RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - Bradley Nall, Rio Linda High School's valedictorian for the Class of 2024, has a grade point average of 4.79, the highest in the history of Twin Rivers Unified School District.

Nall has achieved that GPA accomplishment while working on an Associate of Arts degree from American River College in social science.

Nall's love of learning led him to earn the American River College degree while still in high school.

"I enrolled there surprisingly at first," he said, "as I did not want to take college courses but saw the value in it, so I signed up for my school's AA pathway before my freshman year. However, I ended up liking the ability to take advanced classes without the thought of having to cram studying for the AP (Advanced Placement) test at the end of the year."


In 2023, Nall's academic achievements were acknowledged by the College Board, as he received the National Hispanic Recognition Award. Nall graciously credits the Rio Linda High faculty for contributing to his success.

"Teachers here have been some of my favorite throughout my school experience," Nall said. "There's always great interaction between staff and students on campus."

Nall also credits his family for their support and encouragement.

"My parents and family always placed a huge emphasis on the importance of education I adopted myself," he said.

While being an overachiever in the classroom, Nall has also generously donated his time as a math tutor for his classmates.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As Memorial Day draws near, communities prepare to honor and commemorate the sacrifices of fallen heroes. Several events will be held throughout the Sacramento area, providing community members with ample opportunities to participate in the celebrations.

Memorial Day, observed on the last Monday in May, honors service members who have died in military service to the nation, according to the Department of Defense. The holiday has roots dating back to the post-Civil War era, when citizens would informally place spring flower memorials on the graves of fallen soldiers.

are invited to join in the upcoming observances at any of the following locations.

Girls' State Leadership Conference, which inspired him to become politically aware.

"I didn't have much of an interest in politics before this experience," Nall said. "But now I'm thinking about running for office myself in the future. I would like to start at the local level and work my way up."

Nall's practice in speech-making while still a student could come in handy later as an aspiring politician. He won first place in the local competition and third place in the regional competition of the American Legion's Oratorical Contest, presenting a speech on how U.S. Constitution changes have been effectively used, specifically in reference to civil rights.

Rio Linda High School head counselor Karlene Bittler gives high praise to Nall.

"Bradley is one of the brightest students we have had at Rio Linda High School in many years," Bittler said. "Bradley is hardworking, ambitious and confident. On a personal level, he has a good sense

of humor, is easy-going and while he takes school seriously, it's a labor of love for him. He dives in because he gets interested and engaged in the learning process."

Nall, while he celebrates his many achievements and anticipates summer vacation, weighs his higher-education options.

"I'm most likely going to be pursuing a chemical engineering degree," he said, "although I am considering materials engineering as well," Nall said. "However, I still do plan on double majoring in anthropology with whatever engineering discipline I choose. And lastly, I am still undecided on which college I will be attending since I'm still dealing with all the financial issues surrounding college."

While planning his future, Nall avoids putting pressure on himself, maintaining that he measures success by how well he simply leads a happy life.

The 62nd Rio Linda High commencement services will be at 7 p.m. May 30 at Cal Expo's Heart Health Park. ★

is "Their Sacrifice, Our Gratitude," encapsulating the essence of remembrance and appreciation for those who have given their lives in service to their country. At the heart of the ceremony lies a musical tribute, featuring patriotic music performed by the Rancho Cordova River City Concert Band.

This year holds a special significance as community members together honor the 21st-century heroes who witnessed the tragic events of 9/11 and selflessly rushed to aid those in need, many of whom did not return.

An event highlight will be the presentation by the Non Commissioned Officers Association, showcasing the "Missing Man Table." This symbolic gesture, led by retired Air Force veteran Jim Sullivan, features a dinner table set with an empty chair, representing those who are missing or fallen.

"This is a dignified and beautiful service," said Cordova Community Council executive director Shelly Blanchard. "All gave some and some gave all, and we are honoring that here in Rancho Cordova."

On that same date, May 27, community members will also gather at the East Lawn ceremony at 10 a.m., where attendees can gather to honor the fallen heroes of the United States Armed Forces.

The event is being hosted at multiple locations including East Lawn Sierra Hills at 5757 Greenback Lane, Sacramento; 4300 Folsom Blvd., East Sacramento; and 9189 East Stockton Blvd., Elk Grove.

ceremony promises to be a moving tribute where distinguished military speakers such as Bob Hilton and Gilbert Morales will take the stage, along with musician and bagpiper Liz Tubbs. Part of the program will also include the Armed Forces Medley and the POW/MIA (Prisoner of War/Missing in Action) ceremony. Complimentary refreshments will be provided.

Other events include the Memorial Day tribute at Mount Vernon Memorial Park at 11 a.m. May 27 at 8201 Greenback Lane.

Starting at 5:30 a.m. May 27, Boy and Girl Scout troops will raise donated American flags around the park, followed by the fire department hoisting a 50-foot flag at the entrance at 10 a.m.

"On Memorial Day, it is important to stop and reflect on the American patriots who have paid the ultimate sacrifice to keep us free," said Mount Vernon Memorial Park's general manager Carol Rybolt. "I am grateful for

the brave men and women who serve in the military, standing guard to protect our country and our rights. Let us honor and remember them on this Memorial Day and every day."

The event will feature a military band, a keynote speech by a Colonel from the California National Guard, and a Color Guard from the UC Davis ROTC program. A possible fly-over, a popular attraction in previous years, is pending confirmation, adding to the day's magic.

The tribute concludes at noon, with the symbolic raising of the American Flag honoring the sacrifices and expressing gratitude to those who have given their lives.

The 25th annual Memorial Day Ceremony at the Fair Oaks Cemetery District will take place from 10 a.m. to noon on May 25 giving special recognition to the women in time of war between the American Revolutionary War and World War II. The cemetery is at 7780 Olive St., Fair Oaks. ★

Controller Cohen Issues April Cash Report

Fiscal year-to-date revenues still trend below expectations

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On May 10, State Controller Malia M. Cohen released her monthly cash report covering the state's General Fund revenues, disbursements and actual cash balance for the fiscal year through April 30, 2024. The state ended April with \$95.8 billion in unused borrowable resources, while fiscal year-to-date receipts continue below estimates contained in the 2024-25 Governor's proposed budget.

The Governor's Budget estimated that the state would collect nearly \$16.3 billion in personal income taxes in April. As shown on the State Controller's Office April 2024 Personal Income Tax Tracker webpage, the state exceeded the revenue target by approximately \$150 million.

"With April personal income tax revenues just tracking with the most recent budget estimates, fiscal year-to-date revenues continue at lower-than-expected levels," said Controller Cohen. "The high level of borrowable resources is due in large part to the \$26 billion the state has prudently built up and reserved

for rainy days and economic uncertainties. Maintaining enough cash to cushion against economic downturns has been one of California's strengths in its credit ratings and ensures the state will continue to meet its payment obligations."

Fiscal year-to-date receipts through April were \$169.8 billion, nearly \$4.8 billion below the Governor's Budget estimates, or 2.7 percent. The state's cash position is \$7.6 billion better than expected with disbursements of \$184.9 billion for the fiscal year nearly \$12.4 billion, or 6.3 percent, less than proposed budget projections.

As the chief fiscal officer of California, Controller Cohen is responsible for accountability and disbursement of the state's financial resources. The Controller has independent auditing authority over government agencies that spend state funds. She is a member of numerous financing authorities, and fiscal and financial oversight entities including the Franchise Tax Board. SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Department of Water Resources (DWR) is continuing its annual eco-friendly program to combat overgrowth in detention basins to prevent the potential for flooding in the unincorporated parts of the County. Starting on May 21, Billy Goat Gruff and hundreds of his hungriest friends will converge on five separate locations over the next five weeks to help reduce the flood threat from overgrown grass and weeds.

Most of the County's flood prevention efforts occur during the spring and summer months before the rains fall again. Left unattended overgrowth could block water flow from heavy rains, resulting in street flooding. This is the twelfth year these contractors have been utilized as an effective force to ensure the creeks and

detention basins are clear for the upcoming storm season. This year, 300 goats and sheep will be casually dining as they rotate through five different locations.

The areas chosen for the contractor's dining experience will include Arcade Creek at Evergreen Estates: Winding Way at Auburn Blvd - 4.4 Acres, Arcade Creek at Kenneth Avenue: N/O Burl Way - 3.4 Acres, Arcade Creek at White Fir Way: E/O Garfield Ave - 2 Acres, Ottoman Hills Detention Basin: Main Avenue at Wiltshire Way - .7 Acres, and Strawberry Creek at Calvine Road: East & West of Aubery Drive - 7.7 Acres.

Residents near the projects received postcards letting them know about the cost-effective approach to flood prevention work. An onsite herder and trained dogs accompany the dining party 24-hours a day to ensure they are cared for, kept on task, don't wander off, and offer Thousand Island or Blue Cheese, if requested. ★

In Memory Of...

It's time for celebration on **Memorial Day** weekend and that's okay. But do we really know what Memorial Day is all about? We sometimes confuse it with Veteran's Day. Both are significant, but they are different. Memorial Day is specifically dedicated to honoring and remembering those who died while serving in the U.S. Military. It is a solemn day of remembrance. **Veteran's Day**, on the other hand, celebrates all veterans...both living and deceased...who have served in the armed forces.

Memorial Day is observed on the last day of May each year. It originated during the American Civil War when citizens began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers with flowers. It was officially proclaimed in 1868. Originally, it was known as Decoration Day. **Memorial Day** honors those who made the ultimate sacrifice by giving their lives in service to their country. Traditionally **Memorial Day** is marked by ceremonies, parades, and the decoration of graves with flags and flowers. The civil War ended in the spring of 1865 and claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history, and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries. By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime



tributes to those countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers. It's not clear where exactly this tradition originated and numerous different communities may have independently initiated the memorial gatherings. Some records show that one of the earliest **Memorial Day** celebrations was begun by a group of formerly enslaved people in Charleston, South Carolina less than a month after the Civil War ended in 1865.

On May 5, 1868, General John Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance later that month. For decades **Memorial Day** was observed on May 30, but in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established **Memorial Day** as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. It's the same law that declared **Memorial Day** a federal holiday.

Let's all remember what this day stands for in the midst of the fun with a moment of silence which takes place at 3:00 PM local time. I found the following and truly believe what veterans have given us with their sacrifice. ★

- It is THE VETERAN, not the preacher, who has given us freedom of religion.
- It is THE VETERAN, not the reporter, who has given us freedom of the press.
- It is THE VETERAN, not the poet, who has given us freedom of speech.
- It is THE VETERAN, not the campus organizer, who has given us the freedom to assemble.
- It is THE VETERAN, not the lawyer, who has given us the right to a fair trial.
- It is THE VETERAN, not the politician, who has given us the right to vote.
- It is THE VETERAN who salutes the flag.
- It is THE VETERAN who eternally serves under the flag.

Social Security Matters Older Husband and Working Wife Seek Guidance

Dear Rusty: I am 74 years old, retired and receiving Social Security. My wife will be 65 in January of 2025. Our hope was to start paying off some credit card expense by her receiving SS when she turns 65, however it appears there would be a substantial reduction to her benefits. Her work income is \$37,500 a year, and she wasn't planning on retiring from work at age 65. Because I am 11 years older, we felt it makes sense to use her Social Security as a means to lower our debt. We have \$27,000 in credit card debt, and I don't really want to use my 401(k) funds due to taxes. We pretty much live on my Social Security and pension. **Signed: Seeking Suggestions**

Dear Seeking: Your wife's full retirement age (FRA) for Social Security purposes is age 67. Because she will not yet have reached her FRA in January 2025 (when she is 65), if she claims SS to start at that time, not only will her monthly amount be reduced, but she will be subject to Social Security's annual earnings test. The earnings test sets a limit for how much can be earned by beneficiaries who claim SS before FRA. The earnings limit for 2024

is \$22,320. The limit for next year is not yet published (it's based on changes to the national wage index) but will be a bit higher – likely about \$23,500. Thus, I can't provide the exact impact, but if your wife's 2025 earnings exceed next year's limit, Social Security will take back \$1 in benefits for every \$2 over the limit (half of the amount over the limit). So, if your wife earns \$37,500 per year, that will likely be about \$14,000 over the limit and Social Security will take back half of that (\$7,000). They "take back" by withholding future benefits, or you can repay them in a lump sum. So, you will have a choice – repay Social Security from your other assets, or they will withhold your wife's SS benefits for the number of months needed to offset her penalty for exceeding the earnings limit. The number of months they will withhold depends on how much is owed and what your wife's monthly SS benefit is. For example, if your wife's age-65 SS benefit is about average (\$1,900) and her penalty for exceeding the limit is \$7,000, Social Security would withhold your wife's benefit for 4 months to recover the penalty, but she would receive her full benefit for the remaining 8 months of the year.

Unless your wife tells them in advance that she will exceed the limit, Social Security will find out the following year (after you file your income taxes). But, in any case, your wife cannot avoid the annual earnings test for working before reaching her full retirement age. The earnings test goes away when

your wife reaches her FRA of 67. Until that time, if she continues working she will have a choice to have her benefits withheld for a portion of the year, or simply repay Social Security in a lump sum (in which case her benefits would continue uninterrupted).

FYI, there is a silver lining in this, because if your wife has benefits withheld because she exceeds the earnings limit before her FRA, after she reaches her full retirement age Social Security will give her time credit for the months when benefits were withheld, which will result in her monthly Social Security payment amount increasing somewhat at her full retirement age. Thus, over time, your wife may recover the benefits which were withheld for exceeding the annual earnings limit. But to get 100% of the benefit she's earned from a lifetime of working, and be exempt from Social Security's earnings limit, she would need to wait until she reaches her FRA to claim.

California's Lagging Economy Hinders Efforts to Close State Budget Deficit

As Gov. Gavin Newsom and state legislators spend the next few weeks fashioning a state budget that's plagued by a multibillion-dollar deficit, they can't count on a booming economy to make their task easier.

California's recovery from the devastating economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic has been sluggish at best, trailing what's happening in the nation as a whole and in the state's archrivals, such as Texas and Florida.

According to Employment Development Department data, there are 200,000 fewer Californians in the labor force – those employed or seeking employment – than there were in February 2020, just before the pandemic exploded. There are 500,000 fewer employed, and 200,000 more unemployed.

While California's unemployment rate of 5.3% in March was just a third of what it was at the height of the pandemic-induced recession, it was still the highest of any state, markedly higher than the national rate of 3.9% and nearly two percentage points higher than it was before the pandemic.

By the federal government's more nuanced measure of employment called U-6, which counts not only the unemployed, but workers who are "marginally attached" to

the labor force and those who are involuntarily working part time, the state's 9.5% rate of underemployment is also the nation's highest.

Those numbers imply an economy that's not even operating at cruising speed, much less accelerating. Even the state's technology sector, centered in the San Francisco Bay Area, has cooled off as its once high-flying corporations announce layoffs virtually every day.

"California's civilian employment growth has been essentially flat since the second half of 2022 while the U.S. has remained relatively healthy, resulting in the state's unemployment rate rising faster than the nation," the revised budget Newsom unveiled last week acknowledges.

The pandemic erased about 3 million jobs in California as Newsom shut down large segments of the state's economy. Countless employers, particularly small businesses, never reopened after the health crisis eased and those that did survive have had to contend with inflationary costs, tighter loan conditions and changed consumer habits.

The budget blames stubborn inflation and the high interest rates imposed by the Federal Reserve System to tame inflation for California's slowdown, but economies of other states have experienced the same factors and prospered despite them.

However, they don't contend with factors unique to California, such as extremely high costs for housing, utilities and labor that make job creation more difficult here. Until recently, California has been losing population, thanks to outward migration to other states. The state has

also seen employment shifts, particularly in technology.

Those conditions underscore the sluggish recovery that sets California apart from other states. For instance, Texas' unemployment rate, 3.9%, is identical to the national rate while Florida's 3.2% is even lower.

So, one might ask, where is California's once-booming economy headed?

Newsom's Department of Finance says it "has not modeled a recession scenario. However, if inflation takes longer to cool and interest rates remain high for longer than projected in the May Revision baseline forecast, continued tight credit conditions could further discourage economic activity."

A few days before he released his revised budget, Newsom stood at the top of a Golden Gate Bridge tower to record a video celebrating the tourism industry's recovery.

Visitors to California spent \$150.4 billion last year, he said, surpassing the previous record of \$144.9 billion in 2019.

That's good news, even though an adjustment for inflation would probably reduce the recovery's relative impact. But while it's a high-profile economic sector, tourism is scarcely 3% of the state's overall economy. It's the other 97% we should be nurturing.



I know I didn't answer most of my callers as they would have hoped. But perhaps once I've mastered Jesus' list, I'll have better responses to their questions.


Finally, my best call began last week, with "FIRST, I think your new picture makes you look like Jean-Luc Picard."

The Lesser of Two Evils

Dear Dave,

My husband and I are following your plan, and we're on Baby Step 2. We just learned that the person who has done our taxes for the last three years made mistakes on all our returns. They were really nice and did our taxes for free, but now we owe back taxes in the amount of \$18,000. Since we're still paying off debt, the only savings we have is the \$1,000 in our beginner emergency fund. Should we take out a personal loan to take care of this, or set up payments with the IRS?

Dear Laura,
Take out a personal loan. Period.
Let this sink in for a min-

ute. How often does Dave Ramsey tell people to borrow money? Almost never. Why am I doing it now, in this situation? Because the IRS is the worst creditor on the planet. They have almost unlimited power, and they have ridiculously high penalties and interest rates. With a personal loan from a local bank or credit union, you'll at least have more input and flexibility in deciding the terms of the agreement.

Now, I don't know about you, but if the person doing my taxes screwed things up to the tune of \$18,000, I'd find someone else in a heartbeat. I understand you want to work with someone nice, and free is usually a great price. But in this case, free was not so free after all.

Just go to your local bank or credit union, explain the situation and see what you can work out. I always recommend small banks or credit unions over any of the mega banks. Places like Bank of America and Fifth Third

just have no soul or empathy whatsoever. And the customer service at a credit union or small bank is a hundred times better than what you'll find at a big bank. Sure, they're still bankers, but there's a human element in there. You're not just a number to them like you are to the mega banks.

I hate debt, Laura, and I'm sorry you guys are in this situation. But 100% of the time, I'd rather have personal loan debt than IRS debt. In my mind, it's the lesser of two evils.

Alice Astafan Shares Her Story

Retired Major General Highlights Achievements (and Challenges) in New Memoir

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Being the first female two-star general in the Air Force Reserves is only one of 85-year-old trailblazer Alice Astafan's many accomplishments. She was also a CEO, worked at the Pentagon, was personally appointed by former Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger and is now a published author.

and chemistry. "Roll Tide!" she said at one point of the newspaper interview, alluding to the Alabama slang.

Astafan was first inspired to serve her country when she attended a movie theater at age 19. She saw a cutout of a woman dressed in an Air Force uniform, advertising women's enrollment in Officer Training School. This piqued her interest, so she joined

and planning support for aircraft and hundreds of personnel, and much more.

From Thailand to Austria to England to Africa, she traveled near and far, eventually landing at Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma City in 1965, where she met her future husband, Peter Astafan, a civilian employee. The pair married in a small ceremony in 1968.


"He was perfect," Astafan said. "He didn't have a jealous bone in his body."

When Peter was assigned to Fort McClellan in 1973, he and Astafan moved to Carmichael. Shortly after their move, the Astafans welcomed a baby boy named Patrick. He would be their only child. To juggle motherhood and her booming career, Astafan stepped down from her 13-year stint of active duty and joined the Air Force Reserves. This gave her more ability to care for Patrick and still do the job she loved. Impressing all her supervisors, it was only a few years later in 1988 when she was named a general and received her first star.

What made Astafan so successful? She said it was all about following the Air Force mission, being a team player and working to the best of her ability. Her grit and determination were recognized and she proved herself capable every single time she was promoted.

While continuing her successful career, the unimaginable happened when Patrick was diagnosed with leukemia in 1992. While Patrick was fighting leukemia, Astafan somehow kept rising up the military ladder, traveling and working in logistics at the Pentagon, officially receiving her second star in 1993, while also supporting her son.

Unfortunately, Patrick lost his hard-fought battle in 1994 at age 20, which turned Astafan's world upside down.

"He was a jewel, he really was," Astafan said. Patrick's legacy has since been honored with a scholarship fund in his name at both Oklahoma Christian University and California State University, Sacramento (CSUS), which has helped fund nearly 200 students' education.

Then in 2021, Peter died from retrograde amnesia, which was another unimaginable loss.

"We had been married for 53 years, four months, and nine days. My life will never be the same," Astafan wrote in her memoir.

When asked how she kept going after losing both her husband and son, Astafan points to sky, referring to God. She honors both Patrick and Peter in her memoir's Chapter 15, "My Soulmate and My Angel - Love is the Greatest Blessing of All".

After retiring from the Air Force in 1998, Astafan immediately dove into a new role as the CEO of the Federal Technology Center, which works with state, federal, and local government contracts. She stayed in that role for 10 years. In addition, she was appointed by former Gov. Schwarzenegger to serve as the chairperson on the California Veterans Board. She served on 20 boards of directors with no compensation, wrote and gave

100 speeches across the country, was the grand marshal of the Sacramento and Elk Grove Veteran's Day parades, and even got her master's in both early childhood education and international affairs from California State University at Sacramento.


Astafan hopes her passion for this country will inspire American youth to serve their country, chase their dreams and believe in themselves.

"Quite frankly, the country needs women to serve," Astafan said. "We need good honest people to serve our nation so our way of life can forever be safe and in place. Why do so many people want to come to America? Think about it."

She provides words of wisdom to young people: "You do not have to be born with a silver spoon in your mouth. You can dream big, set goals, work honestly and diligently, and become most anything in America. Also, it is not what happens to you along the way, it is how you handle those things. Life is short; it is like a drop of dew on a blade of grass; in the morning it is there but it is soon over. Make your time on this Earth count for something!"

There is so much more to her story. Astafan has lived what can only be described as a remarkable life and has changed the lives of others, as well. Devoted to every role she has had, whether picking cotton on her childhood farm, being a wife and mother, a mentor, a CEO or a two-star general, Astafan has lived a life full of hard work, selflessness, patriotism and integrity.

Leaving no stone unturned, Astafan's book is filled to the brim with her past speeches, every article written about her and a vast array of photos. It is now available to purchase on her website (aliceastafan.com) or on Amazon. ★

But that's merely scratching the surface. Astafan's memoir, "Lady Leader Leaves Lasting Legacy," takes the reader through a detailed journey of her extraordinary life, leaving inspiration and courage along the way.

Messenger Publishing Group had a recent conversation with Astafan at her Carmichael home. Tucked away in a peaceful neighborhood, the Astafan house is warm and inviting. Astafan is quick-witted, energetic and wildly interesting. "Why do newspaper people care so much about my age?" she laughed when asked.

A longtime Carmichael resident, Astafan hails from a farm in rural Alabama, which is obvious when her honey-sweet Southern accent comes out. Born Nora Alice Davidson, she spent her childhood among eight other siblings (seven also served in the military), helping with farmwork and living off the land.

Dreaming of a bigger life, she later put herself through the University of Alabama by working various jobs on campus. There she studied biology

the Air Force in 1960, where she would become very successful. Little did she know that she would go on to make history as the first female two-star general in the Air Force Reserves. To clarify, a two-star general is nominated by the president and confirmed by the Senate.

Being one of the only women among thousands of men in the Air Force, it would be safe to assume there was some disadvantage due to the time period. However, Astafan was sure to point out, she didn't face much sexism or prejudice in the military, and if anything, the men she worked with were protective and supportive of her. Astafan reminisced that they recognized her work ethic and loyalty and gave her the promotions she deserved.

"Throughout my career, I had 42 male supervisors and they all treated me with great respect," she said.

Astafan's military career lasted 38 years, taking her throughout the world. Her duties included developing and finalizing logistics plans, inventorying war readiness material, coordinating



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The newest members of the California Highway Patrol (CHP) were sworn in May 10 during a graduation ceremony at the CHP Academy in West Sacramento. The 106 officers are part of the CHP's multiyear recruiting campaign to fill 1,000 vacant officer positions by hiring qualified individuals from California's diverse communities.

"These men and women have chosen to dedicate themselves to a career in public service. They have completed several months of rigorous training at the CHP Academy to prepare them to serve the people of California," said CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee. "While this job is one of the most difficult things they will do in their entire life, it is also the most rewarding thing that they will do, and we are proud to have them as part of the CHP family."

The swearing-in ceremony for the new officers marks the completion of a challenging 26-week journey at the CHP Academy. They will report to one of the 103 CHP Area offices throughout the state to begin serving the people of California.

At the CHP Academy, cadet training starts with nobility in policing, leadership, professionalism and ethics, and cultural diversity. Additionally, cadets receive

instruction on mental illness response and crisis intervention techniques. Training also covers vehicle patrol, crash investigation, first aid, and the apprehension of suspected violators, including those who drive under the influence. Cadets also receive training in traffic control, report writing, recovery of stolen vehicles, assisting the motoring public, issuing citations, emergency scene management, and various codes, including the California Vehicle Code, Penal Code, and Health and Safety Code.

The CHP has seen an outpouring of interest in joining the ranks since the onset of a multiyear recruitment campaign in June 2022. In the first four months of 2024, the CHP received more than 7,600 cadet applications - a more than 100% increase from the same period in 2022. To accommodate the surge of interest, the CHP has been holding three Academy classes simultaneously for the first time in the Department's history. The next cadet graduation from the CHP Academy is scheduled for July 12, 2024.
