

#### **SHAPING THE PAGE**

Poetry is always a shape on the page. Whether it is a rectangular prose box, a series of couplets, or a continuous descent of lines of varying lengths, the effect is that we enter into the poem's structure in much the same way we enter a room in a house. We take in the content of the poem—its meaning, its message to

us—but we are also affected by the way things are arranged: how they look and sound. One of the pleasures of writing poetry is learning to shape the "room" of the poem in various ways. This workshop is for writers who would like to consider the more technical aspects of poetry, who welcome the chance to talk about the intricacies of meter and line, and who would enjoy experimenting with a variety of poetic forms (sonnets, villanelles, sestinas, ghazals—to name a few). Although this workshop will acquaint participants with strategies associated with poetic expression (rhyme, meter, assonance, alliteration, and metaphor, for example), the main purpose of the time will be to draft new poems and to celebrate each other's work.

# IS IT MEMOIR OR FICTION? HARNESSING LIFE EXPERIENCE TO CRAFT THE STORY YOU HAVE TO TELL

Through writing exercises, readings, sharing, engaging discussion, and the calm of retreat, learn how to make your story feel more real and gain renewed inspiration for the writing ahead.

#### **BEGINNING ACRYLIC**

Start from the foundation as Adam demonstrates each step of the process of making an acrylic painting, from gessoing a board/canvas, to creating a drawing and painting, to varnishing and wiring the finished piece. Students will receive individualized instruction that supports all skill levels, including painters with more experience. Adam will demonstrate color mixing using a variety of color theory techniques as well as glazing and impasto techniques with a palette knife, brush, and scraping tools. Students will create a series of paintings using their own reference material and learn to keep proportions accurate.

Explore the foundation of watercolor techniques to create a small series of watercolor paintings inspired by the majestic scenery and natural elements found in Grand Marais. Students will work from photos and each day will begin with practice and guided experimentation using techniques such as washes, dry brush, color layering, and resists. We will also look at the history of watercolor through the works of Dürer, Blake, Turner, Audubon, Moran, Sargent, and O'Keeffe to better understand how these artists made their watercolors as inspiration for students to develop their skills.

#### INTRODUCTION TO FUNCTIONAL POTTERY

Students will be introduced to functional pottery making, starting with the basics of what clay is, why it's such a unique substance, and how it has been used throughout history. Students will first learn basic hand-building techniques to get a feel for clay as a material. They will then work on the potter's wheel, learning to center clay and form walls of bowls and cups. Brett will teach methods of finishing pots after they are thrown, and basic glazing and decoration techniques will be demonstrated.

Watercolor and pastel have long individual histories in visual art as media favored by artists to work through ideas with color in a more immediate/direct manner than oil, fresco, encaustic, egg tempera, and, more recently, acrylic media usually allow. Carl will review some of the individual characteristics of the two and then we will focus on the wonderful textural and expressive potential that they have when used together. Subjects will include still life and landscape. Prerequisite: basic drawing training and some experience/understanding in the use of color in art.

#### **OIL PAINTING: CONCEPT TO EXECUTION**

A successful painting starts before paint is ever applied to the canvas, with a solid concept. We will look at this part of the process by exploring what other artists have chosen to paint and why. Tom will teach students to incorporate quick sketch layout techniques done onsite, from life, from memory, or from other means. Students will also practice underpainting, blocking, and finishing painting techniques.
