Ri-Nu Imagination Launches Artist Studios

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Twelve years ago, the City of Rancho Cordova curated its first art show at City Hall. Titled "Genesis," the show marked the beginning of the contemporary visual art movement in Rancho Cordova. Since that day, the Rancho Cordova Arts (RCArts) was born.

RCArts' mission was to make Rancho Cordova a more vibrant, artful place to live, work, play and grow. Five years ago, The Mills Station Art and Culture Center (The MACC) was established. Rancho Cordova was well on its way to living up to its goal of making the city a place where art and artists thrive.

There was only one element missing to complete their goal. That final element was artist studio space. On Thursday, Aug. 1, Ri-Nu Imagination Artist Studios at Lincoln Village celebrated its grand opening with a ribbon cutting. The event was hosted by the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce.

Representatives from Assemblyman Josh Hoover and State Senator Roger Neillo presented certificates of recognition to Ri-Nu Imagination. They were also presented a proclamation from the City of Rancho Cordova and a gift basket for each studio artist by Explore Rancho Cordova.

Ri-Nu Imagination Artist Studios at Lincoln Village feature seven

studio spaces for local artists with a waiting list of six artists eager to join their creative community. The premiere artists who are on board are Amy Lynn Torres, CJ Einer, Jim Hunter, Nicole Haddad, Mary Teabo, Maria Pascoal and Lauren Hostetter.

Co-founded by Anu Aaltonen-Bond, Ri-Nu Imagination has been in the making for more than five years. Reflecting on her journey, Aaltonen-Bond said, "I am filled with gratitude for the support we've received and excitement for the future. Our goal is to continue fostering a vibrant, inclusive art community where creativity thrives and inspires."

July New Home Sales Return to Normal

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - After six straight months of new home sales that were well above average, sales returned to a historically normal level in July, the North State Building Industry Association reported Aug. 7.

BIA member builders reported selling 433 homes during July, 6% above the monthly average of 409 recorded during July since 1997. Sales were down 15% from June and down 13% from July 2023.

BIA President and CEO Tim Murphy suggested the region's heat wave might have been a factor.

"Sales were noticeably lower than they have been this year during the first two weeks of the month when the Sacramento region was suffering through a historically hot heat wave," he noted. "During eight of those days, temperatures were above 105 and reached 110 or above on three days.

"Temperatures dropped off a bit during the third week of the month and were in the 70s and 80s during the last weekend of the month. It's probably no coincidence that sales climbed during the third week and that the last week of the month was the best week out of the four. Still, despite the heat, overall it was a solid month for our members."


Murphy said it was also possible that talk of the Federal Reserve finally lowering interest rates next month may be causing some people to hold off on buying, although a quarter-point drop in rates would not be substantial enough to make much difference in monthly payments.

New home communities in Rancho Cordova saw the most sales during the month (95), followed by Elk Grove (77) and perennial market leader Roseville, which recorded just 62 sales. Sacramento (excluding Natomas) was next with 48 and Folsom rounded out the top five with 42 sales. The next five sub-

markets were Plumas Lake (20), Rocklin (17), Lincoln (14), Galt (13) and Natomas (12). BIA statistics include

Rancho Cordova City Hall Hosts 48th Art Show

- The 48th Art Show at Rancho Cordova City Hall, featuring abstract still life and botanical themes, runs from July 29 to Oct. 25. Located at 2729 Prospect Drive, the exhibition features work by local artists and members of the Rancho Cordova Art Community.

The art reception, a staple of every exhibit, held at City Hall from 5 to 7 p.m. on July 31, drew approximately 50 attendees who appreciated the artwork and met the artists. The event featured the presentation of awards, abstract artist located on E Street Gallery, served as the jury for this exhibition.

Michelle Scott won both first-place and Best of Show for her abstract still life pieces, "Sometimes Gives Life Artichokes" and "Dahlias Want all the Attention."

"He was very excited and happy to win," said Scott about her grandson who together have been painting for three years. At just seven years old, Axel's achievements highlight the city's commitment to exposing children to art and promoting these young

"Seeing his art hanging on the wall is pretty cool," said event specialist Andrea Medina. "It ties into what Rancho Cordova and The Mills Station Art & Culture Center (MACC) promotes with the Micro Pieces project where we work on getting more art supplies for kids."

Christine Villa was another artist recognized at the exhibit. Participating for the first time in a juried show, she was awarded an Honorable Mention award for her piece "Hanging Memories."

Medina highlighted that the show plays a significant role in the local art scene. "It's impressive to have art on display at City Hall. We hold these shows four times a year and it gives a chance for local artists to be seen by the public and city officials."

The Fall Fine Art Show is the next exhibit taking place at City Hall from Oct. 29 to Jan. 19. Every year, the Fall show is open themed and artists are encouraged to submit their best work.



Sac County Awarded \$15 Million for Bridge Housing

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services (BHS) was notified of a conditional award of \$15 million as part of the latest round of funding from the California Department of Health Care Services' (DHCS) Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH) Program. This award is part of a broader initiative by the State which awarded nearly \$133 million to 10 County behavioral health agencies to provide temporary, safe housing and essential support for people transitioning from homelessness to permanent housing.

This new funding builds on the success of the first round of Behavioral Health Bridge Housing funding, in which Sacramento County received \$43 million. With the initial funding, the County developed two main strategies to address behavioral health and housing challenges. First, the County invested in 100 Safe Stay beds dedicated to individuals experiencing both homelessness and behavioral health issues. Currently, 80 Behavioral Health Services dedicated beds are open. There are 56 beds at the East Parkway campus, and 24 beds are located at the Florin Safe Stay campus. There are currently 20 Behavioral Health Services Safe Stay beds under construction at the Stockton Safe Stay campus.

The second strategy involves collaborating with community-based organizations in Sacramento County to generate innovative ideas for transitional housing. On July 9, the County approved adding approximately 135 beds for individuals with behavioral health challenges, including sober living programs. These beds are in various phases of construction.

With this additional round of funding awarded to Sacramento County, Behavioral Health Services will support the construction of 66 new Safe Stay beds for the Watt Safe Stay Campus. In total, with all funding, Behavioral Health Bridge Housing will support the addition of 301 beds for individuals experiencing homelessness with behavioral health conditions.

"As you all know, each dollar received translates into meaningful change, offering hope, support and a pathway to treatment for those in need," said Sacramento County Behavioral Health Director, Dr. Ryan Quist. "I'd like to thank the State for believing in our mission and empowering Sacramento County to continue the important bridge housing work. Together, we are making a profound difference in the lives of so many."

Sacramento Car Detailing

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova-based Sacramento Car Detailing is one of 36 elite detailers who participated in the 2024 Air Force One Project at the Museum of Flight in Seattle, Washington from July 7 - 14.

The prestigious project restored, maintained, and preserved the first presidential jet Air Force One, which was in use until 1996. It served as the first mobile Oval Office and transported Presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson, and Nixon, as well as international VIPs from Nikita Khrushchev to Henry Kissinger.

The project also included work on dozens of other iconic aircraft at the museum, including the Concorde "Alpha Golf," the first-ever 747 (Serial No. 001), a WWII B-29 Superfortress known as "T-Square 54," and the first Boeing 727 built.

A highly specialized and selective team of detailers worldwide is selected annually to serve as caretakers of the Air Force One, valued at over \$300 million, and other aircraft. Sacramento Car Detailing has participated in the project for the last two years.

Sacramento Car Detailing was founded by Rancho Cordova resident Chris Tabieros in 2020. It serves the Sacramento region by offering quality ceramic coating installation, paint correction services, and interior and exterior detailing for cars, RVs, boats, and motorcycles.

Tabieros fell in love with cars in high school when he participated in an automotive program that taught body repair and mechanics. He worked hard through the years to develop his professional skills, open his own business, and impact the detailer industry.

"Sacramento Car Detailing is honored to have been selected for the Air Force One Project in 2023 and 2024," said Tabieros. "It was a dream of mine to be on the team helping preserve pieces of history. The project has taken my craft to the next level and allowed me to serve my customers better."

Tabieros was selected for this project thanks to his involvement with The Detail Mafia, a network of high-quality professional detailers. In 2002, Founder Renny Doyle received a call from a Bush administration official asking him to bring a team to the Museum of Flight to clean and restore the deteriorating paint and aluminum finish of the historic Air Force One. Renny and a small staff started the restoration project in 2003, and after a few years, Renny opened up the project to The Detail Mafia members.

"It's pretty amazing to get picked once for the Air Force One project, but to get picked twice is even rarer," said Doyle. "I am very proud of Chris Tabieros. If he's good enough for Air Force One, he's good enough for you!"





The Kings continue to look for the power forward to body-up alongside Domantas Sabonis, and last week sought after Lauri Markkanen who re-signed with the Utah Jazz for a reported \$238-million contract over five years. His signing after August 6 means that he cannot be traded for at least six months, after the 2025 trade deadline, and for all intents and purposes makes Mr. Markkanen a name to no longer discuss.

Color announcer Kyle Draper jumped in last week with his own thoughts as to who might be a good fit at power forward when he expressed his enthusiasm for another Utah Jazz standout, in big man John Collins. Collins showed a lot of promise last season putting up 15.1 points per game, while securing 8.5 rebounds. This while he only garnished 28 minutes of playing time per game. Collins is only 26 years of age and stands 6'9" with a 6'11" wingspan. Nice stats for a power forward with a bright future in the NBA, so perhaps Draper is working two jobs as scout and game announcer.

I like hearing from all quarters as it relates to players that might improve the Sacramento Kings front court, and as high as I am on Domantas Sabonis, I know this talented big man needs more help on

I am high and guardedly hopeful that the

recent signing of Orlando Robinson will pay dividends this season, and I applaud Monte McNair's search for a diamond in

Every year some player surfaces to the top and surprises everyone with a breakout year, and in many circumstances this occurs because they finally found a team to give them a true opportunity to shine.

Keon Ellis made significant strides last season because coach Brown built his confidence gradually throughout the season, even making him a starter for a lengthy stretch. Keon's best basketball is still in front of him, and that is after he endured a stint in the G league where he showcased his talents and worked his way up to the big club.

I believe that same confidence would do wonders for Trey Lyles, and like Ellis I am convinced we have not yet seen the top side of Mr. Lyles.

Keep your eyes on Boogie Ellis, who like his namesake Keon looked like a man among boys in the recent summer league games. The Ellis boys could potentially play significant minutes for the Kings this season, and like Keon, I like the defensive effort Boogie brings to the floor to go along with his three-point shooting.

Not to be overlooked is our top draft choice of two years ago Keegan Murray, who had an ambitious rookie season to be followed by his sophomore year that had mixed reviews. This former NCAA Division I leading scorer (822 points, 2021-22) in the nation may very well surprise everyone this year and propel himself into an all-star year. Keegan added a mid-range game last season that will undoubtedly play well alongside newcomer DeMar DeRozan.

I remain convinced that McNair is not through tinkering with this lineup, and when the Kings break training camp this season, look for at least one more power forward to join the group we have today.

The Sacramento Kings glass is half full, and I can't wait to see the upcoming season in full splendor.

Social Security Matters Will My Wife Get a Spousal Benefit from Me?

Dear Rusty: I will be turning 70 (yikes) this coming November. I will begin taking my Social Security benefit at that time. My age 70 SS benefit will be approximately \$4,500 per month. My spouse (who is currently 74) began receiving her SS benefits about 10 years ago - before her FRA. She receives approximately \$1,900 per month.

My question is, based on my expected SS monthly benefit of approximately \$4,500, would my spouse be eligible for an increase in her monthly SS benefit? I've read some articles about this topic, but none of them seem to be on point - so I thought I'd reach out to you. Signed: Seeking Answers

Dear Seeking: Congratulations on choosing a claiming strategy

which will maximize your Social Security. Waiting until age 70 to claim guarantees you will get the most you can personally receive for the rest of your life, along with annual Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA). But the spouse benefits available to your wife when you claim are not based on your age 70 amount. Rather, spouse benefits are calculated using full retirement age (FRA) amounts. Here's what that means:

If your age 70 benefit will be about \$4,500 then your FRA amount was likely around \$3,450. If your wife claimed at, say, 64, then her FRA entitlement would probably have been around \$2,200. Your wife will only get a spousal boost if 50% of your FRA amount (not your age 70 amount) is more than her own FRA entitlement. From what you've shared, 50% of your FRA amount would be about \$1,750, which is less than your wife's FRA entitlement (and her current age 64 amount), which means that she would not be eligible for a spousal boost to her own amount from you.

Spouse benefits can be tricky, because they're based on FRA entitlements, regardless of the age at which benefits are actually claimed. That is not so, however, for surviving spouse benefits. If you were to predecease your wife, her benefit would be your entire \$4,500 amount, instead of her own smaller current amount. Surviving spouse benefits are based on the amount each of you are currently receiving, not on your amounts at your full retirement age.

I hope this answers your question, but we're always here if you need any further assistance.

Texas Scores a Goal on California as Chevron Moves Headquarters to Houston

The war between Gov. Gavin Newsom and the state's once-immense oil industry entered a new phase a few days ago when Chevron, California's oldest and best known producer of gasoline and other petroleum products, announced it was moving its corporate headquarters to Texas.

Chevron, which dates its origins to the California Star Oil Works, which struck oil in the Santa Susana Mountains of Southern California in 1876, characterized the move from San Ramon to Houston as merely an ordinary managerial consolidation.

However, given its prominence, Newsom's recurrent vilification of the industry and his vow to end sales of gasoline-powered cars as a way of becoming carbon-neutral by 2045, the move's political aspects could not be ignored.

Initially, Newsom posted on social media a video denouncing oil industry "price gouging," including a melty-face emoji characterizing the industry's reaction to California's efforts to dampen gas prices.

But his office quickly took down the video and issued a statement saying Chevron's announcement "is the logical culmination of a long process that has repeatedly been foreshadowed by Chevron."

Predictably, Texas' Republican Gov. Greg Abbott, a frequent foil for Newsom, immediately cast Chevron's move as a "snub" to California in a posting on X, formerly Twitter, calling Texas Chevron's "true home."

A more stinging rebuke came from the Bay Area Council, a business group that hews to a moderate political line and has often been supportive of Newsom. "Chasing jobs and employ-

ers out of California is no way to run the economy," Jim Wunderman, the organization's president, said. "It's an embarrassment for California that we've lost so many global companies because of misguided policies that make it incredibly difficult to do business here. California's elected leaders need to take stock of the decisions they're making that affect millions of families and workers, impact the state budget and have grave consequences for the future economic health of this state."

Were Chevron's move an isolated event, it would be only temporarily interesting. However, California has seen a steady exodus of corporations, as the Bay Area Council noted, thus reinforcing its image of hostility to business.

Just days earlier, Elon Musk, who had already moved his Tesla corporate headquarters to Texas, announced that X and SpaceX would follow.

Chevron's announce-

ment also comes amid a flurry of layoffs and corporate retrenchments in the Bay Area's high-tech industry, which have contributed to the state's having the nation's highest unemployment rate. Moreover, we may not have

heard the last of Chevron's moves. The company had been warning California officials that it might close its

two refineries in the state, which are major producers of the state's unique gasoline blend.

Voters in Richmond, the site of one Chevron refinery, will decide in November whether to impose a special tax on the refinery, \$1 per barrel, and the company has accused Richmond's leaders of "playing chicken" with their largest taxpayer and employer.

Politico reported that Andy Walz, a top Chevron executive, warned in an interview about the potential consequences of the Richmond tax measure. "I'm not going to tell you that that's the death knell, but we're getting close," he said, adding, "if I can't invest there, and I can't get a return, we will move on."

Newsom and other

California politicians openly intend to eventually shut down the oil industry to reduce the state's carbon footprint. But they want a gradual reduction so many millions of gasoline-powered cars still on the road can run until phased out.

Were Chevron and other producers to decide, as Walz warns, that continuing operations in a politically hostile California no longer pencils out, the state could see an abrupt and economically devastating fuel shortage.
