SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Did you know that after every general election, voters who have not voted in two federal elections and have not updated their voter registration file get canceled and removed from the voter roll? This duty is one of the responsibilities of the Sacramento County Voter Registration & Elections (VRE) office under the National Voter There were 56,086

Sacramento County voters who met these conditions during our most recent review. As a result, on March 18, Voter **Registration & Elections** sent out postcards to these inactive voters letting them know that their voter registration would be removed from the voter roll.

Voters who received the postcard had to respond by April 2 to keep their voter registration active and on the voter roll in Sacramento County. Voters who missed this deadline had their registration canceled and needed to re-register to vote. What to do if you receive this postcard for a voter who no longer lives at your address? Nothing. Our office will cancel the voter's registration on April 2. What is this postcard for? The postcard is called a pre-cancellation card and is used as a final notice to voters in Sacramento that their voter registration is being canceled. The deadline for response to this postcard is 15 days from the day it is sent. Other reasons we send out this postcard on a weekly basis include death, conservatorship and current incarceration for the conviction of a felony. The Citrus Heights City Council considered amendments to the illegal fireworks ordinance at the April 9 meeting.

A social host ordinance has been in effect for a few years, holding property owners financially responsible if illegal fireworks are used on their premises. However, Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD) Chief Alex Turcotte said that illegal fireworks "remain a significant city concern," causing both noise pollution and safety hazards.

Turcotte presented an amendment clarifying that fireworks discharged on sidewalks or streets in front of a home are under the "apparent control" of the property owner, who would then be subject to the fines.

The other proposed

amendment was to increase the penalty amounts. Currently, a \$750 fine is imposed for the first violation, with each subsequent violation resulting in a \$1,000 fine. The change would update the first violation to a \$1,000 fine, \$2,500 for the second and \$5,000 for subsequent violations. The cost for offenders could increase significantly as each illegal firework would be counted as a violation.

Turcotte said the goal was not to make money off this issue, but rather to make the public aware that it is being taken seriously. He said the hope is that increased penalties will deter people from committing these violations.

Councilmember Kelsey Nelson said that using illegal fireworks is "playing with fire," because it can cause such severe damage. During public comment,

several residents spoke in

support of the increased fines.

Although she supports having an ordinance in place, Mayor Karpinski-Costa said, the Citrus Heights Police Department needs to improve its enforcement efforts. Residents often report fireworks activity that has already ended by the time officers arrive, according to the mayor.

Turcotte said that officers cannot be in every location at once, which is why they have various enforcement strategies, including the use of drones and allowing citizens to serve as witnesses to the violations.

The council voted unanimously to approve the amendments to the illegal fireworks ordinance.

City Council members then discussed changing how service stipends are managed for the various regional boards and commissions that councilmembers also take part in.

A recent change in state legislation increased the maximum limit for compensation that councilmembers can receive. Last April, City Council also voted to raise their compensation from the city to that maximum limit of \$1,900 per month.

Due to that change, stipends from other boards and commissions can only be accepted if separate statutes govern them.

City attorney Ryan R. Jones explained that the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) and the Sacramento Metro Cable Commission do not have separate statutes. So it is illegal for councilmembers to accept those stipends since they are already receiving the maximum allowable compensation. Instead, those Continued on page 3

Rancho Seco Recreational Area Implements New Boat Restrictions

RANCHO SECO, CA (MPG) -The Sacramento Municipal Utility District announced new watercraft restrictions on March 25 at Rancho Seco Lake as a preventive measure against the spread of invasive, non-native golden mussels recently discovered in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

The new restrictions follow an alert issued by the California Department of Fish & Wildlife that indicated the potential environmental and economic threats it could pose to the region.

According to the alert, golden mussel shells were recently discovered in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The species pose a threat to natural ecosystems, water conveyance systems, infrastructure and water quality in California and across the United States.

"This discovery is the first known occurrence of golden mussels in North America," the Department of Fish & Wildlife wrote in the alert.

Golden mussels are similar in appearance, biology and impact to quagga and zebra mussels, per the alert, but can also establish in waters with lower calcium levels than required by quagga and zebra mussels.

To protect Rancho Seco Lake from invasive mussels, only small watercraft that can be launched by hand (such as canoes, kayaks, smaller electric watercraft, paddle boats, sculls and the like) are now allowed.

The watercraft must be thoroughly cleaned, drained and dried before launch, and cannot have been in any other waterway, including the Delta, for at least 30 days. To further protect the ecosystem, only artificial bait and lures are permitted.

The measure also bars trailer-launched watercraft and live aquatic bait, including all baitfish, crawfish, crabs and mussels.

Small electric trolling motors and other handlaunched watercraft such as hand-launched canoes, rafts, kayaks, rowboats, paddle boats, inflatables, sculls and other handlaunched recreational watercraft will still be allowed on the lake.

All permitted watercraft will be required to undergo a watercraft inspection by a certified inspector or canine upon park entry. Inspectors will restrict any boat that has been in any other body of water in the last 30 days or that they deem a risk.

All watercraft must be clean, drained and dry. Boaters will be required to participate in visual inspections of their watercraft.

All visitors planning to

launch any flotation device will receive inspection, and devices must be fully clean, drained and dry before launching.

Other bodies, including the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency, have taken similar steps to protect against the invasive species.

The 400-acre Rancho Seco Recreational Area remains open for a wide range of activities including camping, hiking, fishing and bird watching. Visitors can still enjoy the scenic Howard Ranch Trail, picnic areas and renovated facilities.

SMUD's popular Trout Derby event on April 5 and 6 continued as scheduled, with staff and resources in place to ensure all participants can enjoy a successful fishing experience while adjusting to the new watercraft guidelines.

Certified watercraft inspectors and canine teams will be on-site to conduct thorough inspections, ensuring all watercraft meet clean, drain and dry requirements before launching.

Enhancing Sacramento Residential Care Facilities

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Sacramento County's Department of Child, Family and Adult Services (DCFAS) is working to preserve housing for vulnerable residents in our community. The Department of Child, Family and Adult Services is distributing funds from the California Department of Social Services Community Care Expansion (CCE) Preservation Program. Sacramento County's Department of Child, Family and Adult Services is investing nearly \$12 million to preserve facilities; maintain dedicated beds for qualified residents, which includes disabled and older adults; and avoid homelessness.

California has a shortage of licensed adult and senior residential facilities that accept individuals receiving or applying for Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment (SSI/SSP) or Cash Aid Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI). Many of these facilities are closing or reducing the number of beds available to Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment and Cash Aid Assistance Program for Immigrants residents (also known as "Qualified Residents") as benefit amounts have not kept up with the cost of facility operations and maintenance.

A breakdown of the funding throughout the county has been allocated \$11,993,597 in CCE funding in the following manner: \$5,162,415 for Operational Subsidy Payments (OSP) that is funding to support the day-to-day cost of operations. These funds must be used by June 2029. \$6,831,182 for Capital Projects (CP) that is funding for facilities to make needed repairs and upgrades. These funds must be used by March 2028.

Sacramento County's Department of Child, Family and Adult Services are currently working with six licensed adult and senior residential facilities to support their ongoing operations and capital improvements. These facilities accept the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Non-Medical Board and Care rate, which is significantly lower than the market rate. At St. Mary's Home, a 14-bed adult residential facility, Capital Projects funds were used to replace toilets, upgrade resident furniture and install a new roof. At

Wholesome Elderly, a 6-bed facility for older adults, Capital Projects funds were used to replace original windows, and a sliding glass door and to complete plumbing repairs. Other projects are scheduled to be completed during the contract period with the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services to ensure these facilities are safe and up to date.

"This project is important because our low-income older adults and adults with disabilities need an affordable, safe and stable place to call home; a place where they can live with dignity. These facilities provide, assistance with activities of daily living, medication management and opportunities to socialize with others. Without preservation, many facilities have to defer needed repairs; they have difficulty meeting operating expenses and can eventually close which leads to displacement of residents," says the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services Human Services Program Planner, Mary Parker.


By investing in licensed residential adult and senior facilities, Sacramento County is ensuring that low-income, vulnerable residents have a safe and well-maintained place to live. This funding plays a critical role in helping facilities that prevent homelessness in older and disabled adults.

Sunrise Mall Redevelopment Wants a Hotel

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Attracting a hotel to the Sunrise Mall redevelopment under the city's Sunrise Tomorrow Specific Plan area is a declared strategic objective of the Citrus Heights City Council for its 2025-26 calendar year.

The strategic objective, formally adopted by the council on April 9, tasks the city with partnering with a Sunrise Tomorrow property owner to secure a signed agreement with an authorized hotel operator or developer. The goal is to establish a hotel within the Sunrise Tomorrow Specific Plan area by leveraging city resources and conducting targeted outreach.

The Citrus Heights City Council unanimously approved a request last June to subdivide a 2.8-acre lot at the busy corner of Sunrise Boulevard and Greenback Lane, which is home to a branch of US Bank, as a potential hotel footprint.

"Bringing a hotel to Citrus Heights has been a consistent theme in community feedback and it is a critical piece of the vision for Sunrise Tomorrow, a mixeduse destination designed to serve as an economic engine for the city," said city communications officer Marisa Brown.

Approval of the subdivision request by the city allows the US Bank branch office to remain on an existing 0.93-acre parcel at the busy traffic corner. It also splits the two remaining portions into 1.48 acres for the location of a future hotel development. A separate 0.38-acre parcel is anticipated for either retail or restaurant use.

Attorney David Bowie addressed the City Council last June on behalf of Antioch Street LP and Ellwood Commercial Real Estate, the two developers who brought forth the tentative parcel map and subdivision request to the City Council.

Individual representatives

The development agreement signed by the city with the two developers also encompasses design agreements and zoning codes, along with public improvement requirements, infrastructure upgrades, right-of-way rights for roads and future hotel operating standards, according to the city.

The development agreement also lists accepted hotel brands that would be automatically approved by the Citrus Heights Planning Commission, including Embassy Suites and Holiday Inn.

Community Development director Casey Kempenaar, who presented the subdivision request to council members, described the revised parcel map as the "first domino to fall" in the plans for the mall's redevelopment. Kempenaar oversees the city's planning, building and housing divisions.

A new national-brand 3-star hotel built on the Sunrise Mall property with approximately 120 rooms could fill the gap in local lodging that exists between Rancho Cordova and Roseville. It could generate up to \$500,000 annually in transient occupancy (TOT) taxes, Kempenaar estimated.

The agreement also stipulates that any future hotel must be a 3-star hotel and maintain operation for a minimum of 25

"We continue to hear from residents, businesses and community stakeholders that a hotel is needed in Citrus Heights," said Meghan Huber, the city's Economic Development and Community Engagement director.

And Brown noted, "The city is actively partnering with the property owner and has engaged in discussions with multiple hotel developers to advance this opportunity."

"As we work to transform Sunrise Mall into a vibrant hub for our community and the region, a hotel will play an essential role in supporting business activity, attracting visitors, and anchoring the site as a true destination," Brown said. "The city of Citrus Heights is fully committed to making that vision a reality."

stipends could be directed to the city for deposit into the General Fund.

Mayor Karpinski-Costa said she would support allocating all stipends, including those that officials are technically allowed to keep, into the General Fund.

Councilmember Porsche Middleton said they all serve on various boards throughout their terms in office: "We're all doing the same work."

Because some boards do not offer stipends, Middleton agreed that it would be fair to put all stipends into the General Fund. According to Middleton, that will ensure that all councilmembers receive equal monthly compensation, regardless of their committee assignments.

The council unanimously approved additional stipends to be deposited into the General Fund.

Amendments to the city manager's employment agreement were also considered. One recommendation was to amend the base salary to align with the regional average.

City Manager Ashley Feeney was hired for the role in January 2022 and his contract's terms have not been modified since that time. His performance reviews have been favorable and City Council wants to continue his employment. The proposed contract amendment would provide an annual salary of \$290,000 with a \$500 monthly vehicle allowance.

City Council voted unanimously to approve the salary increase for Feeney.

Chief Turcotte presented the annual Citrus Heights Police Department report. He highlighted various accomplishments from the past year, including a continued focus on supporting the CARES Campaign and enforcement efforts that enhance quality of life. The Citrus Heights Police Department increased enforcement against illegal drugs and intoxication within the city. Enhanced animal services, community engagement and youth safety programs were also implemented.

Comparing crime statistics from 2023 and 2024, Turcotte said there was a 1% reduction in property crimes. This was significant since there has also been an increase in reporting crimes, due to the city's focus on retail theft.

Turcotte acknowledged that crimes against persons were up more than 6% and crimes against society (including drugs and weapons) were up 77%. However, Turcotte attributed much of this increase to proactive policing efforts, which have led to a significant rise in arrests. He emphasized that although the numbers may suggest a spike in crime, they actually reflect the positive results of improved law enforcement.

To improve safety around Citrus Heights schools, the Citrus Heights Police Department increased traffic enforcement in those areas. This led to a 63% increase in traffic citations.

"Seeing the numbers reinforces the hard work you all do all the time," Councilmember Nelson said.

The next scheduled Citrus Heights City Council meeting is at 6 p.m. April 23 at 6360 Fountain Square Drive. ★

The name Sumi was inspired by sumac browse, a favorite snack of Sumi's mother, Amirah, during her pregnancy.

The name is a playful nod to the sumac tree and honors the important role that the local community plays in supporting the zoo's giraffes through its browse donation program.

The browse donation program allows the zoo to feed many of the animals, including the giraffes, chimps, lemurs and many birds, food that is exactly like what they would consume in the wild. They enjoy nibbling leaves, stripping bark and chewing on stems to keep their brains busy and their bellies full.

Every day, the Sacramento Zoo feeds pounds of browse (non-toxic branches and leaves from specific species of trees and shrubs). The browse donation program allows members of the public to donate tree and shrub trimming from specific species of trees and shrubs to feed the zoo inhabitants.

Dear Dave.

How do you feel about the leasing programs automotive manufacturers offer their employees? I've listened to your show enough to know you don't recommend leasing the traditional way through a dealership.

- Baker Dear Baker,

I'd advise investigating the details of any deal like this very carefully. Some manufacturer offers, even ones to employees, are nothing more than another way for the company to fleece more drivers. But some manufacturers offer their employees decent programs that aren't a traditional lease. I assume this is the kind of deal you're talking about.

A few of them offer the

use of a newer, high-quality car for very little money per month, with no hidden catches. In cases like these, things can work out pretty well for the employee and the company. I've even heard of a few companies offering gas and more in these employee deals.

Now, you're right. I don't recommend leasing in a normal scenario. For the average buyer walking onto a car lot, leasing is a complete rip-off. I tend to call it "fleecing" because getting "fleeced" means getting taken advantage of financially. And that's exactly what happens with consumer auto leases. Basically, a car lease is a contract where, instead of buying a car, you pay in monthly installments to drive it for a set amount of time-usually two to three years. It's basically

a glorified rental car. But unlike a rental, leasing is a form of debt. And on top of all that, leasing is also the overall most expensive way to own a car.

Again, just make sure vou check all the details very thoroughly, Baker. Use your head and a calculator, not your heart, when making a decision on something like this.



Social Security Matters *Will My Social Security Increase if I Keep Working After Applying?*

Dear Rusty: I am going to be 67 in a few weeks & I plan on working for another year or two. According to Social Security, they count the best 35 years to come up with your benefit. I currently have 30 years, with 2024 and 2025 taxes yet to be filed. If I take my benefit now, will I get an upward adjustment after filing my taxes for those years, or do I need to wait to apply for SS until after filing my taxes to get credit for those years? Signed: Still Working

Dear Still Working: Whenever you claim your Social Security benefit, SSA will look at your lifetime earnings record on file at the time (as received from the IRS) and calculate your "primary insurance amount" (PIA) using that record on file. They will use your highest earning 35 years to do that calculation and, if you do not yet have 35 years, they will use "zero \$\$" enough times to make it 35 years. In other words, your benefit will always be calculated using 35 years, whether you actually have 35 years of earnings on record, or not.

Social However, Security revisits your earnings record whenever additional information is received from the IRS, so if file your taxes and add the additional year's income after you start your Social Security benefits, you will get credit for those additional earnings. Essentially, you will be replacing one of the "zero \$\$" years originally used to calculate your benefit amount, and Social Security will recalculate your monthly amount to reflect that, resulting in an increase to your monthly benefit.

Thus, as long as you work and earn and report your earnings to the IRS, Social Security will update your record and automatically give you a higher benefit if warranted by your more recent earnings. That recalculation usually happens later in the year (after April 15th), but Social Security will make any increase retroactive to the beginning of the calendar year, so you will get any higher benefit effective with January.

already reached your full retirement age (FRA), you can (if you wish) apply for Social Security now and be confident that Social Security will give you credit for any additional earnings after you apply. And for clarity, if you choose to wait beyond your full retirement age to claim, you will earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) which will continue to increase your monthly benefit amount until you are 70 years of age. DRCs will add 8% to your PIA for each full year you delay (.667% for each month you delay past your FRA).

Overwhelmingly Californians rate the intertwined issues of housing supply, living costs and homelessness as the state's most pressing issues, as a recent poll by the Public Policy Institute of California confirms.

The terrible trio, as one might term it, also draws constant verbal acknowledgement from the state's politicians from Governor Gavin Newsom down, and he and legislators have enacted dozens, perhaps hundreds, of measures to address it.

Nevertheless, there's little evidence that their efforts have had material impact. Either the three situations are beyond the capacity of politics to address, a distinct possibility, or the political efforts to date have not been vigorous enough.

Why, one must wonder, is California plagued while residents of other states enjoy lower housing and living costs and experience much lower rates of homelessness? Shouldn't our political and civic leaders be examining what these other states are doing right, or are they so afflicted with self-righteous hubris that they cannot entertain such a thought?

A new and very detailed study of housing policies in the nation's 250 largest metropolitan areas confirms that California is an outlier when it comes to increasing housing

its costs.

Titled "Build Homes, Expand Opportunity" the report is a product of the George W. Bush Institute at Southern Methodist University.

"America's fastest-growing cities offer lessons on how America can address its housing affordability crisis," the report declares. "Based on our analysis of the 250 largest metropolitan areas and a deep dive into 25 large metros in the Sun Belt and Mountain states, places scoring best for pro-growth housing and land-use policies are mostly large Sun Belt metros from the Carolinas through Texas to Utah."

The metros doing the best job of meeting their housing demands, the report says, have policies that make it easy for developers to build. That includes allowing higher-density housing in "substantial fractions of every city," reducing minimum lot sizes, allowing residential construction in commercial areas, reducing or eliminating parking requirements and embracing innovative technologies such as modular construction and three-dimensional (3D) printing.

In addition to adopting specific housing policies that spur development, the report continues, metros that are meeting demand also pursue complementary policies, such as having enough educational and medical services, allowing "fine-grained mixing of land uses and human activities in as many places as possible," allowing "dynamic changes in land use rather than trying to freeze neighborhoods," and providing amenities such as "walkability, revitalized live-work-play

and trails."

supply and moderating downtowns" and "great parks

So, one might ask, which metro areas are hitting all the right buttons and which are not, as determined in the study?

The 25 top pro-housing metros are all either in the Sun Belt, particularly Texas, California's arch-rival, or in the mountain states such as Utah and Idaho. Number one is Charlotte, North Carolina. and number two is Austin, the Texas capital which is becoming a powerful competitor with California's Silicon Valley.

Not surprisingly, California metros are heavily represented on the list of the nation's 25 "most restrictive" metros. While Honolulu is the least accommodating, Oxnard is number two.

Nine of the 25 are in California. They include, in order after Oxnard, San Jose, San Diego, Riverside-San Bernardino, San Francisco, Sacramento, Bakersfield, Fresno and Stockton.

It would be tempting to dismiss the Bush Institute's report as biased because it comes from Texas, but it contains a wealth of detail and explains how the data were evaluated.

A better response from California politicians would be to read the report and determine what more California could do to make the state housing friendly. The state's current path on housing, other living costs and homelessness is going in the wrong direction.

Man Sentenced for Vehicle Theft, Evading Officers and Illegal Possession of Firearm

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -On April 4, the Honorable Laurel White sentenced James Jarrard to 59 years and four months to life in prison.

On Feb. 14, a jury convicted

Jarrard of vehicle theft, felony evading, felon in possession of a firearm and possession of a controlled substance while armed. The jury also found true two firearm enhancements.

On Oct. 16, 2022, Jarrard was driving a stolen truck when he led Citrus Heights police officers on a high-speed pursuit into a residential area.

Jarrard crashed into a tree and fled on foot with a firearm. Jarrard jumped fences and forced entry into a home with two individuals inside.

One victim escaped to call for help, while the other hid in an upstairs bedroom. Jarrard broke through the ceiling where the

second victim was hiding. This prompted the second victim to jump from a second-story window, resulting in injury. This led to a more than three-hour police standoff with Jarrard hiding in the home.

Officers eventually apprehended Jarrard and searched the stolen truck, where they found a loaded firearm and methamphetamine.

At the time of the offense, Jarrard was on parole for two strike offenses of assault with a firearm. He also had a prior strike for residential burglary. Jarrard's prior strikes were also found true at the sentencing hearing.







SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On April 10, Governor Gavin Newsom announced that officials have seized more than \$316-million worth of illegal cannabis and \$474,000 in cash since this past January.

Through coordinated enforcement actions with state agency partners and local governments, these efforts build upon the previous work to seize \$534-million worth of illegal cannabis in 2024.

In addition to confiscating 212,681 illicit cannabis plants, officials issued 99 warrants, which resulted in the removal of 35 firearms and 29 arrests.

"As California's legal cannabis market expands, we have a responsibility to crack down on the nefarious actors that put public health at risk and undermine the progress we've made. Unlicensed, unregulated products threaten consumer safety and jeopardize the integrity of this industry. We're doubling down on our commitment to protect Californians and lift the legal cannabis marketplace that so many have worked hard to build," said Governor Newsom.

These figures represent combined enforcement efforts from the Governor's Unified Cannabis Enforcement Task Force, the Department of Fish & Wildlife, the Department of Cannabis Control, the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration, the California Department of Pesticide Regulations, among others, since January.

California's regulated cannabis market is the largest in the world. The state fosters environmental stewardship, compliance-tested products and fair labor practices while driving economic growth and funding vital programs in education, public health and environmental protection. The Department of Cannabis Control recently released a market outlook report that shows prices are stable, industry value is up and the licensed market is growing. Since 2019, officials have seized and destroyed more than 800 tons or more than 1.7 million pounds of illegal cannabis worth an estimated retail value of \$3.1 billion through more than 1,500 operations.

The cannabis task force was established in 2022 by Governor Newsom to enhance collaboration and enforcement coordination between state, local and federal partners. Partners on the task force include the Department of Cannabis Control, the Department of Pesticide Regulation, the Department of Toxic Substances Control and the Department of Fish and Wildlife, among others.

In September, Governor Newsom announced emergency hemp regulations in response to increasing health incidents related to intoxicating hemp food and beverage products, which state regulators found sold across the state. The new regulations ban any detectable quantity of tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) from consumable hemp products to protect youth and mitigate the risk of adverse health effects.

The emergency regulations better align the sale of hemp products with certain restrictions currently seen in the California legal cannabis market. Regulations include limiting serving and package size and establishing a minimum age of 21 to legally buy industrial hemp food, beverage and dietary products.

In October, Governor Newsom issued a statement online, called "Court shuts down industry attempt to block enforcement of California's hemp regulations," following the Los Angeles County Superior Court's recent decision to reject the hemp industry's attempt to block enforcement of the regulations.

Since the emergency hemp regulations were put in place, agents from California's Alcoholic Beverage Control have visited

State Library Receives Notice of Termination of Federal Grant

- The California State Library has been notified by the federal Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) that, effective April 1, the 2024-25 federal grant awarded under the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) has been terminated.

In the current fiscal year (2024-25), the State Library received \$15,705,702 in funding to assist local California libraries to provide programs and services, as well as supporting the services provided by the State Library to state government, policymakers, and the public. Over 21 percent of that funding has yet to be sent to California.

The Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) has provided critical funding for a wide range of programs that benefit communities across California. These funds support early learning and literacy programs, such as storytimes and play spaces for low-income families, summer reading initiatives that engage over a million children and teens, and programs that help at-risk youth develop workforce-readiness skills. Additionally, Library Services and Technology Act funds have enabled State Library staff to assist with the expansion of the Student Success Card program, ensuring that all California students receive a public library card by third grade.

Beyond literacy, Library Services and Technology Act funding strengthens communities by supporting diverse programs that align with California's cultural, educational, and environmental priorities. Local libraries have used these funds to create climate education programs, community gardens,

tool libraries, and telehealth privacy pods for individuals without home internet access. Libraries also provide valuable services for veterans, formerly incarcerated individuals, and tribal and rural communities. Highspeed broadband initiatives, along with programs like California Revealed and the Cultural Heritage Disaster Preparedness Program, ensure that California's history and cultural treasures are preserved and accessible to the public.

Library Services and Technology Act funding also expands access to learning resources for Californians of all ages. It supports the state's only shared eBook collection, free access to major news publications like The New York Times and CalMatters for Learning, and databases that serve state employees, lawmakers, and the general public. The Career Online High School program, supported by State Library staff, enables adults to earn their high school diplomas through local libraries, while the Braille and Talking Book Library ensures that visually impaired Californians have free access to books in accessible formats.

Additionally, these funds help strengthen California's library workforce through statewide training, leadership development, and tuition reimbursement for those studying to become librarians. Libraries also benefit from partnerships with state agencies, including the Departments of Aging, Public Health, and Technology, which allow public libraries to serve as vital hubs for government resources and community engagement.

Established in 1850, the California State Library is the central reference and research library for state government and the Legislature. The library collection includes more than 4 million titles, 6,000 maps and 250,000 photographs, and includes an extensive collection of documents from and about the state's rich history. The State Library also serves California's local libraries, providing state and federal funds to support public libraries and deliver statewide programs and services.

Economic Concerns Lead to Drop in Home Sales

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Economic uncertainty and an increase in the number of existing homes on the market led to a decline in new home sales in the Sacramento region in March, the North State Building Industry Association reported on April 8.

Building Industry Association members sold 472 homes during March. That is down 9% from February, down 22% from March 2024 and 11% below the average number of sales reported during the month. March sales were the lowest for the month since the COVID-19 pandemic year of 2020 but were in line with sales immediately preceding the pandemic.

North State Building Industry Association President and Chief Executive Officer Tim Murphy said the primary reason for the drop-off appears to be the decline in stock markets and concerns about the economy. This comes as the United States and its trading partners impose new tariffs.

"Our members reported that the number of people visiting their communities last month was similar to levels from January and February, indicating that prospective buyers are still interested in purchasing a new home," Murphy said. "But given the economic uncertainty, many appear reluctant to pull the trigger."

"In addition, while still below pre-pandemic levels, the number of existing homes on the market in the region is up by about 20% from last year, giving prospective buyers a larger pool to choose from."

The most sales were the 264 reported in

Sacramento County new home communities, followed by 134 homes in Placer County, 35 homes in the Yuba-Sutter market and 20 homes in El Dorado County.

Roseville remained the most active submarket with 101 sales, followed by Rancho Cordova (76), Sacramento (60), Elk Grove (56) and Folsom (27.) Natomas and Plumas Lake tied for sixth with 22 sales, followed by El Dorado Hills (17), Lincoln (16) and Antelope (13).

Building Industry Association statistics include sales by members in Amador, El Dorado, Placer, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba counties.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A new poll released April 9 by the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB) shows broad bipartisan support for America's small businesses. It also shows overwhelming support for keeping the 20% Small Business Tax Deduction in the tax code.

"California is not a low-tax state, which is why allowing the Small Business Deduction to expire at the end of the year would hit our small business owners much harder here than it would elsewhere in the nation," said California director of the National Federation of Independent Business John Kabateck. "Small businesses make up 99.9% of all businesses in California, employing seven million people, so it's vital for the health of the nation's economy that the Small Business Deduction be made a permanent part of the tax code. Small business owners have used the deduction to create new jobs, create new benefits, buy new machinery and expand their business."

According to the survey, more than eight in 10 Americans feel it is important for the federal government to support small businesses, including strong majorities of Republicans, Democrats and Independents.

That support translates to strong agreement (93%) that making the 20% Small Business Tax Deduction permanent should be a top priority for Congress, with nearly all Americans (95%) expressing some concern about the impact an expiration of the deduction would have.

Key findings from the nationwide poll include:

Americans overwhelmingly support small businesses.

About 83% of respondents said that it was important for the federal government to support small businesses. Findings also show that 45% of Americans saod supporting small businesses was extremely important.

More than two-thirds of Republicans (83%), Democrats (86%) and Independents (79%) said that federal support for small

businesses was essential.

Nearly eight in 10 respondents (79%) want to see more support for small businesses.

Americans support the expiring 20% Small Business Tax Deduction that was included in the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA).

About 62% of respondents want to keep the Small Business Tax Deduction in the tax code, while only one in five respondents supports letting it expire.

Approximately 77% agree that the Small Business Tax Deduction helps level the playing field for small businesses by keeping their tax rates closer to those of larger corporations.

Americans say that the 20% Small Business Tax Deduction has helped small businesses and the American economy.

Nearly 91% of Americans agree that small businesses rely on the Small Business Tax Deduction, according to the respondents.

Around 79% of Americans say that the Small Business Tax Deduction has a positive impact on the economy overall.

About 75% of Americans believe the Small Business Tax Deduction has a positive impact on the local economy where they live.

Lastly, 51% of Americans are extremely or very concerned about the impact on the economy if the Small Business Tax Deduction expires. Nearly all Americans (95%) express some concern about the impact an expiration of the deduction would have.

The 20% Small Business Deduction was established under the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) to level the playing field between small businesses and their large, corporate competitors.

However, this vital deduction is set to expire at the end of 2025. Without Congressional action, nine out of 10 small businesses will be hit with a massive tax hike, decimating their ability to expand business operations and raise wages for employees.
