CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The Kiwanis Club of Carmichael has donated \$7,500 to aid drama studies at El Camino High School.

"The money will help us create a theater-like space where students can be comfortable performing," said El Camino High Drama Department director Mike DiSalvo. "It's important they see we're taking them seriously. That way, they're motivated to take their studies more seriously."

The project aims to simulate "black box theater" elements in the classroom. Upgrades include new paint, curtains, lighting and a small stage. Funding came about

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Start practicing your chicken calls because it's almost time to celebrate the 19th Annual Fair Oaks Chicken Festival from 12 to 6 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 21 at Fair Oaks Park (11549 Fair Oaks Blvd.).

Presented by the Fair Oaks Recreation & Park District, this year's event promises to be bigger and better than ever, with activities and entertainment the whole family can enjoy.

"The Fair Oaks Chicken Festival is a beloved tradition that celebrates the culture and charm of Fair Oaks and brings the community together in a fun and unique way," said Recreation supervisor and festival chair Sabrina Bernardo. "The family-friendly atmosphere promotes a sense of pride that keeps people coming back year after year."

With attendance numbers ranging between 9,000 and 10,000, organizing an event this size is no small feat. According to Bernardo, festival planning begins a year in advance and requires an extensive network of volunteers.

"Our volunteers help make the Fair Oaks Chicken Festival happen," said Recreation supervisor Mary Stoakley. "Whether assisting in the kid's park, helping out with parking, or welcoming event attendees at the entrance, they make a huge difference!"

The Fair Oaks Youth Advisory Board is one of the many volunteer service groups participating.

"The youth group serves in an advisory capacity to the Fair Oaks Recreation & Park District's Board of Directors and assumes responsibility for certain activities throughout the year, including the Fair Oaks Chicken Festival," Stockley said.

"The students will sell cold water bottles at the event for \$2. The funds raised will support their activities throughout this



One is to provide for our families. That's our primary job. The second reason is to exercise our calling the reason we were put on this planet. But you can't accomplish the second one when you're not doing the first one. You've got to make sure your family has a place to live and food on the table.

Hoover, Niello Talk about Concerns

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A crowd of more than 200 gathered at Bella Vista High School on Tuesday Sept. 3 for a community meeting featuring Assemblyman Josh Hoover and Sen. Roger Niello. The event provided citizens with an opportunity to hear firsthand updates from the Capitol and ask questions regarding their concerns.

Hoover and Niello offered a range of legislative updates, focusing on issues such as homelessness and crime. Hoover emphasized recent legislative efforts aimed at improving oversight of homelessness spending.

"AB 2903 was passed, which requires state-run homelessness programs to report cost and outcome data annually to the California Interagency Council on Homelessness," Hoover said. "This transparency is crucial, especially after recent audits revealed a lack of systematic tracking."

Hoover also highlighted his support for legislation protecting vulnerable children from sex trafficking. Senate Bill 1414, he noted, aims to increase penalties for purchasing children under 16 for sex from a misdemeanor to a felony.

Niello addressed the shift in legislative focus toward public safety.

"We are seeing a significant change in how crime is approached in the legislature," Niello said. "Many new bills have been proposed and passed to enhance public safety."

The meeting featured a Q&A session where attendees voiced concerns and sought clarification on various topics

When asked about AB 1840, a home purchase assistance program, Hoover and Niello responded to concerns about aid for non-citizens.

"This program is intended

to help California residents with down-payment assistance," Hoover said. "I do not support expanding this to non-citizens."

Niello agreed, "I would like the author of that bill to explain to people that apply and don't ger the assistance

when a non-citizen does."

Equal access to education also drew attention as frustrations were brought up by attendees over educational disparities affecting unvaccinated students and concerns over Zoom schools. Hoover acknowledged the issue, citing the long-term harm caused by prolonged school closures during the pandemic and Niello emphasized the importance of local politics, advocating for school districts making decisions.

"I will continue to fight for quality education for all students," Hoover affirmed.

Business owners raised concerns about difficulty accessing grant money. Niello directed them to Go Biz, the state agency handling business grants, while Hoover acknowledged the state's budget challenges.

"We need to better manage our finances to support small businesses," Hoover said.

Residents also expressed frustration with the poor condition of local roads and the lack of investment in street maintenance. They emphasized how the neglect of street upkeep negatively impacts property values and diminishes the pride they take in their homes.

In response, Hoover agreed, noting that California's roads are ranked 46th in quality, despite the state's high gas taxes.

"Funds meant for road maintenance are often redirected to other priorities," Hoover explained. "We should not be taking money from our roads; our community deserves better."

Niello added that the state's broad approach to transportation funding often undermines the ability to

undermines the ability to allocate resources effectively.
"The policies compromise

our ability to focus funds where they're needed most,"

Niello said. In respon tions about homelessness enforcement, the Sheriff's Department emphasized the importance of promoting transitory movements rather than allowing large, stationary encampments in efforts to reduce criminal activity. The department also highlighted the role of the Homeless Outreach Team (HOT), which focuses on connecting homeless individuals with essential

resources and support.

When asked about the implications of the governor's plan to return state workers to the office, including potential costs related to utilities, traffic, pollution, and employee expenses, opinions differed.

"Working from home can be more cost-effective for both the state and employees," Hoover said. "It also helps keep spending within our local economy."

In contrast, Niello emphasized the importance of in-person collaboration.

"While remote work has its benefits, face-to-face interactions are crucial for developing efficient and cohesive work groups," Niello Said.

When questioned about

the alarming increase in hitand-run incidents and the high number of fatalities, Niello expressed his strong concern. He attributed the rise in reckless driving and speeding to the habits formed during the COVID-19 pandemic when streets were less congested.

were less congested.

"We need to increase the consequences for speeding,"
Niello asserted, highlighting that improving traffic safety remains a critical priority

for him.

Delores "Dee," affectionately known as "Dolly" by her friends and family, passed away peacefully on the morning of August 14th, 2024, surrounded by the love and care of her family.

Born in Hannaford, North

Dakota, on October 9, 1936, Dee was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, entrepreneur, and adventurer. Her life was a testament to joy, love, and passion. As the eldest of 10 children, Dee was a natural leader who inspired those around her from an early age. Dee's strong work ethic was evident from her youth, earning her an honors scholarship to Western Montana College of Education in Dillon. In 1956, Dee married Donald Rouse, and together they moved between Anaconda, Montana, and various cities in Idaho and Utah, chasing their dreams and building a future. Dee held leadership positions throughout her career, including Deputy County Treasurer in Anaconda, and she achieved success in sales for several large jewelry companies.

The couple's adventurous spirit led them to manage a property in Nevada, where Dee honed her skills as an independent business owner. She bought and sold land and raw materials for fine jewelry, all while hosting events for local families and children. After traveling the Western states in an RV with their children, they settled in Sacramento, California. Here, Dee opened several businesses,



including D's Jewelry Supply in Carmichael and Nighthorse Studios in Old Sacramento. Her entrepreneurial drive culminated in the founding of the California Institute of Jewelry Training (CIJT) in 1979, which trained over 3,500 students from across the globe in jewelry design, manufacture, and repair. Dee also added the Master Valuer (MV) appraisal program, a curriculum still used today.

Dee's leadership extended to her role as the first woman president of the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce. Dee also served as president of the Sacramento Chamber of Commerce. After separating from Donald in 1976, Dee met Lieutenant Colonel Mel Huth in 1987. The two married in 1990. Dee purchased Bramble's Fine Jewelry and the couple opened the Arden Town Mail & Business Center together. Their businesses became cornerstones of their community. Dee's work included global travel, helping to establish jewelry trade schools and offering Master Valuer workshops in multiple

Dee was a force of nature, full of love, laughter, and

generosity. She was a gifted hostess, always at the center of celebrations, and had a remarkable ability to bring out the best in everyone around her. Her love for her family was immense, and she found her greatest joy as a grandmother, affectionately known as "Gramma Dee," or "Grandma Barbie." She cherished her 11 grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren.

Dee is survived by her hus-



California Has Spent Billions on Homelessness but Lacks Hard Data on Outcomes

California has allocated more than \$20 billion to alleviate the state's homelessness crisis since Gavin Newsom became governor in 2019, but there's precious little data on how the money was spent and what effect it's had, other than the number of unhoused people has contin-

ued to climb. Despite the absence of hard information, Newsom has been highly critical of what he characterizes as the shortcomings of local governments and has threatened to withhold funds from those deemed to be laggards. Local officials, in turn, say they cannot construct comprehensive, long-term strategies unless Newsom is willing to make multi-year commitments of financial support.

Earlier this year, state Auditor Grant Parks issued a harshly worded audit of the California Interagency Council on Homelessness, the Newsom administration's tool for coordinating homelessness programs.

"The state lacks current information on the ongoing costs and outcomes of its homelessness programs, because (the council) has not consistently tracked and evaluated the state's efforts to prevent and end homelessness," Parks wrote, adding that its most recent data is three years old.

Moreover, Parks said, the

council "has also not aligned its action plan to end homelessness with its statutory goals to collect financial information and ensure accountability and results. Thus, it lacks assurance that the actions it takes will effectively enable it to achieve those goals."

It's rather cheeky for Newsom to blame local officials if his own agency has been so laggard in gathering information about where billions of dollars have been spent and how effective those expenditures have been.

The footdragging on data, however, is not confined to the state.

Since 2020, David O. Carter, a federal judge in Los Angeles, has been presiding over a lawsuit filed by the LA Alliance for Human Rights, a coalition of persons from businesses, neighborhoods and homeless groups demanding to know how officials in Los Angeles County have spent homelessness funds. He's angry about a lack of response from the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority.

"If there isn't documentation of the work being done, it's not being done. That can be our only conclusion," Carter said during a recent hearing, telling agency officials, "You're not working on your time frame now. You're working on mine."

Matthew Umhofer, an attorney for the LA Alliance for Human Rights, said, "The city and the county have been saying for decades they're trying really hard on homelessness, but we have to see results.

"An audit like this is a tool that helps us try and figure this out, but at the end of the day we need more beds," Umhofer added. "We

need more services. If the city and county don't know where the documentation is that shows beds and services are being provided, we've got a massive problem."

Umhofer said that if the situation doesn't improve, Judge Carter can impose sanctions on the city and county, appoint a receiver or even assume control of homelessness services.

Meanwhile, back in Sacramento, the quest for hard information on homelessness has taken a baby step forward.

Before adjourning its 2024 session, the Legislature approved a bill that would direct state agencies that administer homelessness programs to annually file reports on spending and outcomes to Newsom's interagency council, which then would be required to make the information available to the public.

Assemblyman Josh Hoover, a Folsom Republican, carried Assembly Bill 2903, which implements one of the Parks audit's recommendations.

"Improving accountability over the dollars we are spending is the first step toward real reform," Hoover said in a statement. "Spending billions of taxpayer dollars only to make the crisis worse is the definition of failure."

That should be obvious. Now we'll see if Newsom signs the bill.

year, and if Alex Len can take just one more step, I believe this 1st round draft choice from 2013 could finally live up to the potential that so many pundits believed that he had when originally drafted. I like Len's game, and his effort is

unquestionable. He acquits himself well when Sabonis needs a breather, and if he can take that next step, I can see moments when he and Sabonis are on the court together. If I haven't yet mentioned your favorite

player, dark horses like Colby Jones, Jordan McLaughlin, Boogie Ellis, or newcomers Orlando Robinson and Isaiah Crawford are waiting in the wings to make their presence known. Just as Keon Ellis emerged last season,

one of these players is waiting to show the Sacramento Kings fans that they deserve some accolades, and it will surprise me if I'm not surprised by one the aforementioned candidates. Let's not forget that we haven't even

mentioned Kings' top draft choice Devin Carter, and although he is scheduled to miss the first half of the upcoming season, Devin no doubt will be eagerly awaiting his opportunity to show the Sacramento fans why this 22-year-old was drafted #13 overall.



Guaranteed Income Pilot Applications Opening

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Department of Child, Family and Adult Services (DCFAS) has partnered with United Way California Capital Region for a new Guaranteed Income Pilot called the Family First Economic Support Pilot.

The pilot gives qualifying families guaranteed payments of \$725 a month for a year. Applications will open on Sept. 30. Two hundred applicants will be randomly selected from those who apply. United Way will contact those selected for the pilot to discuss the next steps and to verify eligibility.


To qualify, families must live in one of the following zip codes: 95815, 95821, 95823, 95825, 95828, and 95838. Applicants must be either the parent or legal guardian of a Black/African American, American Indian, or Alaska Native child and have a child who is between the ages of 0 and 5. Applicants must have an annual household income of less than 200% of the federal poverty line. To qualify, the families cannot be part of any other Guaranteed Income Pilot/ Program.

Applications can be completed online at https://ffesp.

The purpose of the Family First Economic Support Pilot is to offer additional income to help eligible families in the focus zip codes. Data shows that African American/Black and American Indian/Alaska Native children experience higher rates of contact with the child welfare system compared to other ethnicities.

The Family First Economic Support Pilot is primarily funded through state grant money. Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services partnered with a research organization, MEF Associates, to evaluate how the guaranteed income impacts the selected families.


