ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) - Old Town Plaza was filled with raucous energy this past weekend as the Elk Grove Music Festival returned for its second year. The twoday event, held April 5 and 6, featured live performances, local vendors and a welcoming atmosphere for residents and visitors alike.

From noon to 8 p.m. each day, attendees explored food trucks, a beer garden and booths from local artisans and businesses.

CCSD OKs Contract for New GM

ELK GROVE, CA (MPG) - The Cosumnes Community Services District has a new general manager.

The District Board of Directors last week approved the contract for Tim Ogden to step into the role later this month. According to the district documents, Ogden will make \$305,340 in the role, with an annual cost of living adjustment. The contract will begin on April 30.

The contract was approved without any comment from either the board or the members of the public.

Ogden will be tasked with overseeing CCSD functions, which include providing emergency medical, fire protection and parks and recreation services for over 210,000 Sacramento County residents, most notably in Elk Grove and Galt.

Ogden will replace interim general manager and district counsel Sigrid Asmundson, who stepped in after

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When **Will State Give Vets** a Tax **Break?**

After at least eight tries in the Legislature, California may finally join every other state in providing at least some tax exemptions for military retirement income, which supporters argue will help veterans stay in the state and contribute to a skilled workforce.

Assemblymember James Ramos has introduced, for the third time, a bill that would allow veterans to exempt up to \$20,000 of their federal pensions if they make under \$125,000 a year. He narrowed his bill from last year that sought to exempt a veteran's full retirement income. Sen. Kelly Seyarto, a Republican from Murrieta, introduced a similar bill in the Senate.

Overall, about 1.4 million veterans live in California, of whom 141,000 receive military retirement income, according to the latest data available from the U.S. Department of Defense. Another 26,000 Californians receive survivor benefits.

Ramos said the state would benefit from keeping veterans in California, where they might work in other industries after retiring from the military and further contribute to the tax base. California is home to the Navy's Pacific Fleet and tens of thousands of Marines at Camp Pendleton.

"They bring tested job expertise to our California workforce, they live in our communities and serve as volunteers and leaders," said Ramos, a Democrat from San Bernardino. "California can't afford not to put out the welcome mat for our veterans."

The goal of both bills, the legislators say, is to try to keep more military retirees in California. The state has seen its retired military population decrease due to out-of-state moves and deaths by about 28% from more than 195,000 in 2000 to just over 141,000 in 2022, according to data from the U.S. Department of Defense. California's rate of decline during that time was second only to the District of Columbia, where it declined by 35%.

Data was not available on the employment rate among military retirees - those who served at least 20 years. But among the broader group of veterans aged 35 to 64, about 96% of those still in the

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labor force in California were employed, according to data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

'The Primary Factor is Cost of Living' Veterans leave the state for many reasons, "but the primary factor is cost of living," David Boone, president of the San Diego Military Advisory Council, testified at a recent state tax and revenue committee hearing on Seyarto's bill.

"The states that are gaining veterans have developed strategies to target and attract veterans to their state," he said.

Military retirees in California receive approximately \$29,000 each annually — a total of about \$4 billion a year as of 2022, according to the Department of Finance. Surviving relatives of veterans receive a combined \$400 million.

If the tax break became law, California

would lose an average of \$600 in income tax revenue from each of the 130,000 eligible veterans, according to the Legislative Analyst's Office.Gov. Gavin Newsom is proposing a similar idea through his budget proposal. His office estimates it would cost the state about \$130 million in the next fiscal year, and \$85 million each year after that.

But the financial incentive might be too small to convince retirees to stay in California, the Legislative Analyst's Office noted, doing little to achieve the state's goal of making the state a more competitive destination.

That's the case for Sue Johnson, a former Californian who retired in Nevada after serving 27 years in the Air Force and the Air National Guard.

"Even if it passes, I don't think at this point that it's enough," she said. "Both for my husband and I ... We both had nothing and we've worked hard our whole lives. but then to get to the point where that is not recognized in the state policies ... It's just too much."

Teachers, Firefighters, Police Might Like a Tax Break

Staff on the Senate's committee on revenue and taxation also raised a concern that Seyarto's bill might set a precedent for other professions.

"If the Legislature exempts retirement income for one line of work that provides a direct benefit to the public, why should it not extend the same treatment for other commendable professions, such as teachers, firefighters, or police officers? This may lead to a slippery slope where retirement income from other professions is excluded from gross income, thereby eroding the income tax base," the committee's consultants wrote.

Military retirees and surviving relatives pay state and federal income taxes in California, but receive exemptions on military death benefits paid to qualified survivors, pay for time served in combat zones and partial property tax exemptions.

Of the 41 states that have a state income tax, 25 states fully exempt military retirement income, and the rest partially exempt

The state analyst said California could see a non-monetary value to the proposal, though: It "would no longer be the only state that fully taxes military retirement income. In this sense, although it is a small financial incentive, the proposal may well improve veterans' perception of California."

In 1987 and 1998, voters in the Elk Grove Unified School District approved Measure A bond measures to help finance school facility improvements at every school in the district. The measure authorized

administrators to sell bonds and agree to a Mello-Roos special property tax assessment to repay the bond

A Mello-Roos tax is a special assessment unique to California that can be added to your property tax bill to help fund new infrastructure and amenities within a specific district or neighborhood.

To qualify for the reduction, applicants must be at least 65 years old as of June 30 or fully disabled and have no school-age children who have lived in the residence in the previous 24 months.

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

SMUD to Hold Public Proposed Rate Action Workshops

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The SMUD Board of Directors is holding two public workshops and a public hearing to discuss proposed rate changes.

The Chief Executive Officer & General Manager's Reports and Recommendation on Rates and Services, released by SMUD CEO & General Manager Paul Lau, outlines a proposed rate increase of 3 percent on Jan. 1, 2026, and another 3 percent increase on Jan. 1, 2027. The proposed changes also include an optional Time-of-Day (low use) Rate, updates to transmission rates and other miscellaneous

While SMUD works hard to control costs and operate efficiently, the need for a modest rate increase is attributed to several factors including wildfire prevention and mitigation, new generation projects, higher commodity costs for California clean energy compliance, infrastructure investment to maintain a reliable grid, the Folsom Administrative Operations Building and increased operating costs due to inflation, according to SMUD officials.

SMUD officials say that SMUD is committed to keeping rate increases within inflation, and if the proposed changes are approved, SMUD's rates would remain among the lowest rates in the state, currently on average more than 50- percent lower than neighboring PG&E's rates.

Detailed information on the proposed rate action and a complete copy of the Chief Executive Officer and General Manager's Report and Recommendation

on Rates and Services can be found on smud.org/RateInfo.

SMUD will work closely with customers and other stakeholders, including community groups, service organizations, business groups, elected officials and more, to discuss these changes.

In addition, two public workshops and a public hearing will be held for customers to learn more about the process and comment on the proposed changes.

Meetings will be held in-person at SMUD's Headquarters building and virtually via Zoom.

A public workshop is scheduled for Wednesday, April 30 at 5:30 p.m., followed by another public workshop on Tuesday, May 13 at 10 a.m. Additionally, a public hearing will be held on Wednesday, June 4 at 6 p.m.



Is it Ever Too Late to Talk to God?



During my career as a healthcare chaplain, I would often feel like I was pastoring a parade. That's because, by definition, my chaplain relationship with patients was a temporary one.

I suppose that's why I am relieved when a patient asks if they can call me "Pastor" instead of "Chaplain." I hear their request as an invitation to assume the more personal role of their family pastor.

However, that's not quite how it started with a patient I first knew as "Mr. Penny." I call him "mister" because that's how he introduced himself when I entered his hospital room at Houston Northwest Medical Center in 1992.

I reciprocated his formality by introducing myself as "Chaplain Burkes."

At first, I thought he was using titles in recognition of our age difference. But eventually it seemed like it was more about him wanting to distance himself from the three-piece-suited chaplain who matched his stereotypical idea of the "preacher."

Doctors told Penny he had inoperable brain cancer, but he didn't want to talk about that. The balding, bony man just wanted to chat.

During his next several hospitalizations we talked sports – either the Houston Oilers or my lunchtime basketball games with local clergy.

For Penny, the greater the emotional distance we could maintain from reality, the better.

Finally, though, on his last hospitalization, his nurse summoned me from lunch to tell me Penny had a favor to ask.

Thinking this sounded like the call to a deathbed confession, I made a quick exit from the cafeteria toward the ICU.

I walked into his room to find his wife stroking his fevered head.

"Oh good," she said. "I'm glad you're here

today and not playing basketball." "Knee problems," I said.

"He wants to ask you something."

I looked at the figure on the bed, twisted and ghostly. His raspy breathing suggested he wouldn't have much strength for this conversation, so I leaned over the bed and called to him as if announcing my presence through a dense fog.

"Mr. Poppy it's Cheplein Purkes" Lead "Is

"Mr. Penny, it's Chaplain Burkes," I said. "Is there something you want to ask me?"

He nodded. "Teach me..." he said, his voice

trailing.

He took a fuller breath and added, "Teach me to pray."

Confused by his sudden approach to an intimate moment, I searched his wife's face for

She was chewing on her thumbnail. "He's embarrassed."

"Embarrassed?" I asked.

"He's afraid he's being hypocritical to wait until his death to talk to God," she added.

I nodded. It's a common reasoning I hear from patients.

Jesus summarily dismissed this poor logic in his conversation with two insurgents occupying crosses on either side of his.

The first man spent his last hours mocking Jesus and goading him to use his power to save everyone.

But the other guy was quite the opposite. He

felt shame for his past life, so he asked Jesus, "Remember me when you enter your kingdom." Jesus swiftly responded. "Today you will be with me in paradise."

Instead of disqualifying the dying man for being hypocritically tardy, Jesus assured him that he would be rewarded in the promptest

fashion.

"Mr. Penny," I said. "I think you'll find that God cares very little about your past.

He mostly cares about what you'll do with the next minute of your life."

Penny nodded.

More Than a Meal

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On a routine Monday meal delivery, a volunteer driver with Meals on Wheels (MoW) Sacramento County made a frightening discovery. A senior had been trapped in a collapsed bed since Friday, without food, water or a way to call for help. Staying calm, the driver called 911 and remained at the scene until the emergency contact

Reflecting on moments like these, Mindy Klick, executive director of Meals on Wheels Sacramento County shared, "I want to say these are success stories but they are more like life-saving stories."

Although often mistaken for a public agency, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County is a program of the private nonprofit called ACC Senior Services, formerly known as The Asian Community Center of Sacramento Valley.

Meals on Wheels Sacramento County partners with Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services to tackle senior hunger and isola-

Department of Child, Family and Adult Services' support has helped shrink the growing waitlist by providing funding, vehicles and equipment to make meal delivery safer and more efficient.

"We try to provide whatever we can to help seniors stay in their homes safely," Klick said.

In the current fiscal year, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County is serving an average of about 1,500 meals to seniors each month, with flexible meal options designed to fit their lifestyles:

Home delivery gives participants a choice of daily hot meals or weekly frozen meal packs.

Restaurant meal vouchers provide flexibility and the opportunity to dine out at local partner restaurants.

Community Cafés, located in community centers and other sites across the county, provide more than just a meal; they offer a space for seniors to connect, socialize and combat loneliness. For many participants, the opportunity for conversation is just as important as the food itself.

AniMeals, a pet food program, ensures

that seniors don't have to choose between feeding themselves and their beloved pets. Many participants consider their pets to be family and AniMeals provides food for these furry companions, allowing seniors to care for them without sacrificing their own meals.

Despite their name, Meals on Wheels is about far more than just meals: "This is about making sure our seniors are safe, cared for and not forgotten," Klick emphasized.

To help achieve these goals, Meals on Wheels Sacramento County also equips seniors with essential home items such as microwaves for easy meal prep, shower chairs for safer bathing and bedside commodes for added convenience. Regular wellness checks and emergency support add another layer of safety, ensuring help is always within reach.

"We try to provide whatever we can to help seniors stay in their homes safely,' Klick explained.

A key part of this safety net is the bond between seniors and their delivery drivers. Assigned to regular routes, drivers provide consistency which builds trust and familiarity. For many homebound seniors, they might be the only human connection that day or even that week.

If something seems off such as changes in behavior, health or routine, the driver initiates the chain of support by alerting their caseworker who can respond as needed.

"If we see a situation that concerns us, we're able to reach out to DCFAS (Department of Child, Family and Adult Services) and either get advice, coaching on how to handle it or have Adult Protective Services step in and assist," said

Klick spoke highly of the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services team.

I have not met a nicer group of people with the biggest hearts, trying to do the right thing," she said. "I can pick up the phone and say, 'This is the challenge we're facing, what are your thoughts? How can we partner?"

Comprehensive Update on Response to Homelessness

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The Sacramento County departments of Homeless Services and Housing, and Health Services presented their biannual report to the Board detailing outreach efforts to the homeless population in the unincorporated region of Sacramento and along the American River Parkway from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024.

This is the third such report out since the start of the city/county partnership agreement was signed in December 2023. In addition to reporting on joint outreach efforts in the City of Sacramento, county staff also report on similar activities in the unincorporated county.

Looking at the county outreach items by the numbers starting from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024, 10 parkway staff, 10 encampment services staff and six community-based outreach staff provided 25,274 services to 810 unduplicated individuals and supported 184 unduplicated individuals with transitioning out of unsheltered homelessness (which includes shelter and housing). On average, that is 31 services per participant.

More than 70% of unsheltered individuals served were between the ages of 25 and 61, 53% were male and 53% were Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC).

What about individuals in shelters? In county-funded shelters,

45% of individuals are between the ages of 45 and 64, 64% report a disabling condition, 40% have no income, and on average, have experienced nearly four years of homelessness.

From July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024 county shelters enrolled 1,137 unique households.

Taking a look at behavioral health services by the numbers indicate that from July 1 to Dec. 31, 2024, 1,360 unhoused residents were referred to behavioral health services and 947 individuals were successfully admitted and linked to services.

During the same period, HEART Team efforts included 1,607 individuals engaged, 342 referrals to behavioral health services and individuals linked to and served by outpatient programs.

From July to December 2024, the Full-Service Partnerships (FSPs) served 2,631 (95% of total capacity) unduplicated individuals out of which 76% of those individuals are housed, 11% are in shelters, 9% are unsheltered and 4% are unknown.

The Department of Homeless Services and Housing continues to update its data dashboards, reflecting its commitment to providing clear, accessible information to support data-driven decision-making and continuous improvement in addressing homelessness.

Data presented in the dashboards is organized into two general categories: program performance data and demographic insights data.

Program performance data helps track key performance metrics, including program reach, services provided to program participants, program utilization and connections to shelter and housing.

Demographic insights include data on age, gender, race/ethnicity and vulnerability factors such as lengths of homelessness, disability conditions and financial resources.

\$73 Million in Funding Approved ARTS CALENDAR for Harvest Water Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

The Sacramento Area Sewer District's (SacSewer's) landmark water recycling project, Harvest Water, has been awarded an additional \$73 million in both reallocated Proposition 1 grant funding and new Proposition 4 funds from the California Water Commission's Water Storage Investment Program.

Harvest Water is California's largest-ever agricultural water recycling project and is expected to be operational in 2027.

Once complete, Harvest Water will deliver up to 50,000 acre-feet, or roughly 16 billion gallons

annually, of drought-resistant recycled water to agricultural lands and existing habitats in southern Sacramento County.

By reducing the need to pump groundwater, Harvest Water will promote natural groundwater recovery, boost sustainable agriculture and strengthen existing habitats.

"The additional funding from the California Water Commission is a tremendous boost to Harvest Water and a testament to the project's significance in addressing water sustainability and resilience," said Christoph Dobson, Sacramento Area Sewer's general manager. "SacSewer is making significant progress toward implementing a long-term, drought-resilient water solution that will benefit

the entire region."

Harvest Water has received significant financial support, including a previous award from the California Water Commission of \$291.8 million in Proposition 1 Water Storage Investment Program funding and \$30 million from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation.

This grant funding helped support project design and ongoing construction of needed infrastructure for the recycled water distribution system, which includes 41.4 miles of pipelines, on-farm connection improvements and a large pumping station at Sacramento Area Sewer's Echo Water Resource Recovery facility near Elk Grove.

With this latest financial

commitment from the Water California Commission, the grant funding for the project now exceeds \$394 million, further solidifying Harvest Water's status as a cornerstone of sustainable water management in California.

A great example of the County's commitment to environmental stewardship is the Sacramento Area Sewer District's (SacSewer) Bufferlands, a 2,150-acre open space in south Sacramento County that serves as a natural buffer between the EchoWater Facility and the community. This space was specifically designed to help reduce the potential for odor and noise from the sewer treatment plant and is also a habitat preserve reflecting over 30 years of restoration and management for wildlife to thrive.

Each year, SacSewer Bufferlands hosts public tours and exciting events, including Walk on the Wildside, an annual celebration with wildlife demonstrations, hikes, music and opportunities to engage with local wildlife. For more information about Walk on the Wildside, please visit their website at sacsewer.com/event/

Another County project I'm sure many of you are familiar with is the Harvest Water Program, California's largest-ever agricultural water recycling project aimed at delivering recycled water to agricultural lands and habitats in southern Sacramento County. This water has been treated biologically, mechanically, and chemically to meet the stringent requirements for discharge and reuse. While it is not recommended to drink it directly, it is completely safe for crops and livestock. When complete, the program will provide up to 50.000 acre-feet (approximately 16 billion gallons) of drought-resistant, recycled water annually. A few of the key goals of this impactful project include:

Groundwater Restoration: By supplying recycled water for irrigation instead of groundwater, Harvest Water aims to promote natural groundwater recovery and increase regional and

state water reliability.

Sustainable Agriculture: The program supports sustainable farming practices by delivering up to 50,000 acre-feet per year of recycled water to irrigate up to 16,000 acres of agricultural lands.

Habitat Enhancement: Delivering recycled water to existing habitats is expected to strengthen local ecosystems and benefit wildlife while improving groundwater conditions that sustain local riparian and wetland

Last month, Harvest Water was awarded an additional \$73 million in funding from the California Water Commission as part of the Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP).

Grant funding for the project now exceeds \$394 million, further solidifying Harvest Water's status as a cornerstone of sustainable water management in California.

With significant construction occurring in the

area south of Elk Grove, SacSewer is reaching out to residents regarding road closures and construction impacts through multiple methods and channels.

The inconvenience is real but so are the benefits the Harvest Water pipeline project will provide including the scheduled road improvements once the pipeline is constructed. Rep. Bera Responds to General Mail Theft Report

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On March 27, U.S. Representative Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-06) responded to a newly released U.S. Postal Service Office of Inspector General (OIG) audit report on mail theft, a report he formally requested following widespread complaints from Sacramento County residents about ongoing theft and vandalism of their

The audit uncovered serious deficiencies in how local postal facilities track, secure and inspect mailboxes, particularly highlighting severe gaps in oversight of arrow key

"Despite extensive collaborative efforts from my office with USPS and USPIS to address the persistent concerns raised by constituents, the findings of this audit are completely unacceptable," said Representative

Bera. "The audit identified serious systemic issues including missing and unaccounted-for arrow keys, inadequate oversight and a troubling lack of mandatory inspections. The Postal Service must immediately implement the Inspector General's recommendations to restore public trust and ensure that Sacramento County residents have the secure and reliable mail services they deserve."

The Office of Inspector General audit focused on three postal facilities in Sacramento County: Sacramento Main Post Office (Royal Oaks Drive), Fort Sutter Station (Alhambra Boulevard) and Rancho Cordova Post Office (Progress Court).

Key findings include:

"The Sacramento Main Post Office, Fort Sutter Station and Rancho Cordova Main Post Office did not properly track their arrow key inventories."

"There is no tracking mechanism in place that distinguishes whether a Cluster Box Unit (CBU) is postal-owned or privately owned."

"Local management at the Sacramento Main Post Office, Fort Sutter Station and Rancho Cordova Main Post Office did not perform the annual safety inspections for the condition of blue collection boxes, CBUs, and green relay

The report outlines why these failures occurred, their impact on the community and specific steps for corrective action. General has also issued implementation deadlines and will require proof of compliance.

The Office of Inspector

Representative Bera's office will closely monitor the U.S. Postal Service's progress in addressing these critical issues and will continue advocating on behalf of Sacramento County residents to ensure their mail is delivered securely and on time.

43 while averaging 16.1 points per game, according to MaxPreps.

Monterey Trail finished the season as co-champs of the Delta League after finishing 11-1 (24-7 overall). The Mustangs advanced to the second round of the CIF Sac-Joaquin section championships before falling to the Lincoln Trojans. They were selected to the state championship tournament and fell to the Buchanan Bears of Clovis.

At the time of publication. Dorrough has received Division I offers from the University of Washington, Sacramento State, McNeese State University in Louisiana, University of Southern California and UC Berkeley, according to his social media.
