CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - It's just after 8 a.m. on Thursday, Jan. 23, and the two-man crew of the Citrus Heights Beautification Crew (BC), Leon Yang and James Hom, rolls out from the city's general services yard at 6360 Fountain Square Drive to meet up with Citrus Heights Police unit detectives on their first

Today's ride along with the Beautification Crew is coordinated by Regina M. Cave, city general services director who follows behind the brightly painted

truck in her city sedan describing the types of

calls I'm likely to see. The crew also responds to frequent "see, click and fix" requests reported to the city's general services department where no

police response is needed, Cave explained.

We meet Citrus Heights Police Department Detective Felicia Taylor and Detective Michael Machado of the Impact Team in the field. Lt. William Dunning oversees the work of the two assigned detectives who cover the city's 14.2 square miles. Today's focus is Greenback Lane.

The three-and-a-halfhour morning shift of the city's Beautification Crew proves to be a very busy one with multiple calls.

Walmart at Stock Ranch Plans Expansion

- Walmart customers in Citrus Heights who enjoy the convenience of shopping online for their groceries and then pick them up at the Stock Ranch store at 7010 Auburn Blvd. in Citrus Heights will soon have a new designated enlarged pickup area for their purchases.

In December, the Citrus Heights Planning Commission, by a 6-0 vote, approved an expansion project at Walmart, adding about 3,271 square feet to the north side (front) of the building, which will include both an expansion for the online grocery pickup area and the number of designated grocery pick-up parking spaces.

"We're seeing many more customers preferring to pick up their groceries after placing an online order," said one store manager, watching as store personnel busily pushed carts up and down aisles,



each stacked with individual blue customer bins bearing an order tag.

On one morning, the number of Walmart associates who were busily filling individual online orders outnumbered the number of customers browsing the aisles. In a brief half-hour period, it was easy to count some 60 individual bins being filled by Walmart

associates with groceries

of all types. "Customers just enjoy

the convenience of placing an order and then trusting us to carry it out," one

Walmart staff member said. Her cart had six orders to Submitted documents to the city show the expansion of the main building

with a new addition near the current Garden Center. The expanded building

area will enclose an existing outdoor space located east of the store's main entrance. Currently, this area, which is screened by an existing wall, serves as an outdoor employee rest area and is occasionally used for storing racks and garden center supplies. The project will enclose this space and repurpose it for the new use.

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Teens Create Messages of Love

Two high school students have found a way to give back to young patients and their families at Shriners Hospital in Sacramento this Valentine's Day.

Norcal Gift From the Heart Foundation's second annual Valentine's Day Drive is underway and preparing to shower patients and their families with handmade Valentines and hundreds of toys and teen items on Feb. 14.

Oak Ridge High School Junior Aislynne Hartman, 16, and Ponderosa High School Sophomore Sophia Alonso, 15, created their nonprofit organization, the Norcal Gift From the Heart Foundation, in 2024 with the mission of encouraging philanthropy among students in their community while focusing on the specific support of children's charities.

The nonprofit Norcal Gift From the Heart organization is based out of Gold River.

"It all started with the simple idea of collecting handmade Valentines with loving messages for teens," Hartman said. "The first year, it was just the two of us and we asked our own schools to help us make Valentines but this year, more than 12 schools in four counties have agreed to either make Valentines or collect tovs for Shriners."

While their first year was largely focused on all the paperwork necessary for starting a nonprofit organization and getting their IRS tax-exempt status, the teens shared that this year has been dedicated to spreading the word and encouraging other schools to help them reach their goal of collecting 1,200 valentines.

To reach this goal, Hartman and Alonso created a Student

students from area high schools and providing them with the tools and public speaking points to launch the program on their own campuses.

"Our foundation supplies premade valentine kits for all the schools that want to participate. The kits include things like stickers, card-making materials and sample messages," said co-founder Alonso. "This year, we also created a special QR

media so donors could ship a toy or teen item directly to the foundation." Both girls agreed that their favorite part of the drive is reading the sincere personal messages and seeing how much effort kids put into making their cards.

"We hope the kids and teens at Shriners really feel all of our love this Valentine's Day," Hartman added.

Also feeling the love is Hartman's mother, Kellie

"Exposure to running her own business is not new to Aislynne, who spent much of her life working at her parents' businesses growing up. Her father, Galen Hartman, owned Ground Zero Auto Body Inc., located at 11297 Coloma Road, for 25 years before transitioning to teaching auto body at Mather Center," Kellie Hartman said. "At an early age, Aislynne learned data entry and greeting customers. I own a family law office in Gold River, where Aislynne works as

a part-time law clerk. It simply made sense to start her nonprofit in Gold River, since that has always been where she spends her time outside of school and the community has always been so supportive of her family's businesses."

arrest for an individual on probation possessing narcotics paraphernalia found sleeping on a sidewalk outside of Boost Mobile at the corner of Old Auburn Boulevard and Greenback Lane.

Many of the homeless residents I encountered on the morning patrol were well-known to detectives of the Citrus Heights Police Department Impact Team during today's patrol round.

It is unlawful for anyone to store belongings on public property (CHMC 50-504) or on private property, without the property owner's permission (CHMC 74-8), according to city ordinances. There is no required notice before removing abandoned property from public areas and it is subject to discarding.

During the morning shift, the Impact detectives typically make first contact with the homeless before the Beautification Crew team gets to work.

"When not paired with the Impact Team, the Beautification Crew can quickly call for backup from CHPD units in the field, whenever they need to," Cave said. "Their safety is always paramount."

Detective Taylor displayed the evidence that she and fellow Detective Machado found, which they had placed on the hood of her patrol vehicle.

The Beautification Crew finishes their cleanup and the two detectives waited for a time for another officer to hand off their suspect before resuming their rounds.

On the opposite side of the busy intersection of Old Auburn Boulevard and Greenback Lane, the two detectives will make two stops.

One stop is at a Sacramento RT bus shelter diagonally across the intersection. The detectives have noticed through long range binoculars a homeless person set up an encampment in the bus shelter.

The individual, once confronted by Citrus Heights Police Department Impact officers at the bus shelter does comply

with their request to move along.

The Impact Team was looking for an unhoused female who had been feeding feral cats from her sidewalk encampment near what they described as a known methadone clinic.

Detectives searched around the commercial building but were unable to find her. Her encampment was then removed.

"When illegal sites are occupied or a responsible person is readily available, the Beautification Crew works with those individuals to discard unwanted refuse while allowing them to remove property of personal value," according to a city handout.

"For the period of Jan. 1 to 21, 2025, the Beautification Crew picked up and disposed of 2.97 tons of materials," Cave said. "And that does not include materials and personal belongings which are booked into CHPD, as you witnessed today," she said.

In all, the city's Beautification Crew has addressed more than 5,000 service

requests since the two-person crew began addressing blight on the streets in December 2022.

The city also partners with other government agencies which have jurisdictional responsibilities within the shared borders of the city, such as Caltrans, to increase cleanup and enforcement. The Sunrise Recreation and Parks District (SRPD) works closely with the Impact Team and the Beautification Crew in areas where city streets give way to park boundaries.

The city's shopping cart ordinance also ensures shopping carts don't leave the sites where they belong. When they do, shopping carts can find their way into the city's creek corridors.

"We have a rather good relationship with the major retail stores in the city and the companies they contract to return their carts," Cave said. "Sometimes it takes a phone call or two, but they're very good about that."

A city ordinance allows quicker city clean-up response by reducing the time frame necessary for the Beautification Crew of the Citrus Heights Police Department to impound shopping carts, she said.

At the 7-11 convenience store across from San Juan High School, an individual in a sleeping bag was tucked in behind a sign facing Greenback Lane. Citrus Heights Police Department Impact detectives issued a citation for trespassing at the store manager's request.

The two detectives said they stop to talk to individuals whom they felt might need assistance or referral to local agencies.

A chronic nuisance offender program has been implemented by the Citrus Heights Police Department to prosecute chronic offenders of codes and ordinances for individuals and property.

"Much of our work is general outreach, talking to them to see how we can be of help and connecting them to the resources they may need," said Detective Machado.

A young couple and their dog had built an extensive encampment behind a closed church along Greenback Lane. While the couple's dog was safely restrained, they sat on a sidewalk while Citrus Heights Police Department officers assisted the crew in loading their belongings onto the

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Gov. Meets with Small Business Owners Impacted by Firestorm

LOS ANGELES, CA (MPG) -Continuing to have an eye toward recovery and rebuilding, Governor Gavin Newsom on Jan. 21 met with workers and small business owners impacted by the devastating Los Angeles firestorm to hear their stories and highlight the state's work to help communities rebuild.

The Governor visited NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) in La Canada Flintridge for a conversation with employees impacted by the Eaton Fire. Hundreds of Jet Propulsion Laboratory employees lost their homes, with over 100 more likely to be displaced due to damage to their homes. Joined by Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Chair Kathryn Barger, Governor Newsom talked with the employees about rebuilding efforts, as well as concerns about home insurance.

As the largest employer of those impacted by the Eaton Fire, Jet Propulsion Laboratory started a disaster relief fund to help employees, which has already raised over \$2 million. Jet Propulsion Laboratory manages the Deep Space Network, a global web of antennas that communicate with spacecraft. The NASA facility has partnered with CAL FIRE to use soil moisture sensors to support the state's fire management and prevention efforts. JPL also helped California launch pollution-tracking satellites last year and partners with the state on drought monitoring.

Governor Newsom also visited with small business owners Kevin Hockin and Rosanna Kvernmo. They started Side Pie as a pizza pop-up during the

Helping Small Businesses Recover

Since the firestorm, California has worked with federal and local providers to help businesses with the resources and support they need to recover and rebuild.

200+ business advisors from Small Business Support Centers funded through the California Office of the Small Business Advocate's (CalOSBA) Technical Assistance Program are staffed across the region.

This includes business advisors from the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and Women's Business Center (WBC) who can answer loan application, insurance, employee wsupport and business recovery questions. They are co-located

at the Disaster Recovery Center at Pasadena City College and the Disaster Loan Outreach Center in Camarillo (Ventura County).

Small Business Development Center and Women's Business Center advisors are also present at the various Business Recovery Centers organized by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA).

California Office of the Small Business Advocates has launched a Resource Guide for small businesses impacted by the wildfires through its Outsmart Disaster website, and is conducting a series of online trainings in both English and Spanish.

The California Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank (IBank) is offering loan programs for businesses from one to 750 employees affected by the LA wildfires.

Disaster Relief Loan Guarantee Program (DRLGP) issues loan guarantees up to 95% of the loan through IBank's partner Financial Development Corporations to help small business borrowers impacted by disaster who need term loans or lines of credit for working capital.

Additionally, Governor Newsom has issued a number of executive orders in response to the Los Angeles fire storms to help aid in rebuilding and recovery, create more temporary housing, and protect survivors from exploitation and price gouging.

Get Help Today

Californians can go to CA.gov/ LAfires – a hub for information and resources from state, local and federal government.

Individuals and business owners who sustained losses from wildfires in Los Angeles County can apply for disaster assistance online at DisasterAssistance.gov, by calling 800-621-3362, or by using the FEMA smart phone application. Assistance is available in more than 40 languages.

If you use a relay service, such as video relay service (VRS), captioned telephone service or others, give FEMA the number for that service.

State Water Project Increases 2025 Allocation Forecast

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On Jan. 28, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) announced an update to the State Water Project allocation forecast for 2025. The allocation has increased to 20 percent of requested supplies, up from 15 percent in December. The State Water Project provides water to 29 public water agencies that serve 27 million Californians.

While January has been incredibly dry across California, storm runoff into the state's reservoirs came in higher than forecasted at the end of December allowing for a modest allocation increase. Storms in late November and early December had a positive impact by saturating the ground, allowing for storms through December to more efficiently runoff into reservoirs.

More storms are needed, and the longrange forecast does hint at a return to wet conditions in early February that could bring much-needed rain and snow.

"We are in the middle of our biggest months for precipitation for California, and unfortunately January has been very dry, putting a significant dent in our season," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "A return to wet weather is critical for our season's success and it will take many more storms to make up the deficit and further boost water supply deliveries."

Despite the dry conditions, California has effectively managed its reservoirs to keep storage above average for this time of year. Lake Oroville, the State Water Project's largest reservoir, is currently at 127 percent of average for this time of year. San Luis Reservoir, which is jointly operated by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, is at 102 percent of average for this time of year.

Reservoirs in Southern California are also near or above their historical averages.

Each year, the department provides State Water Project allocation forecasts based on available water storage, projected water supply, and water demands. Allocations are updated

monthly as snowpack, rainfall, and runoff information is assessed, with a final allocation typically determined in May or June.

As the winter progresses, if California sees an increase in rain and snowfall, the allocation forecast may increase. Learn more about how the State Water Project allocation process works at https://water.ca.gov/News/Blog/2025/ Jan-25/Get-the-Facts-About-the-State-Water-Project-Allocation.

FAIR Applauds Passage of the Laken Riley Act

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - The following statement was issued by Dan Stein, president of the Federation for American Immigration Reform (FAIR) in response to final passage of the Laken Riley Act by Congress.

"The Federation for American Immigration Reform applauds Congress for its swift action in passing the Laken Riley Act with bipartisan support. Fittingly, final passage by the House of Representatives comes eleven months to the day after the Georgia nursing student was brutally murdered by a criminal illegal alien who had been allowed to enter our country and remained at large even after being charged with serious offenses in New York City.

"The Laken Riley Act will be one of the first pieces of legislation President Trump signs into law in his new administration. In his inaugural address, the president spoke of the need to restore common sense to government, and enacting legislation that requires **Immigration and Customs Enforcement** to detain more criminal aliens certainly fits that description.

"It is especially heartening that the bill that emerged from the Senate Monday and passed today in the House is stronger than the original version. Led by Senators Joni Ernst (R-Iowa), Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa) and John Fetterman (D-Pa.), that chamber, by a 75-24 margin, added key provisions from Sarah's Law to the final bill. The amendment is named for Sarah Root, another promising young woman who was killed in 2016 by an illegal alien drunk driver who was released from federal custody and allowed to run free. This added provision requires DHS to issue detainers and take into custody aliens who are charged with, arrested for, convicted of, or admit to having committed crimes that resulted in death or serious bodily injury. "Along with the executive orders

signed by President Trump on his first day in office, the bipartisan support for the Laken Riley Act gives Americans hope that enactment of other commonsense border and immigration enforcement measures, that truly protect the interest and security of the American people, can be achieved in the 119th Congress."

New Testing Finds Illegal Levels of Bisphenol S in Receipt Paper

CALIFORNIA (MPG) - On Jan. 14, the nonprofit watchdog Center for Environmental Health (CEH) announced new legal action against eight companies for exposing customers to Bisphenol S (BPS)-the lesser-known but also harmful chemical cousin to Bisphenol A (BPA)-in receipt paper.

Bisphenol S, like Bisphenol A, is a hormone-disrupting chemical that mimics estrogen and can disrupt the normal functioning of the body, including metabolism, growth and development and reproduction.

Bisphenol S was added to the list of chemicals known to the state of California to cause cancer and reproductive issues at the end of 2023, which allowed businesses a one-year grace period to ensure that their products either did not contain this chemical, or included a clear and reasonable warning for the presence of Bisphenol S. After Dec. 29, 2024, the Center for Environmental Health conducted testing to determine if receipt paper still included this chemical in levels that can harm human health and found eight companies in violation of California Proposition 65.

The retailers are Exxon, Walmart, Saks Off 5th, Aesop, Dick's Sporting Goods, Ross, Ace

Hardware and Lowe's. Previously, the Center for Environmental Health reached legal agreements with over 10 major retailers and suppliers of receipts, requiring that they remove Bisphenol A

from their receipt thermal paper. While

the receipts were reformulated to remove

Bisphenol A, Center for Environmental

Health's recent investigation showed the

presence of Bisphenol S.

"For more than two decades, CEH has ensured that companies and manufacturers that remove one toxic chemical from their products do not replace it with another toxic, regrettable substitute," said Kizzy Charles-Guzman, CEO at Center for Environmental Health. "These companies have the opportunity to lead by improving their product specifications so that the receipt paper they purchase is safer for their workers and customers."

In 2021, Center for Environmental Health co-created a certification program that highlights products-including thermal paper used for receipts—that do not contain harmful chemicals.

"Studies show that BPS, like BPA, can be absorbed through skin when handling receipt paper, even for short periods," said Shakoora Azimi-Gaylon, senior director of the Toxic Exposures and Pollution Prevent Program at Center for Environmental Health. "When companies know better, they must do better. We are calling on retailers to demand a healthier specification for receipt paper from their suppliers, and suppliers have an opportunity to meet this demand and certify their products under CEH and Clean Production Action's standard."

To reduce exposure to Bisphenol S, Center for Environmental Health recommends that whenever possible, consumers either decline receipts printed on thermal paper, or opt to receive receipts via email for their purchases. Store workers who must handle receipts should wear gloves if possible or avoid using alcohol-based hand cleaners before handling a receipt because it can significantly increase the absorption of Bisphenol S.

Social Security Matters

Social Security Benefits for Someone with Multiple Ex-spouses

Dear Rusty: If a financially well-off individual had multiple ex-spouses, could it happen that the multiple ex-spouses could each be collecting Social Security based on their own financial situation as compared to their rich ex-spouses? Thus, multiple payouts by SS? Just curious, because there are probably many people in this situation as a result of the ever-increasing number of people involved in multiple marriages that each lasted more than ten years. Signed: Curious Ex-Spouse

D e a r Curious Ex-Spouse: A former spouse can only collect one SS benefit – either their own SS retirement amount, or an amount as an ex-spouse if the marriage lasted 10 years or more. And it is possible for multiple ex-spouses of a marriage to the same person to qualify for benefits from those unions, if each marriage lasted at least 10 years. But each ex-spouse can only qualify for one benefit payment – either their own earned SS benefit, or their benefit as an ex-spouse. In other words, someone with two (or more) ex-spouses might have their ex's collecting full benefits on their record, provided that each marriage lasted at least 10 years. But an ex-spouse can only get one benefit -their own SS retirement amount or an ex-spouse amount whichever is higher).

It's possible, also, that an ex-spouse can collect benefits from a former spouse at the same time as a current spouse is also collecting spouse benefits on the same record. And there is no detriment to either's amount because multiple spouses or ex-spouses are collecting on a one person's SS record (Social Security is, after all, a means for spouses, or ex-spouses, to avoid poverty). However, an ex-spouse's own SS retirement benefit (from their personal lifetime work record) must be less than any ex-spouse

benefit they are entitled to from a former spouse. Essentially, if the "10-years-married" rule is satisfied, ex-spouses are subject to the same benefit rules as a current

You are correct that we see some cases like this these days, but each eligible ex-spouse can only get one benefit, and their ex-spouse benefit is always offset by any personal SS retirement benefit the ex-spouse may also be entitled to on their own lifetime work record.

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California's Taxes on Wealth May Hinge on How Trump Treats Deductions

California's state budget is inordinately dependent on taxing the incomes of wealthy residents.

Gov. Gavin Newsom's proposed 2025-26 budget assumes that the state will receive \$133.7 billion in personal income taxes, more than 60% of general fund revenues. Nearly half of that would be paid by the 1% of Californians sitting atop the taxable income ladder.

The downside risk of such dependency is that taxes on the rich tend to swing up and down more than taxes on ordinary wage earners, because earnings on investments are substantial portions of wealthy people's taxable incomes.

When the rich are getting richer, California sees multi-billion-dollar revenue windfalls. But downturns in their investments often result in sharp declines in tax receipts. In his budget, Newsom mentions the "swings in revenues and uncertainty that are a hallmark of California's volatile tax system."

The new budget cites a recent uptick in revenues that allowed Newsom's budget to expand some categories of spending, such as a big increase in tax subsidies for the beleaguered Southern California film and video industry, one of his pet tax returns to \$10,000. programs.

The validity of the new budget's revenue assumptions is in doubt because of the wildfires that have afflicted Los Angeles County. But regardless of their impact, the state will continue to depend on volatile revenues from the

The limit has the indirect effect of increasing federal levies on taxpayers who pay more than \$10,000 in SALT each year. Other aspects of the 2017 tax bill, signed by Trump, benefited the wealthy but even so, California's tax officials estimated that the net impact on California tax-

lost their homes in Pacific Palisades and Malibu.

By happenstance, just as the new budget and the wildfires become prominent items on the Capitol's political agenda, something else is happening in Washington that could affect California's harvest of taxes on the rich.

With Donald Trump back in the White House, negotiations are underway on repeal or retention of a 2017 change in federal tax law that adversely affected states such as California and New York, whose budgets depend on taxing the incomes of the rich.

The change, part of a much larger overhaul of tax policy, limited deductions for state and local taxes - SALT in the politi-

cal vernacular - on federal

payers would be a \$12 billion annual increase in their federal tax obligations.

New York and California legislators and governors saw it as a deliberate hit by Republicans, including Trump, on blue state finances and have tried, on and off, to have it repealed ever since, to no avail. They worried aloud that the much-reduced SALT deduction would encourage wealthy taxpayers to move to states with low or no income taxes, such as Nevada, Texas and Florida.

Walmart at Stock Ranch Plans Expansion

The new area will allow Walmart associates to assemble and store online orders, which will then be delivered to customers waiting in designated parking spaces specifically for online order pick-up.

Online consumers in the U.S. spent an estimated \$45.71 billion on groceries from Walmart in 2023. Projections indicate a 17.5 percent annual growth rate in Walmart's online grocery sales. In 2025, digital consumers will spend an estimated \$63.79 billion on Walmart

Nationwide online grocery sales will total as much as \$257.5 billion in 2024; projections indicate that sales will increase up to \$363.8 billion in 2026.

The new building addition will feature three curved metal awnings and four decorative columns on the front. Exterior paint colors will match the building's existing terra cotta color. New safety barriers will match existing ones, city documents show.

Online order pick-up parking spaces will be re-striped to meet brand standards. Several regular parking spaces will be converted to online grocery pick-up spaces, increasing the total pickup spots.

According to plan documents, the overall distribution of regular and acces-

sible parking spaces will not change. Safety features, including new crosswalk markings will be added near the new building addition to "safely manage the movement" of both employees and vehicles through the area.

At its December meeting, the Citrus Heights Planning Commission also approved design and use permits, along with an amendment to the Stock Ranch Guide for construction of a new 2,309-square-foot Starbucks with a drive-thru lane wrapping around the back to be built on an undeveloped parcel facing Auburn Boulevard.

Development of Stock Ranch began with the construction of the Costco building in 2003 and Walmart in 2005. The city's Stock Ranch development plan, approved in February 2001, provides for the development of 570,000 square feet of commercial areas as well as 43-plus acres for residential development and 32 acres of open space, according to the city's website.

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
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

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
