## Rooted in Community Pride

Leadership class unveils mural, AED at Rusch Park

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)**

- A new mural now greets visitors at Rusch Park, but Tuesday night's "Rooted in Unity Reception" celebrated more than public art. Community leaders, local businesses and residents gathered to mark a project organizers said reflects Citrus Heights' focus on safety, beautification and collaboration.

The reception held on May 12 from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. hosted by the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce's 2025-26 Leadership Citrus Heights class, marked the completion of a community project that brought both public art and public safety

improvements to the park through the installation of a new mural and an outdoor automated external

defibrillator, or AED.

Held in partnership with Citrus Heights Arts and the Sunrise Recreation and

Park District, the event featured live music from a jazz quartet, artwork from local artists, a silent auction and food and drinks from area restaurants and businesses.

The mural was created by artist MAMMXTH, while local vendors including Momo's Smokehouse, Black Angus Steakhouse, R Vida Cantina, Texas Roadhouse, Boeger Winery, Crumble Cookies and Dark Heart Brewing contributed to the evening's reception.

"This was really about leaders coming together," said Megan Smith-Fajardo of Republic Services, a member of the leadership cohort. "People think it's

## Council Approves Trail Expansions and New Roundabouts

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - At the May 13 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered the Gateway Activation Project (GAP), along with amendments to the Bikeway Master Plan, Pedestrian Master Plan and General Plan Bikeways Map.

Community Development Director Casey Kempenaar explained that this project and the amendments are necessary to create a well-connected, safe and sustainable Complete Streets network and trail system. The project will expand the trail network by closing critical gaps between local and regional trails. It will also allow for more walking and biking along Old Auburn Road and Wachtel Way and improve traffic safety along Old Auburn Road.

The project design includes the following features: three new roundabouts located at Old Auburn Road/Argo Drive, Old Auburn Road/Wachtel Way and Old Auburn Road/Oakwood Hills Circle/Linda Creek Court; multi-use paths extending along Old Auburn Road and Wachtel Way; and connections to regional trail systems in Roseville and Sacramento County.

Last June, council directed staff to move forward with preliminary engineering and environmental review, which are now complete. The city's Mitigation Monitoring Plan addresses necessary tree removal, as well as traffic impacts. Staff also conducted public outreach for the project, including public meetings, mailers, a public comment period and a dedicated project webpage.

Development of the plan has been fully funded by a state budget allocation received in 2022. Funding for actual construction has not yet been identified, but adopting these plan amendments will help the city secure future grants for final design and construction. Kempenaar said the rest of the process will likely take a few years.

During public comments, a resident shared concerns about the proposed roundabouts, stating that they will confuse drivers. In particular, he believed there is too much traffic at the Wachtel

to become a leader, but ideally you're already a leader and you're learning about the specific leadership of Citrus Heights so you can be more informed and more impactful."

Smith-Fajardo said the class focused heavily on community safety and beautification when deciding on a project.

"It might not be obvious, but murals actually impact community safety," she said. "When you have a place with murals, it doesn't feel like a place for crime. By putting up the mural and the AED, we focused on community safety with the added benefit of beautification."

The Leadership Citrus Heights program was recently revived after more than a decade-long hiatus, according to Chamber Executive Director Sheri Merrick.

"I truly could not have asked for a better first class," Merrick told attendees during remarks at the reception. "The diversity, the different backgrounds, I'm just so proud of these individuals that decided they wanted to step up for their community."

She said the two priorities consistently surfaced throughout the program.

"The fact they were able to accomplish both of those is just mind-blowing," Merrick said.

Citrus Heights Mayor MariJane Lopez-Taff said the event reflected the city's close-knit character.

"I always tell people Citrus Heights is a medium-sized city, but we function like a small town," Lopez-Taff said. "That feeling is what we want for our residents, and it's evident here today."

The project also highlighted collaboration among public agencies, nonprofits and private businesses. Platinum sponsors included Almond Orchard Dental Care, Atlas Disposal and Republic Services.

Leadership class member Dr.

Gabrielle Rasi of Almond Orchard Dental Care said the project addressed both civic pride and community well-being.

"It brings the city of Citrus Heights together to be involved in beautification, but also concerns about the health of our public," Rasi said. "That is why we had our AED placed, as well as our mural, to make our city feel proud of what we have in our community."

Kevin Huntzinger, district administrator for the Sunrise Recreation and Park District, said the mural has already transformed the atmosphere of the park.

"It changes the whole vibe of the park," Huntzinger said. "This mural is the first thing people will see when they come to the park, and that brings positivity."

James Ellis of the Sac Metro Fire District, who also participated in the leadership class, emphasized the importance of making AEDs accessible in outdoor public spaces.

"Every park, every youth athletic complex should have one of

these," Ellis said.

Local arts advocate Citrus Heights Arts founder Gigi Rayford, who helped coordinate the reception's art exhibit and assisted with the mural project, said public art projects often have impacts beyond aesthetics.

"Art makes people happy," Rayford said. "It builds community morale and civic pride. The children absolutely love it, and it brings unity."

Rayford added that public art

can also encourage positive activity in shared spaces.

"We've seen with other murals that there hasn't been defacing," she said. "The beauty of the art deters people from bad activities."

Looking ahead, Rayford said Citrus Heights Arts is preparing for another community mural project scheduled for June and encouraged residents to support the effort through donations and volunteer work. Information about participating is available through

the organization's website and social media pages.

Proceeds from the evening's silent auction and fundraising activities will be donated back into future community projects and initiatives in Citrus Heights.

a hearty lunch.

Several felled trees on the property were recently cut and split by a member as part of a firewood fundraiser, she said. A large pile of fresh firewood was organized and made ready for public distribution.

"We really appreciate all of your help today," said Michelle Grant, center manager and the daughter of a Korean War era U.S. Navy veteran, to Big Day of Service volunteers who gathered for lunch.

Grant succeeded the center's co-founder, the late Jeanne Rounsavell, who served as center president for many years before her passing in 2025.

Grant brought her late father to many of the center's events before she became involved as its event coordinator. She oversees day-to-day operations of Veterans Community Center as its general manager and it's a role she greatly enjoys.

"We have a wonderful group of volunteers and staff who help continue to make the Veterans Community Center a welcoming place in the local community," she said.

Jean Rounsavell helped found the nonprofit Veterans Community Center in 2013 with her late husband, Jim Rounsavell, with the goal of creating a place where all veterans could feel welcome and supported. Jim Rounsavell died in 2021.

Last year's Veterans Day observance at the historic center at 6921 Sylvan Road was the first without Jeanne Rounsavell, who died on her birthday last August at age 86.

The Veterans Community Center was originally built in 1862 and opened as Sylvan School before serving as a community center for more than 40 years. Historical photos and artifacts on display remind visitors of that rich past heritage.

Acquired by the couple in 2013, the center, which has yellow paint and a rooftop cupola acknowledging the schoolhouse it once was, has become a place for veterans of all military branches in the community to gather among their peers.

The center serves up to 150 veterans each month by providing meals twice a week. In addition, veterans and their guests are welcome to use the center's recreational amenities and educational resources during weekday hours, said facilities manager Vince Robles.

On August 22, the center will host an annual Hawaiian-themed luau dinner event with tickets to go on sale in early June. Live musical entertainment will include a tribute performance honoring the legendary "King of Rock and Roll," Elvis Presley.

"The center recently hosted a very successful annual spaghetti dinner fundraiser in early May to benefit our ongoing veteran's programs," Grant said. "In all, we served over 55 guests."

Grant took time to especially recognize Gino Bartucco, a Vietnam-era veteran for his enthusiastic Italian spirit in providing fresh flowers in honor of Mother's Day for the dinner event and coordinating live entertainment which featured the duet of Carlo Solivan and Louie Lodi who provided musical entertainment. Volunteers of the Sunrise Christian Food Bank also generously donated food to the meal which featured spaghetti, ravioli, salad and garlic bread to guests.

The Veterans Community Center also provides a "Safe Room" center for all military veterans, particularly seniors, disabled and those who suffer with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), providing emotional and physiological benefits through socialization, activity, counseling and recreational therapies.

On Saturday, an adjacent vacant parking lot was used by the nearby Veterans Community Center with consent for overflow parking during the recent Big Day of Service (BDOS) special event.

A preliminary site plan to split two vacant lots on that lot for the purpose of constructing two duplex residential units on 6941 Sylvan Road next door to the Veterans Community Center is under review by the Citrus Heights Planning Department.

Grant said the owner is continuing to work with the Veterans Community Center concerning his plans for the parcel.

The Veterans Community Center is open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Brunch and lunch alternate on Wednesdays. The center serves lunch to veterans on Tuesdays and Thursdays for a suggested donation from 11 to 11:30 a.m. The center will be closed on Thanksgiving Day.

# From Citrus Heights to Europe

## Sail the Danube River

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - What if your next vacation didn't require juggling hotel bookings, train schedules or even figuring out what to do each day, but instead simply involved stepping aboard a ship and letting Europe come to you?

That is the idea behind a new eight-day Danube River cruise being offered through a partnership between Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce and Rancho Cordova-based travel agency The Poodle Booked It Travel Agency.

The cruise, scheduled for April 11-18, 2027, will travel through Austria, Hungary and Slovakia, with stops in cities along the Danube River. Prices start at \$2,699 per person and include accommodation, all meals on board, excursions in each port and most beverages. A chamber promotional code also offers a \$350 off for bookings made in May 2026 and \$500 off air.

Only 178 passengers will be on board, with 20 rooms set aside for the group.

Travel advisor Sydney Schellinger, who founded The Poodle Booked It in 2019, said river cruising tends to surprise first-time travelers in a good way.

"With a river cruise, you don't have the stress of trying to get from one place to another," Schellinger said. "Those pieces are taken care of for you. You get to explore a destination without feeling like you're on your own."

Schellinger said the partnership with the Citrus Heights chamber grew out of her involvement with the organization and a desire to create shared travel experiences for local residents.

"I've been part of the chamber for over a year now," Schellinger said. "We started thinking about how we can elevate what

the chamber is doing. This is a fun way to explore another part of the world with your neighbors and learn about different cultures."

The trip is open to travelers beyond Citrus Heights and the Chamber of Commerce. Schellinger said the group setting offers a sense of familiarity for those hesitant to travel internationally.

"It's ideal for people who want to experience Europe but are nervous to go by themselves," she said. "You're not traveling alone. You're meeting people from the Sacramento region who have similar interests."

At the same time, she said river cruising allows for flexibility. Passengers are not required to stay together for all activities, and excursions often vary by interest level and activity.

"It's designed so people can choose what fits them best. That's part of what makes river cruising special," Schellinger said.

The itinerary includes stops where ships typically dock near city centers, reducing the need for long transfers between ports and attractions. Schellinger said that convenience is one of the biggest advantages for travelers who want to maximize time exploring.

Schellinger, who named her agency after her poodle Winsten, said her approach to travel planning is personal and hands-on.

"I want to learn what the perfect vacation is for each client," she said. "From the time you leave to the time you get back, you don't have to worry. You can just enjoy it."

A cruise night will be held May 27 at 5:30 p.m. at R Vida Cantina, 7040 Sunrise Blvd., featuring an in-person informational session. ★

**CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)** - A young boy, holding a large steering wheel in both his small hands, his feet far from reaching the pedals, excitedly sat in the high cab of a Republic Services garbage collection truck.

One day, he too may help build the future of public works as so many whom have proudly gone before him.

The City of Citrus Heights held its fourth annual free, family-friendly "Tools of the Trade" event on Thursday afternoon, May 14 in Van Maren Park highlighting civil service careers, heavy equipment and the essential public works activities which keeps the city running.

There were plenty of colorful informative booths to visit, placed side-by-side along the length of Thalia Drive by participating sponsors of the event inviting event guests to stop by and meet with individual representatives of area trade schools and public utilities who described a variety of current job openings in office and field careers.

Free shaved ice and kettle popcorn were popular treats for many as they enjoyed the afternoon sunshine.

City staff and members of the Citrus Heights Public Works Department described current professional openings and a range of engineering projects now taking place across the city. Private companies also invited job seekers to discuss their career and education goals and provide a resume if they brought one.

The Tools of the Trade event also provided hands-on equipment demonstrations and an opportunity to talk to and meet some of the trained operators who make specialized heavy equipment move and do some very remarkable work.

There was plenty of time for children to put on a hard hat and then sit in the driver's seat of some of the featured gear all

while under their parent's watchful eye. At the end of Thalia Drive, a large American flag gently waved in the breeze suspended by an overhead crane.

Some affectionate "four legged" workers which provided by representatives of the G.O.A.T. (Greatest of All Time Yoga) in Herald returned this year to a mini petting zoo to remind the public that these adorable munching machines are continuing to be busy grooming overgrown vegetation at various locations throughout the city.

Representatives of the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA), the San Juan Unified School District Office of Adult Education, Sacramento State University and the American River College provided helpful information for those seeking to finished their high school diploma or GED or wishing to enroll in professional certificate programs.

Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) representatives also offered information describing student internship and hourly opportunities. SMUD offers multiple career paths in its innovation and technology department, ranging from a science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) student assistant to director positions.

Representatives of the Sunrise Recreation and Parks District were on hand to share information and distribute flyers describing current summer programs and activities.

# UC Davis Men's Golf Trio Earns All-Big West Recognition

**DAVIS, CA (MPG)** - Three UC Davis men's golfers earned 2025-26 All-Big West recognition, the conference announced May 12. Sophomore Lequan Wang was named to the All-Big West Second Team, while juniors Curtis Da Silva and Ryan Firpo each received Honorable Mention.

Wang, a sophomore from San Mateo, CA, posted the lowest scoring average among the Aggies (71.7) across 32 rounds and closed the regular season ranked No. 362 nationally per Clippd, the highest mark on the UC Davis roster. The Aragon High School graduate recorded two top three individual finishes, taking third at the Bridgestone Collegiate Invitational at 15-under 201 (with 19 birdies, second-most in the tournament) and third at the home El Macero Classic at 4-under 212.

Wang closed fall play with a tie for fourth at the Marquette Intercollegiate after a 3-under second-round 69 and opened The Prestige in a tie for second after a 3-under 68 before the third round was canceled by high winds. He played in all 11 stroke-play events for the Aggies during the regular season after earning All-Big West Honorable Mention as a freshman in 2024-25.

Da Silva, a junior from Monterey CA, earned Honorable Mention after competing in all 11 stroke-play events and posting a 72.9 scoring average across

32 rounds. The Robert Louis Stevenson School graduate opened the season with his first career top 10 by finishing 10th at the Ram Masters Invitational at even-par 210, including a 4-under second-round 66 at Fort Collins Country Club. Da Silva fired 70-68-69 at the Amer Ari Invitational at Mauna Lani Resort to take a tie for 38th at 9-under 207 (the only Aggie under par for the event, with three sub-par rounds) and closed the regular season with a 14th-place finish at 1-under 215 at the 2026 Big West Men's Golf Championship at La Quinta Country Club, one of just

two Aggies under par at the conference event. He also led UC Davis on Day 1 of The Goodwin at Stanford with a 1-under 69.

Firpo, a junior from Davis, CA, received Honorable Mention in his first season at his hometown school. The Davis Senior High School graduate transferred to UC Davis from Fresno State, where he was named the 2023-24 Mountain West Freshman of the Year as a Bulldog. Firpo led the Aggies at the home El Macero Classic with a tie for 30th at 7-over 223, the same event at which he posted a sixth-place finish as a Fresno State freshman in 2024. He paced UC

Davis at the Windon Memorial Classic with a tie for 55th and an even-par 72 in the final round, opened the spring with a 6-under 66 in round one of the Amer Ari Invitational, and closed at a tie for 35th at the R.E. Lamkin Invitational with a final-round 72 across 10 starts and 28 rounds.

Long Beach State's Alejandro de Castro Piera was named the conference's Golfer of the Year and Cal Poly freshman Rafael Bobo-Lloret was tabbed Freshman of the Year. Long Beach State's Rob Murray earned Coach of the Year honors after leading the 49ers

to a record-setting Big West Championship at La Quinta Country Club. Long Beach State placed five golfers on the All-Big West First Team, joined by UC San Diego's Davis McDowell.

The trio of selections capped a 2025-26 campaign that featured the program's first individual victory since 2023, sophomore Louis Grizot's Silver Title at the Gene Miranda Falcon Invitational, and a 3.43 team GPA in the Winter 2026 academic quarter that set a UC Davis men's golf program record and stood as the highest among all UC Davis men's programs. ★

If we are unable to confirm that your signature on your pink Vote by Mail return envelope matches your signature on file, we will contact you to ensure your ballot is counted.

California law allows you the opportunity to correct your signature on your pink Vote by Mail return envelope up until two days before the election is certified.

To correct your signature, you may: print, complete, and return a Signature Verification Statement at VRE or any Vote Center; resolve your signature using My Voter Portal (MVP); or complete and return the letter we sent you using the postage-paid envelope.

Without your signature, your ballot will not be counted.

#### What Happens After Election Day?

Did you know? Depending on the type of election, we have between 28 and 30 days to certify the election. After the polls close at 8 p.m. on Election Day, the work continues as we diligently process, verify and ensure all eligible ballots are counted. Accuracy takes time.

#### The Official Canvass: Division 15, Chapter 4.

In this phase we audit and account for all ballots that were issued, voted, and those that were not used. This phase includes, but is not limited to, the following tasks:

Reconcile the number of ballots counted, spoiled, canceled or invalidated due to identifying marks, over-votes, or as

otherwise provided by statute, with the number of votes recorded, including VBM and provisional ballots, by the vote counting system.

Process and count any valid VBM ballots not included in the semi-final election results. These VBM ballots are returned on Election Day to our office, at a Vote Center, to an Official Ballot Drop Box location or timely via USPS.

Receive, confirm, and process Signature Verification Statements.

Count any valid write-in votes. Duplicate any damaged ballots, if necessary.

Reporting final results to the governing board and the Secretary of State, as required.

#### Conduct the 1% Manual Tally: Division 15, Chapter 4, Article 5.

The 1% manual tally process

validates the tabulation of ballots generated by the electronic voting equipment before certifying election results. Precincts utilized for the 1% manual tally are selected at random by the elections official. For each contest not included in the 1% manual tally, an additional voting precinct with that contest will be selected and tallied. Coming Soon.

#### Process Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) ballots: California Code of Regulation. Title 2, Division 7, Chapter 1, Article 3.5.

CVR extends the existing 15-day registration deadline in California to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote provisionally 14 days prior to an election through Election Day. Voters that are not registered must be processed using CVR.

#### Certify the Election: Division

#### 15, Chapter 4, Article 6; Division 17.

Once the Official Canvass is complete, we will sign a certificate to certify the election results.

Election materials shall be sealed and retained for 22 months from the date of the election for federal elections and six months from the date of the election for local elections.

#### Recounts: California Code of Regulation. Title 2, Division 7, Chapter 8.

## Newsom's Tightfisted Final Budget Faces a Rough Reception in the Legislature

Since the turn of the century, California's state budget has been plagued by a boom-and-bust syndrome rooted in its lopsided revenue system and a lack of political discipline.

The budget became increasingly dependent on taxes paid by the state's most affluent residents, whose incomes increasingly came from investments rather than salaries.

Thus state revenues would often spike upwards, only to level off or decline. But governors and legislators would make new spending commitments during the spikes that would become liabilities during the downturns.

It was dubbed "volatility" and it reached an apex four years ago when Gov. Gavin Newsom declared that the state had a \$97.5 billion surplus, having decided that a post-pandemic revenue spike would be permanent.

His administration later acknowledged a \$165 billion error in a four-year revenue projection. But in the meantime he and the Legislature had raised spending, creating deficits that totaled \$125 billion over four years, according to the Legislative Analyst Office. The deficits were papered over with a series of short-term fixes, including loans and accounting gimmicks.

On Thursday, Newsom

unveiled a revised version of his final budget and, without saying so, indicated he had learned a hard lesson about managing volatility.

Although the state is seeing a new tax spike and his budget sees a \$16.5 billion increase in revenues over three years, Newsom's \$349.4 billion 2026-27 budget takes a cautious approach. He says it would not only erase the structural deficit of the past four years, but it would guarantee that his successor would have a balanced first year budget for 2027-28.

"We're cutting deficits but not cutting corners," Newsom said.

The \$246.6 billion general fund portion of the budget relies not only on new revenues, including a \$3.6 billion boost from several relatively minor tax increases, to be balanced, but it is indirectly helped by big reductions in federal aid for healthcare.

Newsom devoted the first minutes of his budget presentation to bragging about California's \$4-trillion-plus economy, saying "we simply have no peers." He also trolled those with "California derangement syndrome" and denounced President Donald Trump as corrupt and incompetent.

However Trump's tightened eligibility for federally subsidized healthcare that could affect hundreds of thousands of Californians also has the effect of reducing the state's healthcare spending, thus helping Newsom draft a balanced budget.

He could have backfilled the lost federal funds, but that probably would have required him to propose a major tax increase of some

kind, which, as a likely 2028 presidential candidate, he is unwilling to do.

However his attitude on healthcare and taxes places Newsom at odds with advocates for poor Californians who would be affected and their allies in the Legislature, many of whom want a tax increase.

Graham Knaus, CEO of the California State Association of Counties, immediately declared that "the governor is proposing to do to counties what he accuses the president of doing to California."

Chris Hoene, of the left-leaning California Budget & Policy Center, which has been beating the drums for tax increases, said, "The governor promoted California's economic dominance while, in the same breath, making it more difficult for Californians with low incomes to access healthcare by reinstating harmful Medi-Cal asset limits, expanding work requirements and increasing Medi-Cal premiums for certain immigrants."

With just a few months remaining in his governorship, Newsom's ability to bend the Legislature to his will is fading, so the question his new budget poses is whether legislators will go along. Or will they insist that the new holes in the state's safety net be plugged and support raising taxes to pay for it?

## Social Security Matters

### Social Security's "First Year Rule" and Withdrawing from SS

Dear Rusty: I am 63 years old, and about to apply for my Social Security benefits. I am self-employed but only working part time. I know about Social Security's annual earnings limit but recently I learned I must also be concerned about a monthly earnings limit of \$2,040. My questions are:

1) How do I find out if I will be subject to a monthly earning limit of \$2,040 per month? I thought it was only evaluated annually.

2) If I choose to cancel Social Security within the first year or after, what are the penalties? Would I have to pay them back for the whole amount for the whole time that they paid me? Which makes no sense, since I have been paid into SS since I was 13 years old.

Can you help me understand this? Signed: Claiming Early and Still Working

Dear Claiming Early: It can get tricky if you are still working after claiming your Social Security before your SS full retirement age (FRA), especially during your first year collecting. I'm happy to answer your specific questions:

1. There is a special rule which applies during your first year collecting early Social

Security benefits (e.g., before your full retirement age or "FRA," which for you is age 67). What will happen is this: when the IRS provides SSA with your 2026 earnings (in 2027), SSA will review to see if your total 2026 net earnings from self-employment exceeded the 2026 annual limit of \$24,480. If not, no further action is necessary. But if you did exceed the full year 2026 earnings limit, SSA will contact you and ask you to provide them with details about your monthly 2026 net earnings. If you have exceeded the monthly limit in any 2026 month after your SS benefit started, you will not be entitled to SS benefits for that month. Essentially, if you have exceeded the annual limit, you cannot exceed the monthly earnings limit in any remaining month during your first year of collecting. If you exceeded the annual limit, and also any monthly limit, SSA will send you an overpayment notice saying you must repay them for the benefits you were not entitled to receive because you exceeded the monthly earnings limit.

2. You can, within 12 months of applying for Social Security, ask SSA to withdraw your application for SS retirement benefits. They will do that for you, but you will also be required to repay them all SS benefits that they have already paid to (or for) you. This essentially would "wipe the slate clean" and enable your SS benefit to continue growing, allowing you to apply for a larger monthly benefit later. But if you wait longer than 12 months after you first

apply for SS benefits, you can no longer withdraw your application for Social Security. Thereafter, you would be subject to the annual earnings limit (the monthly earnings limit would no longer apply).

FYI, after you reach your FRA, there is no limit on your earnings, and you could choose to suspend your benefit payments and earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) to get a higher monthly benefit. Also at your FRA, if SSA withheld any of your benefits because you exceeded the earnings limit before reaching your FRA, you would get time credit for the number of months your benefits were withheld. Essentially, they would advance your benefit-start month by the number of months your benefits were withheld, yielding a slightly higher monthly amount after your FRA.

Finally, it's important to know that the contributions you made to Social Security from payroll taxes (FICA/SECA) over your lifetime are not what determines your monthly SS benefit amount. Your monthly SS benefit is based on two main factors: a) your average monthly earnings (indexed for inflation) for the highest earning 35 years over your lifetime as reported to the IRS, and b) the age at which you claim your SS benefits. Your contributions to Social Security while working only provide you with eligibility to collect SS benefits; the contributions aren't put into a separate account for you and are not used to calculate your monthly SS benefit. ★

ly, since time is of the essence. With the state's scheduled May 16 primaries rapidly approaching (now delayed), Louisiana wants to redraw its maps in keeping with the court's decision.

Jackson's dissent quotes a 2019 decision of the court in *Rucho v. Common Cause* for the proposition that courts should not "risk assuming political ... responsibility for a [partisan map-drawing] process that often produces ill will and distrust."

But this was a warning against courts involving themselves in minute questions of partisan gerrymandering. Here, the court has set out a bright-line principle that district lines can't be race-based, but otherwise said that the political authorities are welcome to gerrymander or not.

Jackson also slaps the court for creating "chaos in the State of Louisiana." This is quite rich given the history.

When Louisiana created a congressional map after the 2020 census with just one majority-minority district, it got sued for not sufficiently taking race into account; a judge ordered it to make a second minority district. When Louisiana complied by manufacturing a monstrosity of a district stretching 250 miles to randomly scoop up black voters, it got sued again -- this time, for taking race too much into account -- and the case made it to the Supreme Court.

It is a sign of how weak the Jackson dissent is that the other progressives haven't joined it, not even Sonia Sotomayor. It certainly would have been

much better if this case had been decided sooner, but Alito drops a suggestive footnote in his rejoinder to Jackson. He notes that the constitutional question was "argued and conferred nearly seven months ago." This implies that the case was effectively decided right after oral arguments in October of last year, and that the dissenters slow-walked it.

Now, Jackson wants more delay -- it serves the partisan interests of Democrats to preserve unconstitutional race-based congressional districts as long as possible.

The reaction to Louisiana v. Callais has been so incandescent on the Left because it believes that unless black voters have black representatives, they are disenfranchised. But this is not how representative democracy works. Were white voters in Georgia disenfranchised in the 2022 Senate race when two African-American candidates, Democrat Raphael Warnock and Republican Herschel Walker, ran against each other? Were the voting rights of Christians in New York City crimped in 2025 because a Muslim man won the mayoral election?

All indications are that a commitment to some version of court-packing will be orthodoxy among 2028 Democratic presidential candidates. They will seek to make the highly isolated and wholly unpersuasive Justice Jackson part of a new court majority imposed by political fiat.

## Remember

It's a special day we all need to remember. It's Memorial Day, a day that gives us pause to honor those men and women who have given their lives for us so that we can have the freedoms that we sometimes take for granted. It was a great price to pay and one we should never forget. It is for military personnel who died serving the United States, and is celebrated on the last Monday of May. It was initially known as Decoration Day. The name refers to the tradition of adding ornaments to the final resting place of fallen soldiers like flags and flower in national cemeteries. People sometimes confuse this day with Veteran's Day which celebrates everyone, including survivors.

Honoring soldiers who died in battle is an ancient practice. Thousands of years ago, Greeks remembered the fallen in annual festivals and decorated graves with flowers. It was 1882 when the term **Memorial Day** first came about. This name became more common than Decoration Day after the Second World War. Federal law made it official in 1967. Actually, the end of May is not a random choice. Historians think it is a strategic date that ensures flowers across the country are in full bloom.

According to estimates, about 655,000 Americans died throughout the Civil War. The 4-year war claimed the lives of almost 700,000 soldiers. It is by far the highest casualty count for any war in American history, even surpassing the death tolls of World War I or World War II. National cemeteries

became the resting place of Union soldiers, and other cemeteries sprung up across the country. It was a grieving nation who wanted to remember the ones they lost. The first celebration was in Boalsburg Pennsylvania. They decorated their cemetery as early as October of 1864. Carbonate Illinois and Petersburg Virginia were also pioneers in this endeavor. In 1866, it was four women who honored the fallen of the Union and Confederate in Columbus Mississippi. After the deadliest battle of the Civil War President Lincoln praised the sacrifices made in the name of equality. Commemoration became even more widespread following his assassination.

The National Moment of Remembrance was created in the year 2000 after a survey revealed that only 28% of Americans knew the essence of **Memorial Day**. Even more, the younger generation mostly believed it was the reopening of parks and swim-

ming pools. That fact really disturbed me. Please take a moment on this important day to share with your family and friends what this day really means and how important it is that we remember. And I urge all Americans to observe a moment of silence, local time 3 PM, on Memorial Day. This one minute pause aims to honor those who have died to give us the parades, picnics and celebration we can enjoy every day. Perhaps sharing this story will help those younger to understand what an important day it is for us all! **GOD BLESS ALL THOSE SOULS FOR THEIR SACRIFICES.** ★

# Council Approves Trail Expansions and New Roundabouts

location for a roundabout.

Councilmember Jayna Karpinski-Costa asked whether the traffic study considered the traffic volume at that location. Kempenaar said it was included in the traffic model. He agreed "there is a little bit of learning curve" for drivers who are unfamiliar with roundabouts, but the city will conduct outreach to help educate the public. Roundabouts are becoming more common throughout the region, so by the time this one is built, he expects more drivers will be familiar with them.

Councilmember Tim Schaefer agreed that drivers just need more exposure to roundabouts.

Mayor MariJane Lopez-Taff

said the roundabout will benefit the neighborhood by slowing speeds and encouraging drivers to exercise more caution on the road.

The council voted unanimously to approve the project and all amendments.

Next, they considered an updated agreement with Verra Mobility for red-light photo enforcement, as the current agreement expires this year.

Citrus Heights Police Chief Alex Turcotte said the program was implemented in 2008, and there are currently red light cameras at eight intersections throughout the city: Antelope Road/Garden Gate Drive, Auburn Boulevard/Antelope Road, Greenback Lane/Fountain

Square Drive, Greenback Lane/San Juan Avenue, Greenback Lane/Auburn Boulevard (two approaches), Greenback Lane/Sunrise Boulevard, Greenback Lane/Park Oaks Drive and Sunrise Boulevard/Oak Avenue (two approaches).

Chief Turcotte said citation data from 2025 show 17% of red violations were from Citrus Heights residents, down from 18% in 2024. So, many violations are not committed by residents, which Turcotte attributed to the department's efforts to educate the public about the program. He also presented statistics indicating that collisions at the monitored intersections have decreased since the photo enforcement program began.

The program is cost neutral, with revenue from violations covering the cost of the contract, which is approximately \$521,963 annually.

The council voted unanimously to approve a three-year agreement with Verra Mobility for the continued operation, maintenance and administration of the red-light camera enforcement program.

Finally, the council considered granting funds to the nonprofit Citrus Heights Art for the installation of a mural at City Hall to celebrate the United States' 250th anniversary. An allocation of \$6,000 from the city's Community Support Grant would cover much of the \$8,000 mural cost, with Citrus Heights

Art fundraising to cover the remainder.

Citrus Heights Art would release mural concepts through social media so residents can vote for their favorite. The goal is to begin the mural early in June so it can be completed before the city's Stars and Stripes Celebration on June 28.

Councilmember Schaefer suggested the council should have input on the final concept, and the consensus was for the final design to come back to council for review before installation begins. The council voted unanimously to approve the mural funding.

The next meeting of the Citrus Heights City Council is scheduled for May 27. ★
