California Franchise Tax **Board Warns** of Tax Scams

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) · The California Franchise Tax Board (FTB) is warning taxpayers to protect themselves from persistent scams this tax season by reviewing Franchise Tax Board's online scam avoidance tips and being especially guarded with tax, bank account, credit card and other personal information.

"Unfortunately, FTB and other California agencies constantly battle bad actors attempting to steal your money. This time of year, some may try scams by posing as tax agency representatives," said State Controller and Franchise Tax Board Chair Malia M. Cohen. "If you ever doubt the authenticity of a text, email or phone call claiming to be from Franchise Tax Board, Internal Revenue Service or any other government agency, contact the agency directly to verify whether there's an issue that requires your attention."

Recently, the Franchise Tax Board received reports of a scam targeting taxpayers through text messages claiming to be from the Franchise Tax Board. The texts include a link to a fraudulent version of certain Franchise Tax Board webpages designed to steal personal and banking information.

Marauder Trio Dominates

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Coming off impressive wins at the Sacramento Regional Wrestling championships last month, Mitchell Middle School Marauders Erica Banks (107 pounds), Aubrey Vasquez-Paz (112 pounds), and Jayden McCullar (145 pounds) from Mitchell Middle School in Rancho Cordova competed at the Girls Middle School State Wrestling Championships in San Leandro on March 29

The tournament hosted wrestlers from 47 schools or clubs throughout Northern California with 188 competitors. The three star Mithell wrestlers garnered enough team points to place sixth-place overall, beating out a vast majority of the competition with much larger teams. The Mitchell wrestlers took advantage of the extra

Scammers often prey on taxpayers by impersonating Internal Revenue Service or Franchise Tax Board employees. They might attempt to scam taxpayers into sending money not owed or providing personal information that could be used to file fraudulent returns and steal refunds.

If a taxpayer receives a letter from Franchise Tax Board or the Internal Revenue Service that appears suspicious, call the Franchise Tax Board at 800-852-5711 or the Internal Revenue Service at 800-829-1040.

February. Banks was seeded No. 1 over her competition and dominated the competition with decisive wins to reach the finals. In her final match of the day, Banks showcased her athleticism by putting her opponent on her back to lead after the first round. However, her opponent showed she had grit and overcame the deficit in the second and third rounds to beat Banks by points, securing a second-place finish for Banks.

First-year wrestler Vasquez-Paz won second-place at the Regional Championships in February and started her day with a strong

win but found herself needing to wrestle tough to stay in contention for a medal after losing her second match of the day.

Vasquez-Paz won her next two matches (one by points and one by pin) for the third-place win.

McCullar earned first-place

at the Regional Championships. This was McCullar's second trip to the state championship where she hoped to reach the podium. McCullar used her strength to power through her first-round opponent with an early pin. However, her second-round match proved to be just as strong and outwrestled McCullar, moving her into the consolation bracket. McCullar's resilience shined brightly and she pinned her next opponent in the thirdround match and was able to advance where she again found a worthy opponent in her fourthround match, who stifled her chances to reaching the podium this year with a narrow 9-7 loss.

"We couldn't be prouder of them. It's been fun watching them improve and a real honor to coach them this year," said coach Joe Zilles on behalf of the coaching staff (Stacy Adair, Devon Banks and John Marshall).

All three girls are top-notch students. Banks won the team MVP award this season for her leadership and Vasquez-Paz and McCullar won coach's awards for their fearless and tenacious drives throughout the year. All three girls are off to high school next year where they plan to continue competing at the highest levels.



Lady Lancers Strong Start Fuels Win

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -Whenever you score 10 runs

in the first inning of a softball game, you're doing something right.

The Cordova Lady Lancers

did just that at home April 3 against visiting Grant and rode that momentum to a 16-3 victory that was called midway through the fifth inning, due to the double-digit mercy rule.

The Lady Lancers (4-5 overall, 2-1 Metro League at press time) set the tone early, scoring double-digit runs in the bottom of the first inning, with four players recording at least one RBI (Run Batted In).

The highlight was a threerun inside-the park home run to just right of centerfield by junior Briel Brookins, and that was followed up by a home run from sophomore power hitter

Becca Lee in the next at-bat, her third of the season.

The Pacers (2-9 overall, 0-3 Metro League at press time) simply dug themselves too deep of a hole to climb out of at that point. The Lady Lancers added six more runs before the game was called after the top of the fifth inning.

"Very impressed," said Lady Lancers' head coach Kim Little after the game, regarding what she saw from her team in the first inning. "Especially making the adjustments to their (Grant) pitching, not making excuses. Everybody's bats were hot and even just mentally staying in a

game like this. Sometimes that can be tough."

Senior Adriana Arana and Lee both led the team with three hits apiece on the day, with six others recording at least one hit in the contest.

Sophomore pitcher Isabella Tarpley-Cruz also put together an impressive performance on the mound for Cordova, tallying 10 strikeouts in five innings and surrendering just four hits. Her play of late has caught the eye of her coach, who is seeing the youngster start to find her stride.

"Her confidence is growing," Little said of the young pitcher. "She threw a change-up for the first time that actually got called for a strike and she was pretty pumped. There's been lots and lots of growth from her. There's been such a difference from last year to this year. She's still young and still has so much growth in her."

At press time, the Lady Lancers won their last two consecutive Metro League contests and sat in third-place within league standings. The team will head into spring break following two road games earlier this week at Antelope and West Park and will return to the diamond on April 22 when they travel to face McClatchy. First pitch is scheduled for 4 p.m.

Sophomore Slugger a Cordova Standout

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Cordova Lady Lancers' sophomore threesport athlete Becca Lee is showing that she can do it all.

Whether she's throwing touchdown passes in flag football, snatching rebounds in basketball or smashing the centerfield scoreboard with home runs in softball, the second-year sensation has exceled at every sport she has played at Cordova High this school year.

On the football field, Lee threw for more than 1,500 yards and 19 touchdowns last fall as the starting quarterback for the flag football team.

In a game earlier this season against Rosemont, Lee blasted a home run that connected with the scoreboard in centerfield, showing off the powerful swing that continues to serve her well.

"It was nice," Lee said when asked about the feat. "When I got to second base, I heard it hit the scoreboard and said, 'Oh my gosh.' It was so cool."

Although she has been proficient in each of her three sports, softball is what Lee loves the most. In her own words, it's the sport that Lee is best at and she enjoys hitting the ball all over the yard.

Lee draws inspiration from former Oklahoma Sooners' softball star very high level in travel ball. She takes it extremely seriously. I see the transition from last year to this year with her strength, everything.'

Lee has emerged as a team leader in softball this spring according to Little, both by her play on the field and in the dugout. Younger players typically aren't viewed as leaders by their peers unless they can lead by example and she is certainly doing that. But it's also Lee's positive attitude and willingness to speak up when needed that has the respect of her teammates and coaches alike.

"She's very vocal but knows how to deliver the message as a leader should," Little said. "Not critical, but firm and sturdy, but also can be

In the winter, she averaged 8.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per game for head coach Kim Little and the Lady Lancers' basketball team.

This spring, Lee has continued to emerge under Little's coaching on the softball diamond, as she currently leads the team in home runs (3), runs batted in (12), hits (16), batting average (.571), slugging percentage (1.250) and on-base percentage (.647).

Jocelyn Alo, who is the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) all-time home runs leader in softball with 122. Like Alo, Lee has some serious power and her coach has seen Lee take a big step in her development during her second varsity season.

"It's her favorite sport," Little said regarding Lee's ability on the diamond. "It's the sport she plays at a positive."

At the end of the day, it might very well be Lee's strong work ethic that sets her apart and figures to help her improve in the seasons to come.

"She shows up for practice, then she'll even tell me she went home and got reps in," Little said regarding Lee's dedication to the sport. "Softball is her thing." It certainly is.

Sacramento County Celebrates Earth Month

Earth Day is every day in April! Over the month of April, we have the opportunity to welcome spring with a variety of activities, raising awareness about environmental issues and taking action toward ensuring a sustainable future. From water resiliency to renewable energy, this year's theme, Our Power, Our Planet, serves as a reminder of the challenges our planet faces and our collective responsibility to protect it.

This month can also serve as a reminder to all of us that there is no replacement for fresh air and getting outdoors (I too am guilty of spending too much time sitting in front of my computer or attached to my smartphone). As Sacramento County gears up for Earth Month, I'm pleased to help highlight our County's dedication to environmental stewardship.

From sustainability efforts at Sacramento International Airport to the Rosemont Community Association's first ever Earth Day Party, to cleanup efforts along the 23-mile gem of the American River Parkway, everyone can find a way to celebrate and protect our natural environment . . . air, land and water. Learn more about how Sacramento County is investing in our planet here.

A great example of the County's commitment to environmental stewardship is the Sacramento Area Sewer District's (SacSewer) Bufferlands, a 2,150 acre open space in south Sacramento County that serves as a natural buffer between the EchoWater Facility and the community. This space was specifically designed to help reduce the potential for odor and noise from the sewer treatment plant and is also a habitat preserve reflecting over 30 years of restoration and management for wildlife to thrive. Each year, SacSewer Bufferlands

hosts public tours and exciting events, including Walk on the Wildside, an annual celebration with wildlife demonstrations, hikes, music and opportunities to engage with local wildlife. For more information about Walk on the Wildside, please visit their website at sacsewer.com/ event/walk-on-the-wildside-2025.

Another County project I'm sure many of you are familiar with is the Harvest Water Program, California's largest-ever agricultural water recycling project aimed at delivering recycled water to agricultural lands and habitats in southern Sacramento County. This water has been treated biologically, mechanically, and chemically to meet the stringent requirements for discharge and reuse. While it is not recommended to drink it directly, it is completely safe for crops and livestock. When complete, the program will provide up to 50,000 acre-feet (approximately 16 billion gallons) of drought-resistant, recycled water annually. A few of the key goals of this impactful project include:

Groundwater Restoration: By supplying recycled water for irrigation instead of groundwater, Harvest Water aims to promote natural groundwater recovery and increase regional and state water reliability.

Sustainable Agriculture: The program supports sustainable farming practices by delivering up to 50,000 acre-feet per year of recycled water to irrigate up to 16,000 acres of agricultural lands.

Habitat Enhancement: Delivering recycled water to existing habitats is expected to strengthen local

ecosystems and benefit wildlife while improving groundwater conditions that sustain local riparian and wetland areas.

Last month, Harvest Water was awarded an additional \$73 million in funding from the California Water Commission as part of the Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP). Grant funding for the project now exceeds \$394 million, further solidifying Harvest Water's status as a cornerstone of sustainable water management in California.

With significant construction occurring in the area south of Elk Grove, SacSewer is reaching out to residents regarding road closures and construction impacts through multiple methods and channels. The inconvenience is real but so are the benefits the Harvest Water pipeline project will provide including the scheduled road improvements once the pipeline is constructed. As we celebrate Earth Day every day in April, I encourage all of us to reflect on how we can continue to contribute to the restoration and protection of our planet. \$73 Million in Funding Approved for Harvest Water Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Area Sewer District's (SacSewer's) landmark water recycling project, Harvest Water, has been awarded an additional \$73 million in both reallocated Proposition 1 grant funding and new Proposition 4 funds from the California Water Commission's Water Storage Investment Program.

Harvest Water is California's largest-ever agricultural water recycling project and is expected to be operational in 2027.

Once complete, Harvest Water will deliver up to 50,000 acre-feet, or roughly 16 billion gallons annually, of drought-resistant recycled water to agricultural lands and existing habitats in southern Sacramento County. By reducing the need to pump groundwater, Harvest Water will promote natural groundwater recovery, boost sustainable agriculture and strengthen existing habitats.

"The additional funding from the California Water Commission is a tremendous boost to Harvest Water and a testament to the project's significance in addressing water sustainability and resilience," said Christoph Dobson, Sacramento Area Sewer's general manager. "SacSewer is making significant progress toward implementing a long-term, drought-resilient water solution that will benefit the entire region."

Harvest Water has received significant financial support, including a previous award from the California Water Commission of \$291.8 million in Proposition 1 Water Storage Investment Program funding and \$30 million from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. This grant funding helped support project design and ongoing construction of needed infrastructure for the recycled water distribution system, which includes 41.4 miles of pipelines, on-farm connection improvements and a large pumping station at Sacramento Area Sewer's Echo Water Resource Recovery facility near Elk Grove.

With this latest financial commitment from the California Water Commission, the grant funding for the project now exceeds \$394 million, further solidifying Harvest Water's status as a cornerstone of sustainable water management in California.

Social Security Matters When is the Best Time for Me to Claim Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I will be 66 ¹/₂ in June and would like to discuss when would be the best time for me to start taking my social security benefits. I am still employed full time and don't want to be penalized because of that. Please let me know what I need to do to set up an appointment with you. I got your information from the AMAC website, and I look forward to hearing from you. Signed: Ready to Claim

Dear Ready: You can certainly call us on 1.888.750.2622 during normal EST business hours for a personal conversation. But to facilitate that conversation, be aware that deciding when to claim your Social Security benefit normally depends on just a few factors, including your financial need, your health and expected longevity, and your marital status. A few things to be aware of:

• Born in 1958, your "full retirement age" is age 66 years and 8 months. If you were born in October 1958, you will reach you FRA in June 2025, and that is the point you can get 100% of the SS benefit you've earned from a lifetime of working.

• Once you reach your FRA in June, Social Security's "annual earnings test" no longer applies. Thus, you can continue working after you start your SS benefits and your earnings will not negatively affect your monthly benefit amount. If you claim any earlier than your FRA, you will get a smaller benefit and also be subject to Social Security's annual earnings test (which for you this year - your FRA year is \$62,160, or \$5,180/month after you start your SS benefits). If you decide to claim before your FRA, your benefit will be reduced by .556% for each month early (a permanent reduction).

• You can also wait beyond your FRA to claim and earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) at the rate of .667% per month (8% per year of delay), in order to get an even higher benefit later. If financially feasible, you can delay up to the age of 70 when your monthly benefit will reach maximum - about 27% more than it will be in June of this year.


• If you are single and will not be eligible for a spousal benefit, then you should make your claiming decision based only on your own needs. If, however, you are married and your spouse's FRA benefit is more than twice your FRA amount, you may be entitled to a "spousal boost" (a supplemental amount added to your own SS benefit).

• Your life expectancy should be considered when deciding when to claim your SS retirement benefits. If you expect to enjoy at least "average" longevity (about 87 for a woman your current age), then you might also consider delaying your claim (if financially feasible) and that is often a prudent choice. If you don't expect to achieve a long life, or if you need the money sooner, or if you are entitled to spousal benefits, then claiming at your FRA of 66 years and 8 months is likely your best option.

In California's Capitol, Some Political Fights Span Decades

Were we able to transport ourselves back in time 50 years and into California's Capitol, we would find a governor seeking and enjoying massive attention by national political media as he eyes some greater office. We'd also find a Legislature dealing with conflicts among influential interests with heavy financial impacts.

In other words, the Capitol's dynamics in 1975 were pretty much what they are today.

The resemblance even extends to specific issues. For instance, then-Gov. Jerry Brown was touting a "peripheral canal" in 1975 to carry water around the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Gavin Newsom was seven years old then, but now as governor is waging the same campaign for a tunnel to do the same thing and is facing the same opposition.

Other conflicts that confronted Brown and legislators a half-century ago can be found again among the hundreds of bills introduced so far in the 2025 legislative session.

On Tuesday, for instance, the Senate Judiciary Committee took up Senate Bill 29, a measure that would extend indefinitely the ability of survivors of people who died as a result of medical malpractice to sue for "pain, During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Legislature provided a temporary window for such suits because the court system was in pandemic-induced turmoil.

Insurers and other opponents of the measure contend that it violates a 2022 compromise on the limits of malpractice damages, a deal that seemingly ended a 47-year-long political battle that began when Brown signed the Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act in 1975.

A half-century ago, doctors and other health care providers were also skirmishing over "scope of practice," the body of state law that defines in great detail which medical professionals can perform which procedures on which parts of the human body.

The hardest-fought battle pitted orthopedic surgeons against podiatrists over the legal right to perform ankle surgery, and it raged for years until the latter prevailed. Ever since, there have been similar conflicts too numerous to list, such as psychologists vs. psychiatrists over the right to prescribe drugs, optometrists vs. opticians over eye treatment - and even veterinarians vs. dog groomers over who could legally brush a dog's teeth.

The current version of this perennial turf battle is Assembly Bill 876, which would allow nurse anesthetists to provide their services more independently — the latest in a years-long string of legislative efforts by nurses to bolster the scope of their practices.

Soon after becoming governor, Brown pledged to reform workers' compensation, the system that ical care to those with work-related illnesses and injuries. That effort failed, but as one of the last acts of his first governorship, Brown signed a bill to increase payments to such workers by about \$3 billion a year, angering employers who must provide coverage.

That touched off a predictable cycle in which a majority of the workers' compensation interest groups would work out some sort of systemic overhaul once each decade and get it enacted over objections of groups left out of the negotiations.

The last such instance occurred in 2012 when Brown, once again governor, negotiated and signed legislation to raise benefits again, but impose new rules on eligibility and medical care to save enough money to pay for the benefits.

The Capitol is overdue for another workers' compensation deal and a newly introduced measure, Senate Bill 555, could be the vehicle. It would increase benefits to workers with partial but permanent disabilities, which have been capped at \$1,256 a month for the last decade.

The bill would provide automatic cost of living increases and is certain to draw fire from employers — another chapter in what has been one of the Capitol's longest running high-dollar conflicts.

Defendant Sentenced for Vehicle Theft, Evading Officers

Sacramento County District Attorney's Office News Release

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On April 4, the Honorable Laurel White sentenced James Jarrard to 59 years and four months to life in prison.

On Feb. 14, a jury convicted Jarrard of vehicle theft, felony evading, felon in possession of a firearm and possession of a controlled substance while armed. The jury also found true two firearm enhancements.

On Oct. 16, 2022, Jarrard was driving a stolen truck when he led Citrus Heights police officers on a high-speed pursuit into a residential area.

Jarrard crashed into a tree and fled on foot with a firearm. Jarrard jumped fences and forced entry into a home with two individuals inside.

One victim escaped to call for help, while the other hid in an upstairs bedroom. Jarrard broke through the ceiling where the second victim was hiding. This prompted the second victim to jump from a second-story window, resulting in injury. This led to a more than three-hour police standoff with Jarrard hiding in the home.

Officers eventually apprehended Jarrard and searched the stolen truck, where they found a loaded firearm and methamphetamine.

At the time of the offense, Jarrard was on parole for two strike offenses of assault with a firearm. He also had a prior strike for residential burglary. Jarrard's prior strikes were also found true at the sentencing hearing.





More Than a Meal

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On a routine Monday meal delivery, a volunteer driver with Meals on Wheels (MoW) Sacramento County made a frightening discovery. A senior had been trapped in a collapsed bed since Friday, without food, water or a way to call for help. Staying calm, the driver called 911 and remained at the scene until the emergency contact arrived.

Reflecting on moments like these, Mindy Klick, executive director of Meals on Wheels Sacramento County shared, "I want to say these are success stories but they are more like life-saving stories."

Although often mistaken for a public agency, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County is a program of the private nonprofit called ACC Senior Services, formerly known as The Asian Community Center of Sacramento Valley.

Meals on Wheels Sacramento County partners with Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services to tackle senior hunger and isolation head-on.

Department of Child, Family and Adult Services' support has helped shrink the growing waitlist by providing funding, vehicles and equipment to make meal delivery safer and more efficient.

"We try to provide whatever we can to help seniors stay in their homes safely," Klick said.

In the current fiscal year, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County is serving an average of about 1,500 meals to seniors each month, with flexible meal options designed to fit their lifestyles:

Home delivery gives participants a choice of daily hot meals or weekly frozen meal packs.

Restaurant meal vouchers provide flexibility and the opportunity to dine out at local partner restaurants. that seniors don't have to choose between feeding themselves and their beloved pets. Many participants consider their pets to be family and AniMeals provides food for these furry companions, allowing seniors to care for them without sacrificing their own meals.

Despite their name, Meals on Wheels is about far more than just meals: "This is about making sure our seniors are safe, cared for and not forgotten," Klick emphasized.

To help achieve these goals, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County also equips seniors with essential home items such as microwaves for easy meal prep, shower chairs for safer bathing and bedside commodes for added convenience. Regular wellness checks and emergency support add another layer of safety, ensuring help is always within reach.

"We try to provide whatever we can to help seniors stay in their homes safely," Klick explained.

A key part of this safety net is the bond between seniors and their delivery drivers. Assigned to regular routes, drivers provide consistency which builds trust and familiarity. For many homebound seniors, they might be the only human connection that day or even that week.

If something seems off such as changes in behavior, health or routine, the driver initiates the chain of support by alerting their caseworker who can respond as needed.

"If we see a situation that concerns us, we're able to reach out to DCFAS (Department of Child, Family and Adult Services) and either get advice, coaching on how to handle it or have Adult Protective Services step in and assist," said Klick.

Klick spoke highly of the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services team.

Comprehensive Update on Response to Homelessness

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The Sacramento County departments of Homeless Services and Housing, and Health Services presented their biannual report to the Board detailing outreach efforts to the homeless population in the unincorporated region of Sacramento and along the American River Parkway from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024.

This is the third such report out since the start of the city/county partnership agreement was signed in December 2023. In addition to reporting on joint outreach efforts in the City of Sacramento, county staff also report on similar activities in the unincorporated county.

Looking at the county outreach items by the numbers starting from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024, 10 parkway staff, 10 encampment services staff and six community-based outreach staff provided 25,274 services to 810 unduplicated individuals and supported 184 unduplicated individuals with transitioning out of unsheltered homelessness (which includes shelter and housing). On average, that is 31 services per participant.

Examples of service numbers and types include:

General case management: 16,397

Housing search/placement: 1,206

Vital document support: 1,024

Healthcare Services: 393

CalAim services: 294

Coordinated Access System (CAS) Referrals: 351. More than 70% of unsheltered individuals served were between the ages of 25 and 61, 53% were male and 53% were

45% of individuals are between the ages of 45 and 64, 64% report a disabling condition, 40% have no income, and on average, have experienced nearly four years of homelessness.

From July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024 county shelters enrolled 1,137 unique households.

Taking a look at behavioral health services by the numbers indicate that from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024, 1,360 unhoused residents were referred to behavioral health services and 947 individuals were successfully admitted and linked to services.

During the same period, HEART Team efforts included 1,607 individuals engaged, 342 referrals to behavioral health services and individuals linked to and served by outpatient programs.

From July to December 2024, the Full-Service Partnerships (FSPs) served 2,631 (95% of total capacity) unduplicated individuals out of which 76% of those individuals are housed, 11% are in shelters, 9% are unsheltered and 4% are unknown.

The Department of Homeless Services and Housing continues to update its data dashboards, reflecting its commitment to providing clear, accessible information to support data-driven decision-making and continuous improvement in addressing homelessness.

Data presented in the dashboards is organized into two general categories: program performance data and demographic insights data.

Program performance data helps track key performance metrics, including program reach, services provided to program participants, program utilization and connections to shelter and housing.

Demographic insights include data on age, gender, race/ethnicity and vulnerability factors such as lengths of homelessness, disability conditions and financial resources.

Currently, the dashboards only reflect demographics and outcomes from Department of Homeless Services and Housing funded programs.

Community Cafés, located in community centers and other sites across the county, provide more than just a meal; they offer a space for seniors to connect, socialize and combat loneliness. For many participants, the opportunity for conversation is just as important as the food itself.

AniMeals, a pet food program, ensures

"I have not met a nicer group of people with the biggest hearts, trying to do the right thing," she said. "I can pick up the phone and say, 'This is the challenge we're facing, what are your thoughts? How can we partner?""

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - For the second straight week and the fifth time overall this season a Sacramento State women's tennis player has taken home weekly honors from the Big Sky Conference with senior Maddy Ferreros doing the most recent honors for the Hornets on April 2.

It is the fourth career weekly honor from the league office for Ferreros, whose last award came on April 5, 2023. She joins teammates Emilija Pranyte (twice), Lou Baudouin and Reese Walker as Sacramento State winners this spring.

Ferreros finished last week with a 3-0 record, winning both of her singles contests in three sets and taking home a doubles victory alongside teammate Irene Riva. The tandem was also leading their other doubles match before the Hornets clinched the point early, ending the bid for a perfect 4-0 weekend.

The duo opened with a 6-4 win over Weber State's Jessica Hill and Sydney Schnell before switching to singles where Ferreros defeated Schnell for a second time on the day with a 6-7 (5), 6-0, 1-0 (10-8), victory at the No. 1 spot in the lineup, helping Sacramento State to a 7-0 shutout of the Wildcats.

Two days later, Ferreros rallied for another singles victory at the top spot in the lineup, outlasting Idaho State's Asem Shoybek, 3-6, 6-2, 6-2, en route to a 5-2 team victory over the Bengals.

Ferreros' two singles triumphs extended her winning streak to six straight matches and improved her to 10-4 overall at the top spot in the lineup this year, the most wins in the Big Sky at that position.

As a team, the Hornets have a 15-2 overall record and a 5-0 mark in Big Sky play, having won their last eight straight matches. ★

to open the season and five home games, including the Causeway Classic, University of California (UC) Davis football is set for an exciting 2025 with 12 games and eyes on a Big Sky Championship following a historic 2024 season.

The Aggies will host Southern Utah (Sept. 20), Weber State (Sept. 27), Northern Arizona (Oct. 11), Idaho State (Nov. 1) and

Sacramento State (Nov. 22) at UC Davis Health Stadium.

On the road UC Davis will head to Utah Tech (Aug. 30), Washington (Sept. 6), Cal Poly (Oct. 4), Northern Colorado (Oct. 25), Idaho (Nov. 8) and Montana State (Nov. 15).

It's the second-straight season that the Aggies will play 12 games, with their season opener being the Football Championship Series Kickoff Classic in Montgomery, Alabama. The Aggies will face fellow National Collegiate Athletic Association Football Championship Series Playoff qualifier Mercer on Aug. 23 in the Week 0 event set to be broadcast on ESPN's linear networks.

"We're excited about the opportunity to play on national television to start the year against a great opponent in Mercer," said head coach Tim Plough. "Every year in the Big Sky is a tremendous challenge and we look forward to the opportunity to grow as a program in 2025." "We will work hard as a team to create a group that the Davis community and university is proud of. Hopefully that leads to some great crowds in Shredville next fall where we all can find joy every Saturday," Plough said.

The game in Seattle, Washington against the Big Ten's Huskies will be the first time that the two sides have met on the gridiron and the lone Football Bowl Subdivision squad the Aggies will see in 2025. UC Davis will also make its first trip to St. George, Utah and the game in Montgomery will be the first time the Aggies play south of the Mason-Dixon Line since 2008 when they visited Central Arkansas.

Perdomo spent the entire 2024 season on the Braves injured list as he continued his recovery from Oct. 6, 2023 "Tommy John" surgery. He last pitched in the majors in 2023 with Pittsburgh when he was 3-2 with 3.72 ERA in 30 relief appearances.

Perdomo is 4-2 with a 5.55 ERA in 52 relief appearances in the three seasons in the majors with the Brewers (2020-21) and Pirates (2022).




