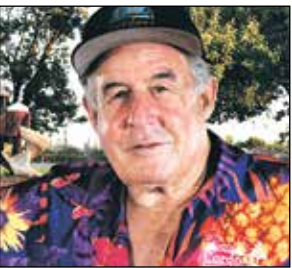

Getting to Know City Council Member Linda Budge

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - After years of dedicated service, Councilmember Linda Budge remains a central figure in Rancho Cordova's city government.

With a career spanning several decades, Budge reflects on her achievements and future goals for the city she has helped shape.

Budge's involvement in local government began in 1978, marking the start of a long career in public service where she has held

elected or appointed positions ever since.

"I have been involved in public office for a very long time," said Budge. "I grew up in an Air Force family and moved here in 1967 after getting married to my first husband."

Since those early days, Rancho Cordova has dramatically evolved. Budge witnessed its transition from a small, tight-knit agricultural town to a bustling city with significant growth. She recalls that most Rancho Cordova residents were engaged in

New Waste Collection Service Set for Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova is transitioning to a new residential solid waste collection and street sweeping service. At the Oct. 7 City Council meeting, Atlas Disposal provided updates on the implementation of the new contract, which will begin on Jan. 1, 2025 and run through Dec. 31, 2034.

Atlas Disposal's presentation focused on several key components of the transition, including vehicle procurement, staffing and community outreach initiatives.

"We are committed to ensuring a seamless transition for the residents of Rancho Cordova," said Atlas Disposal Chief Operating Officer Brian Waters.

According to Atlas Disposal, collection services in 2025 will maintain the same service days, carts and schedules to ensure minimal disruption for residents. The street sweeping schedule will also continue as usual throughout 2025. Starting Dec. 23, Atlas Disposal will accept requests from residents and begin scheduling appointments for bulky item pickups. All services will officially commence on a delayed holiday schedule beginning Jan. 2, 2025, following the New Year.

Atlas Disposal plans to deploy 13 new side-loaders and one rear-loader, with deliveries scheduled for early November. As well as four extra trucks on standby to ensure reliable service.

"We're also pursuing electric vehicle options for future procurements," said Waters. "Big Truck Rental has also provided rental trucks to mitigate any delays in vehicle deliveries."

The transition will involve transferring the remaining inventory of waste carts from the current provider to Atlas Disposal at the beginning of 2025. New carts, compliant with Senate Bill 1383 regulations, have been ordered and are expected to arrive before the end of 2024 according to Atlas Disposal.

To support the new services, Atlas Disposal hired for several positions, focusing on retaining as many drivers as possible, hiring local residents for customer service roles, and expanding its accounting, dispatch, and sustainability departments.

Changes Coming to Airport

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - Effective Oct. 1 and without much ceremony, the Sacramento International Airport (SMF) hourly parking lot was closed, according to the airport website.

This was the closest parking lot to Terminal B, had more than 600 parking spaces available and was ideal for short visits to the airport to meet or drop off travelers using Terminal B.

Terminal B accommodates the following airlines: Aeromexico, Alaska Airlines, Frontier, Hawaiian Airlines, Horizon, JetBlue, Southwest, Spirit and Volaris.

The Sacramento International Airport's website indicates the hourly lot will be permanently closed to make way for a new parking

garage that will boast more than 5,500 spaces when completed. This new development is part of a larger capital improvement project ongoing at the airport. The project,

dubbed SMF Foreword, by Sacramento County leaders is expected to cost \$1.3 billion when completed.

According to a September airport news release, project funding is

coming from the sale of General Airport Revenue Bonds.

"Increasing close-in garage parking capacity is the number one opportunity

three primary activities: being stationed at Mather Air Force Base, working at Aerojet or providing services to the city.

“Rancho Cordova is not the same place that it was in 1978,” said Budge. “There were only four incorporated cities in the county because the city of Sacramento had not grown out to what it is today. The community was governed by a limited number of local organizations.”

Budge’s initial priorities centered on improving the city’s appearance and infrastructure.

“Our mission was to clean up and beautify the city. Our priority was to make Rancho look better so people could have more pride in where they lived,” she explained. “When we incorporated, a lot of people came to work here but they didn’t live in Rancho Cordova. It’s been our goal the entire time, other than the physical, social and commercial health of the city, to build housing so people will live here closer to where they work, as opposed to having to drive miles in a traffic jam.”

Among her proudest accomplishments is the development of distinct neighborhoods in Rancho Cordova, such as the villages of Stone Creek and Capital Village.

“We brought in urban planners to help us create neighborhoods that foster community,” Budge said.

Looking ahead, Budge envisions continued growth and development for Rancho Cordova, including aspects such as continued housing projects and focus on economic development encouraging for new employers, new restaurants and new retail.

“We’re working on a library and a museum that reflects both our military history and the history of Rancho Cordova,” she stated. “We want to ensure housing for homeless veterans and address homelessness comprehensively.”

For Budge, one of the biggest challenges

facing the city is repurposing the extensive office district that Rancho Cordova sits on.

“The council is always looking for opportunities to create a lifestyle where people can walk to work and home, and kids can walk or ride their bicycles to work,” Budge said.

Buildings schools and making sure the schools in Racho Cordova has meet modern educational standards is also something Budge considers a challenge in the city.

“We don’t want kids to have to ride the bus for so many hours a day,” said Budge. “The current architecture and land plan doesn’t provide the experience that kids, especially junior and senior high, want for their own educational opportunities.”

Staying connected with residents is a cornerstone of her approach. Budge emphasizes the importance of public meetings where community members can voice their opinions, as well as utilizing social media to keep the public informed.

Her tenure has been marked by various rewarding experiences, particularly in celebrating community events such as the Fourth of July parade, the California Capital Airshow, the International Festival and the Christmas tree lighting.

“Rancho Cordova is so diverse,” said Budge “At these events, you see all those faces and that I find incredibly heartwarming.”

As she reflects on her legacy, Budge aims for Rancho Cordova to be a place of fiscal health and community trust.

“We brought power and local voice to the community, creating a city that is trusted by the majority of our residents,” said Budge.

Outside of her public service, Budge enjoys teaching the history of Rancho Cordova and finding joy in the continuous learning and community engagement it fosters. With five children and 14 grandchildren, family remains an integral part of her life as she continues to contribute to her community. ★

we have to improve the guest experience at SMF,” said Cindy Nichol, director of airports for the Sacramento County Department of Airports, in an April 2024 news release.

Indeed, a day after the hourly lot was closed, airport officials were joined by local dignitaries to break ground on the new Terminal B parking garage.

“Today’s groundbreaking is another important step to realize the SMF Forward vision and deliver tangible improvements for our community,” said Congresswoman Doris Matsui at the groundbreaking event. “This new parking garage will greatly expand capacity while going above and beyond to make the facility convenient and technologically cutting edge. I’m proud to champion the work of our airport and we are only continuing to push the envelope to keep it the national gold standard for years to come.”

According to a Sacramento County news release on the groundbreaking event, the parking garage project will generate 1,000 jobs during its construction phase and will utilize labor under a Community Workforce Training Agreement, creating opportunities for the local workforce.

Sacramento International Airport visitors have recently become accustomed to the airport’s existing parking lots and


parking garages near the terminals being full during busy travel periods, leaving travelers few options except to utilize the remote long-term parking lots and ride the shuttle to the terminals.

The new parking garage, when completed, will be a great asset to Sacramento travelers. In the meantime, the hourly lot closure will put additional pressure on the other airport parking lots during the new garage’s construction.


Sacramento International Airport’s senior public information officer Scott Johnston provided this guidance, “Travelers are encouraged to check parking availability and track shuttles in real-time before arriving at the airport. We also recommend arriving two-and-a-half hours before a flight and using rideshare options instead of driving.”

“SMF is seeing an average of one million passengers per month and is expected to surpass 13 million in 2024, which would be a record-breaking year for the airport.” Johnston added explaining the need for the expanded parking facilities.

Second Half Surge Propels Lancers Over McClatchy

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Friday evening Oct. 4, inside Lancer Stadium against the visiting McClatchy Lions, the Cordova Lancers showed they can be as physical as necessary.

In a game that saw Cordova run the ball a season-high 37 times while featuring nine different ball carriers, Cordova was able to wear down McClatchy in the second half en route to a 27-7 victory.

The Lancers (5-1 overall, 2-1 Metro League) entered halftime with a 13-0 lead thanks to a one-yard touchdown run from sophomore quarterback Trey Wallace in the first quarter, along with 19-yard touchdown pass from Wallace to senior wide receiver Douglas Reed late in the second quarter. Even so, the game felt closer than the scoreboard indicated. McClatchy (1-5 overall, 1-2 Metro League) relied heavily on senior tailback Jeremiah Giles, who proved to be difficult for the Lancers to stop throughout the game. On the Lions' first play from scrimmage in the third quarter, Giles ripped off a 41-yard touchdown run that brought McClatchy within one score.

"One of the things we told our guys coming in is we can't take them for granted," Lancers' head coach JP Dolliver said of the Lions' rushing attack. "They run hard, and if they get off tackle and we get caught in the wrong gap, that guy is going to beat you when he gets a full head of steam. He's a really good running back. Once he gets going he's really hard to take down."

That would serve as a wake-up call for Cordova, who went on to shut out McClatchy the remainder of the game, while finishing the contest scoring 14 unanswered points of their own, thanks in large part to their commitment to the ground game. Lancers' sophomore tailback Zachary McIntire ripped off a 16-yard touchdown run midway through the third quarter, and senior Tai'Marr Tholmer-Johnson added a six-yard scoring trot of his own early in the fourth quarter to put the Lions away for good.

"I thought our guys played excellent from top to bottom," Lancers' head coach JP Dolliver said following the win. "They played really hard. I haven't been as proud of this group these past two years than I am right now. They fought a really well-coached McClatchy team that is up-and-coming. We took them extremely serious and the kids stepped up."

Tholmer-Johnson led Cordova in rushing with six carries for 70 yards and his score. McIntire's nine carries for 47 yards, along with Wallace's 38 yards on 11 carries led Cordova to the win, their second in a row. Defensively, junior defensive tackle Julian Drahn tallied a team-high 11 tackles, including four tackles for loss. Junior Damajae Moses added eight tackles of his own, including three for loss.

Cordova will go on the road this Friday, October 11 when they travel to Antelope with kickoff set for 7:15 p.m., after press time. ★

Young Quarterback Has Cordova Off to Best Start Since 2016

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Cordova Lancers' sophomore quarterback Trey Wallace began playing the game of football at six years old. By the age of seven, he'd seen enough.

According to his father and current Lancers junior varsity head coach Joel Wallace, he and his wife were awakened one morning when their son was just seven years old, as he stood at their bed. "This is what I want to do with my life," he told his parents. "What do you mean, this is what you want to do?," his father replied. "This is who I am. I want to play football. This is my life," he told them.

His father thought maybe his son had a dream. The two parents sat down that morning drinking their coffee, wondering why their son would say that. Fast forward to 2024, and you can clearly see the young signal caller is right where he's supposed to be when he's on the football field.

The first-year varsity quarterback has an 8:1 touch-down-to-interception ratio with 981 yards passing in the Lancers' first six games of the season. What sets Wallace apart however, is when he displays his dual-threat ability. As a rusher, Wallace has tallied 305 yards on the ground with an impressive six and a half yards-per-carry average, and an additional four touchdowns. His stellar play has helped propel Cordova to their best start in the past eight seasons, with their record currently sitting at 5-1, including 2-1 in Metro League competition. According to his father, playing at the varsity level is right where his son feels he belongs, even as a sophomore. "When he's playing the game now, he always tells us constantly that when he plays the game, and specifically when he's

under pressure, he feels so free," Joel Wallace said.

Growing up, he wasn't the biggest, fastest or strongest kid on the field according to his father. He did not excel at any one area in particular. But what he did do, was play nearly every position while in youth football. That has given the youngster a broad knowledge of the game and has helped him overcome another challenge he faces while on the field.

Wallace has Dyslexia, a learning disability that makes it difficult to read or write. He has not let that stop him on or off the field however, as he currently boasts a 3.5 GPA in the classroom. His studies, both in the classroom and while watching football film, have quickly pushed the sophomore into a leadership role on his team, despite playing with several older teammates. According to the quarterback, it all comes down to the way he prepares.

"They want to listen to a team player who is really confident in what he does," Wallace said about assuming a leadership role. "That's me when I'm out there."

Cordova head coach JP Dolliver has been impressed with the young player since he joined the team entering this season, particularly by his willingness to play the game without shying away from contact.

"The stage isn't too big for him," Dolliver said. "He's a linebacker/safety/running back that's playing quarterback. He's just got that mentality. He wants the ball and wants to compete at all times. He constantly wants to learn, wants to get better, is extremely disciplined, is extremely coachable, and he's great in the weight room. He's just got all the marks that you want when you're looking for a team leader." ★

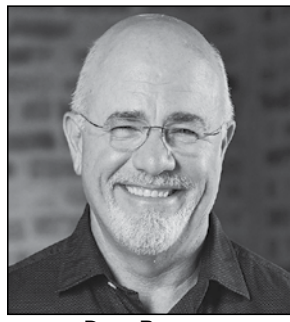

Kings Korner

The wait is finally over and once again a frenetic group of nearly 20,000 fans will hear the introduction, "and now running the point for the Sacramento Kings from the Kentucky Wildcats, De'Aaron Fox!"

On Wednesday night for the very first time Sacramento fans will hear the introduction of newcomer DeMar DeRozan out of the University of Southern California. DeRozan, like many of his comrade's, chose to bolt to the NBA after just one year in college, and the ninth overall pick in the 2009 draft has been an overwhelming success ever since.

Drafted by the Toronto Raptors, DeRozan spent nine years in Canada before a short stint in San Antonio, and then on to Chicago. Traded for Kawhi Leonard, DeRozan had to watch from San Antonio as the Raptors captured the NBA title in 2019.

Many pundits were wildly surprised that of all the destinations and the high interest in his service, DeRozan chose Sacramento as his next home. Since then, he has said all the right things, and like many NBA fans, I believe he will fit in extremely well alongside De'Aaron Fox and Domantas Sabonis. Great players are replete, but great people and great players are a scarce commodity. Mr. DeRozan brings both qualities to a team that is replete with team chemistry, and like most Kings fans, I want to see what Monte McNair's standout acquisition can do.

It is entirely possible that amid all the hype, Kings fans may have to be patient while the big three learn to play alongside one another, but I firmly believe that this six-time all-star will make the transition quickly.

Able to play guard or small forward, much has been reported about the uptick we are likely to see with regards to better looks for Fox, Sabonis, and three-point shooter Keegan Murray.

Lost to some degree in all the uproar of the signing of DeRozan, is how third year hoopster Murray will use DeRozan's talents to get better looks, and more opportunities to drive the lane.

I was impressed with Keegan's introduction of a true mid-range game last

season, and along with some notable shooting inside the three-point line, like former teammate Harrison Barnes, Murray became a threat driving to the basket.

The combination of Murray's three-point shooting, mid-range game, and ability to go to the hole, will have a positive impact on DeRozan as well, and I expect to see this career 21 points per game player, potentially pad that number in the upcoming season.

Not to be overshadowed, Domantas Sabonis could elevate his game even more with the myriad of scoring ability around him, and a return to the high octane offense that led the NBA two years ago may well be in the offing.

It remains to be seen what the loss of defensive minded Jordi Fernandez will do to the Kings, and without question assistant head coach Jay Triano will have big shoes to fill.

Fitting that Sacramento's first opponent of the preseason will be archrival, The Golden State Warriors, and like the Kings, the Warriors will bring a vaunted offensive into Golden One.

Notably missing Wednesday night will be perennial three-point shooter and other half of the splash brothers, Klay Thompson, who has now donned royal blue colors of the Dallas Mavericks.

Joining all-stars Luka Doncic and Kyrie Irving, Thompson hopes to reignite a career that took a two-and-a-half-year hiatus after suffering back-to-back injuries to his ACL and Achilles.

It's important to note that Thompson helped the Warriors to an NBA title in his comeback season of 2022, but the past two years have seen Klay a step slower, and his offense not as reliable as it once was. At age 34 the 6'6" Thompson may still have more in the tank, but we won't witness that until the Mavericks come to town on Dec. 30.

Hitch up your britches Kings fans. We are in for a different look than perhaps this team has ever presented, and it's going to be a fun ride.

Admit One

You land up in a hospital and you feel like you are in a maze. Do you have the correct information when you go in? Did you know that communication breakdowns in hospitals in the U.S. leads to hundreds of deaths? Never happen to you? Let's face it, in the trauma of being admitted, patients and family can easily become confused by the tons of information and instructions from these strangers. That's why **Kati Kleber, BSN, RC, and CCRN** and nationally certified critical care nurse in the neurosciences pulled together information you need to know before it all comes crashing down and you become one of those victims. It's called "**Admit One**" with what you must know when going to the hospital, but no one actually tells you. From CNN to Dr. Oz **Kati** shared the insider information with me on POPPOFF.

1. BRING A LIST OF HOME MEDICATIONS. Know what medications you take on a regular basis. When you are admitted someone will ask you to provide a list of your med and will put them in your chart. Your attending doctor will decide which to keep you on in the hospital. On this one, I asked Kati if it's a good idea to have a list of vitamins and herbs you take, and she said absolutely because of interactions.

2. MAKE A LIST OF HEALTH CARE TEAM MEMBERS. An extensive team of health professionals will come and go from your room. It's hard to tell which is which ... doc, nurse, consultant etc. You and your support person will want to write down who is who, along with their instructions.

3. KNOW YOUR CODE. Your code status informs staff what to do if you stop breathing or your heart stops. Patients without chronic health issues who aren't nearing the end of their life may want health professionals to do everything to revive them. Others with terminal diagnosis or advanced age may choose not to be revived. This is called DNR or Do Not Resuscitate.

4. ASSIGN A SPOKESPERSON. Identify someone the hospital staff can call when changes occur. It is important this person can be easily reached and that you trust.

5. WRITE DOWN QUESTIONS AS YOU THINK OF THEM. Except for nurses, most team members stop by your room once a day, review your care plan, and make adjustments. It's not easy to remember all your questions.

6. ADVOCATE FOR YOURSELF. Let the nurse know of any changes in your condition so the information can be relayed to your health care team. Also, if for any reason, you are not happy with a member of your health care team, let your nurse know that you'd like to speak with a nurse manager.

7. LEAVE THE EQUIPMENT TO THE EXPERTS. Hospitals are full of elaborate, high-tech equipment. If any equipment becomes dislodged, always alert a nurse. Unfortunately, incidents have occurred where patients or family inflict irreparable harm when trying to fix things themselves.

That's just the tip of the iceberg, lots more in "**Admit One.**"

To enhance customer service, Atlas Disposal launched a new app this month. Residents can set up Automatic Bill Pay, use "What goes where" tool, and access educational resources. By January 2025, users will be able to check service schedules, receive custom notifications and schedule bulky item pickups through the app.

The company is partnering with Soil Born Farms to conduct composting workshops and has scheduled three workshops for 2025. Additionally, Atlas Disposal plans to collaborate with the Rancho Cordova Food Locker for two food collection events in June and November 2025.

"You guys are coming along nicely. It's great to see a Rancho Cordova home-grown garbage company stepping up," said Councilmember Garret Gatewood. "I believe we need to ensure everyone is aware of the changes, not just through mail but also by using door hangers. Mail often gets lost and emails can be deleted

but if you put something on someone's door, they can't say they didn't know this was happening."

The City Council recognized the Cordova High Lancers football team for their 400th win. Head coach JP Dolliver thanked the council for their support, emphasizing the hard work of his players.

"That is an amazing accomplishment," said Mayor David M. Sander, PhD. "What is even more important is what we are seeing from you guys this year. We are proud to be in support of you and looking forward to all the things you are going to continue to do for yourself, the school and the community."

Lastly, the council discussed the upcoming Cyclodova event on Oct. 12, organized by Sacramento Area Bicycle Advocates and Bicycling Advocates Rancho Cordova. The event, which promotes community inclusion and environmental awareness, will transform Coloma Road into a car-free street festival from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. ★

California's Expensive Explosion of Real Estate Fraud Hits Home

Rana Robillard came very close this year to losing her life's savings and with it her dream home, when she wired nearly \$400,000 to an internet scammer.

Robillard, ironically, is an experienced veteran of the Bay Area technology industry, but when she received what she thought was a request for her down payment on a home in Orinda, she sent the money, only to learn that she had been tricked.

"That's when I went into a full panic," Robillard, 55, told CNBC, the cable channel devoted to financial matters, which chronicled her terrifying experience.

Robillard was not alone in being victimized.

The real estate industry has fully embraced online transactions, thus eliminating the hassle of having buyers, sellers, real estate agents, mortgage lenders and title company employees shuffle through dozens of paper documents that must be signed or initialed to complete transactions.

It's made the process of buying and selling houses much more convenient, but it's also given scammers an opening for fraud that has cost home buyers many millions of dollars.

The request for down

payment that Robillard received was virtually identical to the many email messages she had exchanged and, in fact, was the only bogus one, which is why scammers have been so successful.

Cyber crooks have mastered the dark art of mimicking legitimate messages, complete with the real names of title company employees and authentic-looking logos, and artificial intelligence could make their scams even more successful in the future.

FBI data, CNBC reported, reveal that real estate fraud involving bogus emails has risen from less than \$9 million in 2015 to \$446.1 million in 2022.

A study of real estate fraud commissioned by Anidjar and Levine, a Florida law firm, found that California's 1,583 cases in 2023 far surpassed those of any other state, as did its \$24.8 million in losses.

Robillard is one of the lucky victims. She quickly reported her loss and her \$398,359.5 was tracked through several banks as the thieves shifted it around to avoid detection. Five months later, after CNBC began making inquiries, she received \$150,000 from one bank and then the remaining nearly \$250,000 from another.

Robillard contacted CNBC about her case both to help her recover the money and bring more attention to the real estate fraud explosion.

"This is not what I thought my public representation would look like, which is that I've lost all this money," Robillard told

CNBC. "If it helps other people, I'm happy to do it, even though it's obviously not my proudest moment."

I take a particular interest in Robillard's case not only because it's important but because I came within a whisker last week of also becoming a victim.

I, too, received a very authentic-looking instruction from the title company handling my purchase of a smaller home for downsizing, seeking down payment and closing costs to complete the purchase. It seemingly came from the title company employee who had been handling my transaction and had all of the appearances of a legitimate communication.

I intended to comply with the request a few hours later, but then received a phone call from my lender about closing the transaction. I told him of the request and he immediately smelled a rat.

That phone call was a lifesaver. A few days later, I presented a valid cashier's check to the title company employee whose identity had been borrowed by the scammer and signed the legitimate paperwork to finalize the purchase.

One of the documents I signed was a warning about phony payment instructions. Perhaps it should have been one of the first documents I was given, rather than one of the last.

Social Security Matters

Will my Wife's Survivor Benefits be Less if she Claimed Her Social Security Early?

Dear Rusty: I claimed Social Security at 70. My wife claimed her own SS at 62, and her earnings were significantly lower than mine. I understand my wife will be eligible to claim my benefit if I pass before she does, but will Social Security reduce that benefit because she didn't wait until age 65 to claim hers? **Signed: Concerned Husband**

Dear Concerned: Your wife's benefit as your surviving spouse will be based on two things:

- Her age when she claims her survivor benefit,
- The amount you were receiving at your death.

If she has reached her own Full Retirement Age (FRA) when she claims

her surviving spouse benefit, she will get 100% of the amount you were receiving when you died (instead of her own smaller SS retirement amount). However, if she claims her survivor benefit at any time before her full retirement age, it will be reduced for claiming the survivor benefit early.

Thus, when your wife claimed her own Social Security retirement benefit (in her case, age 62) doesn't matter and doesn't affect her potential surviving spouse benefit - what matters is her age when she claims her survivor benefit. If she claims before reaching her own FRA, her survivor benefit will be reduced according to the number of months before her FRA that the survivor benefit is claimed. That reduction would be about 4.75% for each year earlier than her FRA she claims it. But if she claims her surviving spouse benefit at or after she reaches her full retirement age, she will get the amount you were receiving at your death, instead of her own smaller age 62 Social

Security retirement benefit amount. FYI, your wife's full retirement age is somewhere between 66 and 67, depending on the year she was born (born in 1960 or later, her FRA is age 67).

And, just for clarity, your wife's payment as your surviving spouse will consist of her own SS retirement benefit plus an auxiliary amount to bring her monthly payment up to what she is entitled to as your surviving spouse.

The Cordova Recreation and Park District (CRPD) was created 66 years ago. One year later, it gave birth to the Cordova Community Council (CCC), which would become the foundation of the City of Rancho Cordova. The City of Rancho Cordova would be built upon 21 years ago. You might say they built this City on Parks and Rec.

It has always been a team effort comprised of many great leaders of the community that carried the torch of progress. Leaders such as Paul and Dayo Hagan, Neil Orchard, Guy Anderson, Cay Nickerson, Linda Budge, Dave Roberts, Robert McGarvey, Ken Cooley, David Sander, Ted Gaebler, Shelly Blanchard and Curt Haven, to name a few. These individuals knew the true meaning of community partnership.

I wasn't born in Rancho

Cordova. I didn't attend Cordova High School. I moved to this community 38 years ago. And 29 years ago, I married another great leader, Rebecca Sloan. We created three beautiful children who did grow up here and this is where they would like to stay and raise their children. Why? Because they also have witnessed the magic of our community, the spirit of our community and the love of our community.

I grew up in the suburbs of Los Angeles. I always had a passion for parks and recreation. I was extremely excited whenever the opportunity arose to go to one of our local parks or school playgrounds. Parks have always played an important role in mental and physical development. This was amplified in 2020 when the pandemic confined people indoors, only to soon be realized by the Center of Disease Control that parks and open spaces were deemed essential to staying healthy.

This passion followed me through my adolescence and into my adult life. The City of Rancho Cordova and the park district worked very well together. A good working relationship is a blessing when striving to make positive changes in a park district that also benefits the growth of a city. What I've learned in

most of my leadership training and governance education is the importance of partnerships. Communities thrive on partnerships. I'm 110% positive that the park district, the school districts and the City of Rancho Cordova have benefitted through the power of their partnerships.

When I speak of our community, I'm referring to the boundaries of the CRPD, which include several communities within Sacramento County. These communities are Gold River, the City of Rancho Cordova, Mather, Lincoln Village, Larchmont, Riviera East and Rosemont.

I'm proud of where we are today. We've come a long way since 1958. Our parks, facilities

and programs are flourishing. We currently have 35 neighborhood parks, 11 community parks, five water play areas, four community centers, two community pools, one golf course and one urban park (Village Green Park).

In the last nine years, our amazing staff has completed more than 200 capital improvement projects benefitting our existing parks and facilities with a total cost of \$19 million. We made our older parks safer for everyone by completing American Disabilities Act improvements and equipment upgrades. We opened 11 new parks with two more planned to open this fall. We demonstrated financial accountability by increasing our Bond rating

from BBB+ to A-. We received 20 awards of excellence from local, regional and state agencies. We brought the struggling Cordova Golf Course back to life during the pandemic. One of my most proud moments was cutting the ribbon at the grand opening of our brand-new Cordova Community Pool alongside my fellow Board Members, CRPD staff, Rancho Cordova City Council and City staff.

At this year's California Special Districts Association annual conference, our General Manager Patrick Larkin was awarded the Special District Governance Certificate. Our Park District was awarded with the District of Distinction Gold Accreditation and the District Transparency Certificate of Excellence. These are major accomplishments upon which we can continue to challenge ourselves and do even more for our community.

Shelly Blanchard, executive director of the Cordova Community College says, "We help people fall in love with their city."

I say, "We help people fall in love with their community." Our accomplishments as a park district have not only helped build a city, but also helped draft a roadmap to the future growth of our community. ★
