California Franchise Tax **Board Warns** of Tax Scams

California Franchise Tax Board News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The California Franchise Tax Board (FTB) is warning taxpayers to protect themselves from persistent scams this tax season by reviewing Franchise Tax Board's online scam avoidance tips and being especially guarded with tax, bank account, credit card and other personal information.

"Unfortunately, FTB and other California agencies constantly battle bad actors attempting to steal your money. This time of year, some may try scams by posing as tax agency representatives," said State Controller and Franchise Tax Board Chair Malia M. Cohen. "If you ever doubt the authenticity of a text, email or phone call claiming to be from Franchise Tax Board, Internal Revenue Service or any other government agency, contact the agency directly to verify whether there's an issue that requires your

Recently, the Franchise Tax Board received reports of a scam targeting taxpayers through text messages claiming to be from the Franchise Tax Board. The texts include a link to a fraudulent version of certain Franchise Tax Board webpages designed to steal personal and banking information.

attention."

On its online Scams webpage at www.ftb. ca.gov/help/scams, the Franchise Tax Board offers a way to report suspected scams and provides tips on how to avoid them.

The Franchise Tax **Board advises Californians** not to reply to suspicious text messages, download attachments or click on links in texts or emails if they are unsure of their authenticity. Visit the Franchise Tax Board's text messaging page at ftb.ca.gov/help/scams/ text-messaging.html to verify when Franchise Tax

Board sends texts and what

information is included. Scammers often prey on taxpayers by impersonating Internal Revenue Service or Franchise Tax Board employees. They might attempt to scam taxpayers into sending money not owed or providing personal information that could be used to file fraudulent returns and steal refunds.

If a taxpayer receives a letter from Franchise Tax Board or the Internal Revenue Service that appears suspicious, call the Franchise Tax Board at 800-852-5711 or the Internal Revenue Service at 800-829-1040.

CalRecycle Announces Crackdown on Foam Foodware

released an update April 4 announcing that or guidance about the new ban or started as 10 other states, have ordinances restrictpolystyrene foam foodware.

In 2022, Gov. Gavin Newsom signed California's landmark anti-plastic pollution bill into law. The legislation included a ban on foam foodware, commonly called Styrofoam, unless the plastic industry demonstrated a 25% recycling rate by the end of 2024. That standard was not met, so the polystyrene foodware ban went into effect statewide in January.

However, until now, neither Gov. Newsom nor CalRecycle had released any statement

it will enforce California's statewide ban on enforcing it. As a result, foam cups, plates ing foam foodware. and containers have still been used by restaurants and for sale in stores across the state.

Polystyrene foam is incredibly hard to recycle and only about 1% of it is recycled nationally. Plastic foam is frequently among the most commonly picked-up items at beach cleanups. Beyond littering our waterways and landscapes, foam cups and takeout containers can also leach harmful chemicals into the human body from food and beverages.

More than 130 cities in California, as well

Polystyrene foam cups, plates and take out containers are overflowing our landfills, polluting our beaches and ocean, and contain chemicals that can make us sick," said CALPIRG State Director Jenn Engstrom in response to the April 4 announcement. "Nothing we use for a few minutes should harm our environment and threaten our health for hundreds of years. That's why California banned foam foodware statewide. It's great to see CalRecycle taking action to better enforce this crucial law."

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - I am honored to share an important initiative that I, alongside Senator Roger Niello, am advocating for in our state budget. We have officially submitted a request for funding to support the Citrus Heights Veterans Memorial Project (CHVMP). This project is dedicated to honoring the bravery and sacrifice of the more than three-million Americans who served in the Vietnam War, including the 58,281 who made the ultimate sacrifice.


The requested funding will enable the immediate construction of a Westcoast replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall. This memorial will be a place of reflection and healing for veterans, their families and visitors, providing a solemn space to pay tribute to those who served. Located within the Veterans section of Calvary Cemetery, the memorial will be

visible from Interstate 80 and open to the public year-round.

This project is historic; it will be the only Vietnam Veterans Memorial west of Missouri and only the second to have the official support and partnership of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund.

Additionally, it will serve as an economic and cultural asset for Citrus Heights and the greater Sacramento region, drawing visitors and fostering community engagement through special events that celebrate service and sacrifice. This memorial will honor all our veterans have given and ensure their service is remembered for generations to come.

The initial Annual Percentage Rate (APR) is currently 6.75% for a new Home Equity Line of Credit (HELOC), and is fixed for the first 5 years of the loan which is called the draw period. 

Social Security Matters

When is the Best Time for Me to Claim Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I will be 66 ½ in June and would like to discuss when would be the best time for me to start taking my social security benefits. I am still employed full time and don't want to be penalized because of that. Please let me know what I need to do to set up an appointment with you. I got your information from the AMAC website, and I look forward to hearing from you. Signed: Ready to Claim

Dear Ready: You can certainly call us on 1.888.750.2622 during normal EST business hours for a personal conversation. But to facilitate that conversation, be aware that deciding when to claim your Social Security benefit normally depends on just a few factors, including your financial need, your health and expected longevity, and your marital status. A few things to be aware of:

• Born in 1958, your "full retirement age" is age 66 years and 8 months. If you were born in October 1958, you will reach you FRA in June 2025, and that is the point you can get 100% of the SS benefit you've earned from a lifetime of working.

· Once you reach your FRA in June, Social Security's "annual earnings test" no longer applies. Thus, you can continue working after you start your SS benefits and your earnings will not negatively affect your monthly benefit amount. If you claim any earlier than your FRA, you will get a smaller benefit and also be subject to Social Security's annual earnings test (which for you this year - your FRA year is \$62,160, or \$5,180/month after you start your SS benefits). If you decide to claim before your FRA, your benefit will be reduced by .556% for each month early (a permanent reduction).

· You can also wait beyond your FRA to claim and earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) at the rate of .667% per month (8% per year of delay), in order to get an even higher benefit later. If financially feasible, you can delay up to the age of 70 when your monthly benefit will reach maximum - about 27% more than it will be in June of this year.

• If you are single and will not be eligible for a spousal benefit, then you should make your claiming decision based only on your own needs. If, however, you are married and your spouse's FRA benefit is more than twice your FRA amount, you may be entitled to a "spousal boost" (a supplemental amount added to your own SS benefit).

• Your life expectancy should be considered when deciding when to claim your SS retirement benefits. If you expect to enjoy at least "average" longevity (about 87 for a woman your current age), then you might also consider delaying your claim (if financially feasible) and that is often a prudent choice. If you don't expect to achieve a long life, or if you need the money sooner, or if you are entitled to spousal benefits, then claiming at your FRA of 66 years and 8 months is likely your best option. In the end, only you can

In California's Capitol, Some Political Fights Span Decades

Were we able to transport ourselves back in time 50 years and into California's Capitol, we would find a governor seeking and enjoying massive attention by national political media as he eyes some greater office. We'd also find a Legislature dealing with conflicts among influential interests with heavy financial impacts.

In other words, the Capitol's dynamics in 1975 were pretty much what they

are today. The resemblance even extends to specific issues. For instance, then-Gov. Jerry Brown was touting a "peripheral canal" in 1975 to carry water around the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Gavin Newsom was seven years old then, but now as governor is waging the same campaign for a tunnel to do the same thing and is facing the same opposition.

Other conflicts that confronted Brown and legislators a half-century ago can be found again among the hundreds of bills introduced so far in the 2025 legislative session.

On Tuesday, for instance, the Senate Judiciary Committee took up Senate Bill 29, a measure that would extend indefinitely the ability of survivors of people who died as a result of medical malpractice to sue for "pain,

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Legislature provided a temporary window for such suits because the court system was in pandemic-induced turmoil.

Insurers and other opponents of the measure contend that it violates a 2022 compromise on the limits of malpractice damages, a deal that seemingly ended a 47-year-long political battle that began when Brown signed the Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act in 1975.

A half-century ago, doctors and other health care providers were also skirmishing over "scope of practice," the body of state law that defines in great detail which medical professionals can perform which procedures on which

parts of the human body. The hardest-fought battle pitted orthopedic surgeons against podiatrists over the legal right to perform ankle surgery, and it raged for years until the latter prevailed. Ever since, there have been similar conflicts too numerous to list, such as psychologists vs. psychiatrists over the right to prescribe drugs, optometrists vs. opticians over eye treatment - and even veterinarians vs. dog groomers over who could legally brush

a dog's teeth. The current version of this perennial turf battle is Assembly Bill 876, which would allow nurse anesthetists to provide their services more independently — the latest in a years-long string of legislative efforts by nurses to bolster the scope of their

practices. Soon after becoming governor, Brown pledged to reform workers' compensation, the system that

suffering, or disfigurement." provides income and medical care to those with work-related illnesses and injuries. That effort failed, but as one of the last acts of his first governorship, Brown signed a bill to increase payments to such workers by about \$3 billion a year, angering employers who must provide coverage.

That touched off a predictable cycle in which a majority of the workers' compensation interest groups would work out some sort of systemic overhaul once each decade and get it enacted over objections of groups left out of the negotiations.

The last such instance occurred in 2012 when Brown, once again governor, negotiated and signed legislation to raise benefits again, but impose new rules on eligibility and medical care to save enough money to pay for the benefits.

The Capitol is overdue for another workers' compensation deal and a newly introduced measure, Senate Bill 555, could be the vehicle. It would increase benefits to workers with partial but permanent disabilities, which have been capped at \$1,256 a month for the last decade.

The bill would provide automatic cost of living increases and is certain to draw fire from employers — another chapter in what has been one of the Capitol's longest running high-dollar conflicts.

Sacramento State's Spring **Enrollment Hits Historic High**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - California State University, Sacramento's Spring enrollment this year was the largest in the university's history, continuing to buck trends and exceeding the California State University's enrollment goals for the campus.

The official Spring 2025 head count stands at 30,164. That's 197 more students than last year, said Brian Henley, interim senior associate vice-president for Enrollment Management.

"That gives us a record number of students enrolled for a spring term in the history of the university," Henley said.

The number exceeds by 3.5% the enrollment target for the academic year that the California State University set for Sac State.

Across the country, enrollment in both community colleges and four-year universities appears to be on the upswing after years of declines in the wake of COVID-19, national data suggests. Last fall, enrollment increased by a modest 0.4% above levels achieved prior to the pandemic, according to the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center.

"One of the things that we are emphasizing is that we have great programs and services that can help all students be successful. We are here to meet their needs," said Henley.

Even as other institutions saw post-pandemic declines, Sac State's enrollment held steady. Henley said this spring's enrollment bump is the result of hard work behind the scenes.

"We're getting the message out about Sac State and that message is very positive," said Henley.

Admissions staffers have been visiting high schools and community colleges, attending college fairs and messaging prospective students via text and email about Sac State's attributes, said Henley.

"One of the things that we are emphasizing is that we have great programs and services that can help all students be successful," Henley added. "We are here to meet their needs."

Sac State's tuition remains relatively low compared to other California universities, Henley pointed out, and financial aid is available to most students. The university boasts programs such as a food pantry and peer mentoring that can help clear obstacles to students' academic goals.

"Across the board, we're just doing a very good job of delivering our message and it's making a difference," Henley







SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - For the second straight week and the fifth time overall this season a Sacramento State women's tennis player has taken home weekly honors from the Big Sky Conference with senior Maddy Ferreros doing the most recent honors for the Hornets on April 2.

It is the fourth career weekly honor from the league office for Ferreros, whose last award came on April 5, 2023. She joins teammates Emilija Pranyte (twice), Lou Baudouin and Reese Walker as Sacramento State winners this spring.

Ferreros finished last week with a 3-0 record, winning both of her singles contests in three sets and taking home a doubles victory alongside teammate Irene Riva. The tandem was also leading their other doubles match before the Hornets clinched the point early,

ending the bid for a perfect 4-0 weekend.

The duo opened with a 6-4 win over Weber State's Jessica Hill and Sydney Schnell before switching to singles where Ferreros defeated Schnell for a second time on the day with a 6-7 (5), 6-0, 1-0 (10-8), victory at the No. 1 spot in the lineup, helping Sacramento State to a 7-0 shutout of the Wildcats.

Two days later, Ferreros rallied for another singles victory at the top spot in the lineup, outlasting Idaho State's Asem Shoybek, 3-6, 6-2, 6-2, en route to a 5-2 team victory over the Bengals.

Ferreros' two singles triumphs extended her winning streak to six straight matches and improved her to 10-4 overall at the top spot in the lineup this year, the most wins in the Big Sky at that position.

As a team, the Hornets have a 15-2 overall record and a 5-0 mark in Big Sky play, having won their last eight straight matches. *

With a nationally broadcast game to open the season and five home games, including the Causeway Classic, University of California (UC) Davis football is set for an exciting 2025 with 12 games and eyes on a Big Sky Championship following a historic 2024 season.

The Aggies will host Southern Utah (Sept. 20), Weber State (Sept. 27), Northern Arizona (Oct. 11), Idaho State (Nov. 1) and

Sacramento State (Nov. 22) at UC Davis Health Stadium.

On the road UC Davis will head to Utah Tech (Aug. 30), Washington (Sept. 6), Cal Poly (Oct. 4), Northern Colorado (Oct. 25), Idaho (Nov. 8) and Montana State (Nov. 15).

It's the second-straight season that the Aggies will play 12 games, with their season opener being the Football Championship Series Kickoff Classic in Montgomery, Alabama. The Aggies will face fellow National Collegiate Athletic Association Football Championship Series Playoff qualifier Mercer on Aug. 23 in the Week 0 event set to be broadcast on ESPN's linear networks.

"We're excited about the opportunity to play on national television to start the year against a great opponent in Mercer," said head coach Tim Plough. "Every year in the Big Sky is a tremendous challenge and we look forward to the opportunity to grow as a program in 2025."

"We will work hard as a team to create a group that the Davis community and university is proud of. Hopefully that leads to some great crowds in Shredville next fall where we all can find joy every Saturday," Plough said.

The game in Seattle, Washington against the Big Ten's Huskies will be the first time that the two sides have met on the gridiron and the lone Football Bowl Subdivision squad the Aggies will see in 2025. UC Davis will also make its first trip to St. George,

Utah and the game in Montgomery will be the first time the Aggies play south of the Mason-Dixon Line since 2008 when they visited Central Arkansas.

In conference, the Aggies will visit Northern Colorado and Montana State for the first time since 2022 and host Northern Arizona and Idaho State for the first time since that same season. UC Davis will host Sacramento State to end the season, looking to win its third-straight Causeway Classic.

Snowpack Reaches Near Average at the End of Wet Season

SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG) - On March 28, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) conducted the April snow survey at Phillips Station. The manual survey recorded 39.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent of 17 inches, which is 70 percent of average for this location.

The snow water equivalent measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack and is a key component of Department of Water Resources' water supply forecast. Statewide, the snowpack is 90 percent of average for this date. Department of Water Resources conducted the in-person snow survey ahead of April 1.

While Department of Water Resources' Snow Surveys and Water Supply Forecasting Unit strives to conduct measurements as close to the first of the month as possible, the Department of Water Resources must schedule surveys around forecasted storm activity to ensure the safety of staff and invited media.

The April measurement is a critical marker for water managers across the state, as it is typically the time when the snowpack reaches its maximum volume and begins to melt. Department of Water Resources' water supply forecasts use data from the April 1 snowpack to calculate how much snowmelt runoff will eventually make its way into California's rivers and reservoirs.

While the snowpack has caught up to near normal, broad swaths of Southern California remain exceptionally dry and below average for rainfall. This includes the Los Angeles region, which currently has only received 45 percent of its average rainfall so far this water year.

state's snowpack has recovered from several weeks of extremely dry conditions in the heart of our winter storm season," said Department of Water Resources Director Karla Nemeth. "However, it's not a wet year across the entire Sierra Nevada. The north has great snowpack, but snowpack is less than average in the central and southern part of the mountain range. That snowpack ultimately flows to the Delta, and the regional disparity affects how much water the State Water Project will be able to deliver.'

Measuring California's snowpack is a key component that guides how California's water supplies are managed. On average, California's snowpack supplies about 30 percent of California's water needs. Its natural ability to store water is why California's snowpack is often referred to as California's "frozen reservoir."

of Water Resources and its partners with the California Cooperative Snow Surveys Program help inform the water supply and snowmelt runoff forecasts, known as the Bulletin 120, that help water managers plan for how much water will eventually reach state reservoirs in the spring and summer. This information is also a key piece in calculating State Water Project allocation updates each month.

"We are very thankful to be ending March where we are now with more snow in the forecast next week, especially considering the dry start to the year," said Andy Reising, manager of Department of Water Resources' Snow Surveys and Water Supply Forecasting Unit. "From major storms in November and December to a bone-dry January, then back to major storms in February and March, this year is a lesson in why we can never know for certain what our water picture will look like until we get to the end of our traditional wet

Before storms in February and March, California was experiencing an excessively dry January that stalled critical growth of the snowpack and contributed to the dangerous conditions that led to devastating wildfires in Southern California. To prepare for the next drought, the Department of Water Resources and Governor Newsom have taken actions to secure and protect California's water supply in the face of growing climate extremes while balancing the needs of the environment.

In January, Governor Gavin Newsom issued an executive order to make it easier for local and regional agencies to maximize groundwater recharge, ensuring California is able to capture and store as much water as possible during high winter flows.

California is also working with the scientific community to adopt the best available science for the state's water management. A recently released report shows that Department of Water Resources' investments in pursuing new strategies known as Forecast Informed Reservoir Operations, which provides flexible water management based on the newest forecasting technologies, can both reduce flood risk for downstream communities and benefit water supplies during dry period.

This fall, the State Water Project received a new operating permit after years of working with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and partners at state and federal fish agencies, that will address the dual challenges of climate change impacts and endangered species protections.

Thanks to efforts to capture as much water as possible from this year's storms, reservoirs across the state are currently 115 percent of average.

The Department of Water Resources conducts four or five snow surveys at Phillips Station each winter near the first of each month, January through April and, if necessary, May.


