**RIO LINDA, CA (MPG)** - Get ready for an exciting evening of holiday cheer at the ninth annual Christmas Parade in Rio Linda on Saturday, Dec. 14.

The festivities will kick off at 6 p.m. Dec. 14 with the much-anticipated lighting of the community Christmas Tree at Troy Graham Park, a small triangle strip located at Front Street and M Street. This marks the beginning of a fun-filled night as the parade winds its way

down M Street, starting at W. 2nd Street and ending at Curved Bridge Road. Be sure to gather around the judges' stand near the community Christmas Tree to catch the festive magic up close.

According to parade organizer Tabitha Worth, the event has become a beloved tradition in Rio Linda and was first inspired in 2016 when local resident John Todd suggested creating a Christmas parade similar to Placerville's parade. He envisioned it as a way to bring joy to Rio Linda

and he encouraged Worth to take on the responsibility of organizing it.

Thanks to her dedication and the support of the Rio Linda/Elverta Country Faire, which helps raise funds and gather sponsors for the parade, the parade has grown into a true community event. The Christmas Light Parade is even in the process of becoming its own nonprofit organization, awaiting IRS approval, according to Worth.

## First Property Taxes Installment Due Dec. 10

**Sacramento County  
News Release**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The deadline for paying the first installment of your 2024-2025 Sacramento County property taxes is coming up shortly. Payments are due no later than Dec. 10. Late payments will incur a 10-percent penalty for each tax bill and partial payments are not accepted.

Payment must be received in the Tax Collector's Office by 5 p.m. Dec. 10 or either be postmarked or paid through the county website at [eproptax.saccounty.gov](http://eproptax.saccounty.gov) by Dec. 10. The Tax Collector also reminds property owners to include the appropriate installment payment stub from the tax bill or website, or write the parcel number of the property on the check being submitted to make sure that you receive proper credit for the payment.

Payment can be mailed to P.O. Box 508, Sacramento, CA 95812-0508. Be sure to mail your payment early enough to ensure a timely postmark and avoid penalties.

### Making Payments

Property taxes can be paid by online e-check or credit card through Sacramento County's Property Tax Bill Information System or over the telephone at 1-844-430-2823, using the 14-digit parcel number. Credit card payments are processed by a contractor and a 2.29% convenience fee will be applied if you elect to pay the annual property tax bill using this method. This convenience fee is not revenue to the county. There is no fee to make a payment via e-check.

To avoid penalties, transactions made either on the internet or over the telephone must be completed before midnight on the payment pay by date. Plan ahead and do not wait until the last minute to make your payment. If you are unable to get through on the internet or telephone, causing you to miss the payment deadline, penalties will not be waived.

Verify your data entry very carefully when making online payments. If your payment is rejected by your financial institution for any reason, you will be charged a return payment fee as well as penalties if your payment is rejected after the due date.

If you use your bank's Online Bill Pay service, a paper check will be printed and mailed to the

# Record Crowd Hits the Streets for 2024 Run to Feed the Hungry

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The streets of East Sacramento were bustling with energy on Thanksgiving morning as the 31st annual Run to Feed the Hungry drew a record number of participants to the largest Thanksgiving Day fun run. This year's event, held on Nov. 28, attracted runners, walkers and virtual participants from across the region and beyond, all coming together to support a cause close to home: the Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services (SFBFS).

"Run to feed the hungry is truly amazing. It's crazy to see the amount of people who all show up to run for the same cause," said participant Emma Harris. "This year was extra special for me because I got to run with my best friend and brother and crush the goal I had been training for." With options for both a 5-kilometer and 10-kilometer run or walk, the event featured a loop course starting on J Street, just west of the entrance to the Sacramento State campus. Participants had the flexibility to

join virtually this year as well, receiving a bib and shirt to commemorate their support while contributing remotely to the cause. This year's race had something for everyone, with the addition of chip timing and the opportunity for participants to join a timed runner's corral. Competitive runners had the chance to earn awards, with the top three finishers in each age group receiving medals, and the top overall men and women in both the 5K and 10K races receiving plaques and prize money. The event also recognized the top three masters (aged 40 and older) among both men and women, with additional plaques and prize money for their achievements. Adding to the festive

atmosphere, several live bands performed throughout the course, keeping participants motivated with music as they ran, walked, or jogged their way through the scenic route. The annual event is not just a holiday tradition but also serves as the largest fundraiser for the Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services, a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing immediate relief and long-term solutions for families in need throughout Sacramento County. The funds raised help the Sacramento Food Bank & Family Services continue its mission to alleviate hunger and support individuals and families in their journey toward self-sufficiency. With just \$1 able to provide three meals to a child, senior

or family facing hunger, every dollar raised at the event made a significant impact on the lives of those in need. In 2023, the Sacramento Food Bank & Family Service distributed 37.9 million pounds of food, equivalent to 31.6 million meals, and provided food assistance to an average of 283,079 individuals each month. This year's record turnout is expected to provide much-needed support to help the Sacramento Food Bank & Family Service continue its essential work in the Sacramento area. Tax Collector. Because the check is sent without a payment stub, enter the parcel number, current year's bill number and installment being paid in the online account number field for payment identification. Be sure you are familiar with your bank's online bill pay

processing timelines. The Tax Collector uses the date appearing on the check from your bank's Payment Processing Center as the payment date. Online bill pay checks dated after the due date will be returned for penalty without exception. Be aware that because bank online bill pay checks are delivered

in large batches without stubs, they will need to be individually handled and the posting of your payment might be delayed. **How to Obtain Information About Your Tax Bill** If you have not received a tax bill, you can obtain your tax bill information and payment stubs

at the Tax Collector's website, over the automated telephone system or by contacting the Tax Collector's Office at 916-874-6622. Sacramento County offers an online email subscription service for property tax information. To receive e-mail notifications when the annual

secured property tax bills are available each year and reminders before the first and second installments delinquent dates, visit the Sacramento County Homepage and enter your email address or mobile number under the "Connect with us" header, located at the bottom right-hand of the page. This service is provided at no cost to subscribers. For additional information about property taxes,

the Sacramento County Tax Collector's website provides answers to common questions from taxpayers regarding property taxes and links to tax bill information and online payments. *Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the property owner of their liability to pay taxes in a timely manner or give the Tax Collector reason to cancel penalties imposed for late payment.* ★



# Fishy Story Suggests Catastrophic Ending



If you’ve been watching the news, then you know that the world is going to end soon.

No, I’m not talking about the recent election. I’m referring to the elusive deep-water oarfish.

Superstitious sailors have long considered the spotting of this rare fish a harbinger of bad news. And this past week, on the shores of Encinitas, California, it’s been spotted again. This makes three times this year in California and only 22 times in the past century.

Japanese mythology recounts the doom fish as a precursor to earthquakes and tsunamis. More than a dozen were found on Japan’s coastline just before Japan’s 2011 Tōhoku earthquake and tsunami, their largest recorded earthquake.

These kind of scary indicators aren’t new. Televangelists have been capitalizing on them for years as they expounded on their version of catastrophic and world-ending predictions.

If you were born before 1960, you’ll likely remember that Hal Lindsey co-authored a 1970 best seller with Carole C. Carlson titled “The Late, Great Planet Earth.”

Some of us just laughed at him, while others tried to ignore him.

However, when the Yom Kippur War of 1973 sent gas prices soaring, we wondered if the Lindsey scenario was creeping into the nonfiction section. Many began taking Lindsey so seriously that they ran scared into the baptismal waters.

Had we been a little smarter, I’m wondering if we might have seen how religious

history was on a repeating track with Lindsey’s approach. He was using the scare-the-hell-out-of-you technique used by centuries of religious thought.

It’s a thought expressed on the old bumper sticker: “The good news is, Jesus is coming back. The bad news is, He’s ticked.” (OK, the sticker doesn’t say “ticked” but this is a family newspaper.)

The real problem with Lindsey and people like him is that they characterize the Christian faith as a war between good and evil. Indeed, they demand that the faithful make a choice between spending eternity in a bottomless pit of eternal fire or going to church three times a week.

The fault in this thinking is that it forces faith into an all-or-nothing proposition. Faith isn’t that way at all. Real faith is relationship-based, not fear-based.

Faith is more like this: When I met my wife at a Southern Baptist Conference Center, I didn’t introduce myself by saying, “Marry me or you’ll burn.” If I had, she might have hit me with a flame thrower.

God doesn’t use that approach either. He doesn’t need to scare us into loving him. That’s because God is not trying to save us from this world. After all, he created this world for us.

Jesus made the same point quite well, saying, “God didn’t go to all the trouble of sending his son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help” (John 3:17, The Message Paraphrase).

God is all about helping us make it through our times of hurt and pain. He’s not about inventing painful situations just so he can play the superhero.

I suppose there’ll always be fortunes to be made by capitalizing on demise, death and destruction, but I will continue to place my faith in my relationship with our creator.

The Lindsey star eventually faded. The counterculture of the 1960s never became the main culture, and Lindsey’s predictions crumbled with the Berlin Wall.

These days, Lindsey is 94 years old, living in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He’s still doing video, but now he’s predicting the final jihad that will come any day now. Same scared-as-hell program, just a different station. ★



### Cost of Thanksgiving Dinner Declines, Remains Higher Than Pre-Pandemic Levels

Cooking a Thanksgiving feast for your friends and family will cost less than last year but will still be more expensive than before the pandemic. The American Farm Bureau Federation’s 39th annual Thanksgiving dinner survey provides a snapshot of the average cost of this year’s classic holiday feast for 10, which is \$58.08 or about \$5.80 per person. This is a 5% decrease from 2023, which was 4.5% lower than 2022. Two years of declines don’t erase dramatic increases that led to a record high cost of \$64.06 in 2022. The survey also notes that the cost varies by region, with the West significantly higher than the national average, at \$67.05 this year.

### California Reflects on SGMA 10 Years Later

California water officials, local water agencies and farmers have spent the past decade preparing for the 2014 Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, or SGMA, a historic regulatory framework developed to bring over-drafted aquifers into balance by 2040. As SGMA implementation takes shape, state and local water officials, lawmakers, farmers and association leaders commemorated the 10th anniversary of SGMA last week at the California Natural Resources Agency in Sacramento. The daylong event featured panel discussions on the past, present and future of the regulation.

### Increased rodent activity on farms causes damage, losses

Rodents, particularly rats, have wreaked havoc in California orchards and vineyards this year, with some farmers reporting yield losses, damage to trees and destruction of irrigation lines, electrical wiring and other infrastructure. Farmers face soaring costs not only to replace what has been destroyed or damaged but to control populations of the pests. “Rodent damage, if ignored, can lead to substantial losses,” said Roger Baldwin, *a wildlife specialist* at the University of California, Davis. “I think this year is just a good example of how being a little bit more proactive may be beneficial in the long run.” ★

### Farmers Fought Fire as Insurance Crisis Left Homes at Risk

During the past three weeks, the Mountain Fire has burned some 20,000 acres and destroyed 243 structures, making it Southern California’s third-most destructive fire in the past decade. The fire forced evacuations and burned around 12,000 acres of crops and rangeland, causing at least \$7 million in agricultural losses, according to Ventura County Agricultural Commissioner Korinne Bell. California’s property insurance crisis, which has left many homes in areas with high fire risk uninsured, prompted some farmers to take it upon themselves to defend property from the blaze.

He appeared in 30 appearances in his rookie season and in 2024 was one of five players to appear in every game.

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Three Hornet seniors were named all-Big Sky Conference on Nov. 26, including outside hitters Bridgette Smith and Caitlin Volkmann being named to the first team, and rightside hitter Ellie Tisko named second team.

The Hornets received three all-league honors after finishing the regular season with an 18-11 overall record and 11-5 conference mark. Sacramento State finished in a tie for second place in the conference

standings and will be the No. 3 seed at the Big Sky Tournament at the Nest.

Smith was named to the first team for the fourth straight year, becoming the first player in program history to be named first team on four occasions. Counting her pandemic season of 2020 when she was named to the second team, Smith is also the first player in school history to receive all-conference accolades on five occasions.

Volkmann was named to the first team for the first time in her career, and Tisko received second team honors for the second consecutive season. ★

# Sacramento State Women's Basketball Finishes Third

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Senior Katie Peneueta finished with a career-high tying 20 points to go with nine rebounds while three other Hornets finished in double figures on Sunday Dec. 1, helping push the Sacramento State women's basketball team past Wagner, 73-34, to finish third at the FIU Thanksgiving Classic in Miami.

The Hornets snapped their three-game skid, improving to 5-3 overall on the year, while the Seahawks fell to 1-6 overall with the result. The 39-point victory was the largest of the year and the largest against a Division I opponent since a 48-point triumph over Portland State on Jan. 23, 2016.

Sunday's 34 points allowed are the fewest in the program's Division I history and the fewest since

defeating Concordia College, 78-29, on Nov. 22, 1990. Sacramento State limited Wagner to just 15 first-half points — the lowest scoring first half by a Hornet opponent since Northern Colorado trailed, 24-15, at the break on Jan. 6, 2007.

Overall, from the field, the Hornets stifled the Seahawks to the tune of a .245 (12-for-49) field goal percentage for the game, which is the lowest by an opponent since Pacific Union shot the same percentage on Dec. 19, 2019.

In only her second game back after missing the first six games of the season due to injury, Peneueta came off the bench to finish 7-of-10 from the field and 5-of-7 from long distance in 29 minutes, matching her career high set at Northern Arizona on Feb. 3, 2022, and tied against Montana State just over a year later on Feb. 23, 2023.

Her nine rebounds were also two shy of her career high of 11 set

against Idaho on Jan. 5, 2023.

She was followed closely by sophomore Lina Falk, who finished with 15 points on 6-of-13 from the field and added six rebounds, three assists, and three steals. Senior Jaydia Martin chipped in 12 points on 5-of-11 from the field, adding four rebounds and six assists, while freshman Sofia Alonso finished with 11 points, five rebounds, and six assists.

Freshman Brooklyn Taylor also blocked four shots on the day, the most since Summah Hanson had four against Eastern Washington on Dec. 30, 2023.

The Hornets surrendered the first basket of the game, but it was all Sacramento State from that point on, outscoring Wagner by a 21-2 count the rest of the quarter — including a 14-0 run to close the period. The run grew to 17-0 with the first three points of the second quarter as the Hornets led by as many as 27 points

in the first half en route to the 41-15 halftime advantage.

Sacramento State limited the Seahawks to four points in both the first and third quarters — tied for the fewest in a single quarter this season along with the four-point fourth quarter at Cal State Fullerton back on Nov. 14 — and tallied the fourth and fifth single-digit quarters defensively this year.

Meanwhile, the offense was clicking, finishing the day shooting 49 percent from the field overall (26-of-53) — its second-highest single-game shooting performance of the year behind only the 55 percent against Lincoln University on Nov. 10. The Hornets were also 11-of-25 (.440) from behind the arc as a team, setting season highs for both makes and percentages and the best in both categories since hitting 13-of-24 from three-point range against Idaho State at last year's Big Sky Conference Tournament.

Sacramento State opened the second half on a 9-0 run, holding Wagner to without a point for the first six minutes of the period and to without a field goal until the final 30 seconds of the period. The Hornets led by as many as 46 points with two minutes to play in the fourth quarter and led nearly the entire game save for the 15 seconds that the Seahawks went in front to start the day and the 3:55 during which the contest was tied.

Following three straight games away from home, Sacramento State returns to The Nest this coming week, hosting Kansas City to open the second-annual Big Sky-Summit Challenge on Wednesday, Dec. 4, at 6:30 p.m. The Hornets then travel to Nebraska to take on Omaha on Saturday, Dec. 7, at Noon PT prior to the start of final exams. Both games are scheduled after press time. ★

# Social Security Matters

## Am I entitled to more Social Security from my Ex-husbands?

**Dear Rusty:** I am 76 years old and a retired high school counselor/teacher. I was married to my first husband from 1968 until 1981. He is still living, and he remarried two more times and, I believe, he is currently divorced. He is 77 years old. His income was always much higher than mine. I was married to my second husband from May 1989 until we divorced in April 2017. My second husband died in June 2023. What I wonder is if I am entitled to receive Social Security benefits based upon the income of either of my ex-husbands? **Signed: Twice Divorced Spouse.**

**Dear Twice Divorced:** Divorced spouses are entitled to the same benefits as a current spouse if their marriage lasted at least 10 years which, in both cases, yours did. The other caveat is whether your own SS retirement benefit is less than you are entitled to


from either of your ex-husbands. If your own SS retirement benefit is less, then you will get an incremental amount on top of your own SS retirement to bring your total monthly benefit up to your spousal (or surviving spouse) entitlement.

Since your first husband is still living, it is likely that your best financial option is to claim a surviving ex-spouse benefit from your deceased 2nd husband. The reason is that survivor benefits from husband #2 are based on his actual benefit at his death, whereas benefits from a living ex-spouse (husband #1) are based upon his full retirement amount. In other words, it is likely that 100% of deceased husband #2's benefit at his death is more than 50% of living husband #1's current benefit at his full retirement age (FRA).

It is, of course, possible that 50% of your first husband's FRA entitlement is more than 100% of your second husband's benefit at death, in which case your ex-spouse benefit from your first husband could be more. The only way to sort this out is to contact Social Security (1.800-772-1213) to make an appointment to apply for surviving ex-spouse benefits from your deceased second husband. Explain that your first

ex-husband is still living, and that you are unsure of what your benefits are as your first husband's ex-spouse. Social Security will be able to determine from their records which one provides you with a higher benefit amount (provide each husband's Social Security number when you call). As I said, your best financial option will likely be to take your survivor benefit from your deceased second ex-husband (note, however, if your first ex-husband also dies before you, you can subsequently file for a survivor benefit from him, if that is more than you are getting from your second husband's record).

Dear Dave,

One of my credit card bills was turned over to a collection agency, because I was late making payments several times. The agency has offered me two or three different payment options I can afford. If I agree to one of these, does the original creditor get paid, as well?

– Bethany

Dear Bethany,

You're facing one of two possibilities. The collection agency is either directly representing the credit card company, or it owns the debt outright. Neither way of handling it is unusual when someone has defaulted on a loan.

Here's the deal. You've already got a mark against you on your credit report for the bill being turned over to collections. So, at this point settling on a credit card you've defaulted on is really no big deal. Unless you have the cash on hand right now to make good on the debt outright, I'd accept whichever deal makes the most sense for you financially at the moment.

you, and anyone else finding themselves in this kind of situation, Bethany, it goes something like this. Stop using credit cards!

Dear Dave,

When I leave my job in two or three years, I'll still have a good income of around \$80,000 thanks to my pension. I talked with my wife recently about us not needing an emergency fund with a continuing steady income like this, but she thinks we should still have money set aside strictly for emergencies. I think we would be fine with my pension and our other investments, but she says a fund set aside strictly for the unexpected would make her feel safer. What are your thoughts?

– Barrett

Dear Barrett,

I always recommend folks have an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses. Put it in a good money market account with check writing privileges and a decent interest rate. That way, your money will work for you a little bit until it's needed.

I know a good pension can feel really solid. But there's always the possi-

bility of lost income or very large, unexpected expenses. Life can take a big financial chunk out of you at any time. What if one, or both of you, have a major medical event? Even with the other investments you mentioned, you should have an emergency fund. Period.

In your case, you could probably lean toward three months of expenses in your emergency fund. If it were me, I'd go ahead and make it a full six months of expenses. Trust me, a fully funded emergency fund will make both of you feel better. It can turn a disaster into nothing more than an inconvenience.

and the Rio Linda Bible Quizzers from Higher Ground Apostolic Church.

Justin Green, who represented the American Legion, was the big winner of the race, raising over \$5,000 for the veterans' organization. Kambria Silva, who raised more than \$2,200, was also among the top fundraisers and earned the title of Jr. Mayor. In a heartwarming display of community spirit, all candidates received checks for their chosen charities.

Green, a man of few words, humbly accepted his title as Honorary Mayor. He represented the American Legion well and was able to raise an outstanding amount of money for his charity. He succeeds Katherine Shermer, who also ran in support of the organization in 2023.

Silva, the newly elected Junior Mayor, was inspired by the opportunity to make a difference.

She shared her motivation in running, quoting 1 Timothy 4:12: "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity."

Silva explained, "I want young people to know that they can do great things even when they are young, and that you should not shy away from a challenge because of your age."

Silva will participate in the Christmas Parade on Dec. 14, passing out candy and making her mark as a Junior Mayor dedicated to community service. While the position

is largely ceremonial, Silva hopes to use her title to serve the communities of Rio Linda and Elverta in a meaningful way.

This year's Honorary Mayor's Race not only raised significant funds for local charities, but also sparked a renewed sense of community involvement, with both young and adult candidates contributing to the spirit of service that defines Rio Linda and Elverta.

The Rio Linda Chamber of Commerce has doubled its membership in recent years and is dedicated to strengthening local businesses by encouraging community involvement in order to stimulate growth and confidence within the local economy. ★
