Santa Kicks Off Season of Giving with Charitable Vending Machines

GREATER SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - With a twinkle in his eve. Santa Claus cut the ceremonial red ribbon at the Light the World Giving Machines on Monday and then showed the world the joy of giving by selecting a few gifts for those in need in the Greater Sacramento Area.

This wasn't just any Santa. It was the global icon Santa J. Claus, who is a mega-influencer with 5-million followers around the world. He stopped by the Giving Machines in the Westfield Galleria at Roseville to kick off the season of giving and encourage all to give to the less fortunate.

"My mission is to light the world with giving and that's the same mission these charitable vending machines have," Santa said. "You, too, can play Santa for someone who really needs it by purchasing gifts in the Light the World Giving Machines."

Santa's visit highlighted a ribbon-cutting ceremony that also featured remarks from William Jessup University President John Jackson representing the interfaith community, mayors from cities throughout the region, and the local charities that will benefit from the Giving Machine purchases.

This is the third year that the Giving Machines are located in the Sacramento area, where they have been some of the most successful in the world. Area residents can make purchases now through New Year's Day.

Light the World Giving Machines, sponsored by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints, are part of a global effort to promote the true spirit of the holidays by giving gifts to those in need. This holiday season, the Light the World Giving Machines are located in 106 cities internationally.

In addition to the Westfield Galleria at Roseville, the machines are located in Modesto's Vintage Faire Mall. Together, they are the

only ones this year in Northern California.

"These vending machines offer a unique and memorable way to light the world with love by serving and caring for others both locally and globally," said Bruce Anderson, director of the local effort. "For many parents, it offers an effective way to teach children about giving to good causes and the joy there is by helping others."

Each of the machines in Roseville contain 30 opportunities to give: 25 opportunities from local charities and five opportunities from global nonprofit organizations.

Among the many items that can be purchased are a winter coat for a homeless person in the region, a suicide prevention therapy session for a local youth and newborn essentials for a local young mother in need. Shoppers can even purchase two piglets for a family in an economically challenged country to help them start a business and become self-reliant.

The global Giving Machines initiative first launched in a few U.S. locations in 2017. Since then, more than \$32- million worth of goods for those in need has been donated. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints covers all program operational expenses. This ensures that participating nonprofits receive 100% of the collected funds.

The local charities with items in the Westfield Galleria at Roseville Giving Machines are Al-Misbaah, Catholic Charities -Diocese of Sacramento, Rancho Cordova Food Locker, First Step Communities of Sacramento and Lighthouse Counseling & Family Resource Center in Placer County.

Helena Madera-Silmi with Al-Misbaah said many families want to give to local charities that make a difference in the lives of those who are under-privileged but they don't know how to do it. The Giving Machines, she said, give them this opportunity while at the same time teaching children the importance of charity.

"A lot of youth love shopping at the mall and you're teaching them how to be empathetic, you're teaching them how to give back," Madera-Silmi said. "It's just an amazing way to give back.'

Carrie Johnson, executive director of the Rancho Cordova Food Locker, is impressed with the Giving Machines concept and hopes they will help to stock the charity's pantries.

"This is the most incredible way to give people the opportunity to give back to their communities," Johnson said. "We're all familiar with vending machines. What a fun way to give a donation to someone in need."

Among the items that shoppers can purchase for Lighthouse Counseling and Family Resource Center of Placer County are gifts of counseling for those experiencing abuse, domestic violence and suicidal thoughts.

"The Giving Machines give an opportunity to take the greed out of Christmas and bring Christ back into the holiday," said Gary McDonald, Lighthouse's executive director. "It really is about service and giving to people in need. It's really touched my heart. It really gives people an opportunity to think about other people besides their own families during this holiday season."

Continued from page 1 county supervisor, Frost was elected to the Citrus Heights City Council in 2012, served as Vice-Mayor in 2014 and eventually served as Mayor in 2015. In 2017, Frost assumed the role of District 4 County Supervisor, being reelected in 2020 with her term ending Jan. 6, 2025.

The well-planned and well-executed event on every front was managed and produced by All Events Management Group, Lisa Montes. "Milestones," one of their specialties, was achieved in every way this night.

The program began with a video, asking friends and colleagues to say one word about Frost and other memories. Part of the video prompted a standing ovation by the Sacramento Taxpayers Association as it began with the slow, unfolding text with the works of Frost, set to the music of "Star Wars."

Words attributed to Frost by many included grace under fire, grass roots, community, authentic, determined, genuine, common sense, calm and collected, dedicated, tenacious, true to your word, principled and much, much more. Jack Frost, thinking he would get the last word in after 12 years, realized that was yet to happen. He did thank God and all

who have helped them. He also thanked Rosario Rodriquez, who owns a taqueria in Folsom, "for the wonderful dinner." Rodriguez will be installed as District 4 Supervisor, filling Frost's spot. Jack Frost also thanked

sponsors Sacramento County Probation, Sacramento Taxpavers Association, Howard Jarvis Tax Association, American Legion Post 637 and Stones Casino. The dessert was provided by the Orangevale Chamber of Commerce. Carlos Verette acted as emcee and as deejay, filling the room with music.

This evening was one to remember. A prayer was said, thanking Jack and Sue Frost for all they have accomplished in the last 12 years and hoping they find ways to continue to make a difference in the new chapter of their lives.



Chaplain's Wife Misinterprets Dying Breath



This week, I'm very happy to announce the 65th birthday of my good friend Dale Swan. Yes, he's still alive, despite the wishes of his wife Jill.

No, wait. That sounds bad. Jill and Dale are a very fit and happy couple, so allow me to start this story again.

Dale Swan, a Sutter Hospice chaplain in Roseville, has always been clear with his wife, Jill, about how he wants to die.

"If I get sick and can't feed myself or make my own decisions, please don't let them put in a breathing or feeding tube. Let me go peacefully."

Jill, 62, is a CPA who is used to calculating the options, responded in the way many families do: "But I don't want you to starve to death."

Dale reassured his wife of 40 years that his hospice colleagues would be there for her and wouldn't let him suffer.

Dale is an avid cyclist who showed no signs of impending problems until one summer evening in 2018. He was watching TV from his recliner, eating a veggie burger and sipping a beer, when he was hit with troubling stomach pains.

He took some antacid and told his wife he was going to lie down. When Jill checked on him an hour later, she found his pain intensifying. She suggested a doctor, but Dale declined, instead making a restroom visit that brought only mild improvement.

An hour later, Jill heard Dale moaning with extreme pain. She insisted on taking him to the ER, but Dale countered by asking her to call 911. When paramedics arrived, they began assessing pain even as they were speculating it was a heart attack.

Within a few minutes, EMTs placed him on a gurney and loaded him in their ambulance. Beside him, they hung an IV drip of Fentanyl, a strong opiate for pain

Once inside the ER, the doctor ordered blood tests, a CT scan and a sonogram. Dale was suffering from pancreatitis, but staff could find no cause. They ruled out stomach blockage, gallbladder problems and even alcohol abuse.

Dale's pain level was rising to alarming levels, with no apparent diagnosis. Nurses admitted Dale to a room, ordered that he have no food for four days, and administered Dilaudid.

However, once inside the room, the pain medication slowed his respiration to six breaths per minute. Dale was rapidly losing consciousness.

Hospital staff grew concerned they'd overdosed him and instructed Jill to keep her husband awake or they'd have to give him Narcan, a drug that reverses opioid effects. "If that doesn't work," they grimly warned, "we'll have to insert a breathing tube down his throat."

Jill remembered Dale's instructions and shocked the staff by saying, "Oh no, he doesn't want that! He's always said to let him die peacefully."

Jill felt prepared. She and Dale had discussed many of the crucial questions involving the end of life and placed those answers into an advance directive, (often called a Living Will). The Advance Healthcare Directive is a document that we should all have.

The directive instructs doctors what we want done if we become incapacitated. Without the directive, doctors are obligated to do everything possible to save our life — even if "everything" means a painful delay of our inevitable

Fortunately, the medical staff knew this wasn't a moment to give up on a healthy and strong patient.

They helped Jill understand that Dale's document didn't apply to situations where a full recovery could be logically anticipated.

While Dale has fully recovered and returned to work, the happy couple is taking no more chances. Dale's given Jill more detailed instructions. And Jill, ever the logical number cruncher, has reviewed their life insurance policies just in case.

Farm Groups Work to expand Outreach on Groundwater Law

As implementation of California's Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ramped up during the past couple years, farmers who learned late about the far-reaching law have encountered additional challenges. In 2017, Madera County farmer Makhan Singh borrowed money to purchase farmland and plant almond trees, long-term investments he may be unable to recoup due to the law's restrictions on groundwater pumping. As groundwater management tightens under SGMA in the coming years, some groups are expanding their efforts to educate farmers about the law.

Farmers Need Plan to Keep Employees Safe from Avian Flu

To protect employees who work with dairy cows and poultry from H5N1 bird flu, farmers should have a basic plan in place, even if their animals are not infected. Such advice and other guidelines were shared during a webinar last month hosted by the California Farm Bureau-affiliated Farm Employers Labor Service, or FELS. As of Dec. 2, 31 human cases of H5N1 bird flu had been confirmed in California, according to the California Department of Public Health. All but one have been Central Valley dairy workers who had direct contact with infected cattle. The workers have all experienced mild symptoms, primarily eye infections, with no hospitalizations.

Farm Bureau Celebrates Success as Organization Prepares for 106th Annual Meeting

California Farm Bureau President Shannon Douglass reflected on the organization's successes this year as it prepares to hold its annual meeting Dec. 7-10 in Monterey. "These are indeed challenging times for farmers and ranchers in California, yet it's in moments like these that the importance of celebrating our accomplishments shines even brighter," Douglass said. "With Annual Meeting just days after Thanksgiving, it's a perfect time to pause and count our blessings—not just as individuals, but as part of this amazing organization we call Farm Bureau."

Farm Income Declines in 2024 Amid Challenges for Producers

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's farm income forecast for 2024 revealed a difficult year for the nation's agricultural producers. USDA projected net farm income at \$140.7 billion for 2024, down \$6 billion from 2023 and \$41.2 billion from \$181.9 billion in 2022 when net farm income reached its peak. "USDA's December report underscores the volatility of the U.S. farm economy as farmers face their second consecutive year of declining income," the American Farm Bureau Federation said in an analysis of the forecast. "Crop producers, in particular, face dramatic declines in cash receipts, with little hope for immediate relief as global supply chain disruptions continue and prices for key commodities remain depressed."

Social Security Matters Was Your IRMAA Article Incorrect?

Dear Rusty: In a recent article about Medicare's "Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount" (IRMAA) and how IRMAA affects Social Security taxes, you described which income gets included in the IRMAA calculation. You said it is "your combined income from all sources, including 50 % of the SS benefits you receive." That 50% number might be true in some cases, but I think a more accurate, general answer is that "your taxable SS benefit is what gets added to IRMAA." For example, we have enough income every year that we are always taxed at 85% of our SS benefit, so 85% of our SS values get added to our IRMAA. The way your answer reads, a reader of the article might think everyone has 50% of their SS benefit added to IRMAA. Signed: IRMAA

Dear IRMAA Victim: I think you may have confused two terms I used when describing Medicare's "Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount" or "IRMAA." I also used the term "MAGI" (Modified Adjusted Gross Income), and it's important to distinguish between those two terms.

MAGI is what determines if the IRMAA provision applies, and IRMAA will affect how much your Medicare premium is. But MAGI is also used for

another purpose - to see if MAGI is over the first threshyour SS benefits are taxable. Your MAGI consists of your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) from your income tax return, plus any non-taxable interest you may have had, plus 50% of the SS benefits you received during the tax year

IRMAA is a factor which will increase your monthly Medicare premium if your MAGI is over certain thresholds for your tax filing status. MAGI is used to determine if a higher Medicare premium applies, and it is also used to see if your SS benefits are subject to income tax.

Your MAGI does, indeed,

always use only 50% of the SS benefits you received during the tax year (not 85% in some cases). That's because the SS contributions included in MAGI relate to SS contributions your employer paid on your behalf. Only half of your received SS benefits are used to determine MAGI because that's the amount of your SS benefits attributable to your employer's contributions. Said another way, the SS payroll tax you personally paid while working was from your taxable income, so it is not included in MAGI. But the amount your employer contributed was not taxable by the IRS and, thus, is included in MAGI. So, it's the portion of your SS benefits attributable to your employer which is included in MAGI. Thus, the terminology that MAGI is "your combined income from all sources, including 50% of the SS benefits you received during the tax year" is correct. MAGI is what determines how much of your SS benefits are taxable, but your MAGI also determines if IRMAA applies to your Medicare premiums.

Your benefits are taxable if, as a married couple filing jointly, your total MAGI exceeds \$32,000. If your old but less than the 2nd threshold (\$44,000 for married filers) then 50% of the SS benefits you received during the tax year are included as part of your income taxable by the IRS. But if your MAGI goes over the 2nd threshold (\$44,000 for married filers) then up to 85% of the SS benefits you received during the tax year will be included as part of your income taxable by the IRS.


In short, MAGI determines how much of your income is subject to taxation. But MAGI is also used to determine if IRMAA applies. And how much your MAGI exceeds the separate IRMAA thresholds determines what your Medicare premium will be.

So, the article correctly states that IRMAA only counts 50% of the SS benefits received because that is what is included in MAGI (which is what determines if IRMAA applies). But the amount of SS which may be taxable income by the IRS could be up to 85% of benefits received during the tax year if your MAGI is high

Sadly, Sacramento returned to their losing ways, with a 115-106 loss to the Trailblazers, followed up by another heartbreaking performance against the Spurs, losing 127-125.

Sac Republic FC Re-Signs Rodrigo Lopez for 2025

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Dec. 3, Republic FC announced the club has re-signed Rodrigo Lopez for the 2025 season. The veteran midfielder will be added to the club's roster, pending league and federation approval. Per club policy, the terms of the contract were not disclosed.

"RoRo is a special player and we're thrilled to have him back in Sacramento for another season," said Republic FC President and General Manager Todd Dunivant. "We know how much winning another championship means to him, and we are looking forward to his continued leadership, both on and off the field."

"My injury last season was just a setback and it doesn't define me," said Lopez. "I'm ready to respond with everything I've got. I'm back and there is only one thing on my mind - to win another championship for this club and the city of Sacramento."

As the first signing in Indomitable Club history,



Lopez has been a fixture in the club's record books. He is currently the club's alltime assist leader (41), while also ranking second all-time in appearances (136), minutes

(10,108) and goals (41). In six seasons, Lopez earned several accolades including 2014 USL Championship Final MVP and two USL Championship All-League First Team selections (2014, 2022).

He was a standout player in Sacramento's historic run to the Open Cup Final in 2022 and became the first player to be named both the

Player of the Tournament and Lower-Division Player of the Tournament (TheCup.US) after leading all players with four goals and four assists.

In 2024, he was honored when U.S. Soccer renamed the Northern California Round of 32 & Quarterfinal to the "Lopez Division" - the only division to be named after an active player, the Modern Era Open Cup assist leader.

In an injury-shortened 2024 campaign, he made 9 appearances, with two goals and one assist, and earned two Team of the Week selections before suffering a torn ACL on May 21.

Lopez's professional career began in 2005 with MLSside Chivas USA. After three seasons with the southern California club, he would move on to compete in USL PDL, MLS Reserve League, and Mexico's top leagues – Ascenso MX and Liga MX. In addition to his stints with Republic FC, he also featured in USL Championship for Rio Grande Valley FC, helping the team the reach the 2021 Western Conference Semifinals.


SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -


