400 Wins and Counting!

Big Red Make History Against Mesa Verde, Improve to 2-0

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Cordova Lancers secured the 400th win in the history of their illustrious program in the most fitting way possible this past Friday at Mesa Verde in dramatic fashion. A gutsy twopoint conversion call by head coach JP Dolliver late in the fourth quarter, combined with defensive heroics thereafter, would give the Lancers a thrilling 15-14 victory in one of the best games in recent memory.

Trailing by a touchdown with three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, Cordova (2-0) would allow Mavericks' (1-1) senior running back Fred Robinson to break off a 75-yard run that sent him barreling toward the endzone. Lancers' senior defensive back Sunntavion Hall-Carson had other ideas however, as he stopped Robinson at the one-yard line in a play that would turn out to be vital. One play later, a Mesa Verde fumble would be recovered by Cordova junior defensive lineman Aayden Huson, giving his team one last chance to join the record books.

A few plays later, Lancers' sophomore quarterback Trey Wallace would connect with senior wide receiver Donovan Schiffner on a 60-yard touchdown pass. Cordova would elect to go for the lead with a gritty two-point conversion play that sent Wallace into the endzone on a quarterback sneak, in a decision that came easy for Dolliver.

"It was easier than I thought," Roth said of the difficulty in making his decision to go for two. "In your head, you always think about what you would do in that situation. It was also credit to Mesa Verde's defense. I thought they had us figured out pretty good, so it was about How many more opportunities are we going to have to be right down here on the goal line?' In that sense it almost felt like my hand was kind of forced."

Mesa Verde would march downfield on their ensuing posession but were ultimately denied by Lancers' sophomore defensive back Terryn Continued on page 3

Rancho **Considers General Plan Revisions**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- The City Council's and the Planning Commission's work session on Aug. 27 was on the ongoing General Plan Update, aimed at guiding Rancho Cordova's growth and development through 2045.

Chelsey Payne and Darcy Goulart presented the update and sought input from the city on proposed changes to planning areas and sub-area boundaries. The General Plan, which serves as the city's longterm blueprint, is updated to reflect new economic conditions, housing needs and state requirements. The current update, initiated to address evolving community and environmental factors, builds upon the last update adopted in 2006.

"The proposed changes to the General Plan include reducing the planning area from 96 square miles to 68 square miles," Payne said. "We evaluated the boundaries and considered areas with limited recent planning efforts and existing development potential. Our goal is to focus on growth within current city limits."

However, members expressed concerns about removing those areas.

"I don't want to lose any of those areas," said Councilmember Garrett Gatewood. "I don't see the need or the benefit."

Mayor David M. Sander, Ph.D., emphasized the importance of historical and political contexts in defining boundaries.

"Our original intent was to establish logical boundaries. We must consider if maintaining these areas aligns with our long-term vision or if focusing on more immediate needs is more practical," Sander said.

Commissioner Lee Frechette said, "If we give up those planning areas, we cut off the possibilities of having conversations about future expansion. We want to keep all our options on the table.'

On the other hand, the proposal to add areas was generally supported. These additions are intended to accommodate future annexation and ensure potential future expansions.

"Any area that the city intends to add to the sphere of influence in the future should be included in a General Plan planning area," said Payne. "The main reason to include an area would be a desire to consider the annexation of

Teaching Kindness, Character Through Flag Football

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Playmakers organization is a nonprofit that works with local youth to build character through free sports programs throughout the year.

By promoting kindness and social inclusion, Playmakers supports all youth and their families, with a particular focus on those with developmental differences and special needs. This year, for the first time, Playmakers founder Greg Roeszler (known as Coach Roz) is excited to announce an NFL FLAG football league for local youth.

The eight-game season will kick off on Sept. 28, running from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. for eight consecutive Saturdays. The league will play at Mesa Verde High School's new stateof-the-art stadium at 7501 Carriage Drive in Citrus Heights. Each day will begin with athletic practice and skills development, followed by a flag football game. The league will split into two groups, one for youth between the ages of 6 and 14, and the other with a more flexible age range for youth with special needs.

The coaches are volunteer student athletes from local high schools, Mesa Verde and San Juan. These two rival schools will be "working together under the Playmakers' umbrella on character building and inclusiveness," Coach Roeszler said.

"There are a lot of families that can't afford the fees to play flag football"

or other organized sports, the coach said, which is why Playmakers programs are always completely free to kids and their families. The funding for this NFL FLAG football league comes from The Optimists of Country Club, a local civic group based out of Citrus Heights, and Verde Design, which built the new stadium at Mesa Verde.

Playmakers is facilitating the league, with Roeszler running the program and providing coaching training and inclusivity awareness to the student athletes.

Roeszler acknowledged the dedication of "two unbelievable volunteers who pulled this together," Rick Johnson and Jim Szymanski, who worked so quickly to implement this new league: negotiating with the NFL for official inclusion as an NFL FLAG football league region (with all the associated uniforms, equipment, and gear), working with the San Juan Unified School District to secure the stadium location, and coordinating with the high schools to recruit student volunteers.

"The fact that rival schools are working together for inclusiveness and character building is amazing. The administration is so supportive, and it can change the culture of a campus," Roeszler said, "and our NFL players are extremely pleased that this is being done at the grassroots level."

He added that it was "incredible and so encouraging" to have local civic groups getting involved, because it is so important to provide opportunities for all kids to enjoy the benefits of sports and athletics, while having fun, learning to kind to each other, and striving to be the best they can be."

"TK" King as he would preserve the win with a game-sealing interception in the redzone. Cordova would kneel to run out the remaining time on the clock.

Wallace again put forth an impressive performance in just his second varsity game for Cordova, as he went 11-of-19 passing for 216 yards and the late touchdown. On the ground, he added

nine carries for 50 yards and an additional score that came in the second quarter. Schiffner, playing in his first game of the season, provided an explosive three receptions for 109 yards to go along with his late score. Robinson would lead Mesa Verde with touchdown runs of 11 and 21 yards, both of which occured in the second quarter.

The game had another special moment prior to kickoff, as legendary former Lancers head coach Max Miller would speak to Dolliver to wish he and his team luck before they would go on to make history.

For Dolliver, being a part of the 400th win in team history is not something he nor his team take

"I guess the thing that strikes me the most is that I got a call from Max Miller last week," Roth said. "He wanted to try to be at our home game (Aug. 23 versus El Camino) and he wasn't able to get there. He said Don't wait for me though, go get the 400th on the road,' and it just struck me because he was a part of all of those wins from his time at Cordova. Sometimes, you hear little pieces like that about the history, and you know this isn't just any other pro-

gram. It's a very storied program

going back many decades with a lot of people who are invested in it. It's a really neat thing to be a part of."

Cordova returns home to Lancers Stadium this Friday, Sept. 6 as they host Valley Christian. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m., and the game has been nominated to be the KCRA 3 "Game of The Week." Poll results were not final prior to press time.

Donald Terry, "If we were to incorporate and annex those existing communities, there are two equations to look at. Either the unincorporated counties vote to incorporate themselves into the city, along with the sales tax increase which makes that question way tougher to get a yes on, or you annex them in without the tax increase and then the rest of us are paying to get the level of service up there at the cost of the city."

The session also introduced the concept of dividing the General Plan planning area into sub-areas, allowing tailored policies for each section.

Public comments reflected a range of perspectives. James Garcia voiced support for the update but urged the city to revisit existing development agreements to ensure they are being met.

"We can't just sit on out city limits; we need to grow as a city," said Garcia when commenting on the proposed area changes. "If we don't, we are going to be gobbled up. We need to protect our borders."

Larry Lad highlighted the importance of environmental justice, a principle that the city was founded on.

"I would like all economic planning along and in the parkway to ensure that development with access within and adjacent to the American River Parkway be designed to reduce as much visual intrusion and to complement the naturalistic amenities of the parkway," said Brenda Gustin in a letter to the council. "Choosing to ignore the Preservation Act threatens our economy and out ecology."

The meeting consensus was to maintain all existing boundaries with the exception of deleting a sliver within the city of Sacramento and going forward with the proposed area additions. It was also agreed to implement the proposed sub-area divisions to more effectively tailor policies.



Social Security Matters

For Advice on When to Claim Social Security

Dear Rusty: I could use some advice on whether or not I should start collecting my Social Security benefits now. I am 67 and 3 months old, and plan to continue working for at least for the next year or two. Signed: Seeking Answers

Dear Seeking: Deciding when to claim Social Security is, indeed, an important decision, as it will affect you for the rest of your life. Mainly, deciding when to claim your SS retirement benefit should consider your financial needs, but your life expectancy and marital status are equally important.

At your current age (past your full retirement age of 66 years & six months) you are already earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) at the rate of .677% higher benefit for each month you continue to delay. That adds up to an additional 8% benefit for each full year you

wait beyond your FRA to claim, and that growth will continue until you are 70 years old. At that point, your benefit will be 28% higher than it would have been at your full retirement age (FRA). If you expect to achieve about "average" life expectancy (about 84 for a man your current age), then waiting until 70 to claim will get you both a higher monthly amount and the most you can get in cumulative lifetime benefits. Waiting, however, only makes sense if you expect at least average longevity. If your health is poor and you have reason to believe you won't live to the "average," then claiming earlier makes more sense. FYI, you may find this tool helpful to determine your potential life expectancy: https://socialsecurityreport. org/tools/life-expectancy-calculator/.

You can, of course, simply delay claiming for as long as you are still working, and then file for benefits at that time. When your paychecks stop is frequently the best time to start your SS benefits (to supplement the lost work income). And, if you are married and your wife will be entitled to a survivor benefit from you, then waiting longer to claim enhances the benefit your surviving spouse receives at your death (your surviving spouse would get your benefit amount, instead of her own smaller amount). If that is a consideration, then waiting - at least until you stop working (or age 70 if feasible) is often a prudent choice.

So, the choice is yours to make, considering your financial needs, life expectancy, and marital status. You no longer need to worry about Social Security's annual earnings test (for those collecting benefits before their FRA) but, if it is financially feasible, waiting still longer will mean a higher monthly benefit for the rest of vour life.

SB 549 Heats Up

Elevate Public Affairs News Release

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The California Gaming Association, California Cardroom Alliance and Communities for California Cardrooms announce growing opposition with many labor unions joining in opposition to Senate Bill 549 by Senator Josh Newman as it could have a "devastating impact on public sector jobs."

Joining in opposition to SB 549 includes the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), California Professional Firefighters, and SEIU California and Teamsters Local 630 as well as a growing number of locals such as AFSCME District Council 36, AFSCME District Council 57, AFSCME Local 101, International Union of Painters and Allied Trades DC 36, Los Angeles County Firefighters Local 1014 and the Los Angeles County Professional Peace Officers Association.

They join a growing number of cities that have filed letters in opposition including California Contract Cities Association, California Cities for Self-Reliance Joint Powers Authority, California Cities Gaming Authority, City of Bell Gardens, Town of Colma, City of Chula Vista, City of Citrus Heights, City of Commerce, City of Compton, City of Emeryville, City of Gardena, City of Hawaiian Gardens, City of Inglewood, City of Oceanside, City of San Jose and City of Tracy.

SB 549 will create a PAGA-like law for gaming tribes to be able to sue their competitors – the cardrooms. This would usurp state regulators and the Attorney General which oversee the legality and permissibility of cardroom games. It would also permit for the first time ever a one-sided injustice as cardrooms would not be allowed to sue tribal casinos. The joint letter opposing SB 549 by these labor unions state: "SB 549 Could Have a Devastating Impact on Public Sector Jobs: SB 549 is an attack on local cardrooms, which are a significant source of revenue for general funds in many cities across California... Many have revenue sharing agreements with municipalities providing a significant amount of funding for essential public services like police, fire, parks and recreation, etc. The measure could easily force cardrooms out of business and result in a loss of \$500 million in tax revenue statewide — meaning less revenue for public safety, public health, homelessness services and infrastructure.

The loss of local tax revenue could spell devastation for many cities across California. For example, approximately 78% of the City of Hawaiian Gardens' general fund comes from cardroom revenues. Similarly, 50% of the City of Commerce's general fund comes from cardroom revenues. Larger cities like San Jose and Fresno would also be seriously impacted. This bill will destabilize essential services.

If signed into law, cities who depend on this revenue stream could be forced into municipal bankruptcy or even disincorporation. This could have potentially devastating impacts that puts jobs, pensions and the financial wellbeing of working families at risk. We have seen this happen before: the Orange County Bankruptcy."

"SB 549 Puts Workers in the Middle: The mere cost of litigation alone could lead to lower wages, loss of jobs or cardroom closures. And cardroom closures could devastate some cities who may have to file for municipal bankruptcy or disincorporate."

A lot of times, these folks will seem like silent partners-which is an oxymoron in small business. They might even present themselves that way in the beginning. But the truth is most people who've put money into your business won't keep silent. They're all going to have different opinions and ideas, and there's a strong possibility these are going to clash at some point with the vision you have for

your company. In short, I would not recommend a fledgling small business, even one that's doing well, to seek out investors. Period. Cash flow your growth, Trey. Cash flow your equipment purchases, and the markets you enter, also. Does this mean you might miss a good opportunity here and there? Sure, it does. But it also means you'll be missing opportunities to fail. Too much success too soon is one of the biggest reasons why small businesses shut down. When you grow too quickly, you run the risk of outgrowing your financial resources, your infrastructure and your human resources.

Do what you can to ensure growth is steady, but play it smart. Don't grow so fast that you crack the foundation of your company.



Fast Food Workers Got a \$20 Minimum Wage, But Is It Working? It's Debatable

Every session of the California Legislature seems to produce at least one bill that generates high-octane political debate and media attention.

As the 2023-24 session winds down this week, Senate Bill 1047, which would impose rules on artificial intelligence developers, is generating fierce lobbying and drawing global interest.

During the final days of last year's session, the focus was on a very different issue — whether the state should impose a \$20-per-hour minimum wage for fast food workers and create a Fast Food Council to oversee working conditions.

A year before, Assembly Bill 257 created the council and empowered it to set an initial minimum wage of at least \$22 an hour, while assuming that franchised fast food outlets were subsidiaries of the parent company, rather than independently owned.

The fast food industry responded with a referendum that, if ratified by voters, would cancel out the new law, thus renewing the debate in the 2023 session. A last-minute deal repealed AB 257 and substituted another measure, AB 1228, that dictated a \$20 minimum wage and removed what the industry considered to be a threat to the franchise system. In return, the referendum was dropped.

The \$20 wage took effect last April, but only after a new squabble erupted over which sellers of food would be covered, colored by a Bloomberg article alleging that Newsom had demanded an exemption to benefit a campaign donor who owns two dozen Panera locations in California.

Newsom declared that the story was "absurd" and gave assurances that Panera and other similar businesses would be covered. The businessman, billionaire Greg Flynn, also said he would honor the \$20 wage.

End of fast food angst? Of course not.

Six months after the \$20 wage took effect there's a new debate in political, media and academic circles over its impact.

Fast food prices have been increasing, but how much higher wages are driving the rise and how fast food operations have changed are two new issues.

This month, Newsom declared that California fast food outlets had created 11,000 new jobs since the law was signed.

"What's good for workers is good for business, and as California's fast food industry continues booming every single month our workers are finally getting the pay they deserve," Newsom said. "Despite those who pedaled lies about how this would doom the industry, California's economy and workers are again proving them wrong."

The industry didn't agree. "Every day you see headlines of restaurant closures, employee job losses and hours cut, and rising food prices for consumers," the International Franchise Association said in a statement. "Local restaurant owners in California are already struggling to cope with the \$20/hour wage, as the Fast Food Council considers additional wage increases. All the while, workers and consumers are feeling the pinch."

Brooke Armour, president of the California Center for Jobs and the Economy, an adjunct of the Business Roundtable, criticized Newsom's declaration as reflecting just one month of preliminary data and concluding, "Despite what some are saying, the data are clear: newly passed fast food minimum wage laws are leading to job losses in California."

Christopher Thornberg, founding partner of Beacon Economics, also was critical in an analysis of the state's economic trends. "California's well-intended push to reduce income inequality via wage floors is beginning to have a significant negative impact on some of our most vulnerable workers — our youth, particularly those from lower income households," Thornberg wrote.

What California has wrought in the fast food industry could be the harbinger of more direct regulation of other industries, and not just in California, for better or worse. It's not surprising, therefore, that its effects will be debated ad nauseam.

sacramento, ca (MPG) - After starting off slowly to begin their season, the Cordova Lady Lancers flag football team earned their first win of the year in convincing fashion with a 42-0 victory at West Campus on Thursday, Aug. 29.

The Lady Lancers (1-5) would score on their second possession of the contest with a nine-yard shovel pass from sophomore quarterback Becca Lee to fellow sophomore running back/wide receiver Sophia Carlson. The barrage of points would continue from there on out against

the Lady Warriors (0-2), with senior safety Mashayla Carter returning an interception back 40 yards for a touchdown midway through the first half. To follow that up, senior safety Layla Ramirez would snag an interception on the ensuing West Campus drive, allowing Lee to connect from one yard out to senior center Saniya Strong for another score. Cordova would enter half-time with a 22-0 advantage that proved to be too much for the Lady Warriors to overcome.

The second half saw much of the same, with Ramirez accumulating two more interceptions on back-to-back West Campus drives, including one returned nearly 60 yards for a touchdown. Ramirez, who tied a team single-game record with three interceptions, also tied for the team lead in tackles with five. She was given the teams' customary "MVP Chain" to wear following the contest, leaving Lady Lancers head coach Garrett Roth eager to heap praise. "She tied the school record in

our short history of three interceptions in one game, and you can't ask for much more from your safety," Roth said.

The scoring in the second half

The scoring in the second half would continue with Lee adding a six-yard touchdown run, as well as a 38-yard touchdown pass to junior wide receiver Taliyah Johnson. Lee would finish an impressive 11-of-16 passing for 116 yards, with three touchdowns and just one interception to go along with her rushing score. Roth has been impressed with his young signal caller in her first season of flag football, and sees a bright future ahead.

"Super impressive," Roth said of Lee. "She's a great player in two other sports already (basketball and softball), and we got her to come out here to play flag football this year. She's about three weeks into playing the sport and she's battling it up with completion percentages rivaling an NFL quarterback. It's

awesome to see."

After the game, the jubilation from the Lady Lancers was evident as high fives and compliments flooded the team huddle. For Roth and his group, getting their first win after some early season struggles was much needed.

"It feels good," he said. "We got the monkey off our back. It feels nice to break the barrier. We had high hopes coming into this one, and we came out and executed well. I'm more proud of their effort today than anything." Cordova hosts visiting Del Campo at 6 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 10 inside Lancers Stadium.

This expressway project stands as a testament to how public infrastructure can create equitable opportunities for individuals and enhance the region's quality of life. income. It will save commuters between \$500 million and \$1.5 billion in travel time over 20 years compared to using current roadways.

The Capital SouthEast Connector Expressway is a shining example of what can be achieved through collaboration, determination, and hard work. The project's impor-

tance was highlighted recently when it received a \$25 million federal RAISE grant. The RAISE program—Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity—recognizes projects that contribute to evenhanded outcomes, especially for communities that have historically been underserved.

The RAISE funds will be used to reconstruct a section of Grant Line Road and correct deadly curves and elevations that obstruct the view of oncoming traffic. Longstanding drainage issues that currently cause flooding and hinder first responders during emergencies will also be fixed.

From an environmental standpoint, the SouthEast Connector Expressway has been designed from its inception to avoid negative environmental impacts where possible, and the modern design will eliminate many negative environmental impacts from the roadway's current structure.

In partnership with the South Sacramento Habitat Conservation Plan, the project is designed to ensure the long-term viability of area plant and wildlife species while

preserving agricultural and ranch land.

When completed, the Capital SouthEast Connector will reduce greenhouse gases, pollutant emissions, vehicle miles traveled, and regional congestion. The project has obtained environmental permits and has agreed to purchase lands to replace impacted agricultural land or vernal pools.

What is the Capital SouthEast Connector **Expressway?**

The planned Connector is an expressway that will link Interstate 5 and Highway 99 near Elk Grove to Highway 50 in El Dorado County. The new expressway will relieve congestion by directing commuter and commercial traffic around the city on a safe expressway. Travelers to and from areas south of Sacramento will no longer need to go through the city to get to their destinations. The Capital SouthEast Connector Expressway also features a parallel bike and pedestrian trail.

Who will benefit from the SouthEast Connector **Expressway when complet-**

The entire region will A the entire region will benefit from reduced congestion on area highways, particularly Hwy 50, and from fewer toxic fumes spewing from thousands of vehicles stuck in traffic. Southeastern Sacramento County residents will have a safe new route to avoid Hwy 50 congestion and bypass downtown traffic. Businesses, companies, farmers, and ranchers will also be able to receive supplies and send products to market more safely and quickly. Most importantly, the modernized roadway will be safe to travel, unlike current conditions that endanger lives.

Who approved building the SouthEast Connector

A In 2004, by a 3-1 margin, voters agreed to tax themselves for 30 years for transportation maintenance, road improvements, mass transit, mobility for seniors and people with disabilities, and

specifically to construct a new expressway connecting I-5 and Hwy 99 in the Elk Grove area to Hwy 50 in El Dorado County, now known as the Capital SouthEast Connector. Since the vote, the tax has generated about \$2 billion. To date, the Capital SouthEast Connector has received about \$58 million of those funds, which were paired with federal and state funds to complete 11 miles of the 34-mile project.

Where have the transportation tax funds not allocated to the Capital SouthEast Connector been used?

A The transportation sales tax funds are allocated according to a formula voters approved when they approved the tax. The largest single recipient of the funds since the tax began is the Regional Transit Authority (38%, amounting to \$709 million) for operating and maintaining light rail and bus services; and providing transportation options to seniors and individuals with disabilities. Street and road maintenance projects have received 29.4%, amounting to \$545.5 million. Overall, capital improvement projects have received 20.4%, amounting to \$377.4 million. The rest of the funds went to smaller projects, and less than 34 of one percent is spent on program administration.

A The Capital SouthEast Connector is part of the "Sacramento Blueprint," adopted over 20 years ago by SACOG's board of directors and still consulted today. The Blueprint's goal is to integrate land use and transportation planning to improve the region's quality of life. It was SACOG's idea to create the Capital SouthEast Connector Joint Powers Authority to manage the design and construction of the expressway. Over the years, SACOG has been mostly supportive of efforts to advance the project, and SACOG recently determined that constructing a segment of the project was the region's number one transportation priority, greatly enhancing a successful project application for federal funding.

QWhat environmental impacts will the South-**East Connector Expressway** create, and how will they be mitigated?

Like any road project, the ACapital SouthEast Connector will affect the environment during and after construction, but all federal, state, and local regulations to protect the environment are being followed. After construction, the environment will be greatly enhanced due to a design that controls and channels damaging groundwater that currently floods the roadway and adjacent lands. The Connector Joint Powers Authority is a member of the South Sacramento

Conservation Agency (SCCA) that oversees compliance with the South Sacramento Habitat Conservation Plan and its rules for road construction. The Connector project has obtained environmental permits and has also agreed to purchase lands to replace impacted agricultural land or vernal pools in accordance with the conservation plan's vision.

How will the Capital SouthEast Connector affect bike and pedestrian traffic in the area?

Bicyclists and pedestrians A who currently face grave danger will be able to avoid traffic entirely by using a paved, Class 1 bike trail that will be built separate from the expressway along its entire length. The bike trail is designed to enable residents to walk or ride their bikes to visit friends in neighboring communities; or peddle to work, local restaurants, stores, parks,

and entertainment venues; or simply to exercise and enjoy the outdoors.


