Greetings Cook County Families,

As we make our way into the new season, please be sure your child comes to school with the right gear. Hats, mittens, boots, and layers are important so we can continue to enjoy the time we spend outdoors.

Our Sawtooth Mt. Elementary students had an exciting Fall. We just held our Student Council election and it was inspiring to see so many young leaders step up with enthusiasm and great ideas for their school. October also included a fun visit from the North American Traditional Organized Food Systems organization where students had the opportunity to take part in foraging walks. All of these important experiences to have for our young people growing up on the North Shore.

It has been a busy and celebratory time in High School as well. Last night, we proudly inducted thirteen new members into the Zhingwaak Chapter of the National Honor Society. These students embody scholarship leadership, character, and service, and we are proud of their accomplishments and example.

Our Fall athletic seasons have also given us a lot to cheer about! The North Shore Storm Boys Cross Country Team capped off a fantastic year by competing in the state meet! Our Cook County Vikings football team has earned a spot in the state tournament, playing in the quarterfinals this Thursday in Grand Rapids. What an incredible Fall for our student athletes!

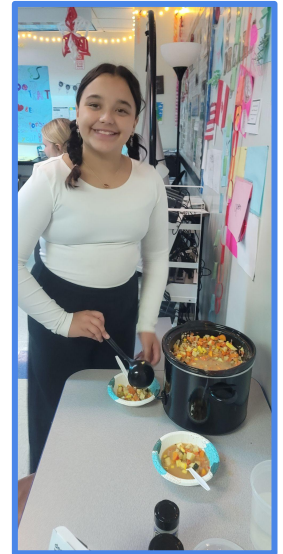

Boozhoo gakina awiya! (Hello everyone!)

Binaakwe-Giizis (October) was a full month for Ojibwe language learning in Sawtooth! We celebrated Indigenous Peoples Day with nature walks in our school forest, led by NATIFS staff, Cassandra and Dakota. We also learned about giizhik (cedar) and got to try some cedar tea! Students also brought home a recipe for cedar tea home with some giizhik to make it with their families! We also worked as a school with Ms. Mila in Art to create a mural featuring Manidoogizhigens, the Little Spirit Cedar Tree.

Pre-k spent time with us reading a variety of fun animal stories, learning animal songs, and practicing colors and vocabulary related to their classroom unit on Bikwaakwadoon (balls). Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd graders practiced their numbers, colors, and some animals.

3rd grade learned the days of the week, animals, practiced counting, and made mazina'iganibemisemakak (paper airplanes). 4th grade learned more about the origin story of lacrosse (according to the Ojibwe) and learned phrases to introduce themselves, and days of the week. 5th graders made posters of Ojibwe phrases they want to hear more around the school and made funny dibaajimowinan (stories) about animals and Stone Soup.

In Gashkodino-Giizis (Lakes Freezing Over Moon- November), we will be focusing on Zoongide'ewin (Courage) and thinking of ways to be courageous at school and thinking of our zhimaaganag (veterans). We will also be observant of nature as dagwaagin (fall) turns to biboon (winter).

Some words you can practice with your students this month are asking “Aaniin minik?” (ah-neen mih-nick, how many) and helping them practice their number words in Ojibwe. You can find pronunciations of these words, songs, and more resources on ojibwe.net by searching on the site for “numbers” or on Ojibwe People’s Dictionary at <https://ojibwe.lib.umn.edu>.

This is an exciting time of year for Sawtooth Student Council! We have 13 4th and 5th graders hoping to join our returning Student Council Members Brennan, Brynn and Oscar. After Student Council Elections, we will also be holding a Winter Clothes Drive later this month. Watch for news about that in the upcoming weeks!

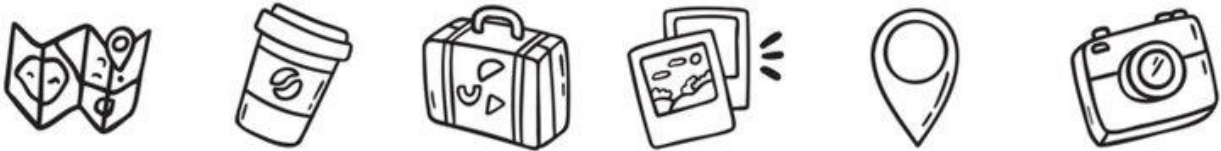

Middle School Field Trip Opportunities!

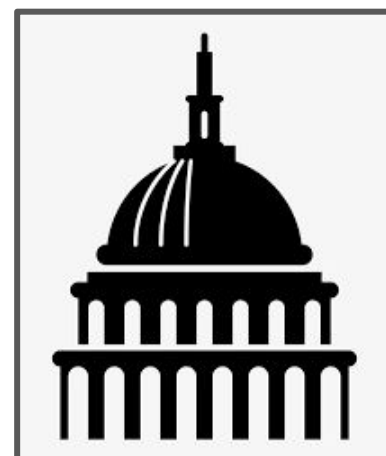

Recognizing Bullying Early: Why Awareness and Prevention Matter

Bullying is more than teasing. It's behavior that intentionally harms someone physically or emotionally. It often happens when one person or group has more power, like being more popular or part of a group against one person. Many kids describe it as "when someone makes you feel less about who you are."

What are the signs

- Avoiding school or friends
- Unexplained sadness or anxiety
- Drops in grades or interest
- Emotional distress after using devices or social media.
- If a child shares that "Someone is being mean," listen; it could be something more serious.

How You Can Help

- Be kind. A smile, a kind word, or inviting someone to join in makes a big difference.
- Speak up. Tell a trusted adult if you or someone else is being bullied.
- Include others. Nobody deserves to feel left out.

Prevention is a Community Effort, preventing bullying is everyone's responsibility: parents, teachers, neighbors, and friends. Together, we can create a culture where every child feels seen, valued, and safe. Kindness, acceptance, and inclusion are the strongest tools we have to build a supportive community.
