

Tucked away behind Rio Linda High School in a grove of shade trees is one of the oldest dirt quarter midget racetracks in the country. Roy Hayer Memorial Speedway is named for a longtime quarter midget supporter that "produces great racing programs and great citizens." Home of the Capitol Quarter Midget Association, the facilities include a 1/20-mile dirt racing surface, permanent timing and scoring tower, snack bar, permanent restrooms, shaded spectator stands and a large pit area.

Established in 1954, the Capital Quarter Midget Association club and racing facility have long played a part in quarter midget racing for youth in Northern California.

United Way Helps Residents File Taxes for Free

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Residents throughout the Sacramento region are eligible to file their taxes online or in person for free through United Way California Capital Region's Free Tax Preparation program that runs through April 15.

Households that earned less than \$67,000 in 2024 can file for free and trained tax volunteers will help maximize cash back from state and federal credits, including the federal and state Earned Income Tax Credits (EITC and CalEITC).





SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The James Kaneko Art Galley, located on the American River College campus, is hosting a retrospective exhibition of Dan Samborski paintings through Feb. 14.

Samborski earned his Master of Arts degree from California State University Sacramento in 1990 and followed that up with a 32-year teaching career as an art professor at American River College.

The art exhibit is titled, "The End of Painting" to which Samborski explains in the exhibit program,

"The earliest Art styles to influence my own teenage creative efforts turned out to have killed painting too. In the 1960s, Pop Art, and then later 1970s Photorealism, poked a rebellious finger into the eye of high-minded Modern Art. Ironically, Abstract Expressionism had become accepted as the new academic taste. The lack of content in that non-objective Art now makes it the preferred choice for corporate wallpaper."

The exhibit includes examples of the artist's work over the last four decades with titles such as "Urbane Primitive," "End of Ego,", "Postmodern

Gothic" and "1% Solution."

In the exhibit program, the artist explains, "After decades of studying and teaching Art history, I tend to see it everywhere. Every choice I make as an artist depends on some dead artist's efforts before me. All these paintings are visual conversations with the history of painting styles, types of paint and various application techniques."

The James Kaneko Gallery is located at 4700 College Oak Drive in Sacramento. Gallery hours are 11 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays and 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Fridays.

Kiley Helps Introduce the National Quarter Midget Racing Returns Human Trafficking Database Act

WASHINGTON (MPG) - On Jan. 31 Representatives Kevin Kiley (R-CA), Harriet Hageman (R-WY) and Hank Johnson (D-GA) introduced the National Human Trafficking Database Act, which would establish a national human trafficking database at the Department of Justice (DOJ) and incentivize state law enforcement agencies to report data. Senators Marsha Blackburn (R-TN) and Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) introduced the legislation in the Senate.

"Tens of thousands of human trafficking cases are reported every year in the United States. We must do everything we can to prevent human trafficking and having the necessary tools at our disposable will bring us closer to stopping this awful crime," said Rep. Kiley. "The bipartisan National Human Trafficking Database Act would help combat this heinous crime by establishing a national database to fill critical information gaps and ultimately save lives."

"For far too long, human trafficking has been prevalent across our country, including on tribal lands. This crisis reached epidemic proportions under the Biden Administration, with 'coyotes' and cartel operatives preying on vulnerable women and children crossing our wideopen southern border. President Trump took decisive action to crack down on these cartels his first few weeks in office,

strengthening border security and disrupting trafficking networks. By supporting his efforts and establishing a human trafficking database, we can provide law enforcement with the tools needed to track movements, determine patterns that expedite victim recovery, apprehend perpetrators more quickly, and identify challenges with prosecutions. I am proud to co-lead this important legislation's reintroduction," said Rep. Hageman.

"The painful truth is that most victims of human trafficking, particularly sex trafficking, are not trafficked across the southern border. Eighty-five percent of human trafficking victims - many of them young runaways living in the U.S. who fall victim to traffickers - are U.S. citizens," said Rep. Johnson. "The FBI has reported that Atlanta has one of the highest sex trafficking rates in the country. We must do all we can to give our government and our communities the tools they need to combat this scourge and protect our young people. I'm please to help lead this bipartisan, bicameral effort to empower the fight against human trafficking.'

Background:

Human trafficking is among the fastest-growing illicit trades in the world, generating over \$150 billion in profits each year. According to the United Nations' International Labour Organization, human traffickers victimize an estimated 28 million people worldwide with 80% subjected to forced labor and 20% in sex trafficking. In 2022, agencies within the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) helped 765 human trafficking victims and made 3,655 trafficking-related arrests. As of 2022, DHS allocated more than \$60 million to combating human smuggling and sent over 1,300 personnel to the southwest border and Latin America to aid in this effort.

Human traffickers know no bounds in their pursuit of victims, and their actions often cause mental trauma, physical harm, financial ruin, and countless other harms to survivors. Many trafficking cases in the U.S. involve workers in jobs with low pay and few legal protections in the underground economy and the service industry. As a result, it's critical that states can collect data on the human trafficking that occurs in their state and share it with the federal government.

Dear Dave,

How do I get my employees to buy-in to the company mission, and really get onboard with what I want to accomplish and the steps toward making it happen? I feel like I have a lot of good people working for me, but I'm not sure I'm getting the message across in terms what I expect and what it will take for them and the business to succeed.

It's a no-brainer that employee buy-in is great, even essential, for your business. But actually getting buy-in? That can be tough. But here are four steps I believe are essential to setting the stage for winning employees over and gaining their trust, their loyalty and their respect.

I am today? Great leaders are open to feedback, humble and willing to grow. They lead by serving. And most teams will follow a good example, so lead with confidence, focus and transparency.

Next, define your mission, vision and values. Your mission describes what you do and why it matters. Your vision paints a picture of what the future will look like when your mission is lived out, and your values declare what your company stands for and guide how you make decisions. Share these often, and be very clear when you do. If these principles aren't firmly in place and understood, you're asking your team to navigate without a map.

Also, communicate consistently and clearly. Your team members aren't a bunch of mind readers. Share all your expectations and goals frequently, along with the why behind your plans. Make time for questions and mentoring, too. Your ability to communicate well goes a long way

toward determining team satisfaction and retention, along with the quality of your relationships and the level of trust you earn.

Finally, have a solid strategic plan. Don't just relay a vague outline your company's destination, map out a clear path of how to get there with all vour leaders. A strategic plan with actionable steps shows your team what winning looks like and what it'll take to succeed.

And when the plan is specific and achievable, your team will rally around it.

Semitrucks Carry Young Patient's Story Across Country

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The story of a 7-year-old boy's health care journey will take the country by storm this year.

A larger-than-life image of UC Davis Children's Hospital patient Shine Arslanian appears on the sides of two semitrucks from Knight Transportation and Swift Transportation.

The trucks also include photos of the Children's Hospital transport team, a 24/7 unit that connects children such as Shine in 33 counties in Northern California, with specialized pediatric care at UC Davis Children's Hospital.

Both trucks will cross the country in 2025. It is part of the trucking companies' Fleet of Miracles campaign, which raises awareness for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals.

Born five weeks early in 2017, Shine weighed just 4.5 pounds and was transported to UC Davis Children's Hospital, where he was diagnosed with two very rare genetic conditions.

Shine has had 17 surgeries to date, including



Area Residents Help Raise More Than \$940,000 for Wildfire Relief

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Responsible parents looking for ways to supplement the educational and personal growth opportunities for their children or themselves should consider hosting a teenage exchange student for an academic semester or year. Children and adults alike, by interacting daily with an international student, broaden their perspective on the world and discover new facts and ideas.

NorthWest Student Exchange places international high school students with adults and families throughout the country. Exchange students add a dimension to the family dynamic.

Benefits to the exchange students include honing their English language skills; learning about this country's educational system; understanding U.S. social, political and cultural values; and establishing international friendships.

Benefits to the hosts are similar. Not only can hosts learn about another culture and its values but they can view the U.S. through another's eyes and thereby gain a broader understanding of the U.S.

Adults do not need to have children at home to host. Many childless couples, empty nesters and single-parent families have enjoyed exchange students. NorthWest Student Exchange places students from dozens of countries with local families who have varied interests. The international students are matched to a host family's lifestyle and interests, according to NorthWest Student Exchange Local Area Coordinator Sheryl Longsworth.

Those unable to host can earn up to \$175 for every student placed with referrals. Nonprofit organizations that refer families to Longsworth can receive \$175 per student in the form of a donation to the organization. While hosts cannot be compensated for hosting, tax deductions might be available. Check with your tax preparer, Longsworth recommended.

'NWSE exchange students are closely screened for appropriate motivation. academic and language skills; our students have solid emotional and practical support from NWSE professional partners abroad, and from the students' natural parents in their own countries," Longsworth said. "Our students come with their own spending money, health and accident insurance. Hosts are not expected to be tour guides. Students are here to go to school to improve their English, not be tourists. NWSE local academic coordinators, like me, recruit, screen and orient local hosts and provide close support throughout the program."

Flexible hosting terms are available, including hosting for a month, as a welcome host or on a trial basis.

"My family has personally hosted students from France and China and we keep in touch with every student even years later," Longsworth said. "While they stayed with us, they shared games they play at home with us, cooked their favorite meals and tried to teach us their language and share their culture. We also have been invited to stay at their family's homes when we visit their country. One of our French students even calls me his 'American mom.""

"Students are placed with hosts quickly, so if you're interested in a specific student, contact me as soon as possible so I can have that student 'put on hold' for you," Longsworth said. "If that student is placed elsewhere, I will do my best to find another student that fits your or your family's lifestyle and interests."

January is National Human Trafficking Awareness Month, and each year, the U.S. Department of State recognizes it as a way to raise awareness about this crime that impacts communities across the country.

Several of Sacramento County's community partners are dedicated to helping victims of human trafficking.

My Sister's House aids Asian and Pacific Islanders and other underserved women and children impacted by domestic violence, sexual assault and human trafficking.

The Family Justice Center helps victims during legal proceedings.

Other helpful resources include RTI International providing insight into information about sex trafficking by collecting and sharing data about the issue, and the National Human Trafficking Hotline allowing residents to report tips about suspicious activity that they have observed. (The National Human Trafficking Hotline is 888-373-7888 and the text is 233733).

We can all do our part to keep community members safe from human trafficking.

Learn the signs of human trafficking, which can include:

Multiple employees living with their employer.

A person who is not given the chance to speak to others alone and someone appears to control who they talk to and what they say.

Visible signs of physical abuse.

A person who does not have control of personal identification such as their driver's license or passport.

A child who is living with someone who is not their parent, a relative or their legal/ assigned guardian.

A child under the legal working age tells you they are forced to work.

If you are in the United States and believe someone may be a victim of human trafficking, call the 24-hour National Human Trafficking Hotline at 1-888-373-7888. If there is an immediate emergency, always call 911.

Become a mentor to a teen, young adult or someone in need. Traffickers might target children or adults who are going through a difficult time, do not have stable housing or do not have a support system.

Get involved with a local organization that fights human trafficking, such as one of the groups listed above.



Social Security Matters Social Security Benefits for Someone with Multiple Ex-spouses

Dear Rusty: If a financially well-off individual had multiple ex-spouses, could it happen that the multiple ex-spouses could each be collecting Social Security based on their own financial situation as compared to their rich ex-spouses? Thus, multiple payouts by SS? Just curious, because there are probably many people in this situation as a result of the ever-increasing number of people involved in multiple marriages that each lasted more than ten years. Signed: Curious Ex-Spouse

D e a r Curious *Ex-Spouse:* A former spouse can only collect one SS benefit – either their own SS retirement amount, or an amount as an ex-spouse if the marriage lasted 10 years or more. And it is possible for multiple ex-spouses

of a marriage to the same person to qualify for benefits from those unions, if each marriage lasted at least 10 years. But each ex-spouse can only qualify for one benefit payment – either their own earned SS benefit, or their benefit as an ex-spouse. In other words, someone with two (or more) ex-spouses might have their ex's collecting full benefits on their record, provided that each marriage lasted at least 10 years. But an ex-spouse can only get one benefit -their own SS retirement amount or an ex-spouse amount -

whichever is higher). It's possible, also, that an ex-spouse can collect benefits from a former spouse at the same time as a current spouse is also collecting spouse benefits on the same record. And there is no detriment to either's amount because multiple spouses or ex-spouses are collecting on a one person's SS record (Social Security is, after all, a means for spouses, or ex-spouses, to avoid poverty). However, an ex-spouse's own SS retirement benefit (from their personal lifetime work record) must be less than any ex-spouse benefit they are entitled to from a former spouse. Essentially, if the "10-years-married" rule is satisfied, ex-spouses are subject to the same benefit rules as a current spouse.

You are correct that we see some cases like this these days, but each eligible ex-spouse can only get one benefit, and their ex-spouse benefit is always offset by any personal SS retirement benefit the ex-spouse may also be entitled to on their own lifetime work record.

California's state budget is inordinately dependent on taxing the incomes of wealthy residents.

Gov. Gavin Newsom's proposed 2025-26 budget assumes that the state will receive \$133.7 billion in personal income taxes, more than 60% of general fund revenues. Nearly half of that would be paid by the 1% of Californians sitting atop the taxable income ladder.

The downside risk of such dependency is that taxes on the rich tend to swing up and down more than taxes on ordinary wage earners, because earnings on investments are substantial portions of wealthy people's taxable incomes.

When the rich are getting richer, California sees multi-billion-dollar revenue windfalls. But downturns in their investments often result in sharp declines in tax receipts. In his budget, Newsom mentions the "swings in revenues and uncertainty that are a hallmark of California's volatile tax system."

The new budget cites a recent uptick in revenues that allowed Newsom's budget to expand some categories of spending, such as a big increase in tax subsidies for the beleaguered Southern California film and

video industry, one of his pet tax returns to \$10,000. programs.

The validity of the new budget's revenue assumptions is in doubt because of the wildfires that have afflicted Los Angeles County. But regardless of their impact, the state will continue to depend on volatile revenues from the wealthy, including those who

lost their homes in Pacific Palisades and Malibu.

By happenstance, just as the new budget and the wildfires become prominent items on the Capitol's political agenda, something else is happening in Washington that could affect California's harvest of taxes on the rich.

With Donald Trump back in the White House, negotiations are underway on repeal or retention of a 2017 change in federal tax law that adversely affected states such as California and New York, whose budgets depend on taxing the incomes of the rich.

The change, part of a much larger overhaul of tax policy, limited deductions for state and local taxes - SALT in the political vernacular - on federal

payers would be a \$12 billion annual increase in their federal tax obligations.

New York and California legislators and governors saw it as a deliberate hit by Republicans, including Trump, on blue state finances and have tried, on and off, to have it repealed ever since, to no avail. They worried aloud that the much-reduced SALT deduction would encourage wealthy taxpayers to move to states with low or no income taxes, such as Nevada, Texas and Florida.

Aggies Post Top Fall Quarter Academic Marks

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Tying for the sixth-highest quarterly GPA in Division I history, UC Davis student-athletes again set the standard in the classroom posting a fall quarter cumulative GPA of 3.25.

The Aggie women's team tied

for its fourth highest Division I GPA with a mark of 3.35 and the UC Davis men posted a 3.07 GPA tying for the eighth highest mark in the Division I era.

An impressive 12.95 percent of Aggie student-athletes finished with a quarterly GPA of 4.0, with 89 Aggies breaching the mark during the fall quarter. 272 Aggies finished with a 3.5+ quarterly GPA (39.59 percent) and 476 student-athletes posted a mark of 3.0+ GPA, encompassing 69.29 percent of all student-athletes.

Women's golf posted the highest quarterly team GPA with a mark of 3.68, tying for the program's fourth-highest GPA in Division I history. Men's cross country led the men's teams with a 3.25 GPA (fifth highest in Division I) and that mark was also the seventh highest posted by an Aggie Division I men's team.

Women's water polo had its highest team GPA of the Division I era with a mark of 3.51. Men's basketball had the program's second highest GPA of the Division 1 era with a 3.14. Baseball had the program's fourth highest team GPA of the Division 1 era with a 3.05. Women's tennis had the program's fourth highest team GPA of the Division 1 era with a 3.51. Women's lacrosse had the program's fifth highest team GPA of the Division 1 era with a 3.44. ★
