

# **Habitat for Humanity Opens Applications**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Twenty interested families took the first steps in learning how to qualify for firsttime home ownership as the first construction phase of eight new single-family homes on Sayonara Drive by Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento (HFHGS) officially opened April 1.

"We're excited to open the application process for the first phase of this project and to help you on the pathway become first-time homeowners," said Rochelle Disney, Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento director of homeowner services, describing the project at a March 31 in-person community presentation at Citrus Heights City Hall. "If you're

selected, you'll be a part of a vibrant, new community on Sayonara Drive and some of you may be next door neighbors one day."

First phase construction is planned to start in June or July, Disney said.

A question-and-answer session followed, describing how to obtain an application and what financial documents would be necessary for consideration. Applicants have no later than 4 p.m. May 23 to submit their complete applications.

Disney said that Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento is accepting applications for the first 10 homes in its Citrus Heights Savonara Drive development and one additional home to be built in Folsom.

"We're encouraging those interested to see HabitatGreaterSac.

org/Apply and then complete a homeownership prequalification questionnaire," Disney said.

The partnership between the City of Citrus Heights and Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento helps provide stable housing for nearly 120 low-income households in Sacramento and Yolo County, including children.

Construction will be done in three stages of eight to 10 units per stage, with each stage taking approximately a year to complete, according to Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento. The total project development cost is estimated at \$8.5

# **California** Franchise Tax **Board Warns** of Tax Scams

California Franchise Tax Board News Release

## SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- The California Franchise Tax Board (FTB) is warning taxpayers to protect themselves from persistent scams this tax season by reviewing Franchise Tax Board's online scam avoidance tips and being especially guarded with tax, bank account, credit card and other personal information.

"Unfortunately, FTB and other California agencies constantly battle bad actors attempting to steal your money. This time of year, some may try scams by posing as tax agency representatives," said State Controller and Franchise Tax Board Chair Malia M. Cohen. "If you ever doubt the authenticity of a text, email or phone call claiming to be from Franchise Tax Board, Internal Revenue Service or any other government agency, contact the agency directly to verify whether there's an issue that requires your attention."

Recently, the Franchise Tax Board received reports of a scam targeting taxpayers through text messages claiming to be from the Franchise Tax Board. The texts include a link to a fraudulent version of certain Franchise Tax Board webpages designed to steal personal and banking information.

On its online Scams webpage at www.ftb.ca.gov/ help/scams, the Franchise Tax Board offers a way to report suspected scams and provides tips on how to avoid them.

The Franchise Tax Board advises Californians not to reply to suspicious text messages, download attachments or click on links in texts or emails if they are unsure of their authenticity. Visit the Franchise Tax Board's text messaging page at ftb.ca.gov/help/scams/ text-messaging.html to verify when Franchise Tax Board sends texts and what information is included.

Scammers often prey on taxpayers by impersonating Internal Revenue Service or Franchise Tax Board employees. They might attempt to scam taxpayers into sending money not owed or providing personal information that could be used to file fraudulent returns and steal refunds. If a taxpayer receives

a letter from Franchise Tax Board or the Internal Revenue Service that appears suspicious, call the Franchise Tax Board at 800-852-5711 or the Internal Revenue Service at 800-829-1040.

Continued from page 1 for Humanity Greater Sacramento program criteria might qualify for a 30-year, zero-percent equivalent

Prospective homeowners must be U.S. citizens or permanent legal residents and be able to demonstrate that they can afford a monthly mortgage payment and the ability to save for closing costs. Potential homebuyers must have good credit (no recent bankruptcies, collections, liens or judgments) and demonstrate a need for decent and affordable housing.

Selected applicants must also complete 500 total hours of sweat equity toward the physical completion of their new home.

"We realize that many of our applicants are working and we're flexible in how the 500 volunteer hours can be completed," Disney said.

The project provides a first-time homebuyer opportunity for qualified low-income families earning between 30 to 80 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI). Each unit provides an affordable 30-year, zero-percent interest equivalent fixed-rate mortgage to qualifying homebuyers, according to Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento.

The online prequalification questionnaire isn't intended to represent a final determination, nor is passing the prequalification a guarantee that applicants will be accepted into the Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento program, Disney said. room units (971 square feet), 12 three-bedroom/two-bathroom units (1,214 square feet), 10 four-bedroom/two-bathroom units (1,407 square feet) and two five-bedroom/two-bathroom units (1,523 square feet).

The new all-electric two-, three- and four-bedroom duet style homes feature drought-tolerant landscaping, energy- efficient heating systems, low-flow plumbing systems, security alarm systems, solar battery storage and rooftop solar panels.

Applications for consideration must be received no later than 4 p.m. May 23 at either Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento offices in Sacramento at 819 North 10th St. or in the Citrus Heights Community Room at 6360 Fountain Square Drive in Citrus Heights.

Habitat for Humanity Greater Sacramento has scheduled four first-come, first-serve application dropoff session dates at those locations until its May 23 deadline.

Construction of the new units on Sayonara Drive by Habitat for Humanity on 12 vacant city-owned lots in Citrus Heights, using CalHome funding, will meet the city's obligation to replace blighted rental units that were demolished between 2008 and 2010.

An in-person orientation meeting regarding the Sayonara Drive Habitat for Humanity single family housing project was moved on April 7 from the Citrus Heights City Council Chambers to the Citrus Heights Event Center in Fountain Square due to interest in applying for the project.

# New Korean BBQ Sushi to Open this Summer

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - Progress toward opening a new Korean barbecue and sushi restaurant, doing business as Must Be Cow, is "moo-ving" along.

There's bright new red lettering in place on the building's front façade of 5511 Sunrise Blvd. in Citrus Heights, formerly home of Boston's Pizza and Sports Bar which closed in November 2023.

A permit application for an interior remodel of the 8,500-square-foot standalone restaurant building was filed with the city in November 2024, said Marisa Brown, the city's communications officer.

Just above Must Be Cow's front entrance, in the center marquee position, is a colorful caricature of a cow in tan coveralls that is holding a piece of sushi with a pair of chopsticks.

The playful name of the new restaurant along Sunrise Boulevard was first confirmed by both Kathilynn Carpenter, executive director of Sunrise MarketPlace and reported by the Citrus Heights Messenger in early January.

Co-owner Jason Duan said in a recent telephone interview that an opening date is expected this summer.

Duan is a business partner in Sizzling Lunch, a Bay Area-based Japanese

fusion restaurant chain that currently operates eight locations in the area.

Must Be Cow is the duo's first new restaurant concept outside of the Bay Area. Duan said he looks forward to bringing his take on Korean barbecue and sushi to the city of Citrus Heights.

"We're in the process of finalizing the new menu for Must Be Cow," Duan said.

Duan said the full-service restaurant will offer both Korean barbecue and all-you-can-eat sushi. The restaurant includes about 44 dining tables equipped with individual grilling stations, a sushi bar and bar that will serve beer and wine, according to Duan.

Public notice of a filing with the California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) for a new on-sale beer and wine license on the premises by the co-owners, Must Be Cow, LLC, is displayed in the restaurant window at its front entrance.

Must Be Cow Korean BBQ and Sushi is the fourth incarnation of the standalone restaurant on Sunrise Boulevard, which was built in 1978.

The restaurant was the location of the Peppermill Restaurant and Lounge, a Logan's Roadhouse, before becoming Boston's Pizza. The former Marie Callender's Restaurant and Bakery located next door on Sunrise Boulevard closed in 2019.

# **Social Security Matters**

# When is the Best Time for Me to Claim Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I will be 66 ½ in June and would like to discuss when would be the best time for me to start taking my social security benefits. I am still employed full time and don't want to be penalized because of that. Please let me know what I need to do to set up an appointment with you. I got your information from the AMAC website, and I look forward to hearing from you. Signed: Ready to Claim

Dear Ready: You can certainly call us on 1.888.750.2622 during normal EST business hours for a personal conversation. But to facilitate that conversation, be aware that deciding when to claim your Social Security benefit normally depends on just a few factors, including your financial need, your health and expected longevity, and your marital status. A few things to be aware of:

• Born in 1958, your "full retirement age" is age 66 years and 8 months. If you were born in October 1958, you will reach you FRA in June 2025, and that is the point you can get 100% of the SS benefit you've earned from a lifetime of working.

• Once you reach your FRA in June, Social Security's "annual earnings test" no longer applies. Thus, you can continue working after you start your SS benefits and your earnings will not negatively affect your monthly benefit amount. If you claim any earlier than your FRA, you will get a smaller benefit and also be subject to Social Security's annual earnings test (which for you this year - your FRA year is \$62,160, or \$5,180/month after you start your SS benefits). If you decide to claim before your FRA, your benefit will be reduced by .556% for each month early (a permanent reduction).

· You can also wait beyond your FRA to claim and earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) at the rate of .667% per month (8% per year of delay), in order to get an even higher benefit later. If financially feasible, you can delay up to the age of 70 when your monthly benefit will reach maximum - about 27% more than it will be in June of this year.

• If you are single and will not be eligible for a spousal benefit, then you should make your claiming decision based only on your own needs. If, however, you are married and your spouse's FRA benefit is more than twice your FRA amount, you may be entitled to a "spousal boost" (a supplemental amount added to your own SS benefit).

• Your life expectancy should be considered when deciding when to claim your SS retirement benefits. If you expect to enjoy at least "average" longevity (about 87 for a woman your current age), then you might also consider delaying your claim (if financially feasible) and that is often a prudent choice. If you don't expect to achieve a long life, or if you need the money sooner, or if you are entitled to spousal benefits, then claiming at your FRA of 66 years and 8 months is likely your best option. In the end, only you can

decide when you should claim your Social Security, but we're always here to answer any additional questions you may have. # In California's Capitol, Some Political Fights Span Decades

Were we able to transport ourselves back in time 50 vears and into California's Capitol, we would find a governor seeking and enjoying massive attention by national political media as he eyes some greater office. We'd also find a Legislature dealing with conflicts among influential interests with heavy financial impacts.

In other words, the Capitol's dynamics in 1975 were pretty much what they are today.

The resemblance even extends to specific issues. For instance, then-Gov. Jerry Brown was touting a "peripheral canal" in 1975 to carry water around the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Gavin Newsom was seven years old then, but now as governor is waging the same campaign for a tunnel to do the same thing and is facing the same opposition.

Other conflicts that confronted Brown and legislators a half-century ago can be found again among the hundreds of bills introduced so far in the 2025 legislative session.

On Tuesday, for instance, the Senate Judiciary Committee took up Senate Bill 29, a measure that would extend indefinitely the ability of survivors of people who died as a result of medical malpractice to sue for "pain, During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Legislature provided a temporary window for such suits because the court system was in pandemic-induced turmoil.

Insurers and other opponents of the measure contend that it violates a 2022 compromise on the limits of malpractice damages, a deal that seemingly ended a 47-year-long political battle that began when Brown signed the Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act in 1975.

A half-century ago, doctors and other health care providers were also skirmishing over "scope of practice," the body of state law that defines in great detail which medical professionals can perform which procedures on which parts of the human body.

The hardest-fought battle pitted orthopedic surgeons against podiatrists over the legal right to perform ankle surgery, and it raged for years until the latter prevailed. Ever since, there have been similar conflicts too numerous to list, such as psychologists vs. psychiatrists over the right to prescribe drugs, optometrists vs. opticians over eye treatment - and even veterinarians vs. dog groomers over who could legally brush

a dog's teeth. The current version of this perennial turf battle is Assembly Bill 876, which would allow nurse anesthetists to provide their services more independently — the latest in a years-long string of legislative efforts by nurses to bolster the scope of their

practices. Soon after becoming governor, Brown pledged to reform workers' compensation, the system that

suffering, or disfigurement." provides income and medical care to those with work-related illnesses and injuries. That effort failed, but as one of the last acts of his first governorship, Brown signed a bill to increase payments to such workers by about \$3 billion a year, angering employers who must provide coverage.

That touched off a predictable cycle in which a majority of the workers' compensation interest groups would work out some sort of systemic overhaul once each decade and get it enacted over objections of groups left out of the negotiations.

The last such instance occurred in 2012 when Brown, once again governor, negotiated and signed legislation to raise benefits again, but impose new rules on eligibility and medical care to save enough money to pay for the benefits.

The Capitol is overdue for another workers' compensation deal and a newly introduced measure, Senate Bill 555, could be the vehicle. It would increase benefits to workers with partial but permanent disabilities, which have been capped at \$1,256 a month for the last decade.

The bill would provide automatic cost of living increases and is certain to draw fire from employers — another chapter in what has been one of the Capitol's longest running high-dollar conflicts.

# CalRecycle Announces Crackdown Musical Celebration on the True on Foam Foodware

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - CalRecycle released an update April 4 announcing that it will enforce California's statewide ban on polystyrene foam foodware.

In 2022, Gov. Gavin Newsom signed California's landmark anti-plastic pollution bill into law. The legislation included a ban on foam foodware, commonly called Styrofoam, unless the plastic industry demonstrated a 25% recycling rate by the end of 2024. That standard was not met, so the polystyrene foodware ban went into effect statewide in January.

However, until now, neither Gov. Newsom nor CalRecycle had released any statement or guidance about the new ban or started enforcing it. As a result, foam cups, plates and containers have still been used by restaurants and for sale in stores across the state.

Polystyrene foam is incredibly hard to recycle and only about 1% of it is recycled nationally. Plastic foam is frequently among the most commonly picked-up items at beach cleanups. Beyond littering our waterways and landscapes, foam cups and takeout containers can also leach harmful chemicals into the human body from food and beverages.

More than 130 cities in California, as well as 10 other states, have ordinances restricting foam foodware.

"Polystyrene foam cups, plates and takeout containers are overflowing our landfills, polluting our beaches and ocean, and contain chemicals that can make us sick," said CALPIRG State Director Jenn Engstrom in response to the April 4 announcement. "Nothing we use for a few minutes should harm our environment and threaten our health for hundreds of years. That's why California banned foam foodware statewide. It's great to see CalRecycle taking action to better enforce this crucial law."




After the hourlong performance, complimentary refreshments will be served.

SACRAMENTO REGION. CA (MPG) - For the second straight week and the fifth time overall this season a Sacramento State women's tennis player has taken home weekly honors from the Big Sky Conference with senior Maddy Ferreros doing the most recent honors for the Hornets on April 2.

It is the fourth career weekly honor from the league office for Ferreros, whose last award came on April 5, 2023. She joins teammates Emilija Pranyte (twice), Lou Baudouin and Reese Walker as Sacramento State winners this spring.

Ferreros finished last week with a 3-0 record, winning both of her singles contests in three sets and taking home a doubles victory alongside teammate Irene Riva. The tandem was also leading their other doubles match before the Hornets clinched the point early,

ending the bid for a perfect 4-0 weekend.

The duo opened with a 6-4 win over Weber State's Jessica Hill and Sydney Schnell before switching to singles where Ferreros defeated Schnell for a second time on the day with a 6-7 (5), 6-0, 1-0 (10-8), victory at the No. 1 spot in the lineup, helping Sacramento State to a 7-0 shutout of the Wildcats.

Two days later, Ferreros rallied for another singles victory at the top spot in the lineup, outlasting Idaho State's Asem Shoybek, 3-6, 6-2, 6-2, en route to a 5-2 team victory over the Bengals.

Ferreros' two singles triumphs extended her winning streak to six straight matches and improved her to 10-4 overall at the top spot in the lineup this year, the most wins in the Big Sky at that position.

As a team, the Hornets have a 15-2 overall record and a 5-0 mark in Big Sky play, having won their last eight straight matches. ★

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -With a nationally broadcast game to open the season and five home games, including the Causeway Classic, University of California (UC) Davis football is set for an exciting 2025 with 12 games and eyes on a Big Sky Championship following a historic 2024 season.

The Aggies will host Southern Utah (Sept. 20), Weber State (Sept. 27), Northern Arizona (Oct. 11), Idaho State (Nov. 1) and

Sacramento State (Nov. 22) at UC

Davis Health Stadium. On the road UC Davis will head to Utah Tech (Aug. 30), Washington (Sept. 6), Cal Poly (Oct. 4), Northern Colorado (Oct. 25), Idaho (Nov. 8) and Montana State (Nov. 15).

It's the second-straight season that the Aggies will play 12 games, with their season opener being the Football Championship Series Kickoff Classic in Montgomery, Alabama. The Aggies will face fellow National Collegiate Athletic Association Football Championship Series Playoff qualifier Mercer on Aug. 23 in the Week 0 event set to be broadcast on ESPN's linear networks.

"We're excited about the opportunity to play on national television to start the year against a great opponent in Mercer," said head coach Tim Plough. "Every vear in the Big Sky is a tremendous challenge and we look forward to the opportunity to grow as a program in 2025."



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On a routine Monday meal delivery, a volunteer driver with Meals on Wheels (MoW) Sacramento County made a frightening discovery. A senior had been trapped in a collapsed bed since Friday, without food, water or a way to call for help. Staying calm, the driver called 911 and remained at the scene until the emergency contact arrived.

Reflecting on moments like these, Mindy Klick, executive director of Meals on Wheels Sacramento County shared, "I want to say these are success stories but they are more like life-saving stories."

Although often mistaken for a public agency, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County is a program of the private nonprofit called ACC Senior Services, formerly known as The Asian Community Center of Sacramento Valley.

Meals on Wheels Sacramento County partners with Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services to tackle senior hunger and isolation head-on.

Department of Child, Family and Adult Services' support has helped shrink the growing waitlist by providing funding, vehicles and equipment to make meal delivery safer and more efficient.

Wheels Sacramento County is serving an average of about 1,500 meals to seniors each month, with flexible meal options

Home delivery gives participants a meal packs.

Restaurant meal vouchers provide flexibility and the opportunity to dine out at

centers and other sites across the county, provide more than just a meal; they offer a space for seniors to connect, socialize and combat loneliness. For many participants, the opportunity for conversation is just as important as the food itself.

# **Comprehensive Update** on Response to Homelessness Sacramento County

News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The Sacramento County departments of Homeless Services and Housing, and Health Services presented their biannual report to the Board detailing outreach efforts to the homeless population in the unincorporated region of Sacramento and along the American River Parkway from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024.

This is the third such report out since the start of the city/county partnership agreement was signed in December 2023. In addition to reporting on joint outreach efforts in the City of Sacramento, county staff also report on similar activities in the unincorporated county.

Looking at the county outreach items by the numbers starting from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024, 10 parkway staff, 10 encampment services staff and six community-based outreach staff provided 25,274 services to 810 unduplicated individuals and supported 184 unduplicated individuals with transitioning out of unsheltered homelessness (which includes shelter and housing). On average, that is 31 services per participant.

Coordinated Access System (CAS) Referrals:

More than 70% of unsheltered individuals served were between the ages of 25 and 61, 53% were male and 53% were Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC).

45% of individuals are between the ages of 45 and 64, 64% report a disabling condition, 40% have no income, and on average, have experienced nearly four years of homelessness.

From July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024 county shelters enrolled 1,137 unique households.

Taking a look at behavioral health services by the numbers indicate that from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024, 1,360 unhoused residents were referred to behavioral health services and 947 individuals were successfully admitted and linked to services.

During the same period, HEART Team efforts included 1,607 individuals engaged, 342 referrals to behavioral health services and individuals linked to and served by outpatient programs.

From July to December 2024, the Full-Service Partnerships (FSPs) served 2,631 (95% of total capacity) unduplicated individuals out of which 76% of those individuals are housed, 11% are in shelters, 9% are unsheltered and 4% are unknown.

The Department of Homeless Services and Housing continues to update its data dashboards, reflecting its commitment to providing clear, accessible information to support

data-driven decision-making and continuous improvement in addressing homelessness.

Data presented in the dashboards is organized into two general categories: program performance data and demographic insights data.

Program performance data helps track key performance metrics, including program reach, services provided to program participants, program utilization and connections to shelter and housing. Demographic insights

include data on age, gender, race/ethnicity and vulnerability factors such as lengths of homelessness, disability conditions and financial resources.
