be delivered, and just relax and watch a movie or a game together. Before the night's over, tell him there's something you've been wanting to talk to him about, and begin an understanding—but firm—conversation about the last few months and the situation with the bills. Let him know he's a good friend, and you enjoy his company, but the roommate agreement isn't working out because he's not living up to his agreement to pay half the bills. Give him every chance to give a reasonable explanation for things, but make sure he understands that you two aren't going to be able to be roommates much longer unless he starts paying on time. Being understanding is

key in a situation like this, Mikhail. You don't want to approach him with a bunch of accusations, but at the same time, you need to know what's going on. Maybe he needs help learning to budget money properly. You said both of you have good jobs, so that means his money has to be going somewhere. The problem is it sounds like it's not going to the right places.

When a friend is having a rough time, you should always do what you reasonably can do to help. But in this case, he's got obligations he needs—and agreed—to live up to. Do what you can, but in the end, he should understand it's time for him to get his act together.

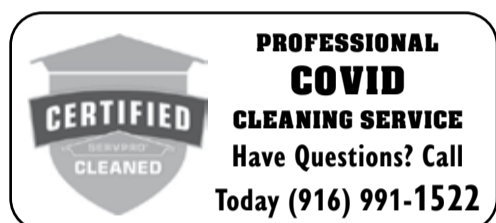

Social Security Matters

Widower's Retirement Stymied by Social Security's "WEP" and "GPO" Rules

Dear Rusty: My wife passed away 4 years ago. I want to retire so called SSA and was told I can collect my own SS at 62, reduced by WEP. My wife's SS was greater than mine, but they said I do not qualify for hers at age 60 because of the GPO. This seems odd that I get zero for her, however I can collect mine at the two thirds reduction at 62. Is this true? This zero dollar amount places my retirement on hold for now. I was counting on her SS. **Signed: Discouraged Widower**

Dear Discouraged: The Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO) are two of the most confusing (and unpopular) of Social Security's myriad rules. From the way you describe your conversation with the Social Security Administration, it doesn't appear to have concluded with you fully understanding how these provisions work, so allow me to elaborate.

WEP and GPO affect anyone who has a retirement pension from a federal, state, or local government agency which did not participate in Social Security, meaning neither the employee nor the employer paid into Social Security based on

the employee's earnings. Obviously, you have such a pension, which means that WEP will reduce any Social Security retirement benefit you have earned from other employment where SS payroll taxes were withheld, and the GPO will affect any survivor benefit you are entitled to.

WEP affects only the SS retirement benefit you earned elsewhere; WEP does not affect any surviving spouse benefit you might be entitled to from your wife. Rather, it is the GPO which affects your survivor benefit, again because of your state retirement (called a "non-covered pension" - one earned without contributing to Social Security). The GPO will reduce any surviving spouse benefit you might be entitled to by 2/3rds of the amount of your "non-covered" state pension. Depending on the size of your state pension, that reduction may entirely eliminate your surviving spouse benefit from your wife.

Under normal SS rules, a surviving spouse does not become eligible for survivor benefits until they reach age 60 (age 50 if disabled). Normally, a surviving spouse benefit claimed at age 60 is reduced by 28.5% and it is the GPO (not WEP) that will affect your survivor benefit whenever you claim it. However, even without GPO, your age 60 survivor benefit amount would be only 71.5% of the amount your wife was receiving (or entitled to receive) at her death. If you are already collecting your non-covered state pension when you claim your SS survivor benefit from your wife, then that reduced age 60 survivor benefit would be offset by 2/3rds of

the amount of your state pension. And that (according to what Social Security told you) is what eliminated your age 60 eligibility for a surviving spouse benefit from your wife. If you don't claim it at 60 your survivor benefit will continue to grow until you reach your full retirement age (FRA) of 67, but if 2/3rds of your state pension is more than 100% of your SS survivor benefit, you still won't get any surviving spouse benefit from your wife's record.

A further consequence of your non-covered state pension is that the SS retirement benefit you earned elsewhere will be reduced by WEP. WEP will reduce, but cannot eliminate, your Social Security retirement benefit. The WEP formula is complex but, generally, your WEP-based Social Security retirement benefit will likely be roughly half of what you would get if you did not have a state "non-covered pension." You could claim your WEP-reduced SS retirement benefit as early as age 62 or, if financially feasible, delay longer to get a somewhat higher (but still reduced) amount.

Just FYI, your state employer had an obligation to fully inform you of the consequences of not contributing to Social Security while earning your state pension. It appears as though they may not have fulfilled that obligation.

California is Starting to Grow Again - Is that a Good Thing?

After Jerry Brown became governor of California for the first time nearly a half-century ago, he declared that the state had entered "an era of limits."

Citing "sluggish economic growth, increasing social instability, widespread unemployment and unprecedented environmental challenges," Brown told state legislators in his 1976 state of the state speech, "In place of a manifest economic destiny, we face a sober reassessment of new economic realities, and we all have to get used to it."

At the time, his rather gloomy observation seemed to be in line with current events. California had seen startling population growth and economic expansion in the decades after World War II, becoming the most populous state in 1962 during the governorship of Brown's father, Pat Brown.

However, population growth slowed in the 1970s after the postwar baby boom had waned. By then the state's economy was undergoing a dramatic, dislocating transformation from industrialism to post-industrial domination by trade, services and technology.

As it turned out, however, the conditions Brown cited, which he translated into fiscal austerity for state government, were merely a pause, not a permanent new reality.

California boomed in the 1980s, with Ronald Reagan's administration pumping many billions of dollars into the state's aerospace sector for a military buildup and a population surge driven by waves of migration, mostly from Latin America and Asia, and a new baby boom.

Between 1980 and 1990, California's population increased by more than 6 million people to nearly 30 million. The 26% gain meant California gained a whopping seven new congressional seats after the 1990 census.

However, things began to slow down shortly thereafter. In the 1990s, the end of the Cold War with the Soviet Union manifested itself in sharp cutbacks in military spending, leading to a recession and an exodus of aerospace workers and their families.

Population grew slowly over the next two decades and declined during the COVID-19 pandemic as stay-at-home workers fled to states with less expensive housing, foreign immigration slowed, the death rate rose and the birth rate declined.

However, a new report from the state Department of Finance's demographics unit says that after four years of population loss, California gained a tiny bit in 2023, "driven by decreased mortality and a rebound in legal foreign immigration."

The gain was 67,000 residents, bringing California's population to 39,128,162, the department's demographers found as they calculated the various factors that influence population changes. What they call "natural growth" - births minus deaths - increased from 106,700 in 2022 to 118,400 in 2023,

largely because the death rate dropped after spiking upward during the pandemic.

California's 1980s baby boom is just a faint memory, however. At one point Californians were producing more than 600,000 babies each year, the equivalent of more than one birth every minute, but the state's birth rate has dropped to a record low and it now has one of the nation's lowest fertility rates, according to a new study released this week.

The Birth Industry Lawyers Group, which specializes in maternity legal issues, used federal data to report that California's fertility rate over the past several years, 55 per 1,000 women, is below the national rate of 58.8 and ninth lowest among the states. South Dakota is the most fecund state with a 71.2 fertility rate, followed closely by North Dakota.

The new Department of Finance report projects that with the effects of pandemic worn off, California's population will continue to grow, albeit slowly.

The new data raise an old question: Is California better off with an increasing population or do the demands of more people just make things more complicated by increasing competition for jobs, housing and other necessities of life?

Sacramento State Experiences Significant Surge in Applications for Fall 2024 Semester

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Applications for the Fall 2024 semester at Sacramento State far surpass applications for the previous year, suggesting a potentially significant boost in attendance.

New data reveals that the University has received 3,470 more applications compared to the previous year, encompassing both undergraduate and graduate students. Additionally, the number of transfer students from community colleges has seen a notable increase from 2023 levels.

Applying is a key step, and more follow.

“Students who have been offered admission should complete their intent to enroll and register for new student orientation as soon as possible to reserve their place in the fall class,” said Brian Henley, director of Admissions and Outreach. “Taking care of pre-enrollment requirements early will ensure that the transition to Sac State is as smooth as possible.”

The application increase is believed to be a response to Sac State’s direct outreach, new marketing strategies, and growing awareness about new and

enhanced programs to attract qualified students.

New programs such as Combat U and the Black Honors College, national recognition for supporting traditionally underserved populations, on-campus housing opportunities,

and ongoing excellence in academics, the arts and athletics have added to Sac State’s reputation.

Part of the University’s outreach includes marketing that targets members of so-called Generation Z – people born between

1997 and 2012 and perceived as being intimately familiar with the use of digital technology, internet and social media. Sac State’s campaign, “The Way of the Hornet,” is meant to increase University visibility in

the region through use of social media, the Sac State website, posters, billboards and advertising on public transportation, and a significant presence at Sacramento International Airport. That campaign will expand in the fall. ★
