## ZipPass Mobile Fare App Ending June 15

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) is reminding riders that the ZipPass mobile fare-payment app will officially be discontinued on Monday, June 15. Riders who currently use ZipPass should transition to Transit Connect, SacRT's new mobile ticketing app that will serve as the region's standard fare-payment platform.

Transit Connect offers an easier, more secure experience for purchasing, storing, and activating SacRT tickets and passes. Riders can download Transit Connect today on both Apple and Android devices.

SacRT encourages all riders to download the Transit Connect app as soon as possible to avoid any service disruptions.

### More Enhancements Coming This Fall

Transit Connect will continue to grow with new features arriving in fall 2026, including: contactless Tap2Ride validation; fare capping (never pay more than the daily maximum); and the ability to load cash onto your Transit Connect account at SacRT vending machines and participating retail locations.

### Connect Card Users Will Start Transition in Fall 2026

Riders who currently use the Connect Card will continue using it as usual. The transition for Connect Card customers to Transit Connect is scheduled to start in fall 2026.

Until then, the Connect Card continues to be valid for fare payment system-wide, and no action is required from Connect Card riders at this time.

### Discount Fare Riders: Fast and Easy Setup

Seniors, students, veterans and riders with disabilities can activate their discount fare eligibility directly in the Transit Connect app. Riders simply select their discount category during setup to unlock reduced pricing on single ride, daily and monthly passes.

### Building a Seamless Regional Fare Experience

Transit Connect is being developed in partnership with regional transit providers and will support a fully integrated fare system for riders across the Sacramento region by fall 2026.

## Harris Industrial Gases Celebrates 90 Years

On Saturday, May 18, Kathleen Harris, 76, president of Harris Industrial Gases donned her protective glasses, put on her leather welding gloves and honored her grandfather Harold A. Harris' legacy by lighting a cutting torch to slice a commemorative chain link celebrating the firm's 90th year in business in Citrus Heights.

Harris stood between a length of chain which was suspended between two blue welding tanks with the years 1936 and 2026 each stenciled on them in front of their corporate headquarters at 8475 Auburn Ave., near Interstate 80 in Citrus Heights.

The anniversary ceremony was attended by Citrus Heights city officials, local elected representatives and members of the Citrus Heights

Chamber of Commerce who joined Harris in commemorating the original 1936 grand opening ceremony.

In 1936, Harold A.

Harris opened Harris Welding, and for over 80 years Harris Industrial Gases has remained in the family, owned and operated through four

generations – never moved, never sold.

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Volunteers participating in the recent Big Day of Service (BDOS) joined with staff members of Sunrise MarketPlace to help paint a colorful new mural along an exterior wall of the Pet Food Express building located at 6177 Sunrise Blvd.

The new mural designed by artist Sharon L. Norton continues the floral pattern of a previously completed work on an exterior wall which faces Sunrise Boulevard.

In the ground-level scene against a blue backdrop, a bluebird perches gently on top of a yellow sunflower, while a puppy with floppy ears and a button nose admires a butterfly landing on a rose.

The middle portion of the panel invites the viewer to look up into the orange petals of blooming California poppies.

At the end of the panel, an inquisitive cat places its nose against the petal of a tulip, captivated by the scent.

"We were honored to work alongside Sharon and an amazing group of volunteers to bring this beautiful new mural to life at the Marketplace at Birdcage," said Kathilynn Carpenter, its executive director. Carpenter was a Big Day of Service project lead for the mural and helped pay for materials necessary to complete the project.

Just before the day of the Big Day of Service event, Norton created a guide outline pattern which would help the volunteers paint just the right color needed.

Over the years, Norton's works have ranged from commissioned portrait paintings of friends, family and pets to California

landscapes.

With a vibrant pop-art style, her artwork is a lively display of favorite subjects. Norton has had a passion for art since she was a young girl growing up in Woodland, according to her artists' biography. Her preferred mediums are oil, acrylic and watercolor.

Norton also earned a multimedia degree from ITT Institute and has attended Sacramento City College and Cal State Summer School for the Arts.

Pet Food Express in the Sunrise MarketPlace opened in July 2023. Located in front of the Walmart grocery store and just adjacent to the Lowe's Home Improvement Center, Pet Food Express was once the location of a Men's Wearhouse clothing store.

# Citrus Heights Serves: Safe Neighborhoods Start with Neighbors

Dear Citrus Heights Community,

As I continue my monthly series highlighting service in Citrus Heights, this month I want to focus on a form of service that happens right outside our front doors: being engaged in your neighborhood. Strong, connected neighborhoods are one of the most effective tools we have for building a safer community, and that starts with neighbors who know, trust, and look out for one another.

Since before the City's incorporation in 1997, Neighborhood Areas have helped connect residents, strengthen community pride, and create opportunities for neighbors to work together to improve the places they call home. Today, Citrus Heights is divided into 11 Neighborhood Areas represented by eight neighborhood organizations. Unlike a homeowners' association, there are no dues to pay and no requirement to own a home. Anyone who lives, works, or owns property in Citrus Heights can get involved.

meetings provide an opportunity for residents to connect with one another, discuss local priorities, collaborate on shared goals, learn about City projects and programs, and engage directly with City staff. Representatives from the Citrus Heights Police Department's Problem Oriented Policing (POP) Team also regularly attend meetings to share updates, answer questions, and collaborate with residents on neighborhood concerns. These partnerships help strengthen communication, build trust, and ensure residents have a voice in shaping their community.

The impact of these groups can be seen throughout Citrus Heights through movie nights in the park, beautification projects, service activities, clean-up efforts, and other neighborhood-led initiatives that bring people together and strengthen community pride. Just as importantly, these efforts help build relationships that make neighborhoods stronger and more resilient. Neighborhood involvement also plays an important role in public safety. Connected neighbors look out for one another, share information, and help identify concerns before they become larger problems. Some of the most effective crime prevention tools are the relationships between neighbors who know and care about one another.

One of the best examples of neighborhood engagement in action is National Night Out, taking place

this year on Tuesday, Aug. 4. Organized by neighborhood volunteers across the city, these gatherings bring residents together with law enforcement, firefighters, and first responders in a fun and informal setting. National Night Out helps strengthen relationships, build trust, and reinforce the shared responsibility we all have in keeping our neighborhoods safe and welcoming.

As event details are finalized, I encourage residents to follow the City of Citrus Heights on social media and subscribe to the City's e-newsletter to stay informed about National Night Out celebrations happening throughout the community and find an event near you.

If you are not sure which Neighborhood Area you belong to, visit the Neighborhood Areas map on the City's website to find your neighborhood organization, learn about upcoming meetings and events, and discover opportunities to get involved.

Thank you to the neighborhood leaders, volunteers, public safety professionals, City staff, and residents who continue to strengthen Citrus Heights one relationship at a time. Together, we are building a community where service starts with being a good neighbor and where safe neighborhoods begin with connected neighbors.

# Harris Industrial Gases Celebrates 90 Years

raffle of complete welding packages, equipment and tools which helped benefit two charities, Gold Country Wildlife Rescue and Single Mom Strong

Much has changed at Harris Industrial Gases since 1936 when the firm was founded. The rural community of Sylvan has been incorporated into the city of Citrus Heights.

The drive-in movie theater which used to be located behind the shop where Kathleen Harris used to watch the latest Hollywood releases during hot summers as a young girl in the back of her Chevy pickup truck is long gone.

Eminent domain has shrunk the firm's business footprint since the widening of Auburn Boulevard from a two-lane gravel road. The city's current two-year Auburn Boulevard Phase 2 construction is nearing completion, adding new sidewalk to the front entrance to the facility. The original parking lot was recently repaved.

Harold Harris, a U.S. Army welder in World War I, first worked on the original San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge, and moved his family north to Fair Oaks for a new start after losing everything during the Great Depression.

Harris Industrial Gases began when Harold Harris and Elmer Denman first established the fabrication and repair shop known as Harris Welding.

"Although squarely in the Auburn Boulevard business district, the location was so remote back then that the address printed on their calendars was 'one mile south of Roseville on U.S. 40,'" she said.

As the need for welding services diminished, the company switched to retail sales and became Harris Welding Supply, and finally Harris Industrial Gases, in 1995.

Katherine Harris remembers her grandfather fondly and the family business he created.

She honors Harold's legacy and his tradition of providing quality personal customer service to the firm's long-term clientele.

"The values that Harold held dear are very important to me," she said. She remains just as dedicated to maintaining the same sound business practices and personal, down-home customer service that Harold Harris first established in 1936.

"Our business is family," she said, and there's no shortage of family and non-family members involved in day-to-day business activities at Harris Industrial Gases, some of whom have been with the firm for years.

Visitors to Harris' office are quick to notice a favorite "Girl Boss" she displays on her desk in her modest office just off the sales floor and not far from the main customer service counter.

"Mainly we're proud that my grandfather Harold passed the business to his son, Kent, who, via my mother, has passed it down to the rest of the family," Harris said in an earlier interview. She's been at the helm of daily operations since 1978 and remembers first coming into the shop in 1960

when she was 10 years old.

"I honestly love what I do," she said. "Why would I do anything else?"

Today Harris Industrial Gases is the largest independent provider of industrial gases and welding supplies in the Sacramento Valley and surrounding areas.

The company carries top welding supplies and equipment, and supplies many industrial, medical and specialty gases to hundreds of businesses all over Northern California and has four locations, two in California and two in Nevada, one of which serves Tesla's automotive assembly plant with its complete line of welding product and gases, she said.

The original building on Auburn Boulevard in Citrus Heights serves as corporate headquarters, housing the administrative offices, general accounting department, warehouse, fleet center and an on-site compressed gas fill plant.

Customers arrive daily at the front counter to purchase supplies, fill tanks and purchase a wide range of welding gear in inventory.

"The experience of working for Harris Industrial Gases is essential to grasping both the company's lasting legacy and its future," said its general manager Jeremy Lawson who summarized what his own 20-year career with Harris Industrial Gases personally means to him.

"The Harris family's legacy goes far beyond the surface of

a successful 90-year-old family business where integrity and handshakes still matter. Those values are real, but underneath them is something even more important, the way relationships, hard work, and loyalty are genuinely valued here," he said.

"Employees are treated as extensions of the Harris family rather than numbers. Whether celebrating weddings and newborns or supporting employees through difficult seasons and loss, the family has always been there beside the employees," Lawson said.

"Having now worked alongside three generations of the Harris family, and watching the fourth generation being raised, I can honestly say their values, dedication to people, and commitment to relationships have remained remarkably consistent, and are just as important today as they have ever been," he said.

Clientele continues to span the business spectrum, ranging from CalTrans and California State Prisons to municipalities, utilities, construction, scientific research facilities, welding shops, welding programs in local schools and colleges and small family businesses in the greater Sacramento and Reno Sparks areas. The business also offers student and veteran discounts on most welding supplies.

Store inventory includes a complete line of welding supplies and safety equipment including goggles, gloves and helmets; tools, abrasives and chipping hammers; safety glasses and face protection; protective leather clothing, fire resistant cloth and welding curtains and brass fitting and gas apparatus.

"We have just about everything that a professional or an amateur welder could ever need," Harris said.

"We're keeping my grandfather's tradition of friendly service and knowing our customers by first name alive and well. Honestly, we plan on being around another 80 years." ★

# Jordan Fisher Rated Nation's 8th Best Returning Running Back

**DAVIS, CA (MPG)** - Hero Sports has placed UC Davis football senior running back Jordan Fisher among the country's best backs, rating the Aggie tailback as the eighth-best returning running back in the Football Championship Subdivision as part of their 2026 FCS previews.

Fisher had a breakout year in 2025, breaking the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the first time in his career while earning Big Sky All-Conference honors. The Aggie senior racked up 1,121 rushing yards on 185 touches, adding eight rushing touchdowns on his way to totaling the 13th-most rushing yards in the nation and third most in the conference.

He also snagged 287 yards through the

air on 26 receptions, scoring three receiving touchdowns to end his season with 1,408 all-purpose yards and 11 total touchdowns. In the Hero Sports ranking, Fisher rates as fourth-best Big Sky running back with four-out-of-the-five conference backs sitting inside the top 10.

UC Davis opens 2026 fall camp on July 29 and will kick off the 2026 season on Aug. 29 in a Big Sky showdown at Portland State. The Aggies will open UC Davis Health Stadium on Sept. 19 when Stetson makes the cross-country trip to Davis. And on Oct. 3, ESPN2 visits Davis to showcase the 2026 homecoming game against Eastern Washington on national television.

Season tickets start as low as \$100 for new alumni (2017-26 UC Davis graduates) and \$140 for the general public. And fans can expect a large collection of perks that

include priority access to postseason tickets, select away games and parking. Van Hout becomes the fourth commitment for the Hornets leading up to the 2026-27 campaign, joining South Africa's Jessica Schilz, Italy's

first team selection, she became the first Milwaukee player to record 20-or-more wins in both singles and doubles in the same season since 2013-14, while her 21 singles wins stand tied for 10th on the program's single-season list.

After posting an 8-1 record in the fall, Van Hout opened her spring campaign with six consecutive wins splitting time between the No. 1 and No. 2 positions, then won her final four heading into the Horizon League Championship. IN doubles, she won four straight following a slow start, then ended the year by winning four of her last five, including a win in the conference tournament where the Panthers were the No. 2 seed.

Prior to her year at Milwaukee, Van Hout spent her freshman season at Marshall University in West Virginia where she was 5-2 in singles play and 16-4 in doubles — including a 6-2 mark against Sun Belt Conference opponents in the latter. She helped the Thundering Herd to a 20-6 overall team record and a runner-up finish at the conference tournament.

Van Hout attended Atlas College in Genk, Belgium, prior to beginning her collegiate career. ★

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Summer break is a time for fun, family and sunshine, but for many Sacramento County families, it can also mean higher grocery costs while children are out of school. That's why the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) is bringing back SUN Bucks, also known as Summer EBT, for summer 2026, and the Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance is here to help.

Eligible families can receive \$120 for each qualifying child to help buy groceries during the summer months when school meals may not be available.

SUN Bucks works like CalFresh food benefits and can be used to buy healthy foods such as fruits, vegetables, dairy products, meat and whole grains at grocery stores, farmers markets and other locations that accept EBT cards.

### Who qualifies for SUN Bucks?

Many children will automatically qualify for SUN Bucks in 2026, including children ages 6–18 who receive CalFresh, CalWORKs and/or Medi-Cal with a household income at or below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level, students approved for free or reduced-price school meals, and children identified by their school as migrant, homeless or foster youth.

Children attending schools participating

in the National School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program may also qualify.

### How do families receive benefits?

Eligible families do not need to apply if their child is automatically enrolled. A SUN Bucks EBT card will be mailed directly to the family for each eligible child.

Families who are not automatically enrolled can still apply by submitting a school meal application or Universal Benefits Application (UBA) through their child's school or district by Aug. 31.

Families are encouraged to make sure their mailing address is up to date with both their child's school and their local county social services office to avoid

delays in receiving benefits.

### Important reminders

SUN Bucks benefits expire 122 days after they are loaded onto the card, so families are encouraged to use their benefits promptly.

Families can manage their benefits using the free ebtEDGE mobile app or by visiting [ebt.ca.gov](http://ebt.ca.gov).

## California's Population is Stagnating as Immigration and Birth Rates Decline

California's population exploded during and immediately after World War II, from 6.9 million in 1940 to 19.9 million in 1970, thanks to waves of migrants from other states drawn to California's surging economy and the famous postwar baby boom.

California absorbed its 13 million new residents by expanding its public infrastructure of schools, colleges, highways, parks and water systems and by welcoming immense private investment in new housing, new retail complexes, new factories and new office buildings.

Population growth slowed in the 1970s in the aftermath of the baby boom and as an economic evolution, from manufacturing to technology and services, changed the job market. The leading politician of the decade, Gov. Jerry Brown, declared that California had entered "an era of limits" and major infrastructure expansion was no longer needed.

However, the 1980s saw a new population surge, driven by immigration from other countries and a new baby boom. California's population jumped by 6 million — 5-plus million of them babies — during the decade, a more than 25% gain.

The increase was so large, relative to the nation as a whole, that California was awarded seven new

congressional seats after the 1990 census.

Unlike California's expansive reaction to its postwar population increase, the 1980s boomlet sparked an adverse reaction in the 1990s, including new laws aimed at denying public services to undocumented immigrants and a power struggle within the Sierra Club over immigration's impact on the environment.

Meanwhile, population growth slowed again, and in this decade virtually halted as immigration and birth rates declined and substantial numbers of people left California, thanks largely to the state's sky-high living costs.

A recent study by researchers Hans Johnson, Julien LaFortune and Eric McGhee at the Public Policy Institute of California found that the total fertility rate has dropped from 2.21 children per woman in 2007 to 1.48 in 2023, far below what demographers call the "replacement level of 2.1 necessary to keep a population from declining."

The state lost a congressional seat after the 2020 census and is likely to lose several more after the 2030 census. However, the impacts of California's population plateau extend far beyond politics.

"A smaller population can offer benefits; it reduces pressure on housing and infrastructure needs," the researchers wrote, "easing congestion and reducing the need for expansive public works projects." They also cited potential improvements in the environment and increasing per pupil spending on education as enrollment declines.

"At the same time," they added, "fewer births — and a smaller population — may

bring challenges: they could accelerate K-12 enrollment declines and strain the state's economic and safety net systems as fewer workers support a larger share of older Californians. Labor shortages could also hinder California's economic development."

Those are all valid points and many more potential impacts could be mentioned. But the underlying issue is whether political policies will reflect the new demographic reality.

The post-World War II population explosion manifested itself in a bipartisan effort to do what was needed to make the transition relatively painless. We haven't seen such political adjustment to changing demographic trends since.

Meanwhile, the state's population is twice what it was in 1970 and we still depend on what politicians wrought in the post-war era — such things as the State Water Plan and our extensive freeway network.

A stagnant population eases pressure for new infrastructure but we still need to maintain what we have and expand it to meet current needs. However, water projects have languished and we no longer build new highways.

Jerry Brown, who proclaimed the "era of limits" in the 1970s, returned to the governorship in 2011 and declared, "I want to get shit done."

There's still much that should be done.

## Social Security Matters

### Why Can't I get a Lump Sum Death Benefit from my Wife?

**Dear Rusty:** My wife passed away in September 2025 at age 64. We had been married for 43 years and started collecting benefits when I turned 62 and she was 63. She did not have enough work credits to claim her own SS and thus collected on my record. SSA told me that I was not entitled to receive the lousy \$255 death benefit because my wife was collecting on my work record. Is this correct?

**Signed: Grieving Widower**

**Dear Grieving:** We extend our sincere condolences on your wife's passing. But I must tell you that what the SSA (Social Security Administration) told you is correct.

Although we often see assertions that the so-called "one-time lump sum death benefit" is always paid, there are specific rules for when that admittedly small SS benefit is available. And there are also specific rules regarding who is eligible to receive it.

Essentially, the lump sum death benefit is paid when the deceased person

was collecting Social Security retirement benefits (or at least entitled to SS retirement benefits). And that one-time lump sum death benefit usually goes to the deceased person's surviving spouse (more on that later). But for the death benefit to be paid, the deceased person must have been collecting Social Security retirement benefits (or was at least entitled to SS retirement benefits). In your specific case, because your wife was not eligible for her own SS retirement benefit and was, instead, just collecting a spousal benefit from your SS record, you unfortunately are not able to collect the lump-sum death benefit as your wife's surviving spouse. So, what you were told by Social Security about this special survivor benefit is, indeed, correct.

For information, here is a bit more on who can collect the SS death benefit: the one-time lump sum death benefit is normally paid to the eligible surviving spouse of a deceased person who was collecting Social Security. But if there is no surviving spouse to receive the one-time payment, the death benefit may be paid to someone else who was also a dependent of the deceased. That might be a minor surviving child or a surviving adult disabled child who was collecting dependent benefits from the deceased person's SS record. In rare cases, a dependent parent may be

paid if no other surviving dependents are eligible. FYI, ex-spouses are not eligible for a death benefit from a former spouse.

The lump-sum death benefit must be applied for by contacting Social Security and the benefit must be claimed within two years of the person's death. You will need to verify your identity and confirm your eligibility for this survivor benefit, and you will need to provide other information about the deceased also (including a death certificate). There is an SSA form to apply for the lump sum death benefit (SSA-8), but calling your local SS office (or 1.800.772.1213) to make an appointment to apply for the one-time lump-sum death benefit in person is usually all that is needed.

The U.K. government banned left-wing influencers Cenk Uygur and Hasan Piker from traveling to the country because they blame everything on the Jews -- and, true to form, Uygur and Piker blamed the Jews.

Uygur and Piker were to speak at a South by Southwest conference in London and participate in an event at the Oxford Union when their visas were canceled. They immediately smelled a rat, and, as usual, one emanating from Jerusalem.

"I've been banned for criticizing Israel," Uygur posted on social media. "Are we free anymore? This is oppression of Western citizens by our own governments on behalf of a different country!"

Piker chimed in, "The U.K. has revoked my visa as well. All at the behest of Israel. The West is betraying 'liberal values' for a genocidal fascist foreign government. Soon we will all become Israel."

Like most everything the duo says -- Piker is Uygur's nephew and got his start on his podcast -- this is poisonous nonsense, although it doesn't make the U.K.'s decision any better.

Britain now conducts itself like a nation that has never heard of John Milton, John Stuart Mill or Bertrand Russell, its storied advocates of free speech down through the centuries.

The U.K. routinely ex-

cludes controversial figures from traveling to the country from abroad, and actively tries to suppress speech offensive to gays, Muslims, trans people, Jews or others. You can get arrested, as TV writer Graham Linehan found out, for posting pungent opinions about biological males using female locker rooms, or for silently praying outside an abortion clinic.

If we needed a reminder of the wisdom of our Founders writing the First Amendment into the Constitution, the free-floating illiberalism of the British government trying to enforce faddish norms provides it.

The Home Office, which was responsible for revoking the Uygur and Piker visas, says that their presence in the country might not have been "conducive to the public good" -- whatever that means.

Certainly, it would be very bad for Britain if the country were to adopt wholesale the malignant views of Uygur and Piker, but that wasn't going to come about as a result of, say, one of them having a 40-minute speaking slot at a South by Southwest satellite event.

Traditionally, in free societies, people are allowed to say dumb and hateful things. Either they discredit themselves by doing so, or perhaps they eventually win people over to their views. Regardless, free and robust debate has been considered a good in and of itself, something a country run by a raucous, free-wheeling Parliament should readily understand.

Are the Jews behind the

exclusion of Uygur and Piker? Yet, there were Jewish groups who didn't want them to come, but excluding them was a decision entirely in keeping with the government's practice of trying to suppress views that it deems extreme. Just a couple of weeks ago, right-wing figures critical of Islam and supportive of Israel saw their visas revoked.

The British government isn't a tool of the Zionists. It is a left-of-center Labour government. The Home Secretary is a Muslim of Pakistani origin who has attended anti-Israel protests. The government has said it would jail Bibi Netanyahu if he travels to Britain, sanctioned Israeli officials, restricted arms sales to the Jewish state, and recognized a Palestinian state.

If the revocation of the visas is an Israeli op, it's a profoundly counterproductive one. In authoritarian societies, people can truly be suppressed -- if China wants to get rid of a nettlesome figure, it simply disappears him or her. In an open society, in contrast, there are many channels for expression, and official hostility tends to make the targeted voices more famous and interesting, whether it's James Joyce or the Sex Pistols.

Surely, Cenk Uygur and Hasan Piker are better known in the U.K. now than they were a few days ago, and that's not, as they say in Britain, conducive to the public good.

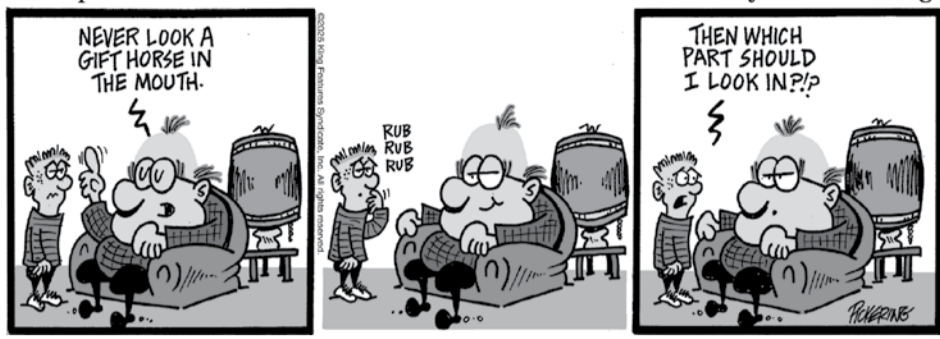

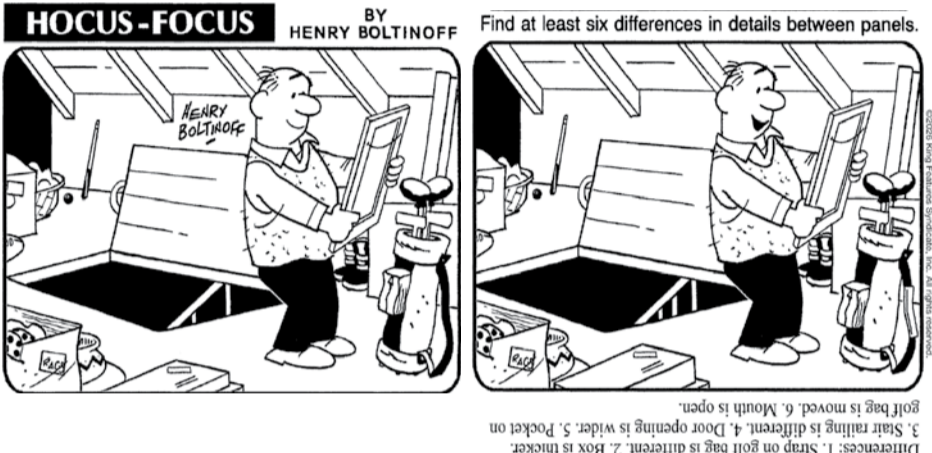
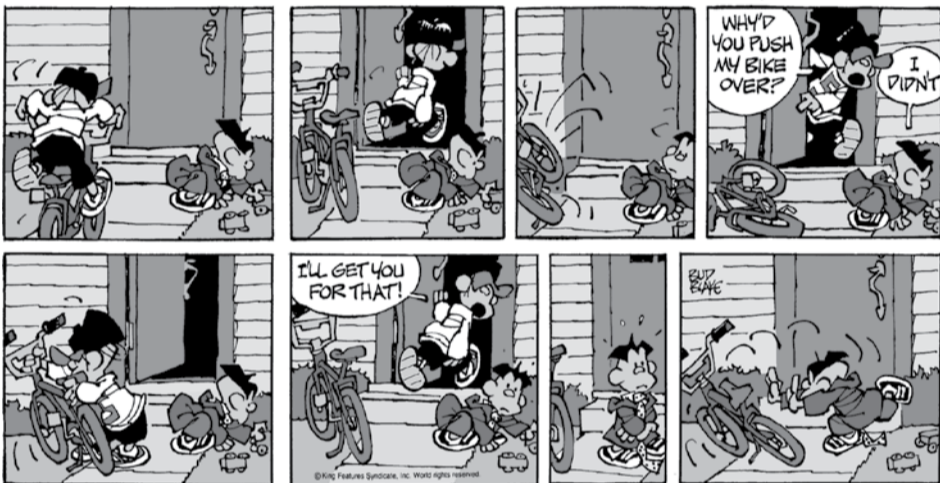

For generations, libraries have quietly anchored communities. Often described as places that preserve knowledge, they may increasingly preserve something modern life is quietly losing — shared civic space not filtered by algorithms, income levels or social circles.

Libraries remain places without entrance requirements or appointments, where people of different generations, backgrounds, skill sets and experiences still naturally cross paths — and perhaps learn from each other.

According to Peter Coyl, director of Sacramento Public Libraries, libraries continue evolving to meet community needs.

“Some people really want the quiet temple of learning,” Coyl said. “Some want a laboratory for knowledge.”

Modern libraries increasingly try to honor both.

Many branches now include quiet reading areas alongside study rooms, community rooms, teen spaces and collaborative learning areas. The library remains a place for concentration and reflection, but also one where conversation, classes, tutoring and shared activity quietly build human connection around learning.

The range of learning itself continues to evolve.

For the first time this past year, Sacramento Public Library’s e-book circulation surpassed physical books. Patrons now access digital media, professional courses, maker spaces, literacy tutoring, technology resources and even “Libraries of Things,” where residents can borrow practical items instead of purchasing them.

**Rebuilding America’s Skill Set: A Mentoring Mindset**

Yet, Coyl repeatedly returned not to programs or technology, but to people and access.

“People who are curious and want to learn come to the library,” Coyl said. “What you are doing may be different, but the reason you are there is often the same. People are seeking to learn, expand and better their lives. The library is for everyone.”

Libraries occupy a unique role in civic life because they remain one of the few public spaces where people can enter freely, Coyl said. “We’re open to anybody who has a question.”

That openness quietly creates intersections that rarely happen elsewhere.

Coyl recalled a retired Fortune 500 CEO regularly attending lectures beside a high school math teacher. Another patron, editor of a national news magazine, used the library as a preferred workspace. “You could be sitting next to a person writing the next prize-winning article,” Coyl said.

Nearby, one could often find a teenager studying or gathering with friends after school, a parent learning English or a neighbor researching resources to rebuild life after losing housing.

Different needs. Different experiences. Each with something to learn and something to offer.

Some connections remain brief. Others grow over years.

“I don’t know that everyone comes expecting community connections,” Coyl said. “But I do think it happens.”

That may matter more than we realize.

As life continues to move online, many Americans increasingly experience community through algorithms, private routines and highly filtered social circles. More and more, we move through already sorted,

familiar lanes of interest, background and belief.

Libraries don’t filter. And increasingly, libraries also help people discern something else: information itself.

In an era increasingly shaped by algorithms and artificial intelligence, Coyl believes personal expertise and library staff themselves remain key.

“Just because the search engine gives you the first result doesn’t mean that’s the best source,” Coyl said. “We teach people how to evaluate information, how search engines and AI choose responses. It’s important to understand those nuances.”

Then he paused on something simpler.

“Sometimes we need that human connection,” he said. “That’s something that cannot be replaced.”

Perhaps that is part of what libraries quietly preserve.

Not simply information, but the people who share it.

And perhaps, if we enter a little more intentionally — lingering a moment longer, introducing ourselves, sharing what we know, or simply noticing one another and asking about life — libraries may help teach us how to become a mentoring-minded community.

One where knowledge, skills and trust move freely between people as they practice the simple habit of lifting one another in small ways, strengthening the whole community over time.

# Defendant Convicted of Shooting Murder in Wingstop Parking Lot

**Sacramento County District Attorney's Office News Release**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On June 2, Alimohammed Hamid was convicted by a jury of second-degree murder. The jury also found true a use of firearm allegation. On February 24, 2024, the victim, Joseph Soto, parked in a Wingstop parking lot and began walking toward the restaurant. Alimohammed Hamid was parked in the next space. As Hamid backed out of his parking spot and drove toward the lot exit, he rolled down his rear passenger window and began a verbal exchange

with the victim. The victim responded, which led to a brief argument. When the victim turned around to walk back toward the restaurant, Hamid retrieved a firearm from the center console and fired one shot out of the back window, striking the victim in the back. Hamid immediately fled from the scene and discarded the gun and shell casing. On March 21, 2024, the victim succumbed to complications from the gunshot wound.

Hamid faces a maximum sentence of 40 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 1 at 3 p.m. in Department 12B before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle. ★

# Defendant Convicted of Stabbing Death on Folsom Boulevard

**Sacramento County District Attorney News Release**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Roderick Earl Sowell was convicted by a jury of second-degree murder. The jury also found true the allegation that Sowell used a deadly weapon in the commission of the murder.

On August 12, 2023, the victim and his friend were sitting on a bench at a Folsom Boulevard light rail station in Rancho Cordova. Roderick Earl Sowell exited a light rail train and approached the two men. Sowell got into an altercation with the victim's friend, which ended with the friend throwing a glass bottle at Sowell. The bottle hit Sowell in the head. Sowell pulled out a sharp object

and challenged the victim's friend to a fight, but the friend walked away and left the area. Sowell then turned his anger toward the victim and stabbed him 18 times with the sharp object. A witness observed the victim on the ground and called 911. The victim was taken to a hospital, where he ultimately succumbed to his injuries a few weeks later.

An allegation that Sowell has a prior strike conviction on a sexual assault charge and aggravating factors will be determined at the sentencing hearing.

Sowell faces a maximum sentence of 31 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 17, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 15B before the Honorable Michael Sweet. ★
