## Boogie All Night with KC and The Sunshine Band

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - It's time to put on your "Boogie Shoes" and "Get Down Tonight" to "Shake Your Booty" with the original Sunshine Man himself, KC & The Sunshine Band at the California State Fair, Saturday, July 25, as part of the Toyota Concert Series on the Main Stage.

KC & The Sunshine Band have entertained audiences for more than 45 years and sold over 100 million records. They were the first act since The Beatles in 1964 to score four No. 1 pop singles in a 12-month span, with three also reaching No. 1 on the R&B chart.

Their 1976 album Part 3 went triple platinum and featured hits like "I'm Your Boogie Man," "Shake Your Booty," and "Keep It Comin' Love." More hits followed, including "Boogie Shoes" from the Saturday Night Fever soundtrack, "Please Don't Go," and "Yes, I'm Ready," a duet with Teri DeSario.

KC won Grammy Awards in 1978 for his work on the "Saturday Night Fever" soundtrack and received the NARAS Governor's Award in 2001. In 2002 KC received the coveted Star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. KC's music is now being sampled by rappers, and whole new generations of fans have been introduced to his music.

"KC & The Sunshine Band is one of those groups that will have the crowd dancing for the entire concert," said Tom Martinez, CEO of Cal Expo & California State Fair. "Have a corn dog, funnel cake, a turkey leg and then come and get your groove on."

## Gaines Supports California's Disabled Veterans Through Senate Bill 888

Senator Ted Gaines (Ret.) News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (Ret.), Vice Chair of the State Board of Equalization, submitted a letter of support for Senate Bill 888 (Seyarto, R), legislation that would exclude service-connected disability compensation from the definition of "household income" when determining eligibility for the low-income exclusion under the Disabled Veterans' Property Tax Exemption (Revenue and Taxation Code Section 205.5).

"Our state has a moral obligation to honor the sacrifices of those who served by ensuring that tax policies do not undermine their financial security. SB 888 is a practical, targeted step toward that goal and aligns with California's commitment to supporting veterans and military families."

SB 888 proposes to remove this barrier and enable more qualifying veterans and their surviving spouses to benefit from the exemption, helping

them afford to stay in their homes and maintain stability in their communities.

In his support letter to Senator Seyarto and members of the Legislature, BOE Vice Chair Gaines states, "I applaud Senator Seyarto for his leadership on this important issue. This commonsense reform recognizes that disability payments are earned for injuries sustained in service to our country, not discretionary or supplemental income. Including these benefits in the income calculation unfairly penalizes disabled veterans, many of whom rely primarily on Social Security and VA disability payments to make ends meet."

Senator Ted Gaines (Ret.) was elected to represent the Board of Equalization's First District. He is a leading taxpayer advocate, defender of Prop. 13, and is committed to providing trustworthy and transparent representation for nearly ten million constituents in 34 counties of northern, eastern, and southern California. SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) will implement adjustments on seven bus routes effective April 6 to enhance on-time performance and maintain reliable connections across the system.

The changes will affect the following bus routes: 21, 25, 68, 81, 93, 137 and 138. Riders are encouraged to review the updated schedules online at [sacrt.com/servicechanges](http://sacrt.com/servicechanges) or call 916-321-BUSS (2877) for assistance.

**Key Adjustments**  
Route 21 Sunrise (Weekdays): Up to eight minutes of travel time will be added to certain trips.

Route 25 Marconi (Weekdays): Up to five minutes of travel time will be added

to certain trips.

Route 68 Oak Park (Weekdays): The trip that currently leaves Arden Fair at 3:56 p.m. will leave two minutes later at 3:58 p.m. All times will shift accordingly.

Route 81 Florin (Weekdays): The schedule is being adjusted along the trip to mimic actual service conditions.

Route 93 Hillsdale (Weekdays): Up to four minutes of travel time will be added on certain trips.

Route 137 (Weekdays): Up to eight minutes of travel time will be added to the morning trip. The route will also travel on Highway 99 longer and exit on Broadway instead of MLK Boulevard. In addition, service to two bus stops along MLK Boulevard will be discontinued.

Route 138 (Weekdays): Up to 10 minutes of travel time will be added to certain trips. ★

# Grant Line Road Doubles its Lanes

## Improving Sacramento's Most Dangerous Roads

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- One of Sacramento region's most critical and most dangerous thoroughfares is officially moving into its next phase of its transformation. The Grant Line Road Reconstruction Project, a cornerstone of the 34-mile Capital SouthEast Connector, has received \$25 million through the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant program, accelerating a modernization effort that aims to turn a rural two-lane road into a state-of-the-art expressway.

This project focuses on connecting Sacramento's four major highways—Interstate 5 (I-5), Hwy 99 (State Route 99), the Jackson Highway (State Route 16), and Hwy 50 (U.S. Highway 50) in the segment between White Rock Road and Douglas Boulevard—and is expected to be completed by 2035. The primary objective is to connect the cities of Elk Grove, Folsom, Sacramento and El Dorado.

"It was envisioned in the 1970s, put on highway plan in the '80s and voters approved it in 2004," Executive Director Derek Minnema said.

This 34-mile road is divided into three corridors: Kammerer (6 miles), Grant Line (19 miles), and White Rock (9 miles), and will cost a total of \$265 million. The Grant Line Expansion, specifically, will cost \$55 million, though the RAISE grant covers almost half the cost.

This renovation is especially crucial because Grant Line Road is officially classified as a High-Injury Network (HIN) corridor, meaning it belongs to the small percentage of roads (roughly

3-10%) where majority of fatal accidents occur. According to a news release from U.S. Representative Ami Bera's office, there were 125 collisions on Grant Line Road from 2016 to 2020. The same news releases states that this renovation could reduce crash rates by 40%.

To make this road safer, the cities of Elk Grove and Rancho Cordova as well as Sacramento County are working together to implement changes that intend to reduce collisions and congestion. One of these steps, which has already been completed, was building roundabouts in the rural Sheldon Area community between Bond Road and Calvine Road.

"The City [of Elk Grove] prepared the Grant Line Road

Precise Roadway Plan Study in 2022 to determine the needed roadway geometry along Segment C of the Capital Southeast Corridor between Bond Road and Calvine Road. The study identified the ultimate roadway design, including intersection geometry (roundabouts over signalized intersections), additional travel lanes, turn lane configurations, a raised median and a Class I multi-use trail," the City of Elk Grove said in an email statement.

Currently in the works is the project of expanding Grant Line from a two-way road into a four-way road in the Rancho Cordova area, with the intention of improving safety. According to the Southeast Connector Project Status Report, the road is

ill-equipped to handle the city's growing population, which grew 1.7 percent from 2020 to 2021. This makes it the highest growth rate of any city in Sacramento County, according to the City of Rancho Cordova. The population (which is approximately 85,000) is projected to reach 120,000 in 2036. Doubling the lanes would not only lower the number of collisions, but it would also improve the response time from first responders if a collision were to happen.

The renovation will also expand the shoulders, which are currently too narrow for a vehicle to pull over into without impinging on the road itself. In order to go around the pulled over vehicle, a driver would have to veer over into

the opposing lane. Additionally, the Capital Southeast Connector will feature more bicycle and pedestrian walkways, which in addition to improving safety, also encourages non-motorized travel, thus helping to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Construction is expected to hit its stride as the weather clears, with city officials and the JPA aiming for a completion date that keeps pace with the rapid housing growth in the Sunrise Boulevard and Grant Line corridors. For the residents of Rancho Cordova, the \$25 million investment represents more than just asphalt; it's a commitment to a safer, more connected commute that finally matches the scale of the community's growth. ★

party about 14 years ago," Cavanagh said. "When we opened Movement, we figured it was time to level it up and move the party to the brewery so everyone could join the fun."

What began as a small gathering has grown into a regional draw. In its first year at the brewery, the event featured just eight breweries. This year, more than 40 breweries from across the United States, and even internationally, are expected to pour at the festival.

Managing that kind of turnout takes coordination, but Cavanagh credits the tight-knit craft beer community.

"We love the craft beer community and have worked, and played, really hard to make connections," she said. "Also, lots of

organization, communication and emails."

This year's theme leans into 90s video games, and attendees are encouraged to dress the part, something regulars have embraced in past years with everything from retro jerseys to iconic pop culture costumes.

"The fest will be full of world-class beers, awesome 90s music and vibes all day," Cavanagh said. "People really bring it when it comes to dressing like their favorite 90s throwback."

The day kicks off with the ticketed tasting event, where guests receive a custom 90s-themed glass and access to samples from participating breweries. But even for those who miss out on tickets, the later portion of the event offers plenty to experience.

At 2:30 p.m., the brewery

opens its doors to the general public, continuing the celebration with four new collaboration beer releases, additional taproom favorites and a full lineup of entertainment.

Live music will carry the event into the evening, with three returning bands performing 90s covers throughout the day. Inverness95 opens during the tasting hours, followed by Adam Aldama and the Aces in the afternoon and Pacific Roots closing out the night.

Food vendors will also play a central role, with trucks like Jojo's Hawaiian Fried Chicken, Staq and Cream Burgers, and West Coast Taco Bar serving throughout the day.

For Cavanagh, the event is about more than just beer or nostalgia. It's about creating a shared experience.

"That moment when you have a tasty beer in your hand, standing next to your good friends and your favorite 90s song comes on, you can't help but sing along," she said. "It's just a vibe like you did back in the 90s."

The festival has also become a point of pride for Rancho Cordova, drawing visitors and highlighting the city's growing craft beer scene. With support from Visit Rancho Cordova, organizers say the event continues to expand both in scale and impact.

Whether attending for the beer, the music or the throwback atmosphere, one thing is certain: for a day, Rancho Cordova will feel a little more like the 90s again.

Or, as Cavanagh put it: "It's totally tubular." ★

# Wilton Ranch, Republic FC to Build Region's Largest Sports Venue

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Wilton Rancheria and Sacramento Republic FC have announced that Republic Stadium at The Railyards will be constructed as a 20,000-plus seat soccer-first venue, forgoing the original plans to grow through phased expansion. The decision reflects the collective ambition of the club, its tribal ownership, and the Sacramento community – a commitment to build something worthy of the passion this region has long shown for its Indomitable Club.

The announcement builds on the momentum of the stadium's groundbreaking in August 2025 – the furthest the project had advanced in more than a decade. As construction became a reality, so did the scale of opportunity and Wilton Rancheria's ability to deliver a stadium that meets the full vision from day one.

"With this stadium, Wilton Rancheria is reclaiming our space and matching the ambition of the region," said Jesus Tarango, Chairman of Wilton Rancheria. "As a Tribe of firsts, we're proud to deliver a 20,000-plus seat, soccer-first stadium – the largest professional sports and entertainment venue in the region – and a home where community comes

together and our collective future takes shape."

"Building bigger is a catalytic investment in the long-term transformation of downtown Sacramento," said Chris Franklin, COO for Wilton Rancheria. "Wilton Rancheria is bringing the capital, vision, and execution needed to turn this site into a destination that drives economic impact, community connection, and sustained growth for the entire region."

"For years, we have known what our fans deserve and what this region is capable of supporting. The response to groundbreaking removed any

remaining doubt," said Republic FC Managing Partner Kevin Nagle. "A 20,000-seat Republic Stadium – with a roof over every seat, safe standing for our supporters and world-class amenities throughout – is not an overreach. It is exactly the venue Sacramento has earned, and we are proud to deliver it."

Republic Stadium is designed to set a new standard for the soccer and outdoor entertainment experience in Sacramento. In addition to an expanded capacity, various investments in fan experience and comfort will be elements of a world-class venue. The most prominent feature, as requested

by fans, will be the overhead canopy that will provide coverage for every seat. The four massive trusses weighing 3,800 tons – three times the tonnage of the Tower Bridge – across the top of the canopy will become distinct additions to Sacramento's skyline and be recognizable across sports. The open-air design, featuring perforated cladding and open corner terraces, will allow natural airflow and help fans take advantage of Sacramento's signature evening cooling, keeping the environment comfortable throughout the summer season.

Preparation work on the site was completed in late 2025.

Before the end of April, essential public infrastructure work including streets, utility work, and storm drains, will begin ahead of stadium foundations and then vertical construction. With the addition of the canopy structure and associated investments, construction will continue through 2027, with Republic Stadium on track to open in 2028 as the permanent home of the Indomitable Club and a premier destination for major soccer competitions, concerts and landmark events in Northern California. Republic Stadium will serve as the catalyst for a new Sacramento neighborhood – one that doubles the footprint of downtown, revitalizes a site that has sat vacant for half a century, and restores a connection to the ancestral home of Wilton Rancheria.

Further announcements on stadium milestones, community programming, and additional development details will follow in the months ahead. "I am excited to begin this journey with her as I know the immeasurable impact she will have on our student-athletes' holistic development. Her passion, knowledge of the game and ability to genuinely connect with people instantly set her apart."

Braun (née Gonzalez) joined the Sacramento State sideline after spending two years as an assistant coach at her alma mater, UC Davis, from 2023-25 before being named interim head coach following the 2024 campaign during a coaching transition. She also served in the same capacity with the Hornets following the 2025 campaign prior to Strader's arrival in March of 2026.

"When assembling our coaching staff, it was my top priority to find coaches that are invested into mentoring student-athletes, have an ability to build quality relationships, while also understanding championship standards, and this is exactly what Janae is as a coach," Strader said. "We have big goals as a program, and I know the significant role she will have in helping us achieve them in the years to come."

In her first season with the Aggies, Braun helped guide UC Davis to a second-place finish in the competitive Big West Conference for the second straight season while mentoring five all-conference

selections as the team went on to finish 10-7-2 overall and 6-2-2 in league play.

A year later, the Aggies finished 13-5-2 overall and duplicated their effort in league play in 2024, posting the most wins in school history since the 1998 team finished 13-6-1 overall.

She also has experience coaching at the club level, serving as head coach of two ECNL Davis Legacy Soccer Club youth teams from 2021-24, and was also an assistant varsity high school coach at Davis HS from 2018-19, helping the Blue Devils to a CIF Sac-Joaquin section title and a second-place finish at NorCal

Regionals.

As a student-athlete, Braun was a two-year letter winner for the Aggies in 2018-19 after spending her first two collegiate seasons at Santa Clara in 2015-16. A two-time Big West All-Academic selection, she earned All-Big West first team honors during her senior year after leading all Aggies in points (13), shots (34), and goals (six).

While with the Broncos, she was a West Coast Conference All-Freshman Team selection and a two-time WCC All-Academic Team honoree, finishing with four career goals and helping Santa Clara

to an NCAA "Sweet 16" berth in 2015 and a spot in the "Elite 8" in 2016.

She also brings with her an extensive international and professional playing resume, including stints as a member of the U17 Mexican Women's National Team which she helped win the 2013 CONCACAF crown while leading the team in goals (three) and assists (four) as only a junior in high school.

Braun also represented Mexico in the 2014 U17 Women's World Cup, where she was the team's leading scorer, netting goals in wins over Colombia and China during the group stage. Her goal against Colombia that put Mexico up, 3-0, was selected as the best goal of the U17 Women's World Cup by a public vote on FIFA.com.

Her international playing experience continued after graduating from UC Davis, where she signed a professional contract with Club América Femenil, an organization that competes in Liga BBVA MX Femenil, the highest division of women's soccer in Mexico. She also had a stint playing for Mazatlán F.C.

Following her pro career in Mexico, Braun has continued to have a successful career for the California Storm of the Women's Professional Soccer League, where she has been a vital piece, serving as a co-captain. Her highlights include helping the Storm secure the WPSL's Jerry Zanelli Cup in 2022 and the WPSL PAC North Championship in 2023, a year in which she also was named MVP.

Braun has also been a member of the first-ever United States Futsal National Team since 2023 and competed in the 2025 CONCACAF World Cup Qualifiers.

A native of Folsom, who prepped at Vista del Lago HS, Braun graduated from UC Davis with a bachelor's degree in communication in 2019 and she went on to earn her master's degree in communication management from USC in 2022. ★

## Board Approves Amendment to Fireworks Ordinance

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)**

- The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved amendments to the County's fireworks ordinance during its March 24 meeting, significantly strengthening penalties for the use of illegal fireworks and the unauthorized use of "safe and sane" fireworks.

The ordinance update follows Board direction from November 2025 to increase enforcement measures and better protect neighborhoods, parks and public spaces from the dangers associated with illegal fireworks.

Under the previous ordinance, violators faced escalating fines of \$1,000 for a first violation, \$2,500 for a second violation, and \$5,000 for each additional violation. A fine of \$10,000 was imposed for violations occurring within the American River Parkway, as well as any park or school property.

The amended ordinance introduces a more stringent approach by applying fines for each individual illegal

firework used, as well as for each instance of unauthorized use of "safe and sane" fireworks outside the designated time period.

In Sacramento County, "safe and sane" fireworks are only permitted between 9 a.m. and 10 p.m., from June 28 through July 4. Use outside of these dates and times is prohibited and now subject to enhanced penalties under the updated ordinance.

The amended ordinance will return to the Board for final approval on April 7 and will go into effect on May 7 ahead of the summer season when fireworks activity typically increases.

Sacramento County encourages residents to celebrate responsibly and to report illegal fireworks activity to 916-874-5115 to help keep neighborhoods safe. ★

## Newsom May Spend \$19 Million to Sugarcoat California's Stalled Economy

California hasn't had a truly balanced state budget for four or maybe five years, and the current one continues to overspend its revenues.

Nevertheless, Gov. Gavin Newsom wants to spend \$19 million on a marketing campaign to portray California as having a vibrant economy, to counter "myths driven by misinformation and political rhetoric."

"California and its business climate have been falsely and maliciously maligned for years, and the state has a right to tell the true story — California is a great place to live, work, invest and visit," Newsom spokesperson Tara Gallegos told the Los Angeles Times. "Setting the record straight will benefit every business, worker and resident of this state."

The solicitation of contractors for the campaign quotes a passage from Newsom's State of the State speech: "California has never been about perfection. It's about persistence. The courage of our convictions and the strength to embody them. That's the California Way."

It appears to be a \$19 million contribution from California taxpayers to Newsom's forthcoming campaign for the presidency. The state is

a target of ceaseless social media and internet criticism, some of it far-fetched but, unfortunately, much of it is deserved, such as its seemingly intractable homelessness crisis. Being from California would be one of the hurdles Newsom faces if he seeks the presidency.

The marketing campaign will attempt to put a positive spin on California's economy and business climate, echoing how Newsom typically responds when interviewers ask about corporate migrations and loss of population to other states. He cites California's having the globe's 4th largest economy were it a nation.

The hard fact, however, is that California's economy isn't doing so well these days, and it cannot be dismissed, as Newsom often does, as something dreamed up by political foes.

Take, for instance, a report that the Legislature's budget analyst, Gabe Petek, issued in 2024, describing California's economy as "sluggish."

"California's economy has been in an extended slowdown for the better part of two years, characterized by a soft labor market and weak consumer spending," Petek said, adding, "Outside of government and health care, the state has added no jobs in a year and a half. Similarly, the number of Californians who are unemployed is 25 percent higher than during the strong labor markets of 2019 and 2022. Consumer spending (measured by inflation-adjusted retail sales and taxable sales) has continued to decline throughout 2024."

This week, the California Center for Jobs & the Economy, an offshoot of the California Business

Roundtable, issued a report that mirrors and builds on what Petek said.

"California's economy in 2025 presents a troubling paradox," the detailed report declares. "While the state continues to rank among the largest economies in the world, the underlying data reveals an economy that is no longer delivering broad-based growth, opportunity, or stability."

"Rather than expanding," the report continues, "California's economy is increasingly defined by stagnation in job creation, erosion in its private sector base, and mounting structural challenges tied to affordability and competitiveness. Many of the state's headline strengths — particularly in technology — are masking deeper weaknesses across the broader economy. The data show an economy that has largely stalled since the pandemic recovery, with employment barely returning to pre-2020 levels, private sector job losses accelerating, and consumer activity weakening in real terms."

Newsom obviously wants to bury these sobering facts, but doing so undercuts his duty — as governor for another nine months — to be straight with Californians, not just conjure up taxpayer-financed propaganda.

He'll have plenty of time to spin fables after he's out of office and on the presidential campaign trail.

## Social Security Matters

I'll be 70 on New Year's Day.

When Should I Apply for Social Security?

**Dear Rusty:** I was born on January 1st, 1958, so I believe Social Security considers me to be 70 as of December 2027. I'm planning on filing when I turn 70 to maximize the payment. I'm not sure if I should start in December, with the first payment in January 2028. Or should I start in January with the first payment in February 2028? I know I can start anytime, however I don't want to file before the maximum payment, even by one month. **Signed: Wanting Maximum Benefit**

**Dear Wanting:** You are correct that if your birth date is January 1, 1958, you are entitled to your full age 70 benefit in December 2027. So, if you claim your SS benefit

to start in December 2027 you will get your maximum benefit amount and you will receive that payment in January 2028 (on the 2nd Wednesday). Basically, anyone born on the first of any month is considered to have been born in the previous month for SS benefit purposes.

You can apply for your benefits up to 4 months prior to your birthday month, and SS usually suggests applying about 3 months in advance to give them time to process your application. When you complete the application, you will specify the month you wish your benefits to start, so applying early does not present a problem. You can either call SSA at 1.800.772.1213 to make an appointment to apply over the phone, or you can apply online at [www.ssa.gov/apply](http://www.ssa.gov/apply).

The one thing you might want to do is put the following in the "Remarks" section of your application for SS benefits: "I do not wish to receive any retroactive Social Security benefits. I want my benefits

to become effective with the first month of my age 70 eligibility (December 2027 because I was born on the first of January)."

Including that remark will ensure that your benefit will be the full maximum amount you are entitled to at 70 years of age, without any reduction. And I congratulate you on choosing a strategy which maximizes your monthly benefit and will likely provide you with the most in cumulative lifetime Social Security benefits.

## The Israel Hoax

we've heard now suggests anything other than that he genuinely relishes killing Iran's leaders and destroying its weapons.

Temperamentally, Trump loves exercising power, always wants to do it on his own authority and seeks to preserve his options. It shouldn't be surprising, then, that as commander in chief of the world's most proficient military, he's been drawn to using and threatening force.

Israel didn't talk Trump into conducting his Venezuela raid, or menacing Denmark over Greenland, or looking to Cuba as his next potential target.

One argument, based on a distortion of remarks made by Secretary of State Marco Rubio, is that Israel forced Trump's hand; it was going to attack Iran no matter what, and we knew U.S. personnel would be hit by Iran in response and would be particularly vulnerable if we didn't hit Iran as well.

Check and mate, Bibi Netanyahu.

The idea, though, that Trump was too sheepish to stay Netanyahu's hand if the Israeli prime minister was about to launch a military operation that Trump opposed and was going to jeopardize American lives is preposterous.

Trump has been happy to say "no" to Netanyahu before. He pressured the Israeli leader into turning back planes at the end of the 12 Day War last June.

By alleging that Israel forced the U.S. into war, the isolationists think they are making a harsh criti-

cism of the Jewish state, but they are really damning Trump. What worse offense can a president of the United States commit than subjugating his own nation to a foreign power? It's a treasonous act that deserves impeachment and removal.

This is exactly why the Russian obsessives so delighted in believing that Trump was a tool of the Kremlin.

Most of the right-wing dissenters blanch at following their own logic. An alternative tack -- seen in intelligence official Joe Kent's resignation letter -- is to argue that Trump was fooled. Kent said there was "a misinformation campaign" that created an echo chamber "to deceive" the president.

This argument is still a stinging condemnation. It paints Trump as an easily manipulated naif, and on a consequential matter of war and peace. In reality, there was no broad-ranging media drumbeat for war and no wave of popular support. This, again, emphasizes how the decision was Trump's, and his alone.

The Russian hoax was, in part, driven by the left's shock at Trump's victory in 2016. Likewise, the isolationists are having trouble processing the fact that the president whom they invested so much in launched a major Middle Eastern war. But Trump was not owned by this faction of the right, any more than he is owned by Israel.

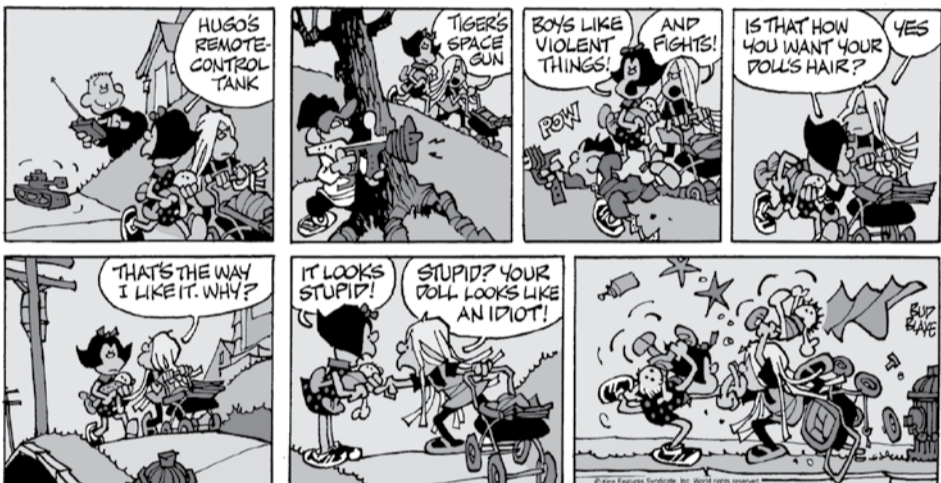

# Roger's Review

Hearings to determine suitability for release.

Excluded from consideration were second- or third-strike offenders, those sentenced to death or life without the possibility of parole and those convicted of first-degree murder of a peace officer or former peace officer due to the performance of their duties. Violent sex offenders, however, were not excluded.

Years later, in the final hours of the last day of the 2020 legislative session, Assembly Bill 3234 passed. This bill expanded eligibility under the Elderly Parole Program by lowering the age threshold from 60 to 50 and reducing the minimum amount of time served from 25 years to 20. It is because of these changes that we are seeing more sexually violent predators released from prison, demonstrating more compassion for criminals than for their victims.

The saving grace in the David Funston case is that Placer County arrested Funston a day ahead of his release for a kidnapping and rape he committed in 1996. The Placer County

District Attorney's Office declined to prosecute the case at the time, believing his convictions in Sacramento County meant that Funston would remain behind bars for life. For the time being, Funston remains incarcerated. However, that will not be the case for other predators in the future, and a person who commits serial violent sex offenses should not be eligible for early release.

I am outraged over the lenient laws that enabled this to occur. That is why I have introduced Senate Bill 1278, which will exclude those convicted of rape, sodomy, lewd and lascivious acts, and sex offenses from being eligible for elderly parole.

I am taking action to provide victims of sex offenses and their families the peace and security of knowing that the person who violated them will not be eligible for early release simply because they turned 50. I will do everything I can to keep people who commit these terrible crimes where they belong, in prison. ★

# It's Time to Fix Broken Public Safety Laws That Endanger Children

I was shocked and horrified this past month when California's Board of Parole Hearings recommended the release of serial child sex predators David Funston and Gregory Vogelsang back into our community.

In 1999, Funston was convicted of 16 counts of child molestation and kidnapping after terrorizing multiple young victims across the Sacramento region. He received 20 years in prison plus three consecutive life terms. At his sentencing, the judge called him "the monster parents feared the most" and said, "there is no man on the face of the earth who deserves this sentence more."

In the same year, Vogelsang was convicted on dozens of counts of sexually assaulting at least five young boys in Citrus Heights, including a child as young as 3 years old. He was sentenced to 355 years to life in prison. Neither of these sexually violent predators were ever supposed to see the light of day.

However, in 2017 Legislative Democrats passed AB 1448 establishing the Elderly Parole Program that allowed

inmates over age 60 to be considered for release after serving only 25 years. Three years later Governor Gavin Newsom signed AB 3234, which lowered the age of eligibility to 50 and time served to only 20 years. The Parole Board's ability to release Funston and Vogelsang was a deliberate choice by Sacramento politicians, who placed the interests of criminals over the interests of public safety.

Thanks to the swift action of the Placer County District Attorney, Funston was immediately detained after leaving state prison. He now faces new charges stemming from the sexual assault of a young child in Roseville in 1996. Vogelsang's parole was also delayed thanks to an organized effort by the public to oppose his release.

These are both important, albeit short-term, victories for public safety, but it should never have made it to this point. Governor Newsom and the Legislature bear responsibility to ensure Funston, Vogelsang, and other predators never get the chance to re-victimize our children.

The first step is fixing the broken policies that enabled this. I have introduced legislation that would give the Governor authority to deny parole in violent felony cases—the same power he already holds in murder cases. I have also coauthored a bill with Senator Roger Niello to exclude sex offenses involving children and other serious crimes from

the Elderly Parole Program entirely.

The second step is accountability for the Newsom-appointed Parole Board. The Governor should remove every member who voted to free Funston and Vogelsang. Prior to his release, Funston himself even admitted that he remains attracted to female children and outlined his need for an "urge control plan." In no world should a monster like him be deemed safe for release.

Every child in California should feel safe playing in local parks or walking to school. Yet the Supermajority has repeatedly passed policies that endanger families and weaken protections. We can no longer tolerate this reckless approach to public safety.

The time for reform is now. I urge my colleagues to change the law without delay. Governor Newsom must also hold the Parole Board accountable and prioritize the safety of our communities. California's children deserve nothing less.

# And Another Thing Save Edward Kelly School

The United States Bicentennial (1976) was celebrated with many observances, parties, and events related to that historical time in history. The Bicentennial culminated on Sunday, July 4, 1976, with the 200th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence by our founding fathers. That was something many people in the community of Rancho Cordova celebrated even though they weren't a city yet. I worked with many others in Rancho Cordova. We were selling national flags, T-shirts, and really worked on something that needed to be repaired. Another thing that was done was to have kids painting pictures or designs on fire hydrants. They were very happy to let people who drove by or walked by see their work of art. They were really talented. Sometimes they had to wait either to get paint to start or to finish because they were

waiting for more paint. I was one of the people who had paint in the back of my truck and needed to get it for the kids who were in need of more paint.

The one thing that we decided to work on, and repair, was the Edward Kelly School which is on Bradshaw Road. I believe it was, and still is, a parent participation preschool. It was a school which was used by quite a few people who had the opportunity to take their children there. The school needed to have a lot of work on it because the base of the building was weak, and there were some people who had the skills to work on it. The school had people working at the base of the building, and there were some who had the talent to repair the roof and the peak where the bell was. It was, and still is, the oldest continuously operating schoolhouse in Sacramento County.

Initially, the school was named the Brighton School. Then it was moved to 3320 Bradshaw Road in

1924, and it was renamed Edward Kelly School. That school has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places by the United States Department of the Interior. I recently called the school and was told that the school is being considered for closure. If this school closes, it will remove the opportunity for youngsters to attend preschool. There are parents who do not want the School District to close it. Parent Participating Preschool needs parents to work in the classroom 1 day a week. The parents I talked to want the school to stay open. As I learned earlier, it is the oldest continuously operating schoolhouse in Sacramento County. I am going to find out what needs to be done to keep this school open. I hope that the Sacramento School District won't close it. Only time and the Sacramento School District will tell.

# New Superior Courthouse to Open in Sacramento Railyards

## Sacramento County Superior Court News Release

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Preparations are underway to open the new Tani G. Cantil-Sakaue Sacramento Superior Courthouse next month in the Sacramento Railyards.

Located at 500 G St., the new courthouse will replace all court operations currently housed in the Gordon D. Schaber Courthouse, 720 9th St., and the Hall of Justice, 813 6th St.

"This new facility not only enhances the court's ability to serve the public more efficiently, but also strengthens meaningful access to justice," said Presiding Judge Lawrence G. Brown. "By bringing services together in a modern, accessible, and secure environment, we are better positioned to meet the needs of all who rely on our justice system."

### Phased Transition Timeline

The court will relocate operations through a carefully coordinated, phased move designed to minimize disruption to court users and the public. The move will occur over five consecutive weekends:

Initial relocation of select administrative offices and court functions will take place from March 28 to 30. Continued transfer of courtrooms and support staff will occur April 4 to 6. The completion of the civil operations move will take place April 11 to 13 and, finally, the final transition of remaining criminal operations from April 18 to 20 and April 25 to 27.

Civil-related services are expected to open to the public at the new

courthouse beginning April 13, following the third move weekend. The courthouse is anticipated to be fully operational, including criminal services, by April 27.

"Our phased transition plan has been designed to ensure that we continue serving the public with minimal disruption throughout this process," said Court Executive Officer Kelly Sullivan. "By moving operations in stages, we are able to maintain continuity of court services while thoughtfully transitioning into the new facility."

### Designed to Better Serve the Public

The 18-story, 538,000-square-foot courthouse includes 53 courtrooms supporting a broad range of criminal and civil proceedings. The building addresses longstanding space limitations while improving access, security, and efficiency.

Courtroom features include advanced remote hearing technology with videoconferencing capabilities, enhanced digital evidence presentation,

including large media files such as body camera and surveillance footage and multi-view video access with strategically placed cameras that preserve juror privacy.

Additional public amenities include civil self-help services, a jury assembly room accommodating up to 500 prospective jurors, food services and a children's waiting room on the first floor, a dedicated Civil Settlement Conference Center and centralized criminal and civil public counters.

The courthouse features a single public entrance with four security screening stations and eight public elevators to enhance safety and efficiency.

With an estimated project cost of approximately \$514 million, the courthouse represents a long-term investment in Sacramento's judicial infrastructure. The project was developed and overseen by the Judicial Council of California, designed by NBBJ, and constructed by Clark Construction Group. ★

The Lancers' next match will be against West Park, which will be held at Mather Golf Course on Thursday, April 16 at 3 p.m. ★

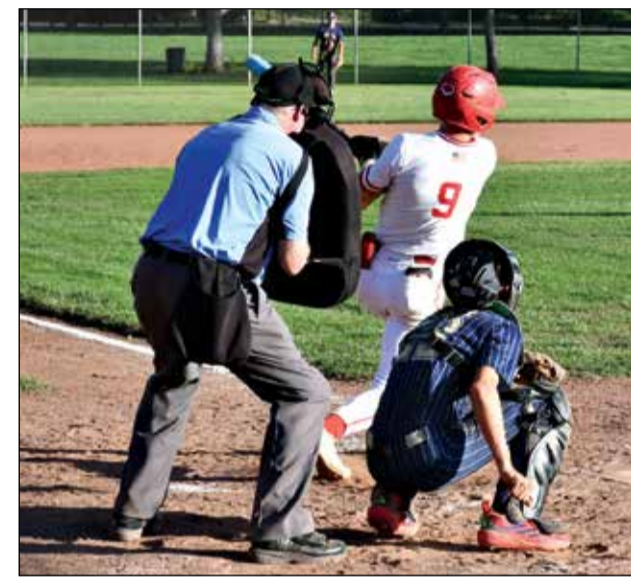

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Cordova Lancers entered spring break this week on a three-game losing streak within Metro League play, including being swept in their most recent two-game series against rival West Park. Despite the slide, the Lancers have been playing solid baseball as of late and should be able to make some noise during the back half of their schedule. Prior to the three-game skid, the Lancers (7-8 overall, 4-5
