## Well, Well, Well

**ANTELOPE, CA (MPG)** - Glasses of chilled groundwater and a ribbon-cutting recently marked the activation of three new groundwater wells in Antelope.

The installations improve water reliability for Sacramento Suburban Water District's northern service communities. These include Antelope, McClellan, North Highlands, Foothill Farms and parts of Carmichael and Citrus Heights.

The cost of the triple-well project – and an additional fourth installation nearby – was supported by ratepayers and a grant of \$18.84 million from

the California Department of Water Resources. Total project cost was more than \$38 million. The new units replace aging area infrastructure.

Adjacent facilities allow water storage. This provision, explained Sacramento Suburban Water District representative Greg Bundesen, will help maintain supply when American River supplies are curbed by drought or by flow requirements for fish spawning.

"This storage will hopefully keep water more affordable," Bundesen told ribbon-cutting attendees. "These wells allow us to serve 33,500 homes. Their construction reflects careful planning, investment and partnerships. Water infrastructure might not

be visible, but it's essential."

Located on Antelope North Road, the wells can supply up to 7500 gallons of water per minute. During future deluges, the facility can return surface water to replenish natural underground reservoirs (aquifers). Like water from the American River, groundwater is treated to meet state and Federal drinking standards. County Supervisor Rich Desmond sipped his sample and noted "Not only do the new SSWD wells ensure safe and reliable water, it also tastes great."

Congressman Ami Bera underscored the challenges of water supply. "It's such a precious commodity,"

## February a Solid Month for New Home Sales

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The first quarter of the year generally sees the greatest number of new home sales in the greater Sacramento region, and 2026 is no exception, as 542 sales were reported by North State Building Industry Association members in February.

Sales were down 10 percent from January, but because there were five weeks in January and four in February, the weekly totals were up 12 percent month over month. Sales were up 4 percent from February 2025 and 7 percent above the historical average for the month.

Tim Murphy, North State's president & CEO, said the sales reflected the continued demand for new homes in the region.

"Despite affordability headwinds, new homes in the region continue to sell at above-average levels thanks to incentives being offered by homebuilders and the fact that mortgage interest rates dropped at the end of February to just under 6 percent for the first time since 2022," Murphy said.

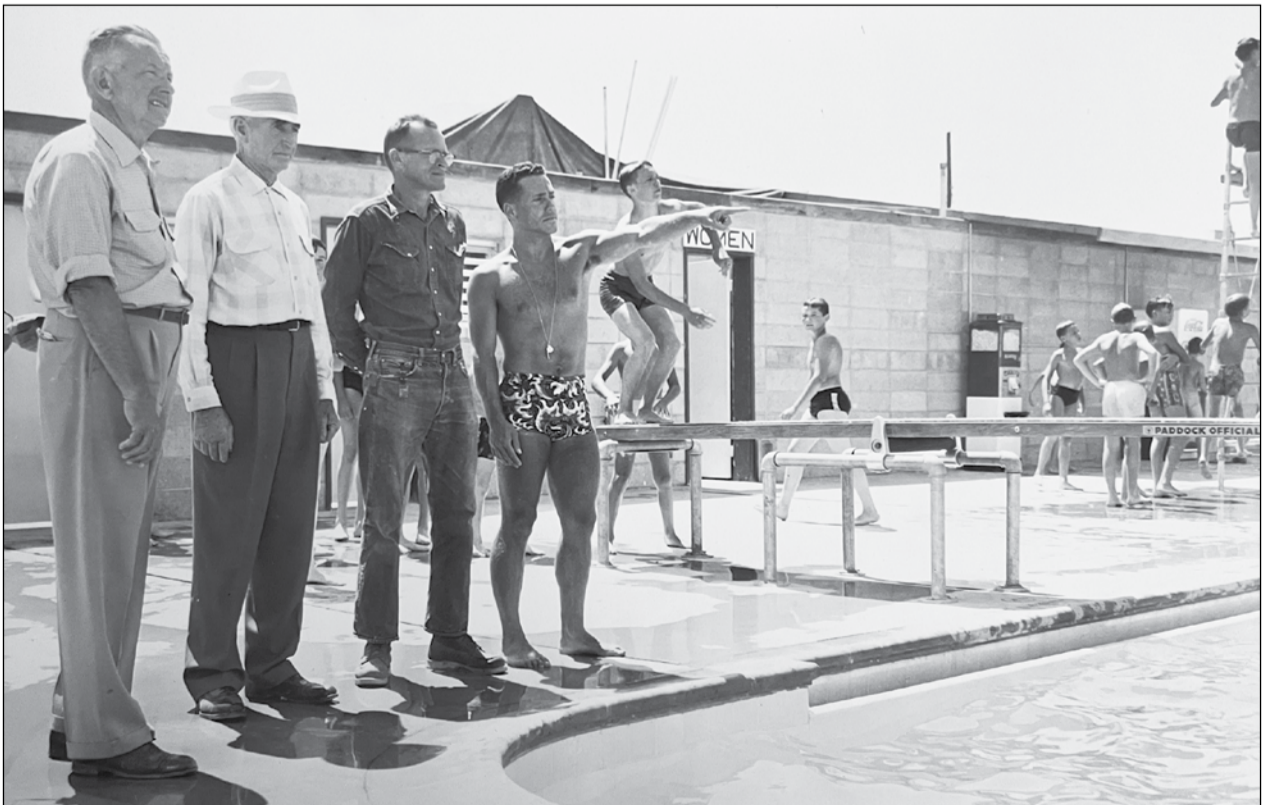
"While March historically marks the peak of sales in our area, the outlook for the immediate future is uncertain due to the current unrest in the Middle East and its potential for far-reaching impacts. But builders are continuing to work with buyers to make purchases possible, and the advantages new homes offer continue to make buying new a great option."

Rancho Cordova took the top spot in February with 112 sales, followed by Roseville close behind with 100. Sacramento saw 66 sales, Elk Grove had 53 and Plumas Lake rounded out the top five with 43.

There were 194 active communities at the end of the month in the region, which includes Amador, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba counties.

## Does Carmichael Want Its Pool Back?

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - In Carmichael Park, there's a grassy field where a community swimming pool once stood. It was a place where kids learned to swim, adults exercised and everyone had fun.

After nearly half a century, when it came time to replace the deteriorating facility, the money never materialized. It's been over two decades since the pool closed. Do people want it back? That's what the Carmichael Recreation and Park District is trying to

find out. "Everybody else around us has a pool," said Ken Hall, a board member of the Carmichael Parks Foundation. "You can go to Citrus Heights. You can go to Rancho Cordova. You can go to Elk Grove. You can go to Sacramento.

All of them have got pools. Why not Carmichael?"

An anonymous donor approached the district and gave \$40,000 to fund the Pool Feasibility Study. The aquatic design firm Counsilman-Hunsaker was hired to research

he said. "For a long time, we took its abundance for granted. Over the last few decades, we've learned we can't count on that."

"In Northern California, we have the second-highest flood risk in the country," continued Bera. "We're also living through drought years. With the growth of our area and all the new homes, this kind of groundwater project – and the ability to store water – is super important."

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Battle began at sunset last week, when six painted trucks rumbled into Carmichael Park. Generators purred; spatulas clanged. 2026 Food Truck Wars had begun.

Following the 2025 success of Burger Wars and Taco Take-Down truck events, Mediterranean was flavor du jour for the first 2026 contest.

Grilling meat scented spring air as vendors plated up their best. Plates and pitas dripped with yoghurt and hummus. Tomatoes and zuchinis sizzled. Olive oil splashed left and right.

Hosted by Carmichael Recreation and Park District, the event drew a hungry crowd of 250 food truck groupies.

Food judges represented community organizations. Donna Miller, Charlotte Saylor, Steven Yankee and Harpreet Virk fasted all day in preparation. The volunteers sniffed, nibbled and scarfed. After a close vote, Grazing fans awarded the popular vote to family-staffed Hefty Gyros from Sacramento.

Food Truck Wars continues April 9 with a Burger Battle (the event will also offer a Mother's Day vendor market). Taco trucks take arms on May 14. June 11 will feature an Asian/Pacific flavor fight.

All contestants are members of Food in the Hood 916, a food truck organization that also supplies vehicles for Carmichael Park's concert season.

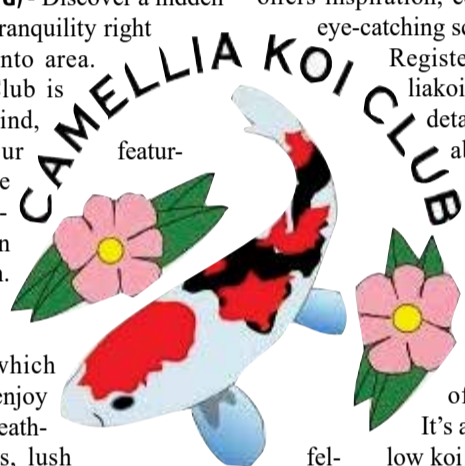

# Celebrating the VW Splittie at Milagro Centre

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Motorists driving Fair Oaks Boulevard to shopping or church on Sunday, March 29 might notice a large gathering of vintage Volkswagen transporters in the Milagro Center.

This will be the Spring Carmichael gathering of the Society of Transporter Owners (SOTO). The club lives for split-window buses, vans, campers, trucks and specialty vehicles, from family haulers to rigs for tradespeople and emergency crews.

The gathering will include resurrected barn- and field-finds, lucky survivors and meticulously restored classics. And these are cherished vehicles with plenty of history.

The SOTO gathering allows only split-window transporters, those from 1950 to 1967. After that, Volkswagen began with the "bay-window" model, whose flatter face wasn't quite as cartoon-owl friendly-looking.

The SOTO members' air-cooled, rear-engined rides can range from original low-horsepower flat-four motivation on up to bored-out, custom 100-hp mills that add a good dose of oomph. Some owners also swap their original transmissions for "freeway-flyer" gearing so they can keep up with traffic.

One big thing these days is VW vans with original shop logos on the sides. Windowless vans allowed for billboard-size ads for tradespeople and delivery drivers, and transporter enthusiasts are always on the lookout for original paint. At Milagro Centre, there might even be a VW fire truck, an ambulance or a ladder truck (bring the kids.)

The SOTO meet happens from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday, March 29 at 6241 Fair Oaks Blvd. Stop by early and wander the rows. Praise the patina. Have a look inside. Catch a whiff of wet dog and scorched oil. Tell the club members about that old bus your uncle once had. Buy a T-shirt. ★

We referred the mother to SFJC, and her daughter was rescued within 24 hours and given one of our Comfort Kits. The rescued daughter told her mom how much receiving the Comfort Kit meant to her. The daughter is now taking control of her future so she can make her own history.

Now our club is embarking on teaching domestic violence and trafficking survivors goal setting,

overcoming obstacles, preparing for success, and independent living skills at the Sacramento Family Justice Center and will later this year begin offering the same workshops to people receiving assistance at the new Cordova Community Food Hub to help empower their independence and give them more control over making their own history.

Soroptimist is an international 501(c)3 non-profit organization who seeks to improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and

economic empowerment. The name, Soroptimist, means "best for women," and that's what the organization strives to achieve. Soroptimists are people at their best, working to help other women to be their best.

# Does Carmichael Want Its Pool Back?

potential costs, with help from the Cumming Group, a local building consultant. An online survey was created to gauge public interest in a new public pool in Carmichael, what features to include and where to build it. The three possible locations floated were Carmichael Park, Del Campo Park and the La Sierra Community Center. An online community discussion was held on Feb. 24, and the survey closed on March 9. The study's findings will be made public when it's presented to the advisory board later this year.

"There's been a buzz over the years about a pool here in Carmichael, since the pool closed down," said Stacey Yankee, the park district administrator.

Several schools and parks have swimming pools, but there is nothing open to the general public in Carmichael. Every year, people drown on the Sacramento and American rivers. Another safe venue offering swimming lessons could help save lives.

"The park district would like to assist the community in having swim lessons, but without a pool, there are challenges with that," Yankee said.

The original Carmichael Park Pool resulted from a grassroots campaign that aggressively fundraised, according to scanned copies of local publications found on Newspapers.com. In 1953, members of the Business and Professional Women's Club collected 400 signatures in support of building a pool and presented them to the park district advisory board. A committee was soon organized to research and develop the project. Construction of the pool and bathhouse cost under \$50,000, which, adjusted for inflation, would be a little over \$600,000 today.

The park district and county covered roughly a third, and over 20 community organizations set out to fundraise the rest. Volunteers went door-to-door asking for donations and organized fundraisers, including a dance, a pancake breakfast, a

basketball game, a beauty pageant, a comedic play, an art auction and a May Day festival. The Carmichael Westerner called the successful campaign "almost a miracle." The Carmichael Park Pool held its dedication ceremony in 1956.

Over the decades, government health and safety codes changed. The high dive board and kiddie pool were removed when they no longer met modern standards, Yankee said. The pool began to leak as it reached the end of its life cycle. It was too expensive to repair and bring into code compliance. So, the park district closed it in 2004 and got to work on a replacement. A state-of-the-art aquatic center came with a \$10 million price tag. One idea was to sell off unused parkland to house developers, but that was never implemented.

The Friends of Carmichael Aquatic Center was formed in 2008 to study local interest in the project and seek out donors. The group reorganized a year later as the Carmichael

Parks Foundation. Hall has been a board member since the early days. He cited two issues that led to the new pool's failure: marketing and timing. First, the project was called an "aquatic center" instead of a community pool, which Hall said confused people. Second, research was done during the Great Recession when the housing market collapsed. Surveys showed that not enough people were willing to support a tax or bond measure for it to pass.

"It wasn't a good time for a poll," Hall said. "I mean, if you're trying to measure interest in people spending money and people are losing the value on their homes around them, it's not a great time to ask our questions as we did so."

While fundraising worked in the '50s, it would cost millions to build a pool that met modern health and safety codes. It would have been impossible for small donations to cover the costs, and the foundation was unable to find enough larger donors to foot the

bill. So, the pool sat abandoned for almost a decade. In 2013, the park district and county spent \$65,000 to demolish the building. Today, the empty field is used for soccer and disc golf.

The only way to fund a new public pool in Carmichael is for residents to approve a new tax or bond measure. In 2022, voters passed Measure G, a \$31.9 million general obligation bond program to fund park maintenance and improvements. Yankee said its passing shows Carmichael residents are willing to invest in public facilities. But she won't know for certain if there is demand for a pool until the feasibility study is completed and published.

"The community has shown that they're willing to support parks, at least doing some deferred maintenance and upkeep," Yankee said. "New construction, new projects, along with ongoing maintenance costs, that is another level, but we want to hear from the community, and we're hopeful." ★

# Defendant Sentenced for Sex Assaults at Retail Store

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Tami Bogert sentenced Jevis Jones to 121 years to life in prison. On Nov. 19, 2025, Jones was convicted by a jury of kidnapping with intent to commit sexual assault, two counts of assault with intent to commit sexual assault, two counts of false imprisonment, sexual battery and false impersonation.

Allegations that Jones suffered two previous strike convictions, that his prior convictions were numerous and of increasing seriousness, that he had served a

prior term in prison, and that he was on parole at the time of the crimes were found true after a bench trial.

On April 30, 2025, the first victim was working as a janitor at the Target on J Street. When she went to get something from the janitor's closet, Jones followed her into the closet and grabbed her buttocks. When she turned and started to scream, Jones attempted to cover her mouth before fleeing the store. Law enforcement contacted Jones a few blocks away, but he gave his brother's name instead of his own. Jones was cited and released.

On May 3, 2025, the second

victim was at the same Target when Jones ran up and grabbed her from behind while covering her mouth. Jones forced her to the back of the store, but he ran away when employees arrived in the area. Law enforcement arrested Jones' brother for both crimes. When the brother identified Jones in surveillance, law enforcement located Jones in the area of Target and arrested him. It was later discovered that Jones was in abscond from parole, having been released from prison just six days earlier. Jones gave a statement to law enforcement where he admitted his involvement in the crimes. ★

## As Gas Prices Soar, California's New Carbon Emission Rules Prompt a War of Words

This week — as the conflict between the U.S. and Iran raged and gasoline prices soared due to disruption in the global oil trade — a political war erupted in California over proposed air pollution rules that could increase fuel prices even more.

The California Air Resources Board's new crackdown on greenhouse gas emissions, "risks driving production, and the associated emissions, out of state, ultimately undermining both California's economic base and global climate objectives," the California Manufacturers & Technology Association says.

Association President Lance Hastings added in a statement, "If these proposed regulations move forward, Californians should brace for higher costs across the board with no end in sight. There is still time to fix this. CARB and the Legislature must act before it's too late."

The proposed regulation "will cripple the survivability of the state's remaining refineries, which will result in California losing the entire industry to this misguided program," Andy Walz, a high-level Chevron executive, said in a statement. Two California refineries have announced plans to shut down and Chevron, which operates two of the remaining plants, has repeatedly implied

that California's regulatory climate might force it to flee the state as well.

However as business pressured the Air Resources Board to ease the limits, a coalition of environmental groups, including the Environmental Defense Fund, complained that the proposed rules don't go far enough.

"Last year, in the face of federal backtracking, California reinforced its leadership on fighting climate change by extending its cap-and-invest program while prioritizing reducing high electricity bills and saving households money," their letter read. "However, CARB's 2026 proposed C&I program amendments fall short of the near-term ambition needed for California to be on a consistent and affordable path to achieve its 2045 carbon neutrality goals."

Meanwhile, 15 Democratic legislators released a letter expressing concern that the new rules would raise fuel and energy costs that are already among the nation's highest.

"This crisis is not a fallacy nor a thinly veiled threat. It is a reality borne by consumers today, who are historically and empirically least able to afford it," the legislators said, adding, "California's climate leadership cannot come at the cost of destabilizing our energy markets and burdening those least able to bear it."

Interestingly — or ironically — all 15 signatories voted less than a year ago for the legislation that empowered the air board to draft the revisions, which were released in January and are due to be finalized in May.

The legislation behind this flurry of warnings and laments is Assembly Bill 1207, which emerged from

backroom negotiations last September. It quickly passed and Gov. Gavin Newsom signed it.

The measure renames the cap-and-trade program cap-and-invest and extends it 15 years from 2030, the current expiration date, coinciding with the state's declared intention to make California carbon neutral by 2045. It authorizes the Air Resources Board to adjust the emission limits accordingly.

Until now, the state's business community had fundamentally supported the auctioning of emission allowances as a market approach preferable to the direct regulation of emissions, which many environmental groups favored.

Capitol politicians also liked auctions because they generate large amounts of money — an estimated \$31 billion since 2013 — that are supposed to finance carbon emission reductions. One major recipient has been the state's much-troubled bullet train project. However, when the state incurs one of its periodic budget crises, the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund has also been tapped for expenses that have little, if any, connection to greenhouse gases.

The cost of living is now a top-drawer political concern, and with gasoline prices topping \$5 a gallon in many regions, anything that pushes consumer prices even higher is bound to become a political football.

**Dear Rusty:** The time is nearing that I want to move from my current Social Security survivor benefit to my own SS retirement benefit at 70 years of age. I have been looking more deeply into the application of Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs), and I have read that DRCs accumulated in the year that I turn 70 (September 2026) will not be effective when I actually turn 70. Rather, those DRCs won't be paid until the following year. Can you verify that this is correct? I presume that if the DRC's are not applied at age 70, that they will be applied sometime after the first of the year and any increase will be paid retroactively.

**Signed: Retiring Soon**

**Dear Retiring Soon:** The Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) you speak of have accumulated at the rate of 8% per year

(.667% per month) since you reached your SS full retirement age (FRA), which means that at age 70 your monthly SS benefit will be about 129% of the amount you were entitled to at your FRA of 66 years plus 4 months.

However, your understanding of how DRCs will work for you at age 70 is not correct. If you claim for your Social Security retirement benefits to begin in September 2026 (the month you turn 70) you will receive all DRCs, you have accumulated up to that point in time. In other words, you will get your full age 70 benefit amount immediately, including all DRCs earned until then, effective with your first SS retirement payment (which you will get in October 2026). What you have likely read about is that DRCs work a bit differently for those who claim SS after their full retirement age, but before their 70th birthday month.

For those who claim mid-year but before age 70, only DRCs earned through the end of the preceding year are initially applied, and DRCs earned during the current year are not paid until the following January. This results in a loss of some SS benefit between the

time benefits start and the following January, because only the amount earned as of the end of the previous year are first paid, and the full number of DRCs earned during the current year are applied in January. But, as is the case for you, when benefits are claimed to start in the month you reach 70 years of age, all DRCs earned up to the month of your 70th birthday are immediately applied.

Congratulations on selecting a strategy which will maximize your monthly Social Security benefit.

man, the border czar who supplanted her in Minneapolis, was on TV and sought to outpace him.

The Journal related that Lewandowski was desperate to get a federally issued gun and badge and exacted retribution against those who didn't cooperate (he failed to get the gun, but apparently got the badge).

DHS officials denied much of the Journal story, but even if a fraction of it was true, it was still damning.

The two were turf, sharp-elbowed bureaucratic players, not a new or unusual offense in Washington. But their enemies tended to be people who knew what they were doing, with Tom Homan high on the list.

Noem and Lewandowski raised eyebrows by taking an unusual amount of control over the department's spending. Self-dealing played a direct role in Noem's defenestration. The department approved a \$220 million contract -- funneled in part through firms run by Noem and Lewandowski allies -- for an ad campaign encouraging illegal immigrants to go home.

The ad starred -- who else? -- Kristi Noem. She was on horseback and in chaps. The implicit message was that if illegal immigrants didn't leave on their own, she'd immediately form a posse and run them over the border. It was a production worthy of a spaghetti western, or -- more to the point, given her political ambitions -- a commercial for a 2028 presidential campaign.

Noem couldn't defend the sketchy spending decisions, or the blatantly self-glorifying

ad, or much of anything else, in brutal back-to-back House and Senate congressional hearings that precipitated her doom. She'd already been taken down a notch after the Minneapolis ICE operation went sideways. Not working with copious supplies of credibility to begin with, she tossed away whatever she had by instantly labeling both agitators shot by DHS agents "domestic terrorists."

All of this said, it was Trump who hired Noem despite her manifest deficiencies, including no notable experience in immigration enforcement. She was camera-ready and loyal, so why not? Her designated replacement, Oklahoma senator Markwayne Mullin, also doesn't have a background in immigration policy. One hopes, though, that he won't interfere with the professionals and will continue the Homan-backed approach of focusing on apprehending illegal immigrants who have committed other criminal offenses and received final orders of removal, and ramping up worksite enforcement.

The French World War I-era statesman Georges Clemenceau once said, "War is too important to be left to the generals." By the same token, immigration enforcement is too important to be left to self-serving glory hounds who are focused more on the main chance than the underlying mission.

Trump's first firing was the right one.

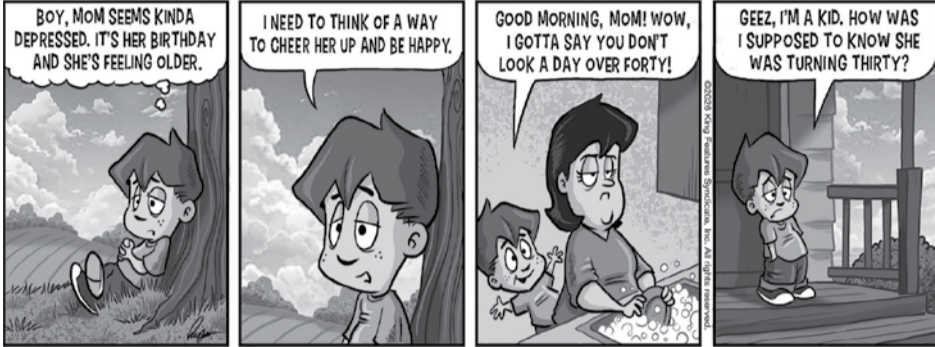

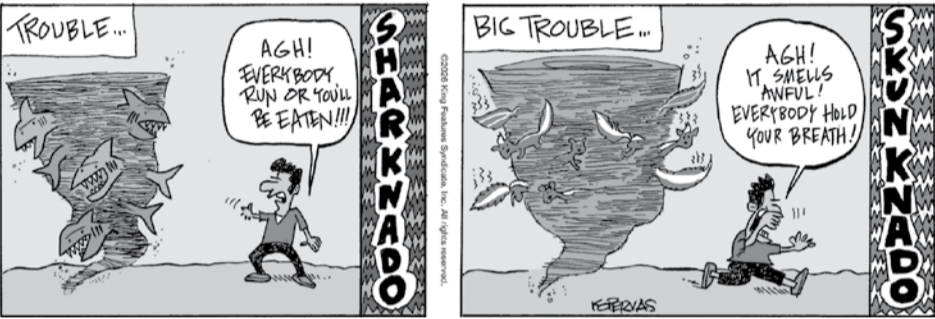
