Twin Rivers Unified Appoints New Superintendent

MCCLELLAN PARK, CA (MPG) - The Twin Rivers Unified School District Board of Trustees approved the appointment and employment contract of Dr. Tu Moua Carroz as the district's next superintendent. A Hmong refugee and former English learner who has spent her career in California public schools, Carroz became the first Hmong and first female superintendent in district history when she

began her role July 1. Carroz most recently served as assistant superintendent of education services for Roseville Joint Union High School District and brings 25 years of experience in California public education to the role, spanning from the classroom to executive cabinet leadership. Her distinguished record includes serving as the associate superintendent of educational services at Woodland Joint Unified and as an area/instructional assistant superintendent at Sacramento

City Unified School District, where she oversaw 23 schools. A former classroom teacher and literacy specialist, she also served as a principal for two different schools, earning the California School Boards Association Golden Bell Award and a National Blue Ribbon Schools nomination. "My vision for Twin Rivers is clear: academic excellence and equity, held together and never traded off, so that all 45 schools share one coherent instructional core,"

Blooming Beyond Borders

'Garden of Beauty' Reimagines Fashion and Body Types

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - "Think of our world as a magnificent garden ... with a multitude of unique and gorgeous flowers ... all individual but beautiful in their own way."

This is the philosophy that guides Jill Widmann, creator and owner of the original Garden of Beauty. Widmann unveiled a new kind of body-typing system at a fashion show

titled "Creativity, Beauty, & Compassion," held June 27 at Sacramento Fine Arts Center.

"I wanted women to feel beautiful just as they are," said Widmann.

While clothing comes in various sizes, they are all the same shape. Widmann noticed that most retailers don't account for the different body types that women have. As a result, the clothes don't fit as well as they could, even if they are the right size. The idea

is for clothes to be created for the body rather than people trying to change their body to fit into their clothes.

"A size two and a size 22 could still be the same shape," said Karen Howk, a friend of Widmann's who participated in the fashion show. "There is no need for women to try to attain a shape or size they are not."

Widmann's mother was a model in the 1940s, which sparked Widmann's interest in fashion from a

young age. One day, she went shopping with friends and that night she dreamt up the whole concept. For the past 20 years she has been working on a sizing guide that rejects traditional industry terms.

Widmann noted that classic shape-identifying terms such as "pear" or "hourglass" can carry a "demeaning" subtext for women. Furthermore, she pointed out that traditional body-typing charts often

Keep Your Pets Safe This Fourth of July

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - For many people, the Fourth of July is a time to celebrate with family, friends and fireworks. For pets, it's often one of the scariest nights of the year.

Every year, animal shelters see a sharp increase in lost pets as frightened dogs and cats panic at the sound of fireworks, escape yards, slip out open doors or bolt from leashes. The good news? A few simple steps can help keep your pets safe.

Keep pets indoors before celebrations begin and create a safe, quiet space with their favorite bed, toys and water. Closing windows, curtains and playing calming music or the TV can help drown out loud noises.

Double-check identification. Make sure your pet is wearing a collar with current ID tags, and if they're microchipped, verify that your contact information is up to date. A microchip is one of the best ways to help your pet find their way home.

If your pet becomes anxious during fireworks, talk to your veterinarian before the holiday about medications or other options that can help reduce stress. Take dogs for a walk earlier in the day before fireworks begin, keep them on a secure leash and leave them home during fireworks shows and crowded celebrations.

Watch the doors. Guests coming and going can create opportunities for pets to slip outside. Never leave pets in the yard during fireworks, even if it's fenced.

To help reunite lost pets with their families, Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter is waiving owner redemption fees from June 27 through July 11. The fee waiver applies to all redeemable animals except those involved in ongoing investigations or animals that have been confiscated or placed under quarantine.

If your pet goes missing, don't wait. Visit Bradshaw Animal Shelter at 3839 Bradshaw Road as soon as possible. The shelter is open Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday from noon to 5 p.m., and Wednesday from noon to 6 p.m. It is closed Mondays and Sacramento County holidays. You can also view lost and found pets online before heading to the shelter. ★

include arbitrary and confusing markers including “cornet, lollipop or goblet.”

Instead of clinical geometric shapes or food comparisons, Garden of Beauty encourages women to find their corresponding flower, using clothing as a guide to balance and enhance natural attributes.

The new framework maps traditional silhouettes to elegant floral counterparts, including Guinevere (Rectangle) for those whose hips, bust and shoulders are close to the same size with a less-defined waistline; Angel Heart (Hourglass) for figures with a well-defined waist, where the hips, bust and shoulders are closely balanced; Yellow Bell (Triangle) for shapes where the hips are larger than the bust or shoulders; Blue Bird (Diamond) for profiles where the waistline is larger than the hips, bust or shoulders; and Tiger Lily (Inverted Triangle) for figures where the hips are smaller than the bust or shoulders.

The fashion show brought this supportive philosophy to life using real women wearing clothing from their personal wardrobes, showcasing how standard apparel can be customized to honor unique individual frames. As they walked down the runway, they held the corresponding flower to indicate their body shape.

“It’s the start of something wonderful for the fashion

industry,” said Allie Claire, who walked in the fashion show.

Widmann stated that this shaping guide has garnered interest from retailers such as Bloomingdale’s and Macy’s, and she is hoping to foster a

collaboration that offers various shapes of clothing. Her current project is to license the system and put her custom floral tags directly onto clothing retail racks worldwide.

“It’s the very first of its kind,”

said Ericka Carvin, Widmann’s friend who walked in the fashion show. “No fitting system has ever come from a place of beauty. It makes shopping easier for women.”

As the fashion industry

slowly tilts toward inclusivity, Widmann’s approach offers a refreshing, gentle path forward. After all, as her philosophy reminds us: “Flowers don’t compete; they grow just as they are, where they are.” ★

California State Senate Celebrates the Familial Adenomatous Polyposis Awareness Week

CALIFORNIA (MPG) - Senator Roger Niello (R-Fair Oaks) introduced Senate Resolution 112 to declare the week of June 14 through June 20, 2026, as Familial Adenomatous Polyposis Awareness Week in California. Familial adenomatous polyposis (FAP) is a hereditary condition that results in a high number of polyps developing within the colon and rectum.

“By declaring this week as FAP awareness week, we acknowledge a commitment to encouraging Californians to gather their family health history and share this information with their healthcare provider for early screening and

prevention of cancers associated with these conditions,” said

Niello. “Understanding your risk for FAP can help healthcare

providers determine appropriate treatment and screening protocol for prevention and early detection.”

Dan Shockley, who has been an active advocate of FAP awareness, lives in Galt, CA. Shockley is a constituent of Senator Roger Niello, and said, “Genetic testing and early detection are paramount. I’m living proof. As a 14-year attenuated FAP warrior, my mantra is a positive spin on a bleak diagnosis: Always Forge Ahead with a Purpose!”

Since 2012, Life’s a Polyp Foundation has been in action raising awareness and supporting FAP patients online worldwide. Its Founder and President, Jenny Jones, stated, “FAP Awareness Week highlights the care FAP

requires, ultimately helping save lives. When patients are fighting the lack of awareness in the medical field about FAP, it results in difficulty to obtain diagnostic testing upon known FAP risk, and they are unable to obtain proper surveillance after diagnosis. Then, their lives are put at risk for multiple cancers and other health issues.” Jones continued, “Recognizing this week tells medical providers there’s something they need to learn more about and tells every FAP patient out there that they are seen and they are not alone. There’s a whole community of us out here with welcoming arms.”

Local Farmers Grow Malting Barley for Brewing Beer

California grain farmers are finding success producing sustainably grown malting barley for Alameda-based Admiral Maltings. The San Francisco Bay Area malt house sources the barley from local growers and produces malt, which can be used for distilling, brewing and food production. Ron Silberstein, co-founder of Admiral Maltings, said the company pays growers a premium to grow malting barley, as well as wheat and rye, using earth-friendly or carbon-sequestering practices such as no-till. “It’s not the cheapest, but it’s all about sustainability,” Silberstein said. Fritz Durst, who grows organic no-till wheat for Admiral in Yolo County, said the premiums are crucial for making it financially viable to grow the grains. “Everybody thinks sustainability is about soil that’s healthy—and that’s part of it,” Durst said. “But part of sustainability is right here, paying a fair price to the grower.”

How Farmers Can Help Fight Wildfires

In 2017, as dozens of wildfires ravaged California’s wine country, University of California, Davis, researcher Natalia Pinzón witnessed the devastation firsthand. The experience showed Pinzón the necessity of including farmers and ranchers in the state’s wildfire preparedness and mitigation efforts. She said farmers play an important part in preventing wildfires

by reducing wildfire fuels, for example. “They also create the social infrastructure that is so important during disaster response,” Pinzón told Ag Alert® in an interview. “During a disaster, what we need most for immediate response is integrated social networks and integrated communities that can leverage existing resources quickly and mobilize. That can make a huge difference for a community’s ability to survive an event like this.”

Farm Advocates Seek Support for Local USDA offices

California Farm Bureau this month joined more than 100 agricultural organizations in a letter urging congressional appropriators to provide additional funding and staffing support for local U.S. Department of Agriculture offices of the Farm Service Agency and Natural Resources Conservation Service. The coalition highlighted growing concerns that staffing reductions, retirements and workforce attrition have led to delays and service disruptions in USDA field offices across the country, including in California. The offices play a critical role in administering farm programs, conservation assistance, disaster relief and technical support for farmers. According to the letter, several USDA agencies have experienced significant workforce losses during the past year, creating challenges for producers seeking timely access to programs and services. ★

said Carroz. “Every Twin Rivers student, regardless of zip code, immigration status, language background, or economic circumstance, is capable of extraordinary achievement, and it is our job to build the system that proves it.”

Her candidacy is further distinguished by a deep personal narrative of equity. Arriving in California as a Hmong refugee and English learner, Carroz’s lived experience directly informs her commitment to the multicultural communities Twin Rivers serves, where students and families speak 53 languages. She holds a doctorate in education, equity and democracy from the University of California, Berkeley, and has been recognized nationally as a Milken Educator Award recipient.

“Carroz is an accomplished, student-centered leader whose experience, integrity and commitment to educational excellence make her an outstanding choice for Twin Rivers,”

said Board President Christine Jefferson. “The board looks forward to working with her as we continue strengthening outcomes for students, supporting staff, and building trust with families, employees and the broader community.”

Twin Rivers Unified serves approximately 25,140 students across 45 schools. The district serves communities in the northern Sacramento area, including Foothill Farms, North Highlands, Rio Linda, Elverta, Del Paso Heights, North Sacramento, Gardenland, Woodlake and North Natomas. The district is recognized for its whole-child philosophy and commitment to research-based instruction.

The selection of Carroz culminated an exhaustive and highly competitive search assisted by the educational executive search firm McPherson and Jacobson, LLC, conducted since mid-April. Though the recruitment and selection of a new superintendent

is largely a confidential process, the Twin Rivers community was engaged through an online survey conducted in 10 languages with 619 respondents and 170 individuals interviewed across 14 stakeholder groups, resulting in community input reports that informed the search and applicant vetting.

Additionally, the board set forth a detailed set of criteria and preferred qualifications that emphasized equity leadership, instructional vision, communication, operations, student-centered leadership, and labor and community relations. With 38 applicants, board criteria and community input data became the lens for assessing applicants. With many strong candidates to evaluate, relevant experience, successful service as a superintendent or assistant superintendent, and familiarity with California public education, finance and law weighed heavily in selecting candidates for consideration and interviews. ★

Exclusive Company: The Medal of Honor

The Medal of Honor is the United States' highest award for military valor in action.....a distinguished award presented only to the deserving; the Medal tells a story of its own. – Congressional Medal of Honor Society

I volunteer at the Charles H. Coolidge Medal of Honor Heritage Center in Chattanooga, Tennessee, the birthplace of the Medal of Honor. There are two other Medal of Honor Museums in the United States: Arlington, Texas and Charleston, South Carolina.

What got me interested in volunteering was to honor my dad, Sal Sr., who served in World War II, and to continue my interest in learning more about the military personnel and the stories that are attached to each veteran at the center. There are stories about individuals and caring for those around them. The stories are not about war, but about character.

To give some context to this story, there have been approximately 41 million men and women who have served in the United States Armed Forces. Presently, 3,555 Medals of Honor have been awarded, with nineteen individuals receiving the award twice. There are 65 living Recipients.

As I guide visitors throughout the Center, people are interested in knowing why Chattanooga is the birthplace of the Medal of Honor. Well, during the Civil War in 1862, a group of mainly Union soldiers that eventually became known as “Andrews’ Raiders” pulled off a daring heist of a train known as “The General” from a Confederate base near Atlanta, Georgia. Chattanooga is called the “birthplace of the Medal of Honor” because the first medals awarded in 1863 were to six members of Andrews’ Raiders; other medals were awarded for Civil War actions in and around the city.

In the state of California, there have been 138 Medal of Honor Recipients. As I learned more of the information presented at the Medal of Honor Center in Chattanooga, I found that one of the notable Recipients there is Maximo Yabes, who was born in Lodi, California in 1932.

According to his son, Greg Filter, 1st Sergeant Yabes was “all military.” “Dad was compassionate and that’s what he was all about.” Greg noted that to get the Medal of Honor, a person had to have compassion and to care about other soldiers first; Medal of Honor recipients share six common traits – commitment, courage, citizenship, integrity, patriotism and sacrifice. He emphasized his point by mentioning his dad

“jumped into a river to save a friend.” He was “just that kind of guy,” Greg continued.

When 1st Sergeant Yabes entered service, the United States was already involved in the Vietnam War. A member of the Company A, 4th Battalion, 9th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division,

1st Sergeant Yabes Medal of Honor Action date was February 26, 1967. Greg was a high school senior when word came his dad

had been killed in action.

The citation for 1st Sergeant Maximo Yabes reads as follows:

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty. First Sgt. Yabes distinguished himself with Company A, which was providing security for a land-clearing operation. Early in the morning the company suddenly came under intense automatic-weapons and

mortar fire followed by a battalion-sized assault from three sides. Penetrating the defensive perimeter, the enemy advanced on the company command post bunker. The command post received increasingly heavy fire and was in danger of being overwhelmed. When several enemy grenades landed within the command post, 1st Sgt. Yabes shouted a warning and used his body as a shield to protect others in the bunker. Although painfully wounded by numerous grenade fragments, and despite the vicious enemy fire on the bunker, he remained there to provide covering fire and enable the others in the command group to relocate. When the command group had reached a new position, 1st Sgt. Yabes moved through a withering hail of enemy fire to another bunker 50 meters away. There he secured a grenade launcher from a fallen comrade and fired point-blank into the attacking Viet Cong, stopping further penetration of the perimeter. Noting two wounded men helpless in the fire-swept area, he moved them to a safer position where they could be given medical treatment. He resumed his accurate and effective fire, killing several enemy soldiers and forcing others to withdraw from the vicinity of the command post. As the battle continued, he observed an enemy machine gun within the perimeter which threatened the whole position. On his own, he dashed across the exposed area, assaulted the machine gun, killed the crew, destroyed the weapon, and fell mortally wounded. First

Sgt. Yabes’ valiant and selfless actions saved the lives of many of his fellow soldiers and inspired his comrades to effectively repel the enemy assault. His indomitable fighting spirit, extraordinary courage, and intrepidity at the cost of his life are in the highest military traditions and reflect great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of his country.

I encourage individuals to research on their own to discover the sacrifices that have been made by our armed forces personnel and their families and come to appreciate what makes our military second to none.

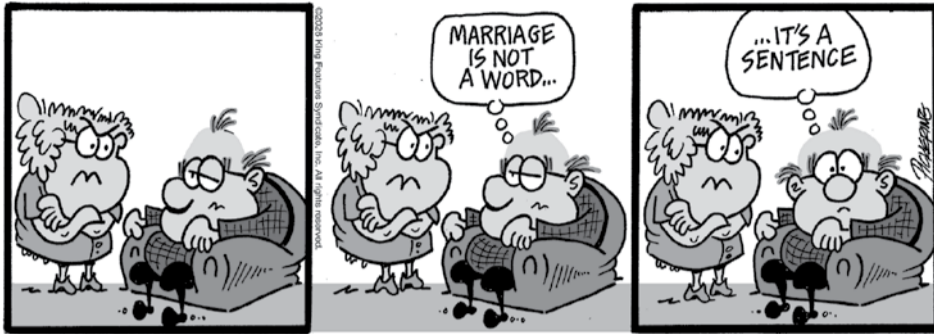

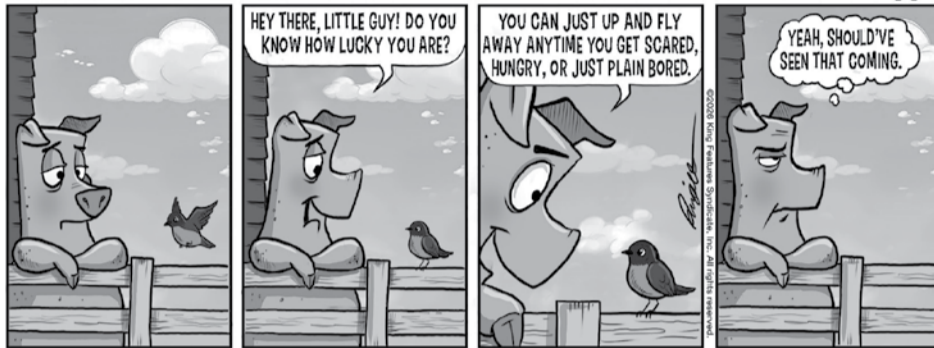

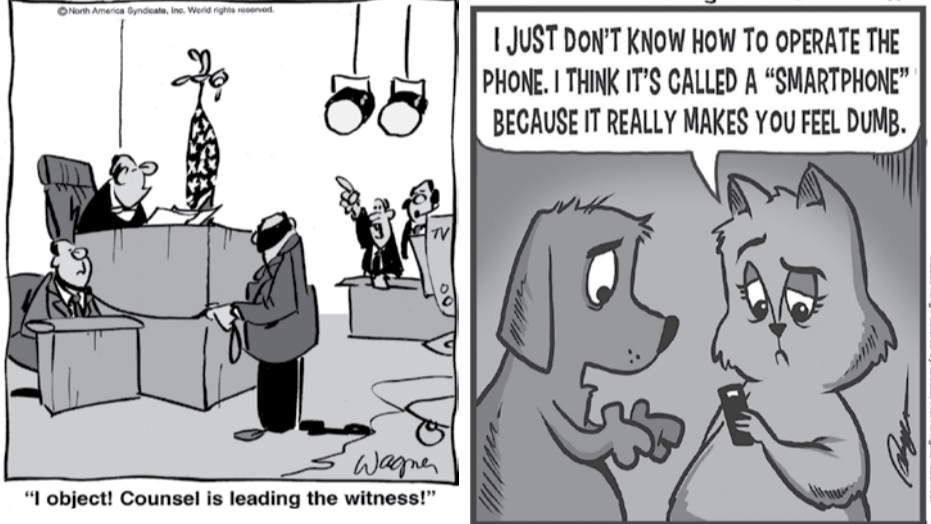

Declaration of Independence

When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.—That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, —That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.—Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good.

He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them.

He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only.

He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures.

He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people.

He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; whereby the Legislative powers, incapable of Annihilation, have returned to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the mean time exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within.

He has endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing the Laws for Naturalization of Foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migrations hither, and raising the conditions of new Appropriations of Lands.

He has obstructed the Administration of Justice, by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary powers.

He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone, for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment of their salaries.

He has erected a multitude of New Offices, and sent hither swarms of Officers to harrass our people, and eat out their substance.

He has kept among us, in times of peace, Standing Armies without the Consent of our legislatures.

He has affected to render the Military independent of and superior to the Civil power.

He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his Assent to their Acts of pretended Legislation:

For Quartering large bodies of armed troops among us:

For protecting them, by a mock Trial, from punishment for any Murders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States:

For cutting off our Trade with all parts of the world:

For imposing Taxes on us without our Consent:

For depriving us in many cases, of the benefits of Trial by Jury:

For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for pretended offences:

For abolishing the free System of English Laws in a neighbouring Province, establishing therein an Arbitrary government, and enlarging its Boundaries so as to render it at once an example and fit instrument for introducing the same absolute rule into these Colonies:

For taking away our Charters, abolishing our most valuable Laws, and altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments:

For suspending our own Legislatures, and declaring themselves invested with power to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever.

He has abdicated Government here, by declaring us out of his Protection and waging War against us.

He has plundered our seas, ravaged our Coasts, burnt our towns, and destroyed the lives of our people.

He is at this time transporting large Armies of foreign Mercenaries to compleat the works of death, desolation and tyranny, already begun with circumstances of Cruelty & perfidy scarcely paralleled in the most barbarous ages, and totally unworthy the Head of a civilized nation.

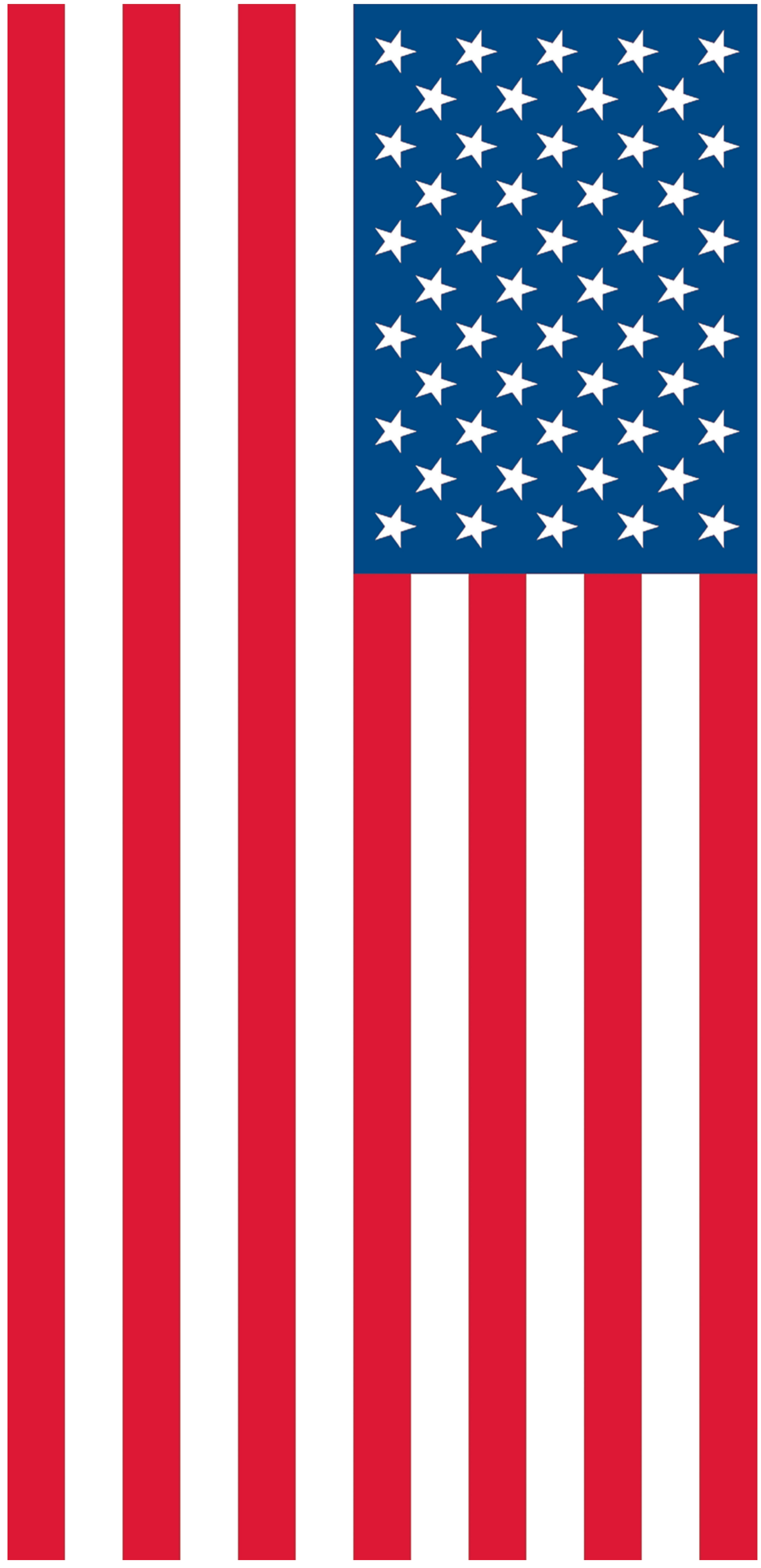
He has constrained our fellow Citizens taken Captive on the high Seas to bear Arms against their Country, to become the executioners of their friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands.

He has excited domestic insurrections amongst us, and has endeavoured to bring on the inhabitants of our frontiers, the merciless Indian Savages, whose known rule of warfare, is an undistinguished destruction of all ages, sexes and conditions.

In every stage of these Oppressions We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A Prince, whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people.

Nor have We been wanting in attentions to our Brittish brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

We, therefore, the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.



Defendant Sentenced for Sexually Assaulting Foreign College Student

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Kevin Davis to 25 years to life in prison. On May 12, a jury convicted Davis of forcible rape. Allegations that Davis has two prior strike convictions for assault with a firearm and aggravating factors of vulnerable victim and prior prison term were also found true. The victim had come to the United States from Europe to attend college. On November 2, 2023, she



traveled alone to make a return trip from a conference by way of Greyhound and Amtrak. At 2 a.m., she was dropped off at the Greyhound Station on Richards Boulevard so she could go to the Amtrak station on I Street and take a train home. The victim was unfamiliar with

Sacramento and had no working cellphone. She made her way to a gas station and asked a clerk to call her a taxi; however, it never arrived. Davis arrived and offered the victim a ride to the Amtrak station. She eventually agreed and got into his car. Davis drove the victim to a secluded area by the river, locked her in his car, and threatened that he had had guns and would sexually assault her if she did not willingly comply with his sexual demands. Davis forced the victim to perform sexual acts with him before raping her. ★

"It was clear throughout our deliberation that Lora is the right person to navigate SMUD through a pivotal time for the electric utility industry as customers seek clean energy sources and exceptional service, while expecting utilities to transition to a clean energy future without compromising on reliability or affordability," Tamayo said. "Lora's expertise as SMUD's first chief zero carbon officer and her extensive senior leadership experience in utility operations will serve SMUD, our customers and our communities very well."

Anguay moves to SMUD's top post after serving as chief zero carbon officer since 2021. In this role, she's responsible for implementing SMUD's Clean Energy Vision, which includes the design, construction, maintenance and transition of SMUD's power generation assets, customer program strategy, and design and development related to distributed energy resources. She also leads research and development activities, grant application and administration, and establishes new business partnerships.

As chief zero carbon officer, Anguay led the addition of more than 1,430 megawatts (MW) of utility-scale renewable and energy storage resources and the

retooling of Cosumnes Power Plant — SMUD's largest natural gas plant — which reduced plant emissions by 27%. She also oversaw significant customer adoption of clean-energy technologies, including achieving 20,000 all-equivalent electric homes, 62 MW of distributed energy resources and more than 54,000 electric vehicles in SMUD's service territory.

Her previous senior leadership responsibilities at SMUD include overseeing the day-to-day operations of the distribution grid, transmission and distribution maintenance engineering, the development of electrical design and construction standards, and the work management activities for line design and construction. Anguay previously led the deployment of SMUD's smart meter project and managed SMUD's distribution automation project.

Prior to joining SMUD in 2004, Anguay held a management position at Oracle Corporation and proudly served in the United States Coast Guard.

She is a fellow of the Greater Sacramento American Leadership Forum and is a graduate of the Roseville Leadership Program. She remains deeply dedicated to regional growth and corporate governance, currently serving on the board of directors for the CSUS Foundation, the board of advisors for the UC Davis Energy and Efficiency Institute, the board of directors for the Roberts Family Development Center and the board executive committee for the Roseville Area Chamber of Commerce. She's a member of the Electric Power Research Institute's (EPRI) Research Advisory Committee, a board member for Smart Electric Power Alliance (SEPA) and a board member at Grid Forward. Anguay is a past board member of the Western Energy Institute, the CSUS Alumni Association and Wind Youth Services. ★
