RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova celebrated the completion of the Chase Drive and American River Parkway Connection project on Aug. 15.

The project was completed in coordination with several partner agencies, including the Folsom Cordova Unified School District, Cordova Recreation and Park District, Sacramento County Regional Parks, Cordova Community Council and Soil Born Farms.

"With the completion of this project, residents now have a direct connection to the American River Parkway, as well as an important link to recreational and educational amenities along Chase Drive," said Mayor Siri Pulipati. "I'm grateful to my City Council colleagues, our dedicated city staff and our partners for making this collaboration a success."

Project improvements include a separate pathway, pedestrian scale lighting, new ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act)-compliant

Final County Recommended Budget Hearings to Begin

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will begin Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-26 Revised Recommended Budget hearings at 9:30 a.m. Sept. 3 in the Sacramento County Administration Building's Board Chambers, located at 700 H St., Sacramento.

If necessary, hearings will continue on Sept. 4 and Sept. 5 at the same time and location.

The hearing schedule, subject to change, includes In-Home Supportive Services Public Authority budget deliberation and approval; and potential federal and state funding impacts on future county budgets. It also includes the Fiscal Year 2025-26 revised recommended budget presentation, public comment, and board deliberation and approval of revisions to the approved recommended budget and adopted budget resolutions.

The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2025-26 Recommended Budget on June 4. The \$8.9-billion spending plan recognized new or enhanced areas of growth in the General Fund totaling \$43 million (\$9 million funded with Net County Cost), with the addition of 52 full-time equivalent positions. The FY 2025-26 General Fund recommended reductions totaled \$18 million, which would have resulted in the deletion of 73 full-time equivalent positions.

However, the Board of Supervisors made additional revisions to the recommended budget, totaling \$11 million in restored reductions and additional growth.

The numbers in the budget change between June and September when Sacramento County receives new information, including the state budget's impact and updated fund balance and revenue totals. Because of that new information, the Revised Recommended Budget comes back to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors for review and adoption in September.

The FY 2025-26 Revised Recommended Budget includes \$9.2 billion in total appropriations, including \$4.2 million in General Fund growth (\$2.3-million funded with Net County Cost), with the addition of 16 full-time equivalent positions.

The budget hearings will also be telecast live on Metro Cable 14 at metro14live.saccounty.gov and on the web at scob.saccounty.gov/Pages/BOSPublicMeetings.aspx. ★

Ukrainian Americans Parade Gratitude

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Celebrations for the 34th anniversary of Ukraine's independence on Aug. 24 culminated in a 30-mile, horn-honking convoy through Carmichael, Arden Arcade, Citrus Heights and Fair Oaks.

The Sunflower Society of

Sacramento spearheaded the parade.

Church and society members hit the road in solidarity.

Twenty vehicles bore painted sunflowers, Ukraine flags and the Stars and Stripes. Slogans blessed Ukrainian resistance to invasion and thanked American supporters. In a blaze of blue and yellow, the convoy crept from North Avenue to merge with Fair Oaks

Boulevard traffic.

Horns began honking immediately. The cacophony continued enroute, until parade vehicles returned to the church more than an hour later.

"We felt so happy to see lots of people still supporting Ukraine," said Sunflower Society of Sacramento co-organizer Olga Noshyn.

"A Ukraine war veteran and

his young son were with us," Noshyn said. "They were happy so many people honked to greet us. When heroes who have sacrificed so much in this war see strangers who support them, this gives them hope."

The Sunflower Society of Sacramento and Carmichael's Ukrainian Seventh Day Adventist Church, whose members fundraise for medical

needs at Ukraine frontlines, on Aug. 23 co-hosted flag day celebrations.

Second Chances for Justice-Involved Adults

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A new chapter began for dozens of Sacramento County residents stepping into stability, safety and a second chance.

Sacramento County, alongside HOPE Cooperative, community partners and residents gathered on July 31 to celebrate the grand opening of Renewed Hope, a formerly vacant motel that was transformed into a 57-unit transitional housing site designed for justice-involved adults experiencing homelessness or housing instability.

Located in Sacramento and

operated by Hope Cooperative, the site offers furnished private housing, wraparound behavioral health services and onsite supports aimed at helping residents heal, stabilize and transition into permanent housing.

“While Renewed Hope provides shelter, the real power of this program isn’t in the buildings, it’s in what happens inside them,” said Dr. Ryan Quist, director of Behavioral Health for Sacramento County. “We know that when people are given a safe place to live and the right behavioral health support, they begin to believe in themselves again. That’s the kind of impact we’re here to celebrate.”

The facility began operating in May, and since then, residents have already begun the steps toward their recovery and graduate from these units into independent living.

“It’s really a big step forward,” said client Luke Smith. “Before, I didn’t have access to anything. I couldn’t even think about going forward. But now, everything is starting to work out.”

Since moving into Renewed Hope, Smith said he’s able to do his own laundry, attend the court-ordered drug and alcohol classes, and participate in life skill classes to help him get back on his feet. Adding this feels like progress.

“With 59 beds and comprehensive support services, it offers more than housing, it creates a real opportunity for healing, growth and renewal,” said April Ludwig. “Made possible through partnerships with Anthem, HealthNet, Kaiser Permanente, Molina and Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services, and supported by a Behavioral Health Bridge Housing grant, this project shows what’s possible when we lead with compassion, purpose and a belief in second chances.”

Renewed Hope residents can stay up to nine months and are offered intensive services, including behavioral health care coordination, life skills, peer

coaching and help planning their next step, whether that’s employment, education or permanent housing. The site includes shared community areas, onsite laundry and pet-friendly policies designed to foster comfort and connection.

As more transitional housing projects come online through Behavioral Health Bridge Housing funding, programs such as Renewed Hope are giving people the space and support to start over.

curb ramps, high-visibility crosswalks, trees and landscaping. The pathway was installed along the Cordova High School and Mills Middle School frontages on Chase Drive. Within Hagan Park, the pathway is connected to the American River Parkway bike trail.

Construction for the first phase of the project began in May 2024 and was completed fall 2024.

The second phase began this past April and was completed this summer.

Funding for the project was awarded through \$2.362 million in state funding through Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) Community Design Program, in addition to \$788,000 in Sacramento Transportation Authority Measure A funds through its Smart Growth

Incentive Program.

City Receives Project of the Year Awards

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova was recently honored with two Project of the Year Awards from the Sacramento Chapter of the American Public Works Association (APWA).

The city received recognition for the Chase Drive American River Parkway Connection project and the Sunrise Boulevard Rehabilitation Phase Two.

Completed this summer, the project added a multiuse path along Chase Drive from Coloma Road to the American River Parkway in Hagan Park.

The project was completed in partnership with the Sacramento County Regional Parks, Cordova Recreation and Park District, Folsom-Cordova Unified School District, Soil Born Farms and Cordova Community Council. Funding for the project was awarded through \$2.362 million in state funding through Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) Community Design Program, in addition to \$788,000 in Sacramento Transportation Authority Measure A funds through its Smart Growth Incentive Program.

In addition to the multiuse path, project improvements included accommodations for pedestrians including crosswalks, lighting, and ADA-compliant curb ramps.

The city commemorated its completion on Friday, August 15, 2025, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and celebration.

The rehabilitation of Sunrise Boulevard from White Rock Road to Douglas Road was completed in Summer 2025. The project enhanced pedestrian safety, flood protection, road surfaces, accessibility and aesthetics in the area.

Improvements included ADA-compliant curb ramps, pavement overlay, and drainage upgrades as well as median, curb, and landscaping enhancements. This was the second project in Rancho Cordova that used the cold-in-place recycling method for pavement rehabilitation. Cold-in-place recycling is a cost-effective, environmentally friendly method that rebuilds roads by reusing the existing pavement instead of hauling it away and replacing it.

The city was awarded a five-million-dollar grant from SACOG under the Maintenance and Modernization Program. The city also received a grant from CalRecycle for the use of rubberized asphalt which sourced rubber crumbs derived from California-generated waste tires.

"Thank you to the APWA Sacramento Chapter for recognizing Rancho Cordova. We are immensely honored to receive these awards," said Public Works Director Albert Stricker. "We are grateful for the City Council, project partners, city staff and residents for helping bring these projects to life."

The nonprofit organization provides lifetime services for graduates of its initial program, including counseling, job search and retention support, financial assistance, paid job training and

its Trellis Gardens transitional workforce housing program.

In 2024, 155 graduates secured employment or enrolled in advanced training or school and 89% of graduates maintained or improved their housing.

Since 2001, 1,955 women have graduated from the program with their more than combined 4,000 children.

California Mid-Decade Redistricting Scheme

Beware of ethically challenged and desperate politicians' intent on using the electorate as pawns in their relentless quest for power.

Governor Gavin Newsom, Attorney General Rob Bonta and loyal party leaders are moving with haste to put a redistricting measure on a special election ballot this November. They are invoking an emergency status to warrant the hasty process with minimal time, a mere five days, allowed for the drafting of thoughtful language and deliberation to influence the electorate. Their motive is raw political ambition, not even thinly veiled, an effort to eliminate Republican seats in the State House and the U.S. House of Representatives. An element essential to candid communication in this regard is the fact that the voters of California have on two prior occasions exercised their

right to call for an Independent Redistricting Commission. The voters spoke clearly and unequivocally, calling for a thoughtfully constructed commission to be comprised of five Democrats, five Republicans and four people not affiliated with either of the two major parties. Appropriate limitations have been placed on the persons who pursue service on the commission. They are subject to a vetting and selection process, they are precluded from most forms of political activism, they are prohibited from running for office, donating to the campaigns of candidates, or working for elected officials. The foregoing is the law of the state and represents a California State Constitutional Amendment that ensures adherence to this practice, for now.

Because the state of Texas, and most other states in the US do not have such an independent commission, the Texas legislature has the right to redraw legislative maps. The Lone Star State is not bound by any manner of restriction or constitutional language; they are free to do precisely what they are doing (SCOTUS – Rucho v Common Cause 2019) regardless of how

many of us may feel about it, it is lawful. This concept of gerrymandering is not, as Governor Newsom relentlessly asserts, unprecipitated. Rather, it is a plot that goes back to 1812. In fact, the very term gerrymandering was coined as a portmanteau of the word salamander and the name of Elbridge Gerry, who would become the vice-president of the United States, but in 1812 as governor of Massachusetts, signed a bill that created a partisan district in the Boston area. Obviously, by including salamander- a slimy crawling amphibian – the term was not intended to be flattering. The voters of California have recognized the unsavory element of such conduct and moved to eliminate that practice by force of law.

Our Attorney General, Mr. Bonta has publicly opined that Texas (and Florida) should have a commission and laws like we have in California; he is correct on that point. Nonetheless, he is working in concert with Governor Newsom and partisan legislative leaders in this state to usurp the twice expressed will of the people in 2008 and 2010, and the Constitutional Amendment their votes created.

The most recently drawn

lines were completed by the independent commission in 2021 after the decennial census, consistent with current law. The deliberations of the commission were in public and conducted by persons who met the explicit criteria established in law created by California voters. Those decisions were made based upon enumerated criteria, and specifically not for the purpose of benefiting either political party. In fact, the final maps were criticized by both major political parties, likely a testament to their legitimacy. In addition, the work of the commission survived legal and political challenges.

The plan advanced by Governor Newsom and his sycophantic legislative leaders is unscrupulous by any reasonable measure. However, Attorney General Rob Bonta, whose job includes the obligation to represent the public interest, has breached his codified obligation to his constituents. Additionally, it will be his responsibility to defend this unprincipled scheme against a legal challenge. Further, his office holds the duty to draft the Title and Summary for your November ballot. Do you believe for a moment that his conduct thus far has demonstrated a scintilla of

objectivity? We deserve an attorney general who will recognize and adhere to their fundamental obligation to their constituents, to represent the public interests and support the electorally expressed demands of the public.

Governor Newsom either fails to understand the role of democracy in this Constitutional Republic, or is estranged from the truth. Once again, the people have spoken through a democratic act on this critical issue. But the governor does not care for the outcome, so he profoundly and almost pathologically rejects it, ignoring his oath of office.

If these elected officials who have taken an oath to support and defend the Constitution of the United States of America, and the State of California succeed in their blatant usurpation of democracy, the 2026 midterm election will likely result in California having only four of fifty-two House seats, approximately nine percent, while nearly forty percent of California voters voted Republican in the last election. Democracy, Governor Newsom?

Governors, attorneys general, and legislators in California have historically engaged in misleading propositions with wholly

disingenuous Title and Summary language intended to dupe the voters to an unwanted and often destructive course of action. Gerrymandering for raw political power against the clearly expressed will of the people is not consistent with the expectations of representative government or the fundamentals of a Constitutional Republic.

Make no mistake, this is not simply a creative way to silence many Californians, it is a disgraceful collaboration to reject the twice expressed democratic will of the voters of the state of California. It also represents a needless expenditure of more than two hundred million dollars in taxpayers' money, while the state is in fiscal crisis.

As good citizens, we have an obligation to inform ourselves and vote wisely. I urge you to join the League of Women Voters and other responsible Californians and reject this partisan affront to democracy.

Two Sacramento Residents Sentenced to Prison

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Dominic Davis, 40, and Sharitia Wright, 61, both of Sacramento, were sentenced July 28 to federal prison for conspiring to file false claims, Acting U.S. Attorney Kimberly A. Sanchez announced.

Davis received a sentence of three years and four months in prison, and Wright received a sentence of one year and three months in prison.

According to court documents, between March 2019 and April 2022, Davis and Wright caused at least nine fraudulent income-tax returns to be filed with the IRS claiming more than \$2 million of income tax refunds.

The returns were filed in the names of Davis,

Wright and family members and listed wages that the taxpayers had not received. They often listed the taxpayers' employer as one of the various LLCs created by Davis, Wright and their family members.

Many of the returns also falsely claimed charitable contributions that were not actually made. Davis prepared and filed the false tax returns.

Wright provided him information and contacted the IRS to check on the status of the refunds claimed in the false tax returns.

Davis and Wright were ordered to pay restitution for the fraudulent income tax refunds that they received.

This case was the product of an investigation by IRS Criminal Investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorney Nicholas M. Fogg prosecuted the case. ★

I have described the lapel pin in the past and I will describe it again for those who haven't seen it yet.

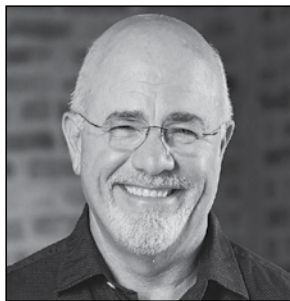

What Comes First?

Dear Dave,

I'm a non-traditional student in my last semester of college. In May, I'll graduate with a degree in elementary education and have a job waiting for me. It will bring our household income up to a little over \$100,000. We're already living on a budget, but the problem is we'll have \$15,000 in student loan debt to repay, plus \$5,000 in credit card debt. What should we address first?

—Marta

Dear Marta,

It sounds like all your hard work is about to pay off in a big way. And I've got some more good news for you. If you two keep living the way you have

been, and put the rest toward debt, you can have that student loan and credit card debt knocked out in just a year or so.

But I want you to pay close attention to what I'm about to say next. Just because you're making more money doesn't mean you should start buying a bunch of toys or pick up a car payment. Sit down together now—don't wait—and practice making a written monthly budget based on your new income. Give every dollar a name before you spend it, and don't forget to work the debt snowball, too. List your debts from smallest to largest, make minimum payments on the largest, and then attack that credit card debt with a vengeance.

Chances are you can get the credit card debt tak-

en care of in two or three months. Then, roll the money from that payment over, and apply it and any other cash you can scrape up toward the student loan debt.

With just a little more work, you folks are going to find yourselves in a really great place soon!

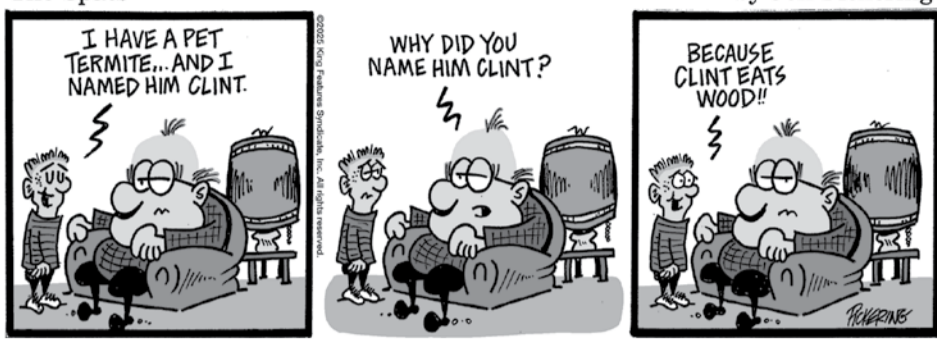

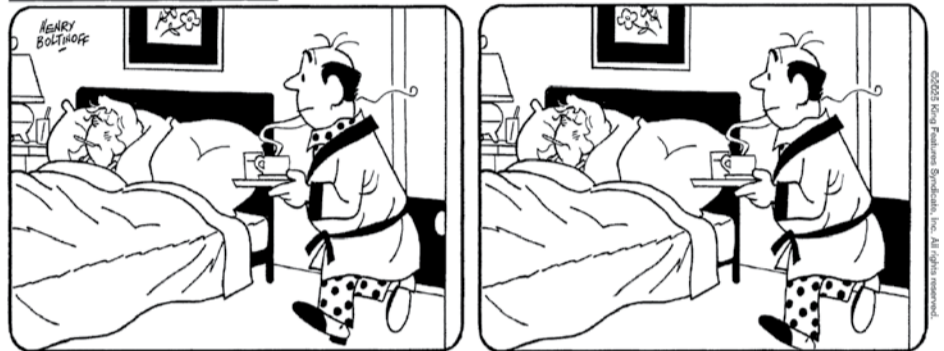

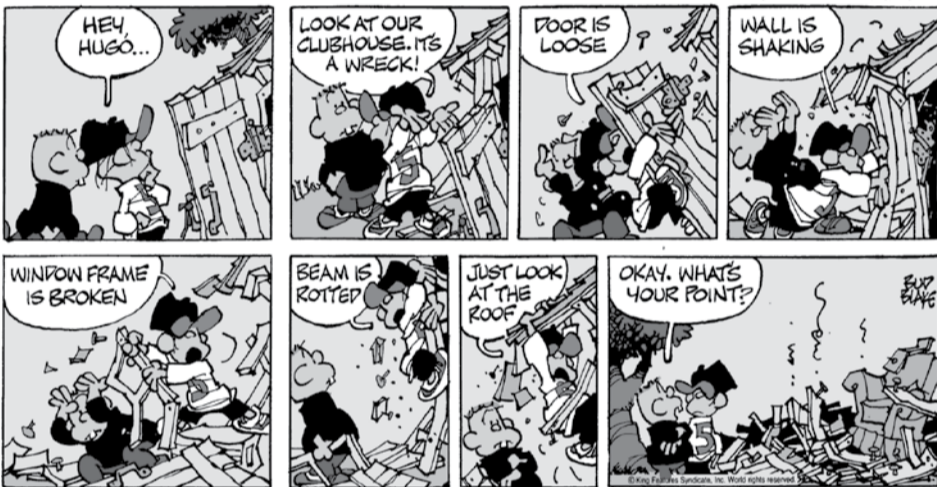

Republic FC Stadium Groundbreaking Ceremony

Sacramento Republic FC News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Wilton Rancheria and Sacramento Republic FC marked the beginning of construction on Republic FC Stadium at the Railyards with a groundbreaking ceremony on Aug. 18.

The ceremony celebrated the tribe's return to its ancestral lands along the banks of the Sacramento and American rivers, 67 years after its federal recognition was stripped from the nation by the California Rancheria Act. Now that Wilton Rancheria and Republic FC have acquired the land in The Railyards, site preparation will begin in the coming days and fans can take the first step in locking in their place for the club's inaugural season in its new home.

"The Rancheria Act tried to erase us but, on its anniversary, we are breaking ground on a future that ensures our sovereignty, our name, and our story will endure," said Wilton Rancheria Chairman Jesus Tarango. "This is not our groundbreaking; this is our homecoming."

Said Managing Partner Kevin Nagle, "Our path has not been easy. But just like our city, just like our tribal partners, we've kept moving forward. And now, together, we are breaking ground on the future. In 2027, when the first ball is kicked here in The Railyards, it will be more than the start of a match. It will be the next chapter in an ongoing story of resilience."

For a first look at the stadium design developments and to learn more about placing a deposit for the 2027 season, fans can visit RepublicStadium.com. A flythrough video will show off the stadium's unique elements, including a Supporters' Plaza, the rooftop club with views back to the city's skyline, the park-like eastern concourse, open-air public-market and beer-garden inspired culinary options, entry plazas and a close look at the West tower that will feature a variety of new premium seating options.

Starting at just \$9.16, four deposit levels are available to give fans priority access to season tickets for the inaugural season at the new stadium. From a safe-standing supporters section (\$9.16), general seating in the East and Southern neighborhoods (\$25) to all new premium seats (\$50) and private luxury suites (\$500) with ultimate comfort and unmatched views, there are options for every budget and every type of fan. Only one deposit is required to secure your seat selection priority for the new stadium.

Each deposit will include

a donation to help the club construct more free-to-play mini-soccer courts around the region. Since 2019, the club has built 12 new safe spaces throughout the community and donations will support the next court opening later this year and the many more to follow.

The groundbreaking comes after years of collaboration and commitment between Wilton Rancheria, Republic FC and the broader Sacramento community. Pre-construction work is already underway, including grading and utility preparation. In

Republic Stadium is expected to open in 2027 and will serve as the permanent home for Republic FC, as well as be a premier venue for concerts, cultural festivals and community events. ★

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Kings begin the 2025-26 season on the road against the Phoenix Suns at 7 p.m. Oct. 22. The Kings finish the homestand with contests against Minnesota (Nov. 9), Denver (Nov. 11) and Atlanta (Nov. 12) with the game against the Nuggets as their first nationally-televised game of the season, airing on NBC.

The Kings embark on a five-game road trip that tips off with their second Emirates NBA Cup game, taking on the Timberwolves at 5 p.m. Nov. 14. Sacramento heads to San Antonio (Nov. 16), Oklahoma City (Nov. 19), Memphis (Nov. 20) and Denver (Nov. 22).

The Kings in Sacramento have two 7 p.m. games against the Minnesota Timberwolves on Nov. 24 and the Phoenix Suns on Nov. 26 for their third Emirates NBA Cup contest. Sacramento ends November with an Emirates NBA Cup game in Utah, playing the Jazz at 6:30 p.m. Nov. 28 and finishing the month with a 6 p.m. home outing versus Memphis.

The Kings take a three-game road trip, playing the Rockets in Houston at 5 p.m. Dec. 3, the Heat in Miami at 5 p.m. Dec. 6 and a nationally televised game against the Indiana Pacers on Dec. 8 (Peacock).

The Kings have a two-game set against the Trail Blazers, squaring off in Portland at 7 p.m. Dec. 18 and in Sacramento at 7 p.m. Dec. 20. Sacramento finishes a four-game homestand with games versus Houston (Dec. 21), Detroit (Dec. 23) and Dallas (Dec. 27).

Road games in Los Angeles are with the Lakers at 6:30 p.m. Dec. 28 and the Clippers at 8 p.m. Dec. 30 in a

nationally-televised game on NBC.

The Kings have 10 games in Sacramento in January, beginning with a New Year's Day clash against the Boston Celtics at 7 p.m. Sacramento travels to Phoenix (Jan. 2) for the second night of a back-to-back with the Milwaukee Bucks (Jan. 4) and the Dallas Mavericks (Jan. 6, NBC). The Kings make their first appearance at Chase Center on Jan. 9, playing the Warriors at 7 p.m.

Sacramento has a seven-game homestand with games against Houston (Jan. 11), the Lakers (Jan. 12, Peacock), New York (Jan. 14), Washington (Jan. 16), Portland (Jan. 18), Miami (Jan. 20) and Toronto (Jan. 21). The Kings then play six games away in nine days, beginning with games against Cleveland (Jan. 23) and Detroit (Jan. 25). Sacramento travels to New York (Jan. 27) before a back-to-back against Philadelphia (Jan. 29) and Boston (Jan. 30) and finishing in Washington on Feb. 1.

The Kings follow with three home games: the Memphis Grizzlies (Feb. 4), their first game on Prime Video against the Clippers at 7 p.m. Feb. 6 and a home matchup against Cleveland (Feb. 7). They play in New Orleans (Feb. 9) and Utah (Feb. 11). The Kings have a home outing against Orlando at 7 p.m. Feb. 19 and then an away game with San Antonio at 5 p.m. Feb. 21 in Austin for the start of a five-game trip. The Kings travel to Memphis (Feb. 23), Houston (Feb. 25) and Dallas (Feb. 26) and ends the trip in Los Angeles against the Lakers (March 1).

Sacramento has nine home games in March: a five-game homestand that starts against the Phoenix Suns at 8 p.m. March 3, airing on NBC; New Orleans (March 5), Chicago (March 8), Indiana (March 10) and Charlotte (March 11). Sacramento travels to L.A. to play the Clippers at 7:30 p.m. March 14, airing on ESPN. The Kings at home squares off against the Utah Jazz (March 15), San Antonio Spurs (March 17), Philadelphia 76ers (March 19) and Brooklyn Nets (March 22).

The Kings head east, taking on Charlotte (March 24), Orlando (March 26), Atlanta (March 28) and Brooklyn (March 29). The five-game road trip ends in Toronto on April 1. The Kings at home play New Orleans (April 3) and the Clippers (April 5). The Kings play the Golden State Warriors twice, first in San Francisco on April 7 and then at 7 p.m. April 10 at Golden 1 Center. Sacramento finishes the regular season on the road on April 12 in Portland.

Lancers Win Season Opener In OT

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - It looks like the weeks of summer conditioning have paid off in a hurry for the Cordova Lancers, as they defeated the Sheldon Huskies 13-10 in overtime Aug. 22 in their season opener.

After a low-scoring and hard-fought first four quarters, the Huskies (0-1 overall) connected on a 19-yard field goal in overtime to take a 10-7 lead. Per the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) rulebook, the Lancers (1-0 overall) would get one possession to tie or win the contest from the Huskies' 25-yard line.

After a handoff to senior running back Chicago Bush on first down that went for three yards, the Lancers could see that the Sheldon Huskies were out of gas after a long, physical game. It was at that moment that Cordova head coach JP Dolliver elected to go with a hurry-up approach and put the ball in the hands of junior quarterback Trey Wallace.

Wallace ran the ball up the middle on three consecutive plays with the Lancers quickly moving to the next play after each carry in an attempt to catch the Huskies off-guard. Wallace would ultimately score from three yards out to give the Lancers the win.

"We always tell them to fight four quarters," Dolliver said after the game. "But that wasn't four quarters; it was five. So they pushed themselves through the whole game, all four quarters, and were the better team in the last quarter against a Sheldon team that fought hard too. It just came down to the end and we were a little bit more physical, probably a little less gassed, and we pulled it out."

Although Wallace struggled in the passing game on the night completing

just two passes for nine yards, it was his tough running that proved style points aren't worth more than the points on the scoreboard. He tallied 19 carries for 90 yards and that overtime score, all while playing through an ankle injury in the second half.

The Lancers' defense was just as gritty, generating two turnovers on interceptions by junior linebacker Masiyah Mejia and sophomore Gino David. Additionally, senior defensive lineman Julian Drahn recorded a sack of Sheldon sophomore quarterback Gavin Workman in the fourth quarter. One of the game's biggest plays for the Lancers came on the second half kickoff, as senior Makhai Stewart returned the kickoff 85 yards for a score to tie up the game after trailing at halftime.

Dolliver was extremely proud of his team's effort and stamina on a day that saw a high temperature of 103 degrees. He credited their output to a long summer of workouts and dedication to conditioning and was pleased to see all that hard work pay off in their first game of the year.

"We lean on these guys a lot," Dolliver said. "I think after six weeks of being with these guys, finally you get to see this is what it's all about. This is the feeling. This is what we've been talking about. It's one thing to say it but it's another when it's 105 degrees out and you're beating on these guys and grinding, holding them accountable; it's hard. But now they get to see it, so hopefully we get even more buy-in moving forward for the rest of the season."

The Lancers' home opener is this Friday, Aug. 29, after press time, when they host Mesa Verde. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. ★

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - It didn't take long for the Cordova Lady Lancers to get their first win under new head coach Kim Bradley, as they defeated the visiting Tokay Tigers 6-0 in their regular season opener on Aug. 18 inside Lancer Stadium.

The Lady Lancers (1-2 overall at press time) did drop their next two contests on the road at Vista Del Lago and Pleasant Grove last week but will keep battling under their new coach. Bradley knows constant improvement is the name

of the game.

"Obviously, we still have a lot of growth to do on both offense and defense," Bradley said. "So we're taking it day by day and working on the small things. Communication is one thing. Just knowing where we're supposed to be in our coverages, in our zones, and also running our routes a little more crisp."

The Lady Lancers travel to St. Francis on Wednesday, Sept. 3 for a big-time matchup at 5 p.m. ★

SacRT's RydeFreeRT Program Makes Youth Travel Easy

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - As students across the Sacramento region head back to school, Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) is reminding families that getting to class has never been easier or more affordable, thanks to the RydeFreeRT program.

Now entering its sixth year, RydeFreeRT provides unlimited fare-free rides on SacRT buses and light rail for all students and youth in TK through 12th-grade. With a valid RydeFreeRT card, students can ride any day, any time and all year long for school, after-school activities, jobs or weekend fun.

"The RydeFreeRT program has been a game-changer for students and families in the Sacramento region," said SacRT General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "We are proud to continue this program for another year and help eliminate transportation barriers for our youth."

Said SacRT Board Chair and Sacramento City Councilmember Rick Jennings, "This program is about opportunity and investing in the future of our youth. Access to reliable, fare-free transportation opens doors for students to succeed both in and out of the classroom. I'm proud to support another year of RydeFreeRT."

Students in TK through 12th-grade who live or attend school within the SacRT service area are eligible for the program. Youth experiencing homelessness or participating in foster care programs also qualify, regardless of residence or school enrollment.

SacRT operates approximately 82 bus routes; 43 miles of light rail serving 53 stations; and ADA paratransit services within a 440-square mile service area throughout Sacramento County, which includes service in Carmichael, Citrus Heights, Elk Grove, Fair Oaks, Orangevale, Rio Linda, Rancho Cordova and Sacramento.

RydeFreeRT cards are distributed through schools and are valid from June 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. Students can also obtain a card year-round at the SacRT Customer Service and Sales Center at 1225 R St. (accessible via light rail to the 13th Street Station) or any Sacramento Public Library branch.

To ride fare-free, students show their valid RydeFreeRT card to the bus operator when boarding or upon request on light rail trains. The card can be used for school, work, recreation and more, even during school breaks and holidays.

RydeFreeRT was launched in 2019 as a pilot

program initiated by former Sacramento City Councilmember and SacRT Board Chair Jay Schenirer to combat chronic absenteeism and expand transportation options for students. A University of Texas study found that the program significantly increased both student transit ridership and school attendance.

In the program's first month, SacRT saw a 40% increase in student ridership and this year alone, the program is on track to carry more than 5,000,000 student boardings, which is more than a 300% increase since launch.

Beyond academic benefits of reducing absenteeism and increasing attendance, RydeFreeRT also encourages lifelong transit habits, contributes to reduced traffic congestion and supports regional environmental sustainability goals.
