

High **Schools** Adopt **Ethnic Studies** Class

GALT, CA (MPG) - Galt Joint Union High School District's newly-adopted ethnic studies curriculum will include instruction on local populations, including the Native American and Portuguese American communities. The board of trustees approved the course and reviewed state test results at its Nov. 21 regular meeting.

Under California's Assembly Bill 101, the district is required to develop an ethnic studies course to be introduced in the 2025-26 school year as an elective. It will then become a graduation requirement, starting with the incoming freshmen of 2026-27.

Educational Services director Linda DeWilde said the class is planned to last one semester. She described it as "an interdisciplinary course that focuses on people's experiences and perspectives living in America."

"Through themes of identity, history, systems of power and social movements, students will gain insights into how race, ethnicity, nationality and culture shape both our individual selves and our overall society in the United States," DeWilde

As required by the state, the course will cover the experiences of African Americans, Latinos, Native Americans, and Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders. "But also we get to

include the local aspects and that's what really makes this a unique experience for our students," DeWilde said, noting that there will also be units on the local Miwok tribe, Wilton Rancheria, and on the area's history of Portuguese immigration and on the Galt Latino community.

Class activities will include surveying people at the Galt Market and discovering underrepresented social movements in the area. The program would

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - As the holidays approach, many of us look forward to gatherings with friends and family, enjoying delicious food and taking part in festive celebrations. However, this time of year can also bring feelings of stress, loneliness or sadness for some. The holiday season is a complex time that can amplify both the highs and lows of life.

"It's normal to feel overwhelmed by the demands of the season," said Sacramento County Director of Behavioral Health Dr. Ryan Quist. "High expectations, separation from loved ones, personal grief and financial pressures can all impact our mental well-being. It's important to remember that it's okay not to feel joyful all the time."

To help navigate the season and its challenges, Sacramento County's Department of Health Services, Behavioral Health Division, offers these tips:

Acknowledge Your Feelings and **Stress Levels**

Recognizing when you need a break is essential. During this time of year, we try to squeeze in a bunch of different events. Maintaining regular routines, especially consistent sleep schedules and meal times can also support mental health.

"We often underestimate how critical a regular sleep routine is to our emotional well-being. It can impact your mental health and your ability to function effectively," Quist explained. "Also, simply staying consistent with meals can help avoid unnecessary stress.

Plan for Managing Stress

Whether it's taking a walk, reading or cooking with loved ones, identifying activities that bring calm and joy can be a valuable resource when emotions run high.

Connect with Others

The holidays don't have to revolve around material gifts. Giving your time and support to friends or community members can lift spirits for both you and

Avoid Excessive Alcohol and/or **Substance Use**

For those in recovery, the holidays can

be especially challenging. It's important to have a plan for navigating social events and leaning on support systems if needed.

County Property Tax Due Dec. 10

Sacramento County News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The deadline for paying the first installment of your 2024-2025 Sacramento County property taxes is coming up shortly. Payments are due no later than Dec. 10. Late payments will incur a 10% penalty for each tax bill and partial payments are not accepted.

Payment must be received in the Tax Collector's Office by 5 p.m. Dec. 10 or either be postmarked or paid through the county website at eproptax.saccounty. gov by Dec. 10. The Tax Collector also reminds property owners to include the appropriate installment payment stub from the tax bill or website, or write the parcel number of the property on the check being submitted to make sure that you receive proper credit for the payment.

Payment can be mailed to P.O. Box 508, Sacramento, CA 95812-0508. Be sure to mail your payment early enough to ensure a timely postmark and avoid penalties.

Making Payments

Property taxes can be paid by online e-check or credit card through Sacramento County's Property Tax Bill Information System or over the telephone at 1-844-430-2823, using the 14-digit parcel number. Credit card payments are processed by a contractor and a 2.29% convenience fee will be applied if you elect to pay the annual property tax bill using this method. This convenience fee is not revenue to the

There is no fee to make a

payment via e-check.

To avoid penalties, transactions made either on the internet or over the telephone must be completed before midnight on the payment pay by date. Plan ahead and do not wait until the last minute to make your payment. If you are unable to get through on the internet or telephone, causing you to miss the payment deadline, penalties will not be waived.

Verify your data entry very carefully when making online payments. If your payment is rejected by your financial institution for any reason, you will be charged a return payment fee as well as penalties if your payment is rejected after the due

If you use your bank's Online Bill Pay service, a paper check will be printed and mailed to the

Tax Collector. Because the check is sent without a payment stub, enter the parcel number, current year's bill number and installment being paid in the online account number field for payment identification. Be sure you are familiar with your bank's online bill pay processing timelines. The Tax Collector uses the date appearing on the check from your bank's Payment Processing Center as the payment date. Online bill pay checks dated after the due date will be returned for penalty without exception.

Be aware that because bank online bill pay checks are delivered in large batches without stubs, they will need to be individually handled and the posting of your payment might be delayed.

If you have not received a tax bill, you can obtain



your tax bill information and payment stubs at the Tax Collector's website, over the automated telephone system or by contacting the Tax Collector's Office at 916-874-6622.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the property owner of their liability to pay taxes in a timely manner or give the Tax Collector reason to cancel penalties imposed for late payment.

conclude with a "capstone activity" in which students would address a local

District faculty have been working on the curriculum since last fall.

"In fall of 2023, a team of history/social science teachers and English teachers were assembled to gather information and create an ethnic studies course for the district," DeWilde said. "Together with an outside consultant and an expert from Sacramento State University, the team explored coursework from other districts, toured areas of Galt and its surrounding region to investigate the significant historical events and people as well as the long-standing cultural practices in the community."

Since fall, the teachers have met monthly to write the course summary, outline and lesson plans.

DeWilde noted that while the course is open to any grade level, it is anticipated that most students will take it in freshman

Trustee Dennis Richardson said it will be a "challenge" to present all of the information planned in one semester. DeWilde voiced "full confidence" in the teachers' ability to

that's going into it as well, but they really planned ... very thoroughly," DeWilde

Trustees Terry Parker and Melissa Neuburger are eager to see how the class progresses, suggesting that students could present their capstone projects to the board.

The board voted 4-0 to approve the ethnic studies course; Trustee Mark Beck

With board approval, the class will be added to the course catalog for 2025-26. Staff will give an in-depth look at the curriculum in

DeWilde also presented "There's a lot of passion results from state testing in math, English language arts and science.

The results came from the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP), which tests English and math skills, and from the California Science Test (CAST). The assessments are administered to juniors and measure how well students are meeting gradelevel expectations.

The most recent results, from spring of 2023-24, showed overall improvement over the previous school year in math and science, while English performance dipped.

The number of students meeting or exceeding expectations in math rose by about 2.5 percentage points compared to the previous year, and the number at the same level in science rose 1.3 percentage points. In English, the number of students meeting or exceeding standards dropped by 2.6 percentage points.

The district's results were higher than the statewide numbers in English and science but trailed the state in math.

Among English topics, the fewest students, 17.8%, were falling below standards in research and inquiry, with higher numbers in listening and reading. The highest

proportion, 23.4%, were below expectations in


In math, the most that students underperformed on were concepts and procedures. In science the weakest area was Earth and space sciences. DeWilde noted several

strategies that staff is planning in response to the results, including greater focus on writing, concepts and procedures, and Earth and space sciences.

Staff noted that the two years shown represent different cohorts of 11th-graders and a different number of students. ★



As I built a post-election gratitude list, I remembered a question routinely asked by the minister of music in a church I

pastored. He'd stand behind the big Baptist pulpit and ask this question of his sleepy and

aging congregation:

"Would you rather be in the best prison in America or here in church today?"

He used the question to roust our aging congregation and inspire them to sing louder. He often used it at the Thanksgiving service because he felt like it gave congregants a bit of gratitude perspective.

I find the reasoning a bit haggard as it's the same kind of sermonic reasoning

ministers use every year that urge us to remember those less fortunate.

I ask you, can't we just hold the guilt this year and sit back and relax with our holiday pie?

Newspaper columnists like myself, and most especially ministers, of whom I am both, try to make you see that your life is not as bad as it could be.

This approach comes off sounding a lot like a parent trying to get their kid to eat

"At least we have turnips and broccoli on our table," goes the paternal reasoning, "I'll bet the kids in Godawfulstan wish they had turnips."

That line of reasoning never did much

The problem with that perspective is that gratitude and thankfulness has never been about comparing your good fortune to the misfortunes of others. Thanksgiving will never be about trying to equalize the imbalance of those fortunes.

Thanksgiving isn't just about being grateful you don't have a loved one deployed to a war-torn country. It's also about being thankful we have brave service members who are willing to serve when their country calls.

Thanksgiving isn't just about being grateful you aren't poor. It is also about being grateful you have resources to give to the poor.

It is not only about being grateful you aren't hungry. It is also about sharing your gratitude with the hungry.

Being truly thankful is not about comparing what you have with what others do not have. It is not about being glad your home is not a shanty cardboard shack under the freeway. It's about the help we give the homeless as we humbly realize that most of us are one paycheck away from building our own shack.

Gratitude is not about giving thanks for what you have, where you work, where you live or even who you are. Thanksgiving is not about you at all.

Thanksgiving is about keeping perspective between recognizing the blessings we've received and utilizing our capacity to return those blessings to others.







Zap Wisely on Microwave Oven Day

According to the National Day Calendar website, on Dec. 6, National Microwave Oven Day honors one appliance that changed how we use the kitchen.

Quite by accident, self-taught American engineer Percy Spencer discovered a way to heat food safely with microwaves. While working with an active radar in 1945, he noticed a melting chocolate bar in his pocket. The high-powered microwave beams created a heating effect ideal for cooking.

Spencer deliberately attempted cooking popcorn in the microwave. Next, he tried cooking an egg. The egg exploded in his fellow engineer's face! However, we can cook scrambled eggs in microwave ovens.

Spencer, employed by Raytheon, continued experimenting with different methods of heating food safely with microwaves. Raytheon filed a United States patent application for Spencer's microwave cooking process on Oct. 8, 1945. In 1947, Raytheon built the first commercially available microwave oven. It was called the "Radaring."

An estimated 90% of homes in the United States have a microwave in them.



The microwave oven cooks more than popcorn. Use this day to celebrate the many uses of the microwave oven. Make crispy bacon; melt chocolate for dipping; heat rice, flax or bean-filled hot pads for achy muscles; soften brown sugar; melt butter; steam vegetables; dry herbs and loosen labels from jars (just make sure all metal is removed).

While testing these ideas out, take some time to clean your microwave. First steam a wet cloth for a minute on high and let it stand for another minute. The steam softens any build-up. Then wipe your microwave down with a little hot soapy water to remove any greasy splatter.

The microwave is a convenient kitchen tool to have around, but it has its limitations. Something that should never be put in a microwave is metal, including foil, and single-use plastics, fine china and some ceramics.

I celebrate my microwave oven every day. I use it for heating leftovers - just put a damp paper towel over the top of the container and it keeps the food moist without drying it out - also for heating water for hot tea: 2 minutes and the water is piping hot. I have even made Bouillabaisse in our microwave. Enjoy your microwave and cook something new

I love walking through my home and turning on the Christmas lights and then sitting and listening to Christmas music. Remembering we are celebrating the Savior's birth. It truly is therapeutic and as the song goes: "The Most Wonderful Time of the Year." Except when it comes to wrapping the gifts.

If I didn't have so much wrapping paper, I would become a bag lady and use gift bags and tissue. But alas, I am a sucker for the fun and foil gift wrap, and of course any with gnomes and Snoopy. I'll quit typing and stop wrapping now.

Wait! One more paragraph: Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day is tomorrow. "A date which will live in Infamy" to quote Franklin D. Roosevelt. As we wind down from a tumultuous political year, let us stop and remember the men and women who live through that harrowing day. Add this day to our prayer list and be mindful we are blessed to live in the home of the brave and realize with finite precision that freedom is not free. People gave their lives, gave up their homes so we can have the freedom to live in a democracy



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Three Hornet seniors were named all-Big Sky Conference on Nov. 26, including outside hitters Bridgette Smith and Caitlin Volkmann being named to the first team, and rightside hitter Ellie Tisko named second team.

The Hornets received three all-league honors after finishing the regular season with an 18-11 overall record and 11-5 conference mark. Sacramento State finished in a tie for second place in the conference standings and will be the No. 3 seed at the Big Sky Tournament at the Nest.

Smith was named to the first team for the fourth straight year, becoming the first player in program history to be named first team on four occasions. Counting her pandemic season of 2020 when she was named to the second team, Smith is also the first player in school history to receive all-conference accolades on five occasions

Volkmann was named to the first team for the first time in her career, and Tisko received second team honors for the second consecutive season.

Sacramento State Women's Basketball Finishes Third

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senior Katie Peneueta finished with a career-high tying 20 points to go with nine rebounds while three other Hornets finished in double figures on Sunday Dec. 1, helping push the Sacramento State women's basketball team past Wagner, 73-34, to finish third at the FIU Thanksgiving Classic in Miami.

The Hornets snapped their threegame skid, improving to 5-3 overall on the year, while the Seahawks fell to 1-6 overall with the result. The 39-point victory was the largest of the year and the largest against a Division I opponent since a 48-point triumph over Portland State on Jan. 23, 2016.

Sunday's 34 points allowed are the fewest in the program's Division I history and the fewest since defeating Concordia College, 78-29, on Nov. 22, 1990. Sacramento State limited Wagner to just 15 first-half points — the lowest scoring first half by a Hornet opponent since Northern Colorado trailed, 24-15, at the break on Jan. 6, 2007.

Overall, from the field, the Hornets stifled the Seahawks to the tune of a .245 (12-for-49) field goal percentage for the game, which is the lowest by an opponent since Pacific Union shot the same percentage on Dec. 19, 2019.

In only her second game back after missing the first six games of the season due to injury, Peneueta came off the bench to finish 7-of-10 from the field and 5-of-7 from long distance in 29 minutes, matching her career high set at Northern Arizona on Feb. 3, 2022, and tied against Montana State just over a

year later on Feb. 23, 2023. Her nine rebounds were also two shy of her career high of 11 set against Idaho on Jan. 5, 2023.

She was followed closely by sophomore Lina Falk, who finished with 15 points on 6-of-13 from the field and added six rebounds, three assists, and three steals. Senior Jaydia Martin chipped in 12 points on 5-of-11 from the field, adding four rebounds and six assists, while freshman Sofia Alonso finished with 11 points, five rebounds, and six

Freshman Brooklyn Taylor also blocked four shots on the day, the most since Summah Hanson had four against Eastern Washington on Dec. 30, 2023.

The Hornets surrendered the first basket of the game, but it was all Sacramento State from that point on, outscoring Wagner by a 21-2 count the rest of the quarter — including

a 14-0 run to close the period. The

run grew to 17-0 with the first three

points of the second quarter as the

Hornets led by as many as 27 points

in the first half en route to the 41-15 halftime advantage.

Sacramento State limited the Seahawks to four points in both the first and third quarters — tied for the fewest in a single quarter this season along with the four-point fourth quarter at Cal State Fullerton back on Nov. 14 — and tallied the fourth and fifth single-digit quarters defensively this year.

Meanwhile, the offense was clicking, finishing the day shooting 49 percent from the field overall (26-of-53) — its second-highest single-game shooting performance of the year behind only the 55 percent against Lincoln University on Nov. 10. The Hornets were also 11-of-25 (.440) from behind the arc as a team, setting season highs for both makes and percentages and the best in both categories since hitting 13-of-24 from three-point range

against Idaho State at last year's Big

Sky Conference Tournament.

Sacramento State opened the second half on a 9-0 run, holding Wagner to without a point for the first six minutes of the period and to without a field goal until the final 30 seconds of the period. The Hornets led by as many as 46 points with two minutes to play in the fourth quarter and led nearly the entire game save for the 15 seconds that the Seahawks went in front to start the day and the 3:55 during which the contest was tied. Following three straight games

away from home, Sacramento State returns to The Nest this coming week, hosting Kansas City to open the second-annual Big Sky-Summit Challenge on Wednesday, Dec. 4, at 6:30 p.m. The Hornets then travel to Nebraska to take on Omaha on Saturday, Dec. 7, at Noon PT prior to the start of final exams. Both games are scheduled after press time.

Galt soccer alum Julian Parra has taken over as the new head coach and he reminds the boys who they play for in his pregame talks.


"This is not just any high school, it's tradition, it's culture and its authenticity," said Parra. "We want to keep making

What do you hope the ladies will learn from you?

That the journey to becoming a winning player, team, and program starts with desire and dedication. The desire to want to succeed and do better, and the dedication to put in the work at practice.

It may be cliche, but I believe sports can have a profound effect on one's life and how they carry themselves in the future. And ... maybe they will look back on their high school basketball experience with fondness and support their own children to continuing the tradition of playing high school sports.

What do you want people to know about you?

There was not a time in my past that I thought I would be a high school coach. I am very humbled that I have been selected as the GHS Varsity girls' basketball coach. It is a position, and title, I take seriously.


Without question, the current squad plays hard every night, but we are lacking in players that have the dog mentality that can set the bone crushing screens that the Kings seem to see nightly from other teams.



After redshirting his first year, he was moved from the defensive line to the offensive line this summer.


By the end of this fall season, he worked his way to the starting position at right
