From Classroom to Careers

Folsom Lake College, Sutter Health open hands-on healthcare training hub

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A ribbon stretched across a set of glass doors Wednesday April 29, marked more than the opening of a new facility in Rancho Cordova, it signaled what local leaders say is a direct response to a growing healthcare workforce shortage and a new pathway for residents to step into stable, in-demand careers.

Folsom Lake College, in partnership with Sutter Health, unveiled a new Instructional Healthcare Hub at its Rancho Cordova Center, backed by a \$2.5 million investment aimed at expanding hands-on training for students entering allied health fields.

The upgraded facility, located at 10259

Folsom Blvd., features four modernized classrooms equipped with advanced medical technology, including simulators, X-ray machines and hospital beds.

College officials said the hub is designed to mirror real-world clinical

environments and better prepare students for immediate employment.

Programs supported at the site include certified nursing assistant, emergency medical technician, medical laboratory technician, radiology technician and advanced imaging

technician training.

"This really is a day of gratitude and appreciation, and most importantly, to talk about the transformation that happens in this building," said Folsom Lake College President Dr. Art Pimentel. "We had a conversation about a need, and this is a real prime example of what we can do when education partners with industry."

That need is substantial. According to regional labor data cited at the event, the Greater Sacramento area sees roughly 7,560 annual job openings in healthcare, while education programs produce about 460 completions each year, leaving a gap of more than 7,100 workers.

Get Ready to Volunteer

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - What could hundreds of volunteers accomplish in a single day? In Rancho Cordova, the answer has been cleaner parks, stronger connections and a growing tradition of giving back.

The third annual Rancho Cordova Spring Service Day returns Saturday, May 16, inviting residents, businesses and community groups to take part in a citywide effort to make a positive impact. The event continues to grow, building on momentum from its first two years, when more than 700 volunteers completed 30 projects.

"In 2024 a group of Rancho Cordova community leaders took a dream long discussed and put it into action," organizers said. "The success has led to an annual service event that unifies our community and enhances the proud tradition of volunteerism."

Organized by Rancho Cordova in Action, the day supports causes including education, environment, arts and culture, animals and basic needs.

"We take on projects all over our city. Regardless of what skill you have there is a place for you in our spring service day," said Councilmember David M. Sander, Ph.D. at last year's event.

City leaders say the impact goes beyond a single day.

"This is all volunteers, people that care about Rancho citizens and how much we are involved in our neighborhoods," said Mayor Garrett Gatewood.

Others point to the sense of connection the event creates.

"This is a day where residents, people of all ages and different neighborhoods come out to help beautify the city in public spaces," said Councilmember Siri Pulipati.

Sponsors said supporting the effort is part of investing locally.

"Giving back to the community that we work in is very important because we care about where we are located and the work that happens here," said Anne Descalzo, co-founder of title sponsor The RADZ Group. "We want to make a meaningful contribution."

Terrance McNamara of Atlas Disposal, another Title Sponsor this year added, "this community always comes together to make their city a better place."

Organizers encourage residents to sign up to volunteer or donate ahead of the event.

leaders said the new hub is intended to help close that gap while creating accessible career pathways for local residents.

"This is such an exciting example of the power of partnership," said Los Rios Community College District Chancellor Dr. Brian King. "When we get a wonderful business partner like Sutter, a city that embraces the importance of education like Rancho Cordova, a school district committed to preparing students to excel in college, the result is what you see today."

King highlighted the long-standing collaboration between the college district, Sutter Health and the city of Rancho Cordova, calling the investment the largest single donation of its kind for the district.

Los Rios Board of Trustees President Deborah Ortiz emphasized the broader regional impact, particularly in building a pipeline of skilled workers.

"This represents what is possible in our region when education and industry come together with a shared commitment," Ortiz said. "Programs like these allow us to better prepare students for high-wage, in-demand careers and ensure access and availability in a field that is going to be more vital than ever."

For Sutter Health, the investment is part of a larger effort to address workforce shortages while strengthening community health systems.

"This is really more than just a ribbon cutting," said Rachel McKinney, president of Sutter Health's Greater Sacramento Division. "It is a literal opening of doors for the many talented students that will train here."

McKinney said the facility will allow students to train in environments that reflect the realities of modern healthcare.

"Healthcare is complex. It's fast-paced and to be able to provide training in an environment that simulates the real world is really what every trained student will need,"

McKinney said.

Rancho Cordova Mayor Garrett Gatewood framed the project as a direct investment in the city's future.

"Today is not just a ribbon cutting," Gatewood said. "We are opening the doors to opportunities, careers and a stronger Rancho Cordova. Not everyone follows the same path, but this hub creates a real stable location for well-paying jobs and careers."

Folsom Cordova Unified School District Superintendent Erik Swanson said the facility also strengthens connections between K-12 education and career opportunities.

"This is more than a new facility. It's about what becomes possible

because of it," Swanson said. "This healthcare hub today opens that up for a lot more of our graduates to have a plan to a living-wage job here in the city of Rancho Cordova."

Swanson noted the hub will support a seamless transition for students from local high schools into college programs and ultimately into the workforce.

Officials across agencies repeatedly pointed to collaboration as the driving force behind the project and as a model for future efforts.

"The students who will walk through these doors will take a moment to reflect on how their future was set by all the individuals here today," said Gatewood. ★

Mermaids Make a Splash

California Mermaid Convention Returns May 15-17

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A splash of color, sequins and shimmering tails will soon ripple through Rancho Cordova as hundreds of “merfolk” from around the world gather for a weekend that blends fantasy with community and a message that runs deeper than the surface.

The California Mermaid Convention returns May 15-17 for its seventh annual event, transforming the Hagan Community Center and Cordova Community Pool into a three-day celebration of performance, creativity and hands-on experiences.

Organizers say the convention, held in partnership with Visit Rancho Cordova, is expected to draw more than 400 attendees, including professional performers, hobbyists and first-time participants traveling from across the United States and as far as Hawaii, Germany and Japan.

Recognized as the longest-running mermaid convention on the West Coast, the event has grown from a small costume parade into a large-scale production that combines entertainment with education and environmental awareness.

“The California Mermaid Convention in Rancho Cordova is quintessentially quirky, refreshingly inclusive, and daringly bold,” said Kristen Achziger, director of marketing and communications for Visit Rancho Cordova. “They push the boundaries of the unexpected and novel while still providing a relaxed and welcoming experience for all visitors.”

The weekend’s programming ranges from public spectacles to interactive workshops, including swim sessions, costuming classes, educational panels and live performances. Environmental stewardship is woven throughout, with an emphasis on ocean and waterway conservation.

Festivities begin Friday, May 15, with the Promenade of Mermaids from 5 to 7:30 p.m. along the Embarcadero Waterfront in Old Sacramento, a free, all-ages event that has become a regional tradition. The evening continues with a 21-and-over launch party from 8:30 to 11:30 p.m. at Dive Bar, 1016 K St., Sacramento.

Main convention programming takes place Saturday, May 16, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Hagan Park Community Pool, featuring hands-on activities and performances for attendees of all ages. That night, the Bubble Ball runs from 7:30 to 11:30 p.m. at the Hagan Community Center, offering a ticketed, all-ages costume event with live entertainment and immersive visuals.

The Bubble Ball, one of the

convention’s most anticipated events, will feature a jazz band, aerial performances and the crowning of the event’s “Pearl,” recognizing a standout participant within the community.

Activities resume Sunday, May 17, with the main convention continuing from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the community pool. The weekend concludes with the Grotto Swim from 6 to 10 p.m. at a private location, a 16-and-over finale featuring a themed pool

experience and professional photography.

“The California Mermaid Convention is truly a celebration of community, magic and joy,” said Rachel Smith, one of the event organizers. “We are a safe place to be yourself, level up your underwater skills and find new best friends.”

Smith said the event also reflects a broader purpose beyond entertainment, including community engagement and environmental efforts such as river cleanups and conservation initiatives.

“We are proud to give back to the greater Rancho Cordova and Sacramento community through ongoing river cleanups, donations and water stewardship,” she said. The world feels scary these days, and building this magical underwater realm has brought a lot of joy to so many people. We are grateful to do it for another year.”

Local tourism officials say the convention continues to bring both cultural and economic benefits to Rancho Cordova, drawing visitors who support area hotels, restaurants and businesses.

Tina Maier has been doing art her entire life. She said her favorite medium is “Fabric, fabric, fabric!” About her winning piece at City Hall she said, “It’s illogical because it has five main petals, and most flowers don’t have that; they have even numbers . . . When you mix sewing with art, you go ‘no rules’ – you can have a lot of complexity.”

Maier recently also got Best of Show at the Sacramento Fine Arts Center in Carmichael with an art quilt.

First Place winner Linda Nunes’ winning work, “Lavender Hill and Lemon Haze,” is from a large series she is doing, “probably 20 pieces,” called Ordered Chaos.

“It brings me so much joy to be in my studio creating,” Nunes said. She put off dedicating herself to art until her children’s education was taken care of, then went to Folsom Lake College, Sacramento State University and “hit the ground running . . . So I’ve been busy ever since, really busy!”

Sheryl French’s Honorable Mention was for “Off-Kilter Cake.” She said that her mother was an artist, and when French came home after being born, “The first thing I smelt was turpentine.”

About her winning artwork she said, “I think it is really a metaphor for life, because no matter how well you plan, things are a little wonky, right? Nothing ever quite goes, and yet it still sticks together. So the cake is there to remind you that nothing’s perfect and you should be having a good

Falcons Build Momentum with Gritty Wins on the Sand

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Folsom Lake beach volleyball is peaking at the right time, stringing together a series of hard-fought wins before entering the Big 8 Conference Pairs Championship.

The Falcons showcased depth and resilience across multiple matchups, going 4-1 in team competitions over the stretch. Their run began on April 10 with a tightly contested 3-2 victory over Solano in Sacramento. Folsom Lake claimed key wins at the No. 1, No. 3, and No. 4 pairs, with the duo of Lutsiv/Vorster setting the tone in straight sets and Ayers/Pham battling through a three-set win to clinch the match.

Later that day, the Falcons edged Cosumnes River by another 3-2 scoreline. Once again, Lutsiv/Vorster delivered at the top spot, while Quintanar/Triplett and Ayers/Pham added crucial victories to secure the team win.

Folsom Lake's strongest showing came on April 17 against Marin, where the Falcons dominated in a 5-0 sweep. Every pair delivered, highlighted by commanding straight-set wins across the lineup. The momentum carried into a neutral-site matchup against Santa Rosa Junior College, where Folsom Lake pulled out yet another narrow 3-2 victory.

The consistent success across multiple pairs, particularly the reliable performances from Lutsiv/Vorster, Quintanar/Triplett, and Ayers/Pham,

has been key to the Falcons' late-season surge.

That momentum led into the Big 8 Conference Pairs Championship on April 22. Competing in Sacramento, the

Falcons faced Sacramento City in the opening round but fell in a close contest, 1-0.

Despite the early exit in pairs competition, Folsom Lake's recent body of work

reflects a team competing at a high level heading into the postseason landscape. Their ability to grind out 3-2 wins and deliver a dominant sweep underscores both depth and

competitive toughness.

With multiple pairs finding rhythm and confidence, the Falcons have positioned themselves as a formidable group as championship play continues. ★

Men's Golf Wins Big Sky Title

LITCHFIELD PARK, AZ (MPG) - The biggest drama of the final round of the Big Sky Men's Golf Championship was a playoff for the individual title. That proved to be a win-win scenario for Sacramento State as the battle was between Jai Bahl and Gabriel Smith who both finished the three-round tournament at 9-under par.

Smith claimed the individual title to earn his first career victory and the Hornets cruised to the team title behind a tournament record 54-hole total of 841 (23-under). The victory gives Sacramento State an automatic berth to an NCAA Regional. The field will be announced on May 6 (after press time) with regionals hosted by Arizona, Oregon State, Georgia, Texas A&M, Ohio State and Wake Forest.

The Hornets entered the final round with an 11-shot lead and saw Idaho pull within five strokes on a couple of occasions before adding some cushion. The team's total broke the tournament record by one stroke and was eight shots better than the previous school record at the conference tournament.

Zach Matzke led the team in the third

round with a 4-under par 68. Matzke finished the tournament at 2-under par to move into a tie for ninth place. Matzke parred the first four holes before his only bogey on the day came on the par-5 fifth. Birdies on Nos. 6 and 8 left him 1-under at the midway point of the round before playing the back nine at 3-under. He parred the first four of those holes and then birdied

No. 14, 15 and 17.

Max Thomas moved into a tie for 14th place after shooting 70 on April 22. Thomas picked up birdies on No. 1 and 5 and remained 2-under through nine. He returned to even early on the back nine but eagled the 535-yard, par-5 14th. Thomas played the final four holes even with pars surrounding a birdie on the par-3 16th and

a bogey on the par-4 17th.

Smith and Bahl traded the lead throughout the round. Smith had a strong start with four birdies and a bogey over the first five holes to leave him 3-under at the midway point. A bogey on No. 11 and a double bogey on No. 15 left him even on the day until a birdie on the par-3 18th forced the playoff. That birdie was one of only two for the team in the tournament.

Bahl, who was coming off a school-record 61 on April 21, started the round with a double bogey to snap a streak of 19 holes without a bogey. He was 3-over through 12 holes but responded with birdies on No. 14, 16 and 17 before a bogey on No. 18.

The playoff took the pair back to No. 1 where Smith recorded a birdie and Bahl a par. Smith became the eighth individual conference champion in the school's Div. I era and the pair were the fourth to account for the top two spots at conference championship for the Hornets.

Zach Mate added the final score to the team total with an even-par 72. Mate was even on both sides of the course with a birdie on No. 1 and a bogey on No. 3 on the front nine and a pair of birdies and bogeys on the back nine. ★

Wolff began his youth career with the Columbus Crew academy before returning to his native Georgia to join Atlanta

United's youth system and in 2019 earned the opportunity

to feature for Atlanta United 2 in USL Championship. The

following year, he signed a home-grown contract for Atlanta and in

five seasons with the club made over 80 appearances with 14 goals and five assists across all competitions.

Ahead of the 2025 season, the 23-year-old was transferred to Real Salt Lake for \$50,000 in allocation money. With RSL, he recorded three goals and four assists in 21 appearances in MLS play, Concacaf Champions Cup, and with Real Monarchs in MLS NEXT Pro.

Wolff has also previously featured for Belgian Challenger Pro League side SK Beveren from July 2022 to January 2023 and in 2022 made seven appearances for the U.S. Men's U-20 National Team in the Concacaf Under-20 Championship. He featured in every match for the tournament and added two goals, including the Championship-winning goal against the Dominican Republic. ★

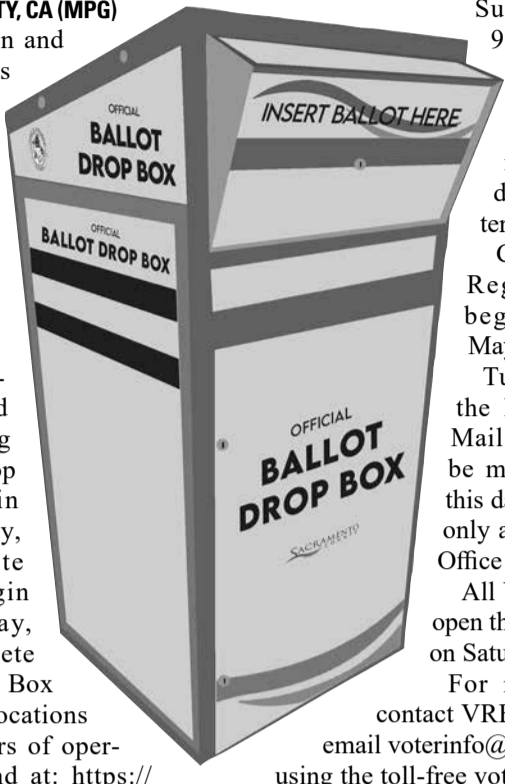

How the Supreme Court's Voting Rights Act Ruling Could Affect California's Gerrymandered Districts

When California's independent redistricting commissions drew new maps of the state's congressional and legislative districts after the 2010 and 2020 censuses, their members were emphatically told by legal advisors that the federal Voting Rights Act required them to maximize opportunities for ethnic communities to elect officeholders.

The commissions went to great lengths to fold that mandate into the geographic boundaries of the districts, even if it required them to ignore city and county lines.

The effect was to enhance the ranks of Black, Latino and Asian representatives in Congress and the state Capitol. It also helped Democrats achieve overwhelming majorities in the Legislature and the state's congressional delegation, thus leaving Republicans with only token representation.

The commission's redistricting plans were, in effect, gerrymanders, if one defines that term as meaning to seek predetermined outcomes — even though the commission was created, via two ballot measures in 2008 and 2010, in response to gerrymanders the Legislature had decreed in prior decades.

Last year, Gov. Gavin Newsom and the Legislature asked voters to set aside the commission's

overwhelmingly pro-Democrat congressional districts and adopt even more lopsided maps, to give Democrats five more seats. It was a response to efforts, backed by President Donald Trump, to gerrymander more Republican districts in Texas and other red states.

Voters agreed by passing Proposition 50. This year's election will test whether the gerrymander has been successful and whether it has enough impact to restore Democratic control of the House of Representatives.

While setting aside the redistricting commission's maps, Prop. 50 promised that the maps would be effective not only this year, but for the 2028 and 2030 election cycles, after which the commission process would be restored using data from the 2030 census.

It's difficult to believe that when the time comes Democrats would truly allow the commission to once again draw the maps. The party's leaders never liked the commission process in the first place, and returning to it could force them to give up some of the seats they are capturing this year.

Additionally, California's congressional delegation, now 52 members, is likely to shrink by four or five seats due to the state's lack of population growth, meaning even fewer positions to distribute.

On Wednesday, the U.S. Supreme Court gave California's Democratic Party leadership another reason to eliminate the redistricting commission by weakening the Voting Rights Act's effect on drawing districts to maximize representation by non-white ethnic groups.

By a 6-3 vote, the court overturned congressional

maps in Louisiana that had, by lower court order, been redrawn to create one more district for the state's Black residents. The split decision declared that a "racial gerrymander" violates the U.S. Constitution's equal rights language.

The revised congressional districts that California created via ballot measure last year will not be immediately affected by Wednesday's ruling, but it could impact states that had been weighing making changes but had not yet done so.

Furthermore, it could affect California's new maps going forward. When they were placed on the ballot, Democratic leaders boasted that they were fully in compliance with the Voting Rights Act's provisions that now have been reinterpreted. Republicans could contend via lawsuit that the maps are unconstitutional under the court's new standard.

The Supreme Court's ruling would also affect how California's redistricting commission approaches its task after the 2030 census by eliminating, or at least weakening, the mandate that guided its actions in the past.

Democratic leaders could minimize the court's decree by persuading voters to eliminate the commission, thus returning redistricting to a Legislature they overwhelmingly control — something they probably would prefer anyway.

Social Security Matters

I Want to do Everything Right When I Claim Social Security

Dear Rusty: I will be 62 in two years. I plan on signing up for SS at age 62, but I have heard there are details that are important when signing up. When it comes time, I want to make sure I do everything right. Can you help me understand?

Signed: Claiming Soon

Dear Claiming Soon: Deciding when to claim your Social Security benefit is a decision you should make only after careful consideration of your personal circumstances. And details are, indeed, important. For example, if you claim at age 62 (when you first become eligible), your monthly SS benefit will be only 70% of the amount you would get by waiting until age 67 to claim. And there are other considerations as well, including:

- If you are still working and claim at 62, you will be subject to Social Security's Annual Earnings Test (AET) which limits how much you can earn from working while collecting early SS benefits. The earnings limit changes each year, and for 2026 it is \$24,480. If the annual limit

after you claim early is exceeded, SS will take back \$1 in benefits for every \$2 you are over the limit. And, if your work earnings substantially exceed the annual limit, you may even be temporarily ineligible for early SS benefits (until you either stop working full time or reach your SS full retirement age). FYI, the AET lasts until you reach your FRA (age 67).

- The benefit reduction for claiming SS early is permanent. After you claim, you will only get increases for Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLA) which occur annually according to inflation. FYI, the average annual COLA adjustment is about 2.5%.

- If you are married, the reduced benefit you get by claiming early will potentially be the basis of your spouse's survivor benefit if you pass first. Surviving spouse benefits are based on the amount you are receiving at your death, thus waiting longer for a higher personal benefit may also provide your spouse with a larger survivor benefit as your widow.

- If you wait longer than age 62, your monthly benefit will continue to increase (by approximately 6% per year) until you reach your FRA, when you get 100% of the amount you are entitled to from a lifetime of working. FYI, you can even wait longer - up to age 70 - to claim an even higher monthly amount (8% more for each year of delay after

FRA). At age 70, your SS benefit would be about 75% more than your age 62 benefit amount.

If you haven't already done so, I suggest setting up your personal online "my Social Security" account at www.ssa.gov/myaccount to see what your SS benefits are estimated to be at various ages. Then, when you are closer to age 62, contact us again to talk about your specific personal circumstances at the time, and we can provide you with everything you need to know about applying for Social Security.

In the end, when claiming your Social Security benefits, you should consider your financial need, your health and life expectancy, your plans for working, and your marital status. We commend you for exploring this well in advance of becoming eligible and we will be here to assist when it is time for you to apply.

of the most indomitable figures in the history of our politics. No matter how much he's mocked or hated, no matter how intense the controversy or how impossible the fix, no matter how dramatic the situation, he never breaks or loses his sense of command.

The ever-ebullient Teddy Roosevelt, who once gave a speech from shot-through notes immediately after an assassination attempt, might tip his cap. (TR takes the cake for badassery in the face of a threat to his life, given that he delivered that 1912 campaign speech while bleeding and with the bullet still lodged in his chest.)

A fundamental part of the Trump ethos is, as he said right after the dinner attack, when everything was still confused, "Let the show go on." For him, the show must never stop, and he's always at the center of it.

This is one reason that he had the instinct to pump his fist in the air in Butler, Pennsylvania, after he'd been bloodied and nearly killed by an assassin's bullet, demonstrating fight and lack of fear in an instantly iconic moment.

Anyone inclined to dismiss this trait as that of a mere entertainer should consider how showmanship has always had an outsized role in high-level politics; FDR referred to himself, in a positive way, as one of the top actors in the country.

Trump's belief that he's always going to prevail and that if he doesn't, he'll find a workaround

gives him an invincible self-confidence. It doesn't mean that he won't retreat if necessary, but whether he's being firm or flexible, he's equally upbeat and assured about his position.

He couples this with a hyperactive energy. Just look at Washington, D.C. He's deployed the National Guard to fight crime, cleaned up homeless encampments and public parks, vowed to make the grass look greener and the water in the Reflecting Pool look bluer, hosted a military parade, brought the coming attractions of an IndyCar race and an enormous fair on the National Mall, started construction of a massive new White House ballroom, and stated his intention to build a 250-foot triumphal arch.

His omnipresence, ambition and willingness to exercise power across two presidencies -- spanning 12 years with the Biden interregnum -- are going to make him one of the most dominant figures in American political history, up there with the likes of Reagan, FDR and TR in the modern era.

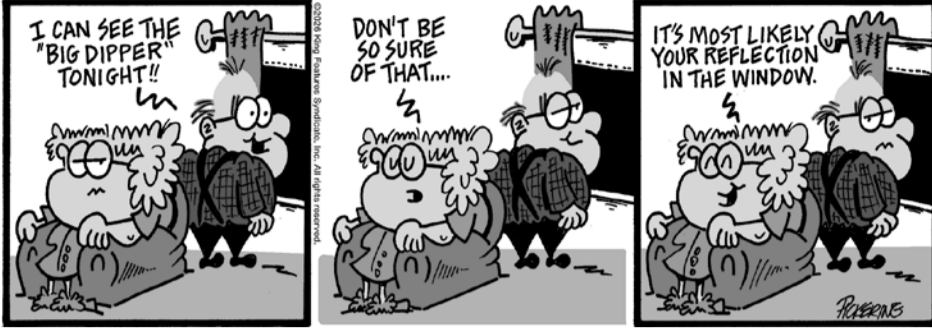
TITLE: None of this means that he's right or wrong on any given question, and, of course, these characteristics all come with downsides, sometimes considerable ones. But no one can question Trump's resilience, or his preternatural ability to proceed unbowed no matter what the circumstance.

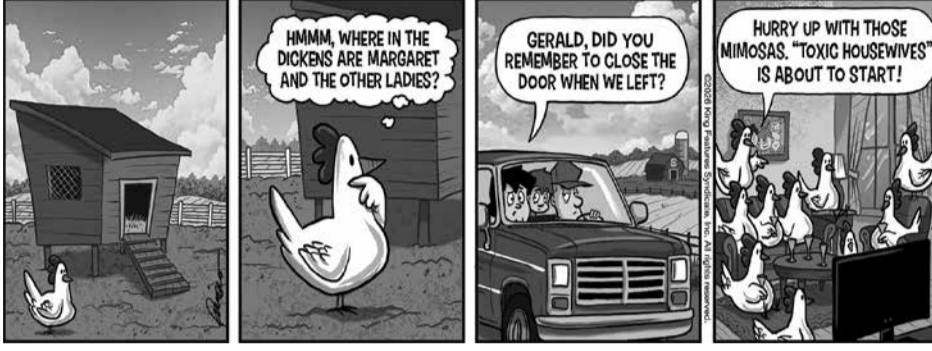

14 years later, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger is back. Just as he said he would be.

He was famous for his movie quote, "I'll be back."

Well, he's back. Former Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger & Lt. Gov Abel Maldonado played a central role in advancing California Proposition 14 in 2010. As governor at the time, he strongly supported the shift to a "top-two" open primary system as part of his broader push for political reform in California.

Schwarzenegger argued that allowing all voters to participate in a single primary would reduce partisan gridlock, empower independent voters, and encourage more moderate candidates. Since 2010, all candidates, regardless of party affiliation, can move on to the November General Election ballot if they make the "top two", and voters may vote for any candidate without party restrictions.

Pre-2010, each Party got its top dog into the final fight, and only party members could vote in their Primary Election. It was meant to weaken the political parties, and it has.

Last week, the two leading Republicans, Steve Hilton and Sheriff Chad Bianco, and four Democrats, U.S. Rep. Katie Porter, billionaire Tom Steyer, San Jose

Mayor Matt Mahan, and former Human Services Secretary Xavier Becerra, did the traditional televised candidate debate. What the six candidates had to say on issues was not really the topic that got the most attention.

What dominated the messaging of the day was the fact that if all of the Democratic candidates stay in the race (they only let the top four on stage) and split up the vote, there's a 50/50 chance that the two Republican candidates would garner the top two spots, creating a situation in which the incredibly democratic state of California would end up electing a Republican governor in 2026.

If the two Republicans split the 30% of CA Republicans expected to vote 15 and 15, they could well get there. This is not some sort of political fantasy; it is a real possibility.

The Chairman of the Democratic Party, Rusty Hicks, holds a weekly press conference, releasing polling results, explaining the problem, and trying to get the candidates to understand that if some of them don't drop out, none of them will get a chance to move forward.

So far, only one, former State Controller Betty Yee, has done the "right thing" for the party. So maybe, like the time-traveling half robot Schwarzenegger played in the movies, he will finally "blow up all the boxes" 14 years after the fact, which was his most famous quote outside of his time in Hollywood. ★

Sometimes I think about our kids when they were going to elementary schools, and I think about what we had to do back then. Our first home was in the White Rock Elementary school area, and one year all four of our kids were in that school. During that time my wife was a teacher's aide at White Rock School. After that year, our kids began going to different schools. We moved to our current home close to the American River Park area. Our oldest child went to Mitchell Middle School, and our other school was Riverview Elementary School. After a while, our kids were attending three different schools: Riverview, Mitchell, and Cordova High School. We learned about the different aspects of the Folsom

Cordova Unified School District. It was a wonderful school district then and is still one of the best today.

There was one thing that affected many parents and schools when two schools were closed. The Cordova Elementary School and the Riverview Elementary school affected quite a few people who didn't want them to close. Both schools were closed on May 28, 2010. The Cordova Lane Elementary in Rancho Cordova is no longer a traditional K-6 school. It is now the Cordova Lane Center serving preschools, special education services, and has community meeting spaces. The other school that closed, Riverview, opened again on Aug. 8, 2014, and is now the Riverview Stem Academy, until today, it has been from K-5, but now it is extending to K-8. The Stem Academy is one of the best schools

in Northern California after being named a Blue Ribbon School. STEM means Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math.

Going on to something quite different is today's society. The United States Supreme Court ruled against the 1965 Voting Rights Act that was signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson in 1965. It was the Voting Rights Act that for six decades was one of the most important laws. It is still important, and that decision was something that prevented discrimination against minorities at the ballot box and helped minorities be elected. That will be fearful for minorities, and we will have to wait and see how the change of the laws of the past will affect the United States of America today.

Lancers Make the Playoffs!

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Following one of the more sensational late-season rallies in recent memory, the Cordova Lancers earned themselves a spot in the CIF (California Interscholastic Federation) Sac Joaquin Section Division II playoffs this week.

The Lancers trailed Metro League rival Antelope by one game for the third and final playoff spot given to Metro League teams as of April 24, when the two teams began a season-defining two-game series. The Lancers would sweep the series and put themselves in the driver's seat for playoff positioning, ultimately winning four of their last five games, including a 3-1 mark in league play, en route to securing third place in the league standings and the No. 16 seed in the postseason bracket.

After falling in the Division II play-in game a season ago, Cordova (12-15-1 overall, 8-7 Metro League at press time) bounced back this spring and earned a playoff berth outright, led by head coach Scott Ahlstrom. This current Lancers' team has been playing together for quite some time, so everyone on the roster knows they will need to play their part if they want to win.

"These guys have played together for a while and everybody knows their roles," Ahlstrom said. "It's a thing that, not everybody plays all the time there's guys that do play all the time. The guys that are filling supporting roles are doing just as big of a job as the guys that are in the roles all the time. It's a big team effort, and it's nice to be around them all the time and have them come together."

As the No. 16 seed, the Lancers were given the tough task of taking on the top seed in Division II in the Elk Grove Thundering Herd (22-6

overall, 13-2 Delta League) on Wednesday, May 6 at Elk Grove. Final results were not available at press time, but Ahlstrom knew his team had their work cut out

for them entering this week's contest. Even so, with Cordova keeping things close against top area teams like McClatchy and West Park in games this season,

Ahlstrom felt his team was up for the challenge coming into the week.

"There's no question it's an uphill battle," Ahlstrom said.

"This team is seasoned though. We may not get all the accolades and whatnot, and may not be as deep, but our guys know how to win and play good teams close. This team knows how to mix it up with the really good teams and keep the game close."

Ahlstrom was undecided on who would start on the mound for Cordova against Elk Grove when asked over the weekend, citing strong performances across the board in recent games by multiple pitchers. It is safe to assume that senior ace Levi Nyberg would be atop the list of names to get the nod, however. This season, Nyberg finished sixth in Division II in strikeouts (60) as well as 10th in earned run average (1.33), with the American River College commit seemingly poised to make potentially his last appearance on the mound for Cordova. Offensively, the team will rely on several players including junior shortstop Bro Ahlstrom, who led the team in batting average (.413), on-base percentage (.525), and runs batted in (20) during the regular season to keep the Lancers in the game.

Final results will be published next week. ★

The High School Mock Election program is conducted prior to each regularly scheduled election to help students build awareness and understanding of the democratic process, regardless of age or voting eligibility.

Assistant Principal Dr. Carrie Jackson shared, "Students get a lot out of this experience. It helps them feel more comfortable with how voting works, and our teachers do their best to keep students involved and engaged in civic life whenever they can."

The event provided students with a meaningful opportunity to experience civic participation firsthand, reinforcing the importance of informed and active citizenship. ★
