

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A day filled with fun, science, hot dogs and aviation excitement captivated more than 700 attendees at the California Capital Airshow's 'Destination Aviation' STEM event on Sept. 21 at Mather Airport, local youth explored career opportunities in aviation and other STEM fields. The event, held in partnership with Women in Aviation International, had a series of engaging activities and discussions. "We have a lot of different programs that we weren't able to do this summer, so we decided to combine some of those topics and career opportunities into something called destination aviation," said California Capital Airshow Executive Director Darcy Brewer. "We thought, let's invite a couple hundred kids and show them what's possible. What we found in our programming, which we have been doing for about 14 years now, is that it's about the people you meet and you talk to that inspire you and show you how to find your way." California Capital Airshow aims to provide education, exposure and access through engaging, year-round events focused on STEM, aviation and aerospace, all designed to empower the region's future workforce, as stated on its website at californiacapitalairshow.com. The day featured a panel discussion with some of the nation's leading professionals in the aviation and aerospace sectors. Panelists included Lt. Col. Merryl Tengesdal, the first Black female U-2 Dragon Lady pilot in the U.S. Air Force; Elizabeth Lewis, PhD, a space engineer at X-bow Systems; Manu Mann, an artificial intelligence expert at Micron; and Ryan Bankerd, who specializes in sustainable fuels at UPS. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Soroptimist International of Rancho Cordova and Gold River club spent a day at the Gold River Mountain Mike’s Pizza to stuff 200 Comfort Kits.

The Soroptimist International of Rancho Cordova & Gold River club has members from Carmichael, Citrus Heights, Gold River, Lincoln Village, Anatolia, Mather, Rosemont, Rancho Cordova, Sacramento and Natomas.

Gold River Mountain Mike’s Pizza donated the use of its party room for free.

A Comfort Kit is a zippered heavy duty tote bag filled with a 30-day supply of personal hygiene items and light 50x60" blanket to be given to domestic violence and trafficking survivors.

“We had over 30 community volunteers, students and even a Rancho Cordova pageant queen help us stuff each tote bag. We reserved the Mountain Mike’s party room for four hours but were able to stuff all 200 tote bags in just 45 minutes, because we had so many incredible volunteers,” said Soroptimist Vice-President Sheryl Longworth.

Originally, the intention was to have the Rancho Cordova Police Department give a Comfort Kit to a survivor during domestic violence calls. Unfortunately, that arrangement didn’t work as hoped, due to an unforeseen logistical issue, according to Soroptimist members.

A representative from the Sacramento Family Justice Center (SFJC) talked during a Soroptimist club business meeting on the services that the center provides. After the presentation, the Soroptimists decided to make Sacramento Family Justice Center a new distribution partner. The Sacramento Family Justice Center agreed and a partnership was born.

Soroptimist members delivered most of its Comfort Kits to the Sacramento Family Justice Center and, in a matter of weeks, the kits were handed out to grateful domestic violence, sexual assault and trafficking survivors. Now the Soroptimists are making more Comfort Kits. In District 1, American River, current Mayor David M. Sander, Ph.D. is running for reelection unopposed.

In District 3, Lincoln Village, candidates include Chris Mann, Sergiy Pronin, Amber Verdugo and Joe Little.

Chris Mann highlighted the need for community resources.

“We have an old community in Lincoln Village; people don’t have a voice,” Mann said. “Street safety and homelessness are both big concerns for me. We also need better infrastructure for parks.”

Fellow District 3 candidate Pronin, an immigrant from Ukraine, expressed his vision for a “city up the hill.”

“I want to make the life of our residents more comfortable and happier,” Pronin said. “My goals will be to keep the city safe and clean, the prosperity of our residents, making our city more attractive to young families and encouraging business development.”

Verdugo and Little were not present at the meeting.

District 4 candidates include Siri Pulipati and Leroy Tripette.

Pulipati, the current vice-mayor, stressed the importance of education, economic development and ensuring public safety.

Her opponent, Leroy Tripette, current Planning Commissioner, emphasized his commitment to making a family-friendly city focusing on recreational options for all, education and housing.

The candidates for Folsom Cordova Unified School District Trustee

District 4 include Chris Clark and Madeline Sanderson.

Clark, serving in this position for eight years, emphasized he has been “accountable, accessible and visible” advocating for social justice, quality education and safe learning facilities.

Sanderson, a Rancho Cordova native, called for increased resources for local schools.

“We need to give parents a real voice, make schools safer, have effective technical programs, raise academic standards and give everyone access to the same quality facilities,” Sanderson said.

Elk Grove Unified School District Area 7 candidates are Carmine Forcina, Heidi Moore and Rehana Rehman.

Both Moore and Rehman addressed school safety and parental involvement. Moore stressed the importance of high-quality education, while Rehman highlighted the need for representation and advocacy for all students.

Forcina was not present at the meeting

The luncheon also featured a three-minute presentation on Folsom Cordova Bond Measure R and S, each seeking to raise \$144 million for elementary schools and middle/high school upgrades.

“We are asking the residents of Rancho Cordova to step up for us one more time and vote for these bonds,” said Folsom Cordova Board member Jennifer Laret. “We have big dreams for our schools and we know our kids could really use this funding.”

“We want elections and government to be civic conversations, and I think today was a perfect example of what we want to strive for,” said Blanchard. “The diversity of candidates is amazing.”

Campaign Whistlestop returns at 11:30 a.m. on Oct. 18 with candidates for California Assembly District 7 and Cordova Recreation and Park District’s 3 and 4 at Rancho Cordova City Hall. ★

Sacramento Woman Indicted for Fraudulent Investment Scheme

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned a 32-count indictment against Maria Dickerson, also known as Dulce Pino, 47, of Sacramento, charging her with 24 counts of wire fraud, one count of securities fraud, and seven counts of money laundering, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced. The indictment was unsealed following her arrest.

According to the indictment, from 2020 through 2024, Dickerson created an investment scheme, selling interest in her illusory shell company, Creative Legal Fundings of California, to investors. Dickerson promised investors that their investments were safe and secure and backed by substantial starting capital. Dickerson promised approximately 140 investors a fixed percent of return per month on their principal investment with additional compounding monthly interest if they left their money invested with her.

In reality, Dickerson used new investor money to pay off prior investors, to fund a lavish lifestyle, and to purchase Mercedes-Benz vehicles and a home in Sacramento. Dickerson did not register the sale of her securities with the Securities and Exchange Commission. Dickerson took money from investors and collected millions of dollars in

investment funds solicited with her false promises and representations.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and IRS Criminal Investigation, with assistance from the Alabama Securities Commission. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Kristin F. Scott and Rosanne L. Rust are prosecuting the case.

The Securities and Exchange Commission is filing a parallel action against Dickerson. The Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency of the California Department of Financial Protection and Innovation previously filed a Desist and Refrain Order against Dickerson.

If convicted, Dickerson faces a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine for each count of wire fraud. Additionally, she faces a maximum statutory penalty of 10 years in prison and a fine of \$250,000 for each count of money laundering. On the securities fraud charge, Dickerson faces a statutory maximum penalty of 20 years in prison and a fine of up to \$5 million. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt. ★

Wrap-around Services Positively Impact Youth

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The dedicated efforts of Sacramento County’s Division of Behavioral Health Services (BHS), in partnership with community-based providers, continue to positively impact youth with High Fidelity Wraparound (HFW) Services. Zavion and Serenity are two inspiring teens whose stories exemplify how support services can positively change lives.

Think of Sacramento County’s High Fidelity Wraparound Services, more commonly referred to as the Wraparound Program, as a personalized support system that helps kids and families when they are most vulnerable. It’s a team of caring professionals who “wrap” around these youth and their families during tough times.

Whether it’s to help foster youth or youth who have been involved with law enforcement, or providing a family with the tools they need to stay together, the Wraparound Program makes a real difference.

For Zavion, he faced more challenges than many could even imagine. He frequently encountered obstacles that left him feeling lost and uncertain about his future at a young age. With the help of the Wraparound Program, he found the strength to turn his life around.

“You know, I’ve been through some really rough times, but I got through it by challenging myself,” said Zavion with a sense of accomplishment while reflecting on his journey. “It’s been rough, but I’ve accomplished something.”

Zavion completed his high school credits, graduated and was recently offered an internship at a wellness center where he now supports other young people in his community. This fall, he’s preparing for a new milestone – starting community college.

Serenity’s story is equally inspiring. She was initially referred to the Wraparound Program with significant challenges, including a difficult home environment and struggles with aggression but embraced the help offered to her. She quickly dove deep into therapy and learned new ways to cope, and her hard work paid off.

Serenity graduated from high school early and earned a scholarship to a college in Vermont. She has volunteered her time

at a wellness center, traveled to Africa and is writing a book about her experiences to share with others who might be facing similar challenges.

“It is gratifying to watch these kids get the opportunity to change the trajectory of their futures,” said Brian Olden, Wraparound Program Monitor for Sacramento County. “Zavion and Serenity illustrate the combined effort of clients who make good use of services, as well as the dedication, persistence, and hard work of the providers who steadfastly adhere to the HFW principles.”

Much of the success seen with Sacramento County’s High Fidelity Wraparound services comes from its focus on giving families a voice in their care, working collaboratively with other services and supporting children in stable, loving environments. To help keep kids from bouncing around from home to home, the Wraparound Program’s primary objective is stability and permanency, which reduces the need for group home placements and institutional care.

Sacramento County partners with, and funds contracts for, three local non-profit agencies to provide High Fidelity Wraparound Services – River Oak Center for Children, Sacramento Children’s Home and Stanford Sierra Youth and Families.

In addition to Probation and Child Welfare, Behavioral Health Services and wraparound provider agencies collaborate with various child-serving systems and individuals including schools, regional centers and health care providers.

Child Protective Services (CPS) and Sacramento Probation departments refer youth to the Wraparound Program. With the referral, Behavioral Health Services County staff coordinate the implementation of care and together all agencies work to ensure every child has a chance to thrive.

An estimated 90% of youth are referred by Child Protective Services and 10% by probation. Not all families and youth referred are ready to engage but the impact of Sacramento County’s High Fidelity Wraparound Services remains clear. In the last quarter of Fiscal Year 2023 - 2024, 80% of the youth who completed the program were able to successfully move forward, ready to embrace a brighter future.

Assembly Republicans Announce Legislation to Bring Down Gas Prices

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As Californians continue to struggle with the highest gas prices in the nation and Gov. Newsom jams Legislative Democrats with a dangerous scheme that will drive costs even higher, Assembly Republicans have introduced a series of bills aimed at providing immediate and long-term relief for drivers across the state.

This package, which includes measures to suspend the gas tax without impacting transportation projects, increase transparency on price-setting, and curb overregulation, stands in stark contrast to Governor Gavin Newsom’s politically motivated and incomplete proposals.

“Through six years in office, Gavin Newsom has completely failed to bring down the cost of gas and California drivers have paid the price. This special session is just one more attempt by Newsom to distract from his role in driving up gas prices,” said Assembly Republican Leader James Gallagher (Yuba City). “While Democrats fall in line behind a scheme that Newsom’s own administration says could increase gas prices, Assembly Republicans have a common-sense plan to give drivers relief.”

The Republican bill package includes:

- Exempt Gas from Cap-and-Trade (ABX2-3 – James Gallagher): California’s Cap-and-Trade program adds roughly 30 cents to the cost of a gallon of gas. This bill would exempt gas from the program, allow out-of-state gas imports, and permit an earlier switch to winter-blend fuel to help reduce seasonal price spikes.
- Suspend the Gas Tax (ABX2-2 – Lackey): Despite having some of the worst roads in the country, Californians pay the highest gas tax. This bill would suspend the gas tax for one year, lowering gas prices by over 60 cents per gallon. It provides immediate relief for working families, with no transportation projects being cut or delayed—all will continue to be funded by existing state revenue.
- Increase Transparency on Gasoline Prices (ABX2-7 – Dixon): While Gov. Newsom blames “price gouging” for high gas prices without evidence, this bill requires the California Energy Commission to regularly update a public dashboard. The

dashboard will compare California’s gas prices to national averages and show the impact of state taxes and regulations. This measure gives Californians the transparency they need to understand what’s really driving up fuel costs.

- Stop Newsom’s Stealth Gas Tax Increase (ABX2-4 – Joe Patterson): California’s Low Carbon Fuel Standard is already adding 11 cents per gallon to our gas prices, and a planned update by an unelected board could add another 52 cents. This bill would block this increase and protect family budgets from skyrocketing fuel costs.
- \$100 Rebate for Drivers to Offset Rising Fuel Costs (ABX2-5 – Lackey): California’s Cap-and-Trade program raises costs, with much of the revenue diverted to wasteful projects like High-Speed Rail. This bill would return a portion of those funds to drivers through a \$100 rebate to help offset rising fuel costs.
- Boost Energy Independence and Lower Fuel Costs for Californians (Lackey): Gavin Newsom’s war on California energy production is adding tens of millions of dollars to our fuel prices. This bill would fast-track drilling approvals, boosting California’s energy independence and reducing reliance on oil from countries with poor environmental and human rights practices.
- Cut Red Tape to Expand California’s Storage Projects (ABX2-6 – Lackey): While Newsom is pushing refiners to store more gasoline, his scheme does nothing to actually increase California’s fuel storage capacity. This bill would remove obstacles and reduce the costs associated with building new gas storage projects needed to accommodate Newsom’s proposed mandate.

During Gov. Newsom’s six years in office, gas prices have risen nearly \$1.50 per gallon, have repeatedly broken records and are substantially higher than in neighboring states. A bipartisan coalition throughout the Western U.S. is opposed to Newsom’s fuel storage mandate, with the Governors of Arizona and Nevada urging Newsom to reconsider his plan.

An analysis of Newsom’s proposal by the California Energy Commission found it has the potential to “artificially create shortages in downstream markets” and “increase average prices.” ★

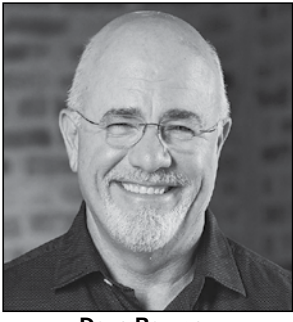

and your wife are having to deal with this kind of situation.

The Social Security system in this country is a mathematical failure. But that doesn’t mean I’m not going to take my money when I deserve it. The government took it from me in the first place, so I don’t have a problem with accepting something I’ve already paid into.

Now, I’ll throw out a warning here. Sometimes when people start receiving unemployment benefits, it causes them to take their foot off the gas. The idea that “free” money is coming in can help them rationalize sitting at home on the couch, instead of working hard to find another job and being extra careful with their finances. I’m not hearing that kind of mentality from you, though. And it’s obvious you and your wife have been pretty smart with your finances.

One more thing I’d suggest is making sure you look at your severance package as survival money only. Make a strict budget and stick to it. Cut out all excess spending. That means no eating out, vacations or anything like

that until you’re working again and everything’s back on solid ground. Right now, focus on covering your Four Walls. By that, I mean food, utilities, shelter and transportation. Feed your family, keep the electricity on, pay the mortgage and put enough gas in the car to get where you need to go.

Everyone hits a rough stretch of road in life from time to time, Brandt. But you two are in a position to handle it better than most. Just remember what got you to such a good place with your finances in the first place. The discipline muscle is already there, and it’s strong. Just flex it, and it’ll help get you through this and back on your feet again!

Kings Korner

For the true basketball fan this time of year is challenging. There are only so many reruns or NBA classics you can watch, and other sports can be a sober replacement if you’re anticipating the upcoming Kings season.

With the acquisition of DeMar DeRozan, many fans are already drawing comparisons of this year’s team from those of the past.

The 2001/2002 Sacramento Kings will never be forgotten, and many believe it was the best overall in Sacramento Kings history.

Names like Mike Bibby, Chris Webber and Vlade Divac come to mind and were the cornerstone players from a team that won a franchise record 61 games. Great players for sure, but how do the big three from that storied team compare with those from our current roster. Let’s see if the stats can shed some light.

In the post, Vlade Divac, albeit a shade past his prime at age 32, turned in 30 minutes per game, scored 11.1 points, grabbed 8.3 rebounds and added 2.9 assists.

Our current big man is none other than Domantas Sabonis, in his prime at age 28. Domantas was on the hardwood for an average of 35 minutes per game, scored 19.4 points, led the NBA in rebounding with 13.7 boards per game, and added a team high 8.2 assists. All this is in addition to leading the league in double-double and triple-doubles for the season.

No comparison here. Sabonis wins in a landslide.

Chris Webber becomes the most difficult matchup for the current Kings as he represents the missing piece that the current team has been looking for, a true power forward.

Chris’ stats are largely why the 2001/2002 team garnished 61 wins.

Chris was on the court each game for just over 38 minutes, scored 24.5 points, secured 10.1 rebounds, and added 4.8 assists. Seasons like this and gaudy stats like these would go on to put Chris Webber in the NBA hall of fame.

Without a true power forward, the current team would have to pose Keegan Murray as the comparison player.

In his second season Keegan logged just under 34 minutes per game. He averaged 15.2 points per game, 5.5 rebounds and 1.7 assists.

No contest here, Chris Webber wins

going away.

So, let’s examine the point guards. From the past the 2001/2002 team was led by fan favorite Mike Bibby.

Mike turned in 33 minutes per game, scored 13.7 points on average each contest, secured 2.8 rebounds, and added five assists.

The current Sacramento Kings are led by De’Aaron Fox. Last season De’Aaron led the team in scoring with 26.6 points per game, pulled down a career high 4.6 rebounds, and dished out 5.6 assists per contest.

Not even close, and as much as I loved Mike Bibby, De’Aaron wins this comparison hands down.

It can be argued that the 2001/2002 team had one of the most potent benches of all-time, and few would argue that Bobby Jackson, Doug Christie and Scot Pollard represented a bench any coach would be proud of.

Their combined bench stats were 29.5 point per game, 14.8 rebounds, and 6.9 assists.

The current team would counter with Malik Monk, Trey Lyles, and Davion Mitchell.

The 2023/2024 team produced 27.9 points per game, 8.6 rebounds, and 8.2 assists per contest.

The edge goes to the 2001/2002 Kings team, but the stats were closer than I expected.

Last season Kevin Huerter was a starter, but with the addition of De’Mar De’Rozan, it is likely that Kevin will be relegated to the bench where I expect to see him add some scoring power that will undoubtedly strengthen the bench overall.


I hope you enjoyed this walk down memory lane and comparing stats.

As much as I thoroughly enjoyed the team from yesteryear, I am excited beyond measure for what the Kings are about to present this season. Just a few short weeks from pre-season games and then the real fun begins.

As with every season, health will be a key component, but as you consider what the 2001/2002 team did in winning 61 games, we should all be imagining what the win total will look like this year!

Social Security Matters

Should my Husband File and then Suspend His Benefits?

Dear Rusty: My financial advisor used a computer program which told my husband to take his SS at age 68, then suspend it after a few months. What I understood was if my husband started and then stopped taking distributions, he would earn delayed retirement credits and thus get more at age 70. I know waiting increases SS amounts, by 8% a year, but does purposely starting and then stopping SS increase distributions even more?

Signed: Confused
Dear Confused: Suspending receipt of one's SS benefits after their FRA (as in your husband's case) does result in him earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs), but the DRCs earned accumulate at the same rate as

if he simply waited longer to claim his SS benefit in the first place. DRCs are earned up to 70 years of age, at which point your husband's maximum SS benefit is attained (FYI, DRCs earn .667% of additional benefit for each month benefits are delayed or suspended, or 8% per year). But I see no advantage to your husband starting his benefits now (at 68) and then suspending them several months later to earn DRCs – the number of DRCs earned are the same in either case, so he could simply wait to apply for his Social Security benefits until he is 70 to get his maximum amount.

The only rationale I can think of to claim and then suspend after doing so is to get a few months of his benefit payments before suspending. But the few months he received benefits before suspending will be considered when he later unsuspends his benefit, so that his total payment amount will be a bit less at 70 than it would otherwise be if he simply waits longer to claim SS. And, just for information, he can't "file and suspend" his benefits so that you can receive a spousal benefit

from him. That option (to file and suspend, enabling a spouse to receive benefits) was eliminated by the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015 - while your husband's benefits are suspended, you cannot receive a spousal benefit from him.

So, frankly, I see no advantage to your husband claiming his benefit now and then suspending them a few months later. If his goal is to maximize his SS benefit, then the best way to do that is simply wait longer to claim.

Disorganization, City-County Feuds Impede California's Efforts to Reduce Homelessness

Over the last five years, the state government has spent some \$24 billion to ameliorate homelessness, which, according to polls, is California's most troublesome issue.

Despite that immense financial commitment —and billions more in spending by local governments and philanthropic organizations — the number of homeless people continues to grow.

The latest federal homelessness count found 186,000 Californians living on the streets or in shelters, up 5,000 from the previous year and 36,000 since 2019, the year Gavin Newsom became governor. California has the highest homelessness rate of any state and more than a quarter of the nation's homeless population.

Despite the crisis, we have no hard data telling us how the money was spent, much less which programs, if any, have been successful. Not surprisingly, given the evident lack of results, official and private agencies that administer the programs are reluctant to disclose such information.

In fact, Calmatters.org and other groups have resorted to lawsuits to compel homelessness agencies to release information on what they have done with the funds.

Despite the shameful secrecy, it's apparent that one factor in the expanding crisis

is a lack of coordination and cooperation among the public and private agencies.

Earlier this year, State Auditor Grant Parks issued a sharply worded critique of the California Interagency Council on Homelessness, the Newsom administration's tool for coordinating homelessness programs.

"The state lacks current information on the ongoing costs and outcomes of its homelessness programs, because (the council) has not consistently tracked and evaluated the state's efforts to prevent and end homelessness," Parks wrote.

State-level disorganization is compounded by a structural choke point at the local level. Overwhelmingly, unsightly encampments of homeless people are located within cities, but the social and medical services central to closing those camps are administered by counties, and in highly politicized urban areas, city and county officials tend to be rivals rather than partners.

While Newsom periodically issues demands that local officials do a better job of eliminating the camps — notwithstanding disorganization in his own administration — the lack of local cooperation and coordination is a major impediment.

A situation in Sacramento, within earshot of the state Capitol and detailed by Sacramento Bee columnists Tom Philp and Robin Epley, illustrates the conflict.

Sacramento's city and county officials have feuded for years over homelessness, not only for the usual reasons but because the American River Parkway, which runs through the city and has been a favorite camping site for homeless people, is managed

by the county.

Two years ago, faced with a business-backed ballot measure to crack down on encampments, the city fashioned a less harsh alternative that anticipated an agreement with county officials to provide services for people losing their camping sites.

However, instead of joining the city, county officials banned camps in the parkway and ordered law enforcement to clear them.

City officials complained that people removed from the parkway simply set up new camps inside the city limits. When a local legislator, Assemblyman Kevin McCarty, obtained a \$25 million state grant to the county for homeless programs, county supervisors decided how to spend it, mostly on a few dozen shelter beds or housing slots, without agreement from city officials.

City Councilwoman Karina Talamantes showed up at a meeting of county supervisors to complain about their unilateral actions.

"All the people living on the American River Parkway moved across the street into our neighborhoods north of the river," Talamantes told the board. "I've been asking about these funds for the last two years."

Supervisors fired back in a press release accusing Talamantes of shading the facts about the situation. McCarty, now a candidate for mayor, is caught in the middle of the feud.

Lewis stressed the importance of hands-on learning, stating, "Any kind of STEM event is really good, especially ones like this with hands-on activities. It gives kids a chance to discover something new and fosters a one-on-one connection."

Offering advice to aspiring young professionals, Lewis said, "Be determined, don't give up. It's hard work getting into these fields, but if you are willing to be determined and not give up, that spark of innovation and curiosity will lead you to success."

The California Capital Airshow continues to make strides in inspiring the next generation, showing that with education and exposure, the sky is truly the limit.

Lancers Lose in League Opener

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Cordova Lancers suffered their first loss of the season this past Friday at West Park by a final of 63-0.

The contest was the Metro League opener for both teams, and the Panthers (5-0, 1-0 Metro League) appeared to be more than ready for the challenge. The first play from scrimmage saw West Park junior quarterback Jaden Jackson connect with senior wide receiver Mason Johnson on a 77-yard touchdown strike. The Lancers (3-1, 0-1 Metro League) surrendered touchdowns on the Panthers' first four possessions, including a 92-yard toss from Jackson to Johnson in what was the second of the two touchdown plays from the duo on the night. West Park would take a 35-0 lead into halftime, and never look back.

Cordova did have success moving the ball deep into West Park territory on two first half possessions but were unable to come away with points. The Lancers' rushing attack was effective early, but penalties stalled drives and put them at a disadvantage. "We moved the ball

early better than I thought we would," Cordova head coach JP Dolliver said. "We were always one block away from making a bigger play and it just never happened. We put ourselves in a couple situations where penalties set us back, and that hurts against a team like West Park."

The Panthers were led by Jackson, who went 6-of-9 passing for 222 yards and four touchdowns through the air. Johnson tallied three receptions for 169 yards and two scores. Senior tailback Ben Osby (six carries for 86 yards) and senior tailback Raheem Hawkins (six carries for 44 yards) paced West Park on the ground.

For the Lancers, senior quarterback Trey Wallace went 11-of-17 passing for 80 yards, but was most effective on the ground, adding eight carries for 48 yards. Senior tailback Isaac Adeluola led the team in rushing with four carries for 54 yards.

Following the loss, Dolliver mentioned he was proud of the way his team prepared during the week leading up to the game, and even though the final result wasn't what they wanted, he felt his team got better based on how focused they were coming in.

"At halftime they're staring at the scoreboard, they know at that point something would have to miraculously happen where we could come back in that game. I told them that we need to show well in the second half. Regardless of what happens in the game you got better because you prepared better this week."

The Lancers will look to get back on track when they host visiting Kennedy on Friday, September 27, with kickoff set for 7 p.m.

from Lancer Stadium. It will be the Homecoming Game for Cordova, and Dolliver is well aware of the challenges that await his team moving forward in Metro League play.

"We need to focus in and be passionate about the game," he said. "We knew we were walking into a really tough league and were going to take some lumps. You're going to hit the mat at some point, it's just going to happen. We know we have some tough games ahead of us." ★
